

### Installation



### 1. Inserting the SIM Card



Locate the SIM card socket in the back of the phone.

Follow the steps below to install the SIM card.

- 1. Remove the battery if attached.
- Slide the SIM card into the slot, under the silvery holders, with the golden connectors facing down and the cut corner to the right.



- Before installing always make sure that the phone is switched off and remove the battery.
- The metal contact of the SIM card can be easily damaged by scratches. Pay special attention to the SIM card when you handle and install. Follow the instructions supplied with the SIM card.

### 2. Installing the Battery



1. Place the battery on the back of the phone.



2. Push it until you hear a click.

### 3. Charging the Battery

To connect the travel adapter to the phone, you must have installed the battery.



1. Insert one end of the travel adapter into the bottom of the phone.



**2.** Connect the other end of the travel adapter to an AC wall outlet.

**NOTE:** Use only Travel charger type TA-25G series.



• Do not force the connector as this may damage the phone and/or the travel adapter.



### 4. Disconnecting the charger



Disconnect the travel adapter from the phone by pressing its side buttons.



- The battery delivered with your phone has to be fully charged before using it.
- Do not remove your battery or the SIM card while charging.
- The moving bars of battery icon will stop after charging completely.



- In the case the battery is not properly charged,
  - 1. After turning on/off the phone using the power key, please try to recharge it.
  - 2. When the battery is attached to the phone, please detach it from the phone. And then place it back to the phone and try to recharge it.



### **Powering On Sequence**

### To get started with the phone



- 1. Press and hold [Power/End Key] until you hear a tone.
- Depending on setting PIN code request [Menu 4-5-1], you can enter it or not.
- If your phone connects to a network, the network name will be displayed shortly.

### To turn off the phone

In standby mode, press and hold key until you hear a tone.

## Getting Started



You can use the access codes described in this section to avoid unauthorized use of your phone. The access codes (except PUK and PUK2 codes) can be changed by using Change codes [Menu 4-5-4].

### PIN code (4 to 8 digits)

The PIN (Personal Identification Number) code protects your SIM card against unauthorized use. The PIN code is usually supplied with the SIM card. When **PIN code request** is set Enable, your phone will request the PIN code every time it is switched on. On the contrary, when PIN code request is set Disable, your phone connects to the network directly without PIN code.

### PIN2 code (4 to 8 digits)

The PIN2 code, supplied with some SIM cards, is required to access some functions such as Advice of call charge. Fixed Dial number. These functions are only available if supported by your SIM card.

### PUK code (4 to 8 digits)

The PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) code is required to change a blocked PIN code. The PUK code may be supplied with the SIM card. If not, contact your local service provider for the code. If you lose the code, also contact your service provider.

### PUK2 code (4 to 8 digits)

The PUK2 code, supplied with some SIM cards, is required to change a blocked PIN2 code. If you lose the code, also contact your service provider.



### **Access Codes**

### Security code (4 to 8 digits)

The security code protects the unauthorized use of your phone. It is usually supplied with the phone. This code is required to delete all phone entries and to activate "Restore factory settings" menu. The default number is "0000". You also can change it in Security settings menu. The menu displayed on the handset screen during a call is different to the default main menu reached from the idle screen, and the options are described here.

### **Making and Answering calls**



### Making a call

- Key in phone number including the area code. To edit a number on the display, press [· ⊙ , ⊙ ] to move the cursor to the left or right. If you want to delete a character, press ⊙.
- 2. Press o to call the number.
- 3. Press ( to end the call.

### Making a call by [Send key]

- 1. Press [Send key], and then you can check the latest missed, received, and dialled phone numbers.
- 2. Select the number you want on the list.
- 3. Press (Send key).

### **International Calls**

- Press and hold the Oth key for the international prefix.
   "+" character may replace with the international access code.
- 2. Enter the country code, area code, and the phone number.
- 3. Press 🕥.

