





SLEEP: Sets the system to turn off automatically at a specified time. (Dimmer: The display window will be darken by half.)






Attaching the speakers to the unit

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals on the unit. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

Connect the black end of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).



Connect the other end of each wire to the correct speaker according to the color coding:


- Be careful to make sure children not to put their hands or any objects into the *speaker duct.
 *Speaker duct: A hole for plentiful bass sound on speaker cabinet (enclosure).
- The speakers contain magnet parts, so color irregularity may occur on the TV screen or PC monitor screen. Please use the speakers far away from either TV screen or PC monitor.





Positioning the system (MDS715 only)

The following illustration shows an example of positioning the system. Note that the illustrations in these instructions differ from the actual unit for explanation purposes. For the best possible surround sound, all the speakers other than the subwoofer should be placed at the same distance from the listening position (A).



(A) Front left speaker (L)/

B Front right speaker (R):

Place the front speakers to the sides of the monitor or screen and as flush with the screen surface as possible.

© Center speaker:

Place the center speaker above or below the monitor or screen.

(D) Surround left speaker (L)/

(E) Surround right speaker (R):

Place these speakers behind your listening position, facing slightly inwards.

(F) Subwoofer:

The position of the subwoofer is not so critical, because low bass sounds are not highly directional. But it is better to place the subwoofer near the front speakers. Turn it slightly toward the center of the room to reduce the wall reflections.

Connections to Your TV

Make one of the following connections, depending on the capabilities of your existing equipment.




- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the unit. Use only one of the connections described in this manual.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.
- Make sure the unit is connected directly to the TV. Tune the TV to the correct video input channel.
- Do not connect your unit via your VCR. The image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

Component Video Connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT (PROGRESSIVE SCAN) jacks on the unit to the corresponding input jacks on the TV using component cables.

You can hear the sound through the system's speakers.












Video Connection

Connect the VIDEO OUT jack on the unit to the video in jack on the TV using a video cable.



Connect an Output of auxiliary device to the AUX (L/R) INPUT Connector.






If your TV has only one output for audio (mono), connect it to the left (white) audio jack on the unit.





USB Connection

Connect the USB port of USB Memory (or MP3 player, etc.) to the USB port on the front of the unit.



Removing the USB Device from the unit

- 1. Choose a different function mode or press **STOP** (■) twice in a row.
- 2. Remove the USB device from the unit.

Compatible USB Devices

- MP3 Player : Flash type MP3 player.
- USB Flash Drive : Devices that support USB 2.0 or USB 1.1.
- The USB function of this unit does not support some USB devices.

USB device requirement

- Devices which require additional program installation connected to a computer, are not supported.
- Do not extract the USB device while in operation.
- For a large capacity USB, it may take longer than a few minute to be searched.
- To prevent data loss, back up all data.
- If you use a USB extension cable or USB hub, the USB device is not recognized.
- Using NTFS file system is not supported.
 (Only FAT(16/ 32) file system is supported.)
- This unit is not supported when the total number of files is 1,000 or more.
- External HDD, Card readers, Locked devices, or hard type USB devices are not supported.
- USB port of the unit cannot be connected to PC. The unit can not be used as a storage device.

Enjoying audio from an external source and selecting the function

You can enjoy audio from an external source through your unit. And you can select the function.

Press **RADIO&INPUT** repeatedly to select the desired input source or the function. - DVD/CD, AUX, iPod, PORTABLE, TAPE, FM, AM








AUDIO (PORT. IN) In Connection




Antenna Connection

Connect the supplied FM/AM antenna for listening to the radio.

Connect the AM Loop antenna to the AM antenna connector. (A)

Connect the FM wire antenna to the FM antenna connector. (F)





NOTE

- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM Loop antenna away from the unit and other components.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
 After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it as horizontal as possible.







Adjust the setup settings

OSD Initial language settings -Optional

During the first use of this unit, the initial language setup menu appears on your TV screen. You must complete initial language selection before using the unit. English will be selected as the initial language.

 Press POWER to turn the unit on. The language setup menu will appear on the screen.



2. Use Λ V < > to select a language then press ENTER.

The confirm menu will appear.



3. Use < > to select the [Enter] then press **ENTER** to finish the language setup.

To display and exit the Setup menu

Press HOME.

Menu Language

Disc Audio / Disc Subtitle / Disc Menu

Select the language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.

[Original]

Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

[Other]

To select another language, press numeric buttons and then **ENTER** to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on the page 42. If you enter the wrong language code, press **CLEAR**.

[Off (for Disc Subtitle)]

Turn off Subtitle.

Display

TV Aspect

Select which screen aspect to use based on the shape of your TV screen.

[4:3]

Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.

