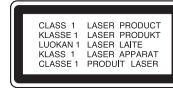

DVD-RW (8 cm / 12 cm disc)  
- VR mode, Video mode and finalized only  
- DVD-RW discs that contain Movie, Music or Photo files.



DVD+RW (8 cm / 12 cm disc)  
- Video mode only  
- DVD+RW discs that contain Movie, Music or Photo files.

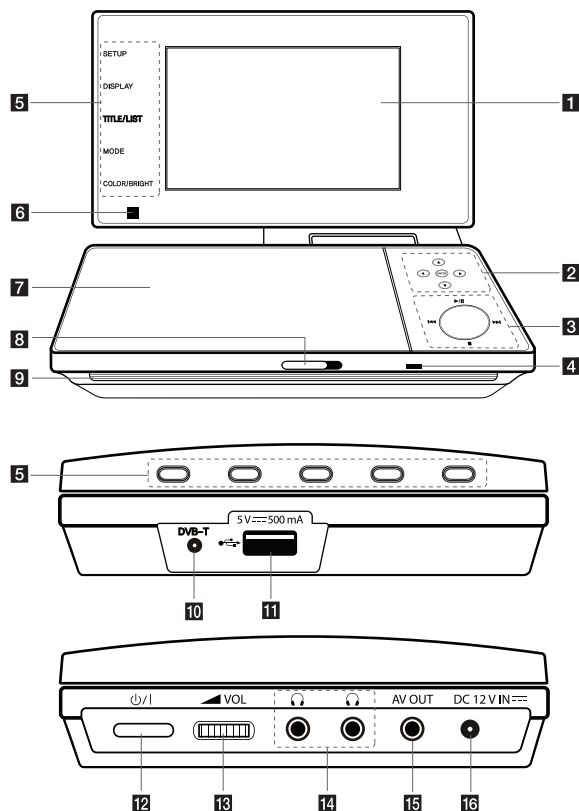

# Main Unit



## 1 LCD screen

## 2 Menu control buttons

- ENTER: Presses to confirm menu selection.
- ◀▶▲▼ (left/right/up/down): Uses to select an item in the menu.

## 3 Playback control buttons

- ▶ / || (Play/Pause): Presses to start playback and pause playback temporarily, press again to exit pause mode.
- ■ (Stop): Presses to stop playback.
- ◀◀ (Skip): Presses to search backward\* or return to the beginning of current chapters/ tracks/ files or go to the previous chapters/ tracks/ files.
- ▶▶ (Skip): Presses to search forward\* or go to next chapters/ tracks/ files.

\* Presses and hold button for about two seconds.

## 4 Battery charge and power indicator

- The indicator turns red in charging and it will be turned into green when the charging is complete. (Refer to page 8 for details.)
- The indicator turns green when the unit is turned on.

## 5 Function buttons

- SETUP: Presses to access or exit the setup menu.
- DISPLAY: Presses to access On-Screen Display.
- TITLE/LIST: Press to access the title menu.  
Displays the channel list.
- MODE: Selects an operation mode. (DVB-T, DAB or Disc)
- COLOR/BRIGHT: Presses to display the Brightness or Colour menu for LCD display.
- \* To adjust the colour or brightness of the LCD display, press COLOR/ BRIGHT repeatedly on the main unit to display the Brightness or Colour menu then use ◀▶ to adjust the value. Press ENTER to confirm the adjustment.

- 6 Remote sensor: Points the remote control here. To control the unit using the remote control, do not fold the LCD panel down.

## 7 Disc Lid

- 8 CD OPEN —▶: Uses the slide open key to open the disc lid.

## 9 Speakers

- 10 DVB-T: Connects the external antenna or RF cable hub.

- 11 USB Port: Connects a USB Flash Drive.

- 12 ⏻/I (Power): Presses to turn the unit ON or OFF.