### Making a call using the Phonebook

- 1. In standby mode, press [ [Names].
- If you find out the desired item through searching by a name or a number, press to call.

### Making call by Speed dials

See the menu Phonebook - Speed dials [Menu 6-3-4] in detail.





### Phonebook



To select a menu in phonebook, press [Names] in standby mode and then scroll to a desired item. You can also access this menu through Organiser.

1. Search	Allows you to search for a specific name and number.
2. Add new	Allows you to add new names and numbers.
3. Caller groups	Allows you to show group list, and select it. You can edit its name, and set a ring and icon for each Group.
4. Speed dials	Allows you to assign up to 8 (2abc - [green]) one-touch dial allocations.

# Menu Description

### Messages [Menu 1]



This menu includes functions related to SMS (Short Message Service), voice mail, as well as the network's service messages.

### Write message [Menu 1-1]

You can write and edit text message up to 480 characters. In addition, you can check the page number in writing message.

- 1. Enter the **Messages** menu by pressing  $\subseteq$  [Select].
- If you want to write a new message, select Write message in the menu.
- 3. Input the message.
- When you finish writing the message, press ☐ [Options].
   Then following option menu will be displayed.

### Send

Sends the text message.

- 1. Enter the phone number to send the message.
- 2. Press (a) [OK]. If you don't want to send it, press (b) [Back].

### Save

Stores the message in Outbox.

If you want to save it in Outbox, press  $\subseteq$  [Select].

### Insert template

The template is pre-defined message. You can select one of the templates and add it to the message you will send.





### Messages [Menu 1]

### **EMS** function

You can use EMS only if the network supports this service.

### Attach picture

If you want to append the picture on sending message, you can select it through EMS. You can also select one of the various pictures.

### Attach animation

If you want to append the animation on sending message, you can select it through EMS. In addition, You can select the one of 15 animations which you want.

### Attach sound

If you want to append the sound on sending message, you can select it through EMS.



 You may not send or receive the message through EMS due to the incompatibility between G7030 phone and the others.

### Insert number

When you enter message, you can insert the phone number stored in the SIM card or in the phone. If the number is stored in the phone, you can also insert home number, and office number.



### eZi dictionary

You can add, delete and edit a word in eZi dictionary. If you save it in a dictionary, this word has a high priority than others.

- · How to add a word in a dictionary
  - 1. Scroll to highlight eZi dictionary.
  - <No entry> message will be displayed when nothing is saved. Once a word is saved in a dictionary, you can view the word list.
  - 3. Press [ [Add] .
  - 4. After entering a word, press ( [OK].
- . How to delete a word from a dictionary
  - 1. Scroll to highlight eZi dictionary.
  - 2. Select a word you want to delete, and then press [ Options].
  - 3. Select Delete menu.
- How to edit a word in a dictionary
  - 1. Scroll to highlight eZi dictionary.
  - 2. Select a word you want to edit, and then press [ Options].
  - 3. Select Edit menu.



### Messages [Menu 1]

### How to use eZi text

eZi text mode allows you to type a word easily and quickly. Simply pressing each key once for each character, you can get the word you want. Therefore, you don't need to input all characters to make a word.

How to change mode

There are 4 modes. : eZi mode, Numeric mode, Letter mode (Capital and Small). You can change and choose one among the editor modes by pressing  $\widetilde{\mathbb{H}}^{\mathfrak{D}}$ .

- 1. How to write a message in eZi mode
  - 1. Select Messages by pressing [ [Select].
  - 2. Select Write message by pressing [ [Select].
  - 3. In eZi text mode, you just press a key marked a character on the keypad. In addition, you can space out by pressing ①由 key.



### Example

For making "Tomorrow", you just press  $\underbrace{8^{nn}} \rightarrow \underbrace{6^{nnc}} \rightarrow \underbrace{6^{nnc}} \rightarrow \underbrace{7^{nn}}$  in sequence.

