Notes on Discs

Handling Discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc. Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints do not get on the surface. Never stick paper or tape on the disc.





Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

Cleaning Discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out.





Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.




- 4 (STOP) Stops playback.

5 I**◄◄** (SKIP)

Returns to beginning of current chapter or track or go to previous chapter or track.

- 6 ►► (SKIP)
 Go to the next chapter or track.
- POWER button and indicator Switches the unit ON and OFF. Lights up red when the unit is turned on.
- 8 Remote Sensor
 Point the remote control here.

Remote Control



POWER (()): Switches DVD Player ON and OFF.

OPEN/CLOSE (△): Opens and closes the disc tray.

0-9 numerical buttons: Selects numbered items in a menu.

CLEAR: Exit the zoom mode.

SCAN (◄◄ / ►►): Search backward or forward.

SKIP (I◄◄ / ▶►I): Go to next chapter or track. Returns to beginning of current chapter or track or go to previous chapter or track.

PAUSE / STEP (II): Pauses playback temporarily/ press repeatedly for frame-by-frame playback.

PLAY (►): Starts playback. STOP (■): Stops playback.

DVD MENU: Accesses menu on a DVD disc.

TITLE: Displays title menu, if available.

√ / ► / ▲ / ▼ (left/right/up/down): Selects an item in the menu.

ENTER (**②**): Acknowledges menu selection.

DISPLAY: Accesses On-Screen Display.

RETURN (3): Displays the menu of a video CD with PBC.

AUDIO: Selects an audio language or an

audio channel. **SUBTITLE:** Selects a subtitle language.

ANGLE: Selects a DVD camera angle, if available.

SETUP: Accesses or removes the Setup menu.

A-B: Repeat sequence from point A to point B.

REPEAT: Repeat chapter, track, title, all.

ZOOM: Enlarges video image.

Remote Control Operation

Point the remote control at the remote sensor and press the buttons.

Remote Control Battery Installation



Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert a battery (size AAA) with ⊕ and ⊝ aligned correctly. We recommend to use the alkaline battery.

Setting up the Player


The picture and sound of a nearby TV, VCR, or radio may be distorted during playback. If this occurs, position the player away from the TV, VCR, or radio, or turn off the unit after removing the disc.

TV Connections

- · Depending on your TV and other equipment there are various ways you can connect the player. Please refer to the manuals of your TV, stereo system or other devices as necessary for additional connection information.
- Make sure the DVD player is connected directly to the TV and not to a VCR, otherwise the DVD image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

Basic TV Connection (Composite Video and Audio Connections)


Connect the VIDEO OUTPUT and AUDIO OUTPUT jacks on the DVD player to the video and audio input jacks on the TV using the video (V) and audio (A) cable.

Advanced TV Connection (Component Video and Audio Connections)

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT-PUT and AUDIO OUTPUT jacks on the DVD player to the component video and audio input jacks on the TV using the component video (C) and audio (A) cable.

To enjoy progressive video

- Set the [Progressive Scan] option to "On" on the setup menu for progressive signal, see page
- Progressive scan work only with the component video connection.

Caution

If your TV does not accept the Progressive Scan format, the picture will appear scrambled. If you set [Progressive Scan] option to [On] in error, you must set the option to [Off]. Remove any disc from the unit and close the disc tray. Then press and hold STOP on the remote control for five seconds.

Do not connect the DVD Player's AUDIO OUT-PUT jack to the phone in jack (record deck) of your audio system.

Audio Connection to Optional Equipment

Connect the DVD player to your optional equipment for audio output.

Amplifier equipped with 2-channel analog stereo or Dolby Pro Logic II / Pro Logic

Connect the left and right AUDIO OUT-PUT jacks on the DVD player to the audio left and right IN jacks on your amplifier, receiver, or stereo system, using the audio cables (A).

Amplifier equipped with 2-channel digital stereo (PCM) or audio / video receiver equipped with a multi-channel decoder (Dolby DigitalTM, MPEG 2, or DTS)

Connect one of the DVD Player's DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT jacks (COAXIAL \mathbf{X}) to the corresponding in jack on your amplifier. Use an optional digital (coaxial \mathbf{X}) audio cable.