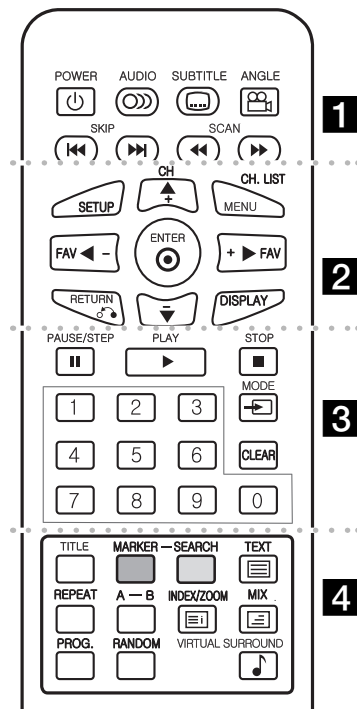
- 13 ◀ VOL (Volume): Uses to adjust the volume level of the built-in speaker and earphones.

- 14 🎧 (Earphones): Connects earphones here.

- 15 AV OUT: Connects to a TV with video and audio input.

- 16 DC 12V IN: Connects the AC adapter or automotive adapter.

# Remote Control



**1** **POWER** (⏻): Switches the unit ON or OFF.

**AUDIO** (🔊): Selects an audio language or audio channel.

**SUBTITLE** (📄): Selects a subtitle language.

**ANGLE** (📷): Selects a DVD camera angle, if available.

**SKIP** (⏮ / ⏭): Goes to next or previous chapter/track/file.

**SCAN** (⏮/⏭): Searches backward or forward.

**2** **SETUP**: Accesses or exits the setup menu.

**MENU**: Accesses the DVD menu.

**CH (+/-)**: Scans up or down through memorized channels.

**CH. LIST**: Displays the channel list.

**▲▼ ◀▶**: Navigates the menus.

**FAV (+/-)**: Tunes to your favorite channels.

**ENTER** (⊙): Confirms menu selection.

**RETURN** (↶): Presses to move backwards in the menu or exit the menu.

**DISPLAY**: Accesses On-Screen Display.

**3** **PAUSE/STEP** (⏸): Pauses playback temporarily/press repeatedly for frame-by-frame playback.

**PLAY** (▶): Starts playback.

**STOP** (■): Stops playback.

**Numerical buttons**: Selects numbered options in a menu.

**MODE**: Switches a operation mode.

**CLEAR**: Removes a track number on the Program List.

**4** **TITLE**: Accesses the disc's title menu.

**MARKER**: Marks any point during playback.

**SEARCH**: Displays [Marker Search] menu.

**TEXT** (📄): Switches between teletext mode and normal TV viewing.

**REPEAT**: Repeats a chapter, track, title or all.

**A-B**: Repeats a section.

**INDEX/ZOOM** (📄): Moves to Index screen or page 100 in the teletext mode. Enlarges video image in disc mode.

**MIX** (📄): Displays the teletext pages superimposed on the TV picture.

**PROG.:** Enters the program edit mode.

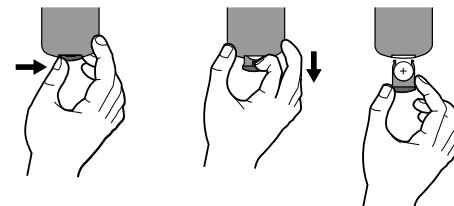
**RANDOM**: Plays tracks in random order.

**VIRTUAL SURROUND**: Presses repeatedly to apply the various sound effects. (Refer to 14 page)

## Put the battery into the Remote Control

Pinch the battery holder clip together then pull the tab to remove the battery holder. Insert the battery with the + facing in the same direction as the + on the battery holder. Replace the battery holder with battery into the Remote Control unit making sure that it is fully inserted.

- Replace Remote Control unit battery with 3 V micro lithium cells such as CR. 2025 or its equivalent.
- Dispose of battery safely in accordance with local laws. Do not dispose of in fire.

