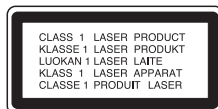



Power Save Mode - OPTIONAL

You can set up the unit into an economic power save mode.

In power-on status, press and hold POWER

() button for about 3 seconds.

- Nothing is displayed in the display window when the unit is turned off.

To cancel, press  (POWER), CLOCK, TIMER or PLAY MODE(DEMO).

In addition, this unit can play a DVD±R, DVD±RW, and CD-R or CD-RW that contains audio titles, MP3, WMA, JPEG or DivX files.

Notes

- Depending on the conditions of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) disc itself, some CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) discs cannot be played on the unit.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregularly shaped CDs (e.g., heart-shaped or octagonal). It may result in malfunctions.

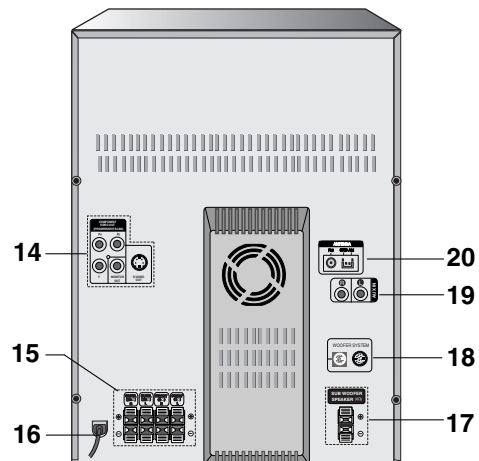
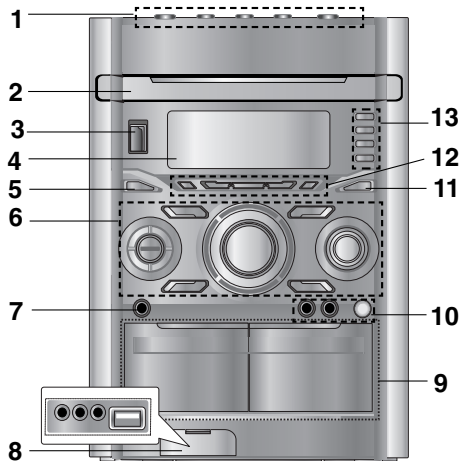
Regional Code

This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labelled as the same as the rear of the unit or “ALL”.

Notes on Regional Codes

- Most DVD discs have a globe with one or more numbers in it clearly visible on the cover. This number must match your unit's regional code or the disc cannot play.
- If you try to play a DVD with a different regional code from your player, the message “Check Regional Code” appears on the TV screen.

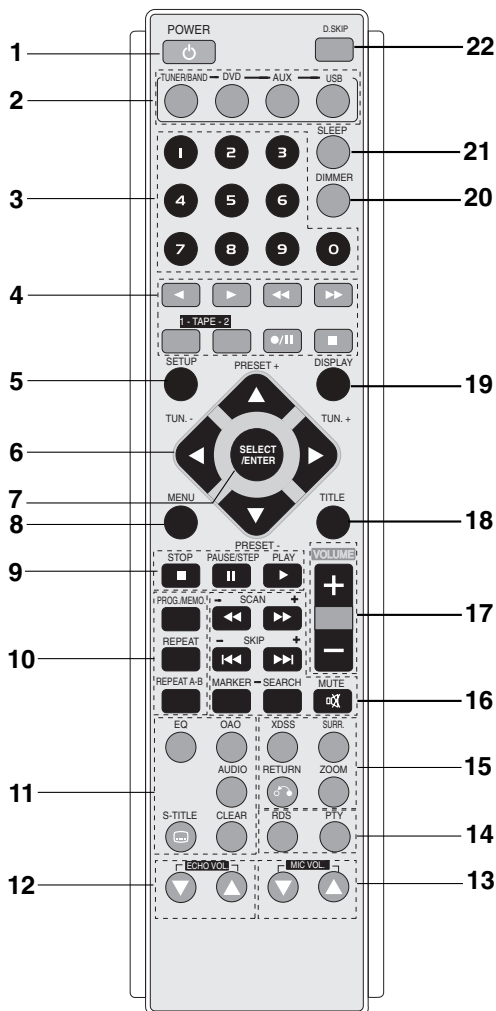

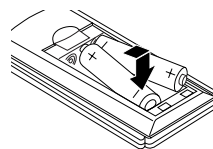
INTRODUCTION

Remote Control Operation Range

Point the remote control toward the remote sensor and press the buttons.

- **Distance:** About 23 ft (7 m) from the front of the remote sensor
- **Angle:** About 30° in each direction of the front of the remote sensor

Remote control battery installation



Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert two R03 (size AAA) batteries with + and - aligned correctly.

Caution

Do not mix old and new batteries. Never mix different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).

Connections

Connecting to a TV

Make one of the following connections, depending on the capabilities of your existing equipment.

Tips

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the unit. Use one of the connections described below.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, VCR, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.

