# For Your Safety

# Guidelines for safe and efficient use

Please read these simple guidelines. Not following these guidelines may be dangerous or illegal.

## Exposure to radio frequency energy

### THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) recommended by international guidelines (ICNIRP). These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organisations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit stated in the international guidelines is 2.0 W/kg\*. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the device. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with the European R&TTE directive must be shown. This directive includes as one essential requirement the protection of the health and the safety for the user and any other person.

## Guidelines for safe and efficient use

The highest SAR value for this device when tested for use at the ear is 0.562 W/kg.

This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used either in the normal use position against the ear or when positioned at least 1.5 cm away from the body. When a carry case, belt clip or holder is used for body-worn operation, it should not contain metal and should position the product at least 1.5 cm away from your body. In order to transmit data files or messages, this device requires a quality connection to the network. In some cases, transmission of data files or messages may be delayed until such a connection is available. Ensure the above separation distance instructions are followed until the transmission is completed. The highest SAR value for this device when tested for use at the body is 1.31 W/kg.

\* The SAR limit for mobile devices used by the public is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The guidelines incorporate a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. SAR values may vary

depending on national reporting requirements and the network band. For SAR information in other regions please look under product information at [www.lgmobile.com](http://www.lgmobile.com).

### FCC SAR information

Your mobile device is also designed to meet the requirements for exposure to radio waves established by the Federal Communications Commission (USA) and Industry Canada. These requirements set a SAR limit of 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of tissue. The highest SAR value reported under this standard during product certification for use at the ear is 0.457 W/kg and when properly worn on the body is 0.37 W/kg. Additionally, this device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 0.79 inches (2cm) between the users body and the back of the phone. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.79 inches (2cm) must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone.

## Product care and maintenance

### WARNING!

*Only use batteries, chargers and accessories approved for use with this particular phone model. The use of any other types may invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.*

- ▶ Do not disassemble this unit. Take it to a qualified service technician when repair work is required.
- ▶ Keep away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, and personal computers.
- ▶ The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators or cookers.
- ▶ Do not drop.
- ▶ Do not subject this unit to mechanical vibration or shock.
- ▶ Switch off the phone in any area where you are required by special regulations. For example, do not use your phone in hospitals as it may affect sensitive medical equipment.
- ▶ Do not handle the phone with wet hands while it is being charged. It may cause an electric shock and can seriously damage your phone.
- ▶ Do not charge a handset near flammable material as the handset can become hot and create a fire hazard.
- ▶ Use a dry cloth to clean the exterior of the unit (do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner or alcohol).

- ▶ Do not expose the phone to liquid or moisture.
- ▶ Use the accessories like earphones cautiously. Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily.

## Guidelines for safe and efficient use

### Efficient phone operation

#### Electronic and medical devices

All mobile phones may get interference, which could affect performance.

- ▶ Do not use your mobile phone near medical equipment without requesting permission. Please consult your doctor to determine if operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical device.
- ▶ Some hearing aids might be disturbed by mobile phones.
- ▶ Minor interference may affect TVs, radios, PCs, etc.

### Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

### Road safety

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile phones in the area when you drive.

- ▶ Do not use a hand-held phone while driving.

- ▶ Give full attention to driving.
- ▶ Use a hands-free kit, if available.
- ▶ Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.
- ▶ RF energy may affect some electronic systems in your vehicle such as car stereos and safety equipment.
- ▶ When your vehicle is equipped with an air bag, do not obstruct with installed or portable wireless equipment. It can cause the air bag to fail or cause serious injury due to improper performance.
- ▶ If you are listening to music whilst out and about, please ensure that the volume is at a reasonable level so that you are aware of your surroundings. This is particularly imperative when near roads.

### Avoid damage to your hearing

Damage to your hearing can occur if you are exposed to loud sound for long periods of time. We therefore recommend that you do not turn on or off the handset close to your ear.

We also recommend that music and call volumes are set to a reasonable level.

## Blasting area

Do not use the phone where blasting is in progress. Observe restrictions, and follow any regulations or rules.

## Potentially explosive atmospheres

- ▶ Do not use the phone at a refueling point.
- ▶ Do not use near fuel or chemicals.
- ▶ Do not transport or store flammable gas, liquid, or explosives in the same compartment of your vehicle as your mobile phone and accessories.

## In aircraft

**Wireless devices can cause interference in aircraft.**

- ▶ Turn your mobile phone off before boarding any aircraft.
- ▶ Do not use it on the ground without permission from the crew.

## Children

Keep the phone in a safe place out of the reach of small children. It includes small parts which may cause a choking hazard if detached.

## Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

## Emergency calls

Emergency calls may not be available under all mobile networks. Therefore, you should never depend solely on the phone for emergency calls. Check with your local service provider.

## Battery information and care

- ▶ You do not need to completely discharge the battery before recharging. Unlike other battery systems, there is no memory effect that could compromise the battery's performance.
- ▶ Use only LG batteries and chargers. LG chargers are designed to maximize the battery life.
- ▶ Do not disassemble or short-circuit the battery pack.
- ▶ Keep the metal contacts of the battery pack clean.
- ▶ Replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. The battery pack may be recharged hundreds of times until it needs replacing.

## Guidelines for safe and efficient use

- ▶ Recharge the battery if it has not been used for a long time to maximize usability.
- ▶ Do not expose the battery charger to direct sunlight or use it in high humidity, such as in the bathroom.
- ▶ Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, this may deteriorate the battery performance.
- ▶ There is risk of explosion if the battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
- ▶ Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions. Please recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- ▶ If you need to replace the battery, take it to the nearest authorized LG Electronics service point or dealer for assistance.
- ▶ Always unplug the charger from the wall socket after the phone is fully charged to save unnecessary power consumption of the charger.

- ▶ You can end a call.
- ▶ You can go back to standby mode by pressing this key when in a menu.


### Clear key

Press once to delete a character.


### Send key

# Getting Started

## Installing the USIM card and battery

### Installing the USIM card.

Your USIM card contains your phone number, service details and contacts and must be inserted into your handset. If your USIM card is removed then your handset becomes unusable (except for emergency calls) until a valid one is inserted. Always disconnect the charger and other accessories from your handset before inserting or removing your USIM card. Slide the USIM card into the USIM card holder. Make sure that the USIM card is properly inserted and the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards. To remove the USIM card, press down lightly and pull it in the reverse direction.



To remove the USIM card

### Note

- The metal contact of the USIM card can easily be damaged by scratches. Pay special attention to the USIM card while handling. Follow the instructions supplied with the USIM card.



To insert the USIM card

### Installing the battery.


Slide the battery upwards and push down until it snaps into place.



### To remove the battery.

Turn the power off. (If the power is left on, there is a chance you could lose the stored telephone numbers and messages.)

After removing the battery cover, gently lift the battery from its compartment.



## Getting Started

### Charging the battery

Before connecting the power adapter to the phone you must first install the battery.



1. Lift the charger connector cover on the right-hand side of the phone to uncover its socket.
2. Push the small end of the power adapter into the socket as shown in the diagram above.
3. Connect the other end of the power adapter to the mains socket.



#### Note

- ▶ Only use the charger included in the box.

4. The moving bars on the battery icon will stop after charging is complete.
5. Ensure the battery is fully charged before using the phone for the first time.

#### CAUTION!

- Do not force the connector as this may damage the phone and/or the power adapter.
- Always use the correct plug adapter when charging your phone abroad.
- Do not remove your battery or the USIM card while charging your phone.

#### WARNING!

- Unplug the power cord and charger during lightning storms to avoid electric shock or fire.
- Make sure that no sharp-edged items, such as animal teeth or nails, come into contact with the battery as this may cause a fire.

## Disconnecting the charger

Disconnect the power adapter from the phone as shown in the diagram below.



## How to use a microSD memory card



MicroSD memory card

### How to insert a microSD memory card

1. Turn the phone off. Inserting or removing the microSD when the phone is on may damage the files stored in the memory card.

2. Lift the plastic cover which protects the microSD slot.



3. Insert the memory card into the slot. The gold contacts must be kept on the back of the microSD. Don't push the microSD too much. If it doesn't go into the slot easily, you may be trying to insert it the wrong way or there could be a foreign object in the slot.

## Getting Started

4. Once inserted, push the memory card until you hear a click, this means that the microSD has been correctly engaged.



5. Close the plastic slot protection.
6. To remove the memory card, turn the phone off, open the slot protection and push the microSD to unlock it. Carefully extract the memory card.

### Attention:

- ▶ Avoid using the microSD card when the battery is low.
- ▶ When writing to the card, wait for the operation to complete before removing the card.
- ▶ The card is designed to fit easily into the system one way only.
- ▶ Do not bend the card or force it into the slot.

- ▶ Do not insert any memory cards other than microSD cards.
- ▶ If the microSD has been formatted using FAT32, format the microSD again using FAT16.

For more information on the microSD, please refer to the memory card instruction manual.

## Memory card formatting

Before you start to use the memory card you have to format it. After you insert the memory card, select **Menu** (the  button) → **Settings** → **Phone settings** → **Memory manager** → **External memory**, then press  the left soft key.

