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Important Precautions

This unit has been engineered and manufactured to assure your personal safety, however improper use may result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. In order to allow the proper operation of all safeguards incorporated in this TV set, observe the following basic rules for its installation, use and servicing. Keep it in an accessible place for future reference.

On Safety

The power supply cord is used as the main disconnect device. Ensure that the socket-outlet is easily accessible after installation.

Operate the TV set only from a power source indicated in the specifications of this manual or listed on the TV set. If you are not sure what type of power supply you have in your home, consult with your dealer.

Overloaded AC outlets and extension cords are dangerous. So are frayed power cords and broken plugs. They may result in a shock or fire hazard. Call your service technician for replacement.

Hands must be dry when holding the power plug to avoid an electric shock.

Do not damage the power cord by disassembling, bending, pulling or heating up, it can cause fire or electric shock.

Make sure to completely insert the power plug. Insecure connections can cause fire.

Do not Open the TV set

- There are no user serviceable components inside.
- There are Dangerous High Voltages inside, even when the power is Off.
- Contact your dealer if the TV is not operating properly.

To Avoid Personal Injury:

- Do not place the TV set on a sloping shelf unless properly secured.
- Use only fixed wooden stand. The TV shall be positioned 5cm behind the front edge of an open fronted with 1cm free space along the sides top and 5cm depth behind the TV.
- Do not try to roll a stand with small casters across thresholds or deep pile carpets.

To Prevent Fire or Hazards:

- Always turn the TV set Off if you leave the room for more than a short period of time. Never leave the TV set On when leaving the house.
- Keep children from dropping or pushing objects into the TV cabinet openings. Some internal parts carry hazardous voltages.
- Do not add accessories that have not been designed for this TV set.
- During a lighting storm or when the TV set is to be left unattended for an extended period of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and external socket.
- Do not bring magnetic devices such as magnets or motors near the picture tube.

Important Precautions

On Installation

Do not allow anything to rest upon or roll over the power cord, and do not place the TV set where the power cord is subject to damage.

Power

This set operates on an AC mains supply, the voltage is as indicated on the label on the back cover. Never apply DC power to the set. In the event of thunderstorms or powercuts, please pull out the aerial and mains plugs.

Service

Do not attempt to service the TV set yourself, as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

Aeria

Connect the aerial cable to the socket marked $\ \ \Gamma$ 75 $\ \Omega$ on the back cover. For the best reception an outdoor aerial should be used.

Location

Do not use this TV near water such as near bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundary tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.

TV set are provided with ventilation openings in the cabinet to allow the release of heat generated during operation. If these openings are blocked, built-up heat can cause failures which may result in a fire hazard. There fore,

- The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items such as newspaper, table cloths, curtains, etc.
- Never place the TV set in a built-in enclosure unless proper ventilation is provided.
- No naked flame source such as lighted candles should be placed on the TV.
- Never place the TV set near or over a radiator or heat source.
- Position your set so that no bright light or sunlight falls directly onto the screen.

On Cleaning

- Unplug the TV set before cleaning the face of the TV screen.
- Use a slightly damp (not wet) cloth. Do not use an aerosol directly on the TV screen because overspray may cause electric shock.

On Repacking

 Do not throw away the carton and packing materials. They make an ideal container in which to transport the unit. When shipping the unit to another location, repack it in its original material.

Caution: Please do not use stabilizer with TV set as this set has inbuilt voltage stabilizer. Use of Inferior quality stabilizer may damage the set.


Battery installation

The remote control handset is powered by two AA/AAA type batteries. To load the batteries, turn the remote control handset over and open the battery compartment. Install two batteries as indicated by the polarity symbols (\oplus and \ominus) marked inside the compartment.



Note: To avoid damage from possible battery leakage, remove the batteries if you do not plan to use the remote control handset for an extended period of time.

Location and function of controls



All the functions can be controlled with the remote control handset. Some functions can also be adjusted with the buttons on the front panel of the set.

