



Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

- Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.
- Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.

Cleaning the unit

Notes on Discs

Handling Discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc. Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints do not get on the surface. Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

Cleaning Discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre out.

Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

Notes on discs

- Depending on the conditions of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) disc itself, some CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) discs cannot be played on the unit.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregularly shaped CDs (e.g., heart-shaped or octagonal). Doing so may result in malfunctions.
- Depending on the recording software & the finalization, some recorded discs (CD-R/RW or DVD±R/RW) may not be playable.
- DVD-R/RW, DVD+R/RW and CD-R/RW discs recorded using a personal computer or a DVD or CD Unit may not play if the disc is damaged or dirty, or if there is dirt or condensation on the Unit's lens.

BD-ROM Disc Features

BD-ROM Discs can store 25 GB (single layer) or 50 GB (dual layer) on a single sided disc - about 5 to 10 times the capacity of a DVD. BD-ROM Discs also support the highest quality HD video available in the industry (up to 1920 x 1080) - Large capacity means no compromise on video quality. Furthermore, a BD-ROM disc has the same familiar size and look as DVD.

- The following BD-ROM disc features are disc dependent and will vary.
- Appearance and navigation of features will also vary from disc to disc.
- Not all discs will have the features described below.
- BD-ROM, Hybrid disc have both BD-ROM and DVD (or CD) layers on one side. On such discs, BD-ROM layer will be only played back in this player.

Video highlights

The BD-ROM format for movie distribution supports three highly advanced video codecs, including MPEG-2, MPEG4 AVC (H.264), and SMPTE VC1. HD video resolutions are also available:

- 1920 x 1080 HD
- 1280 x 720 HD

Graphic planes

Two individual, full HD resolution (1920x1080) graphic planes (layers) are available, on top of the HD video layer. One plane is assigned to video-related, frame accurate graphics (like subtitles), and the other plane is assigned to interactive graphic elements, such as buttons or menus. For both planes, various wipes, fades and scroll effects may be available.

For High-Definition Playback

To view high-definition contents from BD-ROM discs, an HDTV is required. Some discs may require HDMI OUT for viewing of high-definition contents. Ability to view high-definition contents in BD-ROM discs may be limited depending on the resolution of your TV.

Menu sounds

When you highlight or select a menu option, sounds can be heard such as button clicks or a voice-over explaining the highlighted menu choice.

Multi-page/PopUp Menus

With DVD-Video, playback is interrupted each time a new menu screen is accessed. Due to BD-ROM disc's ability to preload data from the disc without interrupting playback, a menu can consist of several pages.

You can browse through the menu pages or select different menu paths, while the audio and video remain playing in the background.

Interactivity

Certain BD-ROM Discs may contain animated menus and/or trivia games.

User Browsable Slideshows

With BD-ROM Discs, you can browse through various still pictures while the audio remains playing.

Subtitles

Depending on what is contained on the BD-ROM disc, you may be able to select different font styles, sizes and colours for some subtitles. Subtitles may also be animated, scrolled or faded in and out.

BD-J Interactive Capability

The BD-ROM format supports Java for interactive functions. "BD-J" offers content providers almost unlimited functionality when creating interactive BD-ROM titles.

BD-ROM Disc Compatibility

This player supports BD-ROM Profile 2.

- Discs supporting BD-Live (BD-ROM version 2 Profile 2) that allows interactive functions to be used when this unit is connected to the Internet in addition to the BONUSVIEW function.
- Discs supporting BONUSVIEW (BD-ROM version 2 Profile 1 version 1.1/Final Standard Profile) that allows Virtual packages or Picture-in-Picture functions to be used.

Regional Code

This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only BD-ROM or DVD discs labeled same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".

AVCHD (Advanced Video Codec High Definition)

- This player can playback AVCHD format discs. These discs are normally recorded and used in camcorders.
- The AVCHD format is a high definition digital video camera format.
- The MPEG-4 AVC/H.264 format is capable of compressing images at higher efficiency than that of the conventional image compressing format.
- Some AVCHD discs use the "x.v.Colour" format.
- This player can playback AVCHD discs using "x.v.Colour" format.
- Some AVCHD format discs may not play, depending on the recording condition.
- AVCHD format discs need to be finalized.
- "x.v.Colour" offers a wider colour range than normal DVD camcorder discs.

Compatibility Notes

- Because BD-ROM is a new format, certain disc, digital connection and other compatibility issues are possible. If you experience compatibility problems, please contact an authorized Customer Service Centre.
- Viewing high-definition content and up-converting standard DVD content may require a HDMI-capable input or HDCP-capable DVI input on your display device.
- Some BD-ROM and DVD discs may restrict the use of some operation commands or features.
- Dolby TrueHD, Dolby Digital Plus and DTS-HD are supported with maximum 7.1 channels if you use HDMI connection for the audio output of the unit.
- You can use a USB Flash Drive that is used to store some disc related information, including downloaded on-line content. The disc you are using will control how long this information is retained.