This operation should only be done when you insert the memory card for the first time. During formatting various folders will be created for different data types.

## Turning the handset on/off

### Turning your handset on

Ensure that your USIM card is in your handset and the battery is charged. Press and hold  until the power comes on. Enter the USIM PIN code that was supplied with your USIM card if the **PIN code request** is set to **On**.

After a few seconds you will be registered on the network.

### Turning your handset off

Press and hold  until the power goes off. There may be a few seconds delay while the handset powers down. Do not turn the handset on again during this time.

### Emergency call function

When you do not have network coverage, or if your phone has no SIM in it, you can still make emergency calls by pressing the right soft key or by dialling an emergency number.

# General Functions

## Making and answering calls

### Making a voice call

1. Enter the number including the full area code.
  - ▶ To delete a digit press  .
  - To delete all digits press and hold  .
2. Press  to make the call.
3. Press  or close the handset to finish the call.

#### Note

- ▶ To activate the speakerphone during a call, press  .

### Making a call from the call logs

1. In standby mode, press  and the latest incoming, outgoing and missed phone numbers will be displayed.
2. Select the desired number by using  /  .
3. Press  to call the number.

### Making a video call

You can make and receive video calls when both you and the other person have 3G coverage. To make a video call, do the following.

1. Input the phone number using the keypad, or select the phone number from the calls made/received lists.
2. If you do not want to use the speakerphone, ensure you have the headset plugged in.
3. To start the video function, press the left soft key [Options] and select Make video call.
  - ▶ You will be notified that you will need to close other applications to make the video call.

#### Note

- ▶ The video call may take some time to connect. Please be patient. While the video call is connecting, you will see your own image; after the other party has answered, their image will be displayed on the screen.

4. Press  or close the handset to finish the call.

## Making a voice/video call from Contacts

It is easy to call anyone whose number you have stored in your Contacts.

1. Press  to access the contacts list.
2. Scroll to the contact to make a call.
3. Press  to make a voice call. Press the left soft key and select Make video call to make a video call.
4. Press  to finish the call.

## Making international calls

1. Press and hold  for the international prefix. The '+' character prefixes the international access code.
2. Enter the country code, area code, and the phone number.
3. Press .

## Answering a call

When you receive a call, the phone rings and the flashing phone icon appears on the screen. If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if stored in your Contacts) is displayed.

Open the slider to answer an incoming call.

### Note

- ▶ To reject an incoming call, press  or the right soft key twice.
- ▶ If you set Answer mode as Press send key (Menu #.4.0.4), you can answer the call by pressing  after opening the slider.
- ▶ If the answer mode is set to Press any key, any key will answer a call except for the call end key or the right soft key .

## General Functions

### Shortcut to activate vibrate mode

You can activate the vibrate only mode by pressing and holding down .

### Signal strength

You can check the strength of your signal by the signal indicator on the LCD screen of your phone. Signal strength can vary, particularly inside buildings. Moving close to a window may improve reception.

### Entering text

You can enter alphanumeric characters using the keypad. For example, storing names in Contacts, writing a message, creating a personal greeting or scheduling events in the calendar all require entering text.

### Changing the text input mode

When you are in a field that allows characters to be entered, you will notice the text input mode indicator in the upper right corner of the LCD screen.

By pressing , you can change the text input mode to Abc, ABC, 123 or abc.

### Using the T9 Mode

The T9 predictive text input mode allows you to enter words easily with a minimum number of key presses. As you press each key, the handset begins to display the characters that it thinks you are typing based on a built-in dictionary. As new letters are added, the word changes to reflect the most likely candidate from the dictionary.

### Using the ABC Mode

1. Press the key labelled with the required letter:
  - ▶ Once for the first letter.
  - ▶ Twice for the second letter.
  - ▶ And so on.
2. To insert a space, press  once. To delete letters, press .

#### Note

- ▶ The characters assigned to the keys and their order of appearance depends on the language selected using the option Input method. The table above provides the characters set for English language.

## Using the 123 (Number) mode

The 123 mode enables you to enter numbers in a message (a telephone number, for example). Press the keys corresponding to the required digits before manually switching back to the appropriate text entry mode.

## Using the symbol mode

The symbol mode enables you to enter various symbols or special characters. To enter a symbol, select **Options** → **Insert** → **Symbols**. Use the navigation and numeric keys to select the desired symbol and press  .

##### Option menus in Message field

  - **Video:** You can insert a video clip. (One video clip per slide)
  - **Sound:** You can insert a sound file. (One sound per slide)
  - **Symbols:** You can insert symbols. After entering the corresponding number keys, press **[OK]**.
  - **Template:** You can insert a text template saved on the phone. After selecting a template, press **[OK]**. The selected template is inserted into the Message window.
  - **Emoticon:** You can insert an emoticon into a message.
  - **Name & number:** After searching for the name and the number in Contacts, you can insert the entry.
  - **New slide:** Select this to add a new slide.