Remote control handset

Before you use the remote control handset, please install the batteries. See the next page.

1. POWER

switches the set on from standby or off to standby.

2. NUMBER BUTTONS

switches the set on from standby or directly select a channel number.

3. ARC/* (Aspect Ratio Control) (Option)

changes the picture format.

4. TURBO PICTURE/SOUND BUTTON (option)

selects Turbo picture / sound.

5. ▲ / ▼ (Programme Up/Down)

selects a programme or a menu item. switches the set on from standby.

√ / ► (Volume Up/Down)

adjusts the volume. adjusts menu settings.

6. SSM (Sound Status Memory)

recalls your preferred sound setting.

7. I/II/* (option)

selects the language during dual language broadcast (option). selects the sound output.

8. PSM (Picture Status Memory)

recalls your preferred picture setting.

switches the sound on or off.

10.TV/AV


selects TV or AV mode. switches the set on from standby.

11.MENU

selects a menu.

12.OK

accepts your selection or displays the current mode.



Location and function of controls

13. LIST

displays the programme table.

14. EYE/*(option)

switches the eye function on or off.

15. SLEEP

sets the sleep timer.

16. Q.VIEW

returns to the previously viewed programme.

17. FAVOURITE

selects a favorite programme.


18. XDP/* (option)

Select Excellent Digital Picture.


19. TURBO SOUND/* (option) selects excellent digital surround.

Battery installation

The remote control handset is powered by two AA type batteries. To load the batteries, turn the remote control handset over and openthe battery compartment. Install two batteries as indicated by the polarity symbols $(\oplus$ and \odot) marked inside the compartment.





Location and function of controls

FRONT PANEL / SIDE PANEL (Option)

Shown below is a simplified representation of front or side panel, here shown may be somewhat different from your set.

 MAIN POWER (On/Off) switches the set On or Off.

POWER/STANDBY INDICATOR illuminates brightly when the set is in standby mode, dims when the set is switched On.

3. MENU selects a menu.

4. OK

accepts your selection or displays the current mode.

◀ / ► (Volume Down/Up)

adjusts the volume.
adjusts menu settings.

▲ / ▼ (Programme Up/Down)

selects a programme or a menu item. switches the set On from standby

5. REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR

Note: Only use the supplied remote control hand-set. (When you use others, they will not be able to function.)

AUDIO/VIDEO IN SOCKETS (AV IN2)(Option)
 Connect the audio/video out sockets
 of external equipment to these sockets.

S-VIDEO/AUDIOINSOCKET(S-AV)(Option)
 Connect the video out socket of an S-VIDEO VCR to the S-VIDEO socket. Connect the audio out sockets of the

B. HEADPHONE SOCKET(Option)
Connect the headphone plug to this socket.

S-VIDEO VCR to the audio sockets as in AV-2.

EYE (option) adjusts picture according to the surrounding conditions.

10. USB - socket (option) Connect the USB pen drive to this socket.



This feature is available with 21SA1model only. After installing the TV, you can adjust the TV set manually to the left or right direction by 15 degrees to suit your viewing position.

Basic operation

On and off

- 1. Press the main power button to switch the set on.
- If the set is in standby mode, press the POWER, ▲ / ▼, TV/AV
 or NUMBER buttons on the remote control handset to switch it
 on fully.
- 3. Press the **POWER** button on the remote control handset. The set reverts to standby mode.
- 4. Press the main power button again to switch the set off.

Note: If, while the set is switched on, the mains plug is disconnected, the set will switch to standby or power on when the mains plug is replaced in the mains power socket.

Programme selection

You can select a programme number with the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown or NUMBER buttons,

Volume adjustment

Press the ◀ / ▶ button to adjust the volume.

Quick view

Press the Q.VIEW button to view the last programme you were watching.

Note: In some model yellow key will work as quickview.

Mute function


Press the **MUTE** button. The sound is switched off and the display \bowtie appears.

You can cancel it by pressing the MUTE, ◀ / ▶, SSM, I/II (option), TURBO SOUND button.

On screen language selection (option)

The menu can be displayed on the screen in desired language. First select your language.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button to select **Language**.
- Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select your desired language.
 - All the on screen displays will appear in the selected language. Press the **OK** or ◀ button to select the Special menu.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.



On screen menus

The dialogue between you and your set takes place on screen with an operator menu. The buttons required for the operating steps are also displayed.

Menu selection


- Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to display each 1.
- menu.


 Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select a menu item.

 Press the ▶ button to display the sub menu or the pull-down menu.
- Change the setting of an item in the sub or pull-down menu with the ◀ / ▶ or ▲ / ▼.


You can move to the higher level menu with the OK or ◀ button and to move to the lower level menu press the \blacktriangleright button. **Note** :

- In some models, the **Normal/Turbo search** will not display, only the **Start** will display in the **Auto programme** menu In some models, **Tilt**, **Booster**, **Degauss** will not display. In some models, the **Language** will not display.









Up to 100 TV stations can be stored by programme numbers (0 to 99). Once you have preset the stations, you will be able to use the ▲ / ▼ or NUMBER buttons to scan the stations you programmed. Stations can be tuned using automatic or manual modes.

Note: In some models up to 200 TV stations can be stored.

Auto programme tuning

All stations that can be received are stored by this method. It is recommended that you use auto programme during installation of this set.

- Press the **MENU** button to select the Station menu. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto pro**-
- gramme.
 Press the ▶ button to display the Auto programme menu.



- Press the ▶ button. Select a TV system with the ▲ / ▼ button on the **System** pull-down menu;

 BG: (Asia/New Zealand/M.East/Africa/Australia)
- I : (Hong Kong/South Africa) **DK**: (East Europe/China/Africa/CIS) **M**: (USA/Korea/Philippines) (option)

 Press the ◀ button.
- Press the ◀ button.

 Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Storage from**.

 Press the ▶ button. Select the beginning programme number with the ◀ / ▶ button or NUMBER buttons on the **Storage from** pull-down menu. Any number under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' (or '00') in front of it, i.e. '05' (or '005') for 5.

 Press the ○K button.

 Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Normal** or **Turbo search**.

Option: In some models, you can only select Start.

Note

- Turbo search is faster than Normal search and in some models, these searches will automatically store all receivable stations.
- If the programmed station has poor quality sound, select the
- system again in the **Manual programme** menu.

 10. Press the ▶ button to begin auto programming. All receivable stations are stored.

To stop auto programming, press the **MENU** button. When auto programming is completed, the **Programme edit** menu appears on the screen. See the 'Programme edit' section to edit the stored programme.






Manual programme tuning

Manual programme lets you manually tune and arrange the stations in whatever order you desire. Also you can assign a station name with five characters to each programme number.

- Press the **MENU** button to select the Station menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Manual** programme.
- Press the button to display the Manual programme



- Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Storage**.

 Press the ► button to select the programme number. Select the desired programme number (0 to 99) with the ◀ / ► button or NUMBER buttons on the **Storage** pull-down menu. Any number under 10 is entered with a purpose (90 or 100) in front of ber under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' (or '00') in front of it, i.e. '05' (or '005') for 5.

- Press the **OK** button.

 Press the **A** / ▼ button to select **System**.

 Press the ► button. Select a TV system with the ▲ / ▼ button on the System pull-down menu;

BG: (Asia/New Zealand/M.East/Africa/Australia)

(Hong Kong/South Africa) DK: (East Europe/China/Africa/CIS) M: (USA/Korea/Philippines) (option)

- 9. Press the OK or ◀ button.
 10. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select Channel.
 11. Press the ► button. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select V/UHF or Cable on the Channel pull-down menu. If possible, select the channel number directly with the number buttons. Any number under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' (or '00') in front of it, i.e. '05' (or '005') for 5.
- 12. Press the **OK** or **◄** button.
- searching on the Search pull-down menu. If a station is found the search will stop.
- 15. Press the **OK** button to store it. The display **Stored** will appear.



