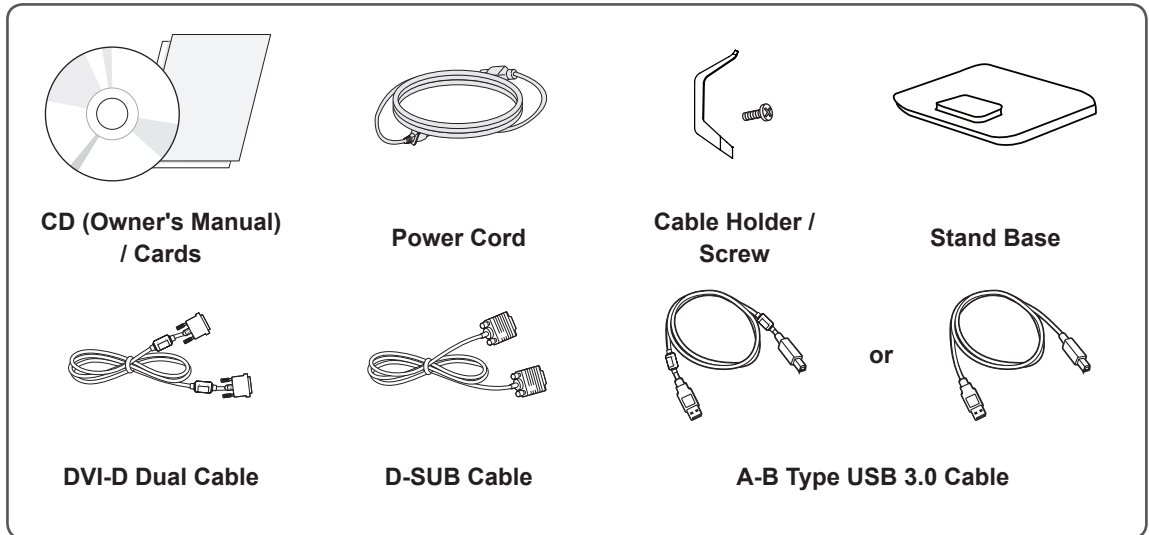

# ASSEMBLING AND PREPARING

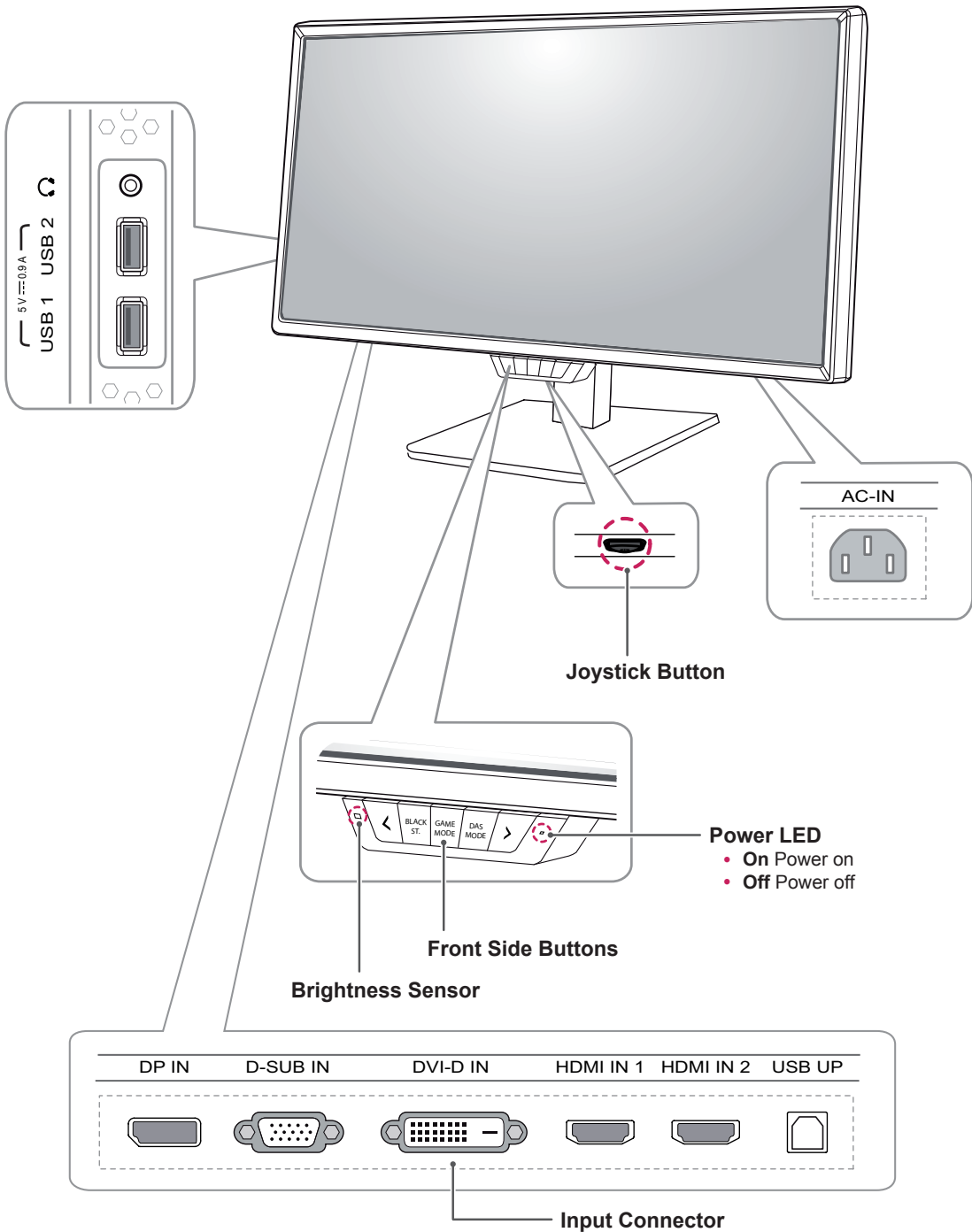

## Component and Button Description








### NOTE

- The Brightness Sensor senses the amount of exterior light so that the processor can make necessary adjustments to the brightness level to compensate.
- The joystick button is located at the bottom of the monitor.

## How to Use the Joystick Button

You can easily control the functions of the monitor by pressing the joystick button or moving it left/right with your finger.

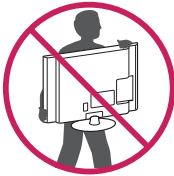
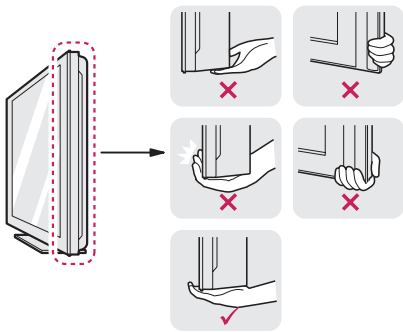
### Basic Functions

		<b>Power on</b>	Press the joystick button once with your finger to turn on the monitor.
		<b>Power off</b>	Press and hold the joystick button once with your finger to turn off the monitor.
		<b>Volume Control</b>	You can control the volume by moving the joystick button left/right.

## Moving and Lifting the Monitor

When moving or lifting the monitor, follow these instructions to prevent the monitor from being scratched or damaged and to ensure safe transportation, regardless of its shape or size.

