# Regional Code

This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labelled same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".



## Note

- Depending on the conditions of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) disc itself, some CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) discs cannot be played on the unit.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregularly shaped CDs (e.g., heart-shaped or octagonal). Doing so may result in malfunctions.
- Depending on the recording software & the finalization, some recorded discs (CD-R/RW, DVD±R/RW) may not be playable.
- DVD-R/RW, DVD+R/RW and CD-R/RW discs recorded using a personal computer or a DVD or CD Recorder may not play if the disc is damaged or dirty, or if there is dirt or condensation on the Recorder's lens.
- If you record a disc using a personal computer, even if it is recorded in a compatible format, there are cases in which it may not play because of the settings of the application software used to create the disc. (Check with the software publisher for more detailed information.)

 You can use a USB device that is used to store some disc related information. The disc you are using will control how long this information is retained.

# AVCHD (Advanced Video Codec High Definition)

- This player can playback AVCHD format discs.
   These discs are normally recorded and used in camcorders.
- The AVCHD format is a high definition digital video camera format.
- The MPEG-4 AVC/H.264 format is capable of compressing images at higher efficiency than the conventional image compressing format.
- Some AVCHD discs use the "x.v.Color" format.
- This player can playback AVCHD discs using "x.v.Color" format.
- Some AVCHD format discs may not be played, depending on the recording condition.
- AVCHD format discs need to be finalized.
- "x.v.Color" offers a wider colour range than normal DVD camcorder discs.

# System Requirements

For high definition video playback:

- High definition display that has HDMI input jacks.
- HDMI or HDCP capable DVI input on your display device is required for some content (as specified by disc authors).
- For up-conversion of standard definition DVD, a HDMI or HDCP capable DVI input on your display device is required for copy-protected content.

For Dolby® Digital Plus, Dolby TrueHD audio playback:

- An amplifier/receiver with a built-in (Dolby Digital, Dolby Digital Plus, Dolby TrueHD or DTS).
- Main, centre, surround speakers and subwoofer as necessary for chosen format.

- While recording, in case of DVD-R/+R disc, there may be noise from the unit. But it is not a problem.
- Recordable DVD is used only for Recorded Title Copy. (Please look at Page 50 Using the Recording title Copy)
- Recorded Title is copied as TS Format File to Recordable DVD. So Disc copied on this unit may not played on other player or recorder.


# Note

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the unit. Use only one of the connections described in this manual.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.
- Make sure the player is connected directly to the TV. Tune the TV to the correct video input channel.
- Do not connect the unit's AUDIO OUT jack to the phono in jack (record player) of your audio system.
- Do not connect your unit via your VCR.
   The image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

# Antenna connection to your TV and this unit


Connect one end of the RF cable to ANTENNA OUT(TO TV) jack on the unit and other end to ANTENNA IN jack on your TV. Passes the signal from the ANTENNA IN jack to your TV/monitor.

Connect the Terrestrial TV antenna to the ANTENNA IN jack on the unit. If you want to use an indoor antenna, use one with a signal amplifier rated at 5V, 100 mA and set [Antenna 5V] to [ON] in the setup menu (See page 25).



# **HDMI Connection**

If you have a HDMI TV or monitor, you can connect it to this unit using a HDMI cable (Type A, High Speed HDMI™ Cable). Connect the HDMI jack on the unit to the HDMI jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor.



Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).



### Note -

- If a connected HDMI device does not accept the audio output of the unit, the HDMI device's audio sound may be distorted or may not output.
- When you use HDMI connection, you can change the resolution for the HDMI output. (Refer to "Resolution Setting" on page 16.)
- Select the type of video output from the HDMI OUT jack using [HDMI Color Setting] option on the [Setting] menu (see page 26).
- Changing the resolution when the connection has already been established may result in malfunctions. To solve the problem, turn off the player and then turn it on again.
- When the HDMI connection with HDCP is not verified, TV screen is changed to black screen. In this case, check the HDMI connection, or disconnect the HDMI cable.
- If there is noise or lines on the screen, please check the HDMI cable (length is generally limited to 4.5m).


# Additional Information for HDMI

- When you connect a HDMI or DVI compatible device make sure of the following:
  - Try switching off the HDMI/DVI device and this player. Next, switch on the HDMI/DVI device and leave it for around 30 seconds, then switch on this player.
  - The connected device's video input is set correctly for this unit.
  - The connected device is compatible with 720x576p, 1280x720p, 1920x1080i or 1920x1080p video input.
- Not all HDCP-compatible HDMI or DVI devices will work with this player.
  - The picture will not be displayed properly with non-HDCP device.
  - This player does not playback and TV screen is changed to black screen.