- 16. To store another station, repeat steps 4 to 15.
- 17. Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Fine tuning

Normally fine tuning is only necessary if reception is poor.

- 1. Repeat the Manual programme tuning steps 1 to 3.
- 2. Press the ▲/▼ button to select Fine.
- Press the ◄/► button step by step to fine tune for the best picture and sound.



- 4. Press the OK button.

The Fine tuned programme will be indicated by yellow number during programme selection.

Assigning a station name

- 1. Repeat the 'Manual programme tuning' steps 1 to 3.
- 2. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Name**.
- 3. Press the ▶ button on the **Name** pull-down menu.
- Press the ▲ button. You can use a blank, +, -, the numeric 0 to 9 and the alphabet A to Z.

With the ▼ button you can select in the opposite direction.


- Select the position by pressing the ◀ / ▶ button and then take your choice of the second character, and so on.
- 6. Press the **OK** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Booster (option)

In some models, **Booster** is an optional function. Only a set with **Booster** can perform this function.

If the reception is poor at the fringe area of the TV signal, select ${\bf Booster}$ to ${\bf On.}$

- 1 Repeat the 'Manual programme tuning' steps 1 to 3.
- 2. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Booster**.
- 3. Press the ▶ button.
- Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select On or Off on the Booster pulldown menu.
- 5. Press the **OK** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.







Favourite programme


This function lets you select your favorite programmes directly.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button to select the Station menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Favourite programme.
- Press the ▶ button to display the **Favourite programme** menu.



- Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select -----.
 Select a desired programme with the ◄ / ► button or NUMBER buttons. Any number under 10 is entered with a numeric '0' in front of it, i.e. '05' for 5.
- 6. To store another programme, repeat steps 4 to 5. You can store up to 8 programmes.
- 7. Press the **OK** button.
- 8. Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV

Repeatedly press the **FAVOURITE** button to select stored favourite programmes.




Calling the programme table

You can check the programmes stored in the memory by displaying the programme table.

Displaying programme table

Press the LIST button to display the Programme table menu. The programme table appears on the screen. One programme table contains ten programmes as below.



Note:

- a. You may find some blue programmes. They have been set up to be skipped by auto programming or in the programme edit
- b. Some programmes with the channel number shown in the programme table indicate there is no station name assigned.
- c. In some model blue key will work as list.

Selecting a programme in the programme table Select a programme with the \triangle / \blacktriangledown or \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright button.

Then press the OK button.


The set switches to the chosen programme number.

Paging through a programme table

There are 10 (or 20) programme table pages which contain 100 (or 200) programmes.


Pressing the ▲ / ▼ or ◀ / ▶ button repeatedly turns the pages.

Press the LIST button to return to normal TV viewing.



Picture adjustment





Note: Picture menu options are not available for RGB input source.

PSM (Picture Status Memory)

- Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
- Press the ▶ button to select **PSM**.

 Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select a picture setting on the PSM pull-down menu.



- Press the **OK** or **◄** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

You can also recall a desired picture (Dynamic, Standard, Mild. Game or User) with PSM button on the remote control. The picture **Dynamic**, **Standard**, **Mild** and **Game** are programmed for good picture reproduction at the factory and cannot be changed.

Picture adjustment

You can adjust picture contrast, brightness, colour intensity, sharpness and tint (NTSC input only) to the levels you prefer.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Contrast**, Brightness, Colour or Sharpness.



3. Press the ▶ button and then ◀ / ▶ button to make appropriate adjustments on the each sub menu.



- Press the **OK** button to store it for the picture user.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Picture adjustment

Eye (option)

Eye is an optional function. Only a set with eye option can perform this function.

In some models, the set will automatically adjust the picture according to the surrounding conditions. This will enable you to enjoy the most suitable picture according to the surroundings.

