





# LG Plasma Colour Display

Plasma Display operates as a group of MZ-40PA18/42PZ10/14 (Monitor), RZ-BA10 (PDP Tuner) and AP-42SA10 (Speaker) series. Hear in after this plasma display group is called the Plasma Display.

#### What is a Plasma Display?

If voltage is inputted to gas in glass panels, ultraviolet rays is outputted and fused with a fluorescent substance. At this moment, light is emitted. A Plasma Display is a next generation flat Display using this phenomenon.

#### 160° - Wide angle range of vision

A Plasma Display provides more than 160° angle range of vision so that you can get a picture without distortion from any direction.

#### **Easy installation**


A Plasma Display is much lighter and smaller than other same class products so that you can install the Plasma Display at the desired place.


# Controls of the remote control

- When using the remote control aim it at the remote control sensor of the Plasma Display.
- This remote control is the one offered when purchasing an LG plasma display monitor.





**MUTE** button switches the sound on or off.



TV/AV button on the remote control

If both S-VIDEO and VIDEO input have been connected simultaneously, only the S-VIDEO can be received.

#### ➤ PROGRAMME (▼, ▲) buttons




# **Composition of the Plasma Display**

- If the Monitor is connected with the PDP Tuner and the latter is switched on, the connecting ports of the Monitor doesn't operate.



- Connect the Monitor with the PDP Tuner by using the control cable (25-15/9 pin).
- · Connect the Speaker cable with matching the polarity.
- · Connect the power cord.


#### **How to connect Speakers and Monitor**



- Switch the Monitor off first and connect the Speaker cables as the picture above. Be sure to match the polarity and left/right.
  (Speakers can also be assembled with the Monitor. For further information refer to 'Speaker &
  - Speaker stand owner's manual.)
- After connecting the Speaker cables in the desired length you can arrange them with the supplied holders as the picture above. Fix the holders in the holes on the back panel of the Monitor in the → arrow direction. Once the holders are fixed they can't be pulled out. Decide the position for holders carefully before fixing.

# **Connecting antenna**

- Connect the Plasma Display with various external equipments after connecting the Monitor with the PDP Tuner and the Speakers.





**Back panel of the PDP Tuner** 




Be careful for the bronze wire not to be bended in connecting to antenna input port.

• RF coaxial cable is not included with the Plasma Display.




- In poor signal area, purchase a signal amplifer to get better picture quality.
- If antenna is split to two Plasma Display sets, use "signal splitter" for better connection.
- If antenna is installed properly, contact your dealer.



# Watching VCR


- When connecting the Plasma Display with external equipments, match the colours of connecting ports (Video - yellow, Audio(L) white, Audio(R) - red).
- If you have a mono VCR, connect the audio cable from the VCR to the AUDIO(L/MONO) input of the Plasma Display.
- When connecting a S-VIDEO input, the picture quality will be far improved.





- You can watch VCR only when the Plasma Display programme is matched with programme switch of VCR.
- Press the ▲ / ▼ buttons or number buttons to return to normal TV viewing.
- You can record programmes received through ANT IN using the Euro scart socket (AV1) of the PDP Tuner.

You can also record signal received through **AV1**, **AV2** and **AV3** using the Euro scart socket (**AV2**) of the PDP Tuner.



To watch VCR

Turn the Plasma Display on and select the programme you want.




TV/AV

- Press TV/AV button on the remote control to select AV 1, AV 2 or AV 3 (only for S-VIDEO). 
  (Select AV 3 if AV 3 is connected. If some connected to the S VIDEO sockets have been connected to the S-VHS VCR simultaneously, only the S-VIDEO can be received.)
- Insert a video tape into the VCR and press the PLAY button on the VCR.

# Watching external AV source

- When connecting the Plasma Display with external equipments, match the colours of connecting ports.



Press TV/AV button on the remote control to select AV 3.

Operate the corresponding external equipments.


# Watching DVD

- In case of connecting the Monitor with a DVD player directly, you should disconnect the PDP Tuner or switch the PDP Tuner off.



