

Introduction

Playable Discs

This unit plays DVD±R/RW and CD-R/RW that contains audio titles, DivX, MP3, WMA and/or JPEG files. Some DVD±RW/DVD±R or CD-RW/CD-R cannot be played on this unit due to the recording quality or physical condition of the disc, or the characteristics of the recording device and authoring software.



DVD-VIDEO (8 cm / 12 cm disc)

Discs such as movies that can be purchased or rented.



DVD±R (8 cm / 12 cm disc)

Video mode and finalized only.



DVD-RW (8 cm / 12 cm disc)

Video mode and finalized only.



DVD+R: Video mode only

Supports the double layer disc also.



DVD+RW (8 cm / 12 cm disc)

Video mode and finalized only.



Audio CD: Music CDs or CD-R/CD-RW in music CD format that can be purchased.

Regional Codes

This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labelled same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".

- Most DVD discs have a globe with one or more numbers in it clearly visible on the cover. This number must match your unit's regional code or the disc cannot play.
- If you try to play a DVD with a different regional code from your unit, the message "Check Regional Code" appears on the TV screen.

Playable file Requirement

Compatible USB Devices

- MP3 Player: Flash type MP3 player.
- USB Flash Drive : Devices that support USB2.0 or USB1.1.
- The USB function of this unit does not support all USB devices.

- Do not extract the USB device while in operation.
- For a large capacity USB, it may take longer than a few minute to be searched.
- To prevent data loss, back up all data.

Connecting to speakers

Case 1

Connect the red cable plug to the **R** connector and the the white one to the **L** connector.



Case 2

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals on the unit. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

Connect the black stripe of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).




Caution

Connections to Your TV







PORT. IN Connection

Connect an output of portable device (MP3 or PMP etc) to the PORT. IN connector.



Listening to music from your external device

The unit can be used to play the music from many types of external device.

- 1. Connect the external device to the **PORT.IN** connector of the unit.
- 2. Turn the power on by pressing **POWER** (**(!**)).
- 3. Select the PORTABLE function by pressing **FUNC.** on the unit or **FUNCTION** on the remote control.
- 4. Turn the external device and start it playing.

Adjust the Setup settings

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound. You can also set a language for the subtitles and the Setup menu, among other things. For details on each Setup menu item.



- It is available only on DVD/CD or USB mode.
- Be sure of complete stop status before adjust the settings. It may not be able to change some setup menu in pause or resume stop status.
- It is highly recommended to set the OSD language in advance of the others.

To display and exit the Setup Menu

- 1. Select the DVD/CD or USB function by pressing **FUNCTION** on the remote control or **FUNC.** on the unit.
- 2. Press **SETUP**. Displays the setup Menu.
- 3. Press **SETUP** to exit in the setup Menu.

[GENERAL] Menu

TV DISPLAY

Select a TV aspect ratio option according to your TV type.

[4:3 PANSCAN]

Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected. Displays pictures cropped to fill your TV screen. Both sides of the picture are cut off.

[4:3 LETTERBOX]

Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected. Displays theatrical images with masking bars above and below the picture.

[16:9]

Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected. The 4:3 picture is adjusted horizontally (in a linear proportion) to fill the entire screen.

OSD LANGUAGE

Select a language for the Setup menu and onscreen display.

SCREEN SAVER

The screen saver appears when you leave the unit in Stop mode for about 5 minutes.



Note

The screen saver will not appear when you leave the player in pause status.

LAST MEMORY (DVD only)

This unit memorizes last scene from the last disc that is viewed. The last scene remains in memory even if you remove the disc from the unit or switch off the unit. If you load a disc that has the scene memorized, the scene is automatically recalled.



Note

It is not available to save the last scene when you change to the other functions.

[AUDIO] Menu

ANALOG AUDIO

[DOWNMIX]

DOWNMIX means that multi-channel surround sound are mixed to produce 2 channel sound suitable for this unit.

Select [LT/RT] to downmix the sound or [STEREO] to get 2 channel sound out of only front speakers.

DYNAMIC

This function allows you to listen to the output sound more clear when the sound is too loud or too low.

