





Playable file Requirement

MP3/ WMA music file requirement

MP3/ WMA file compatibility with this unit is limited as follows:

- Sampling frequency: within 32 to 48 kHz (MP3), within 32 to 48 kHz (WMA)
- Bit rate: within 32 to 320 kbps (MP3), 40 to 192 kbps (WMA)
- · Maximum files: Under 999
- File extensions: ".mp3"/".wma"
- CD-ROM file format: ISO9660/ JOLIET
- We recommend that you use Easy-CD Creator, which creates an ISO 9660 file system.

Compatible USB Devices

- MP3 Player : Flash type MP3 player.
- USB Flash Drive: Devices that support USB2.0 or USB1.1.
- The USB function of this unit does not support all USB devices.

USB device requirement

- Devices which require additional program installation when you have connected it to a computer, are not supported.
- Do not extract the USB device while in operation.
- For a large capacity USB, it may take longer than a few minute to be searched.
- To prevent data loss, back up all data.
- If you use a USB extension cable or USB hub, the USB device is not recognized.
- Using NTFS file system is not supported. (Only FAT(16/32) file system is supported.)
- This unit is not supported when the total number of files is 1 000 or more.
- External HDD, Card readers, Locked devices, or hard type USB devices are not supported.
- USB port of the unit cannot be connected to PC. The unit cannot be used as a storage device.



- Skips Fast backward or Forward.

SLEEP: Sets the system to turn off automatically at a specified time. (Dimmer: The display window will be darkening by half.)




Connecting to speakers

Attaching the speakers to the unit

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals on the unit. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

Connect the black stripe of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).




Color	Speaker	Position

/!\ Caution

- Be careful to make sure children not to put their hands or any objects into the *speaker
 - *Speaker duct: A hole for plentiful bass sound on speaker cabinet (enclosure).
- The speakers contain magnet parts, so color irregularity may occur on the TV screen or PC monitor screen. Please use the speakers far away from either TV screen or PC monitor.
- Make sure to install the speaker with other people in order to prevent it from falling and causing injuries to the installer.

Attaching the woofer cables to the unit

To connect the woofer cable(woofer light cable) to the unit, insert the cable to WOOFER SYSTEM connectors on the unit





Caution

- Make sure arrows on the ends of cables should be toward the to upper side.
- Make sure to connect the cables to connectors tightly on the unit.






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Optional Equipment Connection

AUX IN Connection


Connect an output of auxiliary device(Camcoder, TV, Player, etc) to the AUX IN (L/R) connector.

If your device has only one output for audio(mono), connect it to the left (white) audio jack on the unit.



PORT. IN Connection


Connect an output (earphone or line out) of portable device (MP3 or PMP etc) to the PORT. IN connector.



AUDIO OUT connection

You can connect another device.

Connect the left and right AUDIO OUT jacks of the unit to the audio left and right jacks on another device using the audio cables.










Connect the USB port of USB Memory (or MP3 player, etc.) to the USB port on the front of the unit.






- Removing the USB Device from the unit
 - Choose a different function/ mode or press ■ ENTER on the remote control or □ on the unit twice in a row.
 - 2. Remove the USB device from the unit.
- You can only recharge your iPod through USB port. To listen to music on iPod, refer to the page 22.

Antenna Connection

Connect the supplied FM/ AM antenna for listening to the radio.

Connect the AM loop antenna to the AM antenna connector. (A)

Connect the FM wire antenna to the FM antenna connector. (F)





- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM Loop antenna away from the unit and other components.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
 After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it horizontal.







Basic Operations

CD/ USB Operations

- 1. Insert the disc by pressing **▲ OPEN/CLOSE** or connect the USB device to the USB port.
- 2. Select the CD or USB function by pressing FUNCTION on the remote control or CD/USB on the unit.
- 3. Select the disc by pressing **DISC/USB SKIP**, DISC1, DISC 2, DISC 3 on the unit or **DISC/USB SKIP** on the remote control.

Playing repeatedly or randomly	Press REPEAT on the remote control repeatedly. Refer to the note for details about the display change.

Selecting a folder and a MP3/ WMA file

On the unit

- 1. Press FOLDER and rotate FILE SEARCH until a desired folder appears.
- 2. Press FILE SEARCH or > 11.
- 3. If you want to move to the upper folder, press FOLDER.
- 4. Rotate **FILE SEARCH** until a desired file appears. Press > II to play it.

On the remote control

- 1. Press **PRESET/FOLDER ∧/V** repeatedly until a desired folder appears.
- 2. Press ►/II to play it. The first file of folder will play.

