



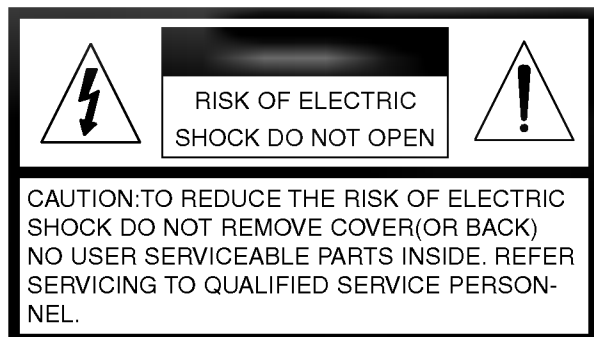

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This section shows you how to handle, clean, and store discs.

### On Handling Discs

- Do not touch the playback side of the disc.



- Do not attach paper or tape to discs.



### On Storing Discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause may damage the discs.

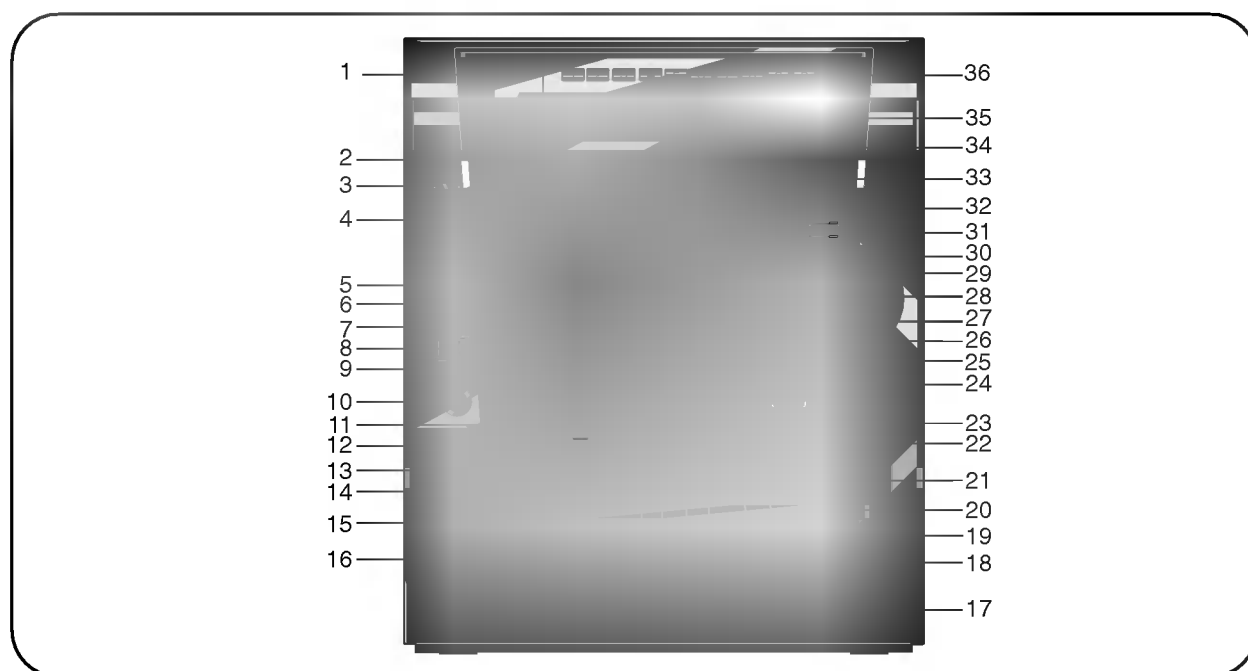
### On Cleaning Discs

- Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.
- If you cannot wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth and finish with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvents such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or anti-static spray for vinyl LPs. They may damage the disc.



