





#### Playable Discs

This unit plays DVD±R/RW and CD-R/RW that contains audio titles, MP3, WMA and/or JPEG files. Some DVD±RW/DVD±R or CD-RW/CD-R cannot be played on this unit due to the recording quality or physical condition of the disc, or the characteristics of the recording device and authoring software.

## Regional Codes

This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labeled same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".

- Most DVD discs have a globe with one or more numbers in it clearly visible on the cover. This number must match your unit's regional code or the disc cannot play.
- If you try to play a DVD with a different regional code from your unit, the message "Check Regional Code" appears on the TV screen.

## Playable file Requirement

- We recommend that you use Easy-CD Creator, which creates an ISO9660 file system.
- You have to set the disc format option to [Mastered] in order to make the discs compatible with the LG players when formatting rewritable discs. When setting the option to Live File System, you cannot use it on LG players. (Mastered/ Live File System: Disc format system for Windows Vista)

The DTS is not supported. In case of DTS audio format, audio is not output.




- Connect the power cord to wall outlet directly if possible. Or when you use an extension cable, it is highly recommended to use an extension cable of 110 V / 15 A or 230 V / 15 A, otherwise the unit may not operate properly because of the lack of power supply.
- Do not overload the extension cord with excessive electrical load.

## **Use of Tripod**

You can mount the unit on a tripod. The tripod is an optional purchase.

#### $/! \setminus$ Caution $_-$


- Extend the tripod legs as much as possible and tighten up the screw securely.
- Before connecting with the unit, you must set up the tripod completely to prevent shaking.
- 1. Unfold the tripod on a flat surface. And then fix the tripod.
  - Tighten up the tightening part of the tripod.
- 2. Lift the speaker and connect the tripod to fixing part on the bottom of the speaker.



#### ∠!\ Caution

When connecting the speaker and the tripod, You should work together with more than two people.

3. Tighten up the Hand screw on the bottom of the unit.




#### ∠!\ Caution

Tighten up the Hand screw on the bottom of the unit while the other is holding a speaker and tripod.



#### Note

- If you use a tripod, use the tripod only for speaker.
- Before buying a tripod, check the specifications for maximum bearing load of the center column. (Unit's net weight: about 22.7 kg)



- Use tripod as below:

   (A) From tripod's center to tripod's leg:
   above 600 mm
   (B) From top of tripod to bottom of tripod:
   below 900 mm
   (C) Tripod net weight: over 3.9 kg
- Use a tripod as low as possible for safety use.
- You should pull the center column to the maximum only in case of need.
- Mount only one unit on each tripod.
- Do not try to extent the tripod legs outside over its allowed range.
- Make sure the tripod is correctly assembled and all its components are tightly connected.
- Do not try to assemble the tripod if parts are missing or defective.
- After installation, check whether the unit is set up firmly on the tripod or not.
- Do not place the unit on an unstable position where it might accidentally fall over.
- Add weight such as sand bags around the tripod legs to prevent them from falling over.




#### Note

- You should limit people around the unit while using this unit with tripod.
   Otherwise it may result in malfunction and causing personal injury or property damage.
- Standing on the stool to reach unit control panel is risky and might lead to injuries.
- Do not put or attach other objects on the tripod.
- Do not shake or push the unit when the tripod is installed.
- Refrain from moving around the tripod after unit is installed.
- Remove the units from all connected cables of the tripods before moving the tripods or adjusting their height.
- When transporting or moving the unit, always use two or more people.
- When you use the tripod, use an extension cord. always be careful the movement of cable.
- It is prohibited to use this unit outside. (Indoor use only)
- Do not expose the unit to excessive dust or vibrations, or extreme cold or heat (such as in direct sunlight, near a heater) to prevent the possibility of panel disfiguration or damage to the internal components.
- When using the external input cable (Mic, etc.) after installing the unit on the tripod, external input cable can cause the unit to fall down.
- Watch out the people can trip over the input cable (Mic, etc.) connected the unit.
- Always be careful of the unit being tripped.




# Connections to Your TV

#### **HDMI Out Connection**

If you have a HDMI TV or monitor, you can connect it to this unit using a HDMI cable (Type A, High Speed HDMI™ Cable).

Connect the HDMI OUT jack on the unit to the HDMI IN jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor. Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).





- You can fully enjoy digital audio and video signals together with this HDMI connection.
- When you use HDMl connection, you can change the resolution for the HDMl output. (Refer to "Resolution Setting" on page 17.)



#### Caution -

- Changing the resolution when the connection has already been established may result in malfunctions. To solve the problem, turn off the unit and then turn it on again.
- When the HDMI connection with HDCP is not verified, TV screen is changed to black or green screen or the snow noise may occur on the screen. In this case, check the HDMI connection, or disconnect the HDMI cable.
- Make sure the unit is connected directly to the TV. Tune the TV to the correct video input channel.



## Note -

- If a connected HDMI device does not accept the audio output of the unit, the HDMI device's audio sound may be distorted or may not output.
- When you connect a HDMI or DVI compatible device make sure of the following:
  - Try switching off the HDMI/DVI device and this unit. Next, switch on the HDMI/ DVI device and leave it for around 30. seconds, then switch on this unit.
  - The connected device's video input is set correctly for this unit.
  - The connected device is compatible with 720 x 480i (or 576i), 720 x 480p (or 576p), 1280 x 720p, 1920 x 1080i or 1920 x 1080p video input.
- Not all HDCP-compatible HDMI or DVI devices will work with this unit
  - The picture will not be displayed properly with non-HDCP device.
  - This unit does not playback and TV screen is changed to black or green screen or the snow noise may occur on the screen.
- If there is noise or lines on the screen, please check the HDMI cable and use a higher version cable than High Speed HDMI™ Cable.
- If you use LGTV or Bluetooth Function of the unit, the audio is not output to HDMI.

#### **Resolution Setting**

The unit provides several output resolutions for HDMI OUT.

You can change the resolution using [Setup] menu.

- 1. Press **The HOME**.
- Use </> to select the [Setup] and press ENTER. The [Setup] menu appears.



- Use ∧ / V to select [Display] option then press
   to move to the second level.
- 4. Use **∧ / V** to select the [Resolution] option then press **>** to move to the third level.
- 5. Use  $\Lambda/V$  to select the desired resolution then press  $\odot$  **ENTER** to confirm your selection.



If your TV does not accept the resolution you have set on the player, you can set resolution to 480p (or 576p) as follows:


Press **STOP** for more than 5 seconds.

#### **AUX IN Connection**

Connect an output of auxiliary device (Camcorder, TV, Player, etc) to the **AUX IN** (L/R) connector.

If your device has only one output for audio (mono), connect it to the left audio jack on the unit.





If your device has only one input for audio(mono), connect it to the left audio jack on the unit.



#### PORT. IN Connection

Connect an output (earphone or line out) of portable device (MP3 or PMP etc) to the **PORT. IN** connector.



## Listening to music from your portable player or external device

The unit can be used to play the music from many types of portable player or external device.

1. Connect the portable player to the PORT. IN connector on the unit.

Or

Connect the external device to the AUX IN connector on the unit.

- 2. Turn the power on by pressing **(b)**/**| POWER ON/OFF**.
- 3. Press FUNCTION to select the AUX or PORTABLE function.
- 4. Turn on the portable player or external device and start it playing.

### **USB** Connection

Connect a USB device (or MP3 player, etc.) to the USB ports on the unit.





Removing the USB device from the unit:

- Choose a different function/mode or press ■ STOP on the remote control or □ on the unit twice in a row.
- 2. Remove the USB device from the unit.

#### Compatible USB Devices

- MP3 Player: Flash type MP3 player.
- USB Flash Drive : Devices that support USB2.0 or USB1.1.
- The USB function of this unit does not support some USB devices.


#### USB device requirement

- Devices which require additional program installation connected to a computer, are not supported.
- Do not extract the USB device while in operation.
- For a large capacity USB, it may take longer than a few minute to be searched.
- To prevent data loss, back up all data.
- If you use a USB extension cable or USB hub, the USB device is not recognized.
- Using NTFS file system is not supported. (Only FAT(16/32) file system is supported.)
- This unit is not supported when the total number of files is 1000 or more.
- External HDD, Card readers, Locked devices, or hard type usb devices are not supported.
- USB port of the unit cannot be connected to PC. The unit can not be used as a storage device.
- Some USB Devices may not work with this unit.

### **Antenna Connection**

Connect the supplied FM antenna for listening to the radio.

Connect the FM wire antenna to the FM antenna connector.





Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.

## Adjust the setup settings

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound.

You can also set a language for the subtitles and the Setup menu, among other things. For details on each Setup menu item, see pages 21 to 24.

## **OSD Initial language settings** - Optional

During the first use of this unit, the initial language setup menu appears on your TV screen. You must complete initial language selection before using the unit. English will be selected as the initial language.

1. Press (1) (**POWER**) to turn the unit on. The language setup menu will appear on the screen.



2. Use  $\wedge \vee <>$  to select a language then press ENTER.

The confirm menu will appear.



3. Use <> to select the [Enter] then press **⊙ ENTER** to finish the language setup.

## To display and exit the Setup menu

 Press HOME. Displays the [Home Menu].

#### Language

#### Menu Language

Select a language for the Setup menu and on screen display.

#### Disc Audio / Disc Subtitle / Disc Menu

Select the language you prefer for the audio track (disc audio), subtitles, and the disc menu.

#### [Original]

Refers to the original language in which the disc was recorded.

#### [Other]

To select another language, press numeric buttons and then **© ENTER** to enter the corresponding 4-digit number according to the language code list on the page 46. If you enter the wrong language code, press CLEAR.

#### [Off (for Disc Subtitle)]

Turns off Subtitle.

## Display

#### TV Aspect

Select the screen aspect to use based on the shape of your TV screen.

#### [4:3]

Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected.

#### [16:9]

Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

#### Display Mode

The Display Mode setting works only when the TV Aspect mode is set to 4:3.

#### [Letterbox]

Displays a wide picture with bands on the upper and lower portions of the screen.

#### [Panscan]

Automatically displays the wide picture on the entire screen and cuts off the portions that do not fit. (If the disc/file is not compatible with Pan Scan, the picture is displayed at Letterbox ratio.)

#### Resolution

Sets the output resolution of HDMI video signal. Refer to "Resolution Setting" for details about the resolution (page 17).

#### [Auto]

If the HDMI OUT jack is connected to TVs providing display information (EDID), automatically selects the resolution best suited to the connected TV.

#### [1080p]

Outputs 1080 lines of progressive video.

#### [1080i]

Outputs 1080 lines of interlaced video.

#### [720p]

Outputs 720 lines of progressive video.

#### [480p (or 576p)]

Outputs 480 (or 576) lines of progressive video.

#### [480i (or 576i)]

Outputs 480 (or (576) lines of interlaced video.

#### Audio

#### **DRC (Dynamic Range Control)**

Make the sound clear when the volume is turned down (Dolby Digital only). Set to [On] for this effect.

#### HD AV Sync

Sometimes Digital TV encounters a delay between picture and sound. If this happens you can compensate by setting a delay on the sound so that it effectively 'waits' for the picture to arrive: this is called HD AV Sync. Use  $\Lambda$  V (on the remote control) to scroll up and down through the delay amount, which you can set at anything between 0 and 300ms.

#### Lock (Parental Control)

#### Initial Setting the Area Code:

When you use this unit for the first time, you have to set the Area Code.

- 1. Select the [Lock] menu and then press >.
- 2. Press >.

To access the [Lock] options, you must input the password you have created. Input a password and press **© ENTER**. Enter it again and press **© ENTER** to verify. If you make a mistake before pressing **© ENTER**, press **CLEAR**.

- 3. Select the first character using  $\Lambda V$  buttons.
- Press **⊙** ENTER and select the second character using ∧ V buttons.
- 5. Press **© ENTER** to confirm your Area code selection.

#### Rating

Blocks playback of rated DVDs based on their contents. Not all discs are rated.

- Select [Rating] on the [Lock] menu then press
   .
- 2. Input a password and press **© ENTER**.
- 3. Select a rating from 1 to 8 using the **\( \nabla \)** buttons.

#### [Rating 1-8]

Rating one (1) has the most restrictions and rating eight (8) is the least restrictive.

#### [Unlock]

If you select unlock, parental control is not active and the disc plays in full.

4. Press **© ENTER** to confirm your rating selection.

#### **Password**

You can enter or change password.

- Select [Password] on the [Lock] menu and then press >.
- Press ENTER.
- Input a password and press © ENTER.
   To change the password, press © ENTER when the [Change] option is highlighted. Input a password and press © ENTER. Enter it again

Bluetooth is wireless communication technology for short range connection.