Deleting a MP3/ WMA file

You can delete file, folder or format by pressing **DELETE**. (USB only)

1. Press **DELETE** repeatedly during selecting the MP3/WMA file. This function is supported only in stop status. The display changes in the following order.

- DELETE?: deletes file - DEL FOLDER : deletes folder - FORMAT?: formats USB

- 2. To delete file/ folder or format, press ►/II on the remote control or press > II on the unit.
- 3. If you want to exit the current mode, press ■ ENTER on the remote control or press □ on the unit



/!\ Caution -

- Do not extract the USB device during operation.(play, delete, etc.)
- Regular back up is recommended to prevent data loss.
- The delete function may not be supported according to the USB status. (lock, etc.)

Other Operations

Programmed Playback

The program function enables you to store your favorite files from any disc or USB device.

A program can contain 20 tracks.

- 1. Insert a CD or USB and wait for it to be order.
- 2. Press PROG./MEMO. on the remote control in stop status.
- 3. Press or rotate to select a track;
 - On the remote control: ► ✓
 - On the unit: FILE SEARCH or I</>
- 4. Press PROG./MEMO. again to save and select a next track.
- 5. Press ►/II to play the programmed music files.
- 6. To clear your selection, press ENTER twice.



Note

The programs are also cleared when the disc or USB device is removed, the unit is powered off or the function is switched to others.

Turn off the sound temporarily

Press MUTE to mute your unit.

You can mute your unit, for example, to answer the telephone, the mute icon "X▶" is blinked in the display window.



AUTO DJ playback

Auto DJ blends the end of one song into the beginning of another for seamless playback. It equalizes volume across tracks for uninterrupted playback.

Press **AUTO DJ** on the remote control or unit repeatedly, the display changes as followings. RANDOM (AUTO DJ RANDOM) -> REPEAT DISC/ ALL (AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL) -> (AUTO DJ OFF)

Mode	Display Window	Description
OFF	- (AUTO DJ OFF)	-
RANDOM	RANDOM (AUTO DJ RANDOM)	The music is played randomly on this mode.
REPEAT	REPEAT DISC/ ALL (AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL)	The music is played repeatedly on this mode.

Note

- Searching for a section within a track or playing repeatedly or randomly is not supported on the AUTO DJ mode.
- During AUTO DJ mode, press **PRESET/FOLDER** Λ/V on the remote control or **FOLDER** on the unit is not available.
- If you move to other functions or stop the music using ☐ on the unit (or ■ ENTER on the remote control) on AUTO DJ mode. AUTO DJ function will be disable.
- AUTO DJ function is not supported in the music file whose length is less than 60 seconds.
- During recording, AUTO DJ function is not available.
- If you change a disc while the AUTO DJ function is activated, the function is deactivated.

Displaying file information (ID3 TAG)

While playing an MP3 file containing file information, you can display the information by pressing INFO.

DEMO

In the power off state, it demonstrates the function on display window by pressing

SUBWOOFER - LIGHTING/ DEMO. To cancel the DEMO, press it again.



- While DEMO, this unit will keep DEMO status even if you unplug the power cord connection.
- You can enjoy other functions during the DEMO. Then the DEMO will pause to temporary.
 - Without input key in 10 sec, the DEMO will play back automatically.







VOCAL FADER

You can enjoy the function as karaoke by reducing singer vocal of music in the various sources. (MP3/WMA/CD/ etc.) Press the **VOCAL FADER**.

To cancel it, press **VOCAL FADER** again.

 The quality of the VOCAL FADER may be different depending on the recording conditions of music files.

Using Microphone

- 1. Connect your microphone to the MIC jack.
- 2. Play the music you want.
- Sing along with the accompaniment. Adjust the microphone volume by rotating MIC VOL clockwise or unclockwise on the unit.



- When not using the microphone, set the MIC VOL to minimum or turn off the MIC and remove the microphone from the MIC jack.
- If the microphone is set too near the speaker, a howling sound may be produced. In this case, move the microphone away from the speaker or decrease the sound level by using the MIC VOL.
- If sound through the microphone is extremely loud, it may be distorted. In this case, rotate **MIC VOL** to minimum.

Radio Operations

Be sure that both FM and AM aerials are connected. (Refer to the page 15)

Listening to the radio

- Press FUNCTION until FM or AM appears in the display window.
 - The last received station is tuned in.
- 2. Press and hold **TUNING -/+** for about two seconds until the frequency indication starts to change, then release. Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

Or

Press TUNING -/+ repeatedly.

