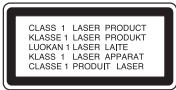


This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labeled same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".

- If you try to play a DVD with a different regional code from the unit, the message "Incorrect region code. Can't play back" appears on the TV screen.

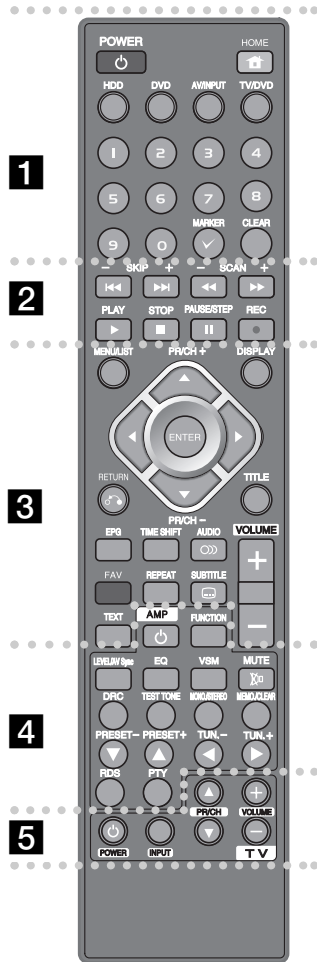
Remote Control Operation

Point the Remote Control at the remote sensor and press the buttons.

Remote Control Battery Installation

Remove the battery cover on the rear of the Remote Control, and insert R03 (size AAA) battery with  and  matched correctly.

POWER: Switches the HDD/DVD recorder ON or OFF.

HOME: Activates the HOME menu.

HDD: Selects the HDD/DVD recorder's mode to HDD.

DVD: Selects the HDD/DVD recorder's mode to DVD.

AV/INPUT: Changes the input source (Tuner, AV1-3, or DV IN).

TV/DVD: Press to switch between 'TV mode', in which you can operate the picture and sound from the TV, and 'DVD mode', in which you can operate the picture and sound from the HDD/DVD recorder.

0-9 numerical buttons: Selects numbered options in a menu.

MARKER: Selects multiple files/titles on the list.

CLEAR: Removes a track number on the Program List.

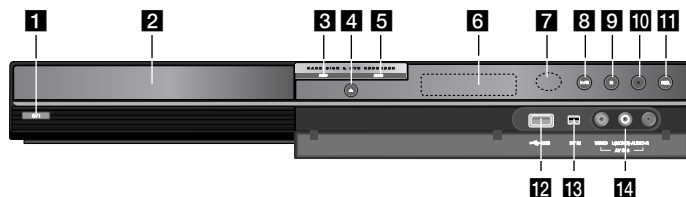

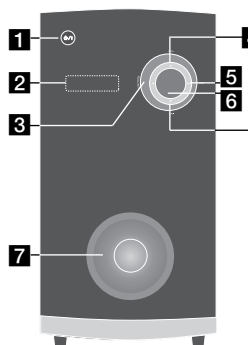

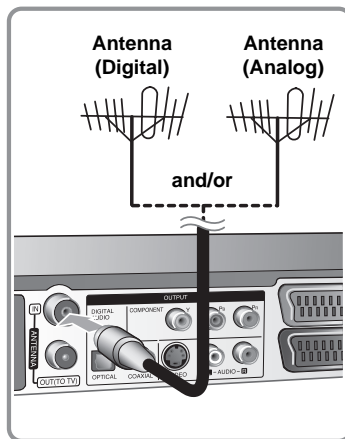

Hooking up the HDD/DVD recorder

1 Antenna connection

Connect the Terrestrial TV antenna to the ANTENNA IN jack on the unit.

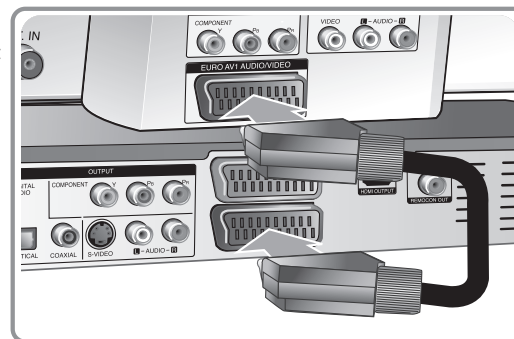
If you want to use an indoor antenna, use one with a signal amplifier rated at 5V, 100mA and set [Antenna Feed 5V] to [ON] in the setup menu.



3 SCART connection

Connect one end of the scart cable into the AV1 SCART jack on the unit and other end to the corresponding in jack on your TV.

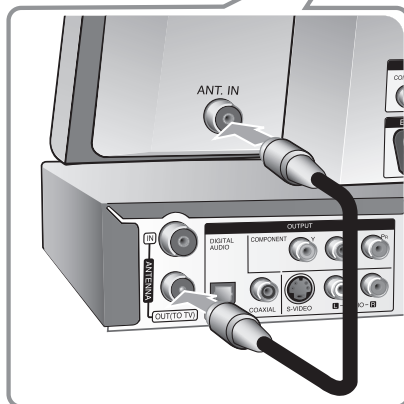
You can get Audio and Video signals together with this connection.



2 Antenna connection to your TV

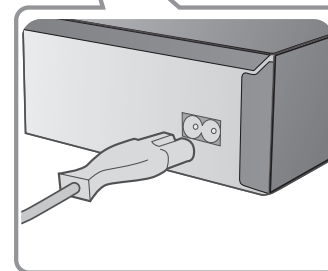
Connect one end of the RF cable to ANTENNA OUT jack on the unit and other end to ANTENNA IN jack on your TV.

Passes the signal from the ANTENNA IN jack to your TV/monitor.



4 Power cord connection

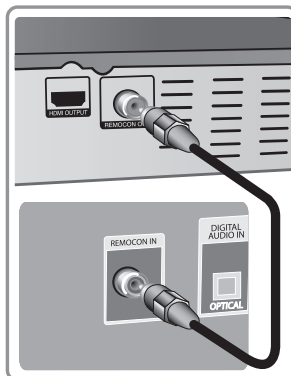
Connect the mains lead to the AC IN terminal on the unit. Then plug the power cord into the mains.



Hooking up the Active Subwoofer

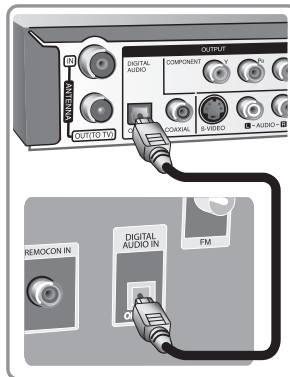
1 Remote control connection

Connect one end of the remote control cable into the REMOCON OUT jack on the HDD/DVD recorder and the other end to the REMOCON IN jack on the active subwoofer.



