## Safety note

#### About the "Symbol Display

When you are watching a DVD and attempt to perform an operation, it may not be performed due to the programming on the disc. When this happens, the unit indicates the button  $\Box$  on the screen.

#### **Types of Playable Discs**



In addition, this unit plays DVD±R, DVD±RW and CD-R or CD-RW containing audio titles, MP3 or WMA.

- Depending on the conditions of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/±RW) disc itself, some CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/±RW) discs cannot be played on the unit.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregularly shaped CDs (e.g., heart-shaped or octagonal). It may result in malfunction.

#### Notes on DVDs and Video CDs

Some playback operations of DVDs and Video CDs may be intentionally programmed by software manufacturers. This unit plays DVDs and Video CDs according to disc contents designed by the software manufacturer, therefore some playback features may not be available or other functions may be added.

## **Before operarion**



- A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop during playback.
- Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.
- Do not touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.



• Do not stick paper or tape etc. on the surface.



• Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.



• This unit cannot play 8cm disc (use 12cm disc only).



- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- Never use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.

#### Regional code






This unit is designed and manufactured for playback of region "2" encoded DVD software. This unit can only play DVD discs labeled "2" or "ALL".

#### **Notes on Regional Codes**

- Most DVD discs have a globe with one or more numbers on it clearly visible on the cover. This number must match your Car DVD Receiver's regional code or the disc cannot play.
- If you try to play a DVD with a different region code from your player, the message "Check regional code" appears on the screen.





## **Remote control**



#### 1. POWER

Switches the unit ON/OFF.

#### SOURCE

Selects a source.

RSE (Rear service)

Plays two different sources as a main source and a secondary source.

#### 2. SKIP I**◄◄/▶▶**I

- Goes to the next (previous) chapter, track or file.
- Returns to the beginning of the current chapter, track, or file.

#### SCAN ◀◀/▶▶

Backward (Forward) search playback.

#### STOP ■ PLAY ▶ PAUSE II

#### 3. SEARCH DVD

Selects a chapter or title.

#### 4. ARROW ▲/▼/◄/► (up/down/left/right)

- Selects the folders (up/down)
- Selects the menus (up/down/left/right)
- Skip (left/right)
- Search (left/right)
- Selects a preset station (up/down)

#### **ENTER**

Confirms menu selection.

#### 5. 0-9 number buttons

- Selects numbered items in the menu.
- Selects a stored radio station frequency (1-6).

#### REPEAT

• Repeats chapter, track, title or file.

#### SHUFFLE CD MP3 WMA

• Plays tracks or files in random order.

#### SCAN CD

• Plays the first 10 seconds of all track.

• Selects audio language.

Selects audio subtitle language.

#### ANGLE DVD

• Selects a DVD camera angle if available.

#### 6. BAND

Selects FM and MW(AM) bands.

#### 7. DISC MENU

Accesses the menu on a DVD disc.

#### 8. RETURN

Displays the disc menu with PBC.

#### 9. VOLUME

Adjusts the volume level.


#### 10. MUTE

Mutes the volume.

#### Install the battery of remote control

Pull the tray on the back of battery of remote control outward with a pencil or ball point pen and insert the battery with the plus (+) minus (-) poles pointing in the proper direction.

- 1 Remove the battery holder with a pencil or ball point pen.
- 2 Install the battery on the battery holder.
- 3 Install the battery holder back into its original position.



#### Using the remote control

Point the remote control in the direction of the front panel to operate.

#### Notes >


- Use only one CR2025 (3V) lithium battery.
- Remove the battery if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time.
- Do not leave the product in a hot or humid place.
- · Do not handle the battery with metallic tools.
- Do not store the battery with metallic materials.
- In the event of battery leakage, wipe the remote control completely clean and install a new battery.



#### **RESET**


If the unit fails to operate properly. press the reset button using a ball point pen or a similar tool.






\* Connecting to Optical equipment.

Connecting to an amplifier equipped with two channel digital stereo or to an Audio/Video receiver equipped with a multi-channel decoder.




