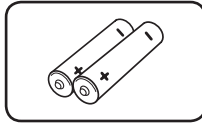
LG AV Remote

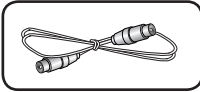

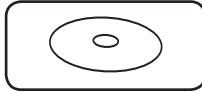

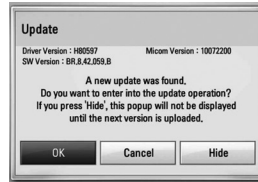
Network Software Update

Network update notification

From time to time, performance improvements and/or additional features or services may be made available to units that are connected to a broadband home network. If there is new software available and the unit is connected to a broadband home network, the player will inform you about the update as follows.

Option 1:

1. The update menu will appear on the screen when you turn on the player.
2. Use \langle / \rangle to select a desired option and then press ENTER (⊙).



[OK]	Starts the software update.
[Cancel]	Exits the update menu and displays it next booting.
[Hide]	Exits the update menu and it does not appear until next software is uploaded in the update server.

Option 2:

If the software update is available from the update server, the "Update" icon appears in the Home menu. Press blue (B) coloured button to start the update procedure.

- HD movie files that need high performance playback could react slowly.
- The total playback time indicated on the screen may not be correct for .ts files.

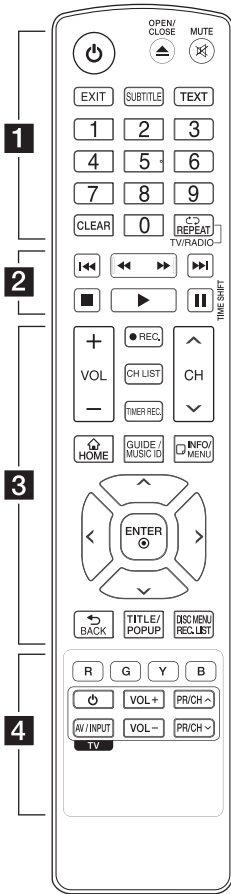

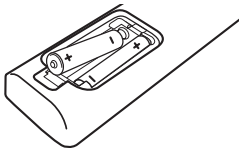

Remote control



Battery Installation



Remove the battery cover on the rear of the Remote Control, and insert two R03 (size AAA) batteries with + and - matched correctly.

⏻ (POWER): Switches the player ON or OFF.

⏮ (OPEN/CLOSE): Opens and closes the disc tray.

MUTE (🔇): Mutes the sound.

EXIT: Exits a menu or hides on-screen information.

SUBTITLE: Selects a subtitle language.

TEXT: Switches between teletext mode and normal TV viewing.

0-9 numerical buttons: Selects numbered options in a menu.

CLEAR: Removes a mark on the search menu or a number when setting the password.

REPEAT (↺): Repeats a desired section or sequence.

TV/RADIO: Switches between TV and radio modes.

⏮ / ⏭ (SCAN): Searches backward or forward.

⏮ / ⏭ (SKIP): Goes to the next or previous chapter / track / file.

DISC MENU/REC.LIST: Accesses menu on a disc or switches between recording list menu.