The sound may be interrupted when the connection interfered by the other electronic wave or you connect the **Bluetooth** in the other rooms. Connecting individual devices under

**Bluetooth** wireless technology does not incur any charges. A mobile phone with **Bluetooth** wireless technology can be operated via the Cascade if the connection was made via **Bluetooth** wireless technology.

Available Devices: Mobile phone, MP3, Laptop, PDA (This units be supported the Stereo Headset.)

#### **BLUETOOTH Profiles**

In order to use **Bluetooth** wireless technology, devices must be able to interpret certain profiles. This unit is compatible with following profile.

A2DP (Advanced Audio Distribution Profile)

## Listening to music of a BLUETOOTH device

Pairing your unit and **Bluetooth** device

Before you start the pairing procedure, make sure the **Bluetooth** feature is turned on in to your Bluetooth device. Refer to your **Bluetooth** device's user guide. Once a pairing operation is performed, it does not need to be performed again.

- Select the Bluetooth function by using
   FUNCTION until BT function is selected or pressing @ Bluetooth on the unit.
   Appears "BT READY" in display window.
- Operate the **Bluetooth** device and perform the pairing operation. When searching for this unit with the **Bluetooth** device, a list of the devices found may appear in the **Bluetooth** device display depending on the type of **Bluetooth** device. Your unit appears as "LG MINI(XX:XX)".



XX:XX means the last four digits of BT address. For example, if your unit has a BT address such as 9C:02:98:4A:F7:08, you will see "LG MINI(F7:08)" on your Bluetooth device.

- If you change the function of the unit, the Bluetooth function is disconnected, operate pairing again.
   (Bluetooth ← Function other than the Bluetooth)
- Depending on the Bluetooth device type, some device have a different pairing way. (Enter the PIN code (0000) as needed.)



#### Note -

- The sound may be interrupted when the connection interfered by the other electronic wave.
- You cannot control the Bluetooth device with this unit.
- Pairing is limited one Bluetooth device per one unit and multi-pairing is not supported.
- Depending on the type of the device, you may not be able to use the Bluetooth function.
- You can enjoy wireless system using phone, MP3, Notebook, headset, etc.
- When not connected the Bluetooth, "BT READY" appears on the display window.
- The Electrical malfunction due to devices using same frequency such as Medical equipment, Microwaves or wireless LAN devices, the connection will be disconnected.
- When someone stands and interrupts communication between Bluetooth device and the player, the connection will be disconnected.
- If the gotten away of the distance between Bluetooth and the unit, the sound quality is lower and lower the connection will disconnect when the space between the Bluetooth and the unit gets out of the operating range of Bluetooth.
- If the function is changed to Bluetooth again from other function, Bluetooth device is paired automatically.
- Bluetooth and LG Sound Sync connection are unavailable during recording.

- You can check the recording percentage rate for the USB record on the screen during the recording. (Audio CD or MP3/ WMA CD only)
- During recording MP3/WMA, there is no sound.
- When you stop recording during playback, the file that has been recorded at that time will be stored. (Except MP3/WMA files)
- Do not remove the USB device or turn off the unit during USB recording. If does not, an incomplete file may be made and not deleted on PC.
- Recording through microphones is not available
- If USB recording does not work, the message like "NO USB", "ERROR", "USB FULL" or "NO REC" is displayed on the display window.
- Multi card reader device or external HDD can not be used for USB recording.

This unit memorizes last scene from the last disc that is viewed. The last scene remains in memory even if you remove the disc from the unit or switch off the unit. If you load a disc that has the scene memorized, the scene is automatically recalled.

## Power Resume - Optional

#### DVD

Even if the power suddenly goes out, turn on the unit and then it plays a position where the contents is being played. System will periodically save current playback status.

#### System Select - Optional

You must select the appropriate system mode for your TV system. Press and hold II PAUSE/STEP for more than five seconds to be able to select a system in the [Home Menu]. (NTSC ↔ PAL)



#### Note

If the USB device is connected or a disc is inserted, this function is not operated.

## Turn off the sound temporarily

Press **MUTE** on the remote control to mute your unit.

You can mute your unit, for example, to answer the telephone, "MUTE" is displayed in the display

To cancel it, press **MUTE** again or change the volume level.