Certain System Requirements

For high definition video playback:

- High definition display that has COMPONENT or HDMI input jacks.
- BD-ROM disc with high definition content.
- HDMI or HDCP capable DVI input on your display device is required for some content (as specified by disc authors).
- For up-conversion of standard definition DVD, a HDMI or HDCP capable DVI input on your display device is required for copy protected content.

For Dolby® Digital Plus, Dolby TrueHD and DTS-HD multi-channel audio playback:

- An amplifier/receiver with a built-in (Dolby Digital, Dolby Digital Plus, Dolby TrueHD, DTS or DTS-HD) decoder.

Important Notice for TV colour system

The colour system of this player differs according to currently playing discs or video contents (YouTube, etc.).

For example, when the player plays back the disc recorded in the NTSC colour system, the image is outputted as a NTSC signal.

Only the multi system colour TV can receive all signals outputted from the player.


Notes:

- If you have a PAL colour system TV, you will see just distorted images when using discs or video contents recorded in NTSC.
- The multi system colour TV changes the colour system automatically according to input signals. In case that the colour system is not changed automatically, turn it off and then on to see normal images on screen.
- Even if the disc and video contents (Youtube, etc.) recorded in NTSC colour system are well displayed on your TV, these may not be recorded correctly on your recorder.

Controlling a TV with the Supplied Remote Control

You can control the volume, input source, and power state of your TV with the supplied Remote Control.

You can control your TV using the buttons below.



By pressing	You can
TV POWER	Turn the TV on or off.
AV	Switch the TV's input source between the TV and other input sources.
PR +/-	Scan up or down through memorized channels.
VOL +/-	Adjust the volume of the TV.

Note:

Depending on the unit being connected, you may not be able to control your TV using some of the buttons.

To programme the remote to control the TV using the manufacturer code


If your TV is listed in the table on the next page, set the appropriate manufacturer code.

- 1 While holding down TV POWER button, press the number buttons to select the manufacturer code for your TV (see page 59-61).
 - If more than one code number is listed, try entering them one at a time until you find the one that works with your TV.
- 2 Release TV POWER button.

Notes:

- Depending on your TV, some or all buttons may not function on the TV, even after entering the correct manufacturer code.
- If you enter a new code number, the code number previously entered will be erased.
- When you replace the batteries of the remote, the code number you have set may be reset to the default setting. Set the appropriate code number again.

Front panel



1 Disc Tray

Inserts a disc here.

2 OPEN/CLOSE (▲)

Opens or closes the disc tray.

Starts playback.

Pause playback or recording temporarily, press again to exit pause mode.



Connect the supplied power cord.

2 HDMI OUT (1080p)

Connect to TV with HDMI inputs. (Interface for digital audio and video)

Connect a network with an always-on broadband connection.

4 AV2 (DECODER) (SCART JACK)

Connect the audio/video output of an external source (Pay-TV decoder, Set Top Box, VCR, etc.).

5 COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (Y PB PR)

Connect to a TV with Y Pb Pr inputs.

Connect the aerial to this terminal.

Connections to Your TV

Make one of the following connections, depending on the capabilities of your existing equipment.

Tip:

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the player. Use only one of the connections described below.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.

Cautions:

- Make sure the player is connected directly to the TV. Tune the TV to the correct video input channel.
- Do not connect the player's AUDIO OUT jack to the phono in jack (record player) of your audio system.
- Do not connect your player via your VCR. The image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

Antenna connection


Connect the Terrestrial TV antenna **(A)** to the ANTENNA IN jack on the unit. If you want to use an indoor antenna, use one with a signal amplifier rated at 5V, 100mA and set [Antenna Feed 5V] to [ON] in the setup menu (See page 28).

Antenna connection to your TV

Connect one end of the RF cable **(R)** to ANTENNA OUT(TO TV) jack on the unit and other end to ANTENNA IN jack on your TV. Passes the signal from the ANTENNA IN jack to your TV/monitor.

HDMI Connection

If you have a HDMI TV or monitor, you can connect it to this unit using a HDMI cable **(H)**. Connect the HDMI jack on the player to the HDMI jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor. Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).



Notes:

- You must select a HDMI audio output and a maximum sampling frequency that your TV accepts using [HDMI] and [Sampling Freq.] options on the [Setup] menu (see page 41).
- If a connected HDMI device does not accept the audio output of the unit, the HDMI device's audio sound may be distorted or may not output.

Tips:

- When you use HDMI connection, you can change the resolution for the HDMI output. (Refer to "Resolution Setting" on page 20-21.)
- Select the type of video output from the HDMI OUT jack using [HDMI Color Setting] option on the [Setup] menu (see page 39-40).

Cautions:

- Changing the resolution when the connection has already been established may result in malfunctions. To solve the problem, turn off the player and then turn it on again.
- When the HDMI connection with HDCP is not verified, TV screen is changed to black screen. In this case, check the HDMI connection, or disconnect the HDMI cable.
- If there is noise or lines on the screen, please check the HDMI cable (length is generally limited to 4.5m).