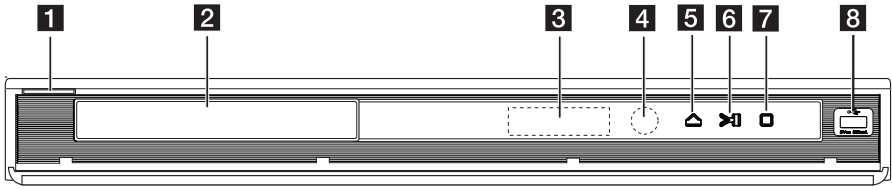

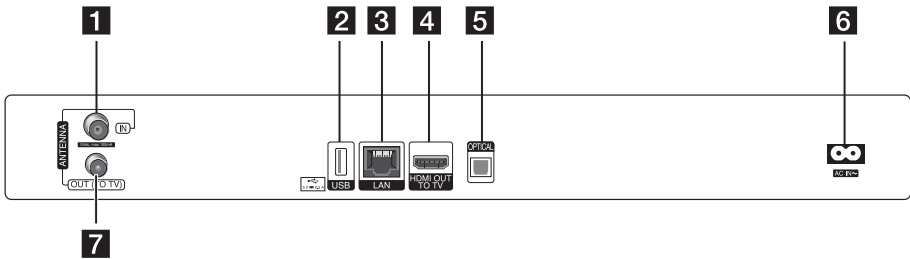

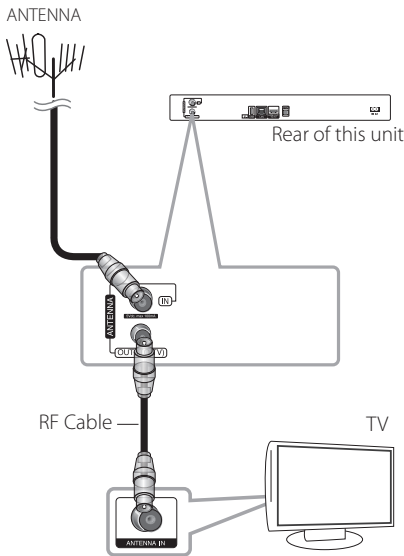

Connections to Your TV

Antenna connection to your TV and this unit

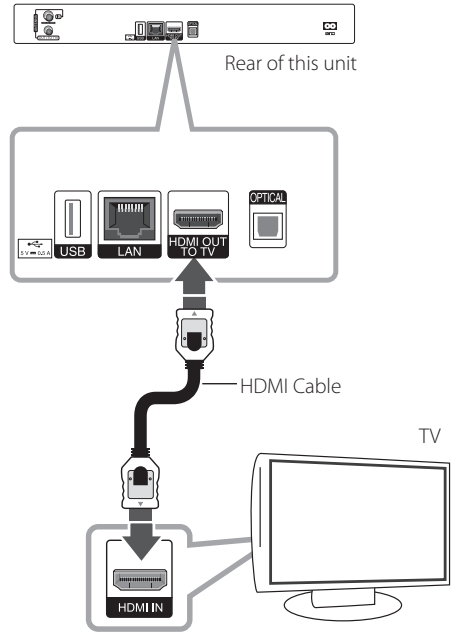
Connect one end of the RF cable to ANTENNA OUT(TO TV) jack on the unit and other end to ANTENNA IN jack on your TV. Passes the signal from the ANTENNA IN jack to your TV/monitor.

Connect the Terrestrial TV antenna to the ANTENNA IN jack on the unit. If you want to use an indoor antenna, use one with a signal amplifier rated at 5V, 100mA and set [Antenna 5V] to [ON] in the setup menu.



HDMI Connection

If you have a HDMI TV or monitor, you can connect it to this unit using a HDMI cable (Type A, High Speed HDMI™ Cable). Connect the HDMI jack on the unit to the HDMI jack on a HDMI compatible TV or monitor.

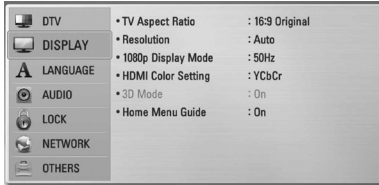


Set the TV's source to HDMI (refer to TV's Owner's manual).

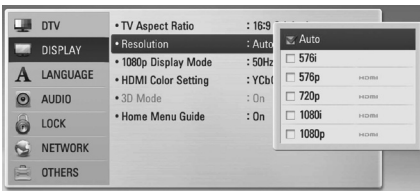
Resolution Setting

The player provides several output resolutions for HDMI OUT jacks. You can change the resolution using [Setup] menu.

1. Press HOME (🏠).
2. Use </> to select the [Setup] and press ENTER (⊙). The [Setup] menu appears.



3. Use ^/v to select [DISPLAY] option then press > to move to the second level.
4. Use </> to select the [Resolution] option then press ENTER (⊙) to move to the third level.



5. Use ^/v to select the desired resolution then press ENTER (⊙) to confirm your selection.

Auto Set UP

You can reset the recorder to all its factory settings. Some options cannot be reset (Rating and Password). The [Auto Setup] menu appears on the screen after the factory settings.

Step 1. Language Setting

1. Use ^/v/</> to select a language for the on-screen display, and press ENTER (⊙).



Step 2. Channel Setting

1. Input the new password using numerical buttons. Enter it again to verify.

2. While the Start option is selected, and press ENTER (⊙) to begin the channel search.

If you want to search channels in numerical order, uncheck the box [Automatic Numbering] by using ENTER (⊙)



The recorder automatically searches for and saves the programmes.

