
Wall Mount: Horizontal installation





Desktop Pedestal Installation


Headphone Socket

Digital Audio Output

- Send the TV's audio to external audio equipment (stereo system) via the Digital Audio Output Optical port.



- Connect one end of an optical cable to the TV Digital Audio Optical Output port.
- Connect the other end of the optical cable to the digital audio optical input on the audio equipment.
- See the external audio equipment instruction manual for operation. When connecting with external audio equipments, such as amplifiers or speakers, please select the **Dolby Digital**. (Refer to p.40)







VCR Setup

- To avoid picture noise (interference), leave an adequate distance between the VCR and TV.
- Typically a frozen still picture from a VCR appears. If the 4:3 picture format is used; the fixed images on the sides of the screen may remain visible on the screen.






- Connect the AUDIO/VIDEO jacks between TV and VCR. Match the jack colours (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)
- Insert a video tape into the VCR and press PLAY on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)
- Select **AV3** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.




- This TV can receive Digital signals without an external digital set-top box. However, if you do receive Digital signals from a digital set-top box or other digital external device, refer to the figure as shown.



PC Setup

 This TV provides Plug and Play capability, meaning that the PC adjusts automatically to the TV's settings. The TV sends configuration information (EDID) to the PC using the Video Electronics Standard Association (VESA) Display Data Channel (DDC) protocol.





- 1. To get the best picture quality, adjust the PC graphics card to 1024x768, 60Hz.
- 2. If using a sound card, adjust the PC sound as required.
- 3. Check the image on your TV. There may be noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrast or brightness in PC mode. If noise is present, change the PC mode to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.
- 4. Avoid keeping a fixed image on the TV's screen for a long period of time. The fixed image may become permanently imprinted on the screen.
- 5. The synchronization input form for Horizontal and Vertical frequencies is separate.
- * DPM (Display Power Management) Mode If the PC goes to power saving mode, the monitor automatically switches to DPM mode.
- If you don't use the PC cable provided, DPM mode may not work.





Connect the power cord correctly. Now, the TV is switched to standby mode.
 Press the ON/OFF, INPUT, PR ▲ / ▼ button on the TV or press the POWER, INPUT, D/V TV, PR ▲ / ▼, Number (0 ~ 9) button on the remote control and then the TV will switch on.
 If you intend to be away on vacation, disconnect the power plug from the wall power outlet.

- **2** If the OSD (On Screen Display) is displayed on the screen as figure after turning on the set, the Auto Programme for the Analog TV and Digital TV is tuned automatically.

Note: It will automatically disappear after approx. 140 seconds unless any button is pressed.

Volume Adjustment

- Press the VOL ▲ /▼ button to adjust the volume.
- 2 If you want to switch the sound off, press the **MUTE** button. You can cancel this function by pressing the **MUTE**, **VOL** ▲ /▼, or **I/II** button.

Programme Selection

Press the **PR** ▲ / ▼ or NUMBER buttons to select a programme number.

On Screen Language Selection

- The menu can be displayed on the screen in your desired language. First select your language.
 - Press the **MENU** button and then \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **SPECIAL** menu.
 - 2 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Menu language.
 - 3 Press the ► button and then the ▲ / ▼ button to select your desired language. All the on screen displays will appear in the selected language.

Programming the Remote control

The remote control is a multi-brand or universal remote control. It can be programmed to operate most remotecontrollable devices of other manufacturers. Note that the remote control may not control all models of other brands.

Programming a code into a remote mode



- 1 To find out whether your remote can operate the device without programming, turn on the device such as a VCR and press the corresponding mode button on the remote. After that, press the **POWER** button. If the device is turned off then it responds properly and the remote need not to be programmed. If not, the remote should be programmed to operate the device. The programming procedures are explained below.
- 2 Press the **MENU** and **MUTE** button continuously at the same time for 2 seconds, the current selected device button will be illuminated. If you don't press any button for 20 seconds, the light on the mode button will be turned off. In that case, you have to repeat from step 2.
- **3** Enter code numbers using the number button on the remote by referring the code table on the following pages. When pressing the button, the light blinks at a time. If the device turned off, the programming is successful.
- **4** Press the **MENU** button to store the code. After blinking twice, this code is stored.
- **5** Test the remote functions to see if the device responds properly. If not, repeat from step 2.

Troubleshooting Checklist

The operation does not work normally.					
The remote control doesn't work	 Check to see if there is any object between the product and the remote control causing obstruction. Are batteries installed with correct polarity (+ to +, - to -)? Correct remote operating mode set: TV, VCR etc.? Install new batteries. 				
Power is suddenly turned off	 Is the sleep timer set? Check the power control settings. Power interrupted No broadcast on station tuned with Auto off activated. 				

	The video function does not work.					
No picture & No sound	 Check whether the product is turned on. Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast. Is the power cord inserted into wall power outlet? Check your antenna direction and/or location. Test the wall power outlet, plug another product's power cord into the outlet where the product's power cord was plugged in. 					
Picture appears slowly after switching on	• This is normal, the image is muted during the product startup process. Please contact your service centre, if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.
