## Installation

### Power

This set operates on an AC mains supply, the voltage is as indicated on the label on the back cover. Never apply DC power to the set. In the event of thunderstorms or powercuts, please pull out the aerial and mains plugs.

## Warning

To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not expose the set to rain or moisture.

The working life of this set is 7 years since the date of delivery to consumer.

### Service


Never remove the back cover of the set as this can expose you to very high voltage and other hazards. If the set does not operate properly, unplug it and call your dealer.

## Aerial


Connect the aerial cable to the socket marked 175  $\Omega$  on the back cover. For the best reception an outdoor aerial should be used.

## Location

Position your set so that no bright light or sunlight falls directly onto the screen. Care should be taken not to expose the set to any unnecessary vibration, moisture, dust or heat. Also ensure that the set is placed in a position to allow a free flow of air. Do not cover the ventilation openings on the back cover.

All the functions can be controlled with the remote control handset. Some functions can also be adjusted with the buttons on the front panel of the set.

### **Remote control handset**

Before you use the remote control handset, please install the batteries. See the next page.

1. POWER

switches the set on from standby or off to standby.

- 2. NUMBER BUTTONS switches the set on from standby or directly select a number.
- 3. ARC (Aspect Ratio Control) changes the picture format.
- 4. TURBO PICTURE / SOUND BUTTON selects Turbo picture / sound.
- (a) / ▼(r) (Programme Up/Down) selects a programme or a menu item. switches the set on from standby. scans programmes automatically.
   ✓ / ► (Volume Up/Down) adjusts the volume. adjusts menu settings.
- VCR BUTTONS (option) control a LG video cassette recorder.
- 7. SSM (Sound Status Memory) recalls your preferred sound setting.
- I/II (option) selects the language during dual language broadcast (option). selects the sound output.
- 9. PSM (Picture Status Memory) recalls your preferred picture setting.
- **10. TELETEXT BUTTONS (option)** These buttons are used for teletext. For further details, see the 'Teletext' section.
- 11. MUTE

switches the sound on or off.

12. TV/AV

selects TV or AV mode. switches the set on from standby.

13. MENU

selects a menu.

### 14. OK

accepts your selection or displays the current mode.

### 15. LIST

displays the programme table.

### 16. EYE/\* (option)

switches the eye function on or off.

#### 17. SLEEP

sets the sleep timer.

### 18. Q.VIEW

returns to the previously viewed programme. selects a favorite programme.

### 19. PIP BUTTONS (option)

PIP

switches the sub picture on or off. PR +/selects a programme for the sub picture. SWAP alternates between main and sub picture. INPUT selects the input mode for the sub picture. SIZE adjusts the sub picture size. STILL freezes motion of the sub picture. POSITION relocates the sub picture in clockwise direction. 9/4 PIP


switches on or off the 9 or 4 sub pictures.


### **COLOURED BUTTONS**

These buttons are used for teletext (only TELETEXT models) or programme edit.


## **Battery installation**

The remote control handset is powered by two AA type batteries. To load the batteries, turn the remote control handset over and open the battery compartment. Install two batteries as indicated by the polarity symbols ( $\oplus$  and  $\odot$ ) marked inside the compartment.






### (Without TELETEXT / PIP)



**Note :** To avoid damage from possible battery leakage, remove the (Without TELETEXT / With PIP) batteries if you do not plan to use the remote control handset for an extended period of time.

### Front panel



#### 1. MAIN POWER switches the set on or off.

2. POWER/STANDBY INDICATOR illuminates brightly when the set is in standby mode. dims when the set is switched on.

MENU

selects a menu.

- OK accepts your selection or displays the current mode.
- A / ▼ (Programme Up/Down) selects a programme or a menu item. switches the set on from standby.
  ◄ / ► (Volume Down/Up) adjusts the volume. adjusts menu settings.
- 6. REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR Note : Only use the supplied remote control handset. (When you use others, they'll be not able to function.)

#### . TV/AV selects TV or AV mode.

clears the menu from the screen. switches the set on from standby.


- **C** (Function) selects volume, EYE (option), picture items or brief auto programme while the menus not display.
- . +/- (▲/▼) adjusts the function or selects a programme.

switches the set on from standby.