If you select [Stop], the [Channel Setting] function will be skipped.

3. Press ENTER (⊙).

Step 3. Time Setting

1. Use </> to select an option among [Manual] or [Auto], and press ENTER (⊙).



Auto: Set the programme that broadcasts a clock signal and the clock will be set automatically.

If the time that has automatically set is not correct comparing your local time, you can set additional time option.

Manual: If there is no channel that broadcasts a clock signal in your area, you can set the time and date manually. Use ^/v to select each field, and input correct time and date using </>. You can use numerical buttons.

2. Press ENTER (⊙) to complete the time setting.

Step 4. Network Setting

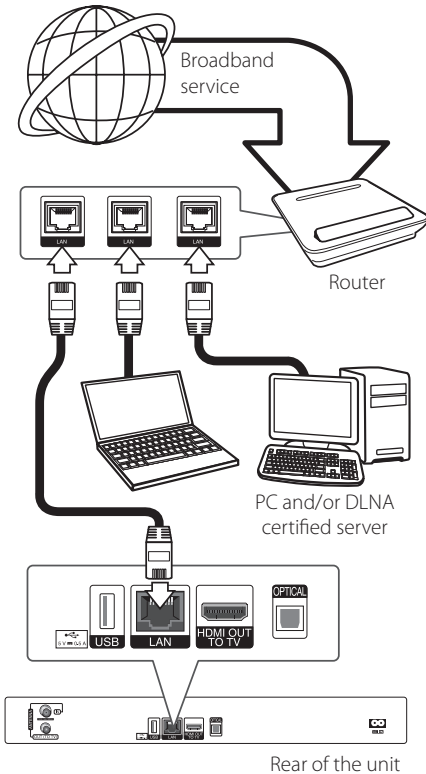
Refer to "Wired network connection" or "Wireless network connection" on pages 12-13 to complete the [Wired] or [Wireless] setup option, and press ENTER (⊙).

Wired network connection

Using a wired network provides the best performance, because the attached devices connect directly to the network and are not subject to radio frequency interference.

Please refer to the documentation for your network device for further instructions.

Connect the player's LAN port to the corresponding port on your Modem or Router using a commercially available LAN or Ethernet cable.



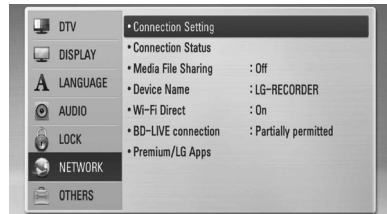
Wired Network Setup

If there is a DHCP server on the local area network (LAN) via wired connection, this player will automatically be allocated an IP address. After making the physical connection, a small number of home networks may require the player's network setting to be adjusted. Adjust the [NETWORK] setting as follow.

Preparation

Before setting the wired network, you need to connect the broadband internet to your home network.

1. Select [Connection Setting] option in the [Setup] menu then press ENTER (⊙).



2. The [Connection Setting] menu will appear on the screen. Use Δ / ∇ to select the [Wired] and press ENTER (⊙).



3. Select [Yes] and press ENTER (⊙) to continue. The new connection settings reset the current network settings.
4. Use Δ / ∇ / \leftarrow / \rightarrow to select the IP mode between [Dynamic] and [Static]. Normally, select [Dynamic] to allocate an IP address automatically.



Note

If there is no DHCP server on the network and you want to set the IP address manually, select [Static] then set [IP Address], [Subnet Mask], [Gateway] and [DNS Server] using $\wedge / \vee / < / >$ and numerical buttons. If you make a mistake while entering a number, press CLEAR to clear the highlighted part.

5. Select [OK] and press ENTER (⊙) to apply network settings.
6. The player will ask you to test the network connection. Select [OK] and press ENTER (⊙) to complete the network connection.
7. If you select [Test] and press ENTER (⊙) at step 5 above, the network connection status is displayed on the screen.

You can also test it on the [Connection Status] in the [Setup] menu.



Settings

Adjust the Setup Settings

You can change the settings of the player in the [Setup] menu.

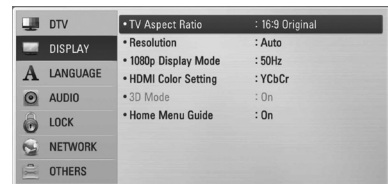
1. Press HOME (🏠).