- It is advisable to place the monitor in the original box or packing material before attempting to move it.
- Before moving or lifting the monitor, disconnect the power cord and all cables.
- Hold the top and bottom of the monitor frame firmly. Do not hold the panel itself.

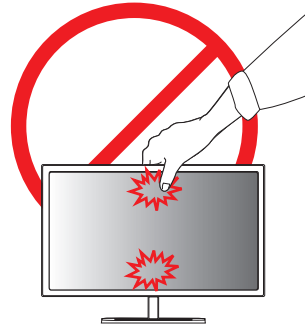


- When holding the monitor, the screen should face away from you to prevent it from being scratched.
- When transporting the monitor, do not expose the monitor to jolts or excessive vibration.
- When moving the monitor, keep it upright and never turn the monitor on its side or tilt it sideways.

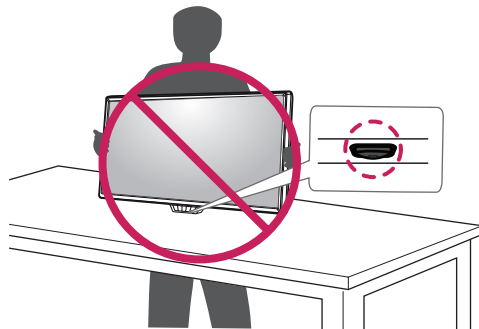


### CAUTION

- Avoid touching the monitor screen as much as possible. Do not apply pressure.
  - This may result in damage to the screen or some of the pixels used to create images.



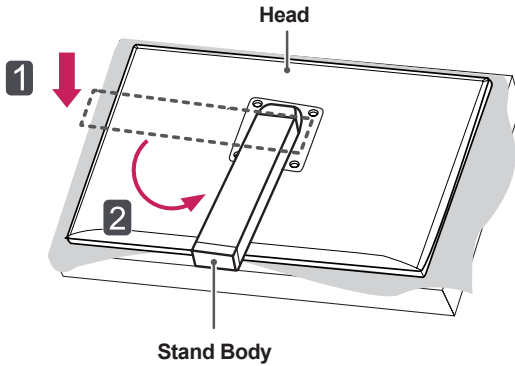
- If you use the monitor panel without the stand base, its joystick button may cause the monitor to become unstable and fall, resulting in damage to the monitor or human injury. In addition, this may cause the joystick button to malfunction.