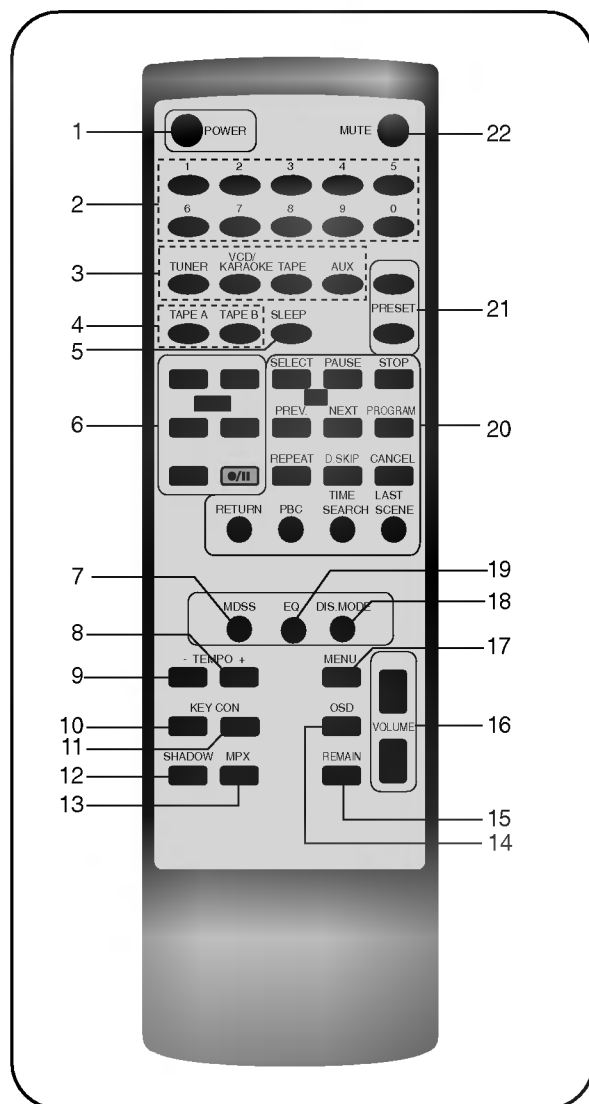
### About This Owner's Manual

### Preparing the Remote Control

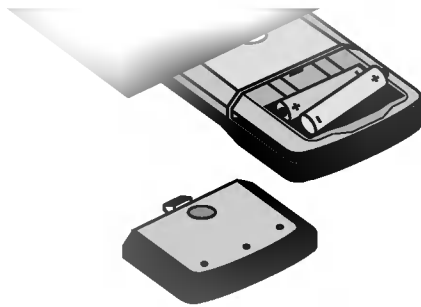
Insert the batteries into the remote control so you can use it to operate the unit.

 Open the battery cover.

 Insert batteries (AAA size).

- Make sure to match the + and - on the batteries to the marks inside the battery compartment.

 Close the cover.

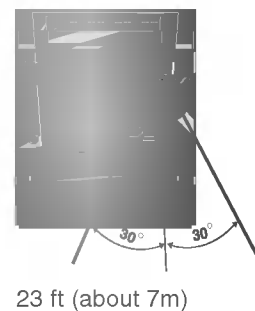


- Improper use of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion.
- To operate the remote control correctly, follow the instructions.
- Do not insert the batteries into the remote control in the wrong direction.
- Do not charge, heat, open, or short-circuit the batteries. Do not throw the batteries into fire.
- Do not leave dead or exhausted batteries in the remote control.
- Do not use different types of batteries together, or mix old and new batteries.
- If you do not use the remote control for a long period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery corrosion.
- If the remote control does not function correctly or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace all batteries with new ones.
- If battery leakage occurs, wipe the battery liquid from the battery compartment, then insert new batteries.
- The batteries should last about one year with normal use.

### Operating with the Remote Control

This section shows you how to use the remote control.

**Point the remote control at the remote sensor and press the buttons.**



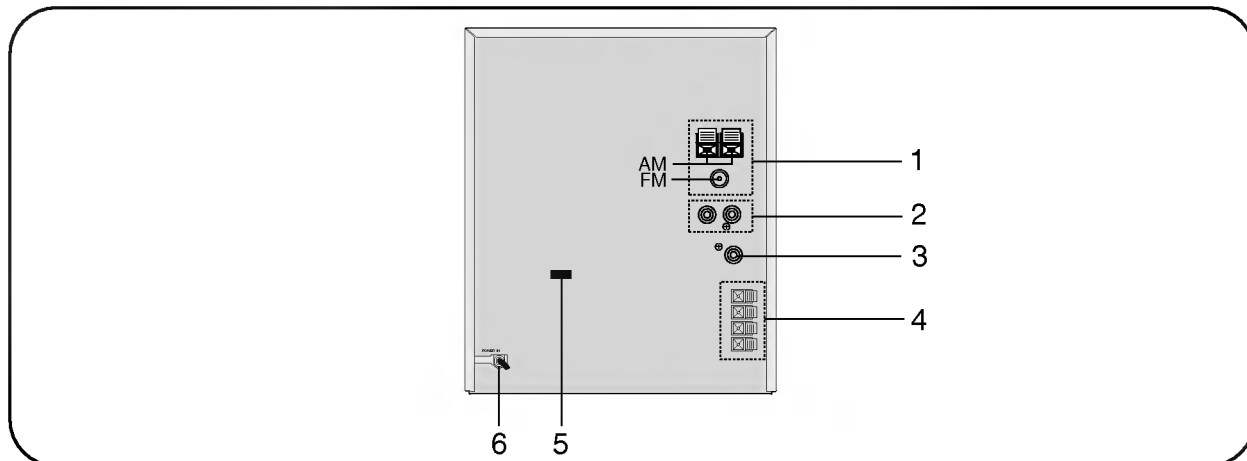
Distance: About 23 ft (7 m) from the front of the remote sensor

Angle: About 30° in each direction of the front of the remote sensor

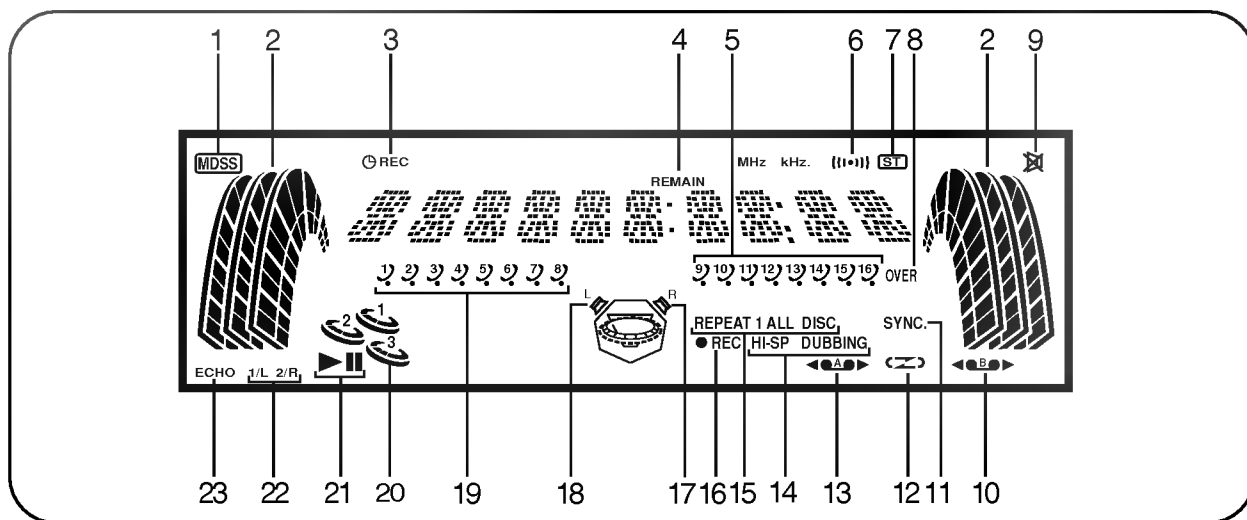
- \* Do not expose the remote sensor of the receiver to a strong light source such as direct sunlight or illumination. If you do so, you may not be able to operate the receiver with the remote control.

- Direct the remote control at the remote sensor of the unit.
- Do not drop the remote control.
- Do not leave the remote control near an extremely hot or humid place.
- Do not spill water or put anything wet on the remote control.
- Do not open the remote control.

