
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



## Listening to the radio

Make sure both the FM and AM aerials are connected.

	ON PLAYER	ON REMOTE
1. Select either FM or AM:	FUNC.	FUNCTION
2. Select the radio station:	TUNING (-)/ TUNING (+)	TUN / TUN.+
3. To 'save' a radio station:  A preset number will show in the display.		PROGRAM/ MEMO
4. To select a 'saved' station:		PRESET/FOLDER
<b>5. To confirm</b> press: Up to 50 radio stations can be saved.		PROGRAM/ MEMO

## Listening to the radio

#### Look for radio stations automatically

Press **TUNING (-)/TUNING (+)** on the player or **TUN.- /TUN.+** on the remote control for more than 0.5 second. The tuner will scan automatically and stop when it finds a radio station.

#### Choose a 'preset number' for a radio station

Select a station you want by pressing **TUNING (-)/TUNING (+)** on the player or **TUN.-/TUN.+** on the remote control. Press **PROGRAM/MEMO**, the station flashes. Press **PRESET/FOLDER** on the remote control to select the preset number you want. Press **PROGRAM/MEMO** to save it.

#### Delete all the saved stations

Press and hold **PROGRAM/MEMO** on the remote control for two seconds. "ERASE ALL" shows. Press **PROGRAM/MEMO** to erase all the saved stations

#### Improve poor FM reception

Press MO./ST. on the player or ▶/II on the remote control. This will change the tuner from stereo to mono and usually improve the reception.

## **Listening to CDs**

Audio CD and MP3/WMA CD can be played back in this player.

## Listening to CDs

#### Pause or restart a CD

Press I during playback. Press this button again to resume play.

#### Search for a section within a track

Hold I◀◀/▶▶I on the player or I◀◀ ◀◀/▶▶▶I on the remote control during playback.

#### Speed search for tracks

Hold I◀◀/▶▶I on the player or I◀◀ ◀◀/▶▶▶I on the remote control only in stop status. Track skips continuously in turn.

#### Skip to another track

Press I◀◀/▶▶I on the player or I◀◀ ◀◀/▶▶▶I on the remote control.

#### Listen to your tracks in any order

Up to 20 tracks on a CD can be listened to in the order of your choice. Insert a CD and wait for it to be read. Press **PROGRAM/MEMO** on the remote control, then use **I**◀◀/▶▶ **I** ( **I**◀◀ ◀/▶▶▶**I**) to select the track. Press **PROGRAM/MEMO** again to save and select the next track. Press **▶/II**. To clear your selection, press ■ twice .

## Listening to music from your iPod

The advantage of connecting your iPod through the system's USB port is that the iPod can be controlled from the system. Connect the iPod to the system with a iPod cable (not supplied).

## Listening to music from your iPod

Operate iPod by using the player or the remote control after connected to the player. When connected, the player operates as the connected iPod does and the states like REPEAT/RANDOM are changed by the iPod setting. For "iPod Touch" model, the explanation of some functions may not be applicable.

#### Pause or restart an iPod

Press >/|| on either the player or the remote control during playback. Press this button again to resume play.

#### Search for a section within a track

Hold I◀◀/▶▶ on the player or I◀◀◀/▶▶▶ on the remote control during playback.

#### Skip to another track

Press | I on the player or I on the remote control.

#### Select another track

Press **MODE** on the remote control one or more times to select previous list. Press **PRESET/FOLDER** on the remote control, you can move to a desired item (Playlists, Artists, Albums, Songs, Genres, Composers etc.).

Press ■ on the remote control once or repeatedly to start playback.

#### Compatible iPod

- We recommend installing the latest software version.
- The player support the models as follows; nano, 5G, 2G nano, classic, 3G nano, Touch. For some models, the player may not operate depending on the firmware version.
- Depending on your iPod's software version, it may not be possible to control your iPod from the player.
- Unsupported iPod models are recognized as an USB device when connected.