## Installing the Monitor

### Assembling the Stand Base

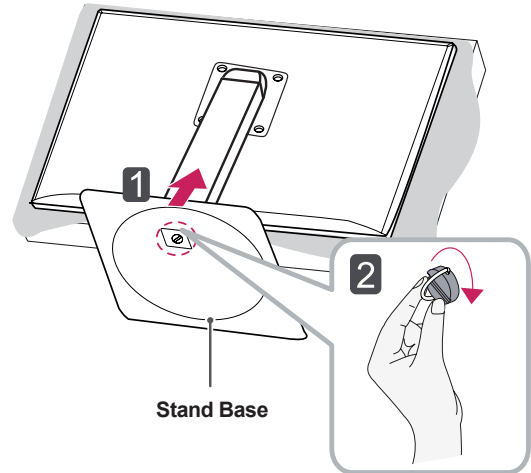
- 1 Place the screen face down.
- 2 Rotate the **Stand Body** 90° counter clockwise.



#### CAUTION

- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- To avoid scratching the head, make sure that when rotating the **Stand Body**, the stand body does not make contact with the head.

- 3 Align the hole on the **Stand Base** with the **Stand Body** and push it all the way up. Turn the screws on the **Stand Base** to the right.



#### CAUTION

- Applying excessive force when tightening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be covered by the product warranty.



## Detaching the Stand Base

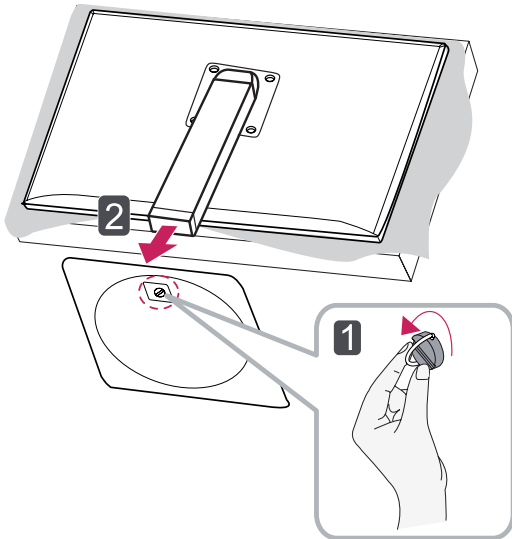
- 1 Place the screen face down.



### CAUTION

- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.

- 2 BodyTurn the screws on the **Stand Base** to the left to detach the **Stand Base** from the **Stand Body**.

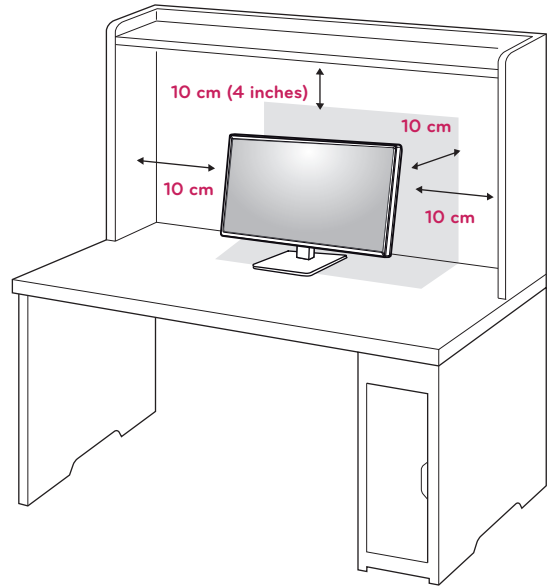


### CAUTION

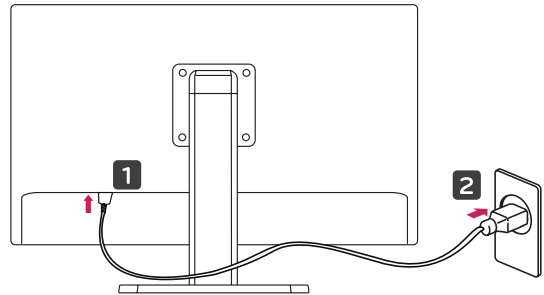
- The components in the illustrations may differ from the actual product.
- Do not carry the monitor upside down, as this may cause it to fall off its stand and result in damage or injury.
- To avoid damaging the screen when lifting or moving the monitor, only hold the stand or the plastic cover. This avoids putting unnecessary pressure on the screen.

## Installing on to a Table

- 1 Lift the monitor and place it on the table in an upright position. Place at least **10 cm (4 inches)** away from the wall to ensure sufficient ventilation.



