Custom-designed Features

Module

You can pull out the module from the bottom of the device to use various features provided by various accessories. (sold separately)

After removing the battery from the module, place the battery into a desired accessory and insert it into the module slot.



- See *Removing the battery* and *Installing the battery* for details.



Always-on display

You can display the date, time, signature or other information on the screen even when the main screen is turned off. Always-on display is a useful feature to check the time frequently and display your own signature.

1 Tap > **Settings** > **Display** > **Always-on display** and then tap to activate the feature.



- The battery may drain faster when you use Always-on display. Turn off this feature to use the battery longer.



- 2 Tap **Content** and select the item you want to display on the screen.
 - **Digital clock**: Always display the current time.
 - **Signature**: Display your signature in place of the current time.
- 3 To set a time period to disable the Always-on display feature, tap **Daily timeout**.
- 4 To view the help for Always-on display, tap **Help**.

Wide-angle lens

You can use the wide-angle lens to take photos of a range that is wider than the actual field of vision. This feature is useful when you take a photo or record a video of a landscape or a wide area from a narrow area.




Gallery features


Floating button

You can use the floating button at the lower part of the Gallery app screen in landscape mode.

- After dragging the button upwards, release it when you reach the button to return to the Home screen.



- You can drag the button to the left or right to move the floating button as desired.



Related content

You can edit and customize related content in Gallery.

- 1 While viewing a picture preview, tap .
- 2 When the icon related with the date or location where you took the photo appears, touch the screen.



- You can view a group of photos taken on the same day or at the same location.



- Tap  to access additional options.

Making a GIF with photos

You can create a GIF file with photos saved in Gallery.

- 1 While viewing an album, tap  > **Create GIF**.
- 2 Select the desired photos to create a GIF file and then tap **NEXT**.
 - You can add more images and adjust the GIF speed, screen ratio, and file order.

3 Tap **SAVE**.



- A maximum of 100 images can be used to create a GIF file.

Making a collage

You can make a collage from the associated content.

- 1 While viewing an album, tap **: > Make collage**.
- 2 Select the desired images to add to the a collage and then tap **NEXT**.
 - Select the desired layout from the bottom of the screen.
- 3 Tap **MAKE**.



- A maximum of 9 images can be used to create a collage.



Making a video from the related content

You can gather related contents to make a video clip by tapping  on the video displaying the date or location.

Select the theme and background music, adjust caption effects and order or add date and your signature and then tap **SAVE**.


-  : Select the video theme.
-  : Add background music or adjust the playback time.
 - To select a file for the background music, tap .
 - To adjust the volume of background music and original video, tap .
-  : Select a font face.
-  : Change the order of files to play as a video.
 - To add files, tap .



Creating a movie

You can create a new movie by putting images and videos together.

- 1 Tap > select an album, then tap > **Create movie**.
- 2 Select images or videos for your movie and tap **NEXT**.
- 3 Edit the selected images and videos and then tap **SAVE**.



Deleting files

You can select images or videos to delete from your video by tapping at the top right corner of its thumbnail.

Adding files

You can select images or videos to add after tapping  at the bottom of the screen. You can also select the images or videos you have already previously added.



- Touch and hold a file, and then tap another file for multiple selection.

Rearranging files

To rearrange the images and videos, touch and hold the file you want to move, then dragging it to the desired location.

Adding file effects

Tap  to add a theme or background music, change the font.

Resetting the movie edits

You can reset the edits made to the movie (e.g. play time) by tapping .

Previewing a file

Check your new video before saving it by tapping . After the playback time elapses, the next file is played automatically.



- A maximum of 50 images and videos can be used to create a video.
- The playback time for an image is 3 seconds by default and it cannot be changed. Videos can be trimmed down to a minimum of 1 second.
- This feature may not support some image or video formats.

Making a GIF with a video

You can easily make a GIF file using recorded video.

- 1 At the desired starting point while watching a video, tap .
- 2 Select the length of the GIF you want to create.
 - GIF is generated for the time selected from the current time.
 - For videos less than 5 seconds, GIF images are automatically generated for the remaining time.


Multi-tasking feature

Multi-Window

You can use two apps at the same time by separating the screen into multiple windows.

While using an app, touch and hold  from the Home touch buttons, then select an app from the recently used apps list.

- You can use two apps displayed on the main screen at the same time.
- To stop the Multi-Window feature, touch and hold .



- You can use this feature in an app that supports the Multi-Window feature.
- The Multi-Window feature is not supported by some apps, including downloaded apps.

Overview screen

The Overview screen provides a preview of your recently used apps.

To view the list of recently used apps, tap  on the Home screen, then tap the displayed app.

- Touch and hold an app and drag it to the top of the screen to start the app with the Multi-Window feature. You can also tap  at the top of each app.

Smart Bulletin

You can add a Home screen that displays useful content and information.

You do not need to add an additional widget or run an app.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **Display** > **Home screen** > **Smart Bulletin** and then tap  to activate it.
 - Smart Bulletin can be found on the left-most canvas of the Home screen.
- 2 Configure Smart Bulletin by using available menu items.
 - To rearrange menu items displayed on Smart Bulletin, touch and hold  then drag up or down.
 - To display or hide a menu item on Smart Bulletin, tap the item.

Smart Notice

Smart Notice is a widget that notifies you of useful information. Using time and location, this feature analyzes the user's usage patterns and the environment in which the smartphone is used.

Use Smart Notice as:

- Automatic reminders to add frequently used unsaved numbers to your contacts.
- Automatic reminders to make a call to a number you did not call back after declining it with a reject message.
- Automatic reminders of a contact's birthday saved in the calendar and the contact list.
- Automatic reminders to clean up temporary files, downloaded files, and apps that have not been used for a specific period of time.
- Automatic reminders to customize device settings according to the pattern and place you are using the device.
- Automatic reminders to save power when battery consumption is high.

Starting Smart Notice


You can add the Smart Notice widget when it is not added by default or is deleted from the Home screen. Take the following steps to add the widget:

- 1 On the Home screen, touch and hold on an empty space, then tap **Widgets**.
- 2 Touch and hold **Smart Notice**, then drag it to the desired position on the Home screen.
 - Tap  in the widget to change the Smart Notice settings.

Smart cleaning

You can delete temporary files or apps that are no longer used.

- 1 Tap **O > Settings > General > Smart cleaning**.
- 2 Select a category, then select an item to delete.
- 3 Tap **DELETE > DELETE** to delete the selected item.




quick share

You can share a photo or video using a desired app immediately after taking it.

- 1 Tap > , then take a photo or record a video.
- 2 Tap the app icon that appears on the screen to share it using that app. You can also swipe the icon towards the opposite direction to see what other apps you can use to share your photos and videos.



- The app displayed by quick share may vary, depending on the type and frequency of access of the apps installed on the device.



QuickRemote

QuickRemote overview

You can control many electronic devices in different locations by using your device as a remote control.



- This feature uses infrared (IR) signals and operates very similar to a remote control. When using QuickRemote, keep the IR sensor at the top right of the device uncovered.
- This feature may not be supported, depending on the device manufacturer or service provider.

Registering a device for remote control

You can register a device you want to control remotely with your device.

- 1 Tap > **QuickRemote**.
- 2 Tap to specify locations where you want to use the remote control.
- 3 Tap and select the type and manufacturer of the device you want to set up.
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions to make sure that the QuickRemote feature works properly on the device.

Creating a universal remote control

You can create a customized universal remote control by assigning remote control functions to your device.

- 1 Tap  > **QuickRemote**.
- 2 Tap  to specify locations where you want to use the remote control.
- 3 Tap  > **Universal remote**.
- 4 Enter a remote control name and tap **OK**.
- 5 Touch and hold the button you want, then drag it to the position you want.
- 6 Tap **NEXT**.
- 7 Follow the on-screen instructions to familiarize yourself with the function, then tap **SAVE**.

QuickMemo+

QuickMemo+ overview

You can make creative notes by using a variety options on this advanced notepad feature, such as image management and screenshots, which are not supported by the conventional notepad apps.

Creating a note

- 1 Tap > **LG** > **QuickMemo+**.
- 2 Tap to create a note.
 - : Save a note.
 - : Undo the last action.
 - : Redo the last action you undid.
 - : Enter a note by using the keypad.
 - : Write notes by hand.
 - : Erase handwritten notes.
 - : Edit or erase parts of a handwritten note.
 - : Access additional options.
- 3 Tap to save the note.

Writing notes on a photo

- 1 Tap > **LG** > **QuickMemo+**.
- 2 Tap to take a photo, then tap **OK**.
 - The photo is automatically attached into the notepad.
- 3 Write notes on the photo.
- 4 Tap to save the note.

Writing notes on a screenshot

- 1 While viewing the screen you want to capture, drag the status bar downwards and then tap :
 - The screenshot appears as the notepad background theme. Memo tools appear at the top of the screen.
- 2 Take notes as desired.
 - To crop and save a portion of the screen, tap and specify a portion with the crop tool.
 - To attach a screenshot to the notepad and enter text, tap .
- 3 Tap and save the notes to the desired location.
 - Saved notes can be viewed in either **QuickMemo+** or **Gallery**.
 - To save notes in the same location all the time, select the **Use as default app** checkbox before selecting an app.