If your car has the ISO connector, connect by using the ISO connector plug that is in front of the Power cable.




## Connecting the Reverse Gear

If using an optional rear view camera, the reverse lead must be connected.

- 1. Clamp the reversing lamp lead.
- 2. Clamp firmly with needle-nosed pliers.






## **Detaching the control panel**

You can detach the control panel when leaving the car. When detaching or attaching the control panel, be careful not to damage the connectors on the back of the control panel and on the panel holder.


- 1. Press the "

  "button to unlock the control panel.
- 2. Pull the control panel out of the unit.
- 3. Put the detached control panel into the provided case.



## Attaching the control panel

- 1. Insert the left side of control panel into the groove on the panel holder.
- 2. Press the right side of control panel to fix it to the panel holder




# Installing the hide-away unit (Under the front seat)

Be sure to use the tapping screws of appropriate length so that they will not damage any parts of the car.

#### **Basic installation**

Before installing, make sure that the ignition-switch is set to OFF and remove the terminal of the car battery to avoid short-circuiting.


- 1. Remove the existing receiver unit.
- 2. Make the necessary connections.
- 3. Install the installation sleeve.
- 4. Install the unit into the installation sleeve.



#### Removing the existing receiver unit.


If there is already an installation sleeve for the receiver unit in the dashboard, it must be removed.

- 1. Remove the rear support from the unit.
- 2. Remove the front panel and trim ring from the unit.
- 3. Insert the lever **(A)** into the hole on one side of the unit. Perform the same operation on the other side and pull the unit out from the mounting sleeve.



#### **ISO-DIN Installation**

- 1. Slide the unit into the ISO-DIN frame.
- 2. Install screws removed from the old unit.
- 3. Slide the unit and frame into the dash opening.
- 4. Install the dash panel or adapter plate.
- 5. Install the trim ring to the unit.







#### Turning the unit on

Press any buttons. (Except the DISP or EJECT)

#### Turning the unit off

Press and hold the "VOL" button.



## Opening / Closing the LCD

Press the "OPEN(CLOSE)" button.
The LCD panel will be opened or closed.

#### **≫** Note

The LCD panel will be closed automatically with turning the power off.



#### Changing the monitor angle

Press the "TILT" button to adjust the LCD panel to an easily viewable angle.

Each time you press the button, the LCD panel changes its angle step by step.

#### Note >

The adjusted LCD panel angle will be memorized and the monitor panel will automatically return to this angle next time the monitor panel is opened.



#### Turning the LCD panel horizontally

Press the "FLIP" button.

When the LCD panel is upright and hinders the operation of the air conditioner, the position of the panel can be turned horizontal in a moment.

To return to the original position, press the "FLIP" button again.

#### Note >

The LCD panel returns to the original position automatically with beep sounds in 10 seconds after operation.

#### Inserting a disc

The disc is drawn in and playback starts automatically.

#### **Ejecting a disc**

Press the "EJECT" button.

The disc is ejected from the loading slot.

#### Note >

If the ejected disc is not removed in approximately 10 seconds, the disc is automatically inserted again into the loading slot.

#### Adjusting the volume

Rotate the "VOL" knob to adjust the sound level.

#### Note

When you turn the unit off, the current volume level is automatically memorized. Whenever you turn the unit back on again, it will operate at the memorized volume level.

#### Mute (To drop the volume in a moment)

Press the "VOL" knob while listening to any source. To resume the previous volume level, press any buttons. (Except the TILT, FLIP, OPEN(CLOSE) or EJECT)

#### Selecting a source

Press the "SRC" button repeatedly to select a source. The mode switches as follows.

 $FM \rightarrow DISC \rightarrow USB \rightarrow VIDEO \rightarrow AUX$ 

You cannot select a source if it is not ready.

#### Selecting a EQ (Equalizer)

Press the "EQ" button repeatedly to select a equalizer. The mode switches as follows.

SALSA : Salsa music acoustics.SAMBA : Samba music acoustics.

# **Dual mode operation**

## Using a monitor connected to REAR OUT

You can play back two different sources as a main source and a secondary source.