# [SOUND] Menu

Each disc has a variety of audio output options. Set the unit's Audio options according to the type of audio system you use.

# **Default Recording Device**

Finalized the recordings in place so that the disc can be played on a regular unit or computer equipped with a suitable DVD-ROM drive.



## Caution-

Once you have finalized a DVD-R and DVD+R disc, you cannot edit or record anything else on that disc.

- 1. Select [Finalize] option then press ENTER (②).
- Press ENTER (♠) while [Finalize] is selected. Finalize menu appears.
- 3. Select [OK] then press ENTER (**⊙**). The recorder starts finalizing the disc.



- How long finalization takes depends on the type of disc, how much is recorded on the disc, and the number of titles on the disc.
- DVD-R, DVD+R DISC can be finalized only one time.
- Depending at the disc and the way of format finalizing may take more time.

# System Information

Displays the current software version.

# Using the Digital TV **functions**

You can watch and record the digital TV programmes or playback the recorded TV programmes you want to watch using this unit.

# Viewing the Digital TV

Viewing the Digital TV broadcasting on the TV screen



- DTV antenna connection is required. (page
- DTV settings such as [Auto Tuning] in the [Setting] menu may be required. (page 23)
- 1. Press (1)/I (POWER) to turn on the unit.
- 2. Use **◄/▶** to select [DTV] on the HOME menu and press ENTER (②).
- Use ◀/▶ to select [Live TV] and press ENTER (**②**).



# **Changing Digital TV** programmes

Generally, press CH  $(\Lambda / V)$  to select the programme position, or entering a programme number using numerical buttons. If you want to change the programme on the programme list, follow the instruction as below.

1. While watching DTV, press CH LIST.



- 2. Use ▲/▼ to select a desired programme, and press ENTER (

  ).
  - If you press green (G) coloured button repeatedly, the unit sort the programmes into channel number, ABC, FTA~CAS or CAS~FTA.
- 3. Press BACK (1) to exit from the channel list.

# Setting favourite programmes

This option allows you to set the favourite channel.

- 1. While watching DTV, press CH LIST.
- 2. Press red (R) coloured button to display [Channel Edit] menu.
- 3. Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$  to select a channel and press ENTER (**⊙**) (channel shows **✓** icon).



4 Press FAV button to display [Set as Favourite] menu.



- 5. Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle/\triangleright$  to select a group and press ENTER (**⊙**) (group shows **✓** icon).
- 6. Select [OK] then press ENTER (

  )
- 7. Press BACK (5) to exit from the channel list menu.
- 8. On the channel list menu, use **◄/►** to move to the Favourite Ch. Group menu.

If you press yellow (Y) in the Favourite state, current channel will be registered to the relevant Favourite

To cancel the favourite programmes from the Favorite List, select a programme, and press yellow (Y) coloured button.

# Viewing the programme information

You can view a description of the programme being broadcast.



- 1. While watching DTV, press INFO/MENU ( ) to display the programme information.
- 2. Press INFO/MENU ( ) again to close the programme information.



- This function informs you of related broadcasting information on current channel.
- Use ▲/▼/◀/▶ to display the next programme, previous programme, next channel, previous channel, etc for the information programme.

# Selecting DTV audio language

Some digital programmes may broadcast several audio languages or encoding methods. You can select an audio language or an encoding method when it is available.

- 1. While watching DTV, press Q.MENU.
- 2. Use **◄/▶** to select the [Audio language] option.



3. Use ▲/▼ to select audio language or an encoding method, and press ENTER (⑤).



- · This option is not available while recording.
- While playing the recording title, You can select the audio language by pressing Q.MENU button.

# **Selecting Audio Description**

Audio description for users who are visually handicapped.

- 1. While watching DTV, press Q.MENU.
- Use ◄/► to select the [Audio description] option.



If you set [On], You can hear the explanation of display through a Main audio and Audio Description audio.

# Selecting DTV subtitle language

Some digital programmes may broadcast several subtitle languages. You can select a subtitle language when it is available.

- 1. While watching DTV, press Q.MENU or SUBTITLE.
- Use ◀/▶ to select the [Subtitle language] option.