#### How to connect

- COMPONENT input is set as 480i or 480p mode.
- Connect component video inputs to Y, PB, PB and audio inputs to right and left Audio ports.





#### How to use



# Connecting PC as a monitor



#### Connecting with PC dicectly

- You should disconnect the Monitor from the PDP Tuner or switch the PDP Tuner off to use the Monitor as a PC monitor only.
- Set the video mode of PC to VGA/SVGA/XGA to obtain the best picture quality for the Monitor.
- If the resolution of PC is over XGA, there will be no picture on the Monitor.
- Connect the signal cable from the monitor output port of the PC to the RGB INPUT(VGA/SVGA/XGA) port of the Monitor.
- Connect the audio cable from the PC to the Audio ports of the Monitor. (Audio cables not included with the Plasma Display)
- In case of using a sound card adjust PC sound properly.






- Press **POWER** button on the PC and press **ON/OFF** button on the Monitor. After this press 6/1 button on the Monitor or press POWER button on the remote control.
- Press MULTIMEDIA button on the remote control to select RGB-PC.
- Set the resolution of PC under XGA (1024x768). (Refer to page 22.)

- If still picture is on the screen for a long period time, Screen Burn!
- If the resolution of PC is over XGA, connect to the RGB INPUT(VGA/SVGA/XGA) port of the Monitor after changing the resolution of PC under XGA.
- If picture isn't displayed properly by connecting a non-standard PC, contact your dealer for more information.



#### **Connecting through the PDP Tuner**

- Press the ▲ / ▼ buttons or number buttons on the remote control, or the ▲ / ▼ on the PDP Tuner to return to normal TV viewing.
- Connect the signal cable from the monitor output port of the PC to the RGB-PC INPUT (VGA/SVGA/XGA) port of the PDP Tuner.
- Connect the audio cable from the PC to the Audio ports of the PDP Tuner. (Audio cables are not included with the Plasma Display)





- · Turn on the PC
- Turn on the Monitor and the PDP Tuner after connecting the former with the latter and the Speakers. (Refer to p.29)
- Press MULTIMEDIA button on the remote control or on the PDP Tuner to select RGB-PC.
  Set the resolution of PC under XGA (1024x768).



# Function checking in PC mode

- Make sure to select **RGB-PC** before operating.







Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select a menu item.

• The selected menu item changes from white to purple.





Press the ◀ / ▶ button to change the setting of a menu item or **OK** button to display the sub menu.

• Press the TV/AV button to exit.

# Adjusting in PC mode

- Only adjust auto configure, horizontal / vertical position and clock phase in 16:9 picture format.



#### **Auto configure**

- This function is for the automatic adjustment of the screen position and clock phase.



Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the special menu.







Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto-configure** and then press the ◀ / ▶ button.







Press the **OK** button.



 If picture needs to be adjusted more after auto adjustment, adjust your Monitor's position and clock phase manually.





Signal from the remote control may be disturbed by sun light or other strong light. In this case, turn the set to other direction.



## **Turnin**

- When using the remote control, aim it at its sensor on the Monitor.



Connect antenna cable and power cord correctly.



Press the **ON/OFF** button on the PDP Tuner and press the **ON/OFF** button on the Monitor. At this moment, the Plasma Display is switched to standby mode. Press the **PROGRAMME** ( $\triangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$ ), **TV/AV**, **MULTIMEDIA** button on the PDP Tuner or on the remote control, or the **POWER** button on the remote control and the Plasma Display will be switched on.

#### With the PDP Tuner on



If the Plasma Display is turned off with the POWER button on the remote control or the  $\phi/1$  button on the Monitor

 Press the ▲ / ▼, TV/AV, MULTIMEDIA button on the PDP Tuner or on the remote control, or press the POWER button on the remote control to turn on the Plasma Display.



If the Plasma Display is turned off with the ON/OFF button on the Monitor

• Press the **ON/OFF** button on the Monitor to turn on the Plasma Display.



