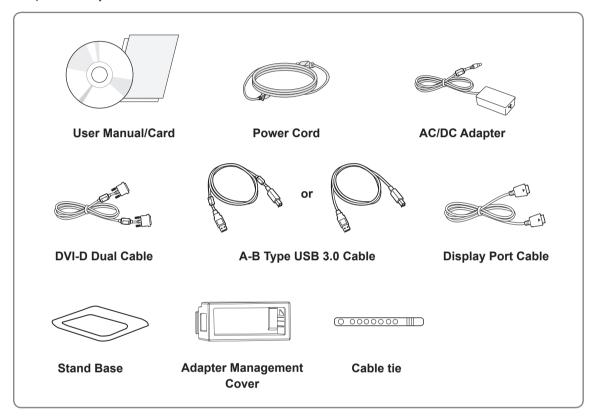

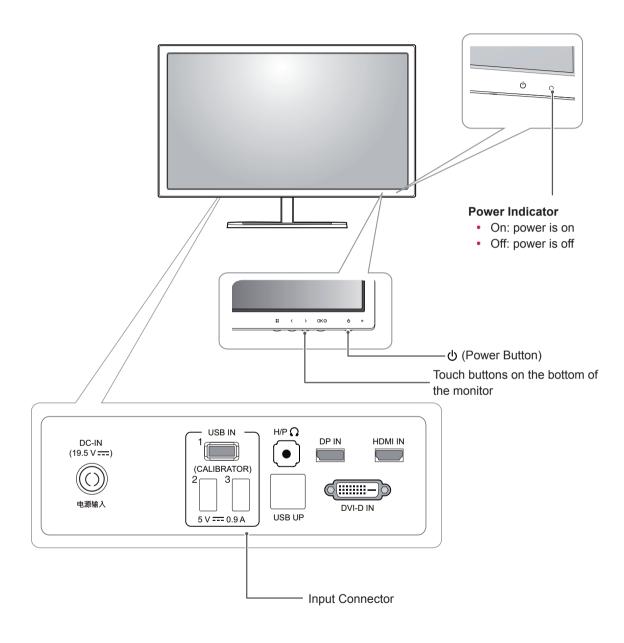

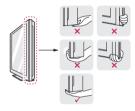
Moving and Lifting the Monitor

When moving or lifting the monitor, follow these instructions to prevent the monitor from being scratched or damaged and to ensure safe transportation regardless of its shape or size.



CAUTION

- As far as possible, avoid touching the monitor screen. This may result in damage to the screen or some of the pixels used to create images.
- It is advisable to place the monitor in the original box or packing material before attempting to move it.
- Before moving or lifting the monitor, disconnect the power cord and all cables.
- Hold the top and bottom of the monitor frame firmly. Do not hold the panel itself.



 When holding the monitor, the screen should face away from you to prevent it being scratched.



- When transporting the monitor, do not expose the monitor to jolts or excessive vibration.
- When moving the monitor, keep it upright, never turn the monitor on its side or tilt it sideways.

Installing the Monitor

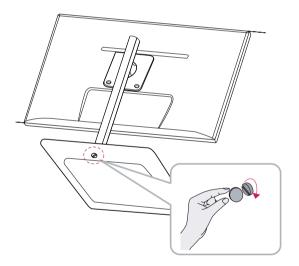
Assembling the stand base

1 Place the screen face down.



CAUTION

- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 1 Attach the stand base to the stand body.
 - 2 Tighten the screw to the right using a coin.



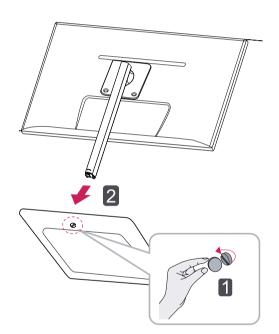
Detaching the stand base

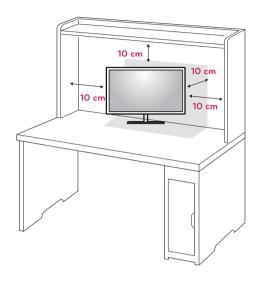
- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.

 - Detach the stand base.