3. Use ▲/▼ to select subtitle language, and press ENTER (♠).



Note

- You can find a programme that supports subtitle language on the programme information
  - For the programmes with subtitle, SUB icon appears on the programme information.
- While playing the recording title, You can select the subtitle language by pressing OMENU button.

# Changing Aspect Ratio

You can change the TV aspect ratio setting while playback.

- 1. While watching DTV, press Q.MENU.
- 2. Use **◄/►** to select the [Aspect Ratio] option.



 Use ▲/▼ to select aspect ratio, and press FNTFR (1).



While playing the recording title, You can select the aspect ratio by pressing Q.MENU button

# Changing Recording device

You can set the storage location where you want to store the DTV recordings.

- 1. While watching DTV, press Q.MENU.
- 2. Use **◄/▶** to select the [Recording device] option.



 Use ▲/▼ to select storage, and press ENTER (**②**).



This option is unavailable while recording.

# Programme Guide (Digital program only)

The Program Guide contains schedule and program information for digital programs. They also provide local over-the-air programs information including conventional digital programs. Use the Program Guide to find programs easily and conveniently and to view schedule and descriptive program information for the programs.

# To Display the Program Guide

Press the GUIDE button on your remote control.



# To Exit the Program Guide

Press the BACK ( button to return to the last program you tuned to.

# To navigate through programs on the Guides

Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangleleft/\triangleright$  on your remote control to navigate the guide screen.

You can move faster through programs by scrolling page-by-page with the CH  $(\Lambda/V)$  buttons on the remote control. Each button stroke scrolls one page up or down.

### To tune to another current channel

Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle/$  to select a current channel then press ENTER (

) and watch TV button. You can watch the channel.

# To display the Full Information window

You can view the detail information for the highlighted program. Press INFO/MENU ( ) or ENTER (**②**) to display detail information window. To exit from the detail information window, press INFO/MENU ( ) or select [Close] then press ENTER (**③**).

# To change date

When the Program Guide with 8 days is displayed, you can also change the date of the Program Guide by pressing the green (**G**) coloured button, you can set the time +24H. On the contrary, by pressing the red (**R**) coloured button, you can set the time -24H.

After setting favourite channels from the CH list, you can use the FAV button to toggle between [All] and [A~D] channel list.

# Using the timeshift function manually

You can pause a Live TV broadcast, then continue watching the programme at a later time. This is useful when you receive an unexpected call or visitor while watching TV.

The following are operating steps when the [Timeshift] option is set to [Manual].

- Press TIME SHIFT while watching a TV broadcast.
  The recorder starts recording the current TV
  programme to the HDD.
- 2. Press II to pause the programme your're watching the just now.
- 3. Press ▶ to resume watching the programme.

Press ENTER (**⊙**) or **◄/►** to display the progress of timeshift.

Press **\(\delta/\)** to playback of timeshift fast forward or fast reverse.

 Press ■, it's not turning off the timeshift function but going back to the DTV in realtime.
 Timeshift cannot be saved as a recorded title.



When recording and copying or record deleting the record, timeshift function is will be stopped.

# Using the timeshift function automatically

If you set the timeshift option to [Auto], live TV broadcast will automatically be recorded to the HDD without pressing the TIME SHIFT button. The timeshift will start automatically when the Digital TV tuner mode is started.

Refer to "Setting the Timeshift" on page 25 to set the [Timeshift] option.

- 1. Press 🖒/I (POWER) to turn on the unit.

  The timeshift function will automatically start.
  - Press **◄◄/▶►** to playback of timeshift fast forward or fast reverse.
- Press HOME ( to exit from the DTV viewing.
- 3. Press ■, it's not turning off the timeshift function but going back to the DTV in realtime.



- Without changing a channel, the timeshift function will go on.
- When you exit from the DTV mode, timeshift function automatically will be stopped.
   Ex) Power off, Record etc.
- If you change the channel during the timeshift function, the unit will switch to Live TV automatically.
- If the timeshift data exceeds the capacity, the data will be deleted automatically from the oldest one.
- Timeshift record Mode is not supported for Audio Only Channel.
- Timeshift record can not start if clock is not set correctly.

# Using the teletext (Viewing Teletext)

Many Digital TV programmes broadcast information via their text service, and this recorder has access to dedicated text programmes transmitted by the broadcasters.



