STAND INSTALLATION

- When assembling the desk type stand, check whether the bolt is fully tightened. (If not tightened fully, the product can tilt forward after the product installation.) If you tighten the bolt with excessive force, the bolt can deviate from abrasion of the tightening part of the bolt.

Attaching the TV to a desk (Except for 22LF15R)

The TV must be attached to desk so it cannot be pulled in a forward/backward direction, potentially causing injury or damaging the product. Use only an attached screw.

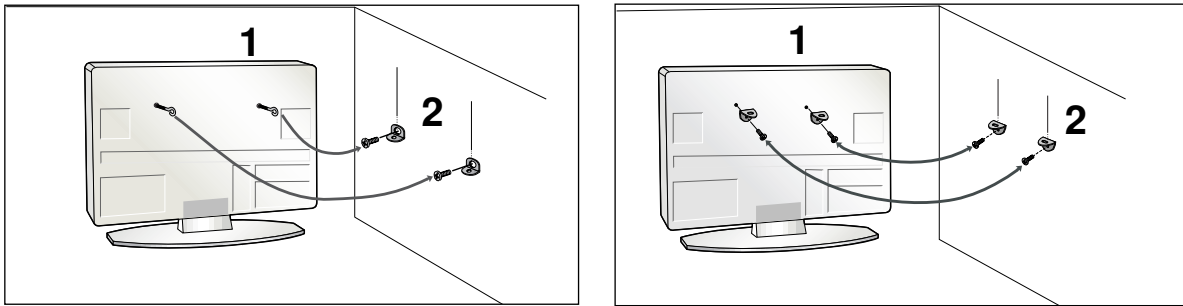

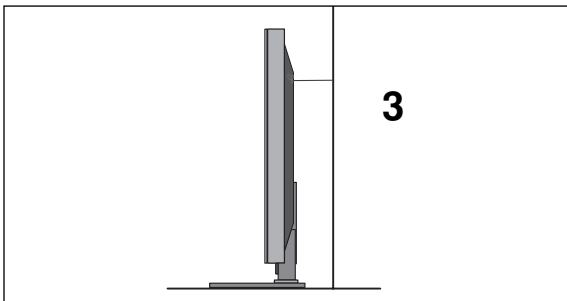
- ▶ To prevent TV from falling over, the TV should be securely attached to the floor/wall per installation instructions. Tipping, shaking, or rocking the machine may cause injury.

CAREFUL INSTALLATION ADVICE

- You should purchase necessary components to fix the TV safely and secure to the wall from a hardware supplier.
- Position the TV close to the wall to avoid the possibility of it falling when pushed.
- The instructions shown below are a safer way to set up the TV, by fixing it to the wall, avoiding the possibility of it falling forwards if pulled. This will prevent the TV from falling forward and causing injury. This will also prevent the TV from damage. Ensure that children do not climb or hang from the TV.



- 1 Use the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts to fix the product to the wall as shown in the picture.
(If your TV has bolts in the eyebolts, loosen then bolts.)
* Insert the eye-bolts or TV brackets/bolts and tighten them securely in the upper holes.
- 2 Secure the wall brackets with the bolts on the wall. Match the height of the bracket that is mounted on the wall.



- 3 Use a sturdy rope or wire to tie the product for alignment. It is safer to tie the rope so it becomes horizontal between the wall and the product.

NOTE

- ▶ When moving the TV undo the cords first.
- ▶ Use a platform or cabinet strong and large enough to support the size and weight of the TV.
- ▶ To use the TV safely make sure that the height of the bracket on the wall and on the TV is the same.

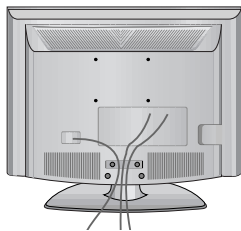

- The Kensington Security System is an optional accessory.

NOTES

- a. If the TV feels cold to the touch, there may be a small "flicker" when when it is turned on.
This is normal, there is nothing wrong with TV.
- b. Some minute dot defects may be visible on the screen, appearing as tiny red, green, or blue spots. However, they have no adverse effect on the monitor's performance.
- c. Avoid touching the LCD screen or holding your finger(s) against it for long periods of time.
Doing so may produce some temporary distortion effects on the screen.



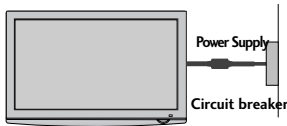

- The TV can be installed in various ways such as on a wall, or on a desktop etc.
- The TV is designed to be mounted horizontally.

EARTHING

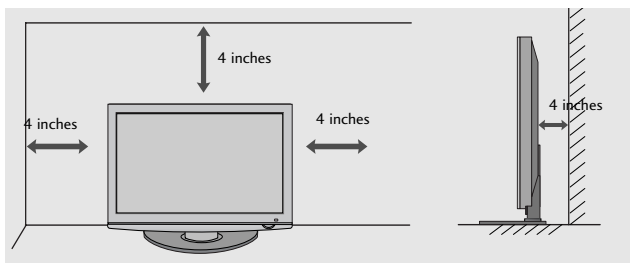
Ensure that you connect the earth wire to prevent possible electric shock. If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker.

Do not try to earth the TV by connecting it to telephone wires, lightning rods or gas pipes.



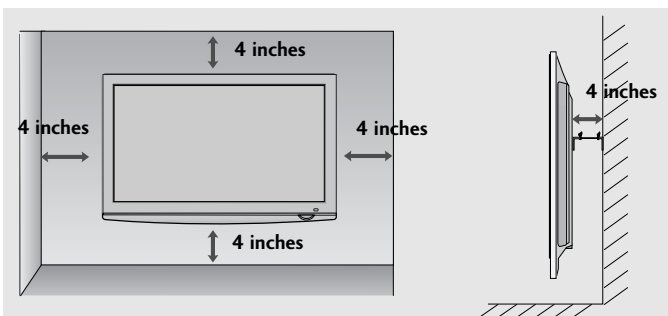
DESKTOP PEDESTAL INSTALLATION

For adequate ventilation allow a clearance of 4" (10cm) all around the TV.