Managing folders

You can group notes by the note type.

- 1 Tap > **LG** > **QuickMemo+**.
- 2 At the top of the screen, tap and select a menu item:
 - **All memos:** View all the notes saved in QuickMemo+.
 - **My memos:** View notes created by QuickMemo+.
 - **Photo memos:** View notes created by .
 - **Capture+:** View notes created by .
 - **Trash:** View deleted notes.
 - **New category:** Add categories.
 - : Rearrange, add or delete categories. To change the name of a category, tap the category.



- Some folders do not appear when launching QuickMemo+ for the first time. Disabled folders are enabled and appear when they contain at least one related content.

QSlide

You can display several apps simultaneously on the same screen and switch between them.

For example, use the calculator or calendar when a video is playing.

When an app is running, tap : > QSlide.



- This feature may not be supported by some apps.



- [] : Switch to full-screen mode.
- —○ : Adjust the opacity of the QSlide window. If the QSlide window is transparent, you can interact with the background.
- X : Close the QSlide window.
- ▲ : Adjust the size of the QSlide window.

LG Health

LG Health overview

You can set a daily exercise goal and check the amount of physical exercise to monitor your health and fitness information.

Getting started with LG Health

You can configure LG Health when launching the app for the first time or after having already used it.

- 1 Tap **O > LG > LG Health**.
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the setup.

Using LG Health

- 1 Tap **O > LG > LG Health**.
- 2 The following options are available.



- : Display your exercise log.
- : Begin tracking an exercise.
- : Set various LG Health settings, including your profile and goals.



- Health-related information provided by LG Health is designed for user convenience and cannot be used for purposes of disease prevention, treatment, diagnosis or other medical issues.
- LG Health may vary or may not be available, depending on the country and service provider. LG Health functions that are available and apps that can be added to LG Health may vary, depending on the country. This is due to differing laws and regulations.

Do not disturb

You can limit or mute notifications to avoid disturbances for a specific period of time.

Tap > **Settings** > **Sound** > **Do not disturb**.

- **Mode:** Select the desired mode.
 - **Priority only:** Receive sound or vibrate notifications for the selected apps. Even when Priority only is turned on, alarms still sound.
 - **Total silence:** Disable both the sound and vibration.
- **Select priorities:** Receive alarms and notifications for the selected apps.
 - **App notifications:** Select apps to receive the notifications.
 - **Calls from:** Set up a range of contacts from which you want to receive notifications for incoming calls.
 - **Repeated calls:** Second call from same caller within 15 min is not silenced.
 - **Messages from:** Set up a range of contacts from which you want to receive notifications for incoming messages.
- **Use Do not disturb:** Turn on the Do not disturb feature.
- **SCHEDULE:** Set the schedule for which you want to turn on the Do not disturb feature.
- **Help:** View the help for **Do not disturb**.

Ringtone ID

You can create a unique ringtone to play when calls are received from a particular contact.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **Sound** > **Ringtone ID** and then tap  to activate it.
- 2 Tap **Compose ringtones for** and select the desired option.



- The default ringtone plays for incoming calls from all other contacts.

Fingerprint recognition

Fingerprint recognition overview

You can register your fingerprint on your device and use this fingerprint to unlock the device screen or content.

When confirming a purchase or signing in to an app, identify yourself by simply touching the fingerprint sensor.



- Your fingerprint can be used by the device for user identification. Very similar fingerprints from different users may be recognized by the fingerprint sensor as the same fingerprint. To ensure security, set the screen lock using a Knock Code, pattern, PIN or Password.
- If the device cannot detect your fingerprint, or you forget the value specified for registration, visit the nearest LG Customer Service center with your device and ID card.

Precautions for fingerprint recognition

Fingerprint recognition accuracy may decrease. To maximize recognition accuracy, check the following before using the device.

- The device's Power/Lock key has a fingerprint sensor. Ensure that the Power/Lock key is not damaged by a metallic object, such as coin or key.
- When water, dust or other foreign substance are on the Power/Lock key or your finger, the fingerprint registration or recognition may not work. Clean and dry your finger before having the fingerprint recognized.
- A fingerprint may not be recognized properly if the surface of your finger has a scar or is not smooth due to being soaked in water.
- If you bend your finger or use the fingertip only, your fingerprint may not be recognized. Make sure that your finger covers the entire surface of the Power/Lock key.
- Scan only one finger for each registration. Scanning more than one finger may affect fingerprint registration and recognition.
- The device may generate static electricity if the surrounding air is dry. If the surrounding air is dry, avoid scanning fingerprints, or touch a metallic object such as a coin or key before scanning fingerprints to remove static electricity.

Registering fingerprints

You can register and save your fingerprint on the device to use fingerprint identification.

1 Tap > Settings > General > Lock screen & security > Fingerprints.



- This feature is available only when the screen lock is set. If the screen lock is not set, enable it by following the on-screen instructions. See *Configuring lock screen settings* for details.

2 Locate the Power/Lock key on the back of the device and gently put your finger on it to register the fingerprint.



- Gently press the Power/Lock key so that the sensor can recognize your fingerprint. If you press the Power/Lock key with an excessive force, the screen lock function may start or the screen may be turned off.
- Ensure that your fingertip covers the entire surface of the sensor of the Power/Lock key.



3 Follow the on-screen instructions.

- Repeat scanning the fingerprint by moving your finger little by little until the fingerprint is registered.

4 When the fingerprint registration is done, tap **OK**.

- Tap **ADD MORE** to register another fingerprint. If you register only one fingerprint and the corresponding finger is not in a good condition, the fingerprint recognition may not work well. As a preventative measure, register multiple fingerprints.

Managing fingerprints

You can edit or delete registered fingerprints.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **General** > **Lock screen & security** > **Fingerprints**.
- 2 Enter your screen lock.
- 3 From the fingerprint list, tap a fingerprint to rename it. To delete it, tap .

Unlocking the screen with a fingerprint

You can specify a target object to unlock with a registered fingerprint.

To select a target object:

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **General** > **Lock screen & security** > **Fingerprints**.
- 2 Enter your screen lock.
- 3 On the fingerprint screen, activate the desired features.
 - **Screen lock:** Unlock the screen with a fingerprint.
 - **Content lock:** Access locked contents with a fingerprint.

Content Sharing

Playing content

You can play photos, videos or music saved on the device from a TV.

- 1 Connect the TV and device to the same Wi-Fi network.
- 2 Execute a file from the **Gallery** or **Music** app and tap > **Play on other device**.
- 3 Select the TV.



- Google Play services should be up to date in order to use Chromecast.

Sending or receiving files

You can send or receive files saved on your device to another LG device or tablet.

Tap > **Settings** > **Network** > **File sharing** > **SmartShare Beam** and tap to activate it.



- Make sure that your device is connected to the same wireless network as the file transfer target device.
- Make sure that **File sharing** is activated on both devices.

Sending files to another device

- 1 From the **Gallery**, **File Manager** or **Music** app, tap > **Share** or
 - When the search window appears, tap **SEARCH**.
- 2 Select a device from the list of nearby devices that support SmartShare Beam.
 - The file is sent to the device.

Using nearby devices

You can play multimedia files saved on a connected device from your device.

- 1 From the **Gallery** or **Music** app, select  **Nearby devices**.
- 2 Select a device from the device list.
 - If the desired device is not seen on the device list, check that DLNA is turned on, then tap **Search nearby devices**.
- 3 Play content saved on the selected device.

Dual Play

You can display your device screen on a connected display device and use different apps from the device.

Use a DisplayPort-HDMI cable or use a Miracast for either of the connections.



- This feature is not available for some content.

Basic Functions

Product components and accessories




Parts overview



- Proximity/Ambient light sensor
 - Proximity sensor: The proximity sensor turns off the screen and disables touch functionality when the device is in close proximity to the human body. It turns the screen back on and enables touch functionality when the device is outside a specific range.
 - Ambient light sensor: The ambient light sensor analyzes the ambient light intensity when the auto-brightness control mode is turned on.
- Laser detection auto-focus
 - Detects the distance from the camera to your subject for automatic focusing.
 - Quickly focuses on closer or farther objects when you use the rear camera to take photos.
- Volume keys
 - Adjust the volume for ringtones, calls or notifications.
 - Gently press a volume key to take a photo. To take continuous shots of photos, press and hold the volume key.
 - Press the Volume Down key twice to launch the **Camera** app when the screen is locked or turned off. Press the Volume Up key twice to launch **Capture+**.
- Power/Lock key (Fingerprint sensor)
 - Briefly press this key when you want to turn on or off the screen.
 - Press and hold this key when you want to select a power control option.
 - Gently put your finger on the key when you want to unlock the screen with your fingerprint.