#### NOTES:

- It may take from about 60 to 150 seconds for the player to search the iPod information and authentication after being connected.
- It is recommended not to change to other functions when "IPOD READY" is on.
- It is recommended not to connect or disconnect iPod when "IPOD READY" is on.
- Make sure to operate the device after "PLAYLISTS" is displayed on screen.
- iPod does not support recording function when connected.
- Press INFO on the remote control repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, Title → Artist → Album → Time information. When "artist/Album" does not exist on the connected iPod, "No artist" or "No Album" is displayed on screen.
- Unsupported texts are displayed like "-".

## Playing music using USB

The advantage of connecting your portable USB player through the system's USB port is that the portable device can be controlled from the system.

  ►►►►) to select the bit rate and USB Rec. or REC again to select the recording speed. Press I◄/►► (I◄◄◄/►►►) to select a desired recording speed and USB Rec. or REC again to finish recording.

# Listening to music from your portable player

The player can be used to play the music from many types of portable player.

## Use your player as an alarm clock

Press and hold **TIMER** on the player for two seconds. Each function, TUNER, CD, USB flashes for two seconds. Press **SET** on the player when the function you want to be woken by is showing.

If you choose TUNER you will be shown the stations you have saved as presets. Use I◄◄/▶►I on the player to select the station you want, then press SET.

You will be shown the ON TIME display. This is where you set the time you want the alarm to go off. Use I◄◄/▶▶I on the player to change the hours and minutes and SET to save.

You will then be shown the OFF TIME display. This is where you set the time you want the function to stop. Use I◄◄/▶►I on the player to change the hours and minutes and press SET to save.

Next you will be shown the volume (VOL) you want to be woken by. Use I◄◄/►►I on the player to change the volume and SET to save. Switch the system off. The clock icon shows that the alarm is set.

When the system is turned off you can check the time the alarm is set for by pressing **TIMER**. You can also turn the alarm on and off by pressing **TIMER**. To set the alarm to go off at a different time, switch the system on and reprogram following the same steps as initially.

## Fall asleep while listening to your player

Press **SLEEP** on the remote control one or more times to select delay time between 10 and 180 minutes, after the player will turn off. Press **SLEEP** on the remote control repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, corresponding icons & dimmer ON  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 180 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 150 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 120 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 90 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 80 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 70 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 60 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 50 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 40 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 30 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 20 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP 10 (dimmer ON)  $\rightarrow$  SLEEP OFF & (dimmer OFF).

## Sound quality adjustment

You can choose sound impressions. Press **EQ** on the remote control repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, NORMAL  $\rightarrow$  NATURAL  $\rightarrow$  AUTO -- EQ (Only MP3/WMA file)  $\rightarrow$  POP  $\rightarrow$  CLASSIC  $\rightarrow$  ROCK  $\rightarrow$  JAZZ.

## **VSM (Virtual Sound Matrix)**

You can select the Virtual sound. Press **VSM** on the remote control to set the virtual sound.

- VIRTUAL: Real-time 3D positioned sound rendering technology with stereo sources, optimized for stereo speakers. Listeners may experience amazing virtual surround effects with their own multimedia players.

## **About MP3/WMA**

### MP3/WMA Disc compatibility with this unit is limited as follows:

- Sampling Frequency: 8 48 kHz (MP3), 32 48 kHz (WMA)
- Bit rate: 8 320 kbps (MP3), 48 320 kbps (WMA)
- CD-R physical format should be "ISO 9660"
- If you record MP3/WMA files using the software which cannot create a FILE SYSTEM, for example "Direct-CD" etc., it is impossible to playback MP3 files. We recommend that you use "Easy-CD Creator", which creates an ISO 9660 file system.
- Do not use special letters such as "/: \*? " < >"etc.
- Even if the total number of files on the disc is more than 1000, the unit will only show up to 999.