Caution

- Make sure the unit is connected directly to the TV. Select the correct AV input on your TV.
- Do not connect your unit to TV via your VCR. The DVD image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

Video connection

Connect the VIDEO OUT jack from the unit to the VIDEO IN jack on the TV using the video cable supplied (V).

S-Video connection

Connect the S-VIDEO OUT jack on the unit to the S-VIDEO IN jack on the TV using the S-Video cable (S).

Component Video (Color Stream®) connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (PROGRESSIVE SCAN) (Y Pb Pr) jacks from the unit to the corresponding jacks on the TV using a Y Pb Pr cable (C).

Progressive Scan (ColorStream® pro) connection

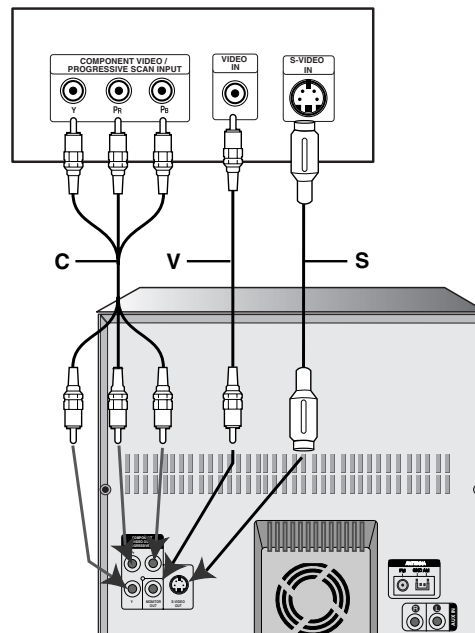
- If your television is a high-definition or “digital ready” television, you may take advantage of this unit’s progressive scan output for higher video resolution.
- If your TV does not accept the Progressive Scan format, the picture will appear scrambled if you try Progressive Scan on the unit.

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (PROGRESSIVE SCAN) (Y Pb Pr) jacks from the unit to the corresponding jacks on the TV using an optional Y Pb Pr cable (C).

Notes

- Set the Progressive to “On” in the Setup menu for progressive signal, see the page 14.

Rear of TV

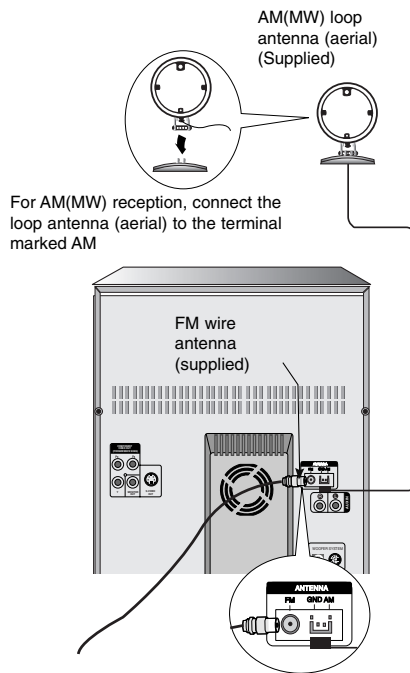


Connections

Connecting to Antenna

Connect the supplied FM/AM antennas to listen to the radio.

- Connect the AM loop antenna to the AM antenna connector.
- Connect the FM wire antenna to the FM antenna connector.



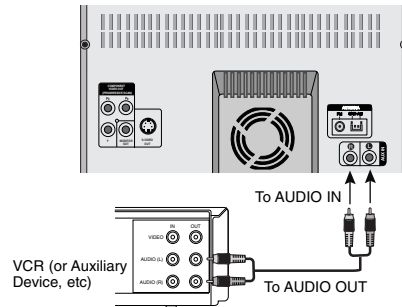
Notes

- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM loop antenna away from the unit and other component.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
- After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it as horizontal as possible.

Connecting to Auxiliary Equipment

You can use VCR or other unit connected to the AUX connector.

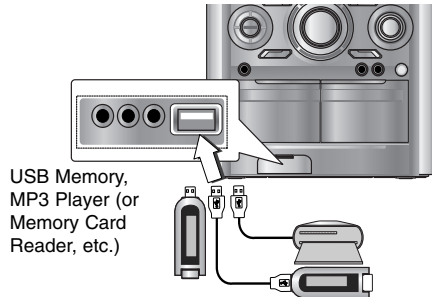
This unit receives the analog signal from auxiliary equipment.



- 1** Connect a VCR or auxiliary device, etc to the AUX connector.
- 2** Press the AUX /AV button on the front panel or AUX button on remote control until the "AUX" indicator is displayed in the display window.

Connections

Connecting USB



- 1 Connect the USB port of USB memory (or MP3 player, etc) to the USB connector on the front panel.
- 2 Select USB function by pressing the USB button on the front panel or the remote control. The "USB" is displayed in the display window.