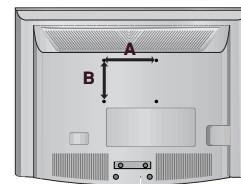
WALL MOUNT: HORIZONTAL INSTALLATION

- We recommend the use of a LG Brand wall mounting bracket when mounting the TV to a wall.
- We recommend that you purchase a wall mounting bracket which supports VESA standard.
- LG recommends that wall mounting be performed by a qualified professional installer.



NOTE

- ▶ Should Install wall mount on a solid wall perpendicular to the floor.
- ▶ Should use a special wall mount, if you want to install it to ceiling or slanted wall.
- ▶ The surface that wall mount is to be mounted on should be of sufficient strength to support the weight of TV set; e.g. concrete, natural rock, brick and hollow block.
- ▶ Installing screw type and length depends on the wall mount used. Further information, refer to the instructions included with the mount.
- ▶ LG is not liable for any accidents or damage to property or TV due to incorrect installation:
 - Where a non-compliant VESA wall mount is used.
 - Incorrect fastening of screws to surface which may cause TV to fall and cause personal injury.
 - Not following the recommended Installation method.



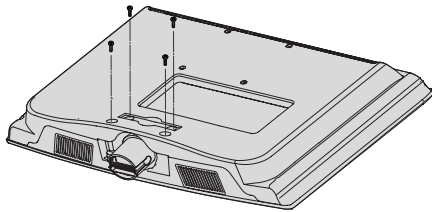

ANTENNA CONNECTION

- For optimum picture quality, adjust antenna direction.
- An antenna cable and converter are not supplied.

PREPARATION



- In poor signal areas, to achieve better picture quality it may be necessary to install a signal amplifier to the antenna as shown above.
- If signal needs to be split for two TVs, use an antenna signal splitter for connection.

EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

- To avoid damaging any equipment, never plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

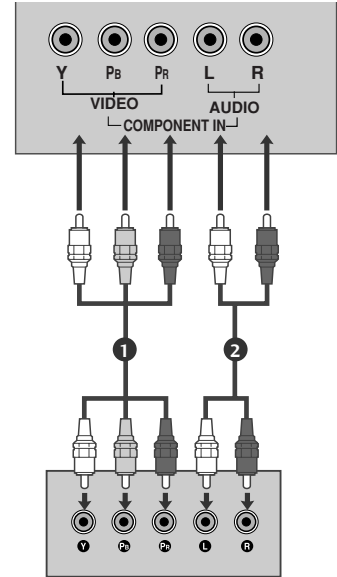

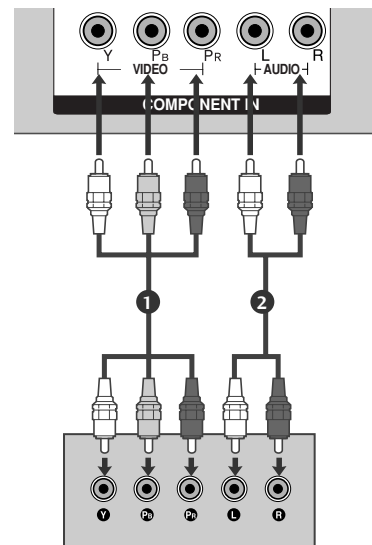

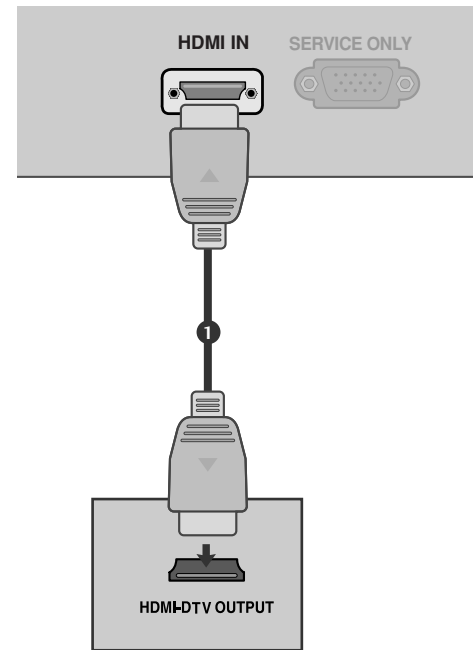
Connecting a set-top box with a HDMI cable

- 1 Connect the HDMI output of the digital set-top box to the **HDMI IN** jack on the TV.
- 2 Select **HDMI** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
- 3 Turn on the digital set-top box.
(Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)

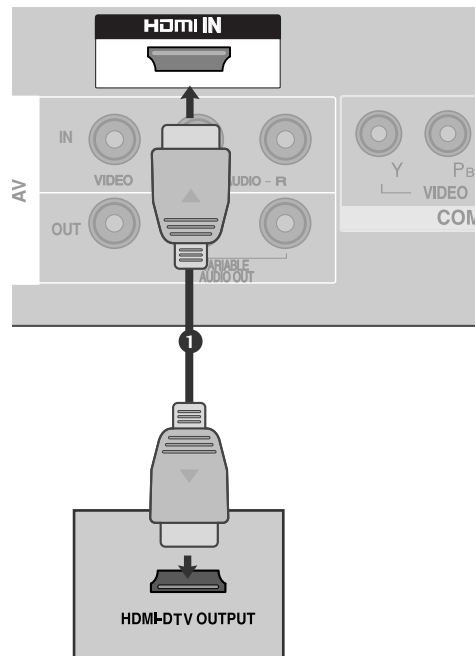
! NOTE

- ▶ TV can receive the video and audio signal simultaneously with using a HDMI cable.
- ▶ If the digital set-top box supports Auto HDMI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically TV to 1280x720p.
- ▶ If the digital set-top box player does not support Auto HDMI, you need to TV the output resolution appropriately.
To get the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the source device to 1280x720p .