Additional Information for HDMI

- When you connect a HDMI or DVI compatible device make sure of the following:
 - Try switching off the HDMI/DVI device and this player. Next, switch on the HDMI/DVI device and leave it for around 30 seconds, then switch on this player.
 - The connected device's video input is set correctly for this unit.
 - The connected device is compatible with 720x576p, 1280x720p, 1920x1080i or 1920x1080p video input.
- Not all HDCP-compatible HDMI or DVI devices will work with this player.
 - The picture will not be displayed properly with non-HDCP device.
 - This player does not playback and TV screen is changed to black screen.

General about connection**Picture and sound**

Digital TV is a transmission technology that replaces the traditional analogue technique.

This means that several TV channels, radio channels and other digital services can be transmitted on the same space as just one channel took up before. As a consumer you get access to many more channels and services than before at the same time as they are received with perfect picture and audio quality.

Coverage

Before buying this product it is anticipated that you have made sure that there are digital transmissions covering your region.

Antenna / Signal source

Depending on the reception your unit may be connected to a simple indoor antenna or to an existing outdoor antenna system. If you live in a flat you should make sure that the digital terrestrial signals are distributed to your wall antenna outlet. If you have your own antenna system you must make sure that it is equipped with antennas, filter and/or amplifier that can handle those frequencies that the digital channels are transmitted on.


Cable-TV

Please observe that this unit is not designed for the reception of regular digital cable-TV signals (QAM-signal). Despite this, operators of smaller cable networks may have chosen to distribute the digital terrestrial signals (COFDM-signal) in the network. In this case this unit may well be used.

Check with your landlord if you are insecure about what type of TV-signal that is provided in the wall antenna outlet.

SCART connection

Connect one end of the scart cable into the AV1 SCART jack (**S**) on the unit and other end to the corresponding in jack on your TV. You can get Audio and Video signals together with this connection.




Component Video Connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks (**C**) on the player to the corresponding input jacks on the TV using Y Pb Pr cables. Connect the left and right AUDIO OUT jacks (**A**) of the player to the audio left and right IN jacks on the TV using the audio cables.



Connecting a PAY-TV/Canal Plus Decoder

Digital Multi-channel sound

A digital multi-channel connection provides the best sound quality. For this you need a multi-channel Audio/Video Receiver that supports one or more of the audio formats supported by your player. Check the receiver manual and the logos on the front of the receiver. (PCM Stereo, PCM Multi-Ch, Dolby Digital, Dolby Digital Plus, Dolby TrueHD, DTS and/or DTS-HD)

Tip:

Connect the amplifier's HDMI output jack to HDMI input jack on your TV using a HDMI cable (**H2**) if your amplifier has HDMI output jack.

To access the Lock System or DTV Rating, you must enter the 4-digit password. If a password is not set on this unit, you must set the password in the Disc Setup settings (page 42).

If not, Lock System and DTV Rating are not activated.

If you do not remember your password, refer to the "If you forget your password" on page 42.

Lock System – Allows you to set up specific programs and ratings through blocking schemes. Also allows you to activate or disable all of the lock schemes previously set up. A password is required to gain access to the lock menu options. When the Lock System is set to [OFF], the [DTV Rating] is not effective.


DTV Rating – You can set the rating to block out all the programs with rating above a specified level.

[No Control]: You can view all programs.

[04 Years] – [18 Years]: Rating [04 Years] has the most restrictions and [18 Years] is the least restrictive.

[Lock All]: All programs are locked. To view a program, you must input the 4-digit password you have created.

Adjust the recording settings



Rec Mode Set – Select the picture quality for recording from XP, SP, LP, EP or MLP. See recording time of each mode on page 66.

[XP]: Highest picture quality.

[SP]: Standard picture quality.

[LP]: Slightly lower picture quality than [SP] mode.

[EP]: Low picture quality.

[MLP]: The longest recording time with the lowest picture quality.

Rec Aspect – This option sets the recording aspect ratio to suit the material you are recording on HDD.

TV Rec Audio – Select an audio channel to record when recording a bilingual program.

[Main+Sub]: Main language and sub language

[Main]: Main language only

[Sub]: Sub language only

AV2 Recording – Selects a method of inputting video signals for the AV2(DECODER) jack. The picture will not be clear if this setting does not match the type of the video input signal.

[Auto]: The video input signal will automatically follow the video signal received.

[CVBS]: Inputs CVBS(composite) video signals.

[RGB]: Inputs RGB signals.

[S-VIDEO]: Inputs S-Video signals.

Time Shift – Set this option to [ON] make this unit to use the Time Shift function automatically without pressing TIME SHIFT button. The timeshift will start in 5-10 seconds after TV tuner mode is started.

The digital EPG shows a table of scheduled digital TV programs and detailed information about individual program. The digital EPG screen consist of program information, channel list and general program list. Note that the unit's clock must be set to the correct time and date to ensure all relevant EPG information is displayed.

Displaying the detailed Information window


You can view detailed information for the highlighted program. Press blue color button to display detailed information window. To exit the detail information window, press blue color button again.