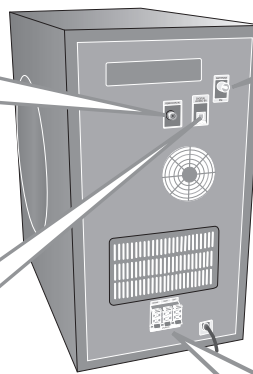
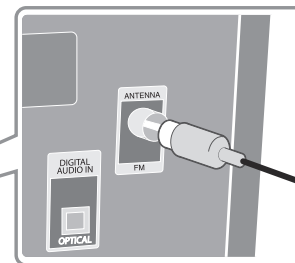
2 Digital audio connection (OPTICAL)

Connect one end of the digital audio cable (OPTICAL) to the DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT (OPTICAL) jack on the HDD/DVD recorder and the other end to the DIGITAL AUDIO IN (OPTICAL) jack on the active subwoofer.



3 FM antenna connection

Connect the FM antenna to the FM ANTENNA jack on the active subwoofer. The reception will be at its best when the two loose ends of the antenna are in a straight and horizontal line.



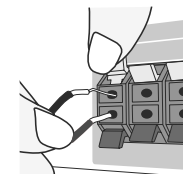
Speaker decoration

4 Speaker connection

Speaker cable is colour-coded by a band near each end.

Green	Center	Above screen, directly front of you
Red	Right	In front of you, to the right of the screen

Connect the red end of each wire to the terminals marked +(plus) and the black end to the terminals marked -(minus). To connect the cable to the active subwoofer and the speakers, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

General about connection

Picture and sound

Digital TV is a transmission technology that replaces the traditional analogue technique.

This means that several TV channels, radio channels and other digital services can be transmitted on the same space as just one channel took up before. As a consumer you get access to many more channels and services than before at the same time as they are received with perfect picture and audio quality.

The recorder converts the digital signal into a format that is suitable for your TV and sound system.

Connecting your recorder is just as simple as connecting for example a video recorder. You get the best picture quality by using a HDMI cable for connection to your TV-set. The best audio experience is obtained by connecting an optical cable to your sound system.

Coverage

Before buying this product it is anticipated that you have made sure that there are digital transmissions covering your region.

Antenna / Signal source

Depending on the reception your recorder may be connected to a simple indoor antenna or to an existing outdoor antenna system. If you live in a flat you should make sure that the digital terrestrial signals are distributed to your wall antenna outlet. If you have your own antenna system you must make sure that it is equipped with antennas, filter and/or amplifier that can handle those frequencies that the digital channels are transmitted on.

Cable-TV

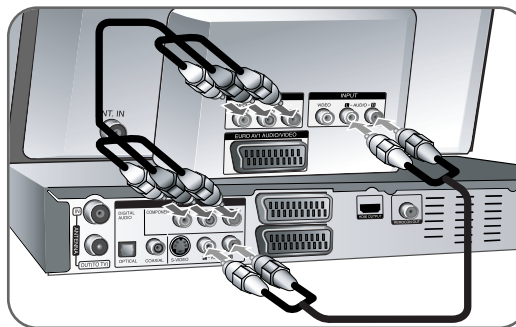
Please observe that this recorder is not designed for the reception of regular digital cable-TV signals (QAM-signal). Despite this, operators of smaller cable networks may have chosen to distribute the digital terrestrial signals (COFDM-signal) in the network. In this case this recorder may well be used.

Check with your landlord if you are insecure about what type of TV-signal that is provided in the wall antenna outlet.

Component connection

Connect one end of the component(Y PB PR) cable to the COMPONENT OUTPUT jack on the unit and other end to the COMPONENT INPUT jack on your TV.

Connect one ends of the audio cables (red and white) to the analog AUDIO OUTPUT jack on the unit and other ends to the AUDIO INPUT jack on your TV.

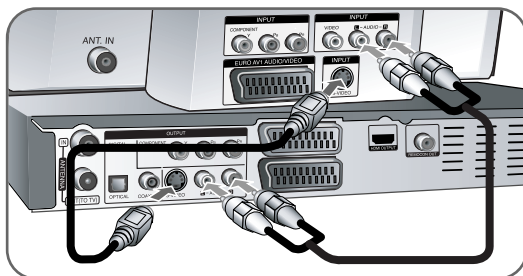


If your television is a high-definition or "digital ready" television, you may take advantage of the unit's progressive scan output for the highest video resolution possible. If your TV does not accept the Progressive Scan format, the picture will appear scrambled with the progressive signal. Set the resolution to 576p using RES. button on the front panel to obtain the progressive signal.

S-Video connection

Connect one end of the S-Video cable to the S-VIDEO OUTPUT jack on the unit and the other end to the S-Video INPUT jack on your TV.

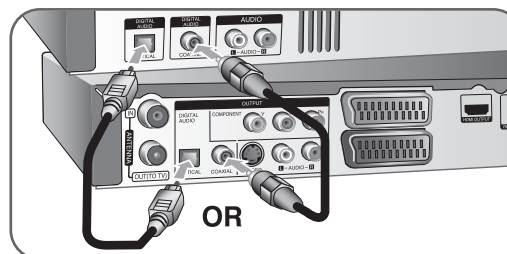
Connect one ends of the audio cables (red and white) to the analog AUDIO OUTPUT jack on the unit and the other ends to the AUDIO INPUT jack on your TV.



Digital audio connection

Connecting to an amplifier/receiver, Dolby Digital/MPEG/DTS decoder or other equipment with a digital input.

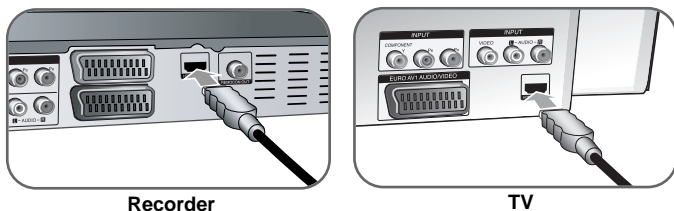
Connect one end of the digital audio cables (COAXIAL or OPTICAL) to the digital audio output jack (COAXIAL or OPTICAL) on the unit and other end to the digital audio input jack (COAXIAL or OPTICAL) on your amplifier.



This recorder does not perform internal (2 channel) decoding of a DTS sound track. To enjoy DTS multi channel surround, you must connect this recorder to a DTS compatible receiver via one of this recorder's digital audio outputs.

HDMI connection

Connect one end of the HDMI cable to the HDMI OUTPUT jack on the unit and other end to the HDMI INPUT jack on your TV.



When you use the HDMI connection, you can change the resolution (576i, 576p, 720p, 1080i or 1080p) for the HDMI output by pressing RES. button repeatedly.

About HDMI

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) supports both video and audio on a single digital connection for use with DVD Players, Set-Top Boxes, and other AV devices.

HDMI was developed to provide the technologies of HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection). HDCP is used to protect digital content transmitted and received.

HDMI has the capability to support standard, enhanced, or high-definition video plus standard to multi-channel surround-sound audio. HDMI features include uncompressed digital video, a bandwidth of up to 5 gigabytes per second, one connector (instead of several cables and connectors), and communication between the AV source and AV devices such as DTVs.

HDMI, the HDMI logo and High-Definition Multimedia Interface are trademarks or registered trademarks of HDMI licensing LLC.

