
Regional Code

This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labelled as the same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".

Notes on Regional Codes

- Most DVD discs have a globe with one or more numbers in it clearly visible on the cover. This number must match your DVD player's regional code or the disc cannot play.
- If you try to play a DVD with a different regional code from your player, the message "Check Regional Code" appears on the TV screen.



Installation and Setup

TV Connections

Make one of the following connections, depending on the capabilities of your existing equipment.

Tips:

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the DVD/CD Receiver. Use one of the connections described below.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, VCR, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.

Caution

- Make sure the DVD/CD Receiver is connected directly to the TV. Select the correct AV input on your TV.
- Do not connect your DVD/CD Receiver to TV via your VCR. The DVD image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

Rear of DVD/CD Receiver

S-Video connection

Connect the S-VIDEO OUT jack on the DVD/CD Receiver to the S-VIDEO IN jack on the TV using the S-Video cable (S).

Video connection

Connect the MONITOR OUT jack from the DVD/CD Receiver to the VIDEO IN jack on the TV using the video cable supplied (V).

Component Video (Color Stream®) connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks from the DVD/CD Receiver to the corresponding in jacks on the TV using an Y Pb Pr cable **(C)**.

SCART connection

Connect the EURO AV OUTPUT (TO TV) socket on the DVD/CD Receiver to the corresponding in jacks on the TV using the scart cable **(T)**.

- If your television is a high-definition or "digital ready" television, you may take advantage of the DVD/CD Receiver's progressive scan output for the highest video resolution possible.
- If your TV does not accept your resolution setting, abnormal picture appears on the screen. Please read TV's owner's manual then set the resolution that your TV can accept.

Notes:

- HDMI mode must be set to OFF for VIDEO OUT and S-VIDEO OUT and Component video connections.
- A picture via scart input is not supported.



Optional Equipment Connections

- 1. Connect a VCR to the AV IN connectors.
- 2. Connect the USB port of USB Memory (or MP3 player, etc.) to the USB port on the front of the unit.



To Remove the USB Device from the unit

- Choose a different function mode or press the STOP () twice in a row.
- 2. Remove the USB device from the unit.

Notes

- Don't extract the USB device while operating.
- Music files (MP3/WMA), image files (JPEG) and DivX files can be played.
- This unit can not use a USB HUB.
- Recommended Memory Cards.

- If the drive of USB device is two or more, a drive folder is displayed on the screen. If you want to move to the initial menu after you select a folder, press RETURN.
- Digital cameras and mobile phones are not supported.


Antenna Connections

Connect the supplied FM/AM antenna for listening to the radio.

- Connect the AM Loop antenna to the AM antenna connector.
- Connect the FM Wire antenna to the FM antenna connector.

Notes:

- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM Loop antenna away from the DVD/CD Receiver and other components.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
- After connecting the FM Wire antenna, keep it as horizontal as possible.




Speaker System Connection

- Connect the speakers to the front (right, left) or center speaker connectors at the main set.
- Connect the subwoofer to the woofer connector.
- Connect the power cord of the Wireless RX to the outlet, then connect the Wireless RX and the rear speaker (right, left) with the speaker cable.
- Connect the DC IN connector of the Wireless TX and the Wireless TX (DC 7V OUT) connector at the main set with the DC power cable.
- Connect the SOUND SIGNAL connector of the Wireless TX and rear (right, left) speaker of connectors of the main set with the sound signal cable.
- Set the distance between this unit and Wireless RX within 10m.

Notes:

- Optimum performance can be implemented only when the Wireless TX and the Wireless RX within distance of 2m to 10m is used since communication failure may occur if longer distance is used
- longer distance is used.
 Be sure to match the speaker cable to the appropriate terminal on the components: + to + and to -. If the cables are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack base.
- It takes about a few seconds (and may take longer) for the Wireless TX and Wireless RX to communicate with each other.
- When the unit is turned off, the Wireless RX is in standby mode (off) automatically after about 10 seconds.
- If the Wireless RX is turned off, the wireless speaker will not function.



About Ferrite Core (optional)

Be sure to attach the ferrite core to the speaker cables (for connecting to this unit).


This ferrite core can reduce noises.

How to attach the ferrite core

- 1 Press the stopper [a] of the ferrite core to open.
- 2 Wind the cable once on the ferrite core.
- 3 Close the ferrite core unitl it clicks.

 Attach the ferrite core near the unit (Refer to the fig.3 and comment.).










LED indicator of Wireless TX





Assembling and Connecting to the Speakers

The front and rear speakers are detached from the speaker stands. Connect the speaker cords and assemble the front and rear speakers from speaker stands as illustrated.

- Connect the speaker cords to the appropriate terminals on the bottom of each front and rear speaker.
- 2. Attach the front and rear speakers to the speaker stands by rotating the screw.



Changing a channel of Wireless TX and Wireless RX

If there is a similar wireless product nearby, interference may occur. In this case, change to another channel using

ID/CHANNEL (ID./CH.) button of Wireless TX.

Manual setting

 Press ID/CHANNEL (ID./CH.) button for less than about 3 seconds.

If the wireless TX and wireless RX signals do not match after operating as above, operate it again about three times.

Auto setting

- 1 Disconnect the DC power cable from the Wireless TX.
- 2 Connect the DC power cable Wireless TX while you pressing the ID/CHANNEL (ID.CH.) button of Wiress TX.
 - The blue LED indicator will flicker.
- 3 Disconnect the DC power cable from the Wireless TX and release the ID/CHANNEL (ID.CH.) button of Wiress TX.
- 4 Connect the DC power cable Wireless TX.
 - The ID setting becomes optimization automaticly .

Note:

The wireless speakers may not receive the changed channel of transmitter (The LED of Wireless TX will turn blue. The The LED of Wireless RX will turn red). In this case set the ID as next paragraph.

Setting an ID of Wireless TX and Wireless RX

When the unit is manufactured, the ID is already set. If an interference occurs or you use a new Wireless RX, an ID is set again.

- Set the wireless TX and wireless RX within 50cm of eachother.
- 2. Turn the Wireless TX and Wireless RX on.
- 3. Press the ID/CHNNEL (ID./CH.) button of Wireless TX and ID button of Wireless RX at the same time for more than about 3 seconds.
 - The wireless RX and Wireless RX of blue LED indicator will flicker.
- Release the ID/CHNNEL (ID./CH.) button of Wireless TX and ID button of Wireless RX.
 ID is set up.

Notes:

- If there is a product with a strong electromagnetic field nearby, interference may occur.
- Do not operate a portable transmitter (such as a wireless network device) near this product.

CAUTION

Rear speaker (wireless speakers) is no sound.

- The DC power cable is not connected the Wireless TX and main unit.
 Connect the Wireless TX and main unit with the DC power cable.
- Power cord of wireless RX (or wireless speakers) is not connected.
 Connect the Power cord of wireless RX (or wireless speakers).

Sound is cut off.

Change a channel of Wireless TX. (Follow steps "Changing a channel of Wireless TX and Wireless RX")

★ If rear speaker (wireless speakers) is no sound after operating as above, disconnect and connect the power cord of Wireless RX (or wireless speakers) or set up an ID of wireless TX and wireless RX (or wireless speakers).

HDMI Connection

If you have a HDMI TV or monitor, you can connect it to this DVD/CD Receiver using a HDMI cable.

- Connect the HDMI OUT jack on the DVD/CD Receiver to the HDMI jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor (H).
- Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).
- In stop mode, select HDMI mode by pressing HDMI. Press RESOL. repeatedly to select the resolution you wish to change.

Notes

- The arrow on the cable connector body should face up for correct alignment with the connector on the DVD/CD Receiver.
- If HDMI cable is not connected, the HDMI button is not operated.



- If there is noise or lines on the screen, please check the HDMI cable.
- Not all HDCP-compatible DVI devices will work with this DVD/CD Receiver.
- If TV does not support HDCP, snow noise appears on the screen, or picture may be vibrated.

Tip:

When you use HDMI connection, you can change the resolution (576p, 720p, 1080i) for the HDMI output by pressing RESOL. on the remote control.