- Some functions may be restricted for access, depending on the device specifications.
- An NFC antenna is built into the back of the device. Do not damage the NFC antenna.
- Do not put heavy objects on the device or sit on it, as this may damage the screen.
- Screen-protective film or accessories may interfere with the proximity sensor.
- If your device is wet or is being used in a humid place, the touch sensor or buttons may not function properly.

Turning on or off the device

Turning on the device

When the device is turned off, press and hold the Power/Lock key.



- When the device is turned on for the first time, initial configuration takes place. The first booting for the device may take longer than usual.

Turning off the device

Press and hold the Power/Lock key, then select **Power off**.

Power control options


Press and hold the Power/Lock key, then select an option.

- **Power off:** Turn off the device.
- **Restart:** Restart the device.
- **Turn on Airplane mode:** Disables cellular services, including making phone calls, messaging and browsing the Internet. Other functions remain available.


Installing the SIM card

Properly use the SIM card provided by your mobile service provider.


- 1 Insert the ejection pin into the hole on the card tray.




- 2 Pull out the card tray.



- 3 Put the SIM card on the card tray with the gold-colored contacts facing downwards.



- 4 Insert the card tray back into the slot.



- This device supports only Nano SIM cards.
- For problem-free performance, it is recommended to use the phone with the correct type of SIM card. Always use a factory-made SIM card supplied by your service provider.

Precautions when using a SIM card

- Do not lose your Nano SIM card. LG is not responsible for damage and other issues caused by loss or transfer of a Nano SIM card.
- Be careful not to damage the Nano SIM card when you insert or remove it.

Inserting the memory card

The device supports up to a 2 TB microSD card. Some memory cards may not be compatible with your device, depending on the memory card manufacturer and type.




- Some memory cards may not be fully compatible with the device. If you use an incompatible card, it may damage the device or the memory card, or corrupt the data stored in it.



- The memory card is an optional item.
- Frequent writing and erasing data may shorten the lifespan of memory cards.

- Insert the ejection pin into the hole on the card tray.
- Pull out the card tray.
- Put the memory card on the card tray with the gold-colored contacts facing downwards.



- Insert the card tray back into the slot.

Removing the memory card

Unmount the memory card before removing it for safety.

- 1 Tap > **Settings** > **General** > **Storage** >
- 2 Insert the ejection pin into the hole on the card tray.
- 3 Pull out the card tray and remove the memory card.



- Do not remove the memory card while the device is transferring or accessing information. This may cause data to be lost or corrupted, or may damage the memory card or the device. LG is not responsible for losses that result from the abuse or improper use of memory cards, including the loss of data.


Battery

Removing the battery




- Turn off the device before removing the battery. Failure to do so may damage the device.

- 1 Press the module eject key to eject the module and then pull out the module to separate it from the device.




2 Grab the middle of the ejected module and pull it out from the device.



3 Hold the battery and module with both hands and separate them from one another in the direction of the arrows in the image below.



- Do not bend the battery when removing it. The plastic cap on the battery may be damaged.




Installing the battery

Correctly insert and charge the battery that came with your device.



- Device specifications may vary depending on the area or service provider. To purchase additional batteries or compatible optional items, contact an LG Customer Service Center for support.
- Be sure to use authentic accessories provided by LG Electronics. Using third-party accessories may damage the device or cause malfunctions.


1 Align the indicated arrows correctly and insert the battery into the module according to the order indicated in the image below.



2 Grab the lower part of the module as shown in the figure below, then gently slide the module into the device until they are tightly fastened.



- Never press the module eject key when inserting the module into the device.




Precautions when using the module

- Failure to follow the instructions provided in this user guide may result in damage to your product or personal injury.
- When replacing the battery, take extra care to ensure that no foreign substance or water enters the device.
- Do not expose your device to moisture or hot and humid environments.
- Do not expose the inside of your device to water and do not insert foreign objects into the battery compartment.
- After removing the module, put it back into the device as soon as possible to avoid damage to the device's interior.
- Do not forcefully separate the module without pressing the module eject key.
- Never remove the module when the device is in use.
- Do not insert a module from another device that is not compatible with your device's service provider and service area.
- Be careful not to hurt your hands when inserting or removing the module.
- Follow the instructions contained in your device manuals to ensure the battery and module are inserted correctly. Failure to insert the battery and module correctly may result in damage to the device or device malfunction.

Charging the battery

Before using the device, fully charge the battery.

Connect one end of the charging cable to the charger, insert the other end of the cable into the cable port, and then plug the charger into a power socket.



- Make sure to use an LG-approved charger, battery and charging cable. Charging the battery with a third-party charger may cause the battery to explode or may damage the device.
- Using the device when it is charging may cause electric shock. To use the device, stop charging it.



- Remove the charger from the power socket after the device is fully charged. This prevents unnecessary power consumption.
- Another way to charge the battery is by connecting a USB cable between the device and a desktop or laptop computer.
- Do not charge the battery by using a USB hub that is unable to maintain the rated voltage. Charging may fail or unintentionally stop.

Using the battery efficiently

Battery lifespan may decrease if you keep many apps and functions running simultaneously and continuously.

Cancel background functions to increase battery life.

To minimize battery consumption, follow these tips:


- Turn off the **Bluetooth®** or Wi-Fi network function when not using them.
- Set the idle time, when the screen automatically turns off, to as short a time as possible.
- Minimize the screen brightness.
- Set a screen lock when the device is not in use.
- Check how much of your battery downloaded apps use.

Touch screen

You can familiarize yourself with how to control your device by using touch screen gestures.

Tapping

Lightly tap with your fingertip to select or run an app or option.




Touching and holding

Touch and hold for several seconds to display the available options.




Double-tapping

Tap twice quickly to zoom in or out on a web page or map.




Swiping

Move your finger quickly across the surface of the screen, without pausing your finger when you first touch it to not to drag an item.





Flicking

Gently touch and hold on the screen, then flick left or right to quickly move to another panel.



Pinching and spreading

Pinch two fingers to zoom out, such as on a photo or map. To zoom in, spread your fingers apart.



- Do not expose the touch screen to excessive physical shock. You might damage the touch sensor.



- A touch screen failure may occur if you use the device near a magnetic, metallic or conductive material.
- If you use the device under bright lights, such as direct sunlight, the screen may not be visible, depending on your position. Use the device in a shady location or a location with an ambient light that is not too bright and bright enough to read books.
- Do not press the screen with excessive force.
- Gently tap with your fingertip on the desired option.
- Touch control may not work properly if you tap while wearing a glove on or by using the tip of your fingernail.
- Touch control may not work properly if the screen is moist or wet.
- The touch screen may not function properly if a screen-protective film or accessory is attached to the device.

Home screen


Home screen overview

The Home screen is the starting point for accessing various functions and apps on your device. Tap on any screen. This immediately redirects you to the Home screen.

This device provides a list of apps on the Home screen. You can run apps directly from the Home screen, without the need to go to separate screens. Drag the Home screen left or right to display available apps. User-installed apps as well as default apps can be run from the list of apps.

Home screen layout

You can add frequently used apps, widgets and folders to the Home screen. This simplifies the steps used to access them.



- The Home screen may vary, depending on the service provider or software version.

- **Status bar:** View status icons, the time and the battery level.
- **Widgets:** Add widgets to the Home screen to quickly access necessary information without bothering to run apps one by one.
- **Folder:** Create folders to group apps according to particular criteria.
- **Page icon:** Displays the total number of Home screen canvases. Tap the desired page icon to go to the page. The icon reflecting the current canvas will be highlighted.
- **Quick access area:** Fix main apps at the bottom of the screen so that they can be accessed from any Home screen canvas.


- **Home touch buttons:**
 - ◀ : Return to the previous screen. Close the keypad or pop-up windows.
 - ○ : Tap to go to the Home screen. To launch Google Assistant, touch and hold.
 - □ : View a list of recently used apps or run an app from the list. Use the **CLEAR ALL** option to delete all recently used apps.

Editing Home touch buttons

You can rearrange Home touch buttons or add frequently used functions to Home touch buttons.

Tap ○ > **Settings** > **Display** > **Home touch buttons** > **Button combination** and customize the buttons and their locations.

- You can add additional buttons for Notification, Capture+, and QSlide. A maximum of two additional items can be added.



Changing the color of the Home touch buttons bar

You can change the background color of the Home touch buttons.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **Display** > **Home touch buttons** > **Color**.
- 2 Select from **White** and **Black**.

Lock/hide icon

The icon to lock or hide the Home touch buttons appears at the bottom left of the screen.

If you want to lock the Home touch buttons while shown, tap  on the left of the Home touch buttons.

To hide the Home touch buttons again, double-tap .

To deactivate the Lock/hide buttons feature, tap  > **Settings** > **Display** > **Home touch buttons** > **Hide Home touch buttons**, then tap **Show lock/hide icon** .



- Some features may not be supported while the Home touch buttons are hidden.