Note on HDMI connection

- If your TV is NOT capable of handling 96 kHz sampling frequency, set the [Sampling Freq.] option to [48 kHz] on the setup menu (See page 20). When this choice is made, this unit will automatically convert any 96 kHz signals to 48 kHz so your system can decode them.
- If your TV is not equipped with Dolby Digital and MPEG decoder, set the [Dolby Digital] and [MPEG] options to [PCM] on the setup menu (See page 20).

- If your TV is not equipped with DTS decoder, set the [DTS] options to [OFF] on the setup menu (See page 20). To enjoy DTS multi channel surround, you must connect this unit to a DTS compatible receiver via one of this unit's digital audio outputs.
- If there is noise or lines on the screen, please check the HDMI cable.
- Changing the resolution when the unit is connected with HDMI connector may result in malfunctions. To solve the problem, turn off the unit and then turn it on again.
- When you connect an HDMI or DVI compatible device make sure of the followings:
 - Try switching off the HDMI/DVI device and this unit. Next, switch on the HDMI/DVI device and leave it for around 30 seconds, then switch on this unit.
 - The connected device's video input is set correctly for this unit.
 - The connected device is compatible with 720(1440)x576i, 720x576p, 1280x720p, 1920x1080i or 1920x1080p video input.
- Not all HDCP-compatible DVI devices will work with this unit.
 - The picture will not be displayed properly with non-HDCP device.

What is SIMPLINK?

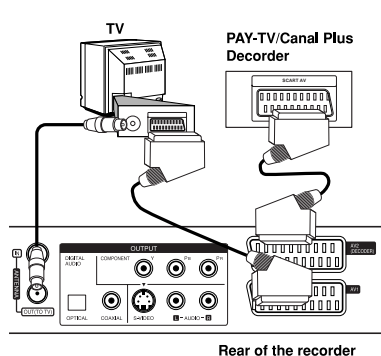


Some functions of this unit are controlled by TV's remote control when this unit and LG TV with SIMPLINK are connected through HDMI connection.

- Controllable functions by LG TV's remote control; Play, Pause, Scan, Skip, Stop, Power Off, etc.
- Refer to the TV owner's manual for the details of SIMPLINK function.
- LG TV with SIMPLINK function has the logo as shown above.

Connecting a PAY-TV/Canal Plus Decoder

You can watch or record PAY-TV/Canal Plus programmes if you connect a decoder (not supplied) to the unit. Disconnect the unit's mains lead from the mains when connecting the decoder. You do not need to turn on the unit to view the signals from the connected tuner on your TV.

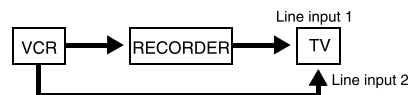


Rear of the recorder

To watch or record PAY-TV/Canal Plus programmes, set [AV2 Connection] option to [Decoder] (see page 19) and set the program's [CANAL] option to [On] on the Setup menu (page 16).

If you disconnect the unit's mains lead, you will not be able to view the signals from the connected decoder.

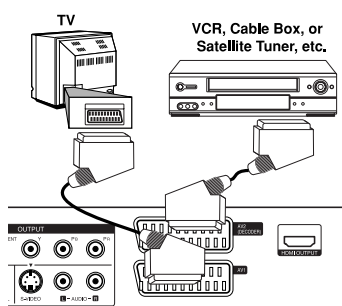
- Pictures containing copy protection signals that prohibit any copying cannot be recorded.
- If you pass the unit signals via the VCR, you may not receive a clear image on your TV screen.
Be sure to connect your VCR to the unit and your TV in the order shown below. To watch video tapes, watch the tapes through a second line input on your TV.



- When you record to a VCR from this unit, do not switch the input source to TV by pressing the TV/DVD button on the remote.
- If you are using a B Sky B tuner, be sure to connect the tuner's VCR SCART jack to the AV2 DECODER jack.
- If you disconnect the unit's mains lead, you will not be able to view the signals from the connected VCR or tuner.

Connecting to the AV2 DECODER jack

Connect a VCR or similar recording device to the AV2 DECODER jack of this unit. You do not need to turn on the unit to view the signals from the connected tuner on your TV.

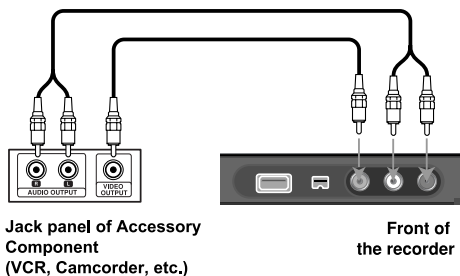

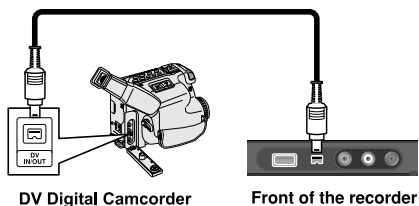

Connecting a Digital Camcorder

Using the front panel DV IN jack, it is possible to connect a DV digital camcorder and digitally transfer DV tapes to DVD.

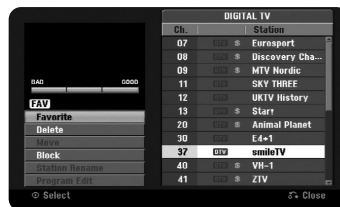

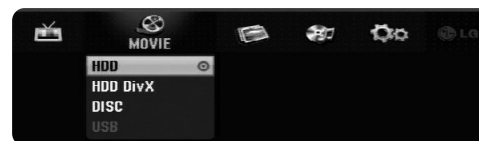

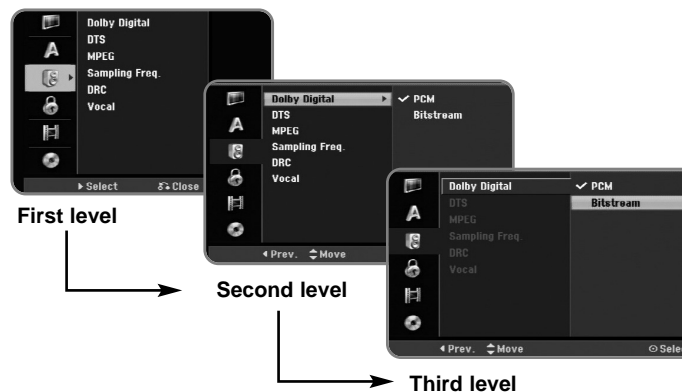

Auto Programming – This option automatically scans and sets the available channels. Password is needed to access this option, if [Lock System] option is set to [On]. (page 21)

[All, Digital or Analog]: Select a broadcasting type which you want to scan automatically.

[Start]: Start the channel scanning.

Program Edit– This option allows you to add channels and edit preset channels. Password is needed to access this option, if [Lock System] option is set to [On]. (page 21)

[Add Channel]: Select the broadcasting type between [Digital] and [Analog] and then press ▲ ▼ to select the channel and press ENTER to add the selected channel.

[Edit]: Displays the screen which show preset channel list and channel editing options. (page 16)

Clock Set– The clock must be set in order to use [Timer record].