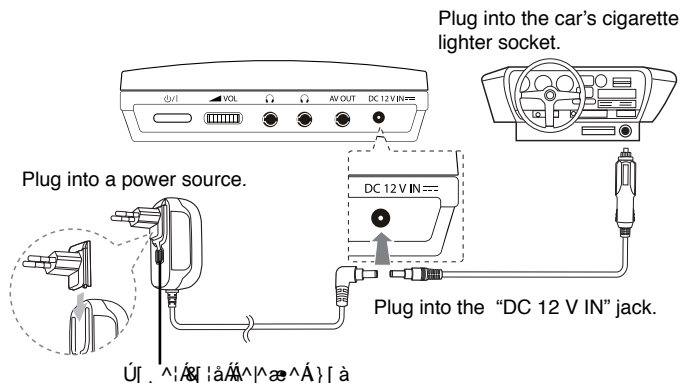

## Power connections

### Connecting the AC Adapter

Connect the supplied AC Adapter from the unit to a power socket.



\* The actual set may differ from the drawing.

### AC adapter

- This AC adapter operates on 100 - 240 V - 1.0 A 50 / 60 Hz.
- Contact an electrical parts distributor for assistance in selecting a suitable AC plug adapter or AC cord set.
- Manufactured by NANJING WANLIDA TECHNOLOGY CO., LTD.

### Connecting the Automotive adapter

This unit and its automotive adapter are designed for use in vehicles that have 8.5 - 15 volt, negative ground electrical systems. This is standard for most vehicles. If your vehicle has a different type of electrical system, the DC power system cannot be used.

#### Automotive adapter

- This automotive adapter operates on DC 8.5 - 15 V.
- Contact an electrical parts distributor for assistance in selecting a suitable automotive adapter.
- Manufactured by GRAND POWER ELECTRONIC TECHNOLOGY (SHENZHEN) CO., LTD.

#### Caution

- To prevent electrical shock and possible damage to your unit or vehicle, always unplug the automotive adapter from the cigarette lighter socket before you remove the plug from your unit.
- A 3 amp. 250 V fuse for protection is installed in the automotive adapter.
- While the engine is being started, disconnect the automotive adapter from the car's cigarette lighter socket.
- Do not operate your unit when the car battery is discharged. Peak current from the car generator may cause the DC fuse to blow.
- If the vehicle's supply voltage drops below approximately 10 volts, your unit may not work properly.
- Do not leave your unit in a place where the temperature exceeds 40 °C (104 °F), or the pick-up device may be damaged.

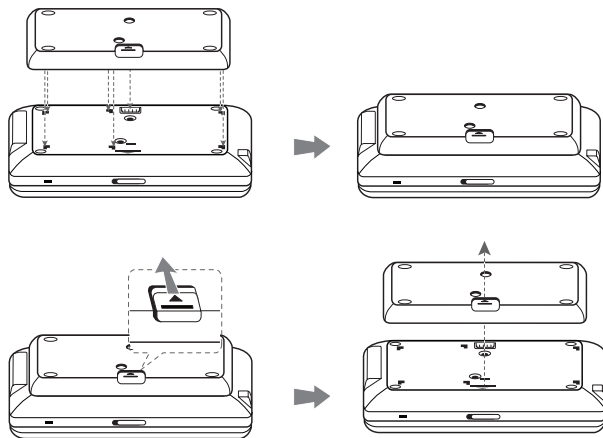

## Attaching the Battery Pack

The following picture shows how to attach or detach the battery pack. You can attach or detach the battery pack as the following

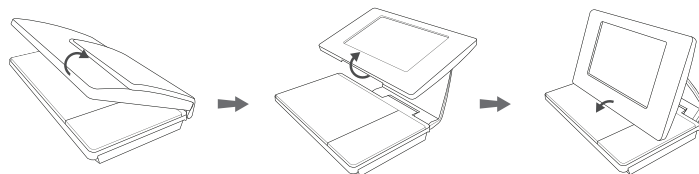
### Attach / Detach



- Charging time on the battery:
  - approximately 2 hours (DP570T only)
  - approximately 2 hours 30 minutes (DP571T only)
- The battery operating time may vary depending on the battery status, operational status and environment conditions.
- The battery indicator will be turned on red light while be recharged. Once the charging is completed, the indicator will be changed to green.
- When the remained time of the battery usage is under a few seconds, "⚠ Check Battery" will be displayed on the screen.