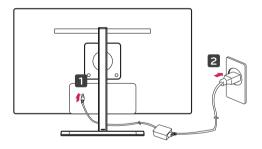
Installing onto a table

1 Lift the monitor and place it on the table in an upright position.

Place at least **10 cm** away from the wall to ensure sufficient ventilation.



2 Connect the adapter to the monitor, then plug the power cord into the power outlet.

CAUTION

- The components in the illustrations may differ from the actual product.
- Do not carry the monitor upside down, as this may cause it to fall off its stand and result in damage or injury.
- To avoid damaging the screen when lifting or moving the monitor, only hold the stand or the plastic cover. This avoids putting unnecessary pressure on the screen.

3 Press the \circlearrowleft (Power) button on the bottom of the monitor to turn it on.

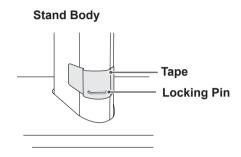

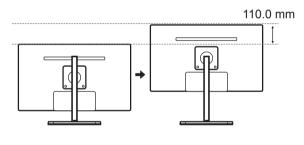

Adjusting the stand height

- 1 Place the monitor mounted on the stand base in an upright position.
- 2 Remove the tape attached at the bottom rear of the stand body, then pull out the locking pin.



3 The height can be adjusted up to 110.0 mm.





CALITION

 Once the pin is removed, it is not necessary to re-insert it to adjust the height.

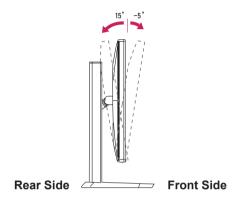

 Do not put your fingers or hand between the screen and the base (chassis) when adjusting the screen's height.

Adjusting the angle

- 1 Place the monitor in an upright position, mounted on the stand base.
- Adjust the angle of the screen. The angle of the screen can be adjusted forwards or backwards from -5° to 15° for a comfortable viewing experience.





WARNING

 To avoid injury to the fingers when adjusting the screen, do not hold the lower part of the monitor's frame as illustrated below.



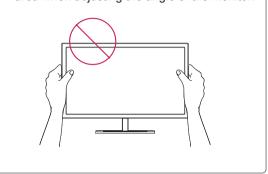






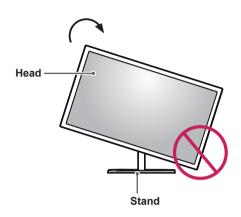

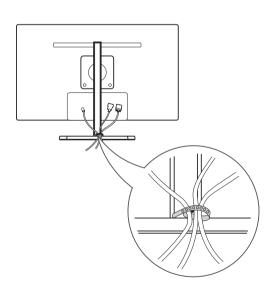
Pivot feature

The pivot feature allows the monitor to rotate 90 clockwise.



Tidying cables

Gather and bind the cables with the supplied cable tie.



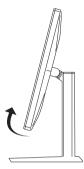


WARNING

 To avoid scratching the stand base, make sure that when rotating the monitor using the pivot feature, the stand does not make contact with the monitor. 1 Raise the monitor up to the maximum height.



2 Adjust the angle of the monitor in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure.



3 Rotate the monitor clockwise as shown in the figure.



4 Complete the installation by rotating the monitor 90° as shown below.



WARNING

 Take care when rotating the monitor if the cable is connected.

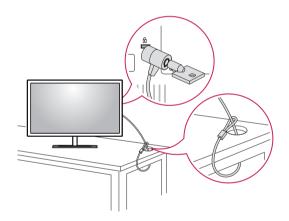

Using the Kensington lock

The Kensington security system connector is located at the back of the Monitor set.

Connect the Kensington security system cable between the Monitor set and a table.





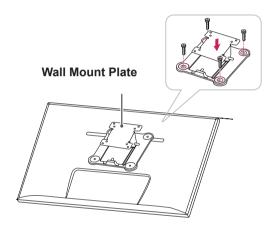

Installing the wall mount plate

This monitor supports the specification of the standard wall mount plate or compatible device.

- 1 Place the screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Place the wall mount plate onto the monitor and align it with the screw holes.
- 3 Using a screwdriver, tighten the four screws to fix the plate onto the monitor.