- 1. Press TEXT while watching TV.
- 2. Use coloured (R/G/Y/B) button to select a page. You can also select a page by entering a three digit number with the numerical buttons.
- 3. Press TEXT or EXIT to exit the teletext screen.



## Note -

Additionally, you now have four coloured buttons to navigate through the content of the page. The use of these coloured buttons will be displayed on the screen.

# Recording TV programmes

You can watch another channel while recording a channel or record up to two different programmes simultaneously in the built-in HDD and playback the recorded programmes.

# **Dual Programme Recording**

You can record two Digital TV programme at the same time.

- 1. Use CH  $(\Lambda / V)$  to select a programme you want to record.
- 2. Press REC. (●) to start recording.
- 3. Use CH  $(\Lambda / V)$  to select another programme you want to record.
- Press REC. (●) to start recording. While recording two programmes simultaneously, you can only watch the programmes being recorded.

# **Normal Recording**

- 1. Use CH  $(\Lambda / V)$  to select a programme you want to record.
- 2. Press REC. (●) to start recording.



### Note

- If the TV screen turns black with stop mark that caused by no signal, scramble and any other reasons, then recording is unavailable.
- You can record maximum 300 titles

#### **Stop Recording**

You can stop recording instantly in Live TV.

- 1. Press (STOP) then stop dialogue is displayed.
- Use ◀/▶ to select [Yes] and press ENTER (⑥)
  to stop recording.



To stop recording, you must move to the programme being recorded before pressing (STOP).

#### Timer Recording (Manual)

You can set the timer for a total of 30 programmes, up to 22-28 days in advance.

1. While watching TV, press TIMER REC..



 Use ▲/▼/ ◀/▶ to select the date to record, and press ENTER (♠).



Use ◀/▶ repeatedly to select [Once, Daily, Mon.~Fri., Sat.~Sun. or Manual], and press ▼.
 If you want to select the day manually, select [Manual] then press ▼, and press ENTER (⑤).
 Select the desired day using ▲/▼/◀/▶ and

press ENTER (**②**).

Note —

The timer recording can be set from 2 minutes after the current time.

4. Enter the necessary information for your timer recording(s).



- ▼ (left/right) Move the cursor left/right

  ▼ (up/down) Change the setting at the
- $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  (up/down) Change the setting at the current cursor position.

You can use numbered buttons to change the setting.

- Select [Next], and press ENTER (♠).
- Use ▲/▼/◀/► to select a programme to record, and press ENTER (⑥). (programme shows ✔ icon)



7. Select [Complete], and press ENTER (**②**) to save the programme.

#### Timer Recording (Programme Guide)

You can also set the timer based on the information provided by the programme guide.

1. While watching TV, press GUIDE.



- 2. Press red (R) or green (G) coloured button to select date field.
- 3. Use **◄/▶** to select the programme list, and select a programme you want to record using **▲/**▼.
- 4 Press the yellow (Y) coloured button.



5. Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to select the date to record, and press ENTER (**②**).



- 6. Use **◄/▶** repeatedly to select [Once, Daily, Mon.~Fri., Sat.~Sun. or Manual], and press ▼. If you want to select the day manually, select [Manual] then press  $\nabla$ , and press ENTER ( $\odot$ ). Select the desired day using  $\triangle/\nabla/\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  and press ENTER (**②**).

- 3. Press ENTER (**③**) to display instant recording menu.



Use ◀/► to select [Record] and press ENTER (⑥).

If you select [Advanced Schedule] and press ENTER (●) to follow the steps 3-5 from "Timer Recording (Manual)" on page 37 to complete the editing.

- 5. Select [Yes] and press ENTER (②).
- Use ◀/▶ to select [Yes] and press ENTER (②) to start recording.

#### Deleting a timer recording

You can delete a timer recording before the timer recording actually starts.

- Use ▲/▼ to select [Delete], and press ENTER (⑤).

#### Modify a timer recording

You can modify a pre-scheduled timer recording before the timer recording actually starts.

- 1. While watching TV, press TIMER REC..
- 2. Press the bule (B) coloured button.
- 3. Use ▲/▼ to select programme field, and press ENTER (♠).
- Use ▲/▼ to select [Modify], and press ENTER (⑤).
- 5. Use ▲/▼/◀/▶ to select a category to change, and press ENTER (♠).



The adjustable items are listed below.

#### Instant Timer Recording

You can set the recording time instantly to stop the recording automatically.

