## Installation

## Attaching the speakers to the unit

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals on the unit. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

Connect the black end of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).


Connect the other end of each wire to the correct speaker according to the color coding

## MDT355 (2.1 channel)

- Be careful to make sure children do not put their hands or any objects into the *speaker duct. *Speaker duct: A hall for plentiful bass sound on speaker cabinet (enclosure)
- The speakers contain magnet parts, so color irregularity may occur on the TV screen or PC monitor screen. Please use the speakers far away from either TV screen or PC monitor.

## Component Video Connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT (PROGRESSIVE SCAN) jacks on the unit to the corresponding input jacks on the TV using component cables.

You can hear the sound through the system's speakers.

- To prevent data loss, back up all data.
- If you use a USB extension cable or USB hub, the USB device is not recognized.
- Using NTFS file system is not supported. (Only FAT(16/32) file system is supported.)
- This unit is not supported when the total number of files is 1,000 or more.
- External HDD, Card readers, Locked devices, or hard type usb devices are not supported.
- The USB port on this unit cannot be connected to a PC. The unit can not be used as a storage device.

## Adjust the Setup settings

## OSD Initial language settings Optional

When using this unit for the first time, the initial language setup menu appears on your TV screen. You must complete initial language selection before using the unit. English will be selected as the initial language.

1. Press POWER to turn the unit on.

The language setup menu will appear on the screen.
2. Use $\wedge \vee<>$ to select a language then press ENTER.
The confirm menu will appear.
3. Use $<>$ to select [Enter] then press ENTER to finish the language setup.

## To display and exit the Setup Menu

1. Select the DVD/CD or USB function by pressing FUNCTION.
2. Press SETUP.

Displays the [SETUP] Menu.
3. Press SETUP or RETURN to exit in the [SETUP] Menu.

Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

## [Other]

To select another language, press numeric buttons and then ENTER to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on the page 39. If you enter the wrong language code, press CLEAR.

## [Off (for Disc Subtitle)]

Turn off Subtitle.

## DISPLAY

## TV Aspect

Select which screen aspect to use based on the shape of your TV screen.

## [4:3]

Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.

## [16:9]

Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

## Display Mode

The Display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to 4:3.

## [Letterbox]

This displays a wide screen picture with black bands at the top and bottom of the screen.

## [Panscan]

This fills the entire $4: 3$ screen, cropping the picture as necessary.

## Progressive Scan <br> (For Component Video connections)

Selects whether the COMPONENT VIDEO(PROGRESSIVE SCAN) OUTPUT jacks output progressive signal. If your TV accepts progressive format signals, you will enjoy accurate color reproduction and high quality image by selecting [On]. If your TV does not accept progressive format signals, select [Off]. If you set Progressive Scan to [On] in error, you must reset the unit. First, remove the disc from the unit. Next, press and hold STOP for about five seconds. The video output will be restored to the standard setting, and a picture will be visible on your TV.

## AUDIO

### 2.1 Speaker Setup (MDT355)

Make the following settings for the built-in 2.1 channel surrounds decoder.

1. Press SETUP.
2. Use $\wedge \vee$ to select AUDIO menu and then press $>$.
3. Use $\wedge \vee$ to select [2.1 Speaker setup] menu and then press ENTER.
4. Press ENTER

The [2.1 Speaker setup] appears.

5. Use $<>$ to select the desired speaker.
6. Adjust options using $\wedge \vee<>$ buttons.
7. Press ENTER to confirm your selection. Return to the previous menu.

## Speaker selection

Select a speaker that you want to adjust.

## ! <br> NOTE

Certain speaker settings are prohibited by the Dolby Digital licensing agreement.

Volume - Press < > to adjust the output level of the selected speaker.

Test - Press < > to test the signals of each speaker. Adjust the volume to match the volume of test signals memorized in the system.

## DRC (Dynamic Range Control)

Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [On] for this effect.

## Vocal

Select [On] to mix karaoke channels into normal stereo.

This function is effective for multi-channel karaoke DVDs only.

## LOCK (Parental Control)

## Initial Setting of the Area Code

When you use this unit for the first time, you have to set the Area Code as shown below.

1. Select the [Lock] menu and then press $>$.
2. Press $>$.

To access the [Lock] options, you must input the password you have created. Input a password and press ENTER. Enter it again and press ENTER to verify. If you make a mistake before pressing ENTER, press CLEAR
3. Select the first character using $\wedge \vee$ buttons.
4. Press $>$ and select the second character using $\wedge \vee$ buttons.
5. Press ENTER to confirm your Area code selection.

## Rating

Blocks playback of rated DVDs based on their contents. Not all discs are rated.

1. Select [Rating] on the [Lock] menu then press $>$.
2. Input a password and press ENTER.
3. Select a rating from 1 to 8 using the $\wedge \vee$ buttons.

## [Rating 1-8]

Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

## [Unlock]

If you select unlock, parental control is not active and the disc plays in full.
4. Press ENTER to confirm your rating selection.

## Password

You can enter or change password.