To Remove the USB from the unit

1. Choose a different function mode or press STOP (■) twice in a row.
2. Remove the USB from the unit.

Notes

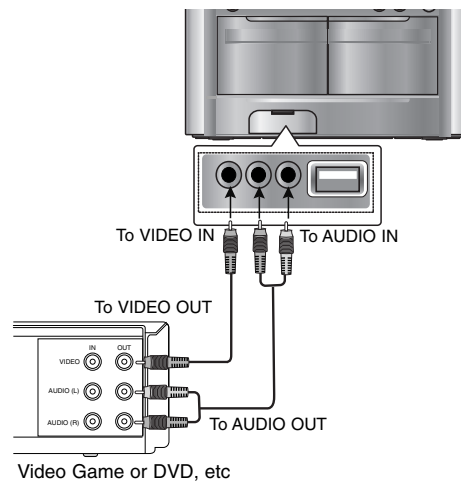
- Do not disconnect the USB device in operating.
- Music files (MP3/WMA), image files (JPEG) and DivX files can be played.
- This unit can not use USB HUB.
- Recommended Memory Card
Compact Flash Card (CFC), Micro Drive (MD), Smart Media Card (SMC), Memory Stick (MS), Secure Digital Card (SD), Multi Media Card (MMC), Memory Stick Pro (MS-Pro)
- Compatible with : FAT16,32
- Only use the memory cards recommended.
- Devices which require additional program installation when you have connected the unit to a computer are not supported.
- In case of a USB HDD, make sure to connect an auxiliary power cord to the USB HDD for proper operation. A primary partition of drive is supported up to four. If there is an extension partition it is not supported.
- If there are two or more drives on the USB device, the folder of the drive is displayed on the screen. If you want to move to the previous menu after you select a folder, press RETURN.
- Digital camera and mobile phone are not supported.

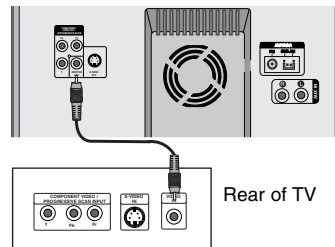
Optional Equipment Connections

Connection of the TV/Monitor, Video Game or DVD, etc

- 1 Connect the video/audio output connector of auxiliary device to the GAME LINK INPUT (VIDEO IN, AUDIO L/R) connector.



- 2 Connect the video input connector of TV/Monitor to the VIDEO OUT connector.



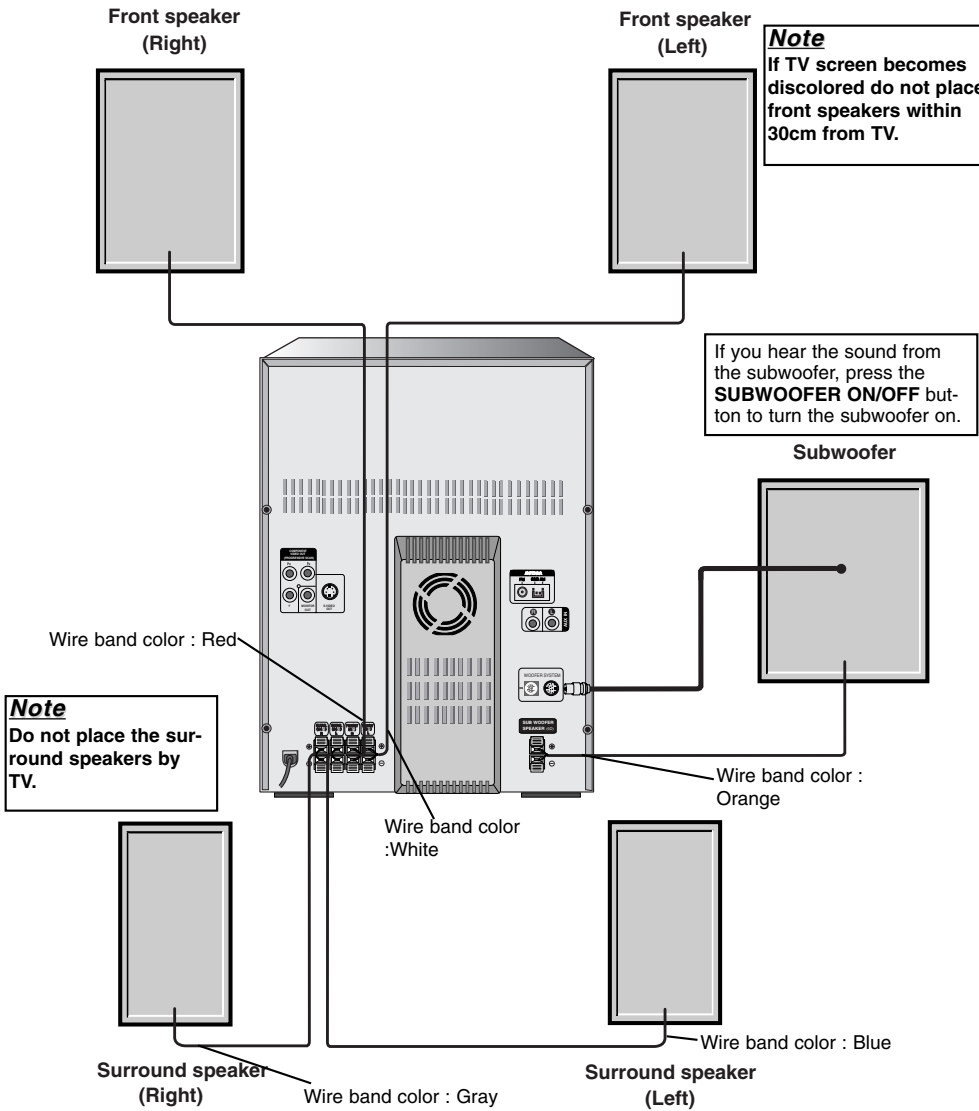
- 3 Press A/V button on the front panel or AUX button on the remote control to select A/V (Audio/Video) function.

"A/V" will be shown in the display window.

Connections

Speaker System Connection

Connect the speakers using the supplied speaker cables by matching the colors of the terminals and those of the cords. To obtain the best possible surround sound, adjust the speaker parameters (distance, level, etc.).



PREPARATION

Notes


- Be sure to match the speaker cable to the appropriate terminal on the components: + to + and - to -. If the cables are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack base.
- If you use front speakers with low maximum input rating, adjust the volume carefully to avoid excessive output on the speakers.
- Connect the Front Left/Right speaker correctly. If it is reversed, the sound may be distorted.

Before Operation

Volume Adjustment

- Turn VOLUME knob clockwise to increase the sound level, or counterclockwise to decrease it.
- Press VOLUME + to increase the sound level, or use VOLUME - to decrease it on the remote control.

MUTE

Press **MUTE** to , press again to restore. You can mute your unit in order, for example, to answer the telephone, “” indicator flashes in the display window. To cancel it , press mute again or volume (-/+) on the remote control.

Headphone Jack

Connect a stereo headphone plug (ø6.3mm) into the headphone jack. The speakers are automatically disconnected when you plug in the headphones (not supplied).

EQUALIZER Effect

You can choose 12 fixed sound impressions and adjust the BASS, MIDDLE and TREBLE.

- You can select a desired sound mode by using **EQ** button on the front panel or remote control. When a sound mode passes by with the left side from the right, press **EQ**

NORMAL → POP → CLASSIC → ROCK → DRAMA
→ JAZZ → SALSA → MUSICAL → SAMBA →
ADVENTURE → PUMP → EXTREME → NORMAL...

- You can select a mode by using **USER EQ** button on the front panel.
 1. Press the **USER EQ** button for more than 1 second. “BASS 0” will appear in the display window.
 2. Turn the **MULTI JOG**. shuttle clockwise or counterclockwise to set the sound level you want. (MIN, -4 ~ +4, MAX steps).
 3. Select the BASS, MIDDLE or TREBLE you want by pressing the **USER EQ** buttons on the front panel.
 4. To cancel the USER MODE, press the **USER EQ** button until “USER MODE OFF” appears.

XDSS (Extreme Dynamic Sound System)

Press XDSS to reinforce treble and bass.

- The “XDSS ON” indicator lights up.

To cancel it press XDSS again.

- The “XDSS NORMAL” indicator lights up.

OA0 (Orientation Acoustic Optimizer) ON/OFF

Press OA0 to reinforce the original sound.

- The “OA0 ON” indicator lights up.

To cancel it press OA0 again.

- The “OA0 NORMAL” indicator lights up.

MP3 Optimizer

This function is optimized for compressible MP3/WMA file. It improves the bass sound to make sweet sound. Each time you press **MP3 OPT** the setting changes in the following order.

MP3-OPT ON ↔ MP3-OPT NORMAL

SURROUND Effect

You can select a desired surround mode by using **SURROUND** button on the front panel or **SURR.** button on the remote control.

When a surround mode passes by with the left side from the right, press SURROUND or SURR..

SURROUND OFF → CINEMA → EALA → TUNNEL →
HALL → THEATER → VOCAL → CHURCH → DISCO
→ SURROUND OFF..

DIMMER


This function turns the LED (Light-emitting diode) of front panel off and darkens the display window by half in power-on status.

Press **DIMMER** once. The LED (Light-emitting diode) of front panel is turned off.

If you press it once more, the display window will be darkened by half. To cancel it, press the button again.

DEMO

Press **DEMO** in power off state to demonstrate the function in the display window.

To cancel it, press () **POWER** or **DEMO** again. During demonstration in power-on status, you can cancel it by using the **CLOCK**, **TIMER** buttons.

Selecting the sound system

You can enjoy different sounds by selecting the sound mode you want.

Turn **MODE SELECT** knob on the subwoofer to select the sound mode.

LINK ON → SURROUND 1 → SURROUND 2

Using the subwoofer


You can use the sound of the subwoofer to enhance the bass.

Press **SUBWOOFER ON/OFF** on the subwoofer to turn on the subwoofer.