Switching the EPG menu

The EPG screen provides two search menus. Press yellow color button when the EPG menu is displayed.

- Now/Next: The screen shows now and next programs.



- 8 Days: The screen shows programs within 8 days. When the EPG menu with 8 days is displayed, you can also change the date of the EPG menu by pressing the green color button then use ◀/▶ to select a date.




You can set a timer record using EPG menu with 8 days. Select a program then press red color button. The red timer icon will be displayed and the program will be memorized by the unit.

You can check the programming on the [Timer Record List] menu (see page 32). To cancel the timer recording, select the program then press red color button. The red timer icon disappears.

Viewing a Teletext service

Teletext is a free broadcasting service by some TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programs, share prices and many other topics.

The unit gives you access to teletext which is greatly improved in various aspects such as text and graphics. This teletext can be accessed by special teletext services and specific services which broadcast teletext.



Use numbered (0-9) buttons on the remote control to change the program which broadcast teletext. Press TEXT to access on the teletext. Follow the indications on teletext and move onto the next or previous step by pressing color (RED or GREEN) or SKIP (◀◀ / ▶▶) buttons. Press TEXT or RETURN (↵) to turn the teletext off and return to TV viewing.

Selecting teletext page

Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the numbered buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then enter the correct page number again. Use RED/GREEN buttons to move up and down pages.

Recording

Follow the instruction below to record a TV channel or other source. The recording continues until the media is full, you stop the recording or the progress of recording is more than 12 hours.



Changing TV audio channel

Before recording, you can change the TV audio channel for stereo and bilingual broadcast. Press AUDIO repeatedly to change the audio channel. The current audio channel is displayed on-screen. Set the [TV Rec Audio] option in the SETUP menu when recoding a bilingual broadcast.

Instant timer recording

Instant timer recording allow you to make a recording of preset length easily.



When the REC (●) is first pressed, recording starts. Press REC (●) repeatedly to select a certain amount of time. Each press of REC (●) to displays the increased recording time on-screen. You can set the instant timer recording up to 240 minutes on HDD.

Note:

The unit will automatically power off when the Instant Timer Recording ends in HDD mode.

Setting a timer record

This unit can be programmed to record up to 16 timer recordings within a month. The clock must be set correctly before setting a timer.



Press HOME and select Home Menu option. Press ◀▶ to select the [Timer Record List] and press ENTER to display [Timer record List] menu. Use ▲▼ to select [New] and press ENTER to display [Timer Record] menu. Adjust the each field as described below using ▲▼◀▶.

[CH]: Choose a memorized program number, or one of the external inputs from which to record. (You cannot select DV input and radio channel.)

[Date]: Choose a date up to 1 month in advance.

[Start Time]: Set the start time.

[End Time]: Set the end time.

[Repeat]: Choose a desired repeat (Once, Daily (Mon-Fri), or Weekly).

Recordings from EPG menu will always be set to [Once].

Press REC (●) repeatedly to set the recording mode (XP, SP, LP, EP or MLP) then press ENTER to set a timer recording. The "Rec OK" on the [Check] field on the [Timer Record List] menu indicates the timer recording is programmed correctly.



Canceling a timer recording

You can cancel a timer record before the timer recording actually starts. Select a timer recording that you want to cancel on the [Timer Record List] menu and press CLEAR.

Timer Recording Troubleshooting

Even though the timer is set, the unit will not record when:

- There is no free space on the HDD.
- A non-recordable is not free space on the HDD.
- The unit is under operating (recording, deleting etc.).
- There are already 255 titles recorded on the HDD.

You cannot enter a timer program when:

- A recording is already underway.
- The time you're trying to set has already passed.
- There are already 16 timer programs set.

If two or more timer programs overlap:

- The earlier program takes priority.
- When the earlier program finishes, the later program starts.
- If two programs are set to start at exactly the same time, the program entered first takes priority.

Time Slip

You can watch the title that you are currently recording to HDD with this function. After the recording is progressed over 15 seconds, press PLAY (▶) to playback the title that you are currently recoding. If you stop playback the title, returns to the current recording position. If you want to stop recording without stopping the current playback, press and hold STOP (■) more than two seconds.

Recording From an external inputs

You can record from an external component, such as a camcorder or VCR, connected to any of the unit external inputs. Each press of the AV changes the input source as described below. Make sure that the component you want to record from is connected properly to the unit before recording an external source.

- Tuner: Built-in tuner
- AV1: AV1 scart jack mounted on back panel
- AV2: AV2 DECODER scart jack mounted on back panel
- AV3: AV IN 3 (VIDEO, AUDIO (L/R)) mounted on the front panel

Using time shift function

This feature allows you to pause or rewind live TV, so you do not miss a thing if you were interrupted.

Press TIME SHIFT then press PAUSE (⏸) while watching live broadcast before answering the phone. The timeshift function will record the broadcast of later viewing. Before using this function, make sure that the unit is in HDD mode.

If no button is pressed for 6 hours, the timeshift will stop automatically. You can use trick play functions (slow, scan, etc.) during timeshift. Refer to playback operation on page 41-43.

Stop timeshift by pressing STOP (■) and confirm by pressing ENTER. You will returned to watch a broadcast in real time.

Jump to start or end during timeshift

Press ENTER to show progress bar during timeshift. Press ◀ to jump to the beginning and ▶ to jump to the end of the timeshift.

Clip recording

If you want to record a timeshifted program as a title, press REC (●) at the starting point and ending point you want to record. The timeshift progress bar indicates a clip that you select with red bar. You can make more clips by repeating this instruction. The clips will be recorded when you exit the timeshift function.

Using time shift function automatically

If the [Time Shift] option in the Channel Setup menu is set to [ON], timeshift starts automatically without pressing TIME SHIFT button in HDD mode.

If you want to quit the timeshift function, set the [Time Shift] function to [OFF].

Editing a title

Using the Title list menu, you can edit video contents.




Chapter search **HDD**

You can select the start of a title by searching a chapter. Select a title that you want to search and press ENTER. Select [Chapter] in the [Search] option from the menu on the left of the screen, and press ENTER to display the [Chapter List] menu.

Use ▲▼◀▶ to find the chapter you want to start playback, and press PLAY to start playback.

Time search **HDD**

Combining titles **HDD**

Use this function to merge the selected title with another title. Select a title and press ENTER. Select [Combine] in the [Edit] option then press ENTER. Select a title you want to combine with current title and press ENTER to confirm.

Dividing a title **HDD**

Use this function to split a title up into two titles. Select a title that you want to divide and press ENTER. Select [Divide] in the [Edit] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the [Divide] menu. Find the point you want to divide a title using PLAY (▶), SCAN (◀◀ / ▶▶), PAUSE (||) buttons and press ENTER while [Divide] option is selected. The playback screen shows the divided point. Select [Done] option and press ENTER to divide. You cannot select dividing point less than 3 seconds.

Deleting a part **HDD**

You can delete a part which you do not want in the title.

Select a title that you want to delete part and press ENTER. Select [Delete Part] in the [Edit] option from the menu on the left of the screen and press ENTER to display the [Delete part] menu. You can find the point using PLAY (▶), SCAN (◀◀ / ▶▶), PAUSE (||) buttons.

[Start Point]: Select starting point of a part that you want to delete then press ENTER.

[End Point]: Select ending point of a part that you want to delete then press ENTER.

[Next Part]: Press ENTER to delete the additional part.

[Cancel]: Press ENTER to cancel the selected part.

Naming a title **HDD**

[OK]: Finish the naming.

[Cancel]: Cancels all entered characters.

TV Aspect Ratio

[4:3 Letter Box] – Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected. Displays theatrical images with masking bars above and below the picture.

[4:3 Pan Scan] – Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected. Displays pictures cropped to fill your TV screen. Both sides of the picture are cut off.

[16:9 Original] – Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected. The 4:3 picture is displayed with an original 4:3 aspect ratio, with black bars appearing at the left and right sides.

[16:9 Wide] – Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected. The 4:3 picture is adjusted horizontally (in a linear proportion) to fill the entire screen.

Resolution

Sets the output resolution of the Component and HDMI video signal. Refer to “Resolution Setting” on page 20-21 for details about the resolution.

[Auto] – If the HDMI OUT jack is connected for TVs providing display information (EDID), automatically selects the resolution best suited to the connected TV. If the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT is only connected, this changes the resolution to 1080i as default resolution.

[1080p] – Outputs 1080 lines of progressive video.

[1080i] – Outputs 1080 lines of interlaced video.

[720p] – Outputs 720 lines of progressive video.

[576p] – Outputs 576 lines progressive video.

[576i] – Outputs 576 lines of interlaced video.

1080p Display Mode

When the resolution is set to 1080p, select [24Hz] for smooth presentation of film material (1080/24p) with a HDMI-equipped display compatible with 1080/24p input.

Notes:

- When you select [24Hz], you may experience some picture disturbance when the video switches video and film material. In this case, select [50Hz].
- Even when [1080p Display Mode] is set to [24Hz], if your TV is not compatible with 1080/24p, the actual frame frequency of the video output will be 50Hz or 60Hz to match the video source format.



[PCM Stereo] – Select if you connect this unit's HDMI OUT or DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack to a device with two-channel digital stereo decoder.

[PCM Multi-Ch] (HDMI only) – Select if you connect this unit's HDMI OUT jack to a device with multi-channel digital decoder.

[DTS Re-Encode] – Select if you connect this unit's HDMI OUT or DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack to a device with DTS decoder.

When [HDMI] option is set to [PCM Multi-Ch], the audio may output as PCM Stereo if the PCM Multi-Ch information is not detected from HDMI device with EDID.

Sampling Freq. (Only for SPDIF audio)

[192KHz] – Select this if your A/V Receiver or Amplifier is capable of handling 192 KHz signals.

[96KHz] – Select this if your A/V Receiver or Amplifier is NOT capable of handling 192 KHz signals. When this choice is made, this unit automatically converts any 192 KHz signals to 96 KHz so your system can decode them.

[48KHz] – Select this if your A/V Receiver or Amplifier is NOT capable of handling 192 KHz and 96 KHz signal. When this choice is made, this unit automatically converts any 192 KHz and 96 KHz signals to 48 KHz so your system can decode them.


Check the documentation for your A/V Receiver or Amplifier to verify its capabilities.

DRC (Dynamic Range Control)

When a disc encoded in Dolby Digital or Dolby Digital Plus is playing back, you may wish to compress the dynamic range of the audio output (the difference between the loudest sounds and the quietest ones). This allows you to listen to a movie at a lower volume without losing clarity of sound. Set DRC to [On] for this effect.

[LOCK] Menu (Parental Control)

The [LOCK] settings affect only BD and DVD playback.



To access the any features in [LOCK] settings, you must enter the 4-digit security code you have created.
If you have not entered a password yet, you are prompted to do so. Enter a 4-digit password and press ENTER. Enter it again and press ENTER to verify.

Password

You can create, change or delete the password.

[New] – Enter a 4-digit password and press ENTER. Enter it again and press ENTER to create a new password.

[Change] – Enter the current password and press ENTER. Enter a 4-digit password and press ENTER. Enter it again and press ENTER to create a new password.

[Delete] – Enter the 4-digit password and press ENTER to delete the password.

Tip:

If you make a mistake before pressing ENTER, press ◀ to delete a number one by one.

If you forget your password

If you forget your password, you can clear it using the following steps:

- 1** Remove any disc that might be in the player.
- 2** Select [LOCK] option in the [Setup] menu.
- 3** Use Number buttons to enter “210499”. The password is cleared.

Rating

Blocks playback of rated disc based on their content. (Not all discs are rated.)

[Rating 1-8] – Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

[Unlock] – If you select unlock, parental control is not active and the disc plays in full.

BD Age

Set an age limit of BD-ROM play. Use number buttons to input an age limit for BD-ROM viewing.

[255] – All BD-ROM can be played.

[0-254] – Prohibits play of BD-ROM with corresponding ratings recorded on them.

Area Code

Enter the code of the area whose standards were used to rate the DVD video disc, based on the list on page 62.

[NETWORK] Menu


The [NETWORK] settings are needed to use the software update, BD Live and YouTube features.

Some BD-ROM discs may enable you to access special BD-ROM sites, if you connect the player to the Internet. For example, if a BD-ROM site includes content such as links to future movie trailers, you can watch the downloaded on-line content on the player.

You do not need to connect to a PC to use this function.

Preparations:

- This feature requires an always-on broadband internet connection. (see page 22-23.)
- A BD-ROM disc compatible with this feature is required. Not all BD-ROM discs are compatible.



IP Mode

If there is a DHCP server on the local area network (LAN), this player will automatically be allocated an IP address. If you're using a broadband router or broadband modem that has a DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol) server function, select [Dynamic IP]. The IP address will automatically be determined.

If there is no DHCP server on the network and you want to set the IP address manually, select [Static IP] then set the [IP Address], [Subnet Mask], [Gateway] and [DNS Server] using [IP Setting] option.

How to check the network configuration

Select [IP Mode] option and check the Network status indicator shown above the menu. (The Network status indicator changes according to Network configuration.)

IP Setting

This option is available only if [IP Mode] option is set to [Static IP].

Use the ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ buttons to select a field; use the number buttons to enter a value. Press ENTER when [OK] is highlighted to finish and exit the screen.

BD-LIVE connection

You can restrict Internet access when BD-Live functions are used.

[Permitted] – Internet access is permitted for all BD-Live contents.

[Partially permitted] – Internet access is permitted only for BD-Live contents which have content owner certificates. Internet access and AACS Online functions are prohibited for all BD-Live contents without a certificate.

[Prohibited] – Internet access is prohibited for all BD-Live contents.

[OTHERS] Menu



Skin

Changes the background of the initial screen.

Java Font Size **BD**

You can adjust the default text size displayed for the BD-J contents during BD-ROM playback.

This setting is only valid when BD-J contents do not set the size of text. Please select a font size bigger than 24 when the player is connected with a HD TV.

Initialize

You can reset the player to its original factory settings or initialize the BD storage.

[Factory Set] – If you need to, you can reset the player to all its factory settings. Some options cannot be reset. (Rating, Password and Area Code, etc.)

[BD Storage Clear] – Initializes the BD contents from the connected USB Flash Drive.

Software Update

You can update the software by connecting the unit directly to the software update server (see page 58).

DivX Registration Code

DivX® is a digital video format created by DivX, Inc. This is an official DivX Certified or DivX Ultra Certified device that plays DivX video. This DivX® Certified device must be registered in order to play DivX Video-on-Demand (VOD) content. First generate the DivX VOD registration code for your device and submit it during the registration process. [Important: DivX VOD content is protected by a DivX DRM (Digital Rights Management) system that restricts playback to registered DivX Certified devices. If you try to play DivX VOD content not authorized for your device, the message "Authorization Error" will be displayed and your content will not play.] Learn more at www.divx.com/vod.