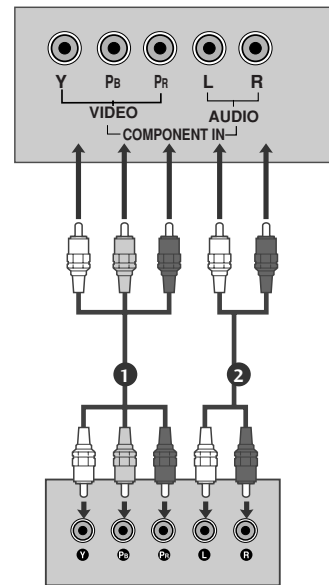

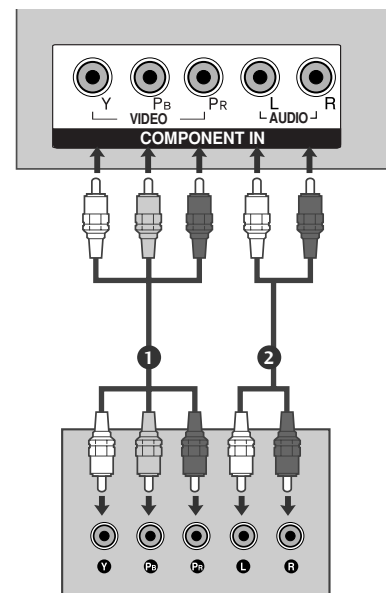

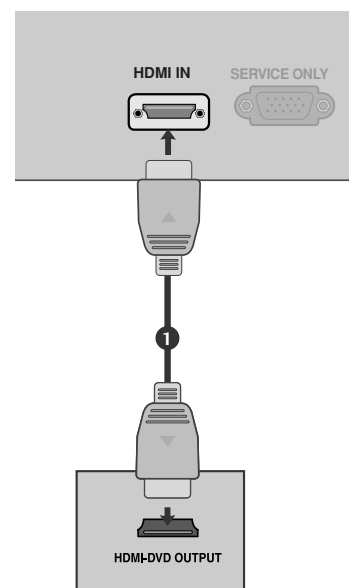

- 1 Connect the HDMI output of the DVD to the **HDMI IN** jack on the TV.
- 2 Select **HDMI** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
- 3 Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

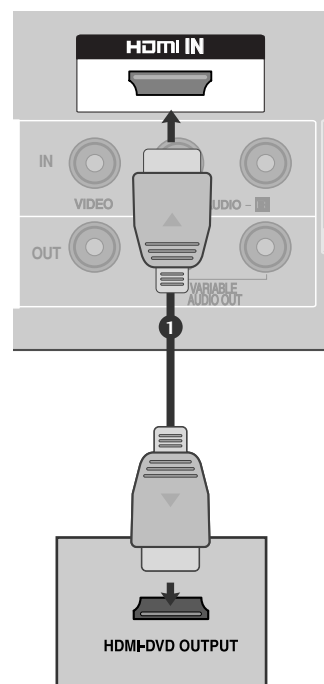
! NOTE

- ▶ The TV can receive video and audio signals simultaneously when using a HDMI cable.
 - ▶ If the DVD player supports Auto HDMI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically TV to 1280x720p.
 - ▶ If the DVD player does not support Auto HDMI, you must TV the output resolution appropriately.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the source device to 1280x720p.

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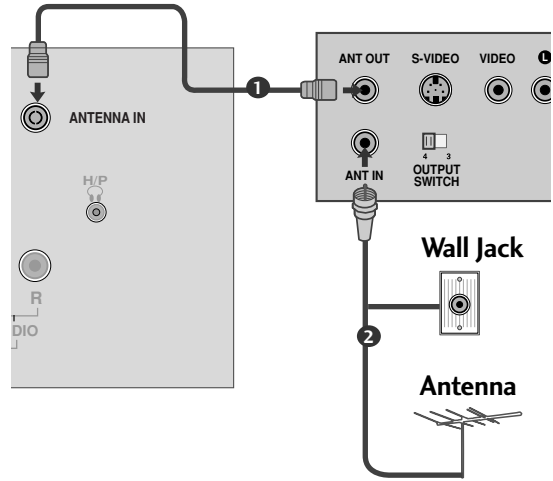
VCR SETUP

- To avoid picture noise (interference), allow adequate distance between the VCR and TV.

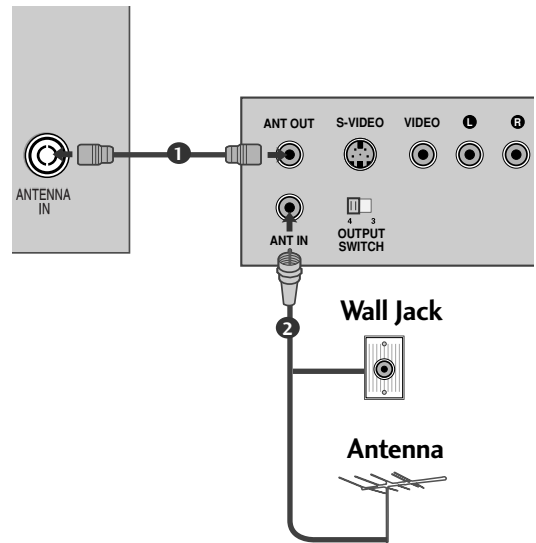
Connecting with a RF cable

- 1 Connect the **ANT OUT** socket of the VCR to the **ANTENNA IN** socket on the TV.
- 2 Connect the antenna cable to the **ANT IN** socket of the VCR.
- 3 Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR and match the appropriate programme between the TV and VCR for viewing.