- 2 Connect the **Power Cord** to a wall outlet.



- 3 Press the **Power** button on the bottom of the monitor to turn it on.

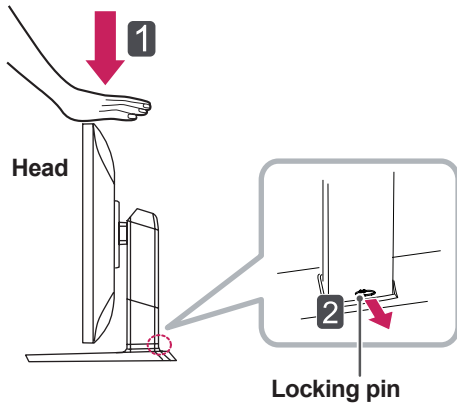

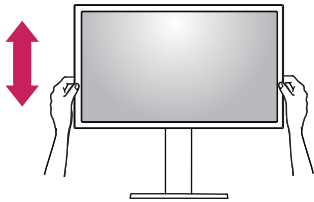
- To avoid the risk of electric shock, disconnect the Power Cord before moving or installing the monitor.

## Adjusting the Stand Height

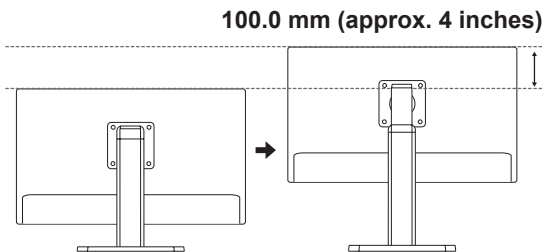
- 1 Place the monitor mounted on the stand base in an upright position.
- 2 Push the **Head** downward and pull out the **Locking Pin**.



- 3 Handle the monitor with both hands for safety.



- 4 The height can be adjusted up to **100.0 mm (approx. 4 inches)**.



### ! CAUTION

- Once the pin is removed, it is not necessary to re-insert it to adjust the height.
- Problems with the height or angle adjustment of the product caused by the attachment of protective glass in Internet cafes specializing in gaming will not be covered by the warranty.

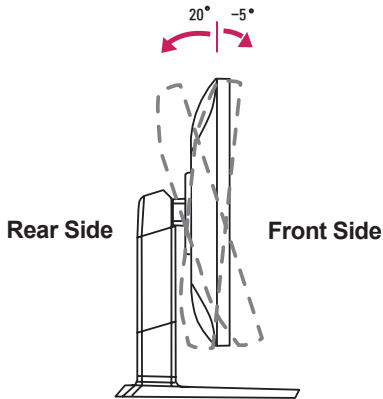

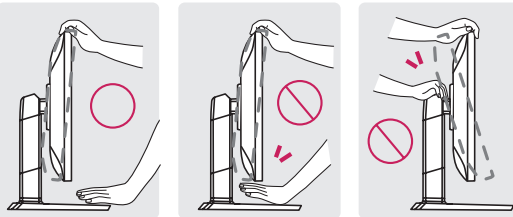
## Adjusting the Angle

- 1 Place the monitor in an upright position, mounted on the stand base.
- 2 Adjust the angle of the screen. The angle of the screen can be adjusted forwards or backwards from  $-5^{\circ}$  to  $20^{\circ}$  for a comfortable viewing experience.

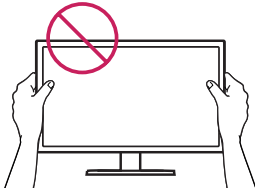


### **!** WARNING

- To avoid injury, do not put your fingers or hand between the head and the base when adjusting the screen's angle or height.



- Be careful not to touch or press the screen area when adjusting the angle of the monitor.

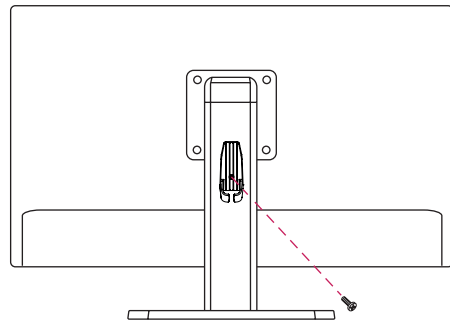

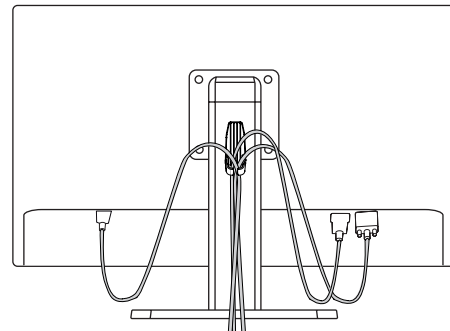

## Tidying Cables

- 1 Use the screw provided to attach the cable holder to the stand body as illustrated.