Hiding the Home touch buttons

You can hide the Home touch buttons to view in a larger screen while using an app.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **Display** > **Home touch buttons** > **Hide Home touch buttons**.
- 2 Select apps to hide the Home touch buttons whiling using the app, and tap 
 - The Home touch buttons disappear 3 seconds after the last touch.
 - To view the Home touch buttons again, drag the bottom of the screen upwards.

Status icons

When there is a notification for an unread message, calendar event or alarm, the status bar displays the corresponding notification icon. Check your device's status by viewing the notification icons displayed on the status bar.

- : No signal
- : Data is being transmitted over the network
- : Alarm is set
- : Vibrate mode is on
- : Bluetooth is on
- : Connected to a computer via USB
- : Battery level
- : Airplane mode is on
- : Missed calls
- : Wi-Fi is on
- : Silent mode is on
- : GPS is on
- : Hotspot is on
- : No SIM card
- : NFC is on




- Some of these icons may appear differently or may not appear at all, depending on the device's status. Refer to the icons according to the actual environment in which you are using the device.
- Displayed icons may vary, depending on the area or service provider.

Notifications panel

You can open the notifications panel by dragging the status bar downward on the main screen.

- To open the quick access icons list, drag the notifications panel downwards or tap ▾.
- If you touch and hold an icon, the settings screen for the corresponding function appears.
- To rearrange, add, or remove icons, tap **EDIT**.



Switching the screen orientation

You can set the screen orientation to automatically switch, according to the device's orientation.

On the notification panel, tap **Rotation** from the quick access icon list.

You can also tap **O > Settings > Display** and activate **Auto-rotate screen**.



Editing the Home screen

On the Home screen, touch and hold on an empty space, then select the desired action from below.


- To rearrange the Home screen canvases, touch and hold on a canvas, then drag it to a desired location.
- To add a widget to the Home screen, touch and hold on a blank area of the Home screen, then select **Widgets**.
- To change a wallpaper, touch and hold on a blank area of the Home screen, then select **Wallpapers**.
- To configure the Home screen settings, touch and hold on a blank area of the Home screen, then select **Home screen settings**. See *Home screen settings* for details.
- To view or reinstall the uninstalled apps, touch and hold on a blank area of the Home screen, then select **App trash**.

Viewing the background theme

You can view only the background image by hiding apps and widgets on the Home screen.

Spread two fingers apart while on the Home screen.

- To return to the original screen, which displays apps and widgets, pinch your fingers on the Home screen or tap .



Moving apps on the Home screen

On the Home screen, touch and hold an app, then drag it to a desired location.

- To keep frequently used apps at the bottom of the Home screen, touch and hold an app, then drag it to the quick access area at the bottom.
- To remove an icon from the quick access area, drag the icon to the Home screen.

Using folders from the Home screen

Creating folders

On the Home screen, touch and hold an app, then drag it over another app.

- A new folder is created and the app is added to the folder.

Editing folders

On the Home screen, tap a folder and then do one of the following:

- To edit the folder name and color, tap the folder name.
- To remove an app from the folder, touch and hold the app and drag it to the outside the folder. If only one app is left in the folder, the folder disappears automatically.
- You can also add or remove apps after tapping  in the folder.

Home screen settings

You can customize your Home screen settings.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **Display** > **Home screen**.
- 2 Customize the following settings.
 - **Select Home**: Select a Home screen mode.
 - **Wallpaper**: Change the Home screen background theme.
 - **Screen swipe effect**: Select an effect to apply when the Home screen canvas switches.
 - **Icon shape**: Choose a desired shape for icons from the list provided.
 - **Sort apps by**: Sort apps by names or download date on the Home screen.
 - **Grid**: Change the app arrangement mode for the Home screen.
 - **Hide apps**: Select apps you want to hide from the Home screen.
 - **Loop Home screen**: Enable to allow continuous Home screen scrolling (loop back to the first screen after the last screen).
 - **Smart Bulletin**: Use the Home screen to view information customized to your needs.
 - **Search**: Search by swiping down on the Home screen.
 - **Help**: Displays information regarding the Home screen items and functions.

Screen lock

Screen lock overview

Your device's screen turns off and locks itself if you press the Power/Lock key. This also happens after the device is left idle for a specified period of time.

If you press the Power/Lock key when a screen lock is not set, the Home screen appears immediately.

To ensure security and prevent unwanted access to your device, set a screen lock.



- Screen lock prevents unnecessary touch input on the device screen and reduces battery consumption. We recommend that you activate the screen lock while not using the device.

Configuring lock screen settings

There are several options available for configuring the lock screen settings.

- 1 Tap > **Settings** > **General** > **Lock screen & security** > Select **screen lock** and then select the method you prefer.
- 2 Customize your lock settings:
 - **None**: Deactivate the screen lock function.
 - **Swipe**: Slide on the screen to unlock it.
 - **Knock Code**: Tap a pattern to wake up and unlock the screen.
 - **Pattern**: Draw a pattern to unlock the screen.
 - **PIN**: Enter a numeric password to unlock the screen.
 - **Password**: Enter an alphanumeric password to unlock the screen.
 - **Fingerprints**: Unlock the screen by using your fingerprint.



- If you incorrectly attempt to unlock the device 5 times, the screen is blocked for 30 seconds.

Customize Lock screen

You can customize the lock screen settings.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **General** > **Lock screen & security** > **Customize Lock screen**.
- 2 Select a function you want to set.
 - **Wallpaper**: Allows you to set the background for your Lock screen.
 - **Shortcuts**: Allows you to choose apps to run on your Lock screen.
 - **Screen swipe effect**: Allows you to set the screen transition effect to apply when the screen is unlocked.
 - **Weather animation**: Enable this option to display weather animations for the current location on the Lock screen.
 - **Contact info for lost phone**: Allows you to set text to be displayed on the Lock screen to identify the phone's owner.



- This option appears only when a screen lock is set.

Secure start-up settings

For additional security for your device, you can enable the Secure start-up option when setting a screen lock.

- You cannot use all functions, except for emergency calls, until you unlock the device.
- If you forget your decryption password, you cannot restore encrypted data and personal information.

KnockON

You can turn the screen on and off by double-tapping the screen.



- This option is available only on the Home screen provided by LG. It may not function properly on a custom launcher or on a Home screen installed by the user.
- When tapping the screen, use your fingertip. Do not use a fingernail.
- To use the KnockON feature, make sure that the proximity/light sensor is not blocked by a sticker or any other foreign substance.

Turning on the screen

Double-tap the middle of the screen.

- Tapping the top or bottom of the screen may decrease the recognition rate.

Turning off the screen

Double-tap on an empty space on the Home screen.

- If a screen other than the Home screen is displayed, double-tap on an empty space on the status bar.

Knock Code

You can unlock the screen by creating your own Knock Code. When the screen is locked, you can directly access the Home screen by tapping the screen in a specified sequence.



- You can use your Knock Code, together with the KnockOn feature.
- Make sure to use your fingertip when tapping the screen.

Creating a Knock Code

- 1 Tap > **Settings** > **General** > **Lock screen & security** > **Select screen lock** > **Knock Code**.
- 2 Tap the squares in a pattern of your choice to create a Knock Code and tap **NEXT**.

- 3 Input the created Knock Code again for verification, then tap CONFIRM.

Unlocking the screen with a Knock Code

Unlock the screen by inputting the Knock Code you have created.

Enter your Knock Code on the touch screen when the screen is turned off.

- It is also possible to enter a Knock Code when the lock screen is turned on.

Device encryption

Encrypting your device

By default, data is encrypted before saving on the device to protect the data. It is possible to read, write and copy data even when device encryption is set. You can set the device with the lock settings so that it displays a user identification prompt when it is turned on.

Precautions for device encryption

You can use the mobile phone lock on the lock screen to increase your device's protection level.



- If the mobile phone lock is turned on and an incorrect password is entered more than a specified number of times, the device will automatically reset.
- If you forget your decryption password, you must reset the device to use it again. A factory reset will delete all data saved before the reset.
- Encryption takes place when the device boots for the first time after a factory reset. Stopping encryption before it is complete may damage data. For example, do not remove or insert the battery while encryption is in progress. Wait until the process is complete.

SD card encryption

You can encrypt and protect data saved on the SD card. The encrypted data in the SD card cannot be accessed from another device.

- 1 Tap > **Settings** > **General** > **Lock screen & security** > **Encryption & credentials** > **Encrypt SD card**.
- 2 Read the on-screen overview of SD card encryption and then tap **CONTINUE** to continue.
- 3 Select an option and tap **ENCRYPT NOW**:
 - **New data encryption**: Encrypt only data that is saved on the SD card after encryption.
 - **Full encryption**: Encrypt all the data currently saved on the SD card.
 - **Exclude media files**: Encrypt all files, except for media files such as music, photos and videos.



- To encrypt the SD card, make sure that the screen lock is set using a PIN or password.
- Once SD card encryption starts, some functions are restricted to access.
- If you turn off the power while encryption is underway, the encryption process will fail, and some data may be damaged.
- Encrypted files are accessible only from the device where the files were encrypted.
- You can activate SD card encryption even when the device does not have an SD card installed. Any SD card that is installed after encryption will automatically be encrypted.

Taking screenshots

You can take screenshots of the current screen you are viewing.

Via a shortcut

Press and hold the Power/Lock key and the Volume Down key simultaneously for at least two seconds.

- Screenshots can be viewed from the **Screenshots** folder in **Gallery**.

Via Capture+

On the screen where you want to take a screenshot, drag the status bar downwards, then tap .



- When the screen is turned off or locked, you can access **Capture+** by pressing the Volume Up key twice. To use this feature, tap **Settings > General** and activate **Shortcut keys**.
 - See *Writing notes on a screenshot* for details.

Entering text

Using the Smart keyboard


You can use the Smart keyboard to enter and edit text.

With the Smart keyboard, you can view text as you type without bothering to alternate between the screen and a conventional keyboard. This allows you to easily find and correct errors when typing.



Moving the cursor

With the Smart keyboard, you can move the cursor to the exact position you want. When typing text, touch and hold on the space bar and then drag left or right.




- This option is available only on the QWERTY keyboard.

Suggesting words

Smart keyboard automatically analyzes your usage patterns to suggest frequently used words as you type. The longer you use your device, the more precise the suggestions are.

Enter text, then tap a suggested word or gently drag the left or right side of the space bar upwards.

- The selected word is automatically entered. You do not need to manually type every letter of the word.




Changing the QWERTY keyboard layout

You can add, delete or rearrange keys on the bottom row of the keyboard.

- 1 Tap > Settings > General > Language & input > On-screen keyboard > LG Keyboard > Keyboard height and layout > QWERTY keyboard layout.

You can also touch and hold on the keyboard and tap > Keyboard height and layout > QWERTY keyboard layout.

- 2 Touch and hold a key on the bottom row, then drag it to a desired position.





- This option is available on the QWERTY, QWERTZ and AZERTY keyboards.
- This function may not be supported for some languages.

Customizing the keyboard height

You can customize the keyboard height to maximize hand comfort when typing.

- 1 Tap > Settings > General > Language & input > On-screen keyboard > Keyboard height and layout > Keyboard height.
You can also touch and hold on the keyboard and tap > Keyboard height and layout > Keyboard height.
- 2 Adjust the keyboard height.



Selecting a landscape keyboard mode

You can select a landscape keyboard mode from several choices.

- 1 Tap > Settings > General > Language & input > On-screen keyboard > Keyboard height and layout > Keyboard type in landscape.
You can also touch and hold on the keyboard and tap > Keyboard height and layout > Keyboard type in landscape.
- 2 Select a keyboard mode.

One-handed operation mode

You can move the keyboard to one side of the screen so that you can use the keyboard with one hand.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **General Language & input** > **On-screen keyboard** > **LG Keyboard** > **Keyboard height and layout** > **One-handed operation**.

You can also touch and hold  on the keyboard and tap  > **Keyboard height and layout** > **One-handed operation**.

- 2 Press the arrow displayed next to the keyboard to move the keyboard in the direction you want.



Entering text by using voice

On the keyboard, tap .



- To maximize the voice command recognition, speak clearly.
- To enter text with your voice, make sure that your device is connected to a network.
- To select the language for voice recognition, tap  > **Languages** on the voice recognition screen.
- This function may be not supported, or the supported languages may differ depending on the service area.

Adding languages to the keyboard

You can make additional languages available for keyboard input.

- 1 Tap  > **Settings** > **General** > **Language & input** > **On-screen keyboard** > **LG Keyboard** > **Select languages**.
- 2 Select the languages you want to use on the keyboard..

Copy and Paste

You can cut or copy text from an app, and then paste the text into the same app. Or you can run other apps and paste the text into them.

- 1 Touch and hold around the text you want to copy or cut.
 - 2 Drag to specify the area to copy or cut.
 - 3 Select either **CUT** or **COPY**.
 - Cut or copied text is automatically added to the clipboard.
 - 4 Touch and hold the text input window, then select **PASTE**.
- If there is no item that has been copied or cut, the **PASTE** option will not appear.

Clip Tray

If you copy or cut an image or text, it is automatically saved to the clip tray and can be pasted to any space at any time.

- 1 On the keyboard, touch and hold and select . You can also touch and hold the text input window, then select **CLIP TRAY**.
 - 2 Select and paste an item from the clip tray.
 - A maximum of 20 items can be saved to the clip tray.
 - Tap to lock saved items in order not to delete them, even when the maximum quantity is exceeded. A maximum of ten items can be locked. To delete locked items, unlock them first.
 - Tap to delete the items saved to the clip tray.
- The clip tray may not be supported by some downloaded apps.

Useful Apps

Installing and uninstalling apps

Installing apps

Access an app store to search and download apps.

- You can use SmartWorld, Play Store or the app store provided by your mobile service provider.



- Some app stores may require you to create an account and sign in.
- Some apps may charge fees.
- If you use mobile data, you may be charged for data usage, depending on your pricing plan.

Uninstalling apps

Uninstall apps that you no longer use from your device.



- Some apps cannot be uninstalled by users.

Uninstalling with the touch and hold gesture

On the Home screen, touch and hold the app to uninstall, then drag it over **Delete** at the top of the screen.

- Uninstalled apps can be reinstalled within 24 hours of uninstallation.
See *App trash* for details.

Uninstalling by using the settings menu

Tap > **Settings** > **General** > **Apps & notifications** > **App info**, select an app, then tap **Uninstall**.

Uninstalling apps from the app store

To uninstall an app, access the app store you download the app from and uninstall it.

App trash

You can view the uninstalled apps on the Home screen. You can also reinstall apps within 24 hours of uninstallation.

1 Tap > App trash.

Alternatively, you can also touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen, then tap **App trash**.

2 Choose the desired option.

- **Restore**: Restore the selected app.
-  : Remove the uninstalled apps permanently from the device.



- Uninstalled apps are automatically removed from the device 24 hours after they were uninstalled. If you want to reinstall the uninstalled apps, you must download them again from the app store.
- This feature is activated on the default Home screen only. If you uninstall apps while using the EasyHome screen or other launcher, they are immediately and permanently removed from the device.

Phone

Voice call

You can make a phone call by using one of the available methods, such as manually entering a phone number or making a call from the contact list or the list of recent calls.

Making a call from the keypad

- 1 Tap > > Dial.
- 2 Make a call by using a method of your choice:
 - Enter a phone number and tap .
 - Touch and hold a speed-dial number.
 - Search for a contact by tapping the initial letter of a contact name in the contact list, and then tap .



- To enter "+" when making an international call, touch and hold number 0.
- See *Adding contacts to the speed dial list* for details on how to add phone numbers to the speed dial list.

Making a call from the contact list

- 1 Tap > > Contacts.
- 2 From the contact list, select a contact and tap .

Answering a call

To answer a call, swipe on the incoming call screen.

- When the stereo headset is connected, you can make calls by using the call/end button on the headset.
- To end a call simply by pressing the Power/Lock key, tap > **Settings** > **Networks** > **Call** > **Answer and end calls**, then turn on **End calls with the Power key**.

Rejecting a call

To reject an incoming call, swipe  on the incoming call screen.

- To send a rejection message swipe  on the incoming call screen and select the message you want to send.
- To add or edit a rejection message, tap  > **Settings > Networks > Call > Call blocking & Decline with message > Decline with message**.
- When a call is coming in, press the Volume Up, Volume Down or Power/Lock key to mute ringtone or vibration.

Viewing missed calls

If there is a missed call, the status bar at the top of the screen displays .

To view missed call details, drag the status bar downwards and tap the missed call notification. You can also tap  > **Call logs**.

Functions accessible during a call

During a call, you can access a variety of functions on the call screen.

- **Hold:** Place the current call on hold.
- **Video Call:** Switch to a video call (if available).
- **Contacts:** Move directly to the contact list from the call screen. It is possible to view the contact list during a call.
- **End:** End a call.
- **Dialpad:** Display or hide the dial pad.
- **Speaker:** Turn on the speakerphone function.
- **Mute:** Mute your voice so that your voice cannot be heard by the other party.
- **Bluetooth:** Use a Bluetooth device to make calls. Make sure that a Bluetooth device is connected.
- **⋮ :** Access additional call options.

Making a three-way calling

You can make a call to another contact during a call.

- 1 During a call, tap : > **Add call**.
 - 2 Enter a phone number and tap .
 - The two calls are displayed at the same time, and the first call is put on hold.
 - 3 To switch to another call, tap the desired number on the screen.
To start a conference call, tap .
-  • You may be charged a fee for each call. Consult your mobile service provider for more information.

Viewing call records

To view recent call records, tap  >  > **Call logs**. Then, you can use the following functions:

- To view detailed call records, select an entry. To make a call to the selected call entry, tap .
 - To delete call records, tap : > **Delete** or **Delete all**.
-  • The displayed call duration may differ from the call charge. Contact your mobile service provider for details on call charges.

Configuring call options

You can configure various call options.

- 1 Tap  >  > **Dial** or **Call logs**.
- 2 Tap : > **Call settings** and then configure the options to suit your preferences.

Messaging

Sending a message

You can send messages to all of your contacts using the Messaging app.



- Sending messages abroad may incur additional charges.

- 1 Tap > .
- 2 Tap .
- 3 Specify a recipient and create a message.
 - To attach files, tap .
 - To access optional menu items, tap .
- 4 Tap **Send** to send the message.

Reading a message

You can view exchanged messages organized by contact.

- 1 Tap > .
- 2 Select a message from the message thread list.

Configuring messaging settings

You can change messaging settings to suit your preferences.

- 1 Tap > .
- 2 Tap > **Settings** from the message list.

Camera

Starting the camera

You can take a photo or record a video to cherish all of your memorable moments.

Tap .



- Before taking a photo or recording a video, wipe the camera lens with a soft cloth.
- Be careful not to stain the camera lens with your fingers or other foreign substance.
- Images included in this user guide may be different from the actual device.
- Photos and videos can be viewed or edited in Gallery. See *Gallery overview* for details.

Changing the camera mode

You can select a camera mode that suits your environment to take a photo or record a video easily and conveniently.


Tap  >  > MODE, then select the desired mode.



Auto mode

You can take photos or record videos by selecting a variety of camera modes and options.

- 1 Tap > , then tap **Auto** ().
- 2 To take a photo, tap . To record a video, tap .



Taking a photo

- 1 Select a camera mode and tap the subject to focus the camera on.
- 2 Tap to take a photo.
 - You can also press the Volume Down or Volume Up key to take a photo.



- When the screen is turned off or locked, start the camera by pressing the Volume Down key twice. To enable this feature, tap > **Settings** > **General** > **Shortcut keys**.

Recording a video

- 1 Select a camera mode and tap the subject to focus the camera on.
- 2 Tap .
 - To take a photo while recording a video, tap .
 - To pause the video recording, tap . To resume the video recording, tap .
- 3 Tap  to end the video recording.

Customizing the camera options

You can customize a variety of camera options to suit your preferences.

Tap  on the screen.





You can take a sequence of frames at set intervals to record changes that take place slowly over time, such as cloud movements, celestial motions, traffic, and more.

- While recording a Time-lapse, voices are not recorded.



Slo-mo

You can create an entertaining video by changing the moving speeds of subjects in your video. This feature allows you to record a video at a faster rate of speed and then play it at the standard speed so that the video appears to be slowed down.

- 1 Tap > , then tap **MODE** > .
- 2 Tap and record a video.
- 3 Tap to end the video recording.



Popout

You can take a photo or record a video by using both the standard and wide-angle of the dual camera at the back of the device to record the scenes as if they were put in a frame. The scenes shown in the small, front screen are shot by using the standard camera, and the scenes shown in the large, background screen are shot by using the wide-angle camera. Change the front screen to a different shape or apply various effects to take a sensuous photo or video.

- 1 Tap > , then tap **MODE** > .
- 2 Tap and select the desired layout.
- 3 Select the desired effect:
 - **Fisheye**: Apply a convex lens effect to the area captured by the wide-angle camera.
 - **B&W**: Apply grayscale to the area captured by the wide-angle camera.
 - **Vignette**: Darken the edges of the area captured by the wide-angle camera.
 - **Lens blur**: Blur the area captured by the wide-angle camera.

Multi-view

You can take multiple photos or videos in the form of a collage by using the front and rear cameras. Photos and videos can be saved with different layouts.

Panorama

- Do not damage the power cord by bending, twisting, pulling, or heating. Do not use the plug if it is loose as it may cause electric shock or fire.
- Do not place any heavy items on the power cord. Do not allow the power cord to be crimped as it may cause electric shock or fire.
- Do not handle the phone with wet hands while it is being charged. It may cause an electric shock or seriously damage your phone.



- Do not disassemble the phone.
- Do not place or answer calls while charging the phone as it may short-circuit the phone and/or cause electric shock or fire.
- Do not attempt to repair or modify the device yourself. Your device is equipped with an internal rechargeable battery which should be replaced only by LG or an authorized LG repair center.
- You should never attempt to open or disassemble this device yourself and doing so may cause damage that voids your warranty.
- Make sure that no sharp-edged items, such as animal's teeth or nails, come into contact with the battery. This could cause a fire.

Consumer Information About Radio Frequency Emissions

Your wireless phone, which contains a radio transmitter and receiver, emits radio frequency energy during use. The following consumer information addresses commonly asked questions about the health effects of wireless phones.

Are wireless phones safe?

Scientific research on the subject of wireless phones and radio frequency ("RF") energy has been conducted worldwide for many years, and continues. In the United States, the Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") and the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") set policies and procedures for wireless phones. The FDA issued a website publication on health issues related to cell phone usage where it states, "The scientific community at large ... believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to radiofrequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community does recommend conducting additional research to address gaps in knowledge. That research is being conducted around the world and FDA continues to monitor developments in this field. You can access the joint FDA/FCC website at <http://www.fda.gov> (under "c" in the subject index, select Cell Phones > Research). You can also contact the FDA toll-free at (888) 463-6332 or (888) INFO-FDA. In June 2000, the FDA entered into a cooperative research and development agreement through which additional scientific research is being conducted. The FCC issued its own website publication stating that "there is no scientific evidence that proves that wireless phone usage can lead to cancer or a variety of other problems, including headaches, dizziness or memory loss." What does "SAR" mean?

In 1996, the FCC, working with the FDA, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and other agencies, established RF exposure safety guidelines for wireless phones in the United States. Before a wireless phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested by the manufacturer and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed limits established by the FCC. One of these limits is expressed as a Specific Absorption Rate, or "SAR." SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy in the body. Tests for SAR are conducted with the phone transmitting at its highest power level in all tested frequency bands. Since

1996, the FCC has required that the SAR of handheld wireless phones not exceed 1.6 watts per kilogram, averaged over one gram of tissue. Although the SAR is determined at the highest power level, the actual SAR value of a wireless phone while operating can be less than the reported SAR value. This is because the SAR value may vary from call to call, depending on factors such as proximity to a cell site, the proximity of the phone to the body while in use, and the use of hands-free devices. For more information about SARs, see the FCC's OET Bulletins 56 and 65 at http://www.fcc.gov/Bureaus/Engineering_Technology/Documents/bulletins or visit the Cellular Telecommunications Industry Association website at http://www.ctia.org/consumer_info/index.cfm/AID/10371. Can I minimize my RF exposure?

If you are concerned about RF, there are several simple steps you can take to minimize your RF exposure. You can, of course, reduce your talk time.

You can place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, as the exposure level drops off dramatically with distance. The FDA/FCC website states that "hands-free kits can be used with wireless phones for convenience and comfort. These systems reduce the absorption of RF energy in the head because the phone, which is the source of the RF emissions, will not be placed against the head. On the other hand, if the phone is mounted against the waist or other part of the body during use, then that part of the body will absorb more RF energy. Wireless phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet safety requirements regardless of whether they are used against the head or against the body. Either configuration should result in compliance with the safety limit." Also, if you use your wireless phone while in a car, you can use a phone with an antenna on the outside of the vehicle. You should also read and follow your wireless phone manufacturer's instructions for the safe operation of your phone.

Do wireless phones pose any special risks to children?

The FDA/FCC website states that "the scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless communication devices, including children." The FDA/FCC website further states that "some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all." For example, the Stewart Report from the United Kingdom ["UK"] made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. [The UK's] recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health

Parents who wish to reduce their children's RF exposure may choose to restrict their children's wireless phone use.

Consumer Information on SAR

(Specific Absorption Rate)

This model phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves. Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. Because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels to use only the power required to reach the network, in general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

The highest SAR values are:

* Head: 1.02 W/kg

* Body (Body-worn/Hotspot): 1.12 W/kg

(Body measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements).

While there may be differences between SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines. SAR information on this model phone is on file with the FCC and can be found under the Display Grant section of <http://www.fcc.gov/oet/fccid> after

searching on FCC ID ZNFH820. Additional information on Specific Absorption Rates (SAR) can be found on the Cellular Telecommunications Industry Association (CTIA) website at <http://www.ctia.org/>.

* In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

FCC Hearing-Aid Compatibility (HAC) Regulations for Wireless Devices

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing aids. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities. While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.


The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users to find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. T4 is the better/ higher of the two ratings.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise. The hearing aid and wireless phone rating values are then added together.

A sum of 5 is considered acceptable for normal use. A sum of 6 is considered for best use.



In the above example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless phone meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equal M5. This should provide the hearing aid user with "normal usage" while using their hearing aid with the particular wireless phone. "Normal usage" in this context is defined as a signal quality that's acceptable for normal operation.

The M mark is intended to be synonymous with the U mark. The T mark is intended to be synonymous with the UT mark. The M and T marks are recommended by the Alliance for Telecommunications Industries Solutions (ATIS). The U and UT marks are referenced in Section 20.19 of the FCC Rules. The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your phone is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth and WLAN components must be disabled during a call.

Caution:

Avoid potential hearing loss.

Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cellular telephones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds and Bluetooth or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and other potential hearing problems varies.

The amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device, the device settings and the headphones. You should follow some commonsense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-canceling headphones to block out background environmental noise.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before your hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech or experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

TIA Safety Information

The following is the complete TIA Safety Information for wireless handheld phones.

Exposure to Radio Frequency Signal

Your wireless handheld portable phone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When ON, it receives and sends out Radio Frequency (RF) signals.

In August, 1996, the Federal Communications Commissions (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for handheld wireless phones. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies:

ANSI C95.1 (1992)*

NCRP Report 86 (1986)

ICNIRP (1996)

* American National Standards Institute; National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements; International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection.

Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant scientific literature. For example, over 120 scientists, engineers, and physicians from universities, government health agencies, and industry reviewed the available body of research to develop the ANSI Standard (C95.1).

The design of your phone complies with the FCC guidelines (and those standards).

Antenna Care

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the phone and may violate FCC regulations.

Tips on Efficient Operation

For your phone to operate most efficiently:

Don't touch the antenna unnecessarily when the phone is in use. Contact with the antenna affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than otherwise needed.

Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone.

Pacemakers

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six (6) inches be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

- Should ALWAYS keep the phone more than six (6) inches from their pacemaker when the phone is turned ON;
- Should not carry the phone in a breast pocket;
- Should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference;
- Should turn the phone OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider (or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives).

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Health Care Facilities

Turn your phone OFF in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may use equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Turn your phone OFF in any facility where posted notices so require.

Aircraft

FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while in the air. Switch OFF your phone before boarding an aircraft.

Blasting Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone OFF when in a "blasting area" or in areas posted: "Turn off two-way radio". Obey all signs and instructions.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Turn your phone OFF when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always marked clearly. Potential areas may include: fueling areas (such as gasoline stations); below deck on boats; fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities; vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane); areas where the air contains chemicals or particles (such as grain, dust, or metal powders); and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

For Vehicles Equipped with an Air Bag

An air bag inflates with great force. DO NOT place objects, including either installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

Part 15.19 statement

- The battery pack has protection circuit to avoid the danger. Do not use nearby the place where generates static electricity more than 100V which gives damage to the protection circuit. If the protection circuit were broken, the battery would generate smoke, rupture or flame.
- If the skin or cloth is smeared with liquid from the battery, wash with fresh water. It may cause the skin inflammation.
- Please take your phone to an authorized service center immediately if this occurs.
- Do not handle the phone with wet hands while it is being charged. It may cause an electric shock or seriously damage your phone.
- Do not place or answer calls while charging the phone as it may short-circuit the phone and/or cause electric shock or fire.
- The charger and adapter are intended for indoor use only.
- Talking on your phone for a long period of time may reduce call quality due to heat generated during use.

Explosion, Shock, and Fire Hazards

- Do not put your phone in a place subject to excessive dust and keep the minimum required distance between the power cord and heat sources.
- Unplug the power cord prior to cleaning your phone, and clean the power plug pin when it's dirty.
- When using the power plug, ensure that it's firmly connected. If not, it may cause excessive heat or fire.
- If you put your phone in a pocket or bag without covering the receptacle of the phone (power plug pin), metallic articles (such as a coin, paperclip or pen) may short-circuit the phone and may cause an explosion. Always cover the receptacle when not in use.

General Notice

- Do not place items containing magnetic components such as a credit card, phone card, bank book, or subway ticket near your phone. The magnetism of the phone may damage the data stored in the magnetic strip.
- Talking on your phone for a long period of time may reduce call quality due to heat generated during use.

- When the phone is not used for a long period time, store it in a safe place with the power cord unplugged.
- Using the phone in proximity to receiving equipment (i.e., TV or radio) may cause interference to the phone.
- Do not use the phone if the antenna is damaged. If a damaged antenna contacts skin, it may cause a slight burn. Please contact an LG Authorized Service Center to replace the damaged antenna.
- Do not immerse your phone in water, liquid, or expose to high humidity. Immediately, take it to an LG Authorized Service Center.
- Do not paint your phone.
- The data saved in your phone might be deleted due to careless use, repair of the phone, or upgrade of the software. Please backup your important phone numbers. FDA Consumer Update



The U.S. Food and Drug Administration's Center for Devices and Radiological Health Consumer Update on Mobile Phones:

1. Do wireless phones pose a health hazard?

The available scientific evidence does not show that any health problems are associated with using wireless phones. There is no proof, however, that wireless phones are absolutely safe. Wireless phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low levels of RF when in standby mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating

effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the reasons for inconsistent results.

2. What is the FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless phones?

Under the law, the FDA does not review the safety of radiation-emitting consumer products such as wireless phones before they can be sold, as it does with new drugs or medical devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless phones are shown to emit Radio Frequency (RF) energy at a level that is hazardous to the user. In such a case, the FDA could require the manufacturers of wireless phones to notify users of the health hazard and to repair, replace, or recall the phones so that the hazard no longer exists. Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the wireless phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support needed research into possible biological effects of RF of the type emitted by wireless phones;
- Design wireless phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user that is not necessary for device function; and
- Cooperate in providing users of wireless phones with the best possible information on possible effects of wireless phone use on human health.

The FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the federal level. The following agencies belong to this working group:

- National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health
- Environmental Protection Agency
- Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- National Telecommunications and Information Administration

The National Institutes of Health participates in some interagency working group activities, as well.

The FDA shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless phones with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). All phones that are sold in the United States must comply with FCC safety guidelines that limit RF exposure. The FCC relies on the FDA and other health agencies for safety questions about wireless phones.

The FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless phone networks rely upon. While these base stations operate at higher power than do the wireless phones themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless phones. Base stations are thus not the subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

3. What kinds of phones are the subject of this update?

The term "wireless phone" refers here to handheld wireless phones with built-in antennas, often called "cell", "mobile", or "PCS" phones. These types of wireless phones can expose the user to measurable Radio Frequency (RF) energy because of the short distance between the phone and the user's head.

These RF exposures are limited by FCC safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of the FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the phone is located at greater distances from the user, the exposure to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposure decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the source. The so-called "cordless phones," which have a base unit connected to the telephone wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower power levels, and thus produce RF exposures far below the FCC safety limits.

4. What are the results of the research done already?

The research done thus far has produced conflicting results, and many studies have suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments investigating the effects of Radio Frequency (RF) energy exposures characteristic of wireless phones have yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals. However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer-causing chemicals so as to be pre-disposed to develop cancer in the absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless phones, so we do not know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health. Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them, the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless phones and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neuroma, tumors of the brain or salivary gland, leukemia, or other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful health effects from wireless phone RF exposures. However, none of the studies can answer questions about long-term

exposures, since the average period of phone use in these studies was around three years.

5. What research is needed to decide whether RF exposure from wireless phones poses a health risk?

A combination of laboratory studies and epidemiological studies of people actually using wireless phones would provide some of the data that are needed. Lifetime animal exposure studies could be completed in a few years. However, very large numbers of animals would be needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but ten or more years follow-up may be needed to provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to a cancer-causing agent and the time tumors develop – if they do – may be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless phones. Many factors affect this measurement, such as the angle at which the phone is held, or which model of phone is used.

6. What is the FDA doing to find out more about the possible health effects of wireless phone RF?

The FDA is working with the U.S. National Toxicology Program and with groups of investigators around the world to ensure that high priority animal studies are conducted to address important questions about the effects of exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) energy.

The FDA has been a leading participant in the World Health Organization International Electro Magnetic Fields (EMF) Project since its inception in 1996. An influential result of this work has been the development of a detailed agenda of research needs that has driven the establishment of new research programs around the world. The project has also helped develop a series of public information documents on EMF issues. The FDA and the Cellular Telecommunications & Internet Association (CTIA) have a formal Cooperative Research And Development Agreement (CRADA) to do research on wireless phone safety. The FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIA-funded research is conducted through contracts with independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless phone users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

7. How can I find out how much Radio Frequency energy exposure I can get by using my wireless phone?

All phones sold in the United States must comply with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) guidelines that limit Radio Frequency (RF) energy exposures. The FCC established these guidelines in consultation with the FDA and the other federal health and safety agencies. The FCC limit for RF exposure from wireless phones is set at a Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC limit is consistent with the safety standards developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (IEEE) and the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement. The exposure limit takes into consideration the body's ability to remove heat from the tissues that absorb energy from the wireless phone and is set well below levels known to have effects. Manufacturers of wireless phones must report the RF exposure level for each model of phone to the FCC. The FCC website (<http://www.fcc.gov/oet/rfsafety>) gives directions for locating the FCC identification number on your phone so you can find your phone's RF exposure level in the online listing.