- **Subject:** Select this to insert a subject.
- **More:** Select this to add a Business card, Schedule, Memo, To do, and My business card.

- ▶ **Save to drafts:** Select this to save the message to drafts.
  - ▶ **Input method:** Select the desired dictionary mode.
  - ▶ **Writing language:** You can select the language for writing a message.
  - ▶ **Add to dictionary:** You can add a word to the phone's dictionary.
2. Press the right soft key [Back] to exit this menu.
  3. Press [Send] to send the message. The message will automatically be saved in the Sent Items folder. If the message has not been sent, it will remain in the Outbox with a 'failed' status.

#### Email (Menu 5.1.2)

To send/receive an Email, you should set up an Email account. (Refer to page 42 for help when setting up an Email account.)

1. Enter the Email addresses of the recipients in the To, Cc, Bcc fields. You can search the Contacts by pressing **[OK]**.

## Messaging

### Note

- ▶ Enter the reference Email address to forward the Email in the Cc (Carbon copy) field.
- ▶ Enter a hidden reference Email address to forward the Email without showing that you are in the Bcc (Blind Carbon Copy) field.
- ▶ Only valid Email addresses are allowed for the recipient (To), reference address (Cc) and hidden reference address (BCC) fields. When an Email address has been specified, another field where you can specify another address appears. You can specify up to 20 recipients for the To and Cc address fields and 10 recipients for the BCC address field.

  - ▶ **Recently used:** You can use the latest Email addresses you used. (Only shown in Options menu when cursor is located in To/Cc/Bcc fields.)
  - ▶ **Insert:** Select this option to insert special characters, templates, and contacts. It is also possible to attach multimedia files (images, videos and sounds).
  - ▶ **Save to drafts :** Select this menu to save the message in the Drafts folder.
  - ▶ **View attachment:** Shows the attached files. (This item is only available when files have been attached.)
  - ▶ **Remove:** Deletes the attached file. (This item is only available when files are already attached.)
  - ▶ **Input method:** Select the desired dictionary mode.
  - ▶ **Writing language:** You can change the writing language.
  - ▶ **Add to dictionary:** You can add a new word to the T9 dictionary.
  - ▶ **Set mail priority:** You can configure the priority of the Email you wish to send.
5. When you have finished writing an Email, press **OK** to send the Email.

## Voice message (Menu 5.1.3)

You can send a recorded voice message.

1. Enter the voice message menu.
2. Press the centre key to record your voice message.
3. Press the centre key to stop the recording. To send the message directly, press the centre key once again.

- ▶ **Message info:** Brief information about the saved draft.

## Outbox

Menu 5.5

The Outbox is a temporary storage place for messages waiting to be sent. Failed messages are also placed in the Outbox. For example, Emails will be placed in the Outbox if the Email account is not correctly configured.

You can use the following functions by pressing the left soft key [Options].

### For sending / waiting messages

- ▶ **Call:** You can make a voice call or a video call to the recipient.
- ▶ **Cancel sending:** You can stop sending/ waiting status.

Shows the Messages, Emails, Postcards and Voice messages you have sent.

- ▶ **Call:** You can make a voice call or a video call.

- ▶ **Copy & Move:** Copy or move a sent message to your USIM.

## My folders Menu 5.7

You can move existing messages from your Inbox or Sent messages into My folders. You can also move them back at any point.

## Templates Menu 5.8

### Text templates (Menu 5.8.1)

You can add, edit, and delete frequently used useful phrases after pressing the left soft key [Options].

#### Note

- ▶ Useful phrases may be saved as a default.

### Multimedia templates (Menu 5.8.2)

You can create, edit and view available templates when creating multimedia messages. Five types of template (Birthday, Greeting, Holiday, Thanks, Sorry) are saved by default.

You can add, edit and delete emoticons. You can then add these to messages you write. Press **[OK]** to view the emoticon.

### Media Album

Menu 5.0

#### Note

- ▶ This service is not available in all countries. Please contact your service provider for further information.

Accesses the remote media album.

### Messaging settings

Menu 5.\*

#### Text message (Menu 5.\*.1)

You can configure text message related options.