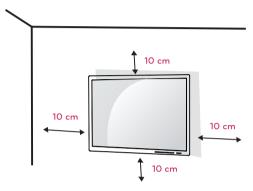


NOTE

- · The wall mount plate is sold separately.
- For more information on installation, refer to the wall mount plate's installation guide.
- Be careful not to use excessive force when mounting the wall mount plate, as this can damage the monitor's screen.

Installing to a wall

Install the monitor at least 10 cm away from the wall and leave about 10 cm of space at each side of the monitor to ensure sufficient ventilation. Detailed installation instructions can be obtained from your local retail store. Please refer to the manual to install and set up a tilting wall mounting bracket.



To install the monitor to a wall, attach a wall mounting bracket (optional) to the back of the monitor. Make sure that the wall mounting bracket is securely fixed to the monitor and to the wall.

- 1 Use the screws and wall mounting bracket that comply with the VESA standard.
- 2 Screws which are longer than the standard length may damage the inside of the monitor.
- 3 A non-VESA standard screw may damage the product and cause the monitor to fall. LG Electronics is not liable for any accidents relating to the use of non-standard screws.
- 4 The monitor is VESA standard compliant.
- 5 Use it according to the VESA standard as specified below.
 - 784.8 mm or less
 - * Thickness of the wall mount plate: 2.6 mm
 - * Fastening screw: Diameter 4.0 mm x Pitch 0.7 mm x Length 10 mm
 - 787.4 mm or greater
 - * Use the wall mount plate and screws that conform to the VESA standard.

CAUTION

- Use the wall mounting bracket and screws that conform to the VESA standard. Damage caused by the use or misuse of inappropriate components will not be covered by the product warranty.



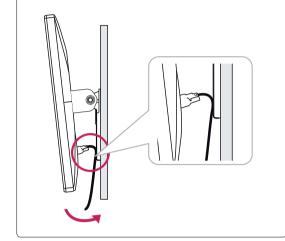

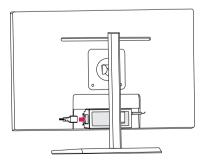
1 Insert the adapter into the compartment of the adapter management cover.



2 Insert the adapter management cover into the groove 1 and slide it to the groove 2.

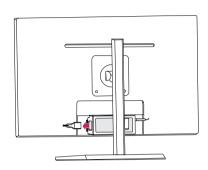

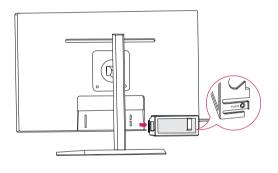


Disassembly order to mount the adapter

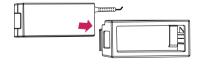
1 Disconnect the power cord.

USING THE MONITOR

Connecting to a PC

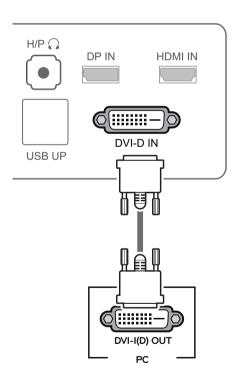
 This monitor supports the *Plug and Play feature.

*Plug and Play: A feature that allows you to add a device to your computer without having to reconfigure anything or install any manual drivers.

DVI connection

Transmits digital video signals to the monitor. Connect the monitor using the DVI cable as illustrated below.

Press the menu (**) button and then select the input option from the input menu.



CAUTION

 Connect the input signal cable and turn in the direction of the arrow.
 To prevent disconnection secure the cable tightly.



- Do not press on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image distortion.
- Do not display a still image on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image retention. Use a screensaver if possible.



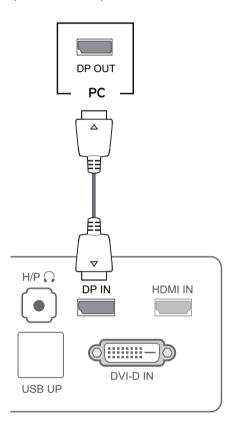
NOTE

- When connecting the power cord to the outlet, use a grounded (3-hole) multi-socket or a grounded power outlet.
- The monitor may flicker when turned on in an area of low temperature. This is normal.
- Sometimes red, green, or blue spots may appear on the screen. This is normal.

Display port connection

Transmits the digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect your PC to the monitor using the display port cable as illustrated below.

Press the menu (#) button and then select the input option from the input menu.





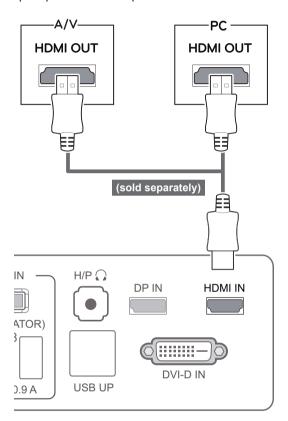
NOTE

 Sound may not be available depending on the DP version of your PC.

HDMI connection

Transmits the digital video and audio signals from your PC and A/V devices to the monitor. Connect your PC and AV device to the monitor with the HDMI cable as illustrated below.

Press the menu (#) button and then select the input option from the input menu.

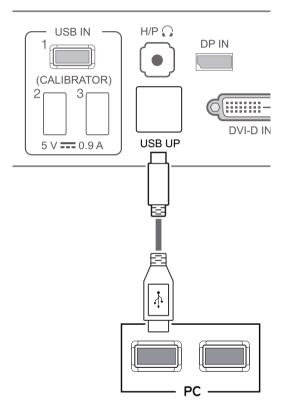
HDMI PC may cause device compatibility issues.

Connecting to AV Devices

USB 3.0 cable-PC connection

The USB 3.0 function acts as a USB hub on the product.

To use USB 3.0, connect the A-B type USB 3.0 cable included with the product to the PC. Peripheral devices connected to the USB IN port can be controlled from the PC.



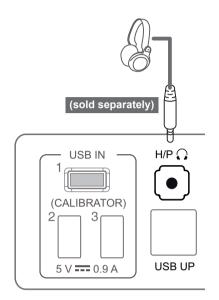

Headphone port connection

Use the headphone port to connect a peripheral device to the monitor. Connect as illustrated.





NOTE

- · Peripheral devices are sold separately.
- The USB 3.0 ports can be used to connect the keyboard, mouse, and other USB devices.
- For an angle plug earphone, it is difficult connect it with a peripheral device, so use a straight type.

INSTALLING TUSB3410 DRIVER

You must install the TUSB3410 driver before installing True Color Pro. Insert the the owner's manual CD included in the product package into your PC's CD driver and install the TUSB3410 driver.

- Set the default Web browser to Internet Explorer.
- Click the TUSB3410 driver.

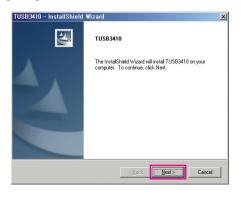


3 Click the TUSB3410 Driver or True Color Pro on the CD's main screen. When the file download window appears, click the Run button. (The file download window may vary depending on the operating system and the Internet Explorer version, but the installation procedures are same.)

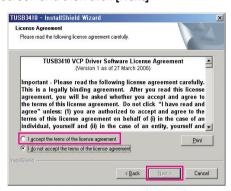




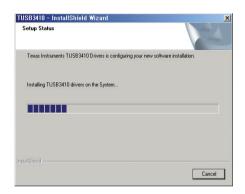

INSTALLING TRUE COLOR PRO/FINDER

Insert the the owner's manual CD included in the product packaging into your PC's CD driver and install the True Color Pro/Finder software.

1 When the True Color Pro/Finder installer starts, the window appears as shown below. Select a language and click [Next].



3 Check "I accept...." on the License Agreement screen and then click [Next].



2 Click [Next].

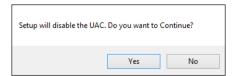


4 Enter your User Name and Company Name, and click [Next].



CAUTION

On Windows 7, a step to disable the UAC control is added.



Click [Yes] to continue the installation.

5 Click [Change] to change the installation path. Click [Next].



6 Click [Install] to start the installation process.



7 When the installation is complete, restart the system.



CAUTION

- If an incompatible calibration application is installed on your PC, a warring message appears asking you to remove the application during the installation.
- 8 When you run the True Color Pro/Finder software, the True Color Pro/Finder icon [] appears in the system tray at the right bottom of the PC screen.



Right-click the True Color Pro/Finder icon and select "Start Program" to start the program.



CAUTION

- Once you have completed the monitor calibration with the True Color Pro/Finder software, remove the calibrator from the monitor and store it at room temperature away from direct sunlight or put it in the box.
 - If the calibrator's measuring part is exposed to direct sunlight for a long time, this may cause the calibrator performance degradation.
 - Do not store it in an environment with too low/high temperature and high humidity.
- If any third-party calibration application is already installed on your PC, the image quality may be affected by a conflict between the two applications. For the best performance, it is recommended to delete the third-party calibration application.



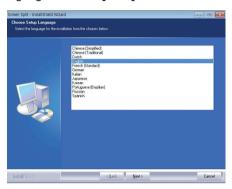

- To use the True Color Pro/Finder function, you must purchase the supported calibrator.
- For details on supported calibrators and graphic cards, see the True Color Pro/Finder user guide.
- If you have changed the input port, it is recommend that you calibrate the monitor's picture quality again.

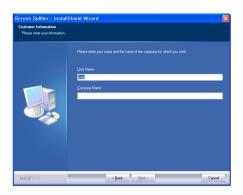

TROUBLESHOOTING

Nothing is displayed on the screen.		
Is the monitor's power cord plugged in?	Check if the power cord is correctly plugged in to the power outlet.	
Is the power indicator on?	Check the power indicator.	
Is the power indicator displaying red?	Check that the connected input is enabled (Menu - Input).	
Is the power indicator blinking?	 If the monitor is in power-saving mode, move the mouse or press any key on the keyboard to switch the display on. Check if the computer is turned on. 	
Is the "OUT OF RANGE" message displayed?	 This occurs when signals transferred from the PC (video card) are out of the horizontal or vertical frequency range of the monitor. Please see the "Product Specification" section of this manual to set the appropri- ate frequency. 	
Is the "CHECK SIGNAL CONNECTION" message is displayed?	• This is displayed when the signal cable between the PC and the monitor is missing or disconnected. Check the cable and reconnect.	

The "OSD LOCKED" message is displayed.	
Are some functions unavailable when pressing the Menu button?	The OSD is locked. Go to Menu > Settings and set "OSD Lock" to Unlock.

Does image sticking occur even when the monitor is turned off?	 Displaying a still image for a prolonged time may cause damage to the screen, resulting in the retention of the image. Use a screen saver to protect the screen when using the monitor for a prolonged period of time.

- Vertical Frequency: In order to display an image, the screen must be refreshed dozens of times per second like a fluorescent lamp.
 - The number of times the screen is refreshed per second is called vertical frequency or refresh rate and is represented by Hz.
- Horizontal Frequency: The time it takes to display one horizontal line is called the horizontal cycle. The number of horizontal lines displayed in one second can be calculated by dividing one by the horizontal cycle. This is called horizontal frequency and is

represented by kHz.

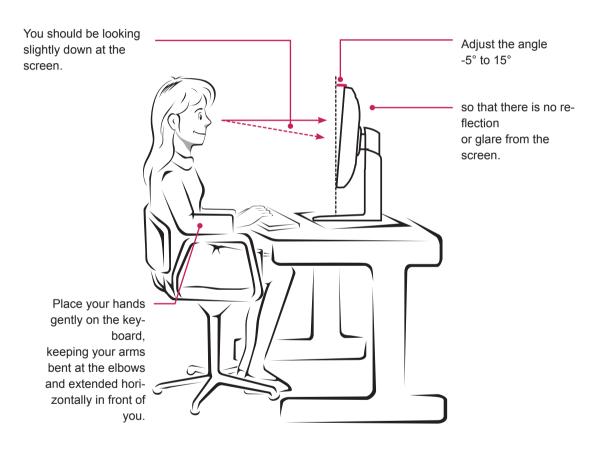