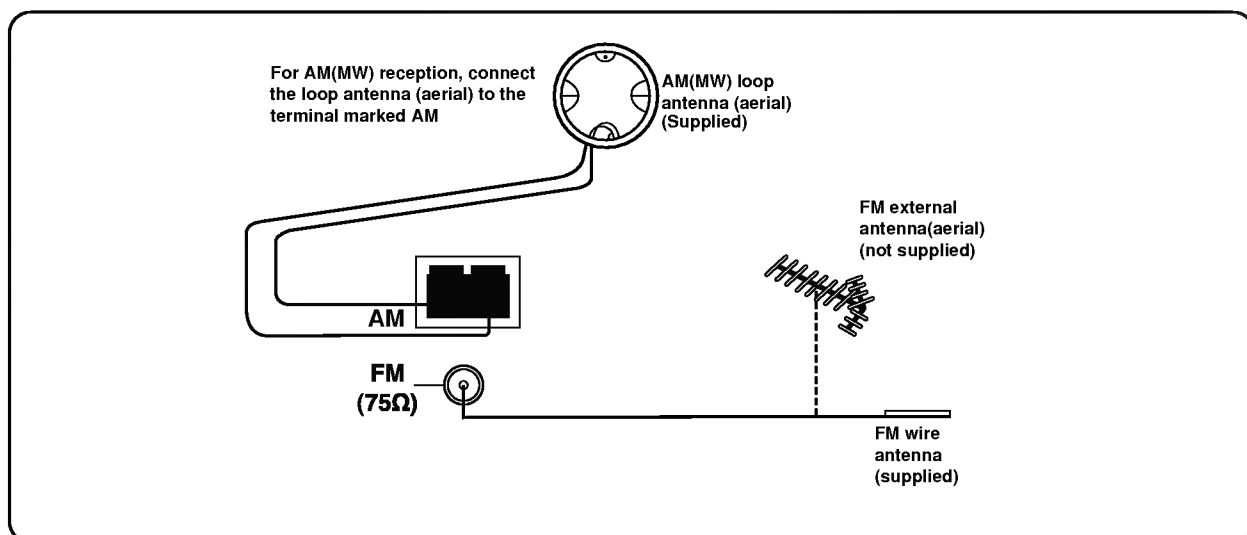

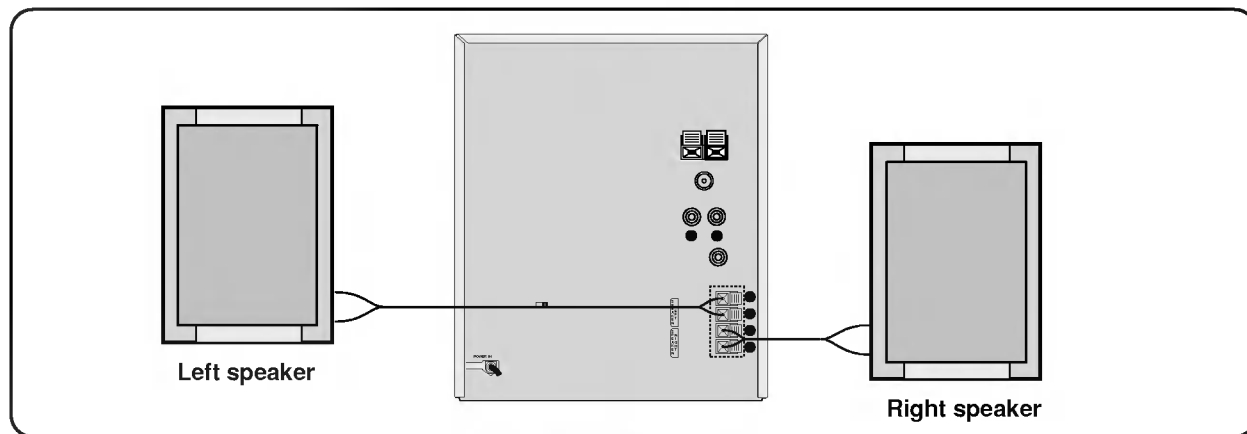
Connect the supplied FM/AM antennas for listening to the radio.

- Connect the AM loop antenna to the AM antenna connector.
- Connect the FM wire antenna (or FM "T" antenna) to the FM 75Ω coaxial connector.