1. **Text message centre:** Input the address of the Text message centre.
2. **Delivery report:** By enabling this option, you can verify whether your message has been sent successfully.
3. **Validity period:** This network service allows you to set how long your text messages will be stored at the message centre.
4. **Message types: Text, Voice, Fax, X.400, Email**  
Usually, the type of message is set to Text. You can convert your text into alternative formats. Contact your service provider for the availability of this function.
5. **Character encoding:** Auto/Default alphabet/Unicode
  - ▶ **Auto (default):** Message with single byte character is normally encoded in Default alphabet (GSM7). Message with double-byte character is automatically encoded in unicode (UCS2).

- ▶ **Default alphabet:** A letter which is composed of double byte character is encoded in Default alphabet(GSM7). Please note that double byte characters with accent may be converted into single byte character without accent.

7. **Creation mode:** Allows you to select the contents type supported by MMS. (Restricted, Warning and Free)
8. **Delivery time:** Configures the delivery time of message to the recipient. The Multimedia message centre will deliver the message after the delivery time.
9. **Multimedia msg. centre:** Allows you to configure network information such as the MMSC and the Internet profile, to send a multimedia message.

  - **Shut down:** You can set an image as the shut down image.
- ▶ **Move:** Enables the file to be moved to another folder.

- ▶ **Copy:** Copies the file to another folder.
- ▶ **Delete:** Deletes the selected image.
- ▶ **Mark/Unmark:** Using the Mark function, you can send, delete, move and copy multiple files.
- ▶ **File**
  - **Rename:** You can rename the image.
  - **Edit:** Enables the image to be edited.

### Note

- ▶ The edit menu is not displayed in the default images folder.

- **File info:** Shows information on the selected image file.
- ▶ **Create new folder:** You can create a new folder within the folder currently selected.
- ▶ **Slide show:** You can view the images as a slide show.
- ▶ **Sort by:** You can sort the files by date, file type or name.
- ▶ **List view/Grid view:** You can view the images as a List view or a Grid view.
- ▶ **Memory manager:** You can view the memory status (handset or external memory card).

## Sounds

### Menu 6.2

The Sounds folder consists of embedded links for downloading ringtones and music as well as folders containing the default sounds and voice recordings.

When a file is selected, the following options will be displayed by pressing the left soft key [Options].

▶ **Use as**

- **Voice ringtone:** You can set the sound file as a ringtone for incoming calls.
- **Video ringtone:** You can set the sound file as a ringtone for incoming video calls.
- **Message tone:** You can set the sound file as a new message alert.
- **Start-up:** You can set the sound file as your start-up tone.
- **Shut down:** You can set the sound file as your shut down tone.

- ▶ **Sort by:** You can sort the files by date, file type or name.
- ▶ **File info:** Shows the information on the selected sound file.
- ▶ **Memory manager:** You can view the memory status (for your handset or external memory card).

## Videos

### Menu 6.3

Here you can manage or send downloaded or captured videos clips.

The following are available using the left soft key [Options] in the list of videos.

When viewing video clips in the Media Player, the following options are available:

- ▶ **Landscape view:** You can view the video in wide view mode.

- ▶ You can also view the video in wide view mode by pressing .

- ▶ **Mute/Unmute:** Switch the sound on/off.
- ▶ **Capture:** You can save what is on the paused screen as an image file (only possible when paused).
- ▶ **Repeat:** You can set the repeat option (Off/One/All).
- ▶ **File info:** You can check information on files being played.
- ▶ **Send:** You can send the video via Message, Email or Bluetooth.
- ▶ **Delete:** Deletes the selected video.

- ▶ **Use as:** You can set the video file as a voice ringtone or video ringtone. This menu will change and is dependent upon the type of file selected.

Menu 6.4

You can easily download games and play the default games. If you want to download games select Download games in this menu.

## Applications

Menu 6.5

You can easily download other applications when you select the embedded link in this menu. You can create a folder using left soft key [Options].

### Note

- ▶ In the Games and Applications menus, additional cost may be incurred when using online services.

## SVG contents Menu 6.6

The SVG contents folder contains all of your default and downloaded SVG files.

When a file is selected, the following options will be displayed by pressing the left soft key [Options].

- ▶ **Play/Pause:** Pause or resume playback.
- ▶ **Send:** Send the file as a message or via Bluetooth.
- ▶ **Go to list:** Return to your list of SVG files.
- ▶ **Landscape view:** View your SVG in landscape view mode. (This only appears if you select Options without pausing).
- ▶ **Mute/Unmute:** Switch the sound on/off.
- ▶ **File info:** View brief information about the file.
- ▶ **Use as wallpaper:** Set the SVG file as a wallpaper.
- ▶ **Delete:** Delete an SVG file.

## Alarms

Menu 7.1

If you set the alarm,  appears on the indicator bar. The specified alarm sounds at the scheduled time. Press  to stop the alarm. Press the left soft key [Snooze] to choose the snooze interval. The alarm sound stops and resumes after the selected snooze duration. You can set up to 5 alarms.

