Brief Info.

What is Brief Info?

- : Brief Info shows the present screen information.
- : On Watching with the upper Input signal, press the **INFO** i button.

How to use?

- 1. Press the **INFO** (i) button to show the Brief Info on the screen.
- 2. Press the INFO i button or EXIT button to exit.

Installing Batteries


1 Open the battery compartment cover on the back side.




Insert two AA type batteries in correct polarity (+ with +, - with -). Don't mix old or used batteries with new ones.



Close the cover.





UNFOLDING THE BASE STAND


■ This feature is not available for all models.



- Place the set with the screen facing down on a cushion or soft cloth as shown in Figures 1. Before unfolding the stand, please make sure two locks (A) on the bottom of the stand push outward.
- Pull the stand out as shown above in Figures 2 ~ 3.

 After unfolding the stand, please insert and tighten the screws in the holes (B) on the bottom of the stand.
- When connecting cables to the set, Do not disengage the lock (C).

 This may cause the set to fall, causing serious bodily injury and serious damage to the set.




INSTALLATION

- The set is designed to be mounted horizontally.


GROUNDING


Ensure that you connect the earth ground wire to prevent possible electric shock. If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker. Do not try to ground the unit by connecting it to telephone wires, lightening rods, or gas pipes.

For proper ventilation, allow a clearance of 4" on each side and from the wall.






Wall Mount: Horizontal installation









Stand Installation for 32LC2D*









- Carefully place the set screen side down on a cushioned surface that will protect set and screen from damage.
- Place the hook of the stand in the back of the set as shown.
- Install the 4 bolts provided securely, in the back of the set.

HOW TO JOIN THE SET ASSEMBLY TO THE WALL TO PROTECT THE SET TUMBLING

- Set it up close to the wall so the set doesn't fall over when it is pushed backwards.
- The instructions shown below is a safer way to set up the set, which is to fix it on the wall so the set doesn't fall over when it is pulled in the forward direction. It will prevent the set from falling for-ward and hurting people. It will also prevent the set from damage caused by fall. Please make sure that children don't climb on or hang from the set.



- Use the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts to fix the set to the wall as shown in the picture. (If your set has the bolts in the eye-bolts position before inserting the eye-bolts, loosen the bolts.)

 * Insert the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts and tighten them securely in the upper holes.
- 2 Secure the wall brackets with the bolts (not provided as parts of the set, must purchase separately) on the wall. Match the height of the bracket that is mounted on the wall.



Use a sturdy rope (not provided as parts of the set, must purchase separately) to tie the set. It is safer to tie the rope so it becomes horizontal between the wall and the set.


- ▶ When moving the set to another place undo the ropes first.
- ▶ Use a set holder or a cabinet that is big and strong enough for the size and weight of the set.
- ▶ To use the set safely make sure that the height of the bracket that is mounted on the wall is same as that of the set.








BASIC OPERATION

TURNING ON THE SET

- When using the remote control, aim it at its sensor on the set.
 - Connect power cord correctly, the set is switched to standby mode.
 - Press the ^① / I, INPUT or PR ▲ or ▼ button on the set or press the POWER, INPUT, D/A TV, PR ▲ or ▼ or NUMBER buttons on the remote control and then the set will switch on.





PROGRAMME SELECTION

Automatically finds all channels available through antenna or cable inputs, and stores them in memory on the channel list.

Press the PR ▲ or ▼ or NUMBER buttons to select a programme number.

BASIC OPERATION

VOLUME ADJUSTMENT

Adjust the volume to suit your personal preference.


Press the VOL ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the volume.

If you want to switch the sound off, press the MUTE button.

You can cancel this function by pressing the MUTE, VOL ▲ or ▼, or I/II button.

Language Selection (option)

- The menus can be shown on the screen in the selected language. First select your language.
- Audio function lets you select your preferred language for audio. If
 the audio data in selected language is not broadcasted, English
 audio will be played. When two or more audio languages are broadcasted, you can also select audio language with the I/II button on
 the remote control.
- Use Subtitle function when two or more subtitle languages are broadcasted. If the subtitle data in selected language is not broadcasted, English subtitle will be displayed. You can also select Subtitle language with the SUBTITLE/* on the remote control.
- Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the SPECIAL menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Language.
- Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Language, Audio, Subtitle or Subtitle Hard of hearing.
- Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select your desired language. From this point on, the on-screen menus will be shown in the language of your choice.
- Press the EXIT button to return to normal TV viewing.



SPECIAL FUNCTIONS

TELETEXT (IN ANALOGUE MODE)

Teletext is a free service broadcast by most TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics.

The teletext decoder of this set can support the SIMPLE, TOP and FASTEXT systems. SIMPLE (standard teletext) consists of a number of pages which are selected by directly entering the corresponding page number. TOP and FASTEXT are more modern methods allowing quick and easy selection of teletext information.

Teletext Language Selection (option)

- Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the SPECIAL menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Language.
- Press the ▶ button and then use ▶ button to select **Teletext**.
- Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select the required language.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

NOTE

- a. Please select your local teletext language.
- b. If you don't, the teletext may not appear correctly on the screen.
- c. This feature is not available in all countries.