 Adjust the volume by rotating VOLUME on the unit or by pressing VOLUME +/- on the remote control repeatedly.







You can preset 50 stations for FM and AM.

Before tuning, make sure to turn down the volume.

- 1. Press **FUNCTION** until FM or AM appears in the display window.
- 2. Press to select a desired frequency;
 - On the remote control: TUNING -/+
 - On the unit: **|**</>>
- 3. Press **PROG./MEMO.** a preset number will flash in the display window.
- 4. Press **PRESET/FOLDER** Λ/V to select the preset number you want.
- 5. Press **PROG./MEMO.** The station is stored.
- 6. Repeat steps 2 to 5 to store other stations.
- 7. To listen a preset station, press **PRESET/FOLDER** Λ/V or 0 to 9 numerical buttons.

Deleting all the saved stations

- 1. Press and hold **PROG./MEMO.** for two seconds. "ERASE ALL" will flash up on the unit display.
- 2. Press PROG./MEMO. to erase all saved radio stations.

Improving poor FM reception

Press >|| ST. / MONO on the unit or ▶/|| on the remote control. This will change the tuner from stereo to mono and usually improve the reception.

Sound adjustment

Setting the surround mode

This system has a number of pre-set surround sound fields. You can select a desired sound mode by using **SOUND EFFECT**.

The displayed items for the Equalizer may be different depending on sound sources and effects.

On Display	Description
NATURAL	You can enjoy comfortable and natural sound.
Local Specialization equalizer	Regionally optimized sound effect. (FORRO/ FUNK/ SERTANEJO/ DANGDUT/ ARABIC/ PERSIAN/ INDIA/ REGUETON/ MERENGUE/ SALSA/ SAMBA/ CUMBIA/ AFRO)
AUTO EQ	Realizes the sound equalizer that is the most similar to the genre of which is included in the MP3 ID3 tag of song files.
POP CLASSIC JAZZ ROCK	This program lends an enthusiastic atmosphere to the sound, giving you the feeling you are at an actual rock pop, jazz or classic concert.
MP3 - OPT	This function is optimized for compressible MP3 file. It improves the treble sound.
BASS BLAST	Reinforces the treble, bass and surround sound effect.
LOUDNESS	Improves the bass and treble sound.
VIRTUAL	You can enjoy more virtual surround sound.
BYPASS	You can enjoy the sound without equalizer effect.







Note

- On some speakers, sound may not be heard or heard in low sound depending on the sound mode.
- Maybe you need reset the surround mode, after switching the input, sometimes even after the sound track changed.
- By pressing BASS BLAST on the unit you can directly select the BYPASS or BASS BLAST sound.

Setting the USER EQ

You can listen to music with the desired sound effect by adjusting the BASS, MIDDLE and TREBLE.

- Press **USER EQ.** "USER EQ" is displayed.
- 2. Press SET to enter the USER EO.
- 3. Select the BASS, MIDDLE or TREBLE sound effect you want by rotating **FILE SEARCH**.
- Press **I**≪/≫**I** to select the sound level you want.
- 5. To finish the setting, press **SET**.

Setting the Clock

- 1. Turn the unit on.
- 2. Press **CLOCK** for at least 2 seconds.
- 3. Choose time mode by pressing $|\langle\langle\rangle\rangle|$.
 - AM 12:00 (for an AM and PM display) or 0:00 (for a 24 hour display)
- 4. Press **SET** to confirm your selection.
- 5. Select the hours by pressing **|** <</>>> **|**.
- 6. Press SET.
- 7. Select the minutes by pressing $|\langle\langle\rangle\rangle|$.
- 8. Press SET.

Using your player as an alarm clock

- 1. Turn the unit on.
- Press TIMER. Fach functions flashes.
- 3. Press **SET** when the function you want to be woken by is showing.
- "ON TIME" will be displayed. This is your desired time to unit turns on. Press **I≪/≫I** to change the hours and minutes and press **SET** to save.
- 5. The "OFF TIME" will be displayed. This is your desired time to unit turns off.
- 6. Press **I**≪/≫**I** to change the hours and minutes and press **SET** to save.
- Press I≪/≫I to change the volume and press SET to save. The clock icon "⊕" shows that the alarm is set.
- 8. Press **TIMER** button 2 times. You can check the setting status.



Note

- If you set the clock time, you can check the time by pressing CLOCK even when the player is turned off.
- If you set the clock time and alarm, you
 can check the alarm icon "O" by pressing
 CLOCK even when the player is turned off.
- If you set the clock time and alarm, you
 can check the alarm icon "O" and setting
 information by pressing TIMER even when
 the unit is turned off.







Sleep Timer Setting

Press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select delay time between 10 and 180 minutes. After the delay time, unit will turn off.

To cancel the sleep function, press **SLEEP** repeatedly until "SLEEP 10" appears, and then press **SLEEP** once again while "SLEEP 10" is displayed.



Note

- You can check the remaining time before the unit turns off.
- Press **SLEEP**. The remaining time appears in the display window.

Dimmer


Press **SLEEP** once. The display window will be darkening by half. To cancel it, press SLEEP repeatedly until dim off.

Advanced Operations

Playing the iPod

You can enjoy the sound with your iPod. For details about iPod, refer to the iPod User Guide.

1. Connect the iPod firmly.



If you turn this unit on, your iPod is automatically turned on and recharging starts.

2. Press AUX/iPod/PORT. IN on the unit or **FUNCTION** on the remote control to select iPod function. You can operate your iPod through an iPod's display by using the supplied remote control and also control on your iPod.

Compatible iPod

- · We recommend installing the latest software version.
- The unit supports the models as follows: iPod nano 1 G, 2 G, 3 G, 4 G, 5 G, 6 G/ iPod classic/ iPod 4 G, 5 G/ iPod touch 2 G, 3 G, 4 G/ iPhone 3 G, 4. For some models, the unit may not operate depending on the firmware version.
- Depending on your iPod's software version, you may not control your iPod from the player.



- If this unit displays an error message, follow the message. An error message "ERROR".
 - Your iPod is not connected firmly.
 - This unit recognizes your iPod as an unknown device.
 - Your iPod is exceptionally low in power.
 - → The battery needs to be charged.

Listening to music from your portable player or external device

The unit can be used to play the music from many types of portable player or external device. (Refer to the page 14)

1. Connect the portable player to the PORT. IN (PORTABLE IN) connector of the unit.

Connect the external device to the AUX IN connector of the unit.

- 2. Turn the power on by pressing (1)/1.
- 3. Select the PORTABLE or AUX function by pressing **FUNCTION** on the remote control or AUX/ iPod. PORT. IN on the unit.
- 4. Turn the portable player or external device and start it playing.

Changing the lighting effect

You can change the unit's lighting effects by pressing **LIGHTING** on the remote control or **LIGHT EFFECT** on the unit in 5 types. (Forward Level Mode/ Peak Level Mode/ Center Level Mode/ Reverse Level Mode/ Shower Level Mode)

Changing the woofer lighting

You can change the woofer's lighting effects in 5 types by pressing SUBWOOFER - LIGHTING/ **DEMO**. (Default On LED/ Level Meter LED/ Sound Detect LED/ Level Reverse LED/ Always On LED)

On/ off the woofer power

You can power on or off the woofer by pressing WOOFER POWER on the remote control.

Recording to USB

You can record a various sound source to USB.

- 1 Connect the USB device to the unit
- 2. Select a function in which you want to record by using CD/USB, TUNER on the unit or **FUNCTION** on the remote control.

One track recording - You can record to USB after playing a file you want.

All tracks recording - You can recording to USB after stop.

Program list recording - After showing the programmed list, you can record it to USB.

- 3. Press **REC. TO USB 2** on the unit or **REC** on the remote control.
 - If you connect both of **USB1** and **USB2**, press >II to record to **USB1** and press ☐ to record to USB2.
- 4. To stop recording, press
 on the unit or ■ ENTER on the remote control.

To select recording bit rate and speed

Dubbing USB to USB

You can do dubbing a various sound source in USB1 to USB2 on USB function.

- 1. Connect a USB device including desired sound files to USB1.
- 2. Connect an USB device to USB2.
- 3. Press **REC. TO USB 2** on the unit or **REC** on the remote control.
- 4. To stop recording, press
 on the unit or ■ ENTER on the remote control

Pausing recording

During recording, press REC. TO USB2 on the unit or

REC on the remote control to pause recording. Press it again to restart recording. (Only Radio/ AUX/ Portable)

- You can check the recording percentage rate for the USB record on the display window during the recording. (MP3/WMA CD Only)
- During recording MP3/ WMA, there is no sound
- When you stop recording during playback. the file that has been recorded at that time will be stored. (AUDIO CD Only)
- Do not remove the USB device or turn off the unit during USB recording. If not, an incomplete file may be made and not deleted on PC.

Notes on Discs

Handling Discs

Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.