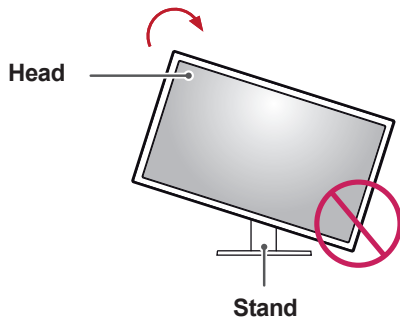


- 2 Gather and bind the cables with the supplied cable holder.



## Pivot Feature

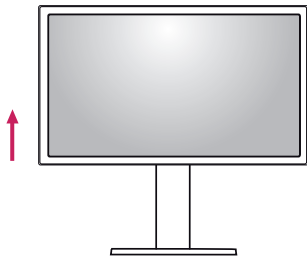
The pivot feature allows the monitor to rotate 90° clockwise.



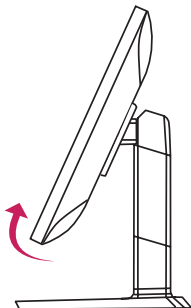
### ! WARNING

- To avoid scratching the stand base, make sure that when rotating the monitor using the pivot feature, the stand does not make contact with the monitor.

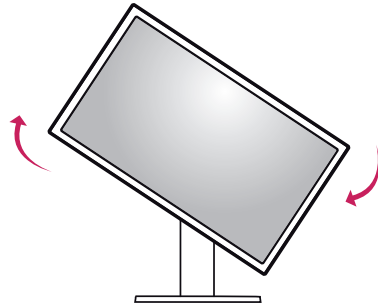
- 1 Raise the monitor to the maximum height.



- 2 Adjust the angle of the monitor in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure.



- 3 Rotate the monitor clockwise as shown in the figure.



- 4 Complete the installation by rotating the monitor 90° as shown below.

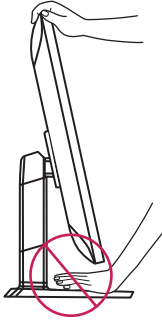


### ! NOTE

- Auto Pivot feature of the display is not supported.
- The screen can be rotated easily using the screen pivot shortcut key provided with your Windows operating system. Note that some Windows versions may use different settings for the screen pivot key or may not support the pivot key at all.
- Supported Windows versions: Windows 7 and Windows 8
- Windows screen pivot shortcut keys
  - 0°: Ctrl + Alt + Up arrow key (↑)
  - 90°: Ctrl + Alt + Left arrow key (←)
  - 180°: Ctrl + Alt + Down arrow key (↓)
  - 270°: Ctrl + Alt + Right arrow key (→)

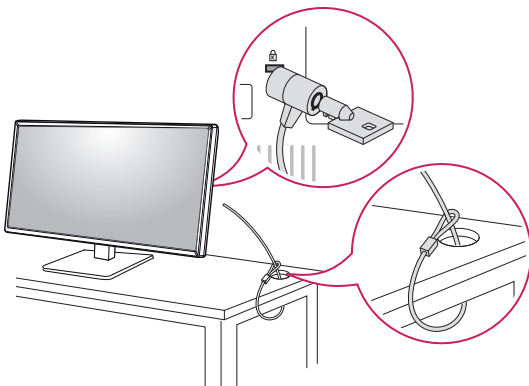
**! WARNING**

- Take care when rotating the monitor if the cable is connected.
- To avoid injury when rotating the display, do not place your fingers between the display and the stand base.

**Using the Kensington Lock**

The Kensington security system connector is located at the back of the Monitor set. For more information on installation and usage, refer to the Kensington lock user manual or visit the website at <http://www.kensington.com>.

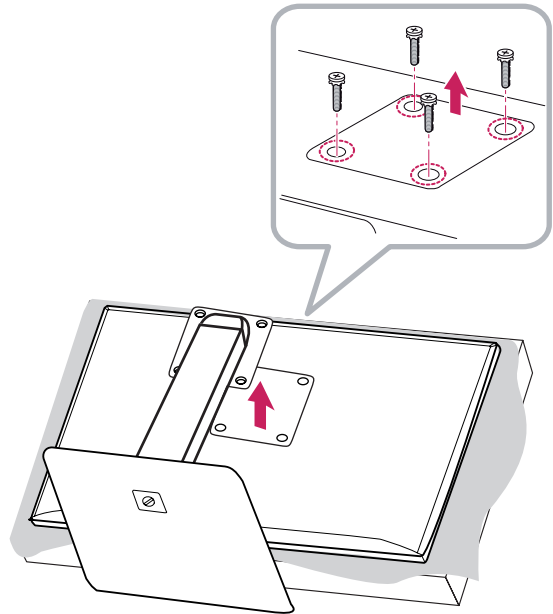
Connect the Kensington security system cable between the Monitor and a table.