4. After writing the message, press (-) [Options].



- 1. To change the language, press (\*) key. You can check the selected language below the text box.
- 2. Once you press the corresponding key, key will be changed to "Change". Then you can change the capital form with (Change). For example: You → you → y.o.u. → Y.O.U. → YOU. After selecting the desired form by pressing [OK], key will return to "Symbol".

### 2. Numeric mode



To enter numbers, select this mode using # key.

### 3. Letter mode

In this mode, you can input letters. There are capital letter mode and small letter mode.





### Notice



- 1. If you want to space, press Ob.
- 2. To delete a letter, use © key.

### Inbox [Menu 1-2]

### Reply [Menu 1-2-1]

You can reply to the incoming message, if you press [Select].

### Forward [Menu 1-2-2]

You can forward the selected message to other party, if you press  $\subseteq$  [Select].

### Delete [Menu 1-2-3]

You can delete the message if you press [Select].

### Get number [Menu 1-2-4]

If the message has the number, you can not only extract it but also save it in the phonebook. You can also call to this number.

### Save attachments [Menu 1-2-5]

You can save attachments such as pictures, sound, or animation. (This option is shown only when there is any attachment.)

### Return call [Menu 1-2-6]

You can call back to sender by pressing (Send).

### Outbox [Menu 1-3]

When you enter this menu, you can see the outgoing message list. You can select the desired message by scrolling , , , and press [Select] to read it. And if you want to exit from **Outbox** menu, press [Back]. In addition, you can delete all outgoing messages by selecting **Delete all** menu at the bottom of the list. After reading a message, press [Options] to access the following submenus.

### Forward [Menu 1-3-1]

You can forward the message to other party.

### Delete [Menu 1-3-2]

You can delete the message.

### Get number [Menu 1-3-3]

If the message has the phone number, you can not only extract it but also save it in the phonebook. You can call to this number.

Notice

If you space out as inputting numbers, the receiver can check them respectively.



### Messages [Menu 1]

### Info service [Menu 1-4]

Cell Broadcast messages (CB message) are text ones that are sent by the network to GSM phone users. The network provides general information such as weather reports, traffic news, tax, pharmacies, and stock prices. Each type of information has the number; therefore, you can contact service provider. When you receive CB message, you can view the submenus below:

### Receive [Menu 1-4-1]

- Yes: If you select this menu, your phone will receive the Cell Broadcast message.
- No : If you select this menu, your phone will not receive the Cell Broadcast message.

### Inbox [Menu 1-4-2]

You can read and delete received CB messages.

### Topics [Menu 1-4-3]

If you want to create new topics, press  $\subseteq$  [Select]. Then, you select New topics menu by  $\subseteq$  [Select]. If you have already topics, you can delete, edit, and activate by pressing  $\subseteq$  [Options].

### Alert [Menu 1-4-4]

• On

When Cell broadcast message is arrived, your phone will inform you by beep.

### • Off

When Cell broadcast message is arrived, your phone will not beep.



### Auto display [Menu 1-4-5]

When you receive CB message, it is automatically displayed on the window. You can read it by scrolling  $\overrightarrow{c}_{1}$ ,  $\overrightarrow{c}_{2}$ .

### • On

The message will be displayed on the screen automatically.

### Off

The message will not be displayed on the screen automatically.

### Language [Menu 1-4-6] (Dependent upon the Network)

You can select the language pressing [Select]. Then, the cell broadcast message will be displayed in the language that you selected. If you use all languages supported by phone, select **Automatic** at the bottom of the list.

### Voice messages [Menu 1-5]

### Listen to voice messages [Menu 1-5-1]

In this menu, you can listen to your voice messages. If the address of voicemail centre is already is saved in phone, your phone connects it automatically. Otherwise, the phone requires entering the address.

### Voice mailbox number [Menu 1-5-2]

You can input voice mailbox address number.



### Messages [Menu 1]

### **Delivery reports [Menu 1-6]**

You can read and delete delivery report messages.