Digital Multi-channel sound

A digital multi-channel connection provides the best sound quality. For this you need a multi-channel audio / video receiver that supports one or more of the audio formats supported by your DVD player such as MPEG 2, Dolby Digital and DTS. Check the receiver manual and the logos on the front of the receiver.

Note

- If the audio format of the digital output does not match the capabilities of your receiver, the receiver produces a strong, distorted sound or no sound at all.
- Six Channel Digital Surround Sound via a digital connection can only be obtained if your receiver is equipped with a Digital Multi-channel decoder.

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound.

To display and exit the Menu:

Press SETUP to display the menu. A second press of SETUP will take you back to initial screen.

To go to the next level:

Press ▶ on the remote control.

To go back to the previous level:

Press ◀ on the remote control.

General Operation

- Press SETUP.
 The Setup menu appears.
- Use ▲ / ▼ to select the desired option then press ► or ENTER to move to the second level.
- Use ▲ / ▼ to select the second desired option then press ► to move to the third level.
- Use ▲ / ▼ to select the desired setting then press ENTER to confirm your selection. Some items require additional steps.
- Press SETUP or PLAY to exit the Setup menu.

Language Setup

Menu Language

Select a language for the Setup menu and on-screen display.

Disc Audio / Disc Subtitle / Disc Menu

Select the language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.

Original – Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

Other – To select another language. Press number buttons then ENTER to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on page 15. If you enter the wrong language code, press CLEAR.

Off (for Disc Subtitle) - Turn off Subtitle.

Display Setup

TV Aspect

- 4:3 Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.
- 16:9 Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

Display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to "4:3".

Letterbox – Displays a wide picture with bands on the upper and lower portions of the screen.

Panscan – Automatically displays the wide picture on the entire screen and cuts off the portions that do not fit.

Progressive Scan

Progressive Scan Video provides the high quality pictures with less flickering. If you are using the Component Video jacks for connection to a TV or monitor that is compatible with a progressive scan signal, set [Progressive Scan] to [On]. Press ENTER to confirm your selection. The confirm menu will appear.

Caution

If your TV does not accept the Progressive Scan format, the picture will appear scrambled. If you set [Progressive Scan] option to [On] in error, you must set the option to [Off]. Remove any disc from the unit and close the disc tray. Then press and hold STOP on the remote control for five seconds.

Audio Setup

Each DVD disc has a variety of audio output options. Set the player's AUDIO options according to the type of audio system you use.

Dolby Digital / DTS / MPEG

Bitstream – Select "Bitstream" if you connect this unit's DIGITAL AUDIO OUT-PUT jack to an amplifier or other equipment with a Dolby Digital, DTS or MPEG decoder.

PCM (for Dolby Digital / MPEG) – Select when connected to a two-channel digital stereo amplifier. DVDs encoded in Dolby Digital or MPEG will be automatically downmixed to two-channel PCM audio.

Off (for DTS) – If you select "Off", the DTS signal is not output through the DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT jack.

Sample Freq. (Frequency)

Check the documentation for your amplifier to verify its capabilities.

48 kHz – If your receiver or amplifier is NOT capable of handling 96 kHz signals, select 48 kHz. When this choice is made, this unit automatically converts any 96 kHz signals to 48 kHz so your system can decode them.

96 kHz – If your receiver or amplifier is capable of handling 96 kHz signals, select 96 kHz.

DRC (Dynamic Range Control)

The dynamic range (the difference between the loudest sound and the quietest one) can be compressed during playback of a DVD encoded in Dolby Digital format. This function takes effect when a DVD VIDEO disc recorded in Dolby Digital format is played back at low or middle volume. Set DRC to On for this effect.

Others Setup

PBC

Set Playback Control (PBC) to On or Off.

On – Video CDs with PBC are played according to the PBC.

Off – Video CDs with PBC are played the same way as Audio CDs.

MPEG4 Subtitle

You can adjust the default MPEG4 subtitle's size displayed during MPEG4 playback.

Setup

- 1. Load your chosen disc in the tray, with the playback side down.
- 2. Press PLAY (►) to start playback.
- 3. To stop the playback, press STOP (■).

Tip

- The unit records the stopped point, depending on the disc. "III" appears on the screen. Press PLAY to resume playback (from the scene point).
- If you press STOP again or unload the disc ("
 " appears on the screen.), the unit will clear the stopped point.
- Press OPEN/CLOSE (♠) to remove the disc.

