# Important Notice for TV colour system


The colour system of this player differs according to currently playing discs.

For example, when the player plays the disc recorded in the NTSC colour system, the image is output as an NTSC signal.

Only the multi system colour TV can receive all signals output from the player.

- If you have a PAL colour system TV, you will see just distorted images when using discs or video contents recorded in NTSC.
- The multi system colour TV changes the colour system automatically according to input signals.
   In case that the colour system is not changed automatically, turn it off and then on to see normal images on screen.
- Even if the disc recorded in NTSC colour system are well displayed on your TV, these may not be recorded correctly on your recorder.

#### What is SIMPLINK?



Some functions of this unit are controlled by the TV's remote control when this unit and LGTV's with SIMPLINK are connected through HDMI connection.

Controllable functions by LGTV's remote control; Play, Pause, Scan, Skip, Stop, Power Off, etc.

# Network Software Update

#### Network update notification

From time to time, performance improvements and/or additional features or services may be made available to units that are connected to a broadband home network. If there is new software available and the unit is connected to a broadband home network, the player will inform you about the update as follows.

#### Option 1:

- 1. The update menu will appear on the screen when you turn on the player.
- 2. Use </> to select a desired option and then press ENTER (**②**).



[OK]	Starts the software update.
[Cancel]	Exits the update menu and displays it next booting.
[Hide]	Exits the update menu and it does not appear until next software is uploaded in the update server.

#### Option 2:

If the software update is available from the update server, the "Update" icon appears in the Home menu. Press blue (B) coloured button to start the update procedure.







# Connections to Your TV

# Antenna connection to your TV and this unit


Connect one end of the RF cable to ANTENNA OUT(TO TV) jack on the unit and other end to ANTENNA IN jack on your TV. Passes the signal from the ANTENNA IN jack to your TV/monitor.

Connect the Terrestrial TV antenna to the ANTENNA IN jack on the unit. If you want to use an indoor antenna, use one with a signal amplifier rated at 5V, 100mA and set [Antenna 5V] to [ON] in the setup menu.



## **HDMI** Connection

If you have a HDMITV or monitor, you can connect it to this unit using a HDMI cable (Type A, High Speed HDMI™ Cable). Connect the HDMI jack on the unit to the HDMI jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor.




Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).

## **Resolution Setting**

The player provides several output resolutions for HDMI OUT jacks. You can change the resolution using [Setup] menu.

- 1. Press HOME (1).
- 2. Use **◄/▶** to select the [Setup] and press ENTER (**⑤**). The [Setup] menu appears.



3. Use ▲/▼ to select [DISPLAY] option then press ▶ to move to the second level.



4. Use **◄/▶** to select the [Resolution] option then press ENTER (**⊙**) to move to the third level.




5. Use ▲/▼ to select the desired resolution then press ENTER (**②**) to confirm your selection.



- If your TV does not accept the resolution you have set on the player, you can set resolution to 576p as follows:
  - 1. Press ▲ to open the disc tray.
  - 2. Press  $\blacksquare$  (STOP) for more than 5 seconds.

#### Wired network connection

Connect the unit's LAN port to the corresponding port on your Modem or Router using a commercially available LAN or Ethernet cable (CAT5 or better with RJ45 connector). In the example configuration for wired connection below, this player would be able to access content from either of the PCs.

#### Wired Network Setup

If there is a DHCP server on the local area network (LAN) via wired connection, this player will automatically be allocated an IP address. After making the physical connection, a small number of home networks may require the player's network setting to be adjusted. Adjust the [NETWORK] setting as follow.

#### **Preparation**

Before setting the wired network, you need to connect the broadband internet to your home network.

1. Select [Connection Setting] option in the [Setup] menu then press ENTER (1).



2. Use  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$  to select the IP mode between [Dynamic] and [Static]. Normally, select [Dynamic] to allocate an IP address automatically.