8. What has the FDA done to measure the Radio Frequency energy coming from wireless phones?

The Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) is developing a technical standard for measuring the Radio Frequency (RF) energy exposure from wireless phones and other wireless handsets with the participation and leadership of FDA scientists and engineers. The standard, "Recommended Practice for Determining the Spatial-Peak Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) in the Human Body Due to Wireless Communications Devices: Experimental Techniques", sets forth the first consistent test methodology for measuring the rate at which RF is deposited in the heads of wireless phone users. The test method uses a tissue-simulating model of the human head.

Standardized SAR test methodology is expected to greatly improve the consistency of measurements made at different laboratories on the same phone. SAR is the measurement of the amount of energy absorbed in tissue, either by the whole body or a small part of the body. It is measured in watts/kg (or milliwatts/g) of matter. This measurement is used to determine whether a wireless phone complies with safety guidelines.

9. What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to Radio Frequency energy from my wireless phone?

If there is a risk from these products – and at this point we do not know that there is – it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Since time is a key factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless phone will reduce RF exposure. If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless phone every day, you could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the exposure level drops off dramatically with distance. For example, you could use a headset and carry the wireless phone away from your body or use a wireless phone connected to a remote antenna. Again, the scientific data does not demonstrate that wireless phones are harmful. But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless phone use.

10. What about children using wireless phones?

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless phones, including children and teenagers. If you want to take steps to lower exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) energy, the measures described above would apply to children and teenagers using wireless phones. Reducing the time of wireless phone use and increasing the distance between the user and the RF source will reduce RF exposure. Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000.

They noted that no evidence exists that using a wireless phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

11. What about wireless phone interference with medical equipment?

Radio Frequency (RF) energy from wireless phones can interact with some electronic devices. For this reason, the FDA helped develop a detailed test method to measure Electro Magnetic Interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless telephones. This test method is now part of a standard sponsored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical

Instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by the FDA, medical device manufacturers, and many other groups, was completed in late 2000. This standard will allow manufacturers to ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators are safe from wireless phone EMI.

The FDA has tested hearing aids for interference from handheld wireless phones and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for hearing aids and wireless phones so that no interference occurs when a person uses a "compatible" phone and a "compatible" hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000.

The FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless phones for possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur, the FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.

Driving

Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless phones in the areas where you drive and always obey them. Also, if using your phone while driving, please observe the following:

- Give full attention to driving -- driving safely is your first responsibility;
- Use hands-free operation, if available;
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions or the law require it.

10 Driver Safety Tips

Your wireless phone gives you the powerful ability to communicate by voice almost anywhere, anytime. An important responsibility accompanies the benefits of wireless phones, one that every user must uphold. When operating a car, driving is your first responsibility. When using your wireless phone behind the wheel of a car, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:

1. Get to know your wireless phone and its features such as speed dial and redial. Carefully read your instruction manual and learn to take advantage of valuable features most phones offer, including automatic redial and memory. Also, work to memorize the phone keypad so you can use the speed dial function without taking your attention off the road.
2. When available, use a hands-free device. A number of hands-free wireless phone accessories are readily available today. Whether you choose an installed mounted device for your wireless phone or a speaker phone accessory, take advantage of these devices if available to you.
3. Make sure you place your wireless phone within easy reach and where you can reach it without removing your eyes from the road. If you get an incoming call at an inconvenient time, if possible, let your voicemail answer it for you.
4. Suspend conversations during hazardous driving conditions or situations. Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, and ice can be hazardous, but so is heavy traffic. As a driver, your first responsibility is to pay attention to the road.
5. Don't take notes or look up phone numbers while driving. If you are reading an address book or business card, or writing a "to-do" list while driving a car, you are not watching where you are going. It is common sense. Do not get caught in a dangerous situation because you are reading or writing and not paying attention to the road or nearby vehicles.
6. Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan your calls before you begin your trip or attempt to coincide your calls with times you may be stopped at a stop sign, red light, or otherwise stationary. But if you need to dial while driving, follow this simple tip -- dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
7. Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Stressful or emotional conversations and driving do not mix; they are distracting and even dangerous when you are behind the wheel of a car. Make people you

are talking with aware you are driving and if necessary, suspend conversations which have the potential to divert your attention from the road.

8. Use your wireless phone to call for help. Your wireless phone is one of the greatest tools you can own to protect yourself and your family in dangerous situations -- with your phone at your side, help is only three numbers away. Dial 911 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, road hazard, or medical emergency. Remember, it's a free call on your wireless phone!
9. Use your wireless phone to help others in emergencies. Your wireless phone provides you a perfect opportunity to be a "Good Samaritan" in your community. If you see an auto accident, crime in progress or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 911 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.
10. Call roadside assistance or a special wireless non-emergency assistance number when necessary. Certain situations you encounter while driving may require attention, but are not urgent enough to merit a call for emergency services. But you can still use your wireless phone to lend a hand. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency wireless number.

The above tips are meant as general guidelines. Before deciding to use your mobile device while operating a vehicle, it is recommended that you consult your applicable jurisdiction's local laws or other regulations regarding such use. Such laws or other regulations may prohibit or otherwise restrict the manner in which a driver may use his or her phone while operating a vehicle.

The arbitration will be administered by the American Arbitration Association ("AAA") and will be conducted before a single arbitrator under the AAA's Consumer Arbitration Rules that are in effect at the time the arbitration is initiated (referred to as the "AAA Rules") and under the procedures set forth in this section. The AAA Rules are available online at www.adr.org/consumer. Send a copy of your written demand for arbitration, as well as a copy of this provision, to the AAA in the manner described in the AAA Rules. You must also send a copy of your written demand to LG at LG Electronics, U.S.A., Inc. Attn: Legal Department- Arbitration 1000 Sylvan Avenue Englewood Cliffs, NJ 07632. If there is a conflict between the AAA Rules and the rules set forth in this section, the rules set forth in this section will govern. This arbitration provision is governed by the Federal Arbitration Act. Judgment may be entered on the arbitrator's award in any court of competent jurisdiction. All issues are for the arbitrator to decide, except that issues relating to the scope and enforceability of the arbitration provision and to the arbitrability of the dispute are for the court to decide. The arbitrator is bound by the terms of this provision.

Governing Law. The law of the state of your residence shall govern this Limited Warranty and any disputes between us except to the extent that such law is preempted by or inconsistent with applicable federal law.

Fees/Costs. You do not need to pay any fee to begin an arbitration. Upon receipt of your written demand for arbitration, LG will promptly pay all arbitration filing fees to the AAA unless you seek more than \$25,000 in damages, in which case the payment of these fees will be governed by the AAA Rules. Except as otherwise provided for herein, LG will pay all AAA filing, administration and arbitrator fees for any arbitration initiated in accordance with the AAA Rules and this arbitration provision. If you prevail in the arbitration, LG will pay your attorneys' fees and expenses as long as they are reasonable, by considering factors including, but not limited to, the purchase amount and claim amount. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if applicable law allows for an award of reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses, an arbitrator can award them to the same extent that a court would. If the arbitrator finds either the substance of your claim or the relief sought in the demand is frivolous or brought for an improper purpose (as measured by the standards set forth in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 11(b)), then the payment of all arbitration fees will be governed by the AAA Rules. In such a situation, you agree to reimburse LG for all monies previously disbursed by it that are otherwise your obligation to pay under the AAA Rules. Except as otherwise provided for, LG waives any rights it may have to seek attorneys' fees and expenses from you if LG prevails in the arbitration.

Hearings and Location. If your claim is for \$25,000 or less, you may choose to have the arbitration conducted solely on the basis of (1) documents submitted to the arbitrator, (2) through a telephonic hearing, or (3) by an in-person hearing as established by the AAA Rules. If your claim exceeds \$25,000, the right to a hearing will be determined by the AAA Rules. Any in-person arbitration hearings will be held at a location within the federal judicial district in which you reside unless we both agree to another location or we agree to a telephonic arbitration.

Opt Out. You may opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. If you opt out, neither you nor LG can require the other to participate in an arbitration proceeding. To opt out, you must send notice to LG no later than 30 calendar days from the date of the first consumer purchaser's purchase of the product by either: (i) sending an e-mail to *optout@lge.com*, with the subject line: "Arbitration Opt Out" or (ii) calling 1-800-980-2973. You must include in the opt out e-mail or provide by telephone: (a) your name and address; (b) the date on which the product was purchased; (c) the product model name or model number, and (d) the IMEI or MEID or Serial Number, as applicable (the IMEI or MEID or Serial Number can be found (i) on the product box; (ii) on a label on the back of the product beneath the battery, if the battery is removable; or (iii) from the settings menu via the following path:

Settings > General > About phone > Status).

You may only opt out of the dispute resolution procedure in the manner described above (that is, by e-mail or telephone); no other form of notice will be effective to opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. Opting out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and you will continue to enjoy the full benefits of the Limited Warranty. If you keep this product and do not opt out, then you accept all terms and conditions of the arbitration provision described above.