## Opening the LCD panel

To open LCD panel, place the unit on a stable place such as table and do as following.



## Rechargeable Battery

- Its rechargeable battery provides you with the freedom to pass it around and plays the files without the power cord.
- The rechargeable battery will start charging only when the AC adaptor is connected to a power outlet.
- Operating time on the battery:
  - approximately 2 hours 30 minutes (DP570T only)
  - approximately 4 hours (DP571T only)
- The maximum playing time:
  - approximately 3 hours (DP570T only)
  - approximately 5 hours (DP571T only)

Pull up the LCD panel to the vertical position and pull forward LCD panel. And then put it down to desired angle on disc lid.

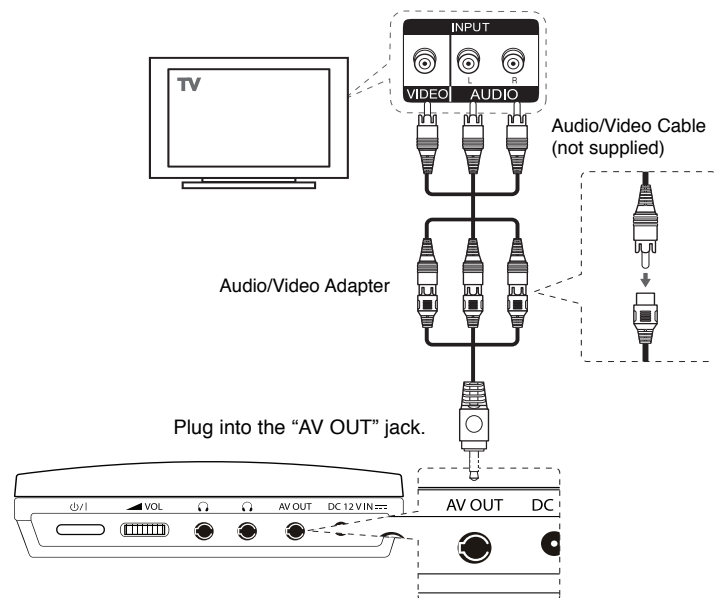
- When finished using the unit, return the LCD panel to its original position.
- Do not leave the LCD panel in the face-up position, or sudden shocks may damage it.



# Hooking up the unit

## Audio and Video Connection

Connect the AV OUT jack on the unit to the corresponding input jacks on your TV using the supplied AV cable as shown below.

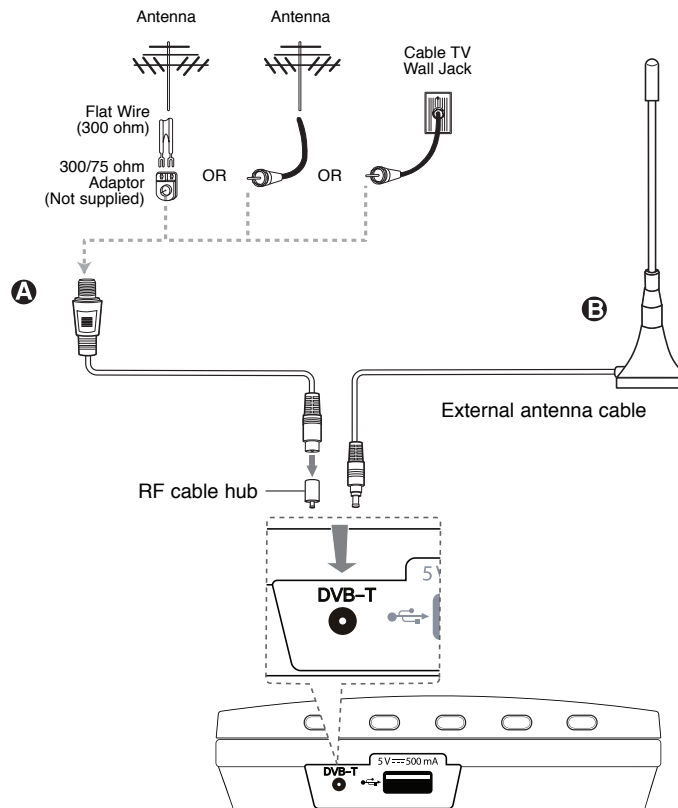


## Antenna Connection

Connect the TV antenna to the DVB-T jack on the unit after selecting one between **A** and **B** as shown below:

**A**: Connect an indoor antenna cable using supplied RF cable hub.

**B**: Connect a supplied External antenna cable.



## General about digital broadcast

---

### Picture and sound

Digital TV is a transmission technology that replaces the traditional analogue technique.

This means that several TV channels, radio channels and other digital services can be transmitted on the same space as just one channel took up before. As a consumer you get access to many more channels and services than before at the same time as they are received with perfect picture and audio quality.

### Coverage

Before buying this product it is anticipated that you have made sure that there are digital transmissions covering your region.

### Antenna / Signal source

Depending on the reception your unit may be connected to a simple indoor antenna or to an existing outdoor antenna system. If you live in a flat you should make sure that the digital terrestrial signals are distributed to your wall antenna outlet. If you have your own antenna system you must make sure that it is equipped with antennas, filter and/or amplifier that can handle those frequencies that the digital channels are transmitted on.

### Cable-TV

Please observe that this unit is not designed for the reception of regular digital cable-TV signals (QAM-signal). Despite this, operators of smaller cable networks may have chosen to distribute the digital terrestrial signals (COFDM-signal) in the network. In this case this unit may well be used.

Check with your landlord if you are insecure about what type of TV-signal that is provided in the wall antenna outlet.

## Selecting the operation mode

You must select one of the operating modes before operating.

Press **MODE** repeatedly to change the mode among DVB-T, DAB or Disc.

- **Disc:** You should select the Disc mode before using playback functions or disc setup setting.
- **DVB-T:** You should select the DVB-T mode before watching TV channel or using TV setup setting.
- **DAB:** You should select the DAB mode before listening to the radio or using radio setup setting.

## Adjust the settings - more you can do

### When you turn on for the first time (optional)

The menu for a language selection will appear when you turn on the unit for the first time. You must select a language to use the unit. Use ▲▼◀▶ to select a language then press **ENTER** and the confirm menu will appear. Use ◀▶ to select [ENTER] then press **ENTER**.

### Adjust the language settings

**Menu Language** – Select a language for the Setup menu and on-screen display.

**Disc Audio/Subtitle/Menu** – Select a language for the Disc Audio/Subtitle/Menu.

[Original]: Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

[Other]: To select another language, press number buttons then **ENTER** to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list. (see page 20) If you make a mistake while entering number, press **CLEAR** to delete numbers then correct it.

[Off] (for Disc Subtitle): Turn off Subtitle.

## Adjust the display settings

**TV Aspect** – Select which screen aspect to use based on the shape of your TV screen.

[4:3]: Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.

[16:9]: Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

**Display Mode** – If you selected 4:3, you'll need to define how you would like widescreen programs and films to be displayed on your TV screen.

[Letterbox]: This displays a widescreen picture with black bands at the top and bottom of the screen.

[Panscan]: This fills the entire 4:3 screen, cropping the picture as necessary.

## Adjust the audio settings

**DRC (Dynamic Range Control)** – Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [On] for this effect.

**Vocal** – Set to [On] only when a multi-channel karaoke DVD is playing. The karaoke channels on the disc mix into normal stereo sound.

## Adjust the lock settings

You must set the [Area Code] option to use the lock options. Select [Area Code] option then press ►. Enter a 4-digit password then press **ENTER**. Enter it again then press **ENTER** to verify. If you make a mistake while entering number, press **CLEAR** then correct it.

If you forget your password you can reset it. First, remove the disc in the unit. Select Lock icon on the Setup menu. Input the 6-digit number "210499" and the password will be cleared.