SUB_WOOFER ON ↔ SUB_WOOFER OFF

Before Operation

Setting the Clock

- 1 Press CLOCK.**
(If the clock requires setting, press and hold CLOCK for more than 2 seconds.)
- The hours display begins to blink.
- 2 Select either the 12 hour cycle or the 24 hour cycle by turning MULTI JOG. shuttle.**

(12HR) or (24HR)
- 3 Press SET/CDII to confirm the selected hour cycle.**
- 4 Use MULTI JOG. shuttle to set the current hour.**
- 5 Press SET/CDII.**
- 6 Use MULTI JOG. shuttle to set current minutes.**
- 7 Press SET/CDII and the correct time is shown on the display.**

Notes

When the clock is not appeared in the display window, follow as below.

- In case the clock is set, press the CLOCK button. The clock will be shown in the display window for about 5 seconds.
- In case the clock is not set, the clock will blink in the display window for about 1 minute. Set the clock as above.

Sleep Timer Function

When the sleep timer is set, the unit automatically turns off after the specified time has elapsed.

- 1 To specify the time delay before the power is turned off, press SLEEP.**
In the display window you can see *SLEEP 180* for about 5 seconds. This means that the system turns off automatically after 180 minutes.
- 2 Each time you press SLEEP the setting changes in the following order.**
SLEEP 180 → 150 → 120 → 90 → 80 → 70 → 60 → 50 → 40 → 30 → 20 → 10 → OFF (No display) → SLEEP 180...
- 3 To check the remaining time until the power is turned off.**
While the sleep function is active, press **SLEEP** briefly. The remaining until the unit is turns off, is displayed for about 5 seconds.

Note


If you press **SLEEP** while the sleep time is displayed, the SLEEP time is reset.

To cancel Sleep Timer setting

If you wish to stop the function, press the **SLEEP** button repeatedly until "*SLEEP 10*" appears, and then press **SLEEP** once again after "*SLEEP 10*" shows on the display.

Using Microphone - OPTIONAL

You can sing to a music source by connecting a microphone to the unit.

- 1 Connect your microphone to the MIC1/ MIC 2 Jacks.**
"  " will be shown in the display window.
- 2 Play a music you want.**
- 3 Sing along with the accompaniment.**
Adjust the microphone volume by turning MIC VOL. knob. (MIN,1 - 14, MAX steps)

For your reference



You can record using microphone. Refer to the "Recording" explanation section.

Notes

- When not using the microphone, set the MIC VOL. knob to minimum or turn off the MICs and remove the microphone from the MIC jacks.
- If the microphone is set too near the speaker, a howling sound may be produced. In this case, move the microphone away from the speaker or decrease the sound level by using the MIC VOL. control.
- If sound through the microphone is extremely loud, it may be distorted. In this case, turn the MIC VOL. control toward minimum.

To Adjust ECHO Volume

You can give an echo effect to the sound from the microphones.

Press the ECHO VOL. ( / ) on the remote control to increase the echo volume or decrease it. (MIN,1 - 14, MAX steps)

Before Operation

Timer Function

With the TIMER function you can have the radio reception, CD play, USB play and TAPE play turned on and off at the desired time.

1 Press CLOCK to check the current time.

For your reference

If you don't set clock, timer function doesn't work.

2 Press TIMER to enter the timer setting mode.

"TUNER→CD →USB→TAPE" flash in the display window in turn.

For your reference

If you want to correct the previous memorized TIMER setting, press and hold the **TIMER** button for more than 2 seconds.

- The previously memorized time and "Ⓞ" indicator appears in the display window.

3 Press SET/CDII when the desired function flashes.

4 1. a. When you select TUNER function, 'PLAY' and 'REC' indicator flash in the display window alternately for about 3 seconds.

- 'PLAY' indicator : TUNER play only
'REC' indicator : TUNER play and recording
- b. Press SET/CDII when the desired function flashes.

c. Select the previously memorized preset number by pressing ◀▶ on the front panel and press SET/CDII.

'ON TIME' indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.

2. When you select CD, USB or TAPE function,

ON TIME' indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.

5 Set the hour to switch on by turning MULTI JOG. shuttle.

6 Press SET/CDII to confirm the hour to switch on time.

7 Set the minute to switch on by turning MULTI JOG. shuttle.

8 Press SET/CDII to confirm the minute to switch on.

'OFF TIME' indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.

9 Set the hour to switch on by turning MULTI JOG. shuttle.

10 Press SET/CDII.

11 Set the minute to switch off by turning MULTI JOG. shuttle.

12 Press SET/CDII.

13 Adjust the volume level by turning MULTI JOG. shuttle.

14 Press SET/CDII.

"Ⓞ" appears in the display window and the timer setting has been completed.

15 Switch the system off.

The selected timer functions are automatically switched on and off at the preset times.

To cancel or check the timer

Each time the **TIMER** button is pressed you can select the timer set or cancel. You can also check the timer setting status.

To activate or check the timer, press the **TIMER** button repeatedly so that "Ⓞ" appears in the display window.

To cancel the **TIMER**, press the **TIMER** button repeatedly so that "Ⓞ" disappears from the display window.

Notes

If you insert a DVD or DivX files except audio CD/MP3/WMA on the unit, the timer function will operate to the TUNER.

Before Operation

Displaying Disc Information On -screen

You can display various information about the disc loaded on-screen.