About HDMI

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) supports both video and audio on a single digital connection for an easy all- digital output to an HDMI or DVI-equipped TV.

Connection to an HDMI TV requires an HDMI cable while connection to a DVI-equipped TV requires an HDMI to DVI adaptor.

HDMI has the capability to support standard, enhanced, or high-definition video plus standard to multi-channel surround-sound audio, HDMI features include uncompressed digital video, a bandwidth of up to 5 gigabytes per second, one connector (instead of several cables and connectors), and communication between the AV source and AV devices such as DTVs.

HDMI, the HDMI logo and High-Definition Multimedia Interface are trademarks or registered trademarks of HDMI licensing LLC.



Resolution setting

You can change the resolution for the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT by pressing RESOLUTION on the remote control. Available resolution settings are as shown below.

Notes:

- If the picture does not appear on the screen with the analog video connections, change the resoultion to 480i (or 576i).
- For 720p and 1080i resolution on the component video out, only non-copy protected discs can be played back. If the disc is copy protected, it will be displayed at the 576p(PAL) 480p(NTSC) resolution.
- 1080i, 720p, 576p and 480p does not work with the analog video connections (MONITOR OUT & S-VIDEO OUT).
- The component (Y/Pb/Pr) will output to black picture in the RGB mode.
- If you change the resolution, the display MENU (MP3/JPEG/DivX) size is changed.
- If your TV does not accept your resolution setting, abnormal picture appears on the screen.
 Please read TV's owner's manual then set the resolution that your TV can accept.

Caution

Changing the resolution when the recorder is connected with HDMI connector may result in malfunctions. To solve the problem, turn off the recorder and then turn it on again.

Displaying Disc Information on-screen

You can display various information about the disc loaded on-screen.

- Press DISPLAY to show various playback information.
 - The items displayed differ depending on the disc type or playing status.
- You can select an item by pressing ▲ / ▼ and change or select the setting by pressing ◀ / ►.
 - Title (Track) Current title (or track).
 number/total number of titles (or tracks).
 - Chapter Current chapter number/total number of chapters.
 - Time Elapsed playing time.
 - Audio Selected audio language or channel.
 - Subtitle Selected subtitle.
 - Angle Selected angle/total number of angles.
 - Sound Selected sound mode.

Note:

If no button is pressed for a few seconds, the onscreen display disappears.

Initial Settings

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound. You can also set a language for the subtitles and the Setup menu, among other things. For details on each Setup menu item, see pages 13 to 16.

To display and exit the Menu:

Press SETUP to display the menu. A second press of SETUP will take you back to initial screen.

To go to the next level:

Press ▶ on the remote control.

To go back to the previous level:

Press ◀ on the remote control.

GENERAL OPERATION

- 1. Press SETUP. The Setup menu appears.
- Use ▲ / ▼ to select the desired option then press ► to move to the second level. The screen shows the current setting for the selected item, as well as alternate setting(s).
- 3. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the second desired option then press ► to move to the third level.
- Use ▲ / ▼ to select the desired setting then press ENTER to confirm your selection. Some items require additional steps.
- 5. Press SETUP or PLAY to exit the Setup menu.

LANGUAGE



OSD

Select a language for the Setup menu and on-screen display.

Disc Audio / Subtitle / Menu

Select the language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.

Original – Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

Other – To select another language, press number buttons then ENTER to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on page 26. If you enter the wrong language code, press CLEAR.

DISPLAY



TV Aspect

4:3 - Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.

16:9 - Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

Display Mode

Display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to "4:3".

Letterbox – Displays a wide picture with bands on the upper and lower portions of the screen.

Panscan – Automatically displays the wide picture on the entire screen and cuts off the portions that do not fit.

AUDIO

Each DVD disc has a variety of audio output options. Set the receiver's AUDIO options according to the type of audio system you use.



Dynamic Range Control (DRC)

With the DVD*1 format, you can hear a program's soundtrack in the most accurate and realistic presentation possible, thanks to digital audio technology. However, you may wish to compress the dynamic range of the audio output (the difference between the loudest sounds and the quietest ones). Then, you may listen to a movie at a lower volume without losing clarity of sound. Set DRC to On for this effect.