Set the DYNAMIC range from OFF to FULL by using **▲/** ▼ and **⊙** ENTER.

[VIDEO] Menu

COLOR SETTING

You can control the picture on your own.

[SHARPNESS]

Adjusts the level of sharpness in the edges between the light and dark areas of the picture.

[BRIGHTNESS]

Adjusts the base level of the signal in the picture.

[CONTRAST]

Adjusts the signal level between black and white in the picture. You may use Contrast when the bright part of the picture is saturated.

[GAMMA]

Adjusts brightness of dark area and middle gray level area of the picture.

[HUE]

Adjusts the balance between red and green levels.

[SATURATION]

Adjusts intensity of all Colors.

If the subtitle is displayed in broken letter, you can change the subtitle code page to view the subtitle file properly.

[PREFERENCE] Menu

TV TYPE

You must select the appropriate system mode for your TV system. Select a TV type among [PAL], [AUTO], or [NTSC].

[AUDIO]/[SUBTITLE]/[DISC MENU]

[Languages]

Select a language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.



Note -

- Enter LANGUAGE CODE when you select [OTHERS] on the language list. Refer to the "Language Codes" on page
- Depending on the disc, your language setting may not work.

PARENTAL

Blocks playback of rated DVD based on their content. (Not all discs are rated.) Password is needed to change the setting.

[Rating 1-8]

Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

PASSWORD

You can create or change the password.

PASSWORD MODE

Select [ON] to lock the setting.

PASSWORD

Select [CHANGE] to change password. Enter the 6-digit password to spaces and select

If you forget your password, enter "136900" to password blank to reset your password.

DEFAULT

It sets default values to its original settings. Select [RESET] to initialize the setting. You have to reset the settings after initializing.

You should enter the password when reset the unit if you set PASSWORD MODE to [ON].

Basic Operations

Disc/USB Operations

- 1. Insert the disc by pressing **OPEN** or connect the USB device to the USB port.
- Select the DVD/CD or USB function by pressing FUNCTION on the remote control or FUNC. on the unit.
- 3. Select a file (or track/ title) you want to play by pressing $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$.

For the most Audio CD and DVD-ROM discs, playback starts automatically.

Other Operations

Displaying Disc Information on-screen

DVD

You can display various information about the disc loaded on-screen and change the setting.

REPEAT - Select the repeat option.

Radio Operations

Listening to the radio

- Select tuner (FM) function by using FUNCTION on the remote control or FUNC. on the unit The last received station is tuned in.
- 2. Auto tuning:

Press and hold **TUNING (-/+)** on the remote control or **TUNING (-/+)** on the unit for about two seconds until the frequency indication starts to change, then release. Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

Manual tuning:

Press **TUNING (-/+)** on the remote control or **TUNING (-/+)** on the unit repeatedly.

3. Adjust the volume by pressing **VOL (+/-)** repeatedly or rotate Volume knob on the unit.

Improving poor FM reception

Press ► MONO/STEREO on the remote control. This will change the tuner from stereo to mono and usually improve the reception.

Presetting the Radio Stations

Deleting the saved stations

Seeing information about a Radio station

The FM tuner is supplied with the RDS (Radio Data System) facility. This shows information about the radio station being listened to. Press RDS repeatedly to cycle through the various data types.

PS (Programme Service Name)	The name of the channel will appear in the display.
PTY (Programme Type Recognition)	The programme type (e.g. Jazz or News) will appear in the display.
RT (Radio Text)	A text message contains special information from the broadcast station. This text may scroll across the display.
CT (Time controlled by the channel)	This shows the time and date as broadcast by the station.

You can search the radio stations by programme type by pressing **RDS**. The display will show the last PTY in use. Press PTY one or more times to select your preferred programme type. Press TUNING (-/+) on the remote control or TUNING (-/+) on the unit. The tuner will search automatically. When a station is found the search will stop.

Sound adjustment

Setting the surround mode

This system has a number of pre-set surround sound fields. You can select a desired sound mode by using **5 SOUND EFFECT** on the remote control or **EQ** on the unit.

The displayed items for the Equalizer may be different depending on sound sources and effects.

Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean