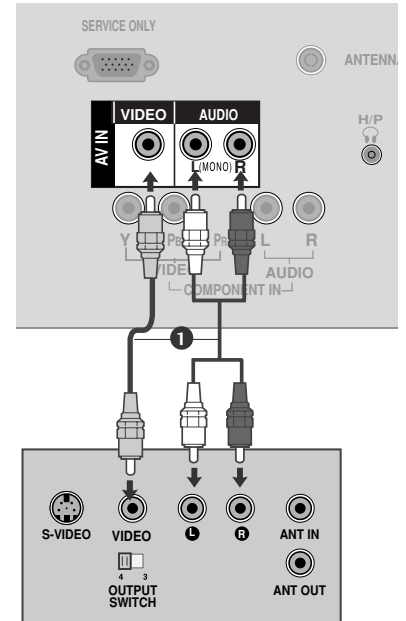
Connecting with a RCA cable

- 1 Connect the **AUDIO/VIDEO** jacks between TV and VCR. Match the jack colours (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)
- 2 Insert a video tape into the VCR and press **PLAY** on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)
- 3 Select **AV** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

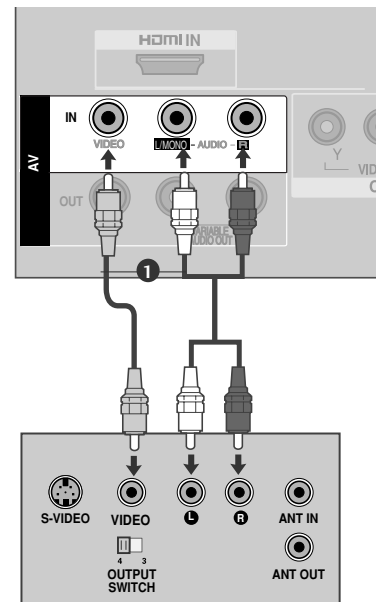

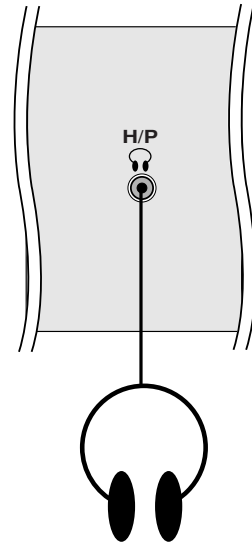

HEADPHONE SETUP (Only 22LF15R)

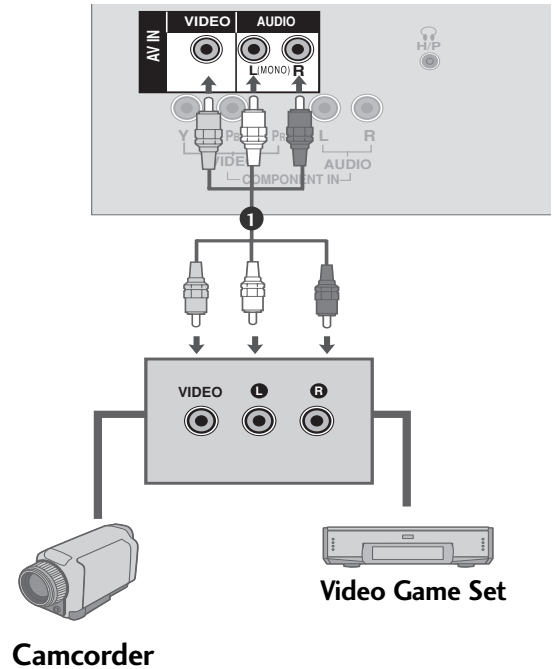

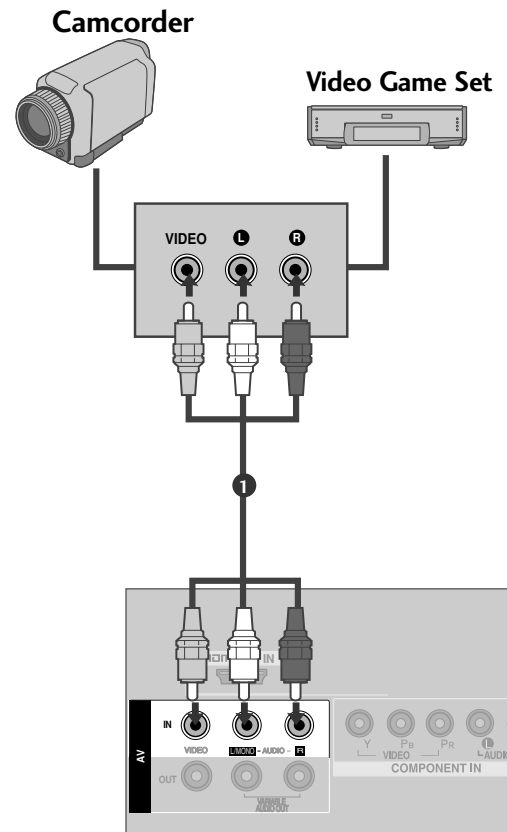
OTHER A/V SOURCE SETUP

- 1 Connect the **AUDIO/VIDEO** jacks between TV and external equipment. Match the jack colours. (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)
- 2 Select **AV** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control. If connected to **AV IN**, select **AV** input source.
- 3 Operate the corresponding external equipment. Refer to external equipment operating guide.