If the Plasma Display is turned off with the remote control and also the ON/OFF button on the Monitor

The screen 16:9 is viewed just like that but the screen 4:3 is magnified to the left and right so that the screen 16:9 is full.

#### · 4:3

This picture format is 4 to 3 of general Plasma Display.

#### Zoom 1

You can enjoy the cinema in a vast screen through the Zoom mode. The screen 4:3 is magnified to the upper/lower sides so that the screen 16:9 is full. The bottom and top of the picture may be lost.

You can move the screen up/down with ▲ / ▼ button.

#### Zoom 2

You can enjoy a larger magnified screen in this mode. The screen Zoom 2 is viewed just like that but the screen 16:9 is magnified more and more to the left and right so that the screen Zoom 2 is full.

#### Zoom

Only when receiving over SVGA (800X600), you can select Zoom.

You can move the screen up/down or left/right with  $\triangle$  /  $\nabla$  or  $\triangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  button.



- When you switch the Plasma Display to standby or off, the picture format is reset to the 16:9.
- In COMPONENT and RGB-PC VGA mode, this function only the 16:9 and the **4:3** works.
- Only when receiving RGB-PC signal (over 800 x 600) in RGB-PC mode, you can select **Zoom**.

If you switch AVL to on, the set will automatically keeps on an equal volume level even if you change programmes. The optional woofer sound stresses and emphasizes bass.



Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the sound menu.







Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired sound item and then press the ✓ / ► button to make desired adjustments.








## **Equalizer**



Press the **OK** button in **Equalizer** to set the **Equalizer User**.

- a. Select **User** by pressing the ▲ / ▼ button.
  - b. Select a sound band by pressing the ◀ / ▶ button. c. Make appropriate sound level with the ▲ / ▼ button.
  - d. Press the **OK** button to store it for the sound **User**.





To recall your preferred setting, press the SSM button until the desired sound (**Dolby Virtual**, **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie**, **Speech** or **User**) appears. The sound **Dolby Virtual**, **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie** and **Speech** are programmed for good sound reproduction at the factory and cannot be changed.







- When a programme is selected, the sound information for the station appears after the programme number and station name disappear.

#### Mono sound selection



In stereo reception if the stereo signal is weak, you can switch to mono by pressing the I/II button twice. In mono reception the depth of sound is improved. To switch back to stereo, press the I/II button twice again.




#### Language selection for dual language broadcast



If a programme received in two languages (dual language), you can switch to **DUAL I**, **DUAL II** or **DUAL I II** by pressing the **I/II** button repeatedly.

- **DUAL I** sends the primary broadcast language to the loudspeakers.
- **DUAL II** sends the secondary broadcast language to the loudspeakers.
- **DUAL I II** sends a separate language to each loudspeaker.





Sound output can be selected according to the type of received broadcast as follows by pressing the I/II button repeatedly.

- When NICAM mono is received, you can select NICAM MONO or FM MONO.
- When NICAM stereo is received, you can select NICAM STEREO or FM MONO. If the stereo signal is weak, switch to FM mono.
- When NICAM dual is received, you can select NICAM DUAL 1, NICAM DUAL 1I, NICAM DUAL 1 II, or MONO.
   When FM mono is selected the display MONO appears on the screen.









In AV mode, you can select output sound for the left and right loudspeakers.


Repeatedly press the I/II button to select the sound output.

- L+R: Audio signal from audio L input is sent to left loudspeaker and audio signal from audio R input is sent to right loud-speaker.
- L+L: Audio signal from audio L input is sent to left and right loud-speakers.
- R+R: Audio signal from audio R input is sent to left and right loud-speakers.









- If you select **Auto sleep On**, the Plasma Display will automatically switch itself to standby mode approximately ten minutes after a TV station stops broadcasting or no input signal.



Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the special menu.








- You don't have to remember to switch the Plasma Display off before you go to sleep. The sleep timer automatically switches the Plasma Display to standby after the preset time elapses

- PIP (Picture in Picture) is an optional function. PIP displays a picture within a picture in the TV and AV modes.