- **10. TURBO SOUND** / **PICTURE (option)** switches Turbo sound or Turbo picture function on or off.
- **11. EYE (option)** adjusts picture according to the surrounding conditions.
- 12. HEADPHONE SOCKET (option) Connect the headphone plug to this socket.
- 13. AUDIO/VIDEO IN SOCKETS (AV3) Connect the audio/video out sockets of external equipment to these sockets. S-VIDEO/AUDIO IN SOCKETS (S-AV) (option) Connect the video out socket of an S-VIDEO VCR to the S-VIDEO socket. ## **Basic operation**

### On and off

- Press the main power button to switch the set on. If the set is in standby mode, press the **POWER**,  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\bigtriangledown$ , **TV/AV** or 2. NUMBER buttons on the remote control handset to switch it on fully.
- Press the **POWER** button on the remote control handset. З. The set reverts to standby mode.4. Press the main power button again to switch the set off.

**Note :** If, while the set is switched on, the mains plug is disconnected the set will switch to standby or power on when the mains plug is replaced in the mains power socket.

### Programme selection

You can select a programme number with the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or NUMBER buttons.

### Volume adjustment

Press the ◀ / ► button to adjust the volume.

### **Quick view**

Press the Q.VIEW button to view the last programme you were watching.

Note : This function works only when Favorite programme is set to Off. Otherwise each press of this button will select a stored favorite programme.

### Mute function

Press the **MUTE** button. The sound is switched off and the display 💐 appears. You can cancel it by pressing the MUTE, ◄ / ►, SSM, I/II, TURBO SOUND button.


### Auto Demonstration

To review all the menus programmed in the set, press the OK button of the front panel control for about 10 seconds. To stop auto demonstration, press any button of the front panel control and **POWER** button of the remote control.

### On screen language selection (option)

The menu can be displayed on the screen in desired language. First select your language.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the Special menu.
- Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select Language.

- Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select your desired language. 4.
- 5. Press the OK button.
- All the on screen displays will appear in the selected language. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV 6 viewing.



## On screen menus


The dialogue between you and your set takes place on screen with an operator menu. The buttons required for the operating steps are also displayed.

### Menu selection

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to display each menu.
- Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select a menu item.
  - The selected menu item changes from white to black.
- 3. Press the ► button to change the setting of a menu item or **OK** button to display the sub menu.

#### Note :

- a. In the teletext mode, menus are not displayed.
- In some models, the Normal/Turbo search will not display, only the Start will display in the Auto programme menu.
   In some models, the Camp or Desguess will not display.
- c. In some models, **Tilt**, **Game** or **Degauss** will not display.
  d. In some models, the **Language** will not display.



Up to 100 TV stations can be stored in this set by programme numbers (0 to 99). Once you have preset the stations, you will be able to use the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or NUMBER buttons to scan the stations you programmed. Stations can be tuned using automatic or manual modes.

Note : In some models up to 200 TV stations can be stored.

### Auto programme tuning

All stations that can be received are stored by this method. It is recommended that you use auto programme during installation of this set.

- Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select the Station menu. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select **Auto pro**-1.



- Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **System**. - If the programmed station has poor quality sound, select the system again in the **Manual programme** menu. Press the **OK** button to begin auto programming. b.

All receivable stations are stored.

To stop auto programming, press the **MENU** button. When auto programming is completed, the **Programme edit** menu appears on the screen. See the 'Programme edit' section to edit the stored programme.

Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV 9. viewing.

#### Auto programme scan

To automatically scan the pictures of stored programmes, press the ▲ (\*) or ▼ (\*) button for about 3 seconds. The picture of stored programmes appears on the screen one by one.

To stop auto programme scanning, press any button except VCR buttons.

### Manual programme tuning

Manual programme lets you manually tune and arrange the stations in whatever order you desire. Also you can assign a station name with five characters to each programme number.

- Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the 1. Station menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Manual 2. programme. Press the ► button to display the Manual programme
- 3. menu.



Any number under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' in front of it, i.e. '05' for 5. 7.



#### Assigning a station name

- 1. Repeat the 'Manual programme tuning' steps 1 to 3.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select Name.
- 3. Press the ► button. You can use a blank, +, -, the numeric **0** to **9** and the alphabet **A** to **Z**.

With the dutton you can select in the opposite direction.

- 4. Select the next position by pressing the **OK** button and then take your choice of the second character, and so on.
- 5. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button and then **OK** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

#### **Booster (option)**

In some models, **Booster** is an optional function. Only a set with **Booster** can perform this function.