*1: Dolby Digital only

Vocal

Set Vocal to On only when a multi-channel karaoke DVD is playing. The karaoke channels on the disc will mix into normal stereo sound.

HD AV Sync

When using Digital TV.

Sometimes AV signal could not be transmitted simultaneously because of later transmission of video signal compared to audio signal.

Because it takes some time to convert analog video signal to digital one in the Digital TV.

And It means that you may not enjoy picture on the screen and sound from speaker at the same time even though it is one scene.

In the HD AV Sync menu, you could adjust delay time to audio signal for simultaneous AV signal transmission

- Delay time could be set up with 10msec unit. (0 ~ 300msec)
- Delay time is different with each TV Brand. So you need to adjust optimal delay time complying with your TV.

5.1 Speaker Setup

Make the following settings for the built-in 5.1 channel surround decoder.

Press ENTER and 5.1 Speaker Setup menu appears.



- 2. Use ◀ / ▶ to select the desired speaker.
- 3. Adjust options using ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ buttons.
- 4. Press ENTER to confirm your selection. Returns to the previous menu.

Speaker selection

Select a speaker that you want to adjust. (Front speakers (Left), Center Speaker, Front speakers (Right), Rear speakers (Right), Rear speakers (Left), or SubWoofer)

Note:

Certain speaker settings are prohibited by the Dolby Digital licensing agreement.

Size

Since the speaker settings are fixed, you cannot change the settings.

Volume

Press \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright to adjust the output level of the selected speaker. (-5dB \sim 5dB)

Distance

If you connected speakers to your DVD/CD Receiver, setting the Distance lets the speakers know how far the sound has to travel to reach your set listening point. This allows the sound from each speaker to reach the listener at the same time.

Press ◀ / ▶ to adjust the Distance of the selected speaker. (You can't adjust front / Woofer speakers)

Test

Press \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright to test the signals of each speaker. Adjust the volume to match the volume of test signals memorized in the system.

Front Left (L) \rightarrow Center \rightarrow Front Right (R) \rightarrow Rear Right (R) \rightarrow Rear Left (L) \rightarrow SubWoofer

LOCK (Parental Control)



Rating

Blocks playback of rated DVDs based on their content. Not all discs are rated.

- 1. Select "Rating" on the LOCK menu then press ▶.
- To access the LOCK options, you must input the password you have created. If you have not yet entered password, you are prompted to do so.

Password

Programmed Playback

The program function enables you to store your favorite tracks from any disc in the receiver memory. A program can contain 300 tracks.

- 1. Insert a disc. Audio CD and MP3/WMA Discs:
- 2. Select a track on the "List", then press PROG. or select ", □→ (Add)" icon then press ENTER to place the selected track on the "Program" list. Repeat to place additional tracks on the list.

Note:

You can add all tracks in the disc. Select "In (Add All)" icon then press ENTER.

- Select the track you want to start playing on the "Program" list. Press MENU to move to the next page.
- 4. Press PLAY or ENTER to start. Playback begins in the order in which you programmed the tracks. Playback stops after all of the tracks on the "Program" list have played once.

- If you want to view a particular file, press ▲ / ▼ to highlight a file and press ENTER or PLAY. While viewing a file, you can press STOP to move to the previous menu (JPEG menu).

Note:

When viewing a JPEG file, the resolution is changed 480p if the resolution set to 1080i. You can change the resolution for 720p or 480p.

Tips:

- There are four Slide Speed options □ :

 Use ▲/▼/◄/I> to highlight the Speed. Then, use ◄/▷ to select the option you want to use then press ENTER.
- If you set Speed option to Off, Slide is not active.

Slide Show

Use ▲ ▼ ◀ ► to highlight the **(Slide Show)** then press ENTER.(You can not change resolution)

Still Picture

- Press PAUSE/STEP during slide show.
 The DVD/CD Receiver will now go into PAUSE mode.
- 2. To return to the slide show, press PLAY or press PAUSE/STEP again.

Moving to another File

Press SKIP (I◀◀ or ▶►I) once while viewing a picture to advance to the next or previous file.

To rotate picture

Press ◀ / ▶ during showing a picture to rotate the picture clockwise or counter-clockwise.


JPEG disc compatibility with this player is limited as follows:

 A list of files in the folder appears. If you are in a file list and want to return to the Folder list, use the ▲ / ▼ buttons on the remote to highlight and press ENTER.
- If you want to view a particular file, press

DVD Audio Discs

DVD Audio is a new disc format building on the success of DVD to provide high quality, uncompressed, multi-channel audio for a new experience in audio quality. A DVD Audio disc can be identified by the DVD audio logo on the disc jacket or on the disc itself

DVD Audio can provide higher quality stereo than Audio CDs with a sampling rate of up to 192kHz (compared to 44.1kHz for CDs). DVD Audio digital sound can be delivered with up to 24 bits of data (compared to 16 bits for a standard CD).

A typical DVD Audio disc contains up to seven times the data capacity of a CD. This additional space is used for music, either Advanced Resolution multichannel sound quality that is closer to the artist's master recording or for longer recordings. Many DVD Audio discs contain on-screen text, such as artist biographies, playlists, or lyrics. Some DVD Audio discs contain photo galleries or video clips.

Moving to another GROUP



Some DVD Audio discs divide content into different groups. Your player enables you to quickly access different groups during playback via the on-screen display.

- 1. Press DISPLAY during playback on in stop mode.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select Group icon.
- Press ◄/► or the numbered buttons (0-9) to select a group number.

Note

Sometimes the author of the disc creates hidden content that can only be accessed by entering a password. If the lock icon appears on the TV screen, enter the password (sometimes you'll find it on the disc's jacket cover or on a web site). This password control isn't dictated by your DVD/CD Receiver — it is a function of the disc.

Since the authoring of DVD Audio Discs varies, some of the on-screen display choices might not be available for the disc you're playing.

Viewing another PAGE



Since DVD Audio discs can hold a lot of content, there are various ways to see what's available on the disc.

- 1. Press DISPLAY during playback.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ to select Page icon.
- 3. Press $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$ to select a page number.

What appears on the screen will vary from disc to disc because the information available depends upon the way the disc was created.

Note:

Since the authoring of DVD Audio Discs varies, some of the on-screen display choices might not be available for the disc you're playing.

Presetting the Radio Stations

You can preset 50 stations for FM and AM (MW). Before tuning, make sure that you have turned down the volume.

- Press BAND on the Remote Control until FM or AM (MW) appears in the display window.
- And then every time you press BAND, FM and AM (MW) changes alternately.
- Press and hold TUN.(-/+) for about two seconds until the frequency indication starts to change, then release.
 - Scanning stops when the DVD/CD Receiver tunes in a station.
- 4. Press PROG/MEMO on the Remote Control.
 A preset number will flash in the display window.
- 5. Press PRESET +/- on the Remote Control to select the preset number you want.
- Press PROG/MEMO on the Remote Control again. The station is stored.
- 7. Repeat steps 3 to 6 to store other stations.

To tune in a station with a weak signal

Press TUN.(-/+) repeatedly in step 3 to tune in the station manually.

To clear all the stored stations

Press and hold PROG/MEMO for about two seconds and "ERASE ALL" is appeared in the display window and then press PROG/MEMO again, the stations are cleared

 If you have accidentally entered into the "ERASE ALL" mode and you do not wish to clear the memory, do not press any key. After a few seconds, the "ERASE ALL" display will go off by itself and change to normal mode.

Note:

If all stations have already been entered, the FULL message will appear in the display window for a moment and then a preset number will flash. To change the preset number, follow the steps 5-6 as above.

Listening to the Radio

Preset radio stations in the DVD/CD Receiver's memory first (see "Presetting radio stations" on the left).

- Press BAND until FM or AM (MW) appears in the display window.
 - The last received station is tuned in.
- Press PRESET +/- repeatedly on the Remote Control to select the preset station you want. Each time you press the button, the DVD/CD Receiver tunes in one preset station at a time.
- Adjust the volume by rotating VOLUME on the front panel or by pressing VOLUME + or - on the Remote Control repeatedly.

