

Connecting to speakers

Attaching the speakers to the unit

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals on the unit. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

Connect the black stripe of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).




/!\ Caution -

- · Be careful to make sure children do not put their hands or any objects into the *speaker duct.

Antenna Connection

Connect the supplied FM antenna for listening to the radio.



Video Connection


Connect the VIDEO OUT jack on the unit to the video in jack on the TV by using a video cable.



Component Video Connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (PROGRESSIVE SCAN) jacks on the unit to the corresponding input jacks on the TV by using component cables.

You can hear the sound through the system's speakers.





Connect an Output of auxiliary device to the AUX (L/R) IN Connector.



Adjust the Setup settings

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound. You can also set a language for the subtitles and the Setup menu among other things. For details on each Setup menu item, refer to the contents as following.

OSD Initial language settings - Optional

When using this unit for the first time, the initial language Setup menu appears on your TV screen. You must complete initial language selection before using the unit. English will be selected as the initial language.

- Press (D(POWER) on the remote control or (D/I (POWER) on the unit to turn the unit on. The language setup menu will appear on the screen.
- Use ▲/▼/◀/▶ on the remote control to select a language then press ENTER⑤. The confirm menu will appear.
- 3. Use **◄/▶** to select [Enter] then press **ENTER ⑤** to finish the language setup.

To display and exit the Setup Menu

- 1. Select the DVD/CD or USB function by pressing **FUNCTION** on the remote control or by pressing **DVD/CD** or **USB** on the unit.
- 2. Press **SETUP** on the remote control. Displays the [SETUP] Menu.
- 3. Press **SETUP** or **BACK** to exit in the [SETUP] Menu.

OSD

Select a language for the Setup menu and then on screen display.

Disc Audio/Disc Subtitle/Disc Menu

Select the language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.

[Original]

Refer to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

[Other]

To select another language, press numeric buttons and then **ENTER** on the romote control to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on the page 34. If you enter the wrong language code, press CLEAR.

[Off (for Disc Subtitle)]

Turn off Subtitle.

DISPLAY

TV Aspect

Select which screen aspect to use is based on the shape of your TV screen.

[4:3]

Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.

[16:9]

Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

Display Mode

The Display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to 4:3.

[Letterbox]

This displays a wide screen picture with black bands at the top and bottom of the screen.

[Panscan]

This fills the entire 4:3 screen, cropping the picture as necessary.

Progressive Scan (For Component Video connections)

Selects whether the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (PROGRESSIVE SCAN) jacks output progressive signal. If your TV accepts progressive format signals, you will enjoy accurate color reproduction and high quality image by selecting [On]. If your TV does not accept progressive format signals, select [Off].

If you set Progressive Scan to [On] in error, you must reset the unit. First, remove the disc from the unit. Next, press and hold ■(STOP) for about five seconds. The video output will be restored to the standard setting, and a picture will be visible on your TV.

AUDIO

2.1 Speaker Setup

Make the following settings for the built-in 2.1 channel surrounds decoder.

- 1. Press **SETUP** on the remote control.
- 2. Use ▲/▼ to select AUDIO menu and then press▶.
- 3. Use **▲/▼** to select [2.1 Speaker setup] menu.
- Press ENTER ●
 The [2.1 Speaker setup] appears.



- Use ◀/▶ to select the desired speaker.
- 6. Adjust options by using **△/**▼**///▶** buttons.
- 7. Press ENTER to return to the previous menu.

Speaker selection

Select a speaker that you want to adjust.

Volume – Press **◄ / ▶** to adjust the output level of the selected speaker.

Test – Press **◄/** ► to test the signals of each of speakers. Adjust the volume to match the volume of test signals memorized in the system.

DRC (Dynamic Range Control)

Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [On] for this effect.

Vocal

Select [On] to mix karaoke channels into normal stereo.

This function is effective for multi-channel karaoke DVDs only.

LOCK (Parental Control)

Initial Setting of the Area Code

When you use this unit for the first time, you have to set the Area Code as shown below.

- 1. Press **SETUP** on the remote control.
- 2. Select the [Lock] menu and then press ▶.
- 4. Select the first character by using **△/**▼ buttons.
- 5. Press ▶ and select the second character by using ▲/▼ buttons.
- 6. Press **ENTER** ⊙ to confirm your Area code selection.

Rating

Blocks playback of rated DVDs based on their contents. Not all discs are rated.

- Select [Rating] on the [Lock] menu then press
- 2. Input a password and press ENTER .
- Select a rating from 1 to 8 by using the ▲/▼ buttons.

[Rating 1-8]

Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

[Unlock]

If you select unlock, parental control is not active and the disc plays in full.

4. Press **ENTER** o to confirm your rating selection.

Password

You can enter or change password.

- 1. Select [Password] on the [Lock] menu and then press .
- 2. Input a password and press ENTER . To change the password, press **ENTER** when the [Change] option is highlighted. Input a password and press **ENTER** ©. Enter it again and press **ENTER** to verify.
- 3. Press **SETUP** to exit the menu.

Area Code

Enter the code of the area whose standards were used to rate the DVD video disc, based on the list on page 33.

- 4. Press ▶ and select the second character by using **▲/▼** buttons.

Basic Operations

Disc/USB Operations

- 1. Insert the disc by pressing **△**(OPEN/CLOSE) on the remote control or by pressing **OPEN/ CLOSE** on the unit. Connect the USB device to the USB port.
- 2. Select the DVD/CD or USB function by pressing **FUNCTION** on the remote control or by pressing DVD/CD or USB on the unit.
- 3. Select a file (or track/ title) you want to play by pressing $\triangle/\nabla/\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$ on the remote control or $|\langle\langle\rangle\rangle$ on the unit.
 - Note
 - When playing a disc or USB Flash Drive containing with DivX, MP3/ WMA and JPEG files together, you can select menu of files which you would like to play by pressing MENU on the remote control.
 - For the most Audio CD and DVD-ROM discs, playback starts automatically.
 - The unit plays only music file contained in the USB storage device or disc automatically. (except for folder)

Other Operations

Displaying Disc Information on-screen

If any button is not pressed for a few seconds, the on-screen display disappears.

To display the DVD Menu

- 1. Press **MENU** on the remote control. The disc's menu appears.
- 2. Select the menu by using $\triangle/\nabla/\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$.
- 3. Press ENTER to confirm.

To display the DVD title DVD

When you play a DVD which contains several titles, you can select the title you want by using the TITLE.

- 1. Press **TITLE** on the remote control. The disc's title appears.
- 2. Select the menu by pressing $\triangle/\nabla/\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$.
- 3. Press ENTER® to confirm.

Selecting a subtitle language

MOVIE DVD

During playback, press **S-TITLE** on the remote control repeatedly to select a desired subtitle language.

1.5 times speed playback DVD

The 1.5 speed allows you to watch the pictures and to listen to the sound quicker than to play at a normal speed.

This unit memorizes last scene from the last disc that is viewed. The last scene remains in memory even if you remove the disc from the unit or switch off the unit. If you load a disc that has the scene memorized, the scene is automatically recalled.

Changing the character set to display DivX® subtitle correctly - optional

MOVIE

During playback, if the subtitle does not displayed on the screen properly, press and hold **S-TITLE** on the remote control for about 3 seconds then press S-TITLE to select another language code until the subtitle is displayed properly.



If any button is not pressed for about 10 seconds, the language code display disappears.

Programmed Playback

MUSIC

You can play the contents of a disc in the order you want by arranging the order of the songs on the disc. The program is cleared when the disc is removed.

To cancel the sleep function, press **SLEEP** repeatedly until the display window get bright.

- You can check the remaining time before the unit turns off.
- Press **SLEEP**. The remaining time appears in the display window.
- Sleep function will work after dimmer function.