If the reception is poor at the fringe area of TV signal, select **Booster** to **On**. When the picture condition is good, do not select **Booster** to **On**.

- 1. Repeat the 'Manual programme tuning' steps 1 to 3.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Booster**.
- 3. Press the ◀ / ► button to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

## Fine tuning

Normally fine tuning is only necessary if reception is poor.

- 1. Repeat the 'Manual programme tuning' steps 1 to 3.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Fine**.
- Press the < / ► button to fine tune for the best picture and sound.</li>



- 4. Press the OK button.
- 5. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

The finely tuned programme will be indicated by yellow number during programme selection.

### Programme edit

This function enables you to delete or skip the stored programmes. Also you can move some stations to other programme numbers or insert a blank station data into the selected programme number.

- Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the 1. Station menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select Programme edit.
- Press the ► button to display the Programme edit menu.



#### **Deleting a programme**

- 1. Select a programme to be deleted with the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\triangledown$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  /  $\blacktriangleright$  button. 2. Press the RED button twice.
- The selected programme is deleted, all the following programmes are shifted up one position.

#### Copying a programme

- Select a programme to be copied with the ▲ / ▼ or ◄ / ► button.
   Press the GREEN button.
- All the following programmes are shifted down one position.

#### Moving a programme

- Select a programme to be moved with the ▲ / ▼ or ◄ / ► button.
   Press the YELLOW button.
- Move the programme to the desired programme number with 3. the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\bigtriangledown$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  /  $\blacktriangleright$  button.
- 4. Press the YELLOW button again to release this function.



#### Skipping a programme number


- Select a programme number to be skipped with the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$ 1. button.
- Press the BLUE button. The skipped programme turns to blue. 2.
- 3. Press the BLUE button again to release the skipped pro-

gramme. When a programme number is skipped it means that you will be unable to select it using the ▲ / ▼ button during normal TV viewing. If you want to select the skipped programme, directly enter the programme number with the NUMBER buttons or select it in the programme edit or table menu.

Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.



### Favorite programme

This function lets you select your favorite programmes directly.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Station menu.
- Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Favorite programme.
- 3. Press the **OK** button to display the **Favorite programme** menu.



- 4. Press the ◄ / ► button to select **On** or **Off**.
- 5. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select -- ----.
- Select a desired programme with the ◄ / ► button or NUMBER buttons. Any number under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' in front of it, i.e. '05' for 5.
- 7. To store another programme, repeat steps 5 to 6. You can store up to 5 programmes.
- 8. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Repeatedly press the  $\ensuremath{\textbf{Q.VIEW}}$  button to select stored favorite programmes.

## Calling the programme table

You can check the programmes stored in the memory by displaying the programme table.

### Displaying programme table

Press the **LIST** button to display the **Programme table** menu. The programme table appears on the screen. One programme table contains ten programmes as below.

### Note :

- a. You may find some blue programmes. They have been set up to be skipped by auto programming or in the programme edit mode.
- b. Some programmes with the channel number shown in the programme table indicate there is no station name assigned.

### Selecting a programme in the programme table

Select a programme with the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  button. Then press the **OK** button. The set switches to the chosen programme number.

### Paging through a programme table


There are 10 (or 20) programme table pages in which contain 100 (or 200) programmes.

Pressing the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  /  $\blacktriangleright$  button repeatedly turns the pages.

Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.





Picture Menu





### **Picture adjustment**

You can adjust picture contrast, brightness, colour intensity, sharpness and tint (NTSC input only) to the levels you prefer.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the Picture menu.
- Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired picture item.
- 3. Press the ◀ / ► button to make appropriate adjustments, then it will be stored for the picture **User**.



4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.


To recall your preferred setting, press the **PSM** button until the desired picture (**Dynamic**, **Standard**, **Mild**, **Game** or **User**) appears. The picture **Dynamic**, **Standard**, **Mild** and **Game** are programmed for good picture reproduction at the factory and cannot be changed.

## Eye (option)

Eye is an optional function. Only a set with eye option can perform this function.

In some models, the set will automatically adjust the picture according to the surrounding conditions. This will enable you to enjoy the most suitable picture according to the surroundings.

Press the EYE/★ button to switch the eye function on or off.



When the eye function is on, the most suitable picture is automatically adjusted according to the surrounding conditions.

At this time the display •••••• in green does not appear continuously but the display •••••• in yellow appears each time the picture condition changes.