[Auto]: Set the channel that broadcasts a clock signal and the clock will be set automatically. If the clock that has automatically set is different with your local clock, you can add more time using [Time Offset] option. (For example, when summer time is started in local area.) Press ► to select [Time Offset] option. Press ▲ ▼ to select a value then press ENTER (0, 30, 60, 90, 120). Select "0" if the clock that has automatically set is identified with your local clock.

[Manual]: If there is no channel that broadcasts a clock signal in your area, you can set the time and date manually.

TV Aspect – Selects the aspects ratio of the connected TV.

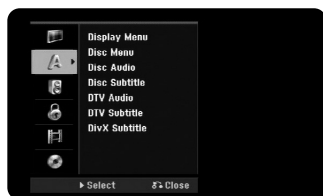

Initialization – You can reset the unit to its original factory settings and format the HDD.

[HDD format]: Everything recorded on the HDD will be erased.

[Original]: Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

DTV Audio – Digital channels sometimes provide multiple audio tracks, often in a different language. You can set a default audio language with this setting.

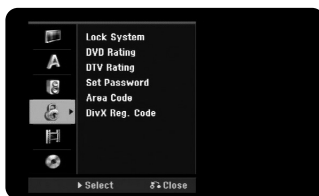

DRC (Dynamic Range Control) – Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [ON] for this effect.

Vocal – Select [ON] to mix karaoke channels into normal stereo. This function is effective for multi-channel karaoke DVDs only.

Adjust the lock settings



To access the Lock System, DVD Rating, DTV Rating, Set Password or Area Code options, you must enter the 4-digit password. If you have not yet entered a password you are prompted to do so. Enter a 4-digit password. Enter it again to verify. If you make a mistake while entering number, press CLEAR to delete numbers.

If you forget your password, you can reset it. Displays the SETUP menu. Input '210499' and press ENTER. The password has now been cleared.

Lock System – Allows you to set up specific programs and ratings through blocking schemes. Also allows you to activate or disable all of the lock schemes previously set up. A password is required to gain access to the lock menu options. When the Lock System is set to [OFF], the [DTV Rating] is not effective.

DVD Rating – Select a DVD rating level. The lower the level, the stricter the rating. Select [No Limit] to deactivate the rating.

DTV Rating – You can set the ratings to block out all the programs with ratings above a specified level.

[No Control]: You can view all programs.

[04 Years] – [18 Years]: Rating [04 Years] has the most restrictions and [18 Years] is the least restrictive.

[Lock All]: All programs are locked. To view a program, you must input the 4-digit password you have created.

Set Password – Changes or deletes the password.

[Change]: Enter the new password twice after entering the current password.

[Delete]: Delete the current password after entering the current password.

Area code – Select a code for a geographic area as the playback rating level. This determines which area's standards are used to rate DVDs controlled by the parental lock. See the Area Codes on page 41.

DivX Reg. Code– We provide you with the DivX® VOD (Video On Demand) registration code that allows you to rent and purchase videos using the DivX® VOD service. For more information, visit www.divx.com/vod.

Press ENTER when [View] icon is highlighted and you can view the registration code of the unit.

Adjust the recording settings



Record Mode Set – Select the picture quality for recording from XP, SP, LP, EP or MLP. See recording time of each mode on page 44.

[XP]: Highest picture quality.

[SP]: Standard picture quality.

[LP]: Slightly lower picture quality than [SP] mode.

[EP]: Low picture quality.

[MLP]: The longest recording time with the lowest picture quality.

Record Aspect – This option sets the recording aspect ratio to suit the material you are recording on DVD.

DV Rec Audio – You need to set this if you have a camcorder using 32kHz/12-bit sound connected to the front panel DV IN jack.

Some digital camcorders have two stereo tracks for audio. One is recorded at the time of shooting; the other is for overdubbing after shooting.

On the Audio 1 setting, the sound that was recorded while shooting is used.

On the Audio 2 setting, the overdubbed sound is used.

TV Record Audio – Select an audio channel to record when recording a bilingual program.

[Main+Sub]: Main language and sub language

[Main]: Main language only

[Sub]: Sub language only

Auto Chapter – When DVD recording, chapter markers are added automatically in every specified interval (5, 10 or 15 min.).

AV2 Recording – Selects a method of inputting video signals for the AV2(DECODER) jack. The picture will not be clear if this setting does not match the type of the video input signal.

[Auto]: The video input signal will automatically follow the video signal received.

[CVBS]: Inputs CVBS(composite) video signals.

[RGB]: Inputs RGB signals.

[S-VIDEO]: Inputs S-Video signals.

Time Shift – Set this option to [ON] make this unit to use the Time Shift function automatically without pressing TIME SHIFT button. The timeshift will start in 5 seconds after TV tuner mode is started.

Adjust the disc settings



Disc Format – You can Initialize a DVD by pressing ENTER while [Start] is selected. The [Disc Format] menu appears. The unit starts formatting after confirmation. You can select a mode between VR and Video for DVD-RW discs. The everything recorded on the DVD will be erased after formatting.

If you load a completely blank disc, the unit will initialize the disc automatically. See “Formatting mode (new disc)” on page 5 for more information.

Finalize – Finalizing is necessary when you play disc recorded with this unit on other DVD equipment. How long finalization takes depends on the disc condition, recorded length and number of titles.

[Finalize]: The [Finalize] menu appears. The unit starts finalizing after confirmation.

[Unfinalize]: The finalized DVD-RW discs can be unfinalized after confirming on the [Unfinalize] menu. After unfinalizing, the disc can be edited and re-record.

Before finalizing, check the characteristics between the disc type in the table below.

-RW	The finalized DVD-RW discs can be unfinalized so that the disc can edit or record again.
+R -R	Once you finalize a disc, you can not edit or record anything on the disc.

RAM	The finalization does not needed.

Disc Label – This function allow you to change the default disc name to something more descriptive. This name appears when you load a disc and when you display disc information on-screen. The keyboard menu appears by pressing ENTER while [Edit] is selected.

Disc Protect – This function allow you to protect discs from accidental record, erasure and editing by setting this option to [ON]. The DVD-R and Video mode formatted DVD-RW are not available to protect.

Setting the sound mode

The related information of the selected button appears on the active subwoofer display.

VSM (VIRTUAL SOUND MATRIX)

You can select the virtual sound. Press VSM to set the virtual sound.

[BYPASS] mode : Software with multichannel surround audio signals is played according to the way it was recorded.

2Ch source

[VSM] mode: Realtime 3D positioned sound rendering technology with stereo sources, optimized for stereo speakers. Listeners may experience amazing virtual surround effects with their own multimedia players.

5.1Ch source

[VSM] mode: Listeners may experience virtul surround effects in the 5.1 ch from the right and left speakers and center speaker.

Set a pre-programmed sound field

This system has a number of pre-set surround sound fields. Select the one which best suits the program you are watching by pressing EQ repeatedly to cycle through the options: NORMAL, NATURAL, POP, CLASSIC, ROCK, JAZZ

Adjust the level settings

Adjust the speaker level settings

You can adjust the sound level of each speaker.

