## PREPARATION

## ATTACHING THE TV TO A WALL

- Purchase the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts to fix the TV to the wall on the market.
- Position the TV close to the wall to avoid the possibility of it falling when pushed.
- The instructions shown below are a safer way to set up the TV, which is to fix it to the wall, avoiding the possibility of it falling forwards if pulled. This will prevent the TV from falling forward and causing injury. This will also prevent the TV from damage. Ensure that children do not climb or hang from the TV.





Use the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts to fix the product to the wall as shown in the picture. (If your TV has bolts in the eyebolts, loosen then bolts.)

\* Insert the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts and tighten them securely in the upper holes.

Secure the wall brackets with bolts to the wall. Ensure that both brackets are even.



3 Use a strong cord to secure the TV. Secure the cord in such a way that it becomes taught when the TV is in position.

#### NOTE


- ▶ When moving the TV undo the cords first.
- ▶ Use a platform or cabinet string and large enough to support the size and weight of the TV.
- ▶ To use the TV safely make sure that the height of the bracket on the wall and on the TV is the same.


## **BACK COVER FOR WIRE ARRANGEMENT**

Here shown may be somewhat different from your TV.



Grip the CABLE MANAGEMENT and push the cover upwards.









## PREPARATION

#### EARTHING


Ensure that you connect the earth wire to prevent possible electric shock. If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker.

Do not try to earth the TV by connecting it to telephone wires, lightening rods or gas pipes.



## **DESKTOP PEDESTAL INSTALLATION**

For adequate ventilation allow a clearance of 4" (10cm) all around the TV .




## WALL MOUNT: HORIZONTAL INSTALLATION

For adequate ventilation allow a clearance of 4" (10cm) all around the TV. Detailed installation instructions are available from your dealer.



To prevent damage do not connect to the mains outlet until all connections are made between the devices.

## ANTENNA CONNECTION



- In poor signal areas, to achieve better picture quality it may be necessary to install a signal amplifier to the antenna.
- If the antenna needs to be split for two TV's, install a 2-Way Signal Splitter.

VHF

If the antenna is not installed properly, contact your dealer for assistance.

#### NOTE

▶ The TV will let you know when the analogue, cable, and digital programme scans are complete.

To avoid damaging any equipment, never plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

### **Connecting with a Component cables**

Connect the video outputs (Y, PB, PR) of the digital set top box to the **COMPONENT IN VIDEO 1** jacks on the set. Match the jack colours. (Y = green, PB = blue, and PR = red)




### **Connecting with HDMI cable**

Connect the digital set-top box to **HDMI/DVI IN 1** or **2** jack on the set.

No separate audio connection is necessary.

Turn on the digital set-top box. (Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)

Select **HDMI1** or **HDMI2** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

- If the digital set-top box supports Auto HDMI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically set to 1280x720p.
- If the digital set-top box player does not support Auto HDMI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.



## **DVD SETUP**

### **Connecting Component cables**





- Select AV1 input source using the INPUT button on the remote control. If connected to AV IN 2 input, select AV2 input source.

### **Connecting HDMI cable**

Connect the HDMI output of the DVD to the HDMI/DVI IN 1 or 2 jack on the set.

No separate audio connection is necessary.


Select **HDMI1** or **HDMI2** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

### NOTE


- ▶ If the DVD supports Auto HDMI function, the DVD output resolution will be automatically set to 1280x720p.
- If the DVD player does not support Auto HDMI, you must set the output resolution appropriately.

To get the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the DVD to 1280x720p.




## **VCR SETUP**

- To avoid picture noise (interference), allow adequate distance between the VCR and TV.
- If the 4:3 picture format is used; the fixed images on the sides of the screen may remain visible on the screen. This phenomenon is common to all manufacturers and in consequence the manufacturer's warranty does not cover the product bearing this phenomenon.

Connect the **AUDIO/VIDEO** jacks between TV and VCR. Match the jack colours(Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)

Insert a video tape into the VCR and press **PLAY** on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)

Select **AV1** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

If connected to AV IN2, select AV2 input source.

#### NOTE

► If you have a mono VCR, connect the audio cable from the VCR to the AUDIO L(MONO) jack of the set.