If there is no DHCP server on the network and you want to set the IP address manually, select [Static] then set [IP Address], [Subnet Mask], [Gateway] and [DNS Server] using ▲/▼/

◄/► and numerical buttons. If you make a mistake while entering a number, press CLEAR to clear the highlighted part.

- 3. Select [OK] and press ENTER (**②**) to apply network settings.
- The player will ask you to test the network connection. Select [OK] and press ENTER
   (♠) to complete the network connection.
- If you select [Test] and press ENTER
   (②) at step 5 above, the network connection status is displayed on the screen.
   You can also test it on the [Connection Status] in the [Setup] menu.



# **Settings**

## Adjust the Setup Settings

You can change the settings of the player in the [Setup] menu.

1. Press HOME (1).



Use ◀/▶ to select [Setup] and press ENTER
 (②). The [Setup] menu appears.



3. Use ▲/▼ to select the first setup option, and press ▶ to move to the second level.



 Use ▲/▼ to select a second setup option, and press ENTER (③)) or ▶ to move to the third level.



5. Use ▲/▼ to select a desired setting, and press ENTER (**②**)) or ▶ to confirm your selection.

# General Playback

### Using [HOME] menu

To access numerous functions of the unit, press HOMF on the remote.

HOME: Accesses or removes the Home Menu.

◄/►: Used to navigate on-screen displays. ENTER (**②**): Acknowledges menu selection. BACK ( ): Exits the menu.



#### DTV

You can watch digital broadcasts.

Starts video media's playback or displays the [MOVIE] menu.

#### Photo

Displays [PHOTO] menu.

#### Music

Displays [MUSIC] menu.

#### Netcast

Shows YouTube videos, Picasa Web Albums and Accu Weather streamed from the Youtube server via the internet to your TV.

#### Setup

Displays [Setup] menu.

#### Playing a Disc

## BD DVD ACD

- 1. Press (OPEN/CLOSE), and place a disc on the disc tray.
- 2. Press ♠ (OPEN/CLOSE) to close the disc tray. For the most Audio CD, BD-ROM and DVD-ROM discs, playback starts automatically.
- Press HOME ( ).
- 4. Select [Movie] or [Music] using **◄/▶**, and press ENTER (1).
- 5. Select [BD], [DVD], [VR] or [Audio] option using  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ , and press ENTER ( $\odot$ ).



- Playback functions described in this manual are not always available in every files and media. Some functions can be restricted. depending on many factors.
- Depending on the BD-ROM titles, a USB device connection may be needed for the proper playback.
- Unfinalized DVD VR format discs may not be played in this player.
- Some DVD-VR discs are made with CPRM data by DVD RECORDER. This unit cannot support these kinds of discs.

## Playing a file on disc/USB device

# MOVIE MUSIC PHOTO

This player can play movie, music and photo files contained in the disc or USB device.

- 1. Insert a data disc on the tray or connect a USB device.
- 2. Press HOME (1).
- 3. Select [Movie], [Photo] or [Music] using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (1).
- 4. Select [Data] or [USB] option using ▲/▼, and press ENTER (**②**).
- 5. Select a file using  $\triangle/\nabla/\triangle$ , and press ►(PLAY) or ENTER (**⊙**) to play the file.

# Basic operations for video and audio content

#### To stop playback

Press ■ (STOP) while playback.

#### To pause playback

Press ■ (PAUSE) while playback.

Press ► (PLAY) to resume playback.

#### To play frame-by-frame (Video)

Press II (PAUSE) while movie playback.

Press **II** (PAUSE) repeatedly to play Frame-by-Frame playback.

#### To scan forward or backward

Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to play fast forward or fast reverse during playback.

You can change the various playback speeds by pressing ◀◀ or ▶▶ repeatedly.

#### To slow down the playing speed

While the playback is paused, press ►► repeatedly to play various speeds of slow motion.