**Rating** – Select a rating level. The lower the level, the stricter the rating. Select [Unlock] to deactivate the rating.

**Password** – Sets or changes the password for lock settings.

[New]: Enter a new 4-digits password using the numerical buttons then press **ENTER**. Enter the password again to confirm.

[Change]: Enter the new password twice after entering the current password.

**Area Code** – Select a code for a geographic area as the playback rating level. This determines which area's standards are used to rate DVDs controlled by the parental lock. (See page 20)

## Adjust the others settings

**REC Bitrate** – You can choose a bit rate for USB direct recording.

Higher bit rate gives the better sound quality but uses more space on the USB Flash Drive. For USB direct recording, see page 17.

## Playing a Disc - more you can do

### Stops the playback

Press **STOP (■)** to stop playback, the unit records the stopped point depending on the disc. "■■■" appears on the screen briefly. Press **PLAY (▶)** to resume playback (from the scene point). If you press **STOP (■)** again or unload the disc ("■" appears on the screen), the unit will clear the stopped point.

(■■■ =Resume Stop, ■ =Complete Stop)

The resume point may be cleared when a button is pressed. (for example: POWER, OPEN, etc)

### Playing a DVD that has a menu **DVD**

Most DVD now have menus which load first before the film begins to play. You can navigate these menus using ▲▼◀▶ or number button to highlight an option. Press **ENTER** to select.

### Playing a DVD VR disc

This unit will play DVD-RW disc that is recorded using the Video Recording (VR) format. When you insert a disc DVD VR disc, the menu will appear on the screen. Use ▲▼ to select a title then press **PLAY (▶)**. To display DVD-VR menu, press **MENU** or **TITLE**.

Some DVD-VR disc are made with CPRM data by DVD RECORDER. The unit does not support these kinds of discs.

### Skip to the next/previous chapter/track/file **ALL**

Press **SKIP (▶▶I)** to move to the next chapter/track/file.  
Press **SKIP (I◀◀)** to return to the beginning of the current chapter/track/file.  
Press **SKIP (I◀◀)** twice briefly to step back to the previous chapter/track/file.

### Pause a playback **ALL**

### Frame-by-Frame playback **DVD DivX**

### Playing repeatedly **ALL**


## Viewing a Teletext service

Teletext is a free broadcasting service by some TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programs, share prices and many other topics.

The unit gives you access to teletext which is greatly improved in various aspects such as text and graphics. This teletext can be accessed by special teletext services and specific services which broadcast teletext.

In DVB-T mode, use numbered (0-9) buttons or **CH - / +** on the remote control to change the channel which broadcast teletext. Press **TEXT** to access on the teletext.

Follow the indications on teletext and move onto the next or previous step by pressing color (Red or Green) or **▲ ▼** buttons.

Press **TEXT** or **RETURN** () to turn the teletext off and return to TV viewing

## Selecting teletext page

Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the numbered buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then enter the correct page number again.

Use Red/Green buttons to move up and down pages

## Special Teletext Functions

**MIX button** – Displays the teletext pages superimposed on the TV picture.

To switch the TV picture off press this button again.

**INDEX/ZOOM button** – The teletext pages are colour coded along the bottom of the screen and are selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button.

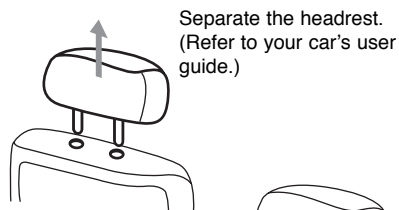
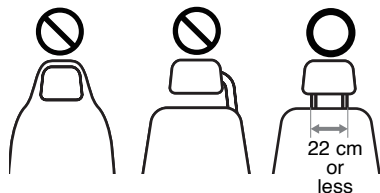

You can enjoy video in the back seat attaching the unit to the back of the front seat.