Press the **EYE/★** button to switch the eye function on or off.





When the eye function is on, the most suitable picture is automatically adjusted according to the surrounding conditions.

At this time the display ••••• in green does not appear continuously but the display ••••• in yellow appears each time the picture condition changes.

Note:

- a. If you press the PSM or TURBO PICTURE / XD PICTURE button with the eye function, the function is automatically switch off.
- b. EYE function is not available for RGB input source.

Turbo picture or XD picture selection (Option)

When this function is on, the picture will be more brilliant and distinct than normal picture.

Repeatedly press the TURBO PICTURE button to switch on or off.







Sound adjustment





SSM (Sound Status Memory)

You can select your preferred sound setting; Flat, Music, Movie or Sports and you can also adjust the sound frequency of equalizer.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button to select SSM.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select a sound setting on the SSM pull-down menu.



Sound Frequency Adjustment

a. Press the ▶ button in **User** to display the **User** sub menu.



▲▼ ◆ OK MENU

- b. Select a sound band by pressing the \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright button.
- c. Make appropriate sound level with the ▲ / ▼ button.
- d. Press the **OK** button to store it for the sound **User**.


Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

You can also recall a desired sound (**Flat**, **Music**, **Movie**, Sports or **User**) with **SSM** button on the remote control. The sound **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie** and Sports are programmed for good sound reproduction at the factory and cannot be changed.

Note: If you press the **SSM** button after making appropriate adjustment on the **User** sub menu, the display **User** automatically appears even though you have already set a factory preset setting; **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie** or Sports.


Sound adjustment

You can adjust balance, AVL (Auto Volume Leveler), or head phone volume/soundAVL automatically keeps on an equal volume level even if you change programmes. If you switch Turbo Sound to on, the set creates a dynamic bass sound. The Turbo sound creates an all around sound as in a concert hall.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the
- Sound menu.

 Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired sound item; AVI, Turbo Sound or Balance.

 Make desired adjustment with the ◀ / ▶, ▲ / ▼ or OK button
- on each pull-down menu.



- Press the **OK** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV

Turbo sound selection (option)

When this function is on, the sound will be more emphasized and amplified than normal sound.
Repeatedly press the **TURBO SOUND** button to switch on or off.

Sound output selection

In AV mode, you can select output sound for the left and right speakers.

- Repeatedly press the **I/II** button to select the sound output. **L+R**: Audio signal from audio L input is sent to left speaker and audio signal from audio R input is sent to right speaker.
- Audio signal from audio L input is sent to left and right speakers.
- Audio signal from audio R input is sent to left and right speakers.

Sound adjustment

Stereo/Dual reception (option)

When a programme is selected, the sound information for the station appears after the programme number and station name disappear.

Mono sound selection

In stereo reception if the stereo signal is weak, you can switch to mono by pressing the **I/II** button twice. In mono reception the depth of sound is improved. To switch back to stereo, press the **I/II** button twice again.

Language selection for dual language broadcast

If a programme received in two languages (dual language), you can switch to **DUAL I**, **DUAL II** or **DUAL I**+**II** by pressing the **I/II** button repeatedly.

DUAL II sends the primary broadcast language to the loudspeakers. **DUAL II** sends the secondary broadcast language to the loudspeakers


DUAL I+II sends a separate language to each loudspeaker.

NICAM reception (option)

If your set is equipped with the receiver for NICAM reception, the high quality NICAM (Near Instantaneous Companding Audio Multiplex) digital sound can be received.


Sound output can be selected according to the type of received broadcast as follows by pressing the **I/II** button repeatedly.

- When NICAM mono is received, you can select NICAM MONO or FM MONO.
- When NICAM stereo is received, you can select NICAM STEREO or FM MONO. If the stereo signal is weak, switch to FM mono.
- When NICAM dual is received, you can select NICAM DUAL I, NICAM DUAL II or NICAM DUAL I+II or MONO. When FM mono is selected the display MONO appears on the screen.