To turn off the radio

Press POWER to turn the DVD/CD Receiver off or select another function mode (DVD/CD, AUX, USB).

To listen to non-preset radio stations

- Use manual or automatic tuning in step 2.
- For manual tuning, press TUN.(-/+) repeatedly.
- For automatic tuning, press and hold TUN.(-/+) for about two seconds on the front panel.

To select a preset radio station directly

You can use the number buttons on the Remote Control to select a preset radio station directly. For example, to listen to preset station 4, press 4 on the Remote Control. To listen to preset station 19, press 1 then 9 (within 3 seconds).

For your reference

• If an FM program is noisy

Press MONO/ST. on the front panel so that "ST." disappears in the display window. There will be no stereo effect, but the reception will improve. Press the button again to restore the stereo effect.

To improve reception

Reorient the supplied antennas.

RDS Operation

This unit is equipped with RDS (Radio Data System), which brings a wide range of information to FM radio. Now in use in many countries, RDS is a system for transmitting station call signs or network information, a description of station programme type text message about the station or specifics of musical selection and the correct time.

RDS TUNING

When a FM station is tuned in and it contains RDS data, the unit will automatically display the station's call sign and the RDS indicator will light in the Display Window as well as indicators for the RDS services programme (PS), programme type recognition (PTY), Radiotext (RT) and Clock Time (CT) if transmitted by the station.

RDS DISPLAY OPTIONS

The RDS system is capable of transmitting a wide variety of information in addition to the initial call sign that appears when a station is first tuned. In normal RDS operation the display will indicate the station name, broadcast network or call letters. Pressing **RDS** on the remote control enables you to cycle through the various data types in the sequence:

(PS ↔ FREQUENCY ↔ PTY ↔ RT ↔ CT)

- PS (Programme Service name)- The name of the channel is shown in the Display Window.
- PTY (Programme type recognition)- The name of the programme type is shown in the Display Window.
- RT (Radiotext)- A "text" message contains special information from the broadcast station. Note that this message may scroll across the display to permit message.
- CT (Time controlled by the channel)- Enables the unit to receive the actual time and show it in the Display Window.

Note:

 Some RDS stations may not choose to include some of these additional features. If the data required for the selected mode is not being transmitted, the Display Window will show a PTY NONE, RT NONE, CT NONE, PS NONE message.

Programme Search (PTY)

A major benefit of RDS is its ability to encode broadcasts with Programme Type (PTY) codes that indicate the type of material being broadcast. The following list shows the abbreviations used to indicate each PTY along with an explanation of the PTY

You may search for a specific Programme Type (PTY) by following these steps:

- Press BAND to select FM mode.
- 2. Press PTY on the remote control, the display will show the last PTY in use.
- 3. Press PTY repeatedly to select a desired PTY.
- 4. When the PTY is selected, press TUN.(-/+). The unit will go into an automatic search mode.When a station is tuned, the search will stop.

Sleep Timer Setting

You can set the DVD/CD Receiver to turn off automatically at a specified time.

1. Press SLEEP to set the desired sleep time.

The SLEEP indicator and sleep time appears in the display window.

2. Each time you press SLEEP the setting changes in the following order.

SLEEP 180 \rightarrow 150 \rightarrow 120 \rightarrow 90 \rightarrow 80 \rightarrow 70 \rightarrow 60 \rightarrow 50 \rightarrow 40 \rightarrow 30 \rightarrow 20 \rightarrow 10 \rightarrow OFF

Press SLEEP. The remaining time appears in the display window.

Dimmer

This function will change the brightness of the display window on the front panel during in power-on status. Press the DIMMER repeatedly.

Mute

Press MUTE to mute your unit.

You can mute your unit in order, for example, to answer the telephone, "MUTE" indicator flashes in the display window.

Using Headphone Jack

Connect a stereo headphone plug (#3.5mm) into the PHONES connector.

The speakers are automatically disabled when you plug in headphones (not supplied).

Selecting input source