Press ENTER or ► when [DivX Reg. Code] is highlighted and you can view the registration code of the unit.

Note:

All the downloaded videos from DivX® VOD can only be played back on this unit.

Disclaimer Notice

Press ENTER or ► to view the notice of Network Service Disclaimer on page 67.

Play a disc

Notes:

- When you turn on the player or replace a disc, the player returns to the initial default setting. Depending on the disc, a specific type of audio that the disc has is output.
- Depending on the pre-recorded contents of the BD-ROM, some functions may not be available or may be operated differently than other media.

If a disc menu screen is displayed

BD DVD AVCHD DivX

The menu screen may be displayed first after loading a disc which contains a menu.

Use ◀ / ▶ / ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the title/chapter you want to view, then press ENTER to start playback.

Skip to the next/previous chapter/track/file **ALL**

During playback, press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to go to the next chapter/track/file or to return to the beginning of the current chapter/track/file.

Press ◀◀ twice briefly to step back to the previous chapter/track/file.

Resume playback **BD DVD AVCHD DivX**

During playback, press STOP (■) to stop playback.

The unit records the stopped point, depending on the disc. "■■■" appears on the screen briefly. Press PLAY (▶) to resume playback (from the scene point). If you press STOP (■) again or unload the disc ("■" appears on the screen.), the unit will clear the stopped point. (■■■ = **Resume Stop**, ■ = **Complete Stop**)

Notes:

- The resume point may be cleared when a button is pressed (for example; POWER, OPEN/CLOSE, etc).
- On BD-Video discs including BD-J, the resume play function does not work.

Fast forward or fast reverse **ALL**

Press SCAN (◀◀ or ▶▶) to play fast forward or fast reverse during playback. You can change the various playback speeds by pressing SCAN (◀◀ or ▶▶) repeatedly. Press PLAY (▶) to continue play at normal speed.

Playing repeatedly **ALL**

During playback, press REPEAT repeatedly to select a desired repeat mode. The current title, chapter or track will be played back repeatedly. To return to normal playback, press REPEAT repeatedly to select [Off].

Note:

If you press ►► once during Repeat Chapter/Track playback, the repeat playback cancels.

Repeating a specific portion (A-B)

BD DVD AVCHD DivX ACD

Press REPEAT to select [A-] at the beginning of the portion you wish to repeat and press ENTER at the end of the portion. Your selected portion will be repeated continually. You cannot select a portion less than 3 seconds. To return to normal playback, press REPEAT repeatedly to select [OFF].

Enlarge the playback image **DVD AVCHD DivX**

During playback or pause mode, press ZOOM to display the [Zoom] menu. Use ◀ / ▶ to select zoom mode (16 steps). Press RETURN to exit the [Zoom] menu.

To return to the normal picture size, select [Off] on the [ZOOM] menu.

Note:

This function may not work on some disc or titles.

Viewing the Title menu or Popup menu

BD DVD

Press TITLE/POPUP to displays the title menu or popup menu. If the current DVD or BD-ROM disc has a menu, the Title menu or Popup menu appears on the screen. Depending on the disc, the menu may not be available.

Using the search menu **BD DVD AVCHD DivX**

During playback, press SEARCH to display the search menu.

Press ◀ / ▶ to skip the playback 15 seconds forward or backward.

Tip:

You can select a point that you want to skip by pressing and holding ◀ / ▶ button.

Marker Search **BD DVD AVCHD DivX**

To enter a Marker

You can start playback from up to nine memorized points. To enter a marker, press MARKER at the desired point on the disc. The Marker icon appears on the TV screen briefly. Repeat to enter up to nine markers.

To Recall or Clear a Marked Scene

Press SEARCH and the search menu appears on the screen.

Press a number button to select a marker number that you want to recall. Playback starts from the marked scene.

OR

Press ▼ to highlight a marker number. Use ◀ / ▶ to select a marked scene that you want to recall or clear.

During playback, press SUBTITLE to switch the subtitle on or off and press SUBTITLE repeatedly to select a desired subtitle language.

Use ▲ ▼ to select the [Subtitle] option then use ◀ ▶ to select desired subtitle language.

Notes:

Some discs allow you to change subtitle selections only via the disc menu. If this is the case, press TITLE/POPUP or MENU/LIST button and choose the appropriate subtitle from the selections on the disc menu.

Hearing a different audio

BD DVD AVCHD DivX

During playback, press AUDIO repeatedly to hear a different audio language, audio track or audio channel.

OR

During playback, press DISPLAY to display the playback menu.

Use ▲ ▼ to select the [Audio] option then use ◀ ▶ to select desired audio language, audio track or audio channel.

Notes:

- Some discs allow you to change audio selections only via the disc menu. If this is the case, press TITLE/POPUP or MENU/LIST button and choose the appropriate audio from the selections on the disc menu.
- Immediately after you have switched sound, there may be a temporary discrepancy between the display and actual sound.
- On BD-ROM disc, the multi audio format (5.1CH or 7.1CH) is displayed with [MultiCH] in the on-screen display.