1. Select your alarm, or press the left soft key [Options] and select Add new.
2. Set your desired alarm time.
3. Select the desired repeat mode using  /  or select the desired one from the list by pressing left soft key [List].
4. Select the bell to ring at the alarm time. You can open the list by pressing left soft key [Edit].
5. Enter a name or memo for the alarm.
6. Set the snooze duration for the alarm.
7. When you have finished setting the alarm, press the right soft key [Done].

### Note

- ▶ The alarm will go off even when the phone is switched off.

## Calendar

Menu 7.2

The calendar is set to Monthly view by default. The cursor starts on the current date.

Pressing the shortcut key  moves to the previous year and pressing  moves to the following year. Pressing  returns the cursor to today. Pressing  or  moves to the previous month, and  moves to the following month. You can select the date using  /  /  / . Switch to weekly view by pressing the left soft key [Options] and changing the view mode.

### Add new event

You can set the start date, end date, start time, end time, contents, type of event, repetition and alarm of the scheduled event.

### Set holiday

You can set days as holidays. Press the left soft key [Options] and select Set holiday. The selected date will be displayed in red. To clear the holiday, press the left soft key [Options] and select Clear holiday.

### Event notification

If the user has configured the alarm settings, the specified alarm sound will ring. If the notification time is before the event start time, you can set up the alarm again.

## Quick menu

Menu 7.3

Press the left soft key [Options] to display the option pop up menu before recording. Move to the desired menu item using / and press **[OK]**.

  - ▶ **Quality:** You can select a recording quality from Super fine, Fine, and Normal.
  - ▶ **Memory in use:** Choose whether to save your voice recordings to the Handset memory or to the External memory
  - ▶ **Go to my sounds:** Opens the Voice recordings folder in Sounds.
1. Pressing **[OK]** starts recording. When started, the recording time appears on the LCD. To cancel the recording, press [Back].

Using this menu, users can convert Currency, Surface, Length, Weight, Temperature, Volume and Velocity.

### World time Menu 7.#

World time provides time information on major cities worldwide.

### Organiser settings Menu 7.13

#### Calendar settings (Menu 7.13.1)

You can set the configurations to view the calendar.

- ▶ **Default view:** You can set the default value to view a calendar; Month view, Week view.
- ▶ **Weekly start time:** 1AM, 2AM, 3AM, 4AM, 5AM, 6AM, 7AM, 8AM, 9AM, 10AM, 11AM, 12PM.
- ▶ **Week starts on:** You can set the default day to start the week on: Sunday or Monday.

## **Send all schedules & Tasks via Bluetooth** (Menu 7.13.2)

Menu 8.1

Register a new contact address. You can enter the name, different phone numbers and Email addresses of a new contact. You can also assign the contact to groups, include an image or avatar, assign a specific ringtone and enter a memo about the contact. Other available fields include Home page URL, Home address, Company name, Job title and Company address.

## Contacts list

Menu 8.2

Performs the contact address search function. The search operation is performed based on a first name as a default. The current search method and results found are displayed in the Search window. You can make a phone call or send a message to the selected phone number. A Contacts search can be performed based on the phone number or group information.

### Note

- ▶ You can use the settings menu to search by last name instead.

## Groups

Menu 8.3

Using this menu you can manage group information (stored in both the Handset and the USIM). In the handset memory, there are 5 default groups: Family, Friends, Colleagues, School and VIP. You can add, edit and delete groups. When a ringtone for a number is not specified, a call from the number sounds the group ringtone assigned to the number for the group.

## Speed dials

Menu 8.4

Using this menu you can manage speed dials. Speed dials are assigned to keys  - .

## Service dial numbers

Menu 8.5

You can view the list of Service Dial Numbers (SDN) assigned by your service provider (if supported by the USIM card). Such numbers include emergency, directory enquiries and voice mail numbers. After selecting a service number, press  to dial the service.

## Own number

Menu 8.6

Allows you to display your phone number in the USIM card.

## My business card

Menu 8.7

You can create your own business card by pressing the centre key [Add]. After entering your name, number, Email and image, you can send it as a business card.

## Contact settings

Menu 8.8

### Contact list settings (Menu 8.8.1)

- ▶ **Contacts location:** Select which contact information is displayed (from handset memory, from USIM card or both).
- ▶ **Name display:** Sort by first name or last name.
- ▶ **Show picture:** Select whether or not to display an image/avatar.

## Synchronise contacts (Menu 8.8.2)

### Note

You can send all the contact data in your handset to other phones by using Bluetooth.

## Contacts

### **Backup contacts** (Menu 8.8.6)

You can save all the contact data in the handset to an external memory card by the form of vcard.

### **Restore contacts** (Menu 8.8.7)

You can restore all the contact data in an external memory card to the phone memory by the form of vcard.

### **Clear contacts** (Menu 8.8.8)

Clears all contact information. You can delete all the contacts saved in the mobile phone memory as well as on the USIM card.

### **Memory info.** (Menu 8.8.9)

You can check the status of your contacts memory in this menu.

# Calls [Menu 9]

## All calls

Menu 9.1

Allows you to view the missed, received, and dialled call records. You can make a call, or send a message, to the number you have selected from the records. You can also save the number in Contacts.

## Dialled calls

Menu 9.2

Allows you to view dialled call records, make a call, send a message, and save the number in Contacts.

## Received calls

Menu 9.3

Allows you to view received call records, make a call, send a message, and save the number in Contacts.

## Missed calls

Menu 9.4

Allows you to view missed call records, make a call, send a message, and save the number in Contacts.

## Video call [Menu \*]

You can make a video call using this menu.

1. Enter the number you want to dial.
  - ▶ You can key in the number.
  - ▶ You can select the number from Contacts using the centre key [Contacts].
2. When the number is entered, press the centre key [Call] to make a video call.

### During a video call

When you are in a video call, the screen will show the contact's name and duration of the call, the contact's image, volume, video control panel, and your image.

### Incoming video call

When a video call is received, the caller's information is displayed as following.

- ▶ **Picture/Animation:** Displays picture ID, an image as configured in Contacts, or default animation indicating the incoming call.
- ▶ **Caller's name and number:** Shows the incoming caller's number. If the number is stored in Contacts, displays the name of the contact.

## **Shuffle tracks** (Menu 0.2.6)

If you want to play a random selection of tracks, select this option.

## **Music store**      Menu 0.3

Connects to the Vodafone music download site.

# Settings [Menu #]

## Profiles

Menu #.1

You can select a ringtone or vibration for an incoming call and set the sound and volume of the ringtone, key tone, and sound effect, according to a profile. The profiles provided include [Normal], [Silent], [Outdoor], [Flight mode], [Customised 1], [Customised 2], and [Customised 3]. Select a profile, and press **OK** to activate the profile. After pressing the left soft key [Options], select the Edit menu for the [Normal], [Outdoor], [Customised 1], [Customised 2] or [Customised 3] profile to change the configuration. A different list of options is available for each profile that has been selected for editing.

## Phone settings

Menu #.2

### Date & Time (Menu #.2.1)

Although the current time is automatically set when the phone is registered to the network, users can configure the time and date directly using this menu.

## Time

1. Select the Time item from the Date & time list, and then press **OK**.
2. Move to your desired field, Hour, Minute, or am/pm field using the navigation keys. (When you have selected 12 hour as Time format)
3. Enter Hour, and Minutes using the number keys.
4. Select the time format using **</>**.
5. Scroll down to select the hour indicator format i.e. Off, Cuckoo clock or Chime bell.
6. Press the centre soft key **OK** to set the time with the specified value.

## Date

2. Select the date format using **</>**.
3. Enter Day, Month and Year using the number keys.
4. Press the centre soft key **OK** to set the date with the specified value.

## Auto update date/time

When Auto update is on, the time and date are automatically updated according to the current time zone. If Confirm first is selected, the time and date update has to be confirmed before it is updated.

## Daylight saving

Select whether to activate the daylight saving function or not. You can set the Summer time difference of your selected home city for 1 hour or 2 hours.

## Language (Menu #.2.2)

Select the display language. You can select Automatic language option to change the display language to the USIM card supported language.

## Auto key lock (Menu #.2.3)

If you activate this function, the keypad will automatically lock after the predetermined time has passed.

## Security (Menu #.2.4)

### PIN code request

When this is set to On, you are requested to enter your PIN each time you switch the phone on.

### Note

- ▶ Press the right soft key in the PIN code entry window to return to the previous step.
- ▶ 3 incorrect PIN code entries would invalidate the PIN code. And you have to enter the PUK (PIN Unblock Key) code to configure the PIN code again.

## USIM memory

This function shows the status of the USIM card user memory.

## External memory

This function shows the status of the External card user memory. This function displays the in-use and free memory usage statistics.

## Primary storage setting (Menu #.2.7)

You can select the storage destination for your files; Handset memory or External memory.

## Handset Information (Menu #.2.8)

This functions shows the USIM card telephone number, model name and software version of the mobile phone.

## Reset settings (Menu #.2.9)

Select this to reset your phone to its default settings. You are required to enter the security code.