Press LEVEL/AV Sync to adjust the sound level.

The level indicator will appear on the active subwoofer display.

Use ◀▶ to select a desired speaker to set.

Each time you press ◀▶, it is changed as the following order:

LEV FL (Front Left) → LEV C (Center) → LEV FR (Front Right)

→ LEV SW (Subwoofer)

Use ▲▼ to adjust the sound level of the selected speaker. (-10dB ~ +10dB)

Repeat and adjust the sound level of the other speakers.

Adjust the test tone settings

You can adjust the speaker levels and balance while listening to the test tone from your listening position.

Press TEST TONE to select the test tone mode.

A hiss noise comes out for 2 seconds from each speakers in the following order:

TEST FL (Front Left) → TEST CEN (Center) → TEST FR (Front Right) → TEST SW (Subwoofer)

You can adjust the sound level of each speaker during operating the test tone, first press LEVEL/AV Sync then press ▲▼, so that all speaker's sound level is same from the listener's position. If the setting is complete, press TEST TONE.

Adjust the AV Sync settings

Sometimes Digital TV encounters a delay between picture and sound. If this happens you can compensate by setting a delay on the sound so that it effectively 'waits' for the picture to arrive: this is called AV Sync.

Press LEVEL/AV Sync twice.

Use PRESET+ or PRESET- to scroll up and down through the delay amount, which you can set at anything between 0 and 300m sec. (10m sec/value)

If the setting is complete, press LEVEL/AV Sync.

The delay will vary depending on which digital TV channel you are on.

If you change channel you may need to readjust the AV Sync.

This function does not work when the active subwoofer is set to FM tuner.

Using the late night function

You can compress the dynamic range of the sound track.

Press DRC repeatedly.

This may be useful when you want to watch movies at low volumes late at night. Dynamic range compression is possible with Dolby Digital sources only. This function is valid only when you set the Dolby Digital to Bitstream in the setup menu.

NIGHT OFF - Late night function off.

NIGHT STD - Small reduction in dynamic range.

NIGHT MAX - Large reduction in dynamic range.

The late night function may be less effective or have no effect depending on the Dolby Digital source.

Moving to another title **HDD DVD ALL**

Starting playback from selected time **HDD DVD ALL DivX**

Press DISPLAY twice during playback. The time search box shows the elapsed playing time. Select the time search box and then input the required start time in hours, minutes, and seconds from left to right. For example, to find a scene at 2 hours, 10 minutes, and 20 seconds, enter "21020" and press ENTER. If you enter the wrong numbers, press ◀ / ▶ to move the under bar () to the wrong number. Then enter the correct numbers.

Selecting a subtitle language **DVD DivX**

During playback, press DISPLAY twice to display the playback menu. Use ▲ ▼ to select the subtitle option then use ◀ ▶ to select desired subtitle language.

OR

During playback, press SUBTITLE then press ◀ ▶ repeatedly to select a desired subtitle language.

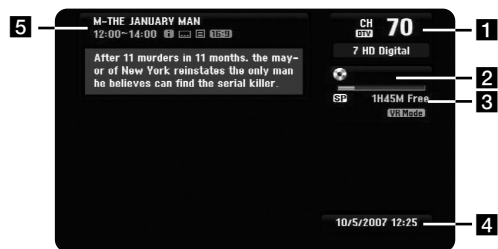
Selecting a sound mode **DVD ALL DivX**

This unit can produce a 3D Surround effect, which simulates multi-channel audio playback from two conventional stereo speakers, instead of the five or more speakers normally required to listen to multi-channel audio from a home theater system.

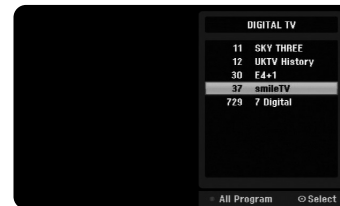

Press Red colored button while watching a TV. The favorite options appears. Press ▲ ▼ to select a desired program then press ENTER to watch the selected program.

About the digital EPG

The digital EPG shows a table of scheduled digital TV programs and detailed information about individual program. The digital EPG screen consist of program information, channel list and general program list. Note that the unit's clock must be set to the correct time and date to ensure all relevant EPG information is displayed.

Displaying the detailed Information window

You can view detailed information for the highlighted program. Press blue color button to display detailed information window. To exit the detail information window, press blue color button again.



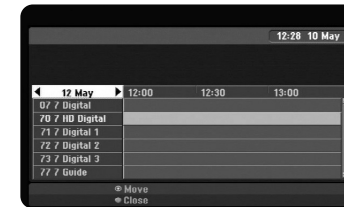
Switching the EPG menu

The EPG screen provides two search menus. Press yellow color button when the EPG menu is displayed.

- Now/Next: The screen shows now and next programs.



- 8 Days: The screen shows programs within 8 days. When the EPG menu with 8 days is displayed, you can also change the date of the EPG menu by pressing the green color button then use ◀ / ▶ to select a date.



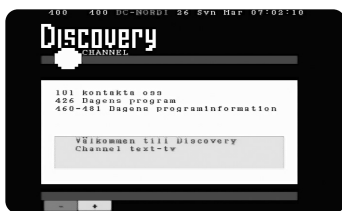
You can set a timer record using EPG menu with 8 days. Select a program then press red color button. The red timer icon will be displayed and the program will be memorized by the recorder.

You can check the programming on the [Timer Record List] menu (see page 33). To cancel the timer recording, select the program then press red color button. The red timer icon disappears.

Viewing a Teletext service

Teletext is a free broadcasting service by some TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programs, share prices and many other topics.

The recorder gives you access to teletext which is greatly improved in various aspects such as text and graphics. This teletext can be accessed by special teletext services and specific services which broadcast teletext.



Use numbered (0-9) buttons or PR/CH on the remote control to change the program which broadcast teletext. Press TEXT to access on the teletext. Follow the indications on teletext and move onto the next or previous step by pressing color (RED or GREEN) or SKIP (◀◀ / ▶▶) buttons. Press TEXT or RETURN (↵) to turn the teletext off and return to TV viewing.

Selecting teletext page

Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the numbered buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then enter the correct page number again. Use RED/GREEN buttons to move up and down pages.

Pause a playback

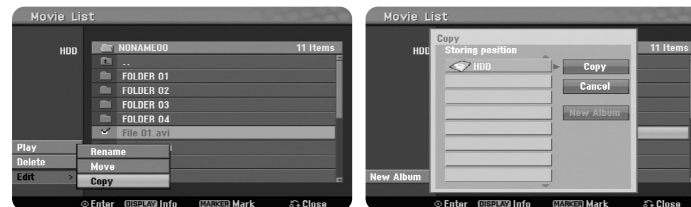

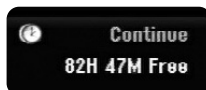

Changing TV audio channel

Before recording, you can change the TV audio channel for stereo and bilingual broadcast. Press AUDIO repeatedly to change the audio channel. The current audio channel is displayed on-screen. Set the [TV Rec Audio] option in the SETUP menu when recoding a bilingual broadcast.