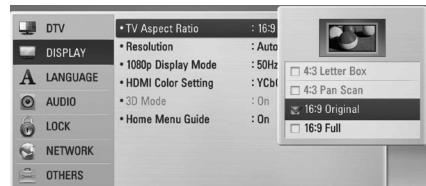
2. Use $< / >$ to select [Setup] and press ENTER (⊙). The [Setup] menu appears.



3. Use \wedge / \vee to select the first setup option, and press $>$ to move to the second level.



4. Use \wedge / \vee to select a second setup option, and press ENTER (⊙) or $>$ to move to the third level.



5. Use \wedge / \vee to select a desired setting, and press ENTER (⊙) to confirm your selection..

General Playback

Using [HOME] menu

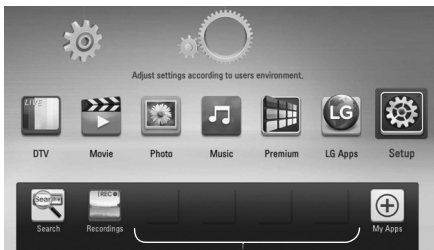
To access numerous functions of the unit, press HOME on the remote.

HOME: Accesses or removes the Home Menu.

▲/▼/◀/▶: Used to navigate on-screen displays.

ENTER (⊙): Acknowledges menu selection.

BACK (⏪): Exits the menu.



Favorite Apps

[DTV] - You can watch digital broadcasts.

[Movie] - Plays video contents.

[Photo] - Plays photo contents.

[Music] - Plays audio contents.

[Premium] - Displays the Premium Home screen.

[LG Apps] - Displays the [LG Apps] screen.

[Setup] - Adjusts the system settings.

[Search] - Searches contents by inputting a keyword on the search menu.

[Recordings] - Displays [Recordings] menu.

[Favorite Apps] - Shortcut for user's favorite Apps.

[My Apps] - Displays the [My Apps] screen.

Playing a Disc

1. Press ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE), and place a disc on the disc tray.
2. Press ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) to close the disc tray.
For most Audio CD, BD-ROM and DVD-ROM discs, playback starts automatically.
3. Press HOME (🏠).
4. Select [Movie], [Photo] or [Music] using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (⊙).
5. Select the disc icon using ▲/▼, and press ENTER (⊙).

If you want to rescan available media server, press the green (G) coloured button.

6. Select a file using ▲/▼/◀/▶, and press ▶ (PLAY) or ENTER (⊙) to play the file.

! Note

- Playback functions described in this manual are not always available in every files and media. Some functions can be restricted depending on many factors.
- Depending on the BD-ROM titles, a USB device connection may be needed for proper playback.

Playing a file on data disc/USB device

This unit can play movie, music and photo files contained in the data disc or USB device.

1. Insert a data disc on the tray or connect a USB device.
2. Press HOME (🏠).
3. Select [Movie], [Photo] or [Music] using ◀/▶, and press ENTER (⊙).
4. Select [Data] or [USB] option using ▲/▼, and press ENTER (⊙).
5. Select a file using ▲/▼/◀/▶, and press ▶ (PLAY) or ENTER (⊙) to play the file.

Basic operations for video and audio content

To stop playback

Press ■ (STOP) during playback.

To pause playback

Press ⏸ (PAUSE) during playback.
Press ▶ (PLAY) to resume playback.

To play frame-by-frame

Press ⏸ (PAUSE) while movie playback.
Press ⏸ (PAUSE) repeatedly to playback Frame-by-Frame.

To scan forward or backward

Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to play fast forward or fast reverse during playback.

You can change the various playback speeds by pressing ◀◀ or ▶▶ repeatedly.

To slow down the playing speed

While the playback is paused, press ▶▶ repeatedly to play various speeds of slow motion.

To skip to the next/previous chapter/track/file

During playback, press ⏮ or ⏭ to go to the next chapter/track/file or to return to the beginning of the current chapter/track/file.

Press ⏮ twice briefly to step back to the previous chapter/track/file.

In the file list menu of a server, there may have many types of contents in a folder together. In this case, press ⏮ or ⏭ to go to the previous or next content with same type.

On-Screen display

You can display and adjust various information and settings concerning the content.



1. During playback, press INFO/MENU (ⓘ) to show various playback information.