Time Setting





Setting the clock

- Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- Press the ► button to select Clock.
 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to adjust the hour.



- 4. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to adjust the minute.
- Press the **OK** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Setting the On/Off timer

By using this function, the set automatically switches on or off at a preset time. You must set the time correctly before using on/off time

- Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Time menu.
- button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Off time/On time.
- 3. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to adjust the hour.



- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to adjust the minute. *Only On time function*; Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to adjust programme number and volume level. Press the OK.
- Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Note:


- On time works only in standby mode.
- To view the remaining on/off time, select the Time menu.
- When you switch the main power off, the Clock is reset .

If you select On on the Auto sleep pull-down menu, the set will automatically switch itself to standby mode approximately ten minutes after a TV station stops broadcasting.

- Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto sleep**. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off** on the **Auto sleep** pull-down menu. Press the **OK** or ◀ button.
- Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to return to normal TV viewing.

Other functions





TV and AV modes

Inputs can be set for TV or AV mode. AV mode is used when a video cassette recorder (VCR), or other equipment is connected to the set.

Note: When a VCR is connected via the aerial socket the set is used in TV mode. See the 'Connection of external equipment' section.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the
- Special menu.

 Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Input.

 Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select IV, AV1, AV2, AV3, S-VIDEO (option) or COMPONENT (option) on the Input pull-down menu.



AV1: VCR connected to the Euro scart socket or AV1 socket of

Alternatively you can select the TV or AV mode by pressing the TV/AV

In AV mode, to return to TV mode, press the ▲ / ▼ or NUMBER but-

Auto AV switching (option)

If your VCR outputs switching voltage when it is switched to playback with the VCR connected to the Euro scart socket. The set is automatically switched to **AV1** mode when an AV signal is input. But if you want to keep on watching TV mode, press the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown or NUMBER buttons. Press the **TV/AV** button to return to AV modes.

The TV can be set so that the remote control handset is needed to control it. This feature can be used to prevent unauthorized viewing.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Child lock**.


 Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off** on
- the **Child lock** pull-down menu. Press the **OK** or ◀ button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV view-5.

With the lock on, the display Child lock appears on the screen if any button on the front panel is pressed while viewing the TV.

Note: The display Child lock will appear on the screen if any button on the front panel is pressed while displaying the menus.

Other functions





Blue back (option)

If you select **On** on the **Blue back** pull-down menu, the blue back-ground appears on the screen when there is no or poor signal.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Blue back**.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select On or Off on the Blue back pull-down menu.
- 4. Press the **OK** or **◄** button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Tilt (option)

The TV picture may tilt to the left or right if the TV set moves to another position. This function can be used to compensate the tilt.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Tilt**.
 Press the ▶ button and then ◀ / ▶ button to adjust the tilt on the
- Press the ▶ button and then ◄ / ▶ button to adjust the tilt on the Tilt pull-down menu.
- 4. Press the OK button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Degaussing (option)


Owing to the super large Tube in the set. The colour purity of the picture may be affected by other magnetic influences such as speakers. Stripes may appear on the screen or there may be colour patches.

- Press the MENU button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **Degauss**.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select On on the Degauss pull-down menu. After the degauss function works, On mode switches to Off mode.
- Press the **OK** or ◀ button.
- Repeatedly press the MENU button to return to normal TV viewing.

Note: If you cannot adjust the screen condition by degaussing, try it again after about 4 minutes.

Other functions





Games (option)

Game is an optional function, only a set with game can perform this function by using the remote control handset.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
- Press the ▶ button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select Game.
 Press the ▶ button to enter the game mode.
- 4. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select a game and then press the OK button_

You can enjoy the game by using the GAME owner's manual.

- a. Press the TV/AV or MENU button to return to the normal TV
- b. If you want a new game, press the RED button to start during the game.

Sleep timer

You don't have to remember to switch the set off before you go to sleep. The sleep timer automatically switches the set to standby after the preset time elapses.