**! NOTE**

- The Kensington security system is optional. You can obtain additional accessories from most electronics stores.

**Detaching the Stand Body**

- 1 Place the monitor's screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Using a screwdriver, remove the four screws and detach the stand from the monitor.



## Installing the Wall Mount Plate

This monitor meets the specifications for the wall mount plate or other compatible devices.

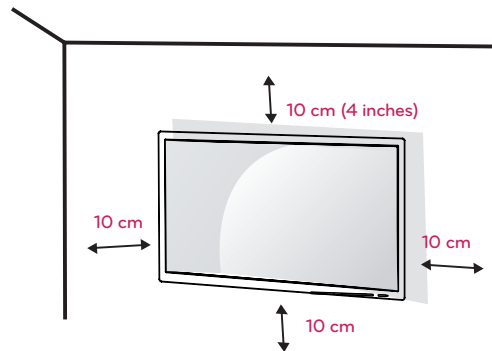
- 1 Place the screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Place the wall mount plate onto the monitor and align it with the screw holes.
- 3 Tighten the four screws to fix the plate to the monitor using a screwdriver.

### NOTE

- The wall mount plate is sold separately.
- For more information on installation, refer to the wall mount plate's installation guide.
- Be careful not to apply too much force while mounting the wall mount plate as it may cause damage to the screen

## Installing on the Wall

Install the monitor at least 10 cm (4 inches) away from the wall and leave about 10 cm (4 inches) of space at each side of the monitor to ensure sufficient ventilation. Detailed installation instructions can be obtained from your local retail store. Alternatively, please refer to the manual for how to install and set up a tilting wall mounting bracket.



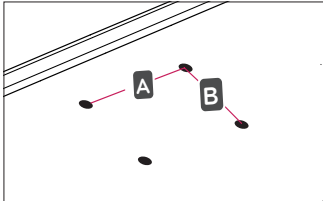
To install the monitor to a wall, attach a wall mounting bracket (optional) to the back of the monitor.

Make sure that the wall mounting bracket is securely fixed to the monitor and to the wall.

- 1 If you use screws longer than the standard length, it may damage the inside of the product.
- 2 A non-VESA standard screw may damage the product and cause the monitor to fall. LG Electronics is not liable for any accidents relating to the use of non-standard screws.

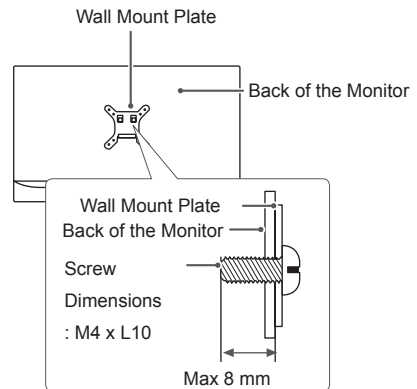


**NOTE**

- The wall mount kit includes the installation guide and all necessary parts.
- The wall mounting bracket is optional. You can obtain optional accessories from your local dealer.
- The length of the screw may differ for each wall mounting bracket. Be sure to use the proper length.
- For more information, please refer to the user manual for the wall mounting bracket.

**CAUTION**

- Unplug the power cord before moving or installing the monitor to avoid electric shock.
- Installing the monitor on the ceiling or on a slanted wall may result in the monitor falling off, which could lead to injury. Use an authorized LG wall mount and contact the local dealer or qualified personnel.
- Applying excessive force when tightening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be covered by the product warranty.
- Use the wall mounting bracket and screws that conform to VESA standards. Damage caused by the use or misuse of inappropriate components will not be covered by the product warranty.
- To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the wall in accordance with the installation instructions. (This pertains only to Australia and New Zealand.)
- When measured from the back of the monitor, the length of each installed screw must be 8 mm (5/16 inches) or less.



# USING THE MONITOR



## CAUTION

- Do not press on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image distortion.
- Do not display a still image on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image retention. Use a screensaver if possible.



## NOTE

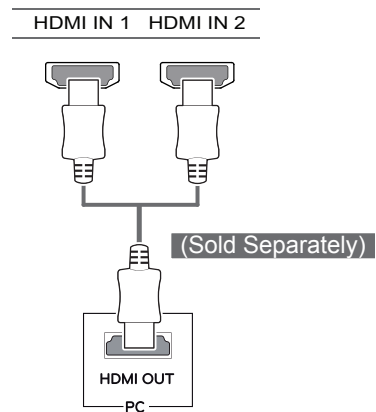
- When connecting the power cord to the outlet, use a grounded (3-hole) multi-socket or a grounded power outlet.
- The monitor may flicker when turned on in an area of low temperature. This is normal.
- Sometimes red, green, or blue spots may appear on the screen. This is normal.