*Note :* If you press the *PSM* or *TURBO PICTURE* button with the eye function, the eye function is automatically switched off.

## **Picture adjustment**

### **Picture format**

You can watch TV in various picture formats; Standard, 16:9 (Wide), Zoom.

Repeatedly press the **ARC** button to select your desired picture format.

### Standard

This picture format is 4 to 3 of general TV.

### 16:9

You can enjoy the cinema (the picture format of 16:9) or general TV programme through the 16:9 mode.

The screen 16:9 is viewed just like that but the screen 4:3 is magnified to the left and right so that the screen 16:9 is full.

#### Zoom

You can enjoy the cinema in a vast screen through the Zoom mode. The screen 4:3 is magnified to the upper/lower and left/right sides so that the screen 16:9 is full. The bottom and top of the picture may be lost.

#### Note :

- a. When you switch the set to standby or off, the **16:9** or **Zoom** picture format is reset to the **Standard** (4:3).
- b. In the 1/2 size sub picture and vertical four sub pictures of PIP mode the picture format is not available.

## Turbo picture selection (option)

When this function is on, picture will be more brilliant and distinct picture than normal picture. You can enjoy the Turbo picture so much better than normal picture.

Repeatedly press the TURBO PICTURE button to switch on or off.






(Turbo Picture off)


*Note :* If you press the *PSM* or *EYE*/ \*button with the Turbo picture function, the Turbo picture function is automatically switched off.



## Sound adjustment

Sound Menu





### Sound adjustment

You can select your preferred sound setting; Flat, Music, Movie or Speech and you can also adjust the sound frequency of equalizer, balance, headphone volume/sound (option). If you switch DBS to on, the set creates a dynamic bass sound. If you switch AVL to on, the set automatically keeps on an equal volume level even if you change programmes.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the Sound menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the desired sound item; Equalizer, DBS, AVL or Balance.
  Press the ◄ / ► button to make desired adjustment.
- Press the OK button in Equalizer to set the Equalizer User.



- a. Select **User** by pressing the ▲ / ▼ button.
  b. Select a sound band by pressing the ◄ / ► button.
  c. Make appropriate sound level with the ▲ / ▼ button.
- d. Press the **OK** button to store it for the sound **User**. The display **Stored** appears.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

To recall your preferred setting, press the SSM button until the desired sound (Flat, Music, Movie, Speech or User) appears. The sound Flat, Music, Movie and Speech are programmed for good sound reproduction at the factory and cannot be changed.

Note : If you press the SSM button after making appropriate adjustment in Sound menu, the display **User** automatically appears even though you have already set a factory preset setting; Flat, Music, Movie or Speech.

## Turbo sound selection (option)

When this function is on, sound will be more emphasized and amplified sound than normal sound. You can enjoy the Turbo Sound so much better than normal Sound.

Repeatedly press the TURBO SOUND button to switch on or off.





## Sound adjustment

### Stereo/Dual reception (option)

Stereo/dual is an optional function.

When a programme is selected, the sound information for the station appears after the programme number and station name disappear.

Broadcast	On Screen Display
Mono	MONO
Stereo	STEREO
Dual	DUAL I

#### Mono sound selection

In stereo reception if the stereo signal is weak, you can switch to mono by pressing the I/II button twice. In mono reception the depth of sound is improved. To switch back to stereo, press the I/II button twice again.

#### Language selection for dual language broadcast

If a programme received in two languages (dual language), you can switch to **DUAL I**, **DUAL II** or **DUAL I**+II by pressing the I/II button repeatedly.

**DUAL I** sends the primary broadcast language to the loudspeakers. **DUAL II** sends the secondary broadcast language to the loudspeakers.

**DUAL I+II** sends a separate language to each loudspeaker.

### NICAM reception (option)

If your set is equipped with the receiver for NICAM reception, the high quality NICAM (Near Instantaneous Companding Audio Multiplex) digital sound can be received.

Sound output can be selected according to the type of received broadcast as follows by pressing the I/II button repeatedly.


- 1. When NICAM mono is received, you can select **NICAM MONO** or FM MONO.
- 2. When NICAM stereo is received, you can select **NICAM STEREO** or FM MONO. If the stereo signal is weak, switch to FM mono.
- When NICAM dual is received, you can select NICAM DUAL I, NICAM DUAL II or NICAM DUAL I+II or MONO. When FM mono is selected the display MONO appears on the screen.