# To skip to the next/previous chapter/track/file

During playback, press ◄ or ► to go to the next chapter/track/file or to return to the beginning of the current chapter/track/file.


Press ► twice briefly to step back to the previous chapter/track/file.

# On-Screen display

You can display and adjust various information and settings about the content.



1. During playback, press INFO/MENU ( ) to show various playback information.

- **3 Time** elapsed playing time/total playback time

# **Troubleshooting**

# General

Symptoms	Cause & Solution
The Power does not turn on.	Plug the power cord into the wall outlet securely.
The unit does not start playback.	<ul> <li>Insert a playable disc. (Check the disc type, color system, and regional code.)</li> <li>Place the disc with the playback side down.</li> <li>Place the disc on the disc tray correctly inside the guide.</li> <li>Clean the disc.</li> <li>Cancel the Rating function or change the rating level.</li> </ul>
The angle cannot be changed.	Multi-angles are not recorded on the DVD Video being played.
Cannot play movie, photo or audio files.	<ul> <li>The files are not recorded in a format that the unit can play.</li> <li>The unit does not support the codec of the movie file.</li> </ul>
The remote control does not work properly.	<ul> <li>The remote control is not pointed at the remote sensor of the unit.</li> <li>The remote control is too far from the unit.</li> <li>There is an obstacle in the path between the remote control and the unit.</li> <li>The batteries in the remote control are exhausted.</li> </ul>

Cannot record or does not	Check the remaining space on the HDD.
record successfully.	If your source is copy-protected, you cannot record it using this recorder.
	If you set a DTV rating for the recorder and higher rated digital programs are received, the programme cannot be recorded. Change the DTV rating level in order to record it.
Timer record does not record	Clock is not set to correct time.
successfully.	The start time of the timer recording is past.
	When setting the recording programme, make sure you set the recorder's built-in tuner, not the TV's built-in tuner.
	If the HDD is damaged, the recording may not complete successfully.
You cannot enter a timer programme when.	The time you're trying to set has already passed.
	There are already 32 timer programs set.
	In case of changing broadcasting time depending on circumstances.
If two or more timer programs overlap.	The earlier programme takes priority.

# **Picture**

Symptom	Cause & Solution
There is no picture.	Select the appropriate video input mode on the TV so the picture from the unit appears on the TV screen.
	Connect the video connection securely.
	Check the [HDMl Color Setting] in the [Setup] menu is set to the appropriate item that conforms to your video connection.
	Your TV may not support the resolution you have set on the unit. Change the resolution to one that your TV accepts.
	The player's HDMI OUT jack is connected to a DVI device that does not support copyright protection.
Picture noise appears	You are playing a disc recorded in a colour system that is different from your TV.
	Set the resolution to one that your TV accepts.

# Sound

Symptom	Cause & Solution
There is no sound or the sound	Connect the audio connection securely.
is distorted.	The input source setting on the amplifier or the connection to the amplifier is incorrect.
	The unit is in scan, slow motion, or pause mode.
	The sound volume is low.
	Check that the connected amplifier is compatible with the audio format output from the player.
	The player's HDMI OUT jack is connected to a DVI device. The DVI jack does not accept audio signal.
	Check the device connected to the player's HDMI OUT jack is compatible with the audio format output from the unit.

# Network

Symptom	Cause & Solution
BD-LIVE feature does not work.	The connected USB storage may not have enough space. Connect the USB storage with at least 1GB free space.
	Ensure that the unit is correctly connected to the local area network and can access the internet.
	Your broadband speed may not be fast enough to use the BD-Live features. Contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP) and increase the broadband speed to suit the unit's requirements.
	The [BD-LIVE connection] option in the [Setup] menu is set to [Prohibited]. Set the option to [Permitted].
Streaming video services (such as YouTube™, etc.) are often stop or "buffer" during playback.	Your broadband service speed may not be fast enough to stream video services. Contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP) and increase the broadband speed is recommended.