- 1. Use CH  $(\Lambda/V)$  to select a programme you want to record.
- 2. Press REC. (●) to start recording. Press ENTER ( ) to display the progress of recording.



If you want to change recording time during recording, press REC. ( ) button then, change it in the Record option menu.

Press ■ to stop recording.



- The external USB HDD recording feature is only supported on first primary partition and it must be formatted with 4KB block
- If the unit cannot catch the signal, the recording will be pause, actual recording time can be less than the time set on timer.
- The quality of recording can be different on the status of the broadcast signal.
- During the recording, turning off by force can cause a serious problem on hard disk drive.
- Recording can be restarted when contents status is changed and it'll separate recording title into two individual title consequently.

#### Recording from Video/Audio Input

You can record from an external composite, such as a camcorder, connected to any of the unit's external inputs.

- 1. Make sure that the component you want to record from is connected properly to the unit. See page 19.
- 2. Select the recording location using [Default Recording Device] option on the Setting menu.
- 3. While watching TV, press INPUT or select [AV] option on Home menu to select the external Record with external input is not available if you're recoding TV broadcasting.
- Press REC. (●) once to start recording.
- Press (STOP) to stop recording.



#### Note

- The external USB HDD recording feature is only supported on first primary partition and it must be formatted with 4KB block NTFS
- If your source is copy-protected using CopyGuard, you will not be able to record it using this recorder. For more details, See Copyright on page 5.
- · In case an incoming signal is NTSC, recording and playback does not work. (only PAL Incoming signal is recordable.)
- You can't use Home menu or enter TV mode while recording process is underway using the external input.

## General Playback

#### Playing a disc

DVD AVCHD ACD

- Press ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) to close the disc tray.
   For most Audio CD, DVD, AVCHD and DVD-ROM discs, playback starts automatically.
- 3. Press HOME (1).
- Select [Movie], [Photo] or [Music] using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (♠).



5. Select the disc icon using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (♠).



Playback functions described in this manual are not always available in every files and media. Some functions can be restricted depending on many factors.

#### To stop playback

Press ■ (STOP) during playback.

#### To pause playback

Press ■ (PAUSE) during playback.
Press ► (PLAY) to resume playback.

#### To scan forward or backward

Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to play fast forward or fast reverse during playback.

You can change the various playback speeds by pressing ◀◀ or ▶▶ repeatedly.

#### To slow down the playing speed

While the playback is paused, press ▶▶ to play at slow motion.

# To skip to the next/previous chapter/track/file

During playback, press ◄ or ► to go to the next chapter/track/file or to return to the beginning of the current chapter/track/file.

Press ◄◀ twice briefly to step back to the previous chapter/track/file.

In case of movie file, press ◄◀ one time. You can play previous file.

#### Using the disc menu

DVD AVCHD

#### To display the disc menu

The menu screen may be displayed first after loading a disc which contains a menu. If you want to display the disc menu during playback, press DISC MENU.

Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$  buttons to navigate through menu items

#### Resume playback

This unit remembers the point where you pressed the ■ (STOP) depending on the disc.

If " (Resume Stop)" appears on the screen briefly, press ► (PLAY) to resume playback (from the scene

If you press ■ (STOP) twice "■ (Complete Stop)" appears on the screen. The unit will clear the stopped point.



#### Note

- The resume point may be cleared when a button is pressed (for example; (1) (POWER), ♠ (OPEN/CLOSE), etc).
- Resume playback may not work depending on the present play section. (Resume playback is disabled on the disk menu section.)

#### Playing the recorded titles

#### REC

  - ▲/▼ to select device, and press ENTER (②).
- While playing disc, [Play on previous play time.] is not supported.

#### Sorting the recorded titles

#### REC

- 1. While watching TV, press REC.LIST to display the [Recorded TV] or use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$  to select [Recorded TV] on the HOME menu and press ENTER (
  ).
- 2. Press yellow (Y) coloured button repeatedly to sorted by recorded time in recent order or title name in alphabetical order.

[ABC] – by title name in alphabetical order.

In case of [ABC] sort, the extended character like tilde can sort incorrectly.

[a/A/#] – Change the keyboard menu settings to capital letters, small letters or symbols.

5. Enter a new name using virtual keyboard, and press ENTER (**②**) while [OK] is selected.

If you rename a title in DISC, it will take long

#### Deleting a recorded titles

#### REC

You can delete recorded title.