## Connecting to a PC

- This monitor supports the \*Plug and Play feature.  
\*Plug and Play: A feature that allows you to add a device to your computer without having to reconfigure anything or install any manual drivers.

## HDMI Connection

Transmits digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect your PC to the monitor using the HDMI cable as shown in the illustration below.



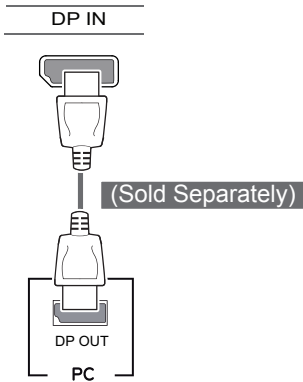
## CAUTION

- Connecting your PC to the monitor using the HDMI cable may cause device compatibility issues.
- Using a DVI to HDMI / DP(DisplayPort) to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.
- Use a certified cable with the HDMI logo attached. If you do not use a certified HDMI cable, the screen may not display or a connection error may occur.

## DisplayPort Connection

Transmits digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect the monitor to your PC using the display port cable as shown in the illustration below:

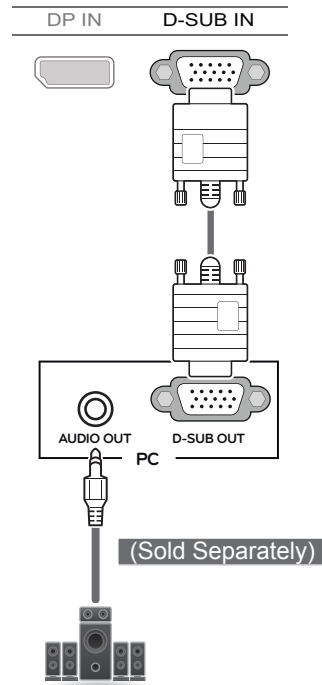

- There may be no video or audio output depending on the DP (DisplayPort) version of the PC.
- When using a Mini DP to DP (Mini DisplayPort to DisplayPort) cable, a cable with DisplayPort 1.1a specifications or above is recommended.

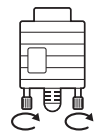
## D-SUB Connection

Transmits the analog video signal from your PC to the monitor. Connect the monitor to the PC using the provided 15-pin D-Sub signal cable as illustrated below.



**CAUTION**

- Connect the input signal cable and turn in the direction of the arrow. To prevent disconnection secure the cable firmly, do not over tighten.

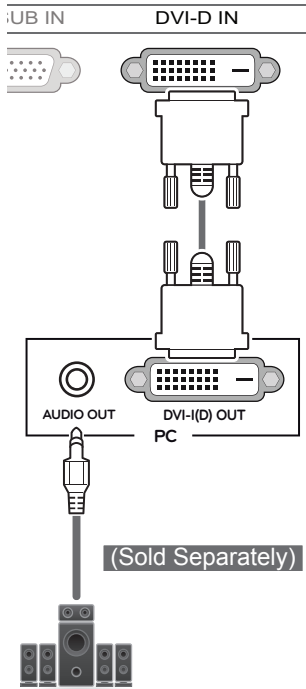

If you are using an Apple® computer, an Apple® adapter is required. The adapter can be purchased at an Apple® store.

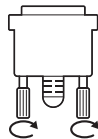
## DVI Connection

Transmits digital video signals to the monitor. Connect the monitor using the DVI cable as illustrated below.



### CAUTION

- Connect the input signal cable and turn in the direction of the arrow. To prevent disconnection secure the cable firmly, do not over tighten.



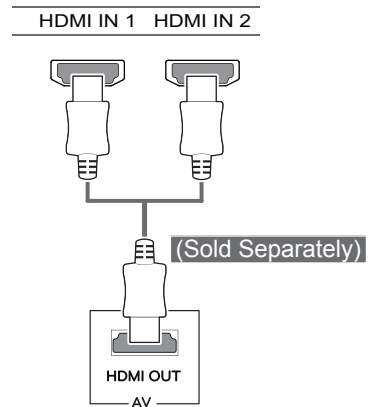
### NOTE

- Using a DVI to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.
- If you connect a DVI signal cable, use the DVI-D dual cable.

## Connecting AV Devices

### HDMI Connection

HDMI transmits digital video and audio signals from your AV device to the monitor. Connect your AV device to the monitor using the HDMI cable as shown in the illustration below.



### NOTE

- Using a DVI to HDMI / DP(DisplayPort) to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.
- Use a certified cable with the HDMI logo attached. If you do not use a certified HDMI cable, the screen may not display or a connection error may occur.

## Connecting Peripherals

### USB Cable Connection - PC

The USB port on the product functions as a USB hub.