### Templates [Menu 1-7]

You can see 10 pre-defined messages in the list. You can view templates already saved in a list before editing it. You can change those ones. The rest ones are **<Empty>**. You can add the new one.

### Edit [Menu 1-7-1]

You can edit a template.

### Delete [Menu 1-7-2]

You can delete a template.

### Send [Menu 1-7-3]

You can send the text message with a template.



### Settings [Menu 1-8]

### Message centre number [Menu 1-8-1]

You can input the address of message centre.

### Message types [Menu 1-8-2]

Text, Voice, Fax, Paging, X.400, E-mail, ERMES

Usually, the type of message is set to **Text** type. You can replace your text with the alternative formats, which are suitable for the device that will be received the message. Contact your service provider for the availability of this function.

### Validity period [Menu 1-8-3]

This network service allows you to set how long your text messages will be stored at the message center.

### Delivery reports [Menu 1-8-4]

If you set **Yes** in this menu, you can check whether your message is sent to the other party successfully or not.

### Pay for reply [Menu 1-8-5]

When the other party replies to your message, you can pay for this.

### Check memory [Menu 1-8-6]

If you select this menu, you can check the used and total memories. The total memory is the sum of SIM and Phone memory.



### Call register [Menu 2]

### (Dependent on the network service)

You can check the record of missed, received, and dialled calls only if the network supports the Calling Line Identification (CLI) within the service area. In the options of missed calls, received calls, and dialled numbers you can:

- Call by this number.
- · Save the number in the phonebook.
- View the date and the time of the call.
- Edit, delete or save the number from the list in phonebook.

### Missed calls [Menu 2-1]

This function allows you to view the list of the latest 10 phone numbers you didn't receive.

### Received calls [Menu 2-2]

This function allows you to view the list of the latest 20 phone numbers you have received.

### Dialled calls [Menu 2-3]

This function allows you to view the list of 20 phone numbers that you have recently called or tried to call.

### Submenus in each menu:

### View detail

You can check the phone number of missed, received or dialled calls in detail.

### Delete

You can delete the record of the phone number.

### Save

You can save the phone number.



### Call

You can make a call to the number.

### View other number

You can check the phone numbers saved in phonebook.

### Write message

You can send a message to the number.

### Clear recent calls [Menu 2-4]

This function allows you to delete missed, dialled or received call lists. You can also delete all call lists at a time.

### Call durations [Menu 2-5]

This function allows you to view the duration of incoming and outgoing calls. You can clear the duration record by using Reset key after entering the security code.

### Last call [Menu 2-5-1]

If you press [Reset], you can delete last call duration.

### Received calls [Menu 2-5-2]

If you press  $\subseteq$  [Reset], you can delete received call duration. You need to input Security code.

### Dialled calls [Menu 2-5-3]

If you press  $\bigcirc$  [Reset], you can delete outgoing call duration. You need to input Security code.

### All calls [Menu 2-5-4]

If you press  $\subseteq$  [Reset], you can delete the duration of last call, received call, and outgoing call. You need to input Security code.

(Dependent on the network service)

### Call costs [Menu 2-6]

This network service allows you to check the last call cost and total call cost. To clear the counters, you need the PIN2 Code.

### Last call's cost [Menu 2-6-1]

This function allows you to reset the Last call's cost. You need to input PIN2 code.

### All calls' cost [Menu 2-6-2]

This function allows you to reset the All calls' cost. You need to input PIN2 code.



 The actual cost invoiced for calls by your service provider may vary depending upon network features, rounding-off for billing, taxes, etc.

### Cost settings [Menu 2-7]

### Call cost's limit [Menu 2-7-1]

This network service allows you to limit the costs of your calls to the number of charging units or units of currency. If you select on the number of remaining, the cost will be displayed in standby mode. You can make or receive a call as far as the specified cost limit is not exceeded.