1. Select [Password] on the [Lock] menu and then press $>$.
2. Input a password and press ENTER.

To change the password, press ENTER when the [Change] option is highlighted. Input a password and press ENTER. Enter it again and press ENTER to verify.
3. Press SETUP to exit the menu.

## NOTE

If you forget your password, you can clear it using the following steps:

1. Press SETUP to display the Setup menu.
2. Input the 6-digit number "210499" and press ENTER. The password is cleared.

## Area Code

Enter the code of the area whose standards were used to rate the DVD video disc, based on the list on page 40.

1. Select [Area Code] on the [Lock] menu then press $>$.
2. Input a password and press ENTER.
3. Select the first character using $\wedge \vee$ buttons.
4. Press $>$ and select the second character using $\wedge \vee$ buttons.

## Disc/ USB Operations

1. Insert the disc by using the OPEN/CLOSE or connect the USB device to the USB port.

During playback, press SUBTITLE ( . . ) repeatedly to select a desired subtitle language.

## 1.5 times speed playback DVD

The 1.5 speed allows you to watch the pictures and listen to the sound quicker than playing at a normal speed.

1. During playback, press PLAY ( ) to play at 1.5 times speed. " $\times 1.5$ " appears on the screen.
2. Press $\operatorname{PLAY}(\stackrel{)}{ }$ again to exit.

## Starting play from selected

 time DVD DivXTo start playing at any chosen time on the file or title.

## Screen Saver

The screen saver appears when you leave the unit in Stop mode for about five minutes.

## System Select - Optional

You must select the appropriate system mode for your TV system. If "NO DISC" appears in the display window, press and hold
PAUSE/STEP (II) for more than five seconds to be able to select a system. (AUTO/ PAL/ NTSC)

## Displaying file information (ID3 TAG )

While playing an MP3 file containing file information, you can display the information by pressing DISPLAY.

## MP3 WMA ACD

Auto DJ blends the end of one song into the beginning of another for seamless playback. It equalizes volume across tracks for uninterrupted playback.

## NOTE

- Searching for a section within a track or playing repeatedly or randomly is not supported on the AUTO DJ mode.
- If you switch to other functions or stop the music by pressing STOP twice on the unit(or © on the remote control) on AUTO DJ mode, AUTO DJ function will be disable.
- AUTO DJ function is not supported in the music file whose length is less than 60 seconds.
- All musics are repeated continuously until the user deactivates the AUTO DJ function.
- During the AUTO DJ operation, SCAN function is not available.
- During recording AUTO DJ function is not available.
- If you change a disc while the AUTO DJ function is activated the function is deactivated.


## VOCAL FADER

You can enjoy the function as karaoke, by reducing singer vocal of music in the various source. (MP3/WMA/ CD/ etc.)
Press the VOCAL FADER, and "FADE ON" will appear in display window.
To cancel it, press VOCAL FADER again.
The quality of the VOCAL FADER may be different depending on the recording conditions of music files.

## Listening to the radio

1. Press FUNCTION on the remote control or TUNER on the unit until FM or AM (optional) (MW) appears in the display window. The last received station is tuned in.
2. Press and hold TUNING (-/+) on the unit or TUN.(-/+) on the remote control for about two seconds until the frequency indication starts to change, then release. Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

## or

Press TUNING (-/+) on the unit or TUN.(-/+) on the remote control repeatedly.
3. Adjust the volume by rotating VOL. on the front panel or by pressing VOL (-/+) on the remote control repeatedly.

## Presetting the Radio Stations

You can preset 50 stations for FM and AM (optional) (MW).
Before tuning, make sure that you have turned down the volume.

"ERASE ALL" will flash up on the unit display.
2. Press PROG./MEMO. to erase of the saved radio stations.

## Setting the surround mode

This system has a number of pre-set surround sound fields. You can select a desired sound mode by using LG EQ/EQ

You can change the LG EQ/EQ using < > arrow key while the sound effect information is displayed on.

The displayed items for the equalizer maybe different depending on sound sources and effects.

- In some of surround modes, some speakers, there's no sound or low sound. It depends on the mode of surround and the source of audio, it is not defective.
- You may need to reset the surround mode, after switching the input, sometimes even after the sound track changed.
- You can not choose the VIRTUAL option, when the MIC is connected to the unit.


## Setting the USER EQ

You can listen to music with the desired sound effect by adjusting the BASS, MIDDLE and TREBLE.

1. Press USER EQ. "USER EQ" is displayed.
2. Press SET to enter the USER EQ.
3. Select the BASS, MIDDLE or TREBLE sound effect you want by using < (-)PRESET(+)> on the unit.
4. Press $\mid \ll(-)$ TUNING(+) >>| on the unit to select the sound level you want.

> The display changed in the following order, "USB REC" <->"TAPE REC"

## Notes on Discs

## Handling Discs



Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

## Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

## Cleaning Discs



Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

## Handling the Unit

## When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

## Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.
Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.
Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

## Cleaning the unit

To clean the player, use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent