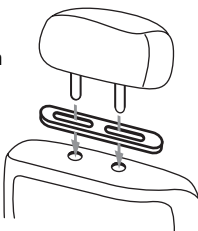
### Warnings

- Depending on the type of headrest, you may not be able to attach the bracket.



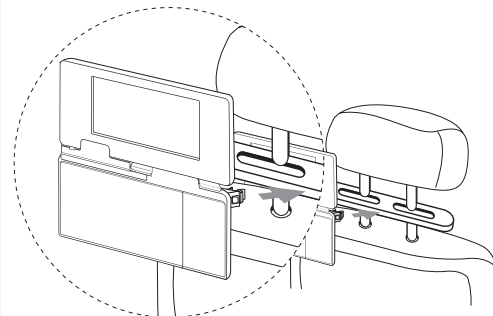
Install the cradle as shown in the figure.

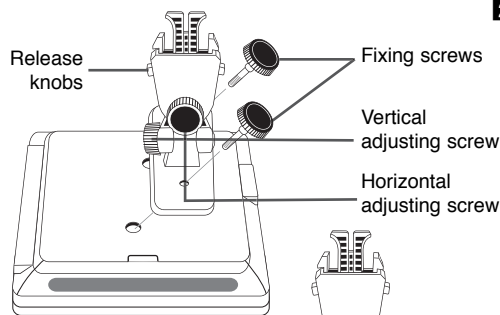

Fit the headrest mounting bracket joined the unit to the cradle.

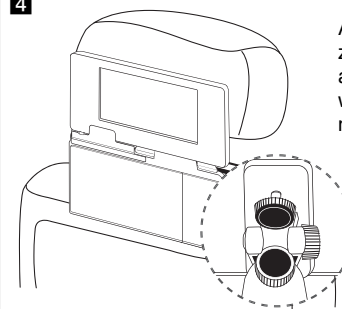
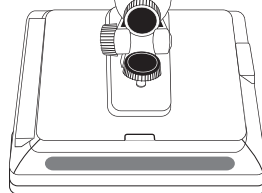

Adjust the horizontal and vertical angles as you want and enjoy the movies.

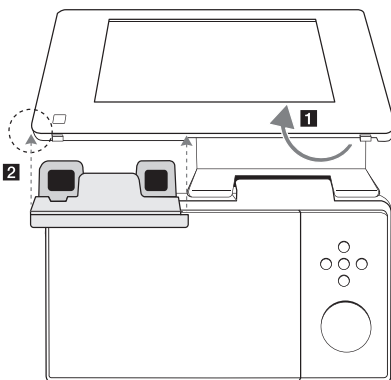
**Note:** When you adjust angles, loose the adjusting screws. Adjusting by force can lead the damage to the inside of your headrest mounting bracket.

In case of installation of this unit headrest of car seat, Bracket must be installed to prevent shaking of LCD panel as below.

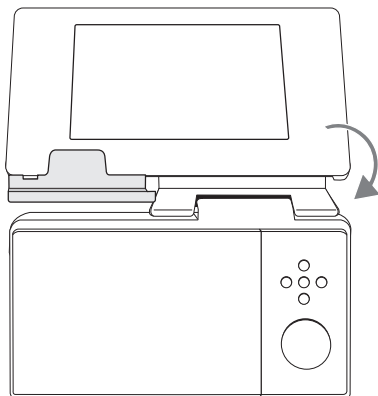

After installation of this unit on headrest, lift the LCD panel to the maximum as picture.

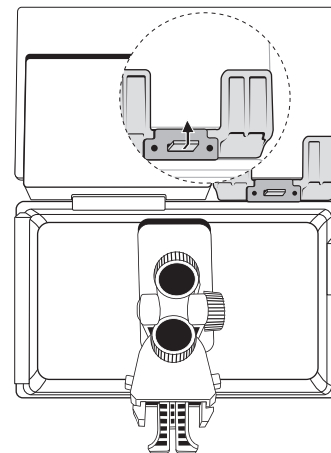


Drag down LCD panel to install another side of Bracket up to the click of latch installation of Bracket is completed.