### Sound output selection

In AV mode, you can select output sound for the left and right loud-speakers.

Repeatedly press the I/II button to select the sound output.

- **L+R**: Audio signal from audio L input is sent to left loud-speaker and audio signal from audio R input is sent to right loud-speaker.
- **L+L** : Audio signal from audio L input is sent to left and right loud-speakers.
- **R+R**: Audio signal from audio R input is sent to left and right loud-speakers.



## Time setting

### Time

The time uses the 24 hour system and must be set to the correct time before operating the set.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Time**.
- 3. Select and adjust hour and minute by pressing the ◀ / ► button or number buttons.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

### On/off time

By using this function in  $\mathbf{On}$  mode, the set automatically switches on or off at a preset time. You must set the time correctly before using on/off time function.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select On time or Off time.
- 3. Press the ◄ / ► button to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Press the ▼ button.
- 5. Select and adjust hour and minute by pressing the ◀ / ► button or number buttons.
- 6. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.


## On Programme number

By using this function, the set automatically switches on at a preset programme.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **On Pr.**.
- 3. Select and adjust programme number by pressing the ◀ / ► button or number buttons.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.







## Time setting

### Volume

By using this function, the set automatically switches on at a preset volume size.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Volume**.
- Select and adjust volume by pressing the ◄ / ► button or number buttons.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

## Auto sleep


If you select **Auto sleep On** the set will automatically switch itself to standby mode approximately ten minutes after a TV station stops broadcasting.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Auto sleep**.
- 3. Press the  $\triangleleft$  /  $\blacktriangleright$  button to select **On**.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

### Note :

- a. This function works only in standby mode.
- b. To cancel the set on/off time, set the on/off timer to --:--.
- c. To view the remaining on/off time, select the Time menu.
- d. When you switch the main power off, the **Time** is reset and the **On/Off time** is off.






## **Other functions**







### TV and AV modes

Inputs can be set for TV or AV mode. AV mode is used when a video cassette recorder (VCR), or other equipment is connected to the set.

Note : When a VCR is connected via the aerial socket the set is used in TV mode. See the 'Connection of external equipment' section.

- Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select the 1. Special menu. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select **Input**. Press the  $\triangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  button to select **TV**, **AV 1**, **AV 2**, **AV 3** (or **S**-

- Video), Component (option). The AV modes are AV1 : VCR connected to the Euro scart socket or phone jack of

AV2 : VCR connected to the phone jack of the set AV3 : VCR connected to the **AV3** sockets of the set S-Video : S-VIDEO VCR connected to the **S-VIDEO** sockets of

the set (option) COMPONENT : COMPONENT connected to the **COMPONENT** INPUT sockets on the set (option)

To return to TV mode, press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or NUMBER buttons.

Alternatively you can select the TV or AV mode by pressing the TV/AV button.

### Auto AV switching (option)

If your VCR outputs switching voltage when it is switched to play-back with the VCR connected to the Euro scart socket. The set is automatically switched to **AV 1** mode when an AV signal is input. But if you want to keep on watching TV mode, press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  or NUMBER buttons.

Press the TV/AV button to return to AV modes.

## Child lock

The TV can be set so that the remote control handset is needed to control it. This feature can be used to prevent unauthorized viewing.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select the Special menu.

With the lock on, the display **Child lock on** appears on the screen if any button on the front panel is pressed while viewing the TV.

### Blue back

If you select **Blue back On**, the blue background appears on the screen when there is no or poor signal.

- Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  button to select the 1. Special menu. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Blue back**.

## **Other functions**

## **Degaussing (option)**

Owing to the super large Braun Tube in the set the magnetic field of the earth may influence on the colour purity of picture by neighbour magnetic substance or installation direction of the set. The stripes may appear on the screen or the colour may not be equal in the corner. You can enjoy the programme in high colour quality by operating the Degaussing.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Degauss**.
- 3. Press the *◄* / ► button to select **On**. After the degauss function
- works, **On** mode switches to **Off** mode. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV 4. viewing.

Note : If you cannot adjust the screen condition by degaussing, try it again after about 4 minutes.

## Tilt (option)

The TV picture may tilt to the left or right if the TV set moves to another position. This function can be used to compensate the tilt.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the Special menu. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Tilt**.

- 3. Press the ◀ / ► button to adjust the tilt.
- 4. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

### Sleep timer


You don't have to remember to switch the set off before you go to sleep. The sleep timer automatically switches the set to standby after the preset time elapses.

Press the SLEEP button to select the number of minutes. The display (1) 0 will appear on the screen, followed by 10, 20, 30, 60, 90, 120, 180 and 240. The timer begins to count down from the number of minutes selected.

### Note :

- a. To view the remaining sleep time, press the SLEEP button once.
- To cancel the sleep time, repeatedly press the SLEEP button b.
- until the display **O** appears.
- When you switch the set off, the set releases the preset sleep C. time.





## **PIP operation (option)**

### **Option**:

PIP is an optional function, so that only the set with PIP function can operate.

PIP (Picture in Picture) displays a picture within a picture.


### On and off

Press the  $\ensuremath{\text{PIP}}$  button to switch on the sub pictures. Press this button again to switch it off.

### Input mode selection for sub picture

Press the **INPUT** button to select the input mode for the sub picture.

Each time this button is pressed, each input mode for the sub picture is displayed as shown below at the left upper side of sub picture.



### Swapping between main and sub pictures

Press the **SWAP** button to exchange the main and sub pictures.

*Note :* When the main picture is TV or AV modes, the swapping is available.

## Programme selection for sub picture

Press the **PR** +/- buttons to select a programme for the sub picture. (In some models, the sub picture programme selection is available when the sub picture is TV mode.)

### Sub picture size

Repeatedly press the **SIZE** button to select the desired sub picture size. The sub picture appears as below.

→ 1/16 size of the main picture → 1/4 size → 1/2 size -

*Note :* When the sub picture size is 1/2 of the main picture, the picture quality might get poor.

## Sub picture freeze


Press the **STILL** button to freeze motion of the sub picture. Press this button again to restore motion.

## Sub picture position change

Press the **POSITION** button repeatedly until desired position is achieved. The sub pictures move clockwise.

### 9 or 4 sub picture

Press the 9/4 PIP button repeatedly to select 9 or 4 sub pictures.



## **Teletext (option)**

Teletext (or TOP text) is an optional function, therefore only a set with the teletext system can receive the teletext broadcast.

Teletext is a free service broadcast by most TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics.

The teletext decoder of this TV can support the SIMPLE, TOP and FASTEXT systems. SIMPLE (standard teletext) consists of a number of pages which are selected by directly entering the corresponding page number. TOP and FASTEXT are more modern methods allowing quick and easy selection of teletext information.

### Switch on/off

Press the **TEXT** button to switch to teletext.

If TV and text picture are displayed half and half of the screen, press the **TEXT** button again to display text picture fully.

The initial page or last page appears on the screen. Two page numbers, TV station name, date and time are displayed on the screen headline. The first page number indicates your selection, while the second shows the current page displayed. Press the **TEXT** or **TV/AV** button to switch off teletext. The previous mode reappears.

### SIMPLE text

### Page selection


- Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the NUMBER buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then reenter the correct page number.
- The ▲ / ▼ button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

### Programming a colour button in LIST mode

If the TV is in SIMPLE text, TOP text or FASTEXT mode, press the button to switch to LIST mode.

Four teletext page numbers of your choice can be colour coded and easily selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button on the remote control handset.

- 1. Using the NUMBER buttons, select the page you wish to programme.
- 2. Wait until the page is displayed on the screen and press the **OK** button. The page numbers in the colour boxes along the bottom of the screen change to "000?".
- 3. Press a colour button to store the page number. From now on, you can select this page with the same coloured button.
- 4. The three other coloured buttons are programmed in the way.



## **Teletext (option)**

## **TOP text (option)**

The user guide displays four fields-red, green, yellow and blue at the bottom of the screen. The yellow field denotes the next group and the blue field indicates the next block.

### Block / group / page selection

- With the blue button you can progress from block to block.
   Use the yellow button to proceed to the next group with automatic overflow to the next block.
- 3. With the green button you can proceed to the next existing page with automatic overflow to the next group.
- Alternatively the ▲ button can be used.
  4. The red button permits to return to previous selection. Alternatively the ▼ button can be used.

#### Direct page selection


Corresponding to the SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering it as a three digit number using the NUMBER buttons in TOP mode.

## FASTEXT

The teletext pages are colour coded along the bottom of the screen and are selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button.