- 1 Press DISPLAY to show various playback information.
The displayed items differ depending on the disc type or playing status.
- 2 You can select an item by pressing \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown and change or select the setting by pressing \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright .
 - Title (Track) – Current title (or track) number/ total number of titles (or tracks).
 - Chapter – Current chapter number/ total number of chapters.
 - Time – Elapsed playing time.
 - Audio – Selected audio language or channel.
 - Subtitle – Selected subtitle.
 - Angle – Selected angle/ total number of angles.
 - Sound – Selected sound mode.

Note

If any button is not pressed for a few seconds, the on-screen display disappears.

Initial Settings

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound. You can also set a language for the subtitles and the Setup menu, among other things. For details on each Setup menu item, see the pages 13 to 16.

To display and exit the Menu:

Press SETUP to display the menu. A second press of SETUP will take you back to the initial screen.

To go to the next level:

Press \blacktriangleright on the remote control.

To go back to the previous level:

Press \blacktriangleleft on the remote control.

GENERAL OPERATION

- 1 Press SETUP. The Setup menu appears.
- 2 Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select the desired option then press \blacktriangleright to move to the second level. The screen shows the current setting for the selected item, as well as alternate setting(s).
- 3 Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select the second desired option and then press \blacktriangleright to move to the third level.
- 4 Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select the desired setting then press SELECT/ENTER to confirm your selection. Some items require additional steps.
- 5 Press SETUP or PLAY to exit the Setup menu.

Select a language for the Setup menu and the on-screen display.

Disc Audio / Subtitle / Menu

Select the language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.

Original – Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

Other – To select another language, press numeric buttons and then SELECT/ENTER to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on the page 30. If you enter the wrong language code, press CLEAR.

TV Aspect

- 4:3** – Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.
- 16:9** – Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

Display Mode

The display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to "4:3".

Letterbox – Displays a wide picture with bands on the upper and lower portions of the screen.

Progressive Scan Video provides the highest quality pictures with less flickering.

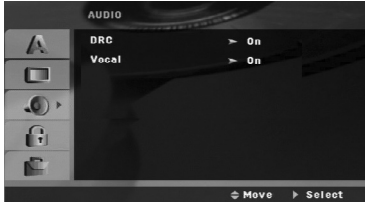

Caution

Once the setting for progressive scan output is entered, an image will only be visible on a progressive scan compatible TV or monitor. Dynamic Range Control (DRC)

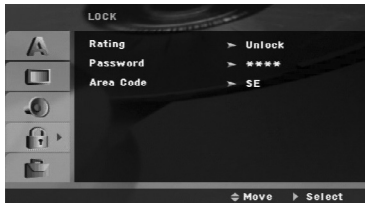
With the DVD*1 format, you can hear a program's soundtrack in the most accurate and realistic presentation, thanks to digital audio technology. However, you may wish to compress the dynamic range of the audio output (the difference between the loudest sounds and the quietest ones). Then, you may listen to a movie at a lower volume without losing clarity of sound. Set DRC to On for this effect.

Vocal

Set Vocal to On only when a multi-channel karaoke DVD is playing. The karaoke channels on the disc will mix into normal stereo sound.

LOCK (Parental Control)



Rating

Blocks playback of rated DVDs based on their contents. Not all discs are rated.

- 1 Select "Rating" on the LOCK menu then press **▶**.
- 2 To access the LOCK options, you must input the password you have created. If you have not yet entered password, you are prompted to do so. Input a password and press SELECT/ENTER. Enter it again and press SELECT/ENTER. to verify. If you make a mistake before pressing ENTER, press CLEAR.

- 3 Select a rating from 1 to 8 using the **▲** / **▼** buttons.
Rating 1-8: Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

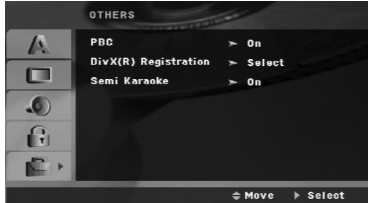




Last Scene Memory **DVD**

This unit memorizes the last scene from the last disc that is viewed. The last scene remains in the memory even if you remove the disc from the unit or switch off the unit. If you load a disc that has the scene memorized, the scene is automatically recalled.

Note

This unit does not memorize the scene of a disc if you switch off the receiver before commencing to play the disc.

System Select

You must select an appropriate system mode for your TV system. If NO DISC appears in the display window, press and hold PAUSE/STEP remote control for more than 5 seconds to be able to select a system (PAL, NTSC or AUTO).

-When the selected system is not compatible with the system of your TV, normal colour picture may not be displayed.





NTSC: Select when the unit is connected with NTSC-TV.

Camera Angle **DVD**

To Select a disc directly

Playing an Audio CD or MP3/WMA file

This unit can play Audio CDs or MP3/WMA files.

MP3/ WMA/ Audio CD

Once you insert an MP3/WMA files recording media Audio CD, a menu appears on the TV screen.

Press / to select a track/file and then press PLAY () or SELECT/ ENTER, and playback starts. You can use variable playback functions. Refer to the page 17.