### Set tariff [Menu 2-7-2]

The phone can change units and currency name. Contact your service provider for charging unit price. You may need the PIN2 code to select the currency or unit in this menu.



### Auto display [Menu 2-7-3]

When setting **On**, show the reminder cost in standby mode. When call end, show the last call costs.

### **GPRS information [Menu 2-8]**

You can check the amount of data transferred over the network through GPRS. In addition, you can also view how much time you are online.

- 1. Press ( OK) or ( Select).
- Scroll to the information you want to check. Your options include the following:

### WAP [Menu 2-8-1]

You can check the data volume and the duration through WAP.

- Last session [Menu 2-8-1-1]
- All session [Menu 2-8-1-2]

### External device [Menu 2-8-2]

You can check the data volume and the duration through GPRS by using external device such as serial port.

### Total data [Menu 2-8-3]

You can check the total amount of data through WAP and external device.

You can set the various functions of sub LCD.

  - You can set the graphic item.
- Sliding time [Menu 4-3-3-2]

You can set the interval of the sliding screen.

You can set the colour of font displayed on Sub LCD.

### Backlight [Menu 4-3-4]

You can set the light-up duration you want every time you press a key or open the flip.

### Contrast [Menu 4-3-5]

You can set the brightness of LCD you want by pressing [€, ].

You can set the menu relevant to a call by pressing  $\subseteq$  [Select] in **Settings** menu.

### Answer mode[Menu 4-4-1]

### • Flip open [Menu 4-4-1-1]

If you select this menu, you can receive an incoming call when only opening folder.

### • Press any key [Menu 4-4-1-2]

If you select this menu, you can receive an incoming call by pressing any key except  $\bigcirc$ ,  $\oint$  key.

### • Send only [Menu 4-4-1-3]

If you select this menu, you can receive a call only by pressing send key.

### Own number sending [Menu 4-4-2]

### (network and subscription dependent)

You can send your phone number to the other party dependent on setting this function.

### • Set by network [Menu 4-4-2-1]

If you select this, you can send your phone number depending on two line service such as line 1 or line 2.

### • On [Menu 4-4-2-2]

If you select this, you can send your phone number to the other party. That is, your phone number will be displayed on receiver's phone.

### • Off [Menu 4-4-2-3]

If you select this, you can't send your phone number.



### Call wait service [Menu 4-4-3]

If this service is enabled, you can accept a waiting (incoming) call. If this service is disabled, you cannot recognize the waiting (incoming) call.

### • Activate [Menu 4-4-3-1]

Activating the corresponding service.

### • Cancel [Menu 4-4-3-2]

Deactivating the corresponding service.

### • View status [Menu 4-4-3-3]

Checking the status of the service.

### Automatic redial [Menu 4-4-4]

### • On [Menu 4-4-4-1]

When this function is activated, your phone will try to make a call in case of failing to connect.

### • Off [Menu 4-4-4-2]

Your phone will not make any attempts to connect the call after failing to connect.

### Minute minder [Menu 4-4-5]

If you select **On**, you can check the call duration by beep sound every minute during a call.

### Phone line in use [Menu 4-4-6]

This function is only used if **Two-line service** is supported by the Service Provider. Two independent phone numbers are registered for the phone. This function provides you with the selection the currently used phone number.

 If you select Line 2 in the area where alternative line service is not supported, you can't make a call.

# Closed user group [Menu 4-4-7] (network dependent)

Use this function to restrict usage of the phone calls with numbers that belong to certain user groups. When this function is used, every outgoing and incoming call is associated with a group index. If a group index is specified, it is used for all outgoing calls. If no group index is specified, the network will use the preferential index (a specific index that is stored in the network).

Forwards to message center. This function is not included in **All data calls** and **All fax calls** menus.

Deactivating the corresponding service.

### View status [Menu 5-x-3]

Checking the status of the corresponding service.

### Cancel all diverts [Menu 5-7]