#### **Adjusting PIP mode**



- - Teletext (or TOP text) is an optional function, therefore only the Plasma Display with the teletext system can receive the teletext broadcast.
  - Teletext is a free service broadcast by most TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics.
     The teletext decoder of this Plasma Display can support the SIMPLE, TOP and FASTEXT sys-
  - The teletext decoder of this Plasma Display can support the SIMPLE, TOP and FASTEXT systems. SIMPLE (standard teletext) consists of a number of pages which are selected by directly entering the corresponding page number. TOP and FASTEXT are more modern methods allowing quick and easy selection of teletext information.



Press the **\*TEXT** button to switch to teletext.

The initial page or last page appears on the screen.
 Two page numbers, TV station name, date and time are displayed on the screen headline. The first page number indicates your selection, while the second shows the current page displayed.

Press the \*TEXT button to switch off teletext.



#### SIMPLE text

#### Page selection

- 1. Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the NUMBER buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then reenter the correct page number.
- 2. The ▲ / ▼ button can also be used to select the preceding or following page.

#### Programming a colour button in LIST mode

If the Plasma Display is in SIMPLE text, TOP text or FASTEXT mode, press the  $\blacksquare$ M button to switch to LIST mode.

Four teletext page numbers of your choice can be colour coded and easily selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button on the remote control.

- 1. Press a coloured button.
- 2. Using the NUMBER buttons, select the page you wish to programme.
- 3. Press the **OK** button. Then the selected page is stored as the selected page number with blinking once. From now on, you can select this page with the same coloured button.
- 4. The three other coloured buttons are programmed in this way.



#### **TOP text (option)**

The user guide displays four fields-red, green, yellow and blue at the bottom of the screen. The yellow field denotes the next group and the blue field indicates the next block.

#### Block / group / page selection

- 1. With the blue button you can progress from block to block.
- 2. Use the yellow button to proceed to the next group with automatic overflow to the next block.
- 3. With the green button you can proceed to the next existing page with automatic overflow to the next group. (Alternatively the ▲ button can be used.)
- 4. The red button permits to return to previous selection. (Alternatively the ▼ button can be used.)

#### Direct page selection

Corresponding to the SIMPLE text mode, you can select a page by entering it as a three digit number using the NUMBER buttons in TOP mode.



#### **FASTEXT**

The teletext pages are colour coded along the bottom of the screen and are selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button.

#### Page selection

- 1. Press the 🔳 button to select the index page.
- 2. You can select the pages which are colour coded along the bottom line with the same coloured buttons.
- 3. Corresponding to the SIMPLE text mode, you can select a page by entering its three digit page number with the NUMBER buttons in FASTEXT mode.
- 4. The ▲ / ▼ button can also be used to select the preceding or following page.

#### REVEAL

Press this button to display concealed information, such as solutions of riddles or puzzles.

Press this button again to remove the information from the display.

#### SIZE

Selects double height text.

Press this button to enlarge the top half of the page.

Press this button again to enlarge the bottom half of the page.

Press this button again to return to the normal display.

#### **UPDATE**

Displays the TV picture on the screen while waiting for the new teletext page. The display  $\Longrightarrow$  will appear at the top left hand corner of the screen. When the updated page is available then display  $\Longrightarrow$  will change to the page number. Press this button to view the updated teletext page.

#### **HOLD**

Stops the automatic page change which will occur if a teletext page consists of 2 or more sub pages. The number of sub pages and the sub page displayed is, usually, shown on the screen below the time. When this button is pressed the stop symbol is displayed at the top left-hand corner of the screen and the automatic page change is inhibited.

To continue press this button again.

#### MIX

Displays the teletext pages superimposed on the TV picture. To switch the TV picture off press this button again.

#### TIME

When viewing a TV programme, press this button to display the time at the top right hand corner of the screen. Press this button again to remove the display. In the teletext mode, press this button to select a sub page number. The sub page number is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To hold or change the sub page, press the RED/GREEN, ▲ / ▼ or NUMBER buttons. Press again to exit this function.