#### CHILDSAFE Mode

This function helps to prevent you from being surprised when you turn on the unit in case that the volume of the unit is set at a high level.

To turn on CHILDSAFE mode, press and hold ENTER / SET on the unit when the volume of the unit is "MIN"

## Auto power down

This unit will be off itself to save electric consumption in the case main unit is not connected to external device and is not used for 20 minutes. So does this unit after six hours since Main unit has been connected to other device using analog input.

## How to disconnect the wireless network connection or the wireless device.

Turn off the unit by pressing the power button for more than 5 seconds.

## **AUTO POWER On**

This unit automatically turns on by an input source: LGTV or **Bluetooth** 

If you try to connect your **Bluetooth** device, this unit turns on and connects your **Bluetooth** device. You can play your music.



#### ■ Note -

- Depending on the connected device, this function may not operate.
- Depending on the connected device, the unit turns on but Bluetooth function may not be connected.
- If you disconnect Bluetooth connection by this unit, some Bluetooth devices try to connect to the unit continually. Therefore it is recommended to disconnect the connection before turning off the unit.
- If you turn on the unit using LGTV or Bluetooth function, proper function of this unit is turned on.
- If you have already paired with this unit, automatically this unit can turn on by an input source when this unit is turned off.
- · If you turn off the unit by pressing the power button for more than 5 seconds, Auto Power On function is disabled. To activate it. turn on the unit.

## Auto function change

This unit recognizes input signals such as **Bluetooth** and LGTV and then changes suitable function automatically.

#### When you try to connect Bluetooth device

When you try to connect your Bluetooth device to this unit, Bluetooth function is selected. Play your music on the Bluetooth device.

#### When LG TV signal comes in

When you turn on your LGTV connected by LG Sound Sync, this unit changes the function to LG TV. You can hear the sound from your TV.



#### Note

- This unit does not respond to the bluetooth connection signal while using the LGTV function.
- If you using the bluetooth function, this unit does not respond to LGTV connection
- The bluetooth unit or the LGTV which is not paired with this unit, cannot use the auto function change.
- If you change the this unit's function to other function, some bluetooth unit may try to connecting in succession. Disconnect the bluetooth connection before changing of the this unit's function.

## LG Sound Sync



You can control some functions of this unit by your TV's remote control with LG Sound Sync. It is compatible with the LGTV that is supported LG Sound Sync. Make sure of the LG Sound Sync logo on your TV.

Controllable function by LG TV's remote control: Volume up/down, mute

Refer to the TV's instruction manual for the details of LG Sound Svnc.



#### Note

- You can also use the remote control of this unit while using LG Sound Sync. If you use TV's remote control again, the unit synchronizes with the TV.
- If the connection fails, check the conditions of this unit and your TV: power, function.
- Make sure of the condition of this unit and the connection in the cases below when using LG Sound Sync.
  - Turn off the unit.
  - Changing the function to the others.
  - Disconnecting the wireless connection caused by interference or a distance.
- Details of TV setting menu vary depending on the models of your TV.
- Bluetooth connection is unavailable after connecting LGTV.
- The amount of time to turn off this unit is different depending on your TV.
- Bluetooth and LG Sound Sync connection are unavailable during recording.

#### With wireless connection

- 1. Turn on the unit by pressing (b) (Power) on the remote control.
- 2. Select LGTV function by using the **FUNCTION** on the remote control.
- 3. Set up the sound output of TV to listen to the sound through this unit: TV setting menu → [Sound] → [TV Sound output] → [LG Sound Sync (Wireless)] "PAIRED" appears on the display window and

then you can see "LGTV" on the display window if connecting normally between this unit and vour TV.



#### Note -

- If you turned off the unit directly by pressing (Power), LG Sound Sync (Wireless) will be disconnected. To use this function again, you should reconnect the TV and the unit.
- Details of TV setting menu vary depending on the manufacturers or models of your TV.


# **Troubleshooting**

#### When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

#### Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

- · Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.
- Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.
- Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

#### Cleaning the unit

To clean the player, use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, or thinner, as these might damage the surface of the

#### Maintaining the Unit

The unit is a high-tech, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn, the picture quality could be diminished. For details, please contact your nearest authorized service center.

#### Notes on Discs

#### **Handling Discs**

Do not touch the playback side of the disc. Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints do not get on the surface. Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

#### Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

#### Cleaning Discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center to out.

Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.