Press OPEN/CLOSE (♠) to close disc tray or press POWER (₺), the disc tray closes automatically and unit turns off.

If a menu screen is displayed

The menu screen may be displayed first after loading a DVD or Video CD which contains a menu.

DVD

Use the ◀ / ▶ / ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the title/chapter you want to view, then press ENTER to start playback.

Press TITLE or DVD MENU to return to the menu screen.

VCD

- Use the number buttons to select the track you want to view.
 Press RETURN to return to the menu screen.
- Menu setting and the exact operating procedures for using the menu may differ depending on the disc. Follow the instructions on the each menu screen. You may also set PBC to [OFF] under Setup menu (see page 11).

Displaying Disc Information on-screen

Some items can be changed using the menu.

- 1. Press DISPLAY during playback.
 - Title (Track) Number
 - Chapter Number (DVD disc only)
 - O 0:00:16 Time search (page 13)
- 2. Press ◀ / ▶ to select an item. The selected item is highlighted.
- Press ▲ / ▼ to change the setting. Press ENTER.

You can also use the number buttons if appropriate (e.g. inputting the title number).

Note

If no button is pressed for a few seconds, the on-screen display disappears.

To pause playback ALL

During playback, press PAUSE/STEP (II) to pause playback.

Frame-By-Frame Playback

DVD MPEG4 VCD

While the playback is paused, press PAUSE/STEP (II) repeatedly.

Skip Scan ALL

During playback, press SKIP (I◄◄/ ►►I) to go to the next chapter/track or to return to the beginning of the current chapter/track.

Press SKIP (►) twice briefly to step back to the previous chapter/track.

Variable Speed Scan ALL

During playback, press SCAN (◀◀ / ▶►) repeatedly to select the required scan speed.

DVD: 4 steps

VCD, ACD, MP3, WMA, MPEG4: 3 steps

Slow Motion DVD MPEG4 VCD

While the playback is paused, press SCAN (►►) repeatedly to play in slow motion (4 steps, forward only).

Repeat Playback ALL

During playback, press REPEAT repeatedly to select a desired repeat mode.

DVD: Chapter/Title/Off

VCD, MPEG4, ACD, MP3, WMA: Track/All/Off

Note

- On a Video CD with PBC, you must set PBC to Off on the setup menu to use the repeat function (See "PBC" on page 11).
- If you press SKIP (►►) once during Repeat Chapter (Track) playback, the repeat playback cancels.

A-B Repeat Playback ALL

During playback, each press of A-B button to select point A and point B and repeats a sequence from point A (Starting point) to point B (End point).

Press A-B again to cancel.

Zoom DVD MPEG4 VCD

During playback or pause mode, press ZOOM to enlarge the video image. (If an MPEG4 file is playing back, the playback will be paused.)

You can move through the zoomed picture using \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright / \blacktriangleleft buttons. Press CLEAR to exit.

Note

Zoom may not work on some DVDs.

Title DVD

If the current DVD title has a menu, the title menu appears on the screen when TITLE button is pressed. Otherwise, the disc menu may appears.

DVD Menu DVD

The disc menu appears on the screen when DVD MENU button is pressed.

Angle Selection DVD

During playback of DVD disc contains scenes recorded different camera angles, press ANGLE repeatedly to select a desired angle.

Subtitle Selection DVD MPEG4

During playback, press SUBTITLE repeatedly to select a desired subtitle language.

Audio Selection DVD MPEG4 VCD

During playback, press AUDIO repeatedly to hear a different audio language or audio track.

Screen Saver

The screen saver appears when you leave the DVD player in Stop mode for about five minutes. If the Screen Saver is displayed for five minutes, the DVD Player automatically turns itself off.

Time Search DVD VCD MPEG4

To start playing at any chosen time on the disc:

- 1. Press DISPLAY during playback.
- 2. Press ◀ / ▶ to select the time clock icon.
- Input the required start time in hours, minutes, and seconds from left to right. Playback starts from the selected time. If you enter the wrong numbers, press CLEAR to remove the numbers you entered. Then input the correct numbers.

Stop the slide show

During slide show, press STOP to move to the menu.

Moving to another File