Repeatedly press the SLEEP button to select the number of minutes. The display \bigcirc --- will appear on the screen, followed by **10**, **20**, **30**, **60**, **90**, **120**, **180** and **240**. The timer begins to count down from the number of minutes selected.

- a. To view the remaining sleep time, press the SLEEP button once.
- To cancel the sleep time, repeatedly press the SLEEP button until the display () - - - appears.
- When you switch the set off, the set releases the preset sleep

Connection of external equipment

You can connect additional equipment, such as VCRs, camcorders etc. to your set.

What is shown here may be somewhat different from your set.

Aerial socket

- Connect the RF out socket of the VCR to the aerial socket on the back of the set.
- 2. Connect the aerial cable to the RF aerial in socket of the VCR.
- Store the VCR channel on a desired programme number using the 'Manual programme tuning' section.
- Select the programme number where the VCR channel is stored.
- 5. Press the PLAY button on the VCR.

Audio/Video in/out sockets (option)

- Connect the audio/video out sockets of the VCR to audio/video in sockets of the set and in sockets of the VCR to RF OUT sockets of the set.
- If the VCR is connected to the AV sockets on the set, press the TV/AV button to select AV1, AV2, AV3.
- Press the PLAY button on the VCR. The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

You can also record programmes received by the TV on video tape via audio/video out sockets.

Note: If you have a mono VCR, connect the audio cable from the VCR to the **AUDIO** L/**MONO** socket of the set.

Euro scart socket (option)


- Connect the Euro scart socket of the VCR to the Euro scart socket of the set.
- 2. Press the PLAY button on the VCR.


If your VCR outputs a switching voltage when connected to Euro scart socket, the set will switch to **AV 1** mode automatically. But if you want to keep on watching TV mode, press the ▲ / ▼ or NUMBER buttons.


Otherwise press the TV/AV button on the remote control handset to select $AV\ 1$ The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

You can also record programmes received by the TV on video tape.


Note: Signal type RGB, i.e. the signals red, green and blue can only be selected for the Euro scart socket. These signals are transmitted, for example, by a pay TV decoder, game machine or photo CD unit, etc.













Connection of external equipment







S-Video/ Audio in sockets (S-AV) (option)

When connecting an S-VIDEO VCR to S-VIDEO socket, the picture quality will be further improved.

- 1. Connect the S-video socket of the VCR to the S-VIDEO socket of the set.
- Connect the audio cable from the S-VIDEO VCR to the AUDIO socket of set.
- 3. Select S-VIDEO by pressing th TV/AV button repeatedly.
- 4. Press the PLAY button on the VCR.
 The VCR playback picture appears on the screen.

Component in sockets (option)

- Connect the COMPONENT video output sockets (Y Cb Cr, Y Pb Pr or Y B-Y R-Y) of the COMPONENT (480i) to the COM-PONENT INPUT sockets (Y PB PR) on the set.
- Connect the audio cable from the COMPONENT to AUDIO IN sockets of AV IN2.
- 3. Press the TV/AV button to select COMPONENT.
- 4. Press the **PLAY** button on the COMPONENT.
 The COMPONENT playback picture appears on the screen.


Headphone socket (option)

Only models which have a headphone socket can perform this function.

Insert the headphone plug to the headphone socket of the set. You can listen to the sound through the headphone.

If you press the MUTE button, the sound from the headphone is switched Off.

Troubleshooting check list



- Colour patch might appear in your TV set if you rotate or shift the position of the set while it is On or in standby mode. If patch appears in your TV set try the following before calling your service centre or dealer. Place the TV set in desired position and switch it Off by the main power switch. Allow the set to cool down for at least 30 minutes and then switch it On. The degaussing circuit (inbuilt) in your set will remove the patch automatically. Please call service only in case this operation does not help.

 When the TV set is switched Off in Standby mode, It may take some time (upto 15 second) for the LED
- to switch Off.