Using coloured (A, B, C, D) Buttons **BD**

These buttons are available only during BD-J contents playback. Use the appropriate buttons as indicated by the display. Depending on the disc contents, the functions of each button may differ.

Last Scene Memory **BD DVD**

This unit memorizes the last scene from the last disc that is viewed. The last scene remains in memory even if you remove the disc from the unit or switch off the unit. If you load a disc that has the scene memorized, the scene is automatically recalled.

Notes:

- Settings are stored in memory for use any time.
- This unit does not memorize settings of a disc if you switch off the unit before commencing to play it.
- Last Scene Memory function for a previous disc is erased once a different disc is played.
- This function may not work depending on the disc.

Screen Saver

The screen saver appears when you leave the player in Stop mode for about five minutes.

For example, to find a scene at 2 hours, 10 minutes, and 20 seconds, enter “21020” and press ENTER. If you enter the wrong numbers, press CLEAR and enter the correct numbers.

Watching from a different angle **BD DVD**

If the disc contains scenes recorded at different camera angles, you can change to a different camera angle during playback.

This unit allows you to enjoy functions such as picture-in-picture, secondary audio and Virtual packages, etc., with BD-Video supporting BONUSVIEW (BD-ROM version 2 Profile 1 version 1.1/ Final Standard Profile). In addition to the BONUSVIEW function, BD-Video supporting BD-Live (BD-ROM version 2 Profile 2) that has a network extension function allows you to enjoy more functions such as online games by connecting this unit to the Internet.

Enjoying BD-Live discs with Internet

This unit supports BD-Live, a new BD-Video function that allows you to use the following interactive functions when connected to the Internet. (The usable functions and the operating method may vary with each disc. For details, refer to the instructions for the disc.)

- Additional contents such as movie's trailer, subtitles and BD-J, etc. can be downloaded to the USB Flash Drive to play them.
- Special video data, etc. may be played back while they are being downloaded to a USB Flash Drive.

Preparations:

- The unit must be connected to the Internet and set up to use the BD-Live functions (see page 22 and 43).
- A USB Flash Drive is required to use this function. Connect a USB Flash Drive (see page 24).
- The free space in the USB Flash Drive must be more than 1GB.

Caution:

Do not extract the connected USB device while content is being downloaded or a Blu-ray disc is still in the disc tray. Doing so may damage the connected USB device and BD-Live features may not operate properly with the damaged USB device anymore.

If the connected USB device seems damaged from such an action, you can format the connected USB device from the PC and reuse it with this player.

Notes:

- Discs may not always be played back according to the settings on this unit, as certain playback formats are prioritized on certain discs.



When the USB Flash Drive is connected and a disc is inserted simultaneously, the menu for selecting a media will appear. Select a media then press ENTER.


Tips:

- To go directly to a specific file, enter the file number using the numbered buttons (0-9).
- You can advance to the previous or next file by pressing ◀◀ or ▶▶ during viewing a photo file in full screen.
- You can start the slide show by pressing PLAY (▶) while the [PHOTO] menu appears.

- Select a folder then press ENTER and you can view the files in the folder. If you want to move to the upper directory, use ▲/▼/◀/▶ to highlight [UP Folder] and press ENTER.
- On the [PHOTO] menu, use red or blue button to move to the previous or next page.
- If there is impossible code to express in the file name, it may be displayed as illegible.

Options during viewing a photo file in full screen





Step 3: Updating Software

Cautions:

- Before updating the software in your player, remove any disc and USB Flash Drive from the player.
- Before updating the software in your player, turn the player off and then turn it back on.
- **During the software update procedure, do not turn off the player or disconnect AC power, or do not press any button.**
- If you cancel the update, turn off the power and turn it on for stable performance.
- This unit cannot be updated to previous software version.

1. Select [Software Update] option in the [Setup] menu then press ► or ENTER.
2. The player will check for the newest update.

Caution: Pressing ENTER while checking for the update will end the process.

Note: If there is no update available, the Message, "No update is found." appears. Press ENTER to return to the [Home Menu].

3. If newer version exists, the message "A new update was found. Do you want to download it?" appears.
4. Select OK to download the update. (Selecting [CANCEL] will end the update.)

5. The player starts downloading the newest update from the server. (Downloading will take about 80 seconds at the network speed of 4Mbps Speed.)
6. When downloading is completed, the message, "Download is complete. Do you want to update?" appears.
7. Select OK to start updating. (Selecting [CANCEL] will end the update and downloaded file will not be re-usable. To update software the next time, the software update procedure has to be started from the beginning again.)

Caution: Do not turn off the power during the software update.

Note: If the software includes the driver update, disc tray may open during the process.

8. When update is completed, the message, "Update is complete." will appear, and the power will turn off automatically after 5 seconds.
9. Turn the power back on. The system now operates with the new version.
10. After completing the update process, repeat procedures 1-4 in Step 4 and check if there are no more updates available.