- 1. While watching TV, press REC.LIST to display the [Recorded TV] or use ▲/▼/◀/▶ to select [Recorded TV] on the HOME menu and press ENTER (1).
- 2. Press blue (B) colored button.
- 3. Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$  to select a recording title then press ENTER (**⊙**). (shows **⋈** icon)
- 4. Press yellow (Y) colored button.



 Use ◀/▶ to select [Yes], and press ENTER (♠) to delete the selected recorded titles.



- · It is unable to do delete during the recording.
- If you delete a title in DISC, it will take long
- If you want delete all titles then HDD format is more faster and more safe (OPTION: Internal HDD format)
- 6. Press red (R) colored button, you can (un)select all titles.

## Playing movie file and **VR** discs

You can play DVD-RW discs that are recorded in Video Recording (VR) format and movie files contained on a disc/HDD/USB device.

1. Press HOME (1).



- 2. Select [Movie] using **◄/▶**, and press ENTER
- 3. Select [VR] using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (♠).



- The file requirements are described on pages 10-11.
- You can use various playback functions. Refer to pages 41-48.
- Unfinalized DVD VR format discs may not be played in this player.
- Some DVD-VR discs are made with CPRM data by DVD RECORDER. This unit cannot support these kinds of discs.

#### What is CPRM?

CPRM is a copy protection system (with scramble system) only allowing the recording of 'copy once' broadcast programs. CPRM stands for Content Protection for Recordable Media.

## Playing a file on **Linked Devies**

This unit can play video, audio and photo files contained in the USB device.

- 1. Insert a USB device into the USB port until it fits into place.
- 2. Press HOME (1).
- 3. Select [Movie], [Photo] or [Music] using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (**②**).



◀ / ▶, and press ENTER (♠).



 Select a file using ▲/▼/ ◀/▶, and press ► (PLAY) or ENTER (**()**) to play the file.



6. Withdraw the USB device carefully after exiting the USB mode.



- **5** List Stops playback and returns to the list.

#### To control music playback

Controls play and sets options while listening to a music.



- 1 Progress bar Selects the desired point and plays.
- 2 Playback control Refer to the basic operation for audio and advanced playback. (see pages 46.48)
- 3 [List] Returns to the list.



When you move the progress bar to desired point during playback, some files may not be moved to exact point or play next file back.



While viewing a photo in full screen, press ◀ or ▶ on the remote control to go to the previous or next photo.

#### Options while viewing a photo

You can use various options during viewing a photo in full screen.

- 1. While viewing a photo in full screen, press INFO/ MENU ( ) to display the option menu.

#### Listening to music while slide show

You can display photo files while listening to audio files.

- 1. While viewing a photo in full screen, press INFO/ MENU (1) to display the option menu.

## Maintenance

#### Notes on Discs

#### **Handling Discs**

Do not touch the playback side of the disc. Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints do not get on the surface. Never stick paper or tape on the disc

#### Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

#### Cleaning Discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre to out.

Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol. benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners. or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

#### Handling the Unit

#### When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

- · Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.
- Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.
- Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

#### Cleaning the unit

To clean the player, use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, or thinner, as these might damage the surface of the unit.

#### Maintaining the Unit

# 6 Appendix

## About the internal hard disk drive

The internal hard disk drive (HDD) is a fragile piece of equipment. Please use the unit following the guidelines below to protect against possible HDD failure

- Do not move the unit while it is on.
- Install and use a unit on a stable, levelled surface.
- Do not use the player in excessively hot or humid places, or in places that may be subject to sudden changes in temperature. Sudden changes in temperature can cause condensation to form inside the player. This can be a cause of HDD failure.
- While the unit is powered on, do not unplug from the wall socket or switch the electricity off from the breaker switch
- Do not move the player immediately after switching it off. If you need to move the player, please follow the steps below:
  - 1. After the message "OFF" is shown in the display, wait at least two minutes.
  - 2. Unplug from the wall socket.
  - 3. Move the player.
- If there's a power failure while the player is on, there is a chance that some data on the HDD will he lost
- The HDD is very delicate. If used improperly or in an unsuitable environment, it is possible that the HDD will fail after a few years of use. Signs of problems include playback unexpectedly freezing and noticeable block noise (mosaic) in the picture.
- However, sometimes there will be no warning signs of HDD failure.
- If the HDD fails, playback of content will not be possible. In this case, contact the LG service center by following methods.