You can listen to the main source through the speakers and to the secondary source through the monitor connected to the REAR OUT jacks.



#### Selecting a source

Press the "RSE" button repeatedly to select a source. The mode switches as follows. RSE DVD  $\rightarrow$  RSE USB  $\rightarrow$  RSE VIDEO  $\rightarrow$  RSE AUX

- RSE DVD
  You can select the built-in DVD drive.
- RSE USB You can select the built-in USB.
- RSE VIDEO
   You can select the component connected to the VIDEO IN jacks.
- RSE AUX
   You can select the component connected to
   the AUX IN jacks.

#### Note >

You cannot select a source if it is not ready.

#### Cancelling the dual mode

Press and hold the "RSE" button. RSE OFF appears.

#### About rear camera view

With an optional rear view camera, you are able to back into a tight parking spot by keeping on eye on trailers.

#### Notes

- You can connect the video camera as a rear view camera to the REAR OUT CAM jack to guide you the car.
- When the vehicle's gearstick is reverse(R), you can see what is behind the vehicle as connecting a rear view camera.

#### **SETUP**

You can customize the various options according to your particular needs.

Touch the "SETUP" button.

The setup screen appears on the screen.

#### **SCREEN**

#### Language

You can set the display language.

Touch the language button you want.

#### Setback

You can move the LCD panel a little forward or backward.

- Yes : Activates the functions.
- No : Cancels the functions.

#### Adjust Picture

#### **Brightness**

You can set the monitor brightness.

Touch the ◀ or ▶ buttons to adjust the settings.

#### Contract

You can set the monitor contrast.

Touch the ◀ or ▶ buttons to adjust the settings.

#### Adjust Dimmer

#### **Auto Dimmer control**

The dimmer adjustments for daytime, evening, and nighttime ambient lights are stored separately.

The brightness of LCD screen adjusts automatically to the optimum level in accordance with the ambient light based on the set values.

- Yes : Activates the functions.
- No : Cancels the functions.

#### Note >

Touch the button to exit the current screen to the previous screen



















#### BG Animation

You can select one of the 5 modes. It displays the change of sound output during playback. Touch the image button you want.

#### Rear Camera

- On : The rear view through the rear view camera is automatically displayed on the monitor when the rear gear is applied.
- Off : Cancels the function.

## Note 🕽

Touch the button to exit the current screen to the previous screen.

#### SOUND

#### Balance/Fader

- Touch the "Left" or "Right" button.
   Adjust the balance—speaker output balance between the left and right speakers.
- Touch the "Front" or "Rear" button.
   Adjust fader—speaker output balance between the front and rear speakers.

#### Woofer

#### **Output Level**

Touch the ◀ or ▶ button to select the output level. Cut-off Frequency

Frequencies 80/120/160 Hz are sent to the subwoofer. The cut-off frequency is chosen according to the Woofer setting so that you can enjoy low frequency effects purely from the subwoofer if it is connected.

Off: Cancels the function.

#### SRS WOW

You can set the various 3D sound effects (1~10).

Touch the ◀ or ▶ buttons to adjust settings.

• SRS : Enjoy SRS and TruBass simultaneously.

• FOCUS : Improve the resolution sound.

• TruBass : Improve the bass sound to make it

spectacular.

#### User Equalizer

Adjusts the sound mode and store your own adjustments in memory.

Touch the  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  button to adjust the level of each frequency band.

#### High Pass Filter

Outputs all frequencies higher than selected according to your preference.











#### Rear Speaker

On: Activates the rear speaker output.

Off: Cancels the function.

#### Beep

#### **Beep Pattern**

- Long Key: When you press the button for a long time, a beep sound occurs.
- All : When any button is pressed, a beep sound occurs.

#### Beep Volume

Adjusts the Beep Volume. (High/Medium/Low)

#### DVD Language

#### **Audio Language**

If the disc contains multi-audio languages, you can change to a different audio language.

#### **Subtitle Language**

If the disc contains multi-subtitle languages, you can change to a different subtitle language.