#### Page selection

- Press the 🗉 button to select the index page. 1.
- 2. You can select the pages which are colour coded along the bottom line with the same coloured buttons.
- 3. Corresponding to the SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering its three digit page number with the NUMBER buttons in FASTEXT mode.
- 4. The  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

## **Special teletext functions**

## REVEAL

Press this button to display concealed information, such as solutions of riddles or puzzles.

Press this button again to remove the information from the display.

## ≡ŧ SIZE

Selects double height text.

Press this button to enlarge the top half of the page. Press this button again to enlarge the bottom half of the page.

Press this button again to return to the normal display.

## ΞX

### UPDATE

Displays the TV picture on the screen while waiting for the new teletext page. The display **TEXT** will appear at the top left hand corner of the screen. When the updated page is available then display **TEXT** will change to the page number. Press this button to view the updated teletext page.



### ן HOLD

Stops the automatic page change which will occur if a teletext page consists of 2 or more sub pages. The number of sub pages and the sub page displayed is, usually, shown on the screen below the time. When this button is pressed the stop symbol is displayed at the top left-hand corner of the screen and the automatic page change is inhibited. To continue press this button again.



## MIX


Displays the teletext pages superimposed on the TV picture.

To switch the TV picture off press this button again. **Note :** When TV and text picture are displayed half and half of the screen, MIX function is not available.




When viewing a TV programme, press this button to display the time at the top right hand corner of the screen. Press this button again to remove the display. In the teletext mode, press this button to select a sub page number. The sub page number is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To hold or change the sub page, press the RED/GREEN,  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  or NUMBER buttons.

Press again to exit this function.




## **Connection of external equipment**











You can connect additional equipment, such as VCRs, camcorders etc. to your set. Here shown may be somewhat different from your set.

### Aerial socket

- 1. Connect the RF out socket of the VCR to the aerial socket on the back of the set.
- 2. Connect the aerial cable to the RF aerial in socket of the VCR.
- 3. Store the VCR channel on the programme number 0 using the 'Manual programme tuning' section.
- Select the programme number where the VCR channel is stored.
- 5. Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR.

### Audio/Video in/out sockets (option)

- Connect the audio/video out sockets of the VCR to audio/video in sockets of the set and in sockets of the VCR to out sockets of the set.
- 2. If the VCR is connected to the AV sockets on the set, press the **TV/AV** button to select **AV 1**, **AV 2** or **AV 3**.
- Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR. The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

You can also record programmes received by the TV on video tape via audio/video out sockets.

### Euro scart socket (option)

- 1. Connect the Euro scart socket of the VCR to the Euro scart socket of the set.
- 2. Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR.

If your VCR outputs a switching voltage when connected to Euro scart socket, the set will switch to **AV 1** mode automatically. But if you want to keep on watching TV mode, press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  or NUMBER buttons.

Otherwise press the TV/AV button on the remote control handset to select **AV 1**. The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

You can also record programmes received by the TV on video tape.

**Note :** Signal type RGB, i.e. the signals red, green and blue can only be selected for the Euro scart socket. These signals are transmitted, for example, by a pay TV decoder, game machine or photo CD unit, etc.

## **Connection of external equipment**

### S-video / Audio in sockets (S-AV) (option)

When connecting an S-VIDEO VCR to the S-VIDEO socket, the picture quality will be further improved.

- 1. Connect the S-video socket of the VCR to the S-VIDEO socket of the set.
- 2. Connect the audio cable from the S-VIDEO VCR to the AUDIO sockets of the set.
- Select AV3 by pressing the TV/AV button repeatedly.
   Press the PLAY button on the VCR.
- The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

Note : If both S-VIDEO and VIDEO sockets have been connected to the S-VHS VCR simultaneously, only the S-VIDEO can be received.

## Component in sockets (option)

- Connect the COMPONENT video output sockets (Y Cb Cr, Y 1. Pb Pr or Y B-Y R-Y) of the COMPONENT (480i) to the COM-PONENT INPUT sockets (Y PB PR) on the set.
- 2. Connect the audio cable from the COMPONENT to AUDIO IN sockets of AV2.
- 3. Press the TV/AV button to select COMPONENT.
- 4. Press the PLAY button on the COMPONENT. The COMPONENT playback picture appears on the screen.


## Headphone socket (option)


In some models which have a headphone socket can perform this function.

If you press the **MUTE** button, the sound from the headphone's is switched off.