Instant timer recording

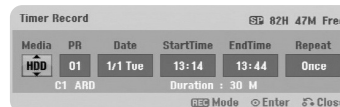
Instant timer recording allow you to make a recording of preset length easily.



When the REC is first pressed, recording starts. Press REC repeatedly to select a certain amount of time. Each press of REC to displays the increased recording time on-screen. You can set the instant timer recording up to 240 minutes on HDD or up to 720 minutes on DVD, depending on the free space available.

Setting a timer record

This unit can be programmed to record up to 16 timer recordings within a month. The clock must be set correctly before setting a timer.



Press HOME and select TV option. Press ▲▼ to select the [Timer Record] and press ENTER to display [Timer record List] menu. Use ▲▼ to select [New] and press ENTER to display [Timer Record] menu. Adjust the each field as described below using ▲▼◀▶.

[Media]: Choose a media to record (HDD or DVD).

[CH/PR]: Choose a memorized program number, or one of the external inputs from which to record. (You cannot select DV input and radio channel.)

[Date]: Choose a date up to 1 month in advance.

[Start Time]: Set the start time.

[End Time]: Set the end time.

[Repeat] Choose a desired repeat (Once, Daily (Mon-Fri), or Weekly).

Recordings from EPG menu will always be set to [Once].

Press REC repeatedly to set the recording mode (XP, SP, LP, EP or MLP) then press ENTER to set a timer recording. The "Rec OK" or "OK" on the [Check] field on the [Timer Record List] menu indicates the timer recording is programmed correctly.



Canceling a timer recording

You can cancel a timer record before the timer recording actually starts. Select a timer recording that you want to cancel on the [Timer Record List] menu and press CLEAR.

Timer Recording Troubleshooting

Even though the timer is set, the unit will not record when:

- There is no disc loaded and there is not free space on the HDD.
- A non-recordable disc is loaded and there is not free space on the HDD.
- [Disc Protect] option is set to [ON] in the Setup menu and there is not free space on the HDD (see page 22).
- The unit is in operating (recording, copying, deleting etc.).
- There are already 99 titles (DVD-RW, DVD-R), 49 titles (DVD+R, DVD+RW) recorded on the disc and there are already 255 titles recorded on the HDD.

You cannot enter a timer program when:

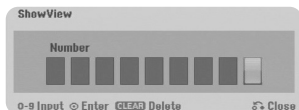
- A recording is already underway.
- The time you're trying to set has already passed.
- There are already 16 timer programs set.

If two or more timer programs overlap:

- The earlier program takes priority.
- When the earlier program finishes, the later program starts.
- If two programs are set to start at exactly the same time, the program entered first takes priority.

Timer recording with SHOWVIEW® code

A SHOWVIEW code is a series of numbers which you can use to automatically program your unit to record a certain program. Most TV guides publish SHOWVIEW programming numbers with their program details.



Press HOME and select TV option. Press ▲▼ to select the [ShowView] and press ENTER to display [ShowView] menu. Enter the SHOWVIEW programming number using numerical buttons then press ENTER to shows the [Timer Record] menu. You can change the settings on the [Timer Record] menu as required.

Press REC repeatedly to set the recording mode (XP, SP, LP, EP or MLP) then press ENTER to set a timer recording. The "Rec OK" or "OK" on the [Check] field on the [Timer Record List] menu indicates the timer recording is programmed correctly.

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Simultaneous playback and record

You can play other contents while you are recording. Simply press HOME and select the playable contents you want to play while recording. You cannot playback other contents while copying or dubbing. The DivX file cannot be played while recording. When you recording on a DVD, the contents on the DVD cannot be played.

Time Slip

You can watch the title that you are currently recording to HDD with this function. After the recording is progressed over 15 seconds, press PLAY to playback the title that you are currently recording. If you stop playback the title, returns to the current recording position.

Record from a camcorder

You can record from a DV-equipped camcorder to the HDD by connecting it with a DV cable. You can also record from a digital camcorder connected to the DV in jack on the front of the unit. Press AV/INPUT repeatedly to select the DV input. Find the place on the camcorder recording that you want to begin recording from and press REC to start recording. Depending on your camcorder, you can use this recorder's remote to control the camcorder using the STOP, PLAY and PAUSE functions. Press STOP to end recording.

Recording From an external inputs

You can record from an external component, such as a camcorder or VCR, connected to any of the recorder's external inputs. Each press of the AV/INPUT changes the input source as described below. Make sure that the component you want to record from is connected properly to the unit before recording an external source.

- Tuner: Built-in tuner
- AV1: AV1 scart jack mounted on back panel
- AV2: AV2 DECODER scart jack mounted on back panel
- AV3: AV IN 3 (VIDEO, AUDIO (L/R)) mounted on the front panel
- DV: DV IN mounted on front panel

Using time shift function

This feature allow you to pause or rewind live TV, so you do not miss a thing if you were interrupted.

Press TIME SHIFT then press PAUSE/STEP while watching live broadcast before answering the phone. The timeshift function will record the broadcast of later viewing. Before using this function, make sure that the unit is in HDD mode.

If no button is pressed for 6 hours, the timeshift will stop automatically. You can use trick play functions (slow, scan, etc.) during timeshift. Refer to playback operation on page 27-28.

Stop timeshift by pressing STOP and confirm by pressing ENTER. You will returned to watch a broadcast in real time.

Jump to start or end during timeshift

Press ENTER to show progress bar during timeshift. Press ◀ to jump to the beginning and ▶ to jump to the end of the timeshift.

Clip recording

If you want to record a timeshifted program as a title, press REC at the starting point and ending point you want to record. The timeshift progress bar indicates a clip that you select with red bar. You can make more clips by repeating this instruction. The clips will be recorded when you exit the timeshift function.

Using time shift function automatically

If the [Time Shift] option in the SETUP menu is set to [ON], timeshift starts automatically without pressing TIME SHIFT button in HDD mode.

If you want to quit timeshift function, set the [Time Shift] function to [OFF].

Editing a title

Using the Title list menu, you can edit video contents.

Before editing

This unit offers various edit options for various disc types. Before you edit, check the disc type, and select the option available for your disc.

You can enjoy advanced edit functions with VR mode formatted DVD (DVD-RW or DVD-RAM). Editing either the original recording (called the "original"), or the playback information created from the original (called a "Playlist"). Edits made to the original titles are final. If you plan to edit a title without editing the original title, you can create a Playlist title for editing. A Playlist is a group of Playlist titles created from the original title for editing purpose.

Titles in the disc's original content contain one or more chapters. When you insert a disc's title into the Playlist, all the chapters within that title also appear. In other words, chapters in the Playlist behave exactly as chapters on a DVD-Video disc do. Parts are sections of Original or Playlist titles. From the Original and Playlist menu you can add or delete parts. Adding a chapter or title to the Playlist creates a new title made up of a section (i.e., chapter) of an Original title. Deleting a part removes part of a title from the Original or Playlist menu.

Adding chapter markers HDD -RWVR +RW +R RAM

You can create chapters within a title by inserting chapter marks at the desired point. Press MARKER at the desired point while playback or recording. A chapter marker icon appears on the screen.