## Display settings Menu #.3

This menu allows you to personalise the display options of the screens and of the menu's entire graphic interface.

### Main Display (Menu #.3.1)

You can set the screen theme to be displayed on the main screen.

### Home screen

- ▶ **Wallpaper:** You can select an image to be displayed on the main screen.
- ▶ **Display items:** You can select which items to display on the screen: Clock, Clock + Key guide, Dual clock, Key guide, Do not show, Calendar + Clock or Calendar
- ▶ **Clock type:** You can select the type of clock.
- ▶ **Clock font colour:** You can select the colour of the clock's display.

### Start up picture

You can select the image to be displayed while the phone is being switched on.

### Power off picture

You can select the image to be displayed while the phone is being switched off.

### Menu style (Menu #.3.2)

You can select the desired menu style from Grid style and List style.

## Font (Menu #.3.3)

You can set the font style, dialling font size, and dialling font colour using  / .

## Backlight (Menu #.3.4)

You can set the backlight duration and the brightness on the Home screen and the backlight duration on the Keypad.

## Handset theme (Menu #.3.5)

Select the desired handset theme from White and Black.

## Welcome message (Menu #.3.6)

After selecting On, you can write a welcome message.

## Call settings

Menu #.4

### Call durations (Menu #.4.1)

You can view call durations by type.

### Call barring (Menu #.4.2)

Apply call barring to voice calls and/or video calls. Select from: All outgoing; Outgoing international; Outgoing international calls except home country; All incoming; and Incoming when abroad.

## Fixed dial numbers (Menu #.4.3)

### ► Turn on/off

- **On:** Select whether to activate FDN or not. PIN2 authentication is required.
- **Off:** Select whether to activate FDN or not. PIN2 authentication is required.

► **FDN List:** Displays the current FDN list. You can edit, add, or delete fixed dial numbers. PIN2 authentication is required to edit, add, or delete the list. The set up information is saved on the USIM. The information saved on the USIM is used when FDN restricts outgoing calls.

## Data volume (Menu #.4.4)

Allows you to check the volume transferred.

## Call costs (Menu #.4.5)

1. This function displays the costs of the Last call and All calls.
2. To edit, press the centre key [Edit] and enter the PIN2 code.
3. You can select either Units or Currency in Set call cost. Depending on your settings, USIM and operator, the call cost is displayed during a call.
4. In the Set limit configuration, select On to configure the cost limit. When a cost limit is configured, and the call costs reach the limit, making a call will not be allowed.

### **Diverts** (Menu #.4.6)

Call divert options for voice and video calls are provided.

#### **Setting call diverts**

### Bluetooth (Menu #.7.1)

#### Bluetooth connection

Your phone has built-in Bluetooth wireless technology which makes it possible for you to connect your phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices such as a handsfree headset, PC, PDA or another phone.

You can, for example, have a conversation via a cordless Bluetooth handsfree headset or browse the internet wirelessly. You can also exchange business cards, calendar items, pictures and other files.

#### Note

- ▶ We recommend that your phone and the Bluetooth device you are communicating with be within a range of 10 metres. The connection may be improved if there are no solid objects between your phone and the other Bluetooth device.

## 1. Getting started

- **Menu** → **Settings** → **Connectivity** → **Bluetooth** → **Turn on/off**

To use the Bluetooth function, you must first turn it on.

## 2. Configuring Bluetooth settings

- **Menu** → **Settings** → **Connectivity** → **Bluetooth** → **Settings**
  - **My device visibility:** Set [My device visibility] [Visible] so that other devices can detect your phone when they are searching for a Bluetooth device. If you select Hidden, other devices will not be able to detect your phone when they are searching for a Bluetooth device.
  - **My device name:** You can name or rename your phone as it will appear on other devices. Your phone's name will be shown on other devices only when My device visibility is set to Visible.
  - **Supported services:** You can view the list of devices such as headsets and handsfree kits supported by this Bluetooth enabled phone.
  - **My address:** Check your Bluetooth address here.

## LIMITED WARRANTY STATEMENT

### **1. WHAT THIS WARRANTY COVERS :**

LG offers you a limited warranty that the enclosed phone and its enclosed accessories will be free from defects in material and workmanship according to the following terms and conditions:

- (1) The limited warranty for the product extends the warranty period beginning on the date of purchase of the product.
- (2) The limited warranty applies for 1 year from the original date of purchase and extends only to the original purchaser of the product and is not assignable or transferable to any subsequent purchaser/end user. It shall neither exclude nor limit any mandatory statutory rights of the customer or any of the customer rights against the seller/dealer of the product.
- (3) This warranty is good only to the original purchaser during the warranty period, but limited to certain country if specified.