### Connecting with an S-Video cable

## PC SETUP

This TV provides Plug and Play capability, meaning that the PC adjusts automatically to the TV's settings. The TV perceives 1024x768, 60Hz as DTV 720p based on the PC graphic card. If necessary, change the screen scanning rate for the graphic card accordingly.

### **Connecting D-sub 15pin cable**



Connect the RGB output of the PC to the **RGB** (PC) jack on the set.



Connect the PC audio output to the AUDIO (RGB/DVI) jack on the set.



Turn on the PC and the set.




Select **RGB-PC** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.


5 Once you select **RGB-PC** input source using the INPUT button on the remote control, **INPUT** button is also available for this purpose.

### NOTE

Check the image on your TV. There may be interference relating to resolution, vertical pattern, contrast or brightness in PC mode. If noise is present, change the PC output to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the VIDEO menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.



### **Connecting HDMI to DVI cable**



### NOTE

- ▶ If the PC has a DVI output and no HDMI output, a separate audio connection is necessary.
- ▶ If the PC does not support Auto DVI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.
- ► To get the best picture quality, adjust the PC graphics card to 1024x768, 60Hz(42PC5D\*) or 1360x768, 60Hz(50PC5D\*).


- ▶ Depending on the graphics card, DOS mode may not work if a HDMI to DVI Cable is in use.

- ▶ The synchronization input form for Horizontal and Vertical frequencies is separate.



### AV OUTPUT SETUP


The TV has a special signal output capability which allows you to hook up a second TV or monitor.



Connect the second TV or monitor to the TV's **AV OUT** jacks.



See the Operating Manual of the second TV or monitor for further details regarding that device's input settings.



#### NOTE

- ▶ Only Digital, Analogue mode can be used for AV out.
- ▶ We recommend to use the AV OUT jacks for VCR recording.

## **DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT SETUP**

Send the TV's audio to external audio equipment via the Digital Audio Output (Optical) port.

Connect one end of an optical cable to the TV Digital Audio (Optical) Out port.





# WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

## **REMOTE CONTROL KEY FUNCTIONS**

When using the remote control, aim it at the remote control sensor on the TV.



**TV, VCR, DVD** Selects the remote operating mode: TV, VCR, DVD. Select other operating modes, for the remote to operate external devices.

**RATIO** Selects your desired picture format.

**INFO** Shows the present screen information.

**GUIDE** Shows a programme schedule.


**Coloured** They are used as per the indications or functions displayed on the TV screen in the case of **buttons** Text displays (Teletext, EPG) and programme edit.

- **EXIT** Returns to TV viewing from any menu.
- SUBTITLE Recalls your preferred subtitle in digital mode.
  - MENU Selects a menu.
    - **LIST** Displays the programme table.
  - **FAV** Displays the selected favourite programmes.

(FAVOURITE)

**1 TELETEXT** These buttons are used for teletext.

**BUTTONS** Text button is used to enable teletext services while other buttons are for teletext functions. \* For further details, see the 'Teletext' section.

#### Remote control effective range



- Use a remote control up to 7 meters distance and 30 degree (left/right) within the receiving unit scope.
- Dispose of used batteries in a recycle bin to preserve environment.

## WATCHING TV/PROGRAMME CONTROL

## **TURNING ON THE TV**

When your TV is turned on, you will be able to use its features.

Firstly, connect the power cord correctly. At this stage, the TV switches to standby mode.

- In standby mode, press the <a href="mailto:oj">oj</a>, INPUT, PR ▲ or ▼ button on the TV or press the POWER, INPUT, D/A INPUT, PR + or -, Number (0~9) button on the remote control and the TV will switch on.
- Select the viewing source by using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
  - This TV is programmed to remember which mode it was last set to, even if you turn the TV off.

When finished using the TV, press the **POWER** button on the remote control. The TV reverts to standby mode.

### NOTE

- If you intend to be away on vacation, disconnect the power plug from the wall power outlet.
- ▶ When the TV is turned on, the indicator will blink green before the picture is seen.

### **INITIALIZING SETUP**

If the OSD (On Screen Display) is displayed on the screen as figure 1 after turning on the set, you can adjust the Auto Programme tuning, Time Zone selection or Password setting.