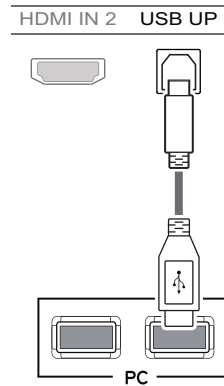
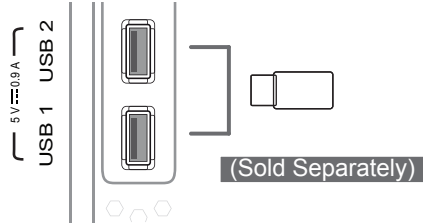
- Make sure to install the most recent Windows OS service pack before using the product.
- Peripheral devices are sold separately.
- A keyboard, mouse, or USB device can be connected to the USB port.

**CAUTION**

**Cautions When Using a USB Device**

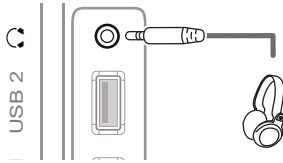
- A USB device with an automatic recognition program installed or that uses its own driver may not be recognized.
- Some USB devices may not be supported or may not work properly.
- It is recommended to use a USB hub or hard disk drive with an external power supply. (If the power supply is not adequate, the USB device may not be recognized properly.)

To use USB 3.0, connect the A-B type USB 3.0 cable of the product to the PC. Peripheral devices connected to the USB 1, 2 port can be controlled from the PC.



## Headphone Port Connection

Use the headphone port to connect a peripheral device to the monitor. Connect as illustrated.

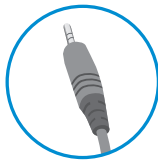

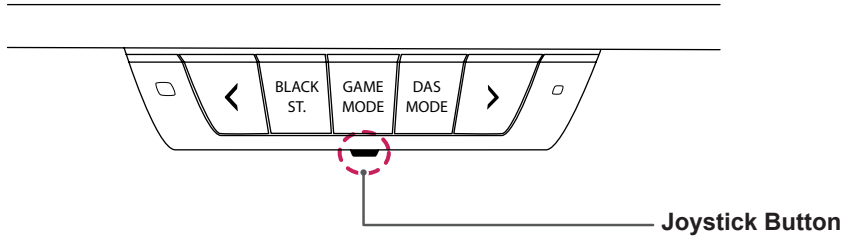

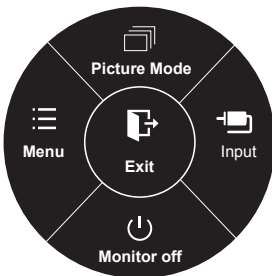
## Activating the Main Menu

- 1 Press the **joystick button** on the bottom of the monitor.
- 2 Move the joystick up/down (▲/▼) and left/right (◀/▶) to set the options.
- 3 Press the joystick button once more to exit the main menu.

- **Horizontal Frequency:** The time it takes to display one horizontal line is called the horizontal cycle. The number of horizontal lines displayed in one second can be calculated by dividing one by the horizontal cycle. This is called horizontal frequency and is represented by kHz.

**NOTE**

- Check if the video card's resolution or frequency is within the range allowed by the monitor and set to the recommended (optimal) resolution in **Control Panel > Display > Settings**.

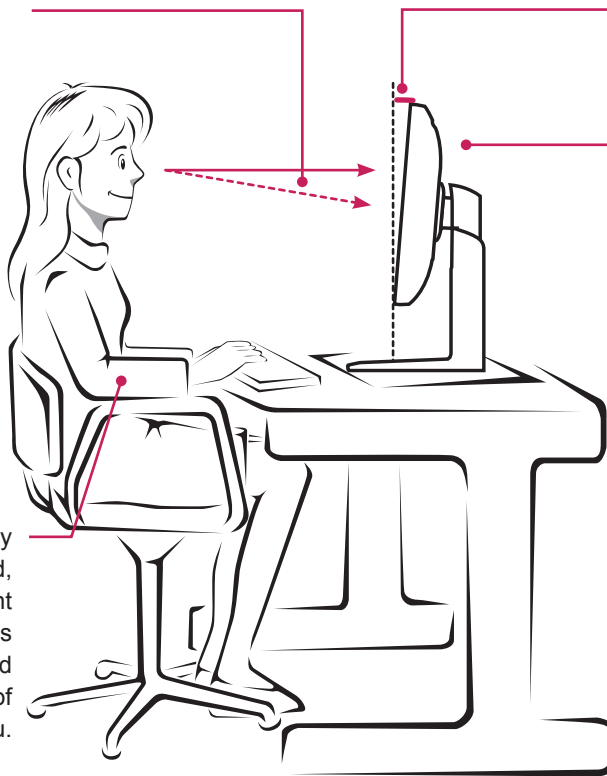