[16:9]

Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

Display Mode

The Display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to 4:3.

[Letterbox]

Displays a wide picture with bands on the upper and lower portions of the screen.

[Panscan]

Automatically displays the wide picture on the entire screen and cuts off the portions that do not fit. (If the disc/file is not compatible with Pan Scan, the picture is displayed at Letterbox ratio.)

Progressive Scan (For Component Video connections)

Selects whether the COMPONENT/
PROGRESSIVE SCAN OUTPUT jacks output
progressive signal. If your TV accepts
progressive format signals, you will enjoy
accurate color reproduction and high quality
image by selecting [On]. If your TV does not

If you set Progressive Scan to [On] in error, you
must reset the unit. First, remove the disc in

Audio

5.1 Speaker Setup (MDS 715)

Make the following settings for the built-in 5.1 channel surround decoder.

- **1.** Select [5.1 Speaker Setup] on the [Audio] menu.
- 2. Press ENTER.

The [5.1 SPEAKER] appears.



- **3.** Use < > to select the desired speaker.
- **4.** Adjust options using $\wedge \vee <>$ buttons.
- **5.** Returns to the previous menu by pressing **RETURN**.

2.1 Speaker Setup (MDT 505)

Make the following settings for the built-in 2.1 channel surround decoder.

- 1. Select [2.1 Speaker Setup] on the [Audio] menu.
- 2. Press ENTER.

The [2.1 SPEAKER] appears.



- **3.** Use < > to select the desired speaker.
- **4.** Adjust options using $\land \lor <>$ buttons.

5. Returns to the previous menu by pressing **RETURN**.

[Speaker]

Select a speaker that you want to adjust.



NOTE

Certain speaker settings are prohibited by the Dolby Digital licensing agreement.

[Size]

Since the speaker settings are fixed, you cannot change the settings.

[Volume]

Adjust the output level of each speaker.

[Distance]

Adjust the distance between each speaker and the listening position.

[Speaker Test Start]

Select [Speaker Test Start] by using the Λ V and press **ENTER**. Press **ENTER** again to stop. Adjust the volume to match the volume of test signals memorized in the system.







DRC (Dynamic Range Control)

Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [On] for this effect

Vocal

Select [On] to mix karaoke channels into normal stereo.

This function is effective for multi-channel karaoke DVDs only.

Semi Karaoke

When a chapter/ title/ track is fully finished, this function shows the score in the screen with a fanfare sound.

[On]

When you finished singing a score will appear on the screen.

[Off]

Fanfare and score do not appears on the screen.



NOTE

- DVD, DVD Karaoke discs with more than 2 tracks are available discs for this function.
- When you watch movies, "off "the Semi Karaoke at the SETUP menu or enjoy it without connecting the MIC if the fanfare or score appears during changing a chapter.
- This function operate on the DVD/CD mode.
- The Semi Karaoke function is available only when a microphone is connected.

Lock (Parental Control)

Initial Setting of the Area Code:

When you use this unit for the first time, you have to set the Area Code.

- 1. Select the [Lock] menu and then press >.
- **2.** Press >.

To access the [Lock] options, you must input the password you have created. Input a password and press **ENTER**. Enter it again and press **ENTER** to verify. If you make a mistake before pressing **ENTER**, press **CLEAR**

- **3.** Select the first character using \wedge **V** buttons.
- Press ENTER and select the second character using ∧ V buttons.
- **5.** Press **ENTER** to confirm your Area code selection.

Rating

Blocks playback of rated DVDs based on their contents. Not all discs are rated.

- 1. Select [Rating] on the [Lock] menu then press >.
- 2. Input a password and press ENTER.
- Select a rating from 1 to 8 using the Λ V buttons.

[Rating 1-8]

Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

[Unlock]

If you select unlock, parental control is not active and the disc plays in full.

4. Press **ENTER** to confirm your rating selection.







Password

You can enter or change password.

- Select [Password] on the [Lock] menu and then press >.
- 2. Press ENTER.
- 3. Input a password and press ENTER.

To change the password, press **ENTER** when the [Change] option is highlighted. Input a password and press **ENTER**. Enter it again and press **ENTER** to verify.

4. Press **HOME** to exit the menu.



NOTE

If you forget your password, you can clear it using the following steps:

- 1. Select the [Setup] menu on the [Home] menu.
- 2. Input the 6-digit number "210499" and press **ENTER**. The password is cleared.

Area Code

Enter the code of the area whose standards were used to rate the DVD video disc, based on the list on page 43.

- Select [Area Code] on the [Lock] menu then press >.
- 2. Input a password and press ENTER.
- **3.** Select the first character using Λ **V** buttons.




Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

Cleaning Discs



Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.

Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.

Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

Cleaning the unit