To erase the subtitle, select the "Off" button.

#### Menu Language

If the disc contains multi-menu languages, you can change to a different menu language.



#### Other

If the language you want is not listed in language menu list. Refer to the page 53 to find the language code.

- Confirm the entered code.
- -• Keypad button.
- Delete the previous character at the cursor position.
- Cancels the function.

#### Aspect Ratio

#### Wide

Select when your screen's aspect ratio is fixed at 16:9 (Wide screen).

#### **Letter Box**

Select when your screen's aspect ratio is fixed at 4:3 (Conventional screen). While viewing a wide screen picture, the black bars appear on the top and the bottom of the screen.

#### **Panscan**

Select when your screen's aspect ratio is fixed at 4:3. While viewing a wide screen picture, the black bars do not appear. The left and right edges of the pictures will not be shown on the screen.

#### Lock

You can secures the device against unauthorized use by assigning a password. In addition, you can specify a rating level with it. If you set a rating level that is lower than the one found on the inserted DVD, it can be played only after entering the password.

If you have already assigned a password, first enter the old password with the numeric buttons 0-9.

## **Defining the parental control**

Select the desired age-appropriate button 1-8. To erase the desired age-appropriate button, select the "Off" button.

#### Notes

- Rating level means that some DVDs are equipped with a code that defines the age-appropriate release.
- If you have not yet assigned a password, the default password is 0000.
- If you forget your password.
   Input the 6-digit number "210499" and the password is cleared. (First, after eject the disc, use the numeric button of the remote control on the DVD screen.)









## Changing the password

- 1. Touch the "Password" button.
- 2. Enter the new password with the numeric buttons 0-9.
- 3. Confirm the new password with the numeric buttons 0-9.
- 4. Touch the "Enter" button to reset the password to the newly assigned one.

#### Changing the area code

- Touch the ▲ or ▼ button to select the area code. Refer to the page 53 to find the area code.
- 2. Touch the "END" button to exit the setup menu.

#### Notes

- If you have not yet assigned a password, the default password is 0000.
- Do not forget your password. A new password cannot be set without your old password.

#### • TA Mode

#### TA Seek

When the newly tuned station does not receive TP information for 5 seconds, the receiver retunes to the next station which has the same TP information as well as the same PI as the last station.

#### **TA Alarm**

When a newly tuned station has no TP information for 5 seconds, a double beep sound is output.

## PI Mode

#### PI Mute

If the sound of a station with different PI is heard intermittently, the receiver mutes the sound right now.

#### PI Sound

If the sound of a station with different PI is heard intermittently, the receiver mutes the sound after 1 second.

#### **SOURCE**

You can select the source on the screen to make it operate according to your particular needs.

The source screen displays on the screen. You cannot use a source if it is not ready.

Your unit supports Bluetooth wireless connection. You can set up a wireless link with a Bluetooth phone.

#### Starting Bluetooth on your phone.

Your phone's Bluetooth feature may be set to off by default. To use your car Bluetooth feature, Bluetooth must be turned on in your phone. - Refer to the page 54 for details.

#### Notes >

- Refer to your phone's user guide.
- Due to the variety of Bluetooth phones and their firmware version, this unit may respond differently when performing over Bluetooth.
- If a phone as described in this list meets requirements of Bluetooth Hand-free Profile 1.0 and Object Push Profile 1.1, it can operate. However, it is noted that this function can or can not be supported according to Bluetooth phone
- As difference in functional operation are mainly resulted from features of a hand-free phone, consult manufacturer of a phone if you have any question.



## • Connection through the unit

- 1. Press the PHONE button to select the phone.
- Touch the button.The "SETUP" screen displays on the screen.
- 3. Touch the "Connect Phone" button.
  The "CONNECT PHONE" screen appears on the screen.
- Touch the "Search" button.
   The "Searching" pop-up screen appears on the screen.
   It will take about 20 seconds to continue the process.
   To cancel, touch the "CANCEL" button.
- Select a Bluetooth phone you desire from the "SEARCH RESULT".

#### Notes

- During the settings for Bluetooth phone, make sure to select "visible to all devices" from Visibility. Otherwise, it cannot search Bluetooth phones.
- The successfully connected bluetooth phone will be registered in the "CONNECT PHONE" screen. Once registered, the phone can be connected without searching.













- In an initial connection, the user will see the "INPUT PIN CODE" screen as shown in the figure. (PIN CODE :1234) For successful connection, make sure to enter the same PIN code for Bluetooth phone and the unit.
- 7. Touch the 0~9 buttons, then confirm.
- 8. Touch the "Enter" button to complete the pairing .
- 9. If the connection is successful, the Bluetooth phone is registered. You can confirm it with the checking mark in the "CONNECT PHONE" screen.

- When the connection is successful, the displayed on the upper right side of the "PHONE" screen.
- The licon is displayed with Headset connection. Refer to the "Headset functionality" for headset connections.
- The icon for hands-free connection.
- The icon for headset connection.

#### Auto connection

- Bluetooth phone with a previous record showing that it has successfully connected will automatically start the connection process when starting the car.
- Auto connection functionality operates if there is a registered Bluetooth phone in the "CONNECT PHONE" screen and the "Auto Connection" is selected on the "INFORMATION" screen.

#### Connection through a bluetooth phone

Turn on a Bluetooth phone.

Refer to your phone's user guide.

- 1. Press the PHONE button to select the phone.
- Touch the button. The "SETUP" screen appears on the screen.
- Touch the "Connect Phone" button.
   The "CONNECT PHONE" screen appears on the screen.
   The Bluetooth phones can be found (searched) only on the "CONNECT PHONE" screen.
- Perform "Searching a Bluetooth device" in the Bluetooth phone.
- Initiate the pairing and connection process on the unit searched.
- In an initial connection, the user will see the "INPUT PIN CODE" screen.

#### Notes

- For successful connection, make sure to enter the same PIN code for Bluetooth phone and the unit.
- The same instructions as "connecting through the unit" apply correspondingly to the following.



#### **Headset functionality**

The connection method is the same as "Hands-free connection", but the icon is displayed on the upper right side of the "PHONE" screen right after connected.

 It works in the same way as the wired headset for bluetooth phone. The headset functionality is for telephone conversation.

It is not for listening to music.

 Unlike the hands-free functionality, Headset connection will allow only two functions "answering calls" and "making a call from the latest call".

Also the caller's number is not displayed when answering calls.

#### Notes >

- If connecting through the unit, initiate the hands-free connection first. If your Bluetooth phone does not recognize the hands-free connection, then initiate the headset connection.
- If connecting through a Bluetooth phone, the hands-free connection or headset connection may not operate depending on the type of the phone.



#### Making a call

There are various ways to make calls with this unit.

To make a call by entering numbers on your number buttons.

- 1. Enter the phone number you want to call, by touching the numeric buttons.
- 2. Touch the "SEND" button to make a call with the entered phone number.
- 3. When you finished the call, touch the "END" button.

#### Notes

- Touch the "SEND" button for long to make a call from a latest call.




- AF (Alternative Frequencies for the actual program)
- TA (Traffic Announcement Identification)
- PTY (Program type recognition)
- RT (Radio text recognition)
- PS (Program Service name)
- PI (Program Identification) : contains additional information for regional program operation
- TP (Traffic Program Identification)

#### **AF** (Alternative frequency)

When the reception quality drops, the tuner automatically changes to another station in the network, broadcasting a better reception quality, using the PI and AF codes. This means: wherever you drive, you can continue to listen to the same program without interruptions.

- 1. Touch the "AF" button. "On" appears on the screen.
- 2. To cancel, touch it again.





### Radio (RDS) operation



#### TA (Traffic announcement identification)

This is an ON/OFF switching signal that indicates when a traffic announcement is on air.

  The "On" appears on the screen.

### PTY (Program type recognition)

You can select your favorite program type.

- 2. The PTY list is displayed in the screen.

#### REGION

ON: Network-Tracking is activated.