The chapter markers can be added at regular interval automatically by setting the [Auto Chapter] option in the SETUP menu.

Deleting a title or chapter

When you delete a title or chapter from the Playlist, the title or chapter in the Original still remains. However, if you delete a chapter or title from Original, the title or chapter deleted from the Original are also removed from Playlist.

Select a title or chapter that you want to delete and press ENTER. Select [Delete] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to confirm.

HDD – You can delete multiple files using MARKER button. Press MARKER at the desired files to select multiple files and then follow the instruction above.

Chapter search HDD -RWVR -RWVideo +RW +R -R RAM

You can select the start of a title by searching a chapter. Select a title that you want to search and press ENTER. Select [Chapter] in the [Search] option from the menu on the left of the screen, and press ENTER to display the [Chapter List] menu.

Use ▲▼◀▶ to find the chapter you want to start playback, and press PLAY to start playback.

Making a new Playlist -RWVR RAM

The Playlist allow you to edit or re-edit a title or chapter without changing the Original recordings. Use this function to add an Original title or chapter to a new Playlist or the registered Playlist.



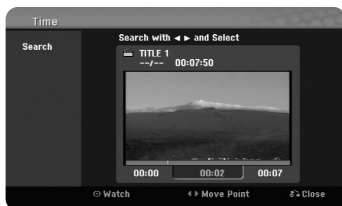
Select an Original title or chapter that you want to put into the Playlist then press ENTER. Select the [Playlist Add] option and then press ENTER to display the [Select Playlist] menu. Moving a Playlist chapter -RWVR RAM

You can select the start of a title by searching through the time duration. Select a title that you want to search and press ENTER. Select [Time] in the [Search] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the [Search] menu.



Use ◀▶ to find the time you want to start. Each press of ◀▶ to moves 1 minute and press and hold ◀▶ to moves 5 minutes. Press ENTER to watch a title from a selected time.

Sorting the titles **HDD**

Press ENTER to bring up the options menu. Select [Sort] option and press ENTER to view the further options. Here you can choose to sort titles according to [Date] (when they were recorded), [Title] (alphabetical order) or by [Category] (sort by genre).

Combining titles **HDD**

Use this function to merge the selected title with another title. Select a title and press ENTER. Select [Combine] in the [Edit] option then press ENTER. Select a title you want to combine with current title and press ENTER to confirm.

Hiding a chapter or title **+RW** **+R**

You can skip through playing chapters or titles without actually deleting them. Select a chapter or title you want to hide and press ENTER. Select [Hide] in the [Edit] option then press ENTER.

If you want to recover the hidden title or chapter, select the hidden title or chapter and press ENTER. Select [Show] in the [Edit] option then press ENTER to recover it.

Dividing a title **HDD** **+RW**

Use this function to split a title up into two titles. Select a title that you want to divide and press ENTER. Select [Divide] in the [Edit] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the [Divide] menu. Find the point you want to divide a title using PLAY, SCAN, PAUSE/STEP buttons and press ENTER while [Divide] option is selected. The playback screen shows the divided point. Select [Done] option and press ENTER to divide. You cannot select dividing point less than 3 seconds.

Protect a title **-RWVR** **+RW** **+R** **RAM**

Use this function to protect a title against accidental recording, editing or deleting. Select a title you want to protect and press ENTER. Select [Protect] option from the menu on the left and press ENTER. The lock mark will appears on the title thumbnail.

If you want to unprotect the title, select the protected title and press ENTER. Select [Unprotect] option from the menu on the left and press ENTER to unprotect it.

Deleting a part **HDD** **-RWVR** **RAM**

You can delete a part which you do not want in the title.

Select a title that you want to delete part and press ENTER. Select [Delete Part] in the [Edit] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the [Delete part] menu. You can find the point using PLAY, SCAN, PAUSE/STEP buttons.

[Start Point]: Select starting point of a part that you want to delete then press ENTER.

[End Point]: Select ending point of a part that you want to delete then press ENTER.

[Next Part]: Press ENTER to delete a additional part (HDD only).

[Cancel]: Press ENTER to cancel the selected part.

[Done]: Press ENTER to delete the selected part.

Naming a title

When a title is recorded by this unit, the title name will be named by a number. You can change a title name by using this function.



Select a title that you want to change a name and press ENTER. Select [Rename] or [Title Name] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the keyboard menu. Use ▲▼◀▶ to select a character then press ENTER to confirm your selection on the keyboard menu.

[OK]: Finish the naming.

[Cancel]: Cancels all entered characters.

[Space]: Inserts a space at the cursor position.

[Delete]: Deletes the previous character at the cursor position.

You can use remote control buttons for entering a name

PLAY (▶): Inserts a space at the cursor position.

⏏ (PAUSE/STEP): Deletes the after character at the cursor position.

■ (STOP), CLEAR: Deletes the previous character at the cursor position.

◀▶ / ◀▶: Moves cursor to left or right.

MENU/LIST, DISPLAY: Changes the character set on the keyboard menu.

Numbers (0-9): Enters the corresponding character at the cursor position.

You can apply a genre for a selected title on HDD. When a character is highlighted on the keyboard menu, keep pressing ◀ until the cursor jumps across to the Genre field. Choose desired genre and press ENTER to select it. The chosen genre name will appear at the lower right corner of the title thumbnail.

Combining chapters **HDD** **-RWvR** **+RW** **+R** **RAM**

Use this function to merge the selected chapter with adjacent chapter. Select a chapter and press ENTER. Select [Combine] option to views combine indicator between chapter thumbnails. Press ENTER to combine indicated two chapters.

This function is not available in conditions as listed below.

- There is only one chapter within the title.
- The first chapter is selected.

- The chapters that you want to combine are created by deleting a part from an Original title.
- The chapters that you want to combine are created from different titles.
- One of the playlist chapter that you want to combine has been moved.

Using the Disc menu

Using the title list menu in DVD mode, you can use the disc setting functions without entering the SETUP menu.



Use ▲▼◀▶ to select the [Disc] option on the DVD title list menu and then press ENTER to show further options.

[Disc Format]: Format the inserted disc. (page 22)

[Finalize]: Finalize the inserted disc. (page 22)

[Unfinalize]: Unfinalize the inserted disc. (page 22)

[Disc Label]: Use this to enter a name for the disc. This name appears when you load the disc and disc information on-screen. (page 22)

[Protect]: Use this to prevent accidental recording, editing, deleting of the inserted disc. (page 22)

[Unprotect]: Release the protect function.

Overwriting **+RW**

You can overwrite a new video recording on a recorded title that is not protected. Select the TV channel or input source you want to record. Press MENU/LIST to display the Title List menu. Use ▲▼◀▶ to highlights a title you want to overwrite and then press REC to start overwrite. To stop the recording, press STOP.

If you overwrite the longer recording than the current title on the fully recorded disc, the next title is overwritten. If next title is protected, the overwriting stops at the starting point of the title.

Dubbing a title

Using the title list menu, you can dub video contents.