ID3 TAG

When playing a file containing information such as track titles, you can see the information by pressing DISPLAY repeatedly. The information [Folder and file name, Song, Artist, Album, Genre, Comment, Time information] of the MP3/WMA file will be shown in the display window and TV screen.

To move next or previous files, press the SKIP (/) button.

Tips

- Press MENU to move to the next page.
- On a CD with MP3/WMA and JPEG, you can switch MP3/WMA and JPEG. Press TITLE, and the word MUSIC or PHOTO on top of the menu is highlighted.

MP3 / WMA disc compatibility with this player is limited as follows:

Programmed Playback

The program function enables you to store your favorite tracks from any disc in the unit memory. A program can contain 300 tracks.

1. Insert a disc.
Audio CD and MP3/WMA Discs:
2. Select a track on the "List", and then press PROG./MEMO. or select " (Add)" icon and then press SELECT/ ENTER to place the selected track on the "Program" list. Repeat to place additional tracks on the list.

Note

You can add all tracks in the disc. Select " (Add All)" icon then press SELECT/ ENTER

3. Select the track you want to start playing on the "Program" list. Press MENU to move to the next page.
4. Press PLAY () or SELECT/ENTER to start. Playback begins in the order in which you programmed the tracks. Playback stops after all of the tracks on the "Program" list have played once.

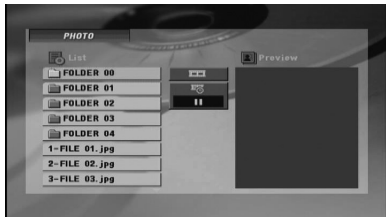

- 2 Press **▲/▼** to select a folder, and press **SELECT/ENTER**. A list of files in the folder appears.

Tip

If you are in a file list and want to return to the Folder list, use the **▲/▼** buttons on the remote control to highlight “**⏪**” and press **SELECT/ENTER** to return to the previous menu screen.

- 3 **If you want to view a particular file, press **▲/▼** to highlight a file and press **SELECT/ENTER** or **PLAY(▶)**.**
Slide Show starts from the selected file if Speed option is not Off.
While viewing a file, you can press **STOP(■)** to move to the previous menu (JPEG menu).

Tips

- Press **MENU** to move to the next page.
- There are four Slide Speed options: **⏪** : > (Slow), >> (Normal), >>> (Fast) and **II** (off).
Use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to highlight the Speed. Then, use **◀/▶** to select the option you want to use then press **SELECT/ENTER**.
- If you set Speed option to Off, Slide Show is not active.

Slide Show

Use **▲/▼/◀/▶** to highlight the **⏪** (Slide Show) then press **SELECT/ENTER**.

Moving to another File

Press **⏪** or **⏩** once during viewing a picture to advance to the next file or to the previous file.

Still Picture

- 1 Press **PAUSE/STEP** during slide show.
The player will now go into the **PAUSE** mode.
- 2 To return to the slide show, press **PLAY(▶)** or press **PAUSE/STEP** again.

To rotate picture

Press **▲/▼/◀/▶** during showing a picture to rotate the picture clockwise or counter-clockwise.

Zoom

The Zoom function allows you to enlarge or reduce a video image.

- 1 Press **ZOOM** repeatedly.
Zoom on ↔ Zoom off
- 2 Use the **▲/▼/◀/▶** buttons on the “Zoom on” mode.

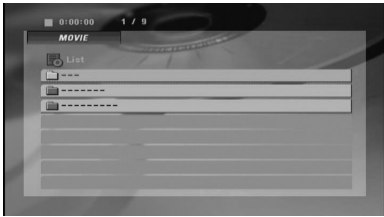
JPEG disc compatibility with this player is limited as follows:

- Depending upon the size and number of JPEG files, it could take a long time for the DVD player to read the disc's contents. If you don't see an on-screen display after several minutes, some of the files may be too large — reduce the resolution of the JPEG files to less than 2760 x 2048 pixels and burn another disc.
- The total number of files and folders on the disc should be less than 999.
- Some discs may be incompatible due to a different recording format or the condition of disc.
- Ensure that all the selected files have the “.jpg” extensions when copying into the CD layout.

Operation with DivX Disc

The unit can play the DivX files.

The DivX menu appears on the TV screen.



- 2** Press **▲** / **▼** to select a folder, and press **SELECT/ENTER** to see the folder contents.

Tip

If you are in a file list and want to return to the Folder list, use the **▲** / **▼** buttons on the remote control to highlight "⋮" and press **SELECT/ENTER** to return to the previous menu screen.

Operation with RADIO

Presetting the radio stations

You can preset 50 stations for FM and AM. Before tuning, make sure that you have turned the volume down to the minimum level.

- 1 Press TUNER/BAND on the remote control to show either FM or AM in the display window. Or Press TUNER on the front panel.**
Every time you press this button, AM and FM changes alternately.
- 2 Select a station you want by pressing TUNING (-/+) on the front panel or ◀/▶ on the remote control.**

Notes

• Automatic Tuning

Press TUNING (-/+) or ◀/▶ for more than 0.5 second.

- Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

• Manual Tuning

Press TUNING (-/+) or ◀/▶ briefly and repeatedly.

- 3 Press PROG./MEMO. on the remote control.**
A preset number will flash in the display window.
- 4 Press ▲/▼ on the remote control to select the preset number you want.**
- 5 Press PROG./MEMO. again.**
The station is stored.
- 6 Repeat the steps 1 (or 2) to 5 to store other stations.**

To clear all memorized stations

Press and hold PROG./MEMO. on the remote control for about two seconds, "ERASE ALL" appears in the display window and then press PROG./MEMO. on the remote control, the stations are cleared.

For your reference

If all stations have already been entered, "FULL" message will appear in the display window for a moment and then a preset number will flash.

To change the preset number, follow the steps 4-5 .

To recall preset numbers

Press and hold ▲/▼ on the remote control until the desired preset number appears or press the button repeatedly.

Listening to the radio

- 1 Press TUNER/BAND on the remote control to show either FM or AM in the display window. Or Press TUNER on the front panel.**
The last received station is tuned in.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ on the remote control repeatedly to select the preset station you want.**
Each time you press this button, the unit tunes in the next preset station.
- 3 Adjust the volume by rotating VOLUME control knob (or pressing VOLUME (-/+) on the remote control) repeatedly.**

To listen to non-preset radio stations

- For manual tuning, see "Manual Tuning".
- For automatic tuning, see "Automatic Tuning".

To select a preset radio station directly

You can use the number buttons on the remote control to select a preset radio station directly.

For example, to listen to the preset station 4, press 4 on the remote control. To listen to the preset station 19, press 1 and then 9 (within 3 seconds).

To turn the radio off

Press POWER to turn off the unit or select another function mode (DVD/CD,TAPE, AUX or USB).

For your reference

• If a FM program is noisy :

Press ST./MO. repeatedly so that "(•••)" disappears in the display window. There will be no stereo effect, but the reception will improve. Press ST./MO. again to restore the stereo effect.

RDS Function : OPTIONAL

About RDS : OPTIONAL

This unit is equipped with RDS (Radio Data System), which brings a wide range of information from FM radio. RDS is a system for transmitting station call signs or network information, a description of station programme type text message about the station or specifics of musical selection and the correct time.

RDS Tuning : OPTIONAL

When a FM station containing RDS data is tuned in, the unit will automatically display the station's call sign and the RDS indicator will light in the Display Window as well as indicators for the programme type recognition (PTY), Radio Text (RT), Clock Time (CT) and RDS services programme (PS) if transmitted by the station.

RDS Display Options : OPTIONAL

The RDS system is capable of transmitting a wide variety of information in addition to the initial call sign that appears when a station is first tuned. In normal RDS operation the display will indicate the station name, broadcast network or call letters. Pressing **RDS** on the front panel enables you to cycle through the various data types in the sequence:

(FREQUENCY → PTY → RT → CT → PS)



- **PTY (Programme type recognition)-** The programme type is shown in the display window.
- **RT (Radio text recognition)-** The radio station's name is displayed in the display window.
- **CT (Time controlled by the channel)-** Enable the unit to receive the actual time and show it on the display window.
- **PS (Programme Service name)-** The programme title is displayed in the display window.

Note

Some RDS stations may not choose to include some of these additional features. If the data required for the selected mode is not being transmitted, the Display Window will show a **PTY NONE, RT NONE, CT NONE, or PS NONE** message.

Programme Search (PTY) : OPTIONAL

A major benefit of RDS is its ability to encode broadcasts with Programme Type (PTY) codes that indicate the type of material being broadcast. The following list shows the abbreviations used to indicate each PTY along with an explanation of the PTY.

You may search for a specific Programme Type (PTY) by following these steps:

- 1 Press TUNER (or TUNER/BAND) to select FM mode.**
- 2 Press PTY on the remote control, the display will show the last PTY in use.**
- 3 Press PTY repeatedly to select a desired PTY.**
- 4 When the PTY is selected, press PTY.**
The unit will go into an automatic search mode. When a station is tuned, the search will stop.

Operation with TAPE

Basic Playback

("NO TAPE" appears in the display window.)

Recording

Basic Setting

- 1** Select a function you want to record except tape function.
- 2** Open the cassette deck TAPE 2 and insert a blank cassette into the cassette compartment.
Set the recording direction
Press **PLAY MODE** repeatedly to set the recording direction.

Recording from Radio, CD or Auxiliary source

- 2** Press **▶** (or **◀**).
The recording begins.
To pause the recording
Press **●/||** or **●REC/PAUSE||**.
To Stop the recording
Press **STOP(■)**.

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CD to Tape Synchronized Recording

The CD synchro recording function dubs a complete CD and programmed titles automatically into a cassette.

- 1** Press **DVD** button on the remote control.
- 2** Press **CD SYNC.** in stop mode.
"REC" flashes and "CD SYNC." displays in the display window.
- 3** The synchronized recording is started automatically after about 7 seconds.

Notes

- If you wish to record from the desired track, select the desired track with **◀◀▶▶** before commencing CD synchro recording.
- You can not change any mode during recording.