#### NOTE

It will automatically disappear after approx, 40 seconds unless a button is pressed.



## FACTORY RESET

If you forgot your password, press '7', '7', '7', '7' on the remote control handset.







Press the ► button and then use ▲ or ▼ button to select the programme number you want to add.

Press the OK button to store the programme. When the programme number you want to add is already added in programme list, the message "Already programmed channel. Do you want to update?" will appear. If you want to keep on manual tuning, select YES with using ◄ or ► button . Then, press the OK button. Otherwise select NO.

When the programme is stored, the Programme edit menu appears on the screen. See the 'Programme Edit' section to edit the stored programme.

Press **EXIT** button to return to normal TV viewing or press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu.





### MANUAL PROGRAMME TUNING Continued

#### In Analogue Mode

Manual programme lets you manually tune and arrange the stations in whatever order you desire. Also you can assign a station name with five characters to each programme number.



Press the **MENU** button and then use  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the **SETUP** menu.



Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then use  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  button to select **Manual Tuning**.



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Press the ► button to select **Band**. Press the ◄ or ► button to select **V/UHF** or **Cable** as required.

Press the ▼ button to select **Channel**. Press the ◄ or ► button to select the desired channel number.

button to commence searching. If a station is found the search will stop.









## WATCHING TV/PROGRAMME CONTROL

FINE TUNING - In Analogue Mode only

Normally fine tuning is only necessary if reception is poor. The finely tuned programme will be indicated by a yellow number during programme selection.



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# WATCHING TV/PROGRAMME CONTROL

## **PROGRAMME EDIT**

This function enables you to delete or skip stored programmes. You can also move some channels to other programme numbers or copy a blank channel data into the selected programme number.





Press the ► button and then use ▲ or ▼ button to select **Programme Edit**.




Press the > button.



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- Deleting a programme (In Analogue Mode Only)
- a. Select a programme to be deleted with the ▲ or ▼ or ◄ or ► button.
- b. Press the **RED** button twice. The selected programme is deleted, all the following programmes are shifted up one position.
- Copying a programme (In Analogue Mode Only)
- a. Select a programme to be copied with the ▲ or ▼ or ◄ or ▶ button.
- b. Press the **GREEN** button.
- c. Move the programme to the desired programme number with the ▲ or ▼ or ◄ or ► button.
- d. Press the **GREEN** button again to copy the programme. All the following programmes are shifted down one position.





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- = Moving a programme (In Analogue Mode Only)
- a. Select a programme to be moved with ▲ or ▼ or
  or ▶ button.
- b. Press the YELLOW button.
- c. Move the programme to the desired programme number with the ▲ or ▼ or ◄ or ► button.
- d. Press the **YELLOW** button again to release this function.

#### Skipping a programme number

- a. Select a programme number to be skipped with ▲
   or ▼ or ▼ or ▶ button.
- b. Press the **BLUE** button. The skipped programme number turns to blue.
- c. Press the **BLUE** button again to release the skipped programme.

When a programme number is skipped it means that you will be unable to select it using the **PR+** or - button during normal TV viewing. If you want to select the skipped programme, directly enter the programme number with the NUMBER buttons or select it in the programme edit or table menu.

#### Selecting Favourite Programme

a. Select your favourite programme number with ▲ or

# **PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL**

The remote control is a multi brand or universal remote. It can be programmed. to operate most remote controlled devices from other manufacturers.

Note that the remote control may not control all models from other brands.

## Programming a code into a remote mode

To find out whether your remote control can operate each device without programming, turn on the device (such as a VCR) and press the corresponding mode button on the remote. After that, press the **POWER** button. If the device is turned off and it responds properly the remote control need not be programmed. If not, the remote should be programmed to operate the device. The programming procedures are explained below.


Press the MENU and MUTE button continuously at the same time for two seconds; the currently selected device button is illuminated.

If you don't press any button for 20 seconds, the light on the mode button will be turned off. In that case, you have to repeat from step 2.

Enter the appropriate code from the code table on the following pages. When pressing the button, the light blinks at a time. If the device turned off, the programming is successful.