Dubbing a title - more you can do

Before dubbing

Use the copying features of this recorder to:

- Back up important recordings stored on the HDD to a DVD.
- Make a DVD copy of a recording on the HDD to play in another player.
- Transfer video from a DVD to the HDD for editing.
- Transfer edited video from the HDD to DVD.

About 'Fast' copying

Copying between DVD and HDD is a complete digital process and therefore involves no loss of quality in the audio or video. This allows for high speed copying for ease and convenience.

When copying from HDD to DVD, the speed of copying depends on the recording mode and the kind of DVD disc you're using. The Fast copying is available for unedited original video titles, and may not be possible when using disc initialized on another recorder.

When you dub a title from the DVD to HDD, only a VR mode formatted disc can use [Fast] mode.

When you dub a title from the HDD to VR mode DVD-RW or DVD-RAM, the [Fast] mode is not available for edited HDD title and Clip Recording title. And dub a edited title from VR mode DVD-RW or DVD-RAM to HDD also cannot use [Fast] mode.

Dub multiple titles from HDD to DVD **HDD**

You can select not only a single title but also multiple titles using MARKER button. Press MARKER at the desired titles to select multiple titles, and press ENTER to display the menu on the left of the screen. Select [Dubbing] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the [Dubbing] menu. Use ▲▼◀▶ to select [Start] icon then press ENTER to confirm.

Dubs a currently playing title **+R -R**


This feature copies a single title to the HDD in real time. When you start copying, playback jumps back to the start of the title, then continues through to the end of the title, when recording automatically stops. The copy will be made in the recording mode (XP, SP, LP, EP or MLP) that is currently set in the SETUP menu.

During DVD playback, press HOME to display the HOME menu. Select the [Dubbing] in the [Easy Menu] option, and press ENTER to start dubbing. The [Dubbing] option in the HOME menu will be activated only for a title from finalized DVD±R or DVD-ROM title without copy protection.

Listening to the radio

Be sure that FM antenna is connected.

See information about a radio station

The FM tuner is supplied with the RDS (Radio Data System) facility. This shows information about the radio station being listened to. Press RDS repeatedly to cycle through the various data types:

PS	(Programme Service Name) The name of the channel will appear in the display
PTY	(Programme Type Recognition) The programme type (e.g. Jazz or News) will appear in the display.
RT	(Radio Text) A text message contains special information from the broadcast station. This text may scroll across the display.
CT	(Time controlled by the channel) This shows the time and date as broadcast by the station.

Listening to the radio - more you can do

Look for radio stations automatically

Press and hold TUN.-/TUN.+ for more than a second. The tuner will scan automatically and stop when it finds a radio station.

Choose a preset number for a radio station

When storing a radio station, the preset number can be chosen. When this unit automatically shows a preset number, press PRESET +/- to change it. Press MEMO./CLEAR to save your chosen number.

Delete all the saved stations

Press and hold MEMO./CLEAR for two seconds. ERASE ALL will flash up on the active subwoofer display. Press MEMO./CLEAR to erase all saved radio stations.

Improve poor FM reception

Press MONO./STEREO. This will change the tuner from stereo to mono and usually improve the reception.

Troubleshooting

General

The power does not turned on.

- ➔ Plug the power cord into the wall outlet securely.

There is no picture.

- ➔ Select the appropriate video input mode on the TV so the picture from the unit appears on the TV screen.
- ➔ Connect the video connection securely.
- ➔ Check the [Video Output Format] in SETUP menu is set to the appropriate item that conforms to your video connection.

Picture noise appears.

- ➔ You are playing a disc recorded in a color system that is different from your TV.
- ➔ The video signal from the external component is copy-protected.
- ➔ Set the resolution that your TV can accept.

The channel is not found or stored.

- ➔ Check your antenna connection.

There is no sound.

- ➔ Connect the audio connection securely.
- ➔ The input source setting on the amplifier or the connection to the amplifier is incorrect.
- ➔ The unit is in scan, slow motion, or pause mode.

The remote control does not work properly.

- ➔ The remote control is not pointed at the remote sensor of the unit.
- ➔ The remote control is too far from the unit.
- ➔ There is an obstacle in the path of the remote control and the unit.
- ➔ The batteries in the remote control are exhausted.

Playback

The unit does not start playback.

- ➔ Insert a playable disc. (Check the disc type, color system, and regional code.)
- ➔ Place the disc with the playback side down.
- ➔ Place the disc on the disc tray correctly inside the guide.
- ➔ Clean the disc.
- ➔ Cancel the Rating function or change the rating level.

Cannot play a disc recorded using this unit on other player.

- ➔ Finalize the disc.
- ➔ Check the disc compatibility of the player.
- ➔ Place the disc on the disc tray correctly inside the guide.
- ➔ Discs recorded with copy-once material cannot be played on other players.

The angle cannot be changed.

- ➔ Multi-angles are not recorded on the DVD Video being played.
- ➔ The angle cannot be changed for the titles recorded on this unit.

The subtitle language cannot be changed or turned off.

- ➔ Subtitles are not recorded on the DVD Video being played.
- ➔ The subtitle cannot be changed for the titles recorded on this unit.

Cannot play MP3/WMA/JPEG/DivX files.

- ➔ The files are not recorded in a format that the unit can play.
- ➔ The unit does not support the codec of the DivX movie file.
- ➔ The resolution is higher than the unit can support.

Recording

Cannot record or does not record successfully.

- Check the remaining space on the disc.
- Check that the source you are trying to record in not copy protected.
- The power may have failed during recording.
- Use a VR mode formatted disc for copy-once material.

Timer record does not record successfully.

- Clock is not set to correct time.
- The start time of the timer recording is past.
- Two timer recordings may have overlapped, in which case only the earlier one will record completely.
- When setting the recording channel, make sure you set the unit's built-in tuner, not the TV's built-in tuner.

Stereo Audio Record and/or Playback is not present.

- TV is not Stereo-compatible.
- Broadcast program is not in stereo format.
- The A/V Output jacks on the unit are not connected to TV A/V In jacks.

HDMI

The connected HDMI device does not display any picture.

- Try disconnecting then reconnecting the HDMI cable.
- Try switching the power of the HDMI device off then back on.
- The video input of the connected device is set correctly for this unit.
- The HDMI cable you are using is fully HDMI-compliant . Using a non-standard cable may result in no picture being output.
- Not all HDCP-compatible DVI devices will work with this unit.

The connected HDMI device does not output sounds.

- Some HDMI-compatible devices do not output sounds (check the manual that came with the connected device).
- If your TV is not capable of handling 96 kHz sampling frequency, set the [Sampling Freq.] option to [48 kHz] on the setup menu. When this choice is made, this unit will automatically convert any 96 kHz signals to 48 kHz so your system can decode them.

Radio

Radio reception is poor.

Resetting the unit

If you observe any of the following symptoms.

- The unit is plugged in, but the power will not turn on or off.
- The front panel display is not working.
- The unit is not operating normally.

You can reset the unit as follows.

- Press and hold the POWER button for at least five seconds. This will force the unit to power off then turn the unit back on.
- Unplug the power cord, wait at least five seconds, and then plug it in again.