Switch on/off

Press the TEXT button to switch to teletext. The initial page or last page appears on the screen.

Two page numbers, TV station name, date and time are displayed on the screen headline. The first page number indicates your selection, while the second shows the current page displayed.

2 Press the TEXT or EXIT button to switch off teletext. The previous mode reappears.

SIMPLE Text

- Page selection
- 1 Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the NUMBER buttons.

If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then re-enter the correct page number.

The PR ▲ or ▼ button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

SPECIAL FUNCTIONS

TELETEXT

TOP Text

The user guide displays four fields-red, green, yellow and blue at the bottom of the screen. The yellow field denotes the next group and the blue field indicates the next block.

■ Block / group / page selection

- With the BLUE button you can progress from block to block.
- 2 Use the YELLOW button to proceed to the next group with automatic overflow to the next block.
- With the GREEN button you can proceed to the next existing page with automatic overflow to the next group. Alternatively the PR ▲ button can be used.
- The RED button permits to return to previous selection. Alternatively the PR ▼ button can be used.

■ Direct page selection

1 Corresponding to the SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering it as a three digit number using the NUMBER buttons in TOP mode.

FASTEXT

The teletext pages are colour coded along the bottom of the screen and are selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button.

■ Page selection


- 1 Press the 🗊 button to select the index page.
- You can select the pages which are colour coded along the bottom line with the same coloured buttons.
- Corresponding to the SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering its three digit page number with the NUMBER buttons in FASTEXT mode.
- The PR ▲ or ▼ button can be used to select the preceding or following page.


- ▶ It's not available to use ISM Method and Low power in LCD TV models.
- ▶ In Analogue mode, 5V antenna power, CI information, Booster and Diagnostics will not display.
- ▶ In some models, XGA will display on the SCREEN menu.
- ▶ In Digital mode, Favourite programme will not display on the STATION menu.

TV MENU / STATION MENU OPTIONS

AUTO PROGRAMME (IN DIGITAL MODE)

Use it to automatically find and store all of the programmes.

When you start auto programming in digital mode, all the stored service information will be deleted.



- Press the MENU button and then ▲ or ▼ button to select the STATION menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ or ▼ button to select Auto programme.
- Press the ▶ button to begin auto programming.

The message "All (of your) channel setup information will be updated. Continue?" will appear.


If you want to keep on auto programming select **YES** with using the ◀ or ▶ button. Then, press the OK button. Otherwise select **NO**.

APPENDIX

TROUBLESHOOTING CHECKLIST

The operation does not work normally.		
The remote control doesn't work	 Check to see if there is any object between the product and the remote control causing obstruction. Ensure you are pointing the remote control directly at the TV. Ensure that the batteries are installed with correct polarity (+ to +, - to -). Ensure that the correct remote operating mode is set: TV, VCR etc. Install new batteries. 	
Power is suddenly turned off	 Is the sleep timer set? Check the power control settings. Power interrupted. No broadcast on station tuned with Auto sleep activated. 	

The video function does	s not work.
No picture &No sound	 Check whether the product is turned on. Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast. Is the power cord inserted into wall power outlet? Check your antenna direction and/or location. Test the wall power outlet, plug another product's power cord into the outlet where the product's power cord was plugged in.
Picture appears slowly after switching on	■ This is normal, the image is muted during the product startup process. Please contact your service centre, if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.
No or poor colour or poor picture	 Adjust Colour in menu option. Keep a sufficient distance between the product and the VCR. Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast. Are the video cables installed properly? Activate any function to restore the brightness of the picture.
Horizontal/vertical bars or picture shaking	■ Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.
Poor reception on some channels	 Station or cable product experiencing problems, tune to another station. Station signal is weak, reorient antenna to receive weaker station. Check for sources of possible interference.
Lines or streaks in pictures	■ Check antenna (Change the direction of the antenna).

TROUBLESHOOTING CHECKLIST

The audio function does not work.	
Picture OK & No sound	 ■ Press the VOL ▲ or ▼ button. ■ Sound muted? Press MUTE button. ■ Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast. ■ Are the audio cables installed properly?
No output from one of the speakers	■ Adjust Balance in menu option.
Unusual sound from inside the product	A change in ambient humidity or temperature may result in an unusual noise when the product is turned on or off and does not indicate a fault with the product.

There is a problem in PC mode. (Only PC mode applied)		
The signal is out of range (Invalid format)	Adjust resolution, horizontal frequency, or vertical frequency.	
	■ Check the input source.	
Vertical bar or stripe on background & Horizontal Noise & Incorrect position	■ Work the Auto configure or adjust clock, phase, or H/V position. (Option)	
Screen colour is unstable or single colour	Check the signal cable.Reinstall the PC video card.

MAINTENANCE

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you can enjoy your new TV.

Caution: Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the Screen

- Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2 Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the Cabinet

- To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth.
- Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence

▶ If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.