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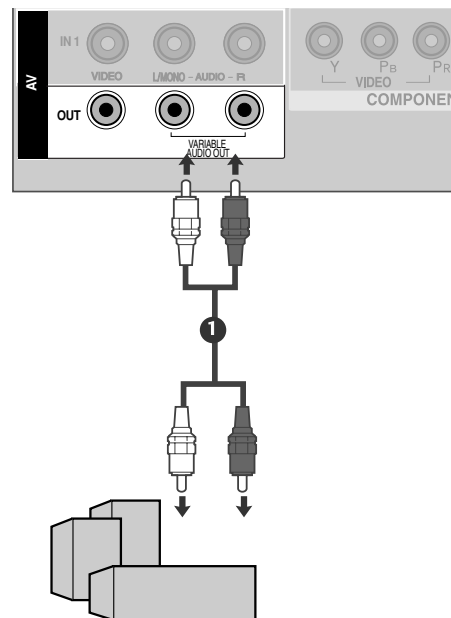
EXTERNAL STEREO SETUP (Except for 22LF15R)

Use to connected either an external amplifier, or add a sub-woofer to your surround sound system.

- 1 Connect the input jack of the stereo amplifier to the **VARIABLE AUDIO OUT** jacks on the TV.
- 2 Set up your speakers through your analog stereo amplifier, according to the instructions provided with the amplifier.

! NOTE

- ▶ When connecting with external audio equipments, such as amplifiers or speakers, please turn the TV speakers off. (▶ p.59)
- ▶ Select **Variable Out** in **Audio** menu to connect the **VARIABLE AUDIO OUT** jacks.(▶ p.60)

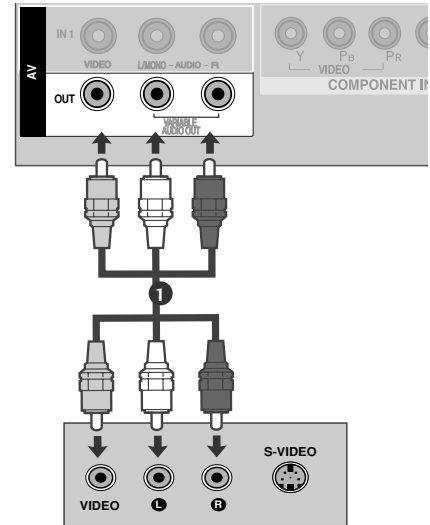
AV OUTPUT SETUP (Except for 22LF15R)

The TV has a special signal output capability which allows you to hook up the second TV or monitor.

- 1 Connect the second TV or monitor to the TV's AV OUT jacks.
- 2 See the Operating Manual of the second TV or monitor for further details regarding that device's input settings.

NOTE

- ▶ Component, RGB, HDMI input sources cannot be used for AV out.
- ▶ We recommend to use the AV OUT jacks for VCR recording.

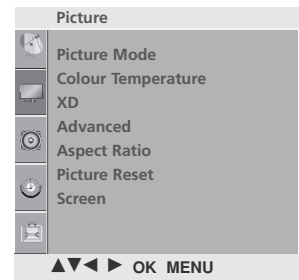

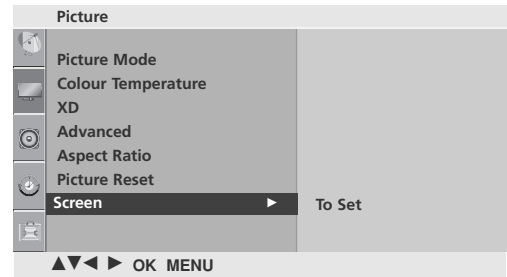
Manual Configure (Adjustment for screen Position)

If the picture is not clear and especially if characters are still trembling, adjust the picture phase manually.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Picture** menu.



- 2 Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Screen**.



- 3 Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Manual Config.**

- 4 Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **H-Position** or **V-Position**.

- 5 Press the ◀ / ▶ button to make appropriate adjustments.

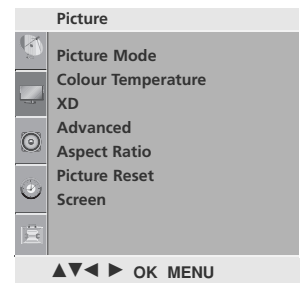

WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

REMOTE CONTROL KEY FUNCTIONS

When using the remote control, aim it at the remote control sensor on the TV.



POWER Switches the set on from standby or off to standby.

TV Returns to the TV viewing from any mode.
Switches the set on from standby.

INPUT If you press the button once, the input source OSD will appear on screen as shown. Press the ▲ / ▼ button and then OK button to select the desired input source.

MUTE Switches the sound on or off.

PSM Recalls your preferred picture setting.

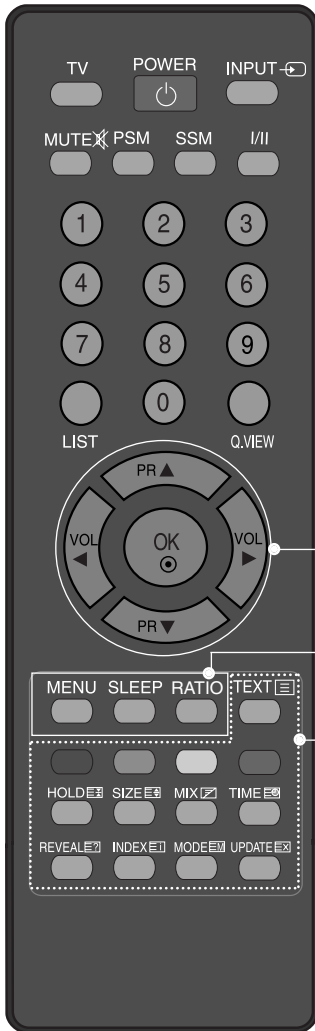
SSM Recalls your preferred sound setting.

I/II Selects the sound output. (▶ p.61)

0~9 number button Selects a programme.
Selects numbered items in a menu.
Switches the set on from standby.

LIST Displays the programme table.

Q.VIEW Returns to the previously viewed programme.



THUMBSTICK (Up/Down/Left/Right) Allows you to navigate the on-screen menus and adjust the system settings to your preference.
Adjusts the volume.
Selects a programme.
Switches the set on from standby. (Up/Down)

OK Accepts your selection or displays the current mode.

MENU Selects a menu.

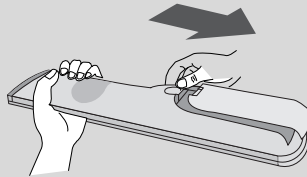
SLEEP Sets the sleep timer.

RATIO Selects your desired picture format. (► p.41)

Coloured buttons These buttons are used for teletext (only **TELETEXT** models) or **Programme edit**.

TELETEXT BUTTONS These buttons are used for teletext.
For further details, see the 'Teletext' section. (► p.68)

Installing Batteries



- Open the battery compartment cover on the back side and install the batteries matching correct polarity (+with +,-with -).
- Install two 1.5V AAA batteries. Don't mix old or used batteries with new ones.
- Close cover.

WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

TURNING ON THE TV

When your TV is turned on, you will be able to use its features.

- 1 Firstly, connect the power cord correctly.
At this stage, the TV switches to standby mode.
 - In standby mode to turn TV on, press the $\phi/|$, **INPUT**, **PR** $\blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown$ (or **P** \wedge / \vee) button on the TV or press the **POWER**, **TV**, **INPUT**, $\blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown$, **NUMBER(0~9)** buttons on the remote control and the TV will switch on.

Installation Guide

If the OSD (On Screen Display) is displayed on the screen after turning on the TV, you can adjust the **Language**, **Location**, **Auto Tuning**.

Note:

- a. It will automatically disappear after approx. 40 seconds unless a button is pressed.
- b. "In -Store" mode is only for shop display and not for general customer use.
- c. "Home" mode is the optimal setting for home environments, and is the TV's default mode.
- d. "In-Store" mode is the optimal setting for store environments. If a user modifies image quality data, "In- Store" mode initializes the product to the image quality set by us after a certain period of time.
- e. The mode (Home, In- Store) can be changed by executing Factory Reset in the Option menu.

PROGRAMME SELECTION

- 1 Press the $\blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown$ or **NUMBER** buttons to select a programme number.

VOLUME ADJUSTMENT

- 1 Press the $\blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright$ button to adjust the volume.
- 2 If you wish to switch the sound off, press the **MUTE** button.
- 3 You can cancel the Mute function by pressing the **MUTE**, $\blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright$ button.

ON SCREEN MENUS SELECTION AND ADJUSTMENT

Your TV's OSD (On Screen Display) may differ slightly from that shown in this manual.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to display each menu.
- 2 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select a menu item.
- 3 Change the setting of an item in the sub or pull-down menu with **◀ / ▶** button.
You can move to a higher level menu by pressing the **OK** button.



! NOTE

- a. The OSD (On Screen Display) function enables you to adjust the screen status conveniently since it provides graphical presentation.
- b. In this manual, the OSD (On Screen Display) may be different from your TV's because it is just example to help the TV operation.
- c. In the teletext mode, menus are not displayed.

WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

AUTO PROGRAMME TUNING

Up to 100 TV stations can be stored by programme numbers (0 to 99). Once you have preset the stations, you will be able to use the ▲ / ▼ or NUMBER buttons to scan the stations you have programmed.

Stations can be tuned using automatic or manual modes.

All stations which can be received are stored by this method. It is recommended that you use Auto tuning during installation of this TV.

1 Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Setup** menu.

2 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto Tuning**.

3 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **System**.

4 Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select a TV system menu;
BG: PAL B/G, SECAM B/G (Europe / East Europe / Asia / NewZealand / M.East / Africa / Australia)
I : PAL I/II (U.K. / Ireland / Hong Kong / South Africa)
DK: PAL D/K, SECAM D/K (East Europe / China / Africa / CIS)
M : (USA / Korea / Philippines)

5 Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Storage From**.

6 Press the ◀ / ▶ button or NUMBER buttons to select the initial programme number. If you use NUMBER buttons, any number under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' in front of it, i.e.'05' for 5.

7 Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Search**.

8 Press the ► button to begin auto tuning.
All receivable stations are stored.

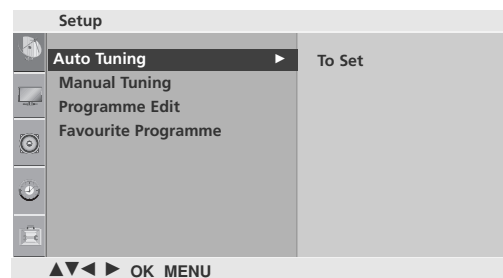
To stop auto tuning, press the **MENU** button.

When auto tuning is complete, the Programme edit menu appears on the screen. See the Programme edit section to edit the stored programme.

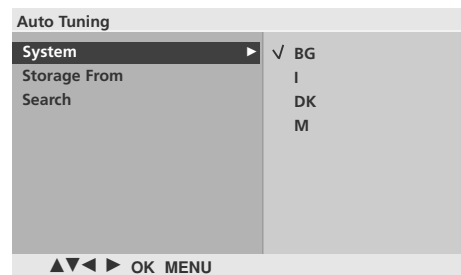

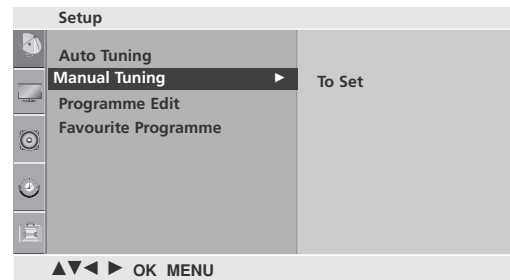
MANUAL PROGRAMME TUNING

Manual programme lets you manually tune and arrange the stations in whatever order you desire.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select the **Setup** menu.
- 2 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select **Manual Tuning**.
- 3 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select **Storage**.

AUTO ON/OFF TIMER SETTING

The Off time function automatically switches the TV to standby at a preset time.

Two hours after the TV is switched on by the on time function it will automatically switch back to standby mode unless a button has been pressed.

Once the on time/off time is set, these functions operate daily at the preset time.

The Off time function overrides the On timer function if both are set to the same time.

The TV must be in standby mode for the On timer to work.

1 Press the **MENU** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select the **Time** menu.

2 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select **On/Off Time**.

- To cancel **On/Off Time** function, select **Off**.

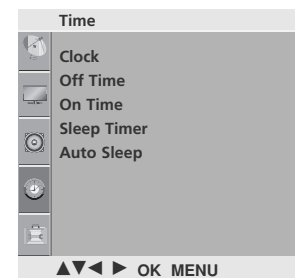
3 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to set the hour.

4 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to set the minutes.

5 **For On Time function only**

- **Programme:** Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select the programme.
- **Volume:** Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to adjust volume level at switch-on.

6 Press the **MENU** button to move to the previous menu screen.

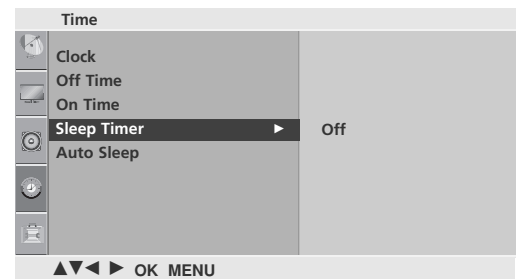
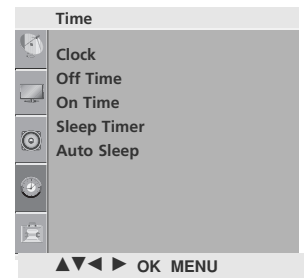

TIME SETTING

SLEEP TIMER SETTING

You do not have to remember to switch the TV off before you go to sleep. The sleep timer automatically switches the TV to standby after the preset time has elapsed.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Time** menu.
- 2 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Sleep Timer**.
- 3 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to set the minute.
- 4 Press the **MENU** button to move to the previous menu screen.



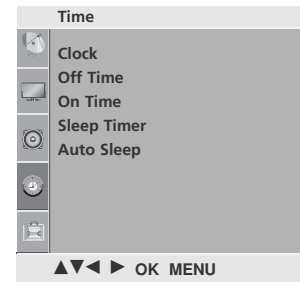
! NOTE

- When you switch the TV off, the TV releases the preset sleep time.

AUTO SHUT-OFF SETTING

If the TV set is switched on and there is no input signal, it will switch off automatically after 10 minutes.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select the **Time** menu.
- 2 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select **Auto Sleep**.
- 3 Press the **▶** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4 Press the **MENU** button to move to the previous menu screen.



TELETEXT

This feature is not available in all countries.

Teletext is a free service broadcast by most TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics.

The teletext decoder of this TV can support the SIMPLE, TOP and FASTEXT systems. SIMPLE (standard teletext) consists of a number of pages which are selected by directly entering the corresponding page number. TOP and FASTEXT are more modern methods allowing quick and easy selection of teletext information.

SWITCH ON/OFF

Press the **TEXT** button to switch to teletext. The initial page or last page viewed appears on the screen.

Two page numbers, TV station name, date and time are displayed on the screen headline. The first page number indicates your selection, while the second shows the current page displayed.

Press the **TEXT** button to switch off teletext. The previous mode reappears.

SIMPLE TEXT

■ Page selection

- 1 Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the **NUMBER** buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then re-enter the correct page number.
- 2 The **▲ / ▼** button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

Programming a colour button in LIST mode

If the TV is in SIMPLE text, TOP text or FASTEXT mode, press the **EM** button to switch to LIST mode.

Four teletext page numbers of your choice can be colour coded and easily selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button on the remote control handset.

- 1 Press a coloured button.
- 2 Using the **NUMBER** buttons, select the page you wish to programme.
- 3 Press the **OK** button. The selected page is stored as the selected page number, blinking once to confirm this. From now on, you can select this page with the same coloured button.
- 4 The three other coloured buttons are programmed in this way.

TOP TEXT

The user guide displays four fields-red, green, yellow and blue at the bottom of the screen. The yellow field denotes the next group and the blue field indicates the next block.

■ Block / group / page selection

- ① With the blue button you can progress from block to block.
- ② Use the yellow button to proceed to the next group with automatic overflow to the next block.
- ③ With the green button you can proceed to the next existing page with automatic overflow to the next group.
Alternatively the ▲ button can be used.
- ④ The red button return to the previous selection. Alternatively the ▼ button can be used.


■ Direct page selection

As with SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering it as a three digit number using the NUMBER buttons in TOP mode.

FASTEXT

The teletext pages are colour coded along the bottom of the screen and are selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button.

■ Page selection

- ① Press the  button to select the index page.
- ② You can select the pages which are colour coded along the bottom line with corresponding coloured buttons.
- ③ As with SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering its three digit page number with the NUMBER buttons in FASTEXT mode.
- ④ The ▲ / ▼ button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

SPECIAL TELETEXT FUNCTIONS

- Press the **T. OPT** button and then use **▲ ▼** button to select the **Text Option** menu.



■ TIME

When viewing a TV programme, press this button to display the time at the top right hand corner of the screen. Press this button again to remove the display. In the teletext mode, press this button to select a sub page number. The sub page number is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To hold or change the sub page, press the **RED/GREEN**, **▲ / ▼** or **NUMBER** buttons.

Press again to exit this function.



■ SIZE

Selects double height text.

Press this button to enlarge the top half of the page.

Press this button again to enlarge the bottom half of the page.

Press this button again to return to the normal display.



■ UPDATE

Displays the TV picture on the screen while waiting for a new teletext page. The display will appear at the top left hand corner of the screen. When the updated page is available then display will change to the page number. Press this button again to view the updated teletext page.



■ REVEAL

Press this button to display concealed information, such as solutions to riddles or puzzles.

Press this button again to remove the information from the display.



■ INDEX

Select the each index page.



■ HOLD

Stops the automatic page change which will occur if a teletext page consists of 2 or more sub pages. The number of sub pages and the sub page displayed is, usually, shown on the screen below the time. When this button is pressed the stop symbol is displayed at the top left-hand corner of the screen and the automatic page change is inactive. To continue press this button again.



■ MIX

Displays the teletext pages superimposed on the TV picture.

To switch the TV picture off press this button again.

APPENDIX

TROUBLESHOOTING

The TV does not operate properly

The remote control does not work

- Check to see if there is any object between the TV and the remote control causing an obstruction.
- Are batteries installed with correct polarity (+ to +, - to -)?
- Correct remote operating mode set: TV, STB, DVD etc.?
- Install new batteries.

Power is suddenly turned off

- Is the sleep time set?
- Check the power control settings. Has the Power supply been interrupted.
- Is Auto sleep activated on this station.

The video function does not work.

No picture & No sound

- Check whether the TV is switched on.
- Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast.
- Is the power cord inserted correctly into the mains?
- Check your antenna direction and/or location.
- Test the mains outlet by plugging another TV into the same outlet.

Picture appears slowly after switching on

- This is normal, the image is muted during the TV startup process. Please contact your service center, if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.

No or poor colour or poor picture

- Adjust Colour in menu option.
- Allow a sufficient distance between the TV and the VCR.
- Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast.
- Are the video cables installed properly?
- Activate any function to restore the brightness of the picture.

Horizontal/vertical bars or picture shaking

- Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.

Poor reception on some channels

- Station or cable channel experiencing problems, tune to another station.
- Station signal is weak, reposition the antenna to receive weaker stations.
- Check for sources of possible interference.

Lines or streaks in pictures

- Check antenna (Change the position of the antenna).

The audio function does not work.

Picture OK & No sound

- Press the **VOL** button.
- Sound muted? Press **MUTE** button.
- Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast.
- Are the audio cables installed properly?

No output from one of the speakers

- Adjust Balance in menu option.

Unusual sound from inside the TV

- A change in ambient humidity or temperature may result in an unusual noise when the TV is switched on or off and does not indicate a fault with the TV.

There is a problem in PICTURE settings.

When the user changes the picture settings, the TV automatically converts back to the initial settings after a certain period of time.

- It means that the TV is currently set to **In Store** mode. To switch to **Home** mode you should do the followings:

From the TV Menu, choose **Opt ion** -> **Factory Reset** -> **Yes** (wait for a few seconds for the TV to download again) -> Choose **Language** -> Choose **Home** -> Press **OK** button -> OSD "WELCOME" appears -> Press **OK** button. Program search will begin automatically (You can stop the search by pressing the **MENU** button). Now you have completed switching to the Home mode.

MAINTENANCE

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can prolong the life of your new TV.
Caution: Be sure to switch the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the Screen

- 1 A good way to keep the dust off your screen for a while is to wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2 Ensure there is no excess water on the screen. Allow any water or dampness to evaporate before switching on.

Cleaning the Cabinet

- To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth.
- Do not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence

CAUTION

- ▶ If you expect to leave your TV dormant for prolonged periods (such as a holiday), unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.

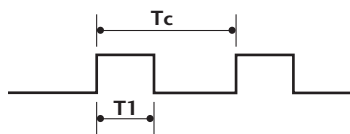

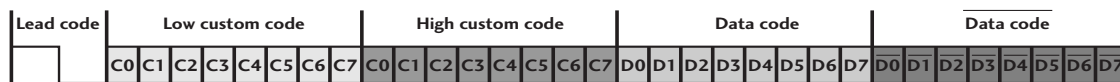

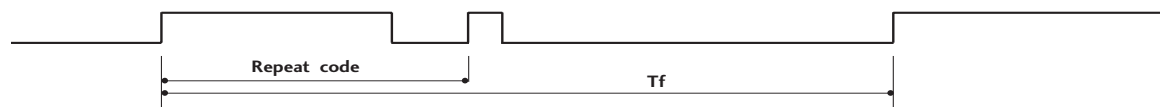

■ Configuration of frame

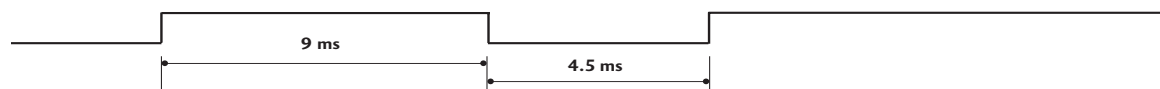
1st frame



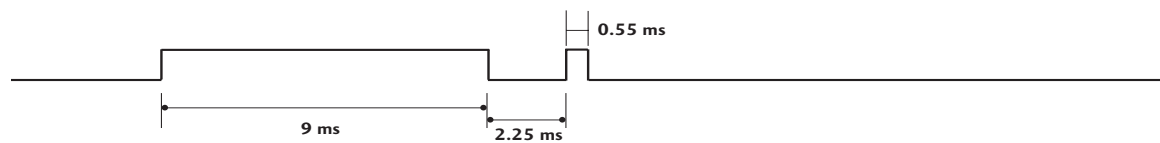
Repeat frame

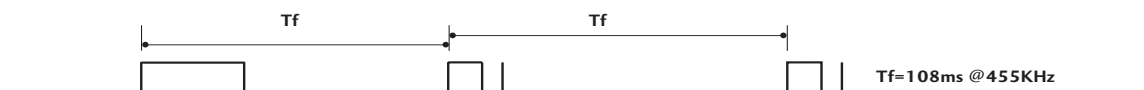