Dimmer

Press **SLEEP** once. The display window will be darkened by half. To cancel it, press **SLEEP** repeatedly until the display window get bright.

DEMO

In power off state, press **DEMO** on the unit once. The unit will power on and display the each of functions in the display window.

Turning off the sound temporarily

Press **MUTE** on the remote control to mute vour sound.

You can mute your sound in order, for example, to answer the telephone. And "IX" will appear in the display window.

To cancel MUTE function, press **MUTE** again or adjust volume level by pressing VOL(+/-).

Screen Saver

The screen saver appears when you leave the unit in stop mode for about five minutes.

System Select - Optional

You must select the appropriate system mode for your TV system. If "NO DISC" appears in the display window, press and hold **II**(PAUSE) on the remote control or **SET/CD II** on the unit for more than five seconds to be able to select a system. (AUTO/ PAI /NTSC)

Displaying file information (ID3 TAG)

While playing an MP3 file containing file information, you can display the information by pressing **DISPLAY** on the remote control.

AUTO DJ playback

MUSIC

Auto DJ blends the end of one song into the beginning of another for seamless playback. It equalizes volume across tracks/files for uninterrupted playback.

Press AUTO DJ on the remote control or unit repeatedly, the display changes as followings order, (AUTO DJ RANDOM) -> (AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL) -> (AUTO DJ OFF).

- Searching for a section within a track/file or playing repeatedly or randomly is not supported on the AUTO DJ mode.
- If you switch to other functions or stop playback by pressing **■**(STOP) on the remote control twice (or **STOP** on the unit) on AUTO DJ mode. AUTO DJ function will be disable.
- AUTO DJ function is not supported in the music file whose length is less than 60
- All musics are repeated continuously until the user deactivates the AUTO DJ function.
- · During the AUTO DJ operation, SCAN function is not available.
- During recording, AUTO DJ function is not available.
- · If you change a disc while the AUTO DJ function is activated, the function is deactivated

Using Microphone

- 1. Connect your microphone to the MIC 1, 2 on the unit.
- 2. Play the music you want.
- 3. Sing along with the accompaniment. Adjust the microphone volume by pressing MIC VOL (+/-) on the remote control.



Note

- When not using the microphone, set the microphone volume as low as possible or turn off the MIC. And then remove the microphone from the MIC 1, 2.
- If the microphone is set too near the speaker, a howling sound may be produced. In this case, move the microphone away from the speaker or decrease the sound level by using the MIC VOL (+/-).
- If sound through the microphone is extremely loud, it may be distorted. In this case, press MIC VOL (+/-) to adjust the volume.

Radio Operations

Be sure that both FM aerial is connected. (Refer to the page 14)

Listening to the radio

- 1 Press **FUNCTION** on the remote control repeatedly or TUNER on the unit until FM appears in the display window. The last received station is tuned in.
- 2. Auto tuning: Press TUNING (-/+) for about 2 seconds until the frequency indication starts changing, then release, scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

Improving poor FM reception

Press MONO/STEREO → on the remote control or ST./MONO on the unit. This will change the tuner from stereo to mono. Then the reception will be better than before.

Sound adjustment

Setting the surround mode

You can change the LG EQ/EQ by using **SOUND EFFECT** on the remote control or **LG EQ/EQ/ BASS BLAST/MP3 OPT.** on the unit while the sound effect information is displayed on.

Note

- In some of surround modes, some speakers, there's no sound or low sound. Depending on the mode of surround and the source of audio, it is not defective.
- You may need to reset the surround mode, after switching the input, sometimes even after the sound track changed.
- You can not choose the VIRTUAL option, when the MIC is connected to the unit.

Setting the USER EQ



Maintenance

Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.

Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.

Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

Cleaning the unit

To clean the player, use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, or thinner, as these might damage the surface of the unit.

Maintaining the Unit

The unit is a high-tech, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn, the picture quality could be diminished. For details, please contact your nearest authorized service center.

Notes on Discs

Handling Discs

Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

Cleaning Discs

Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

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