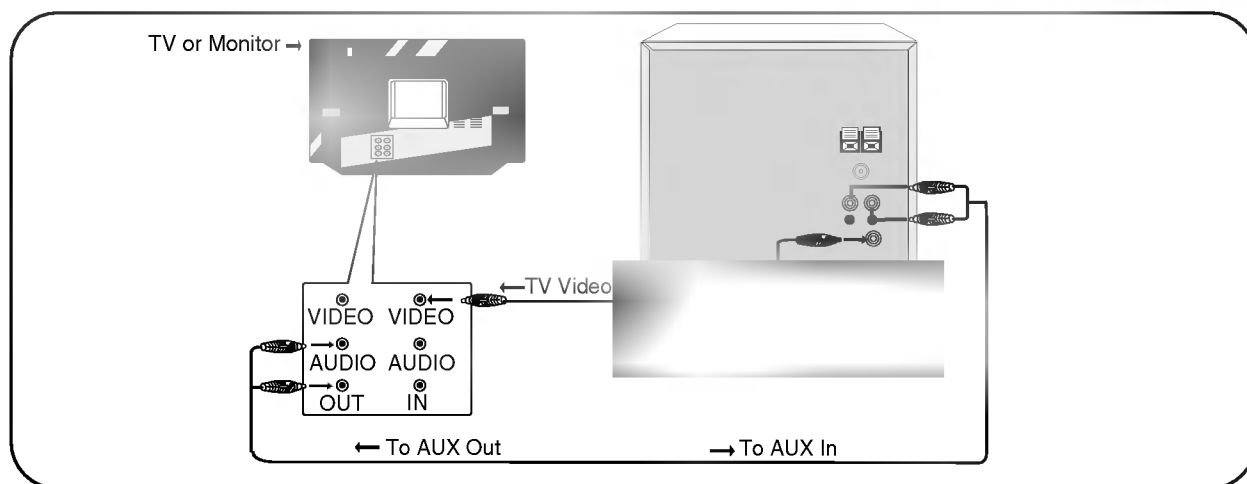


- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM loop antenna away from the unit and other components.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
- After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it as horizontal as possible.

Connect to speaker connector the supplied speaker cords by matching the colors of the terminals and those of the cords. To obtain the best possible surround sound, adjust the speaker parameters (distance, level, etc.).



- Be sure to match the speaker cord to the appropriate terminal on the components: + to + and – to –. If the cords are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack base.
- If you use front speakers with low maximum input rating, adjust the volume carefully to avoid excessive output on the speakers.
- Do not disassemble the front cover of supplied speaker.



### VIDEO OUT jack connection

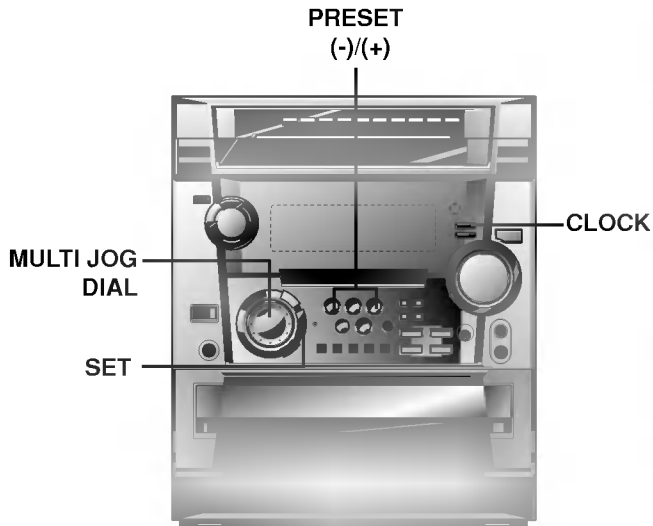
Connect the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the unit to a VIDEO IN jack of a TV or monitor.

### AUX jacks connection

Two phones jacks marked AUX are provided on the back of the unit for connecting other units. (For example, a record player with a pre amplifier, video recorders or tape recorders.)

- Refer to the owner's manual of your TV as well.
- When you connect the unit to your TV, be sure to turn off the power and unplug both units from the wall outlet before making.

You must set the time for the Sleep and Timer function.



Information on the time  
 AM 12:00 = midnight  
 PM 12:00 = noon

Press **CLOCK**. (If the clock is already set, press and hold **CLOCK** for more than 2 seconds.)  
 - The hours begin to flash.

Select a 24 hour cycle or 12 hour cycle by turning **MULTI JOG DIAL** or pressing **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons.

▲▲▲▲▲ (12HR) or ▲▲▲▲ (24HR)

Press the **SET** button to confirm the selected hour cycle.

Use **MULTI JOG DIAL** or **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons to set the correct hours.

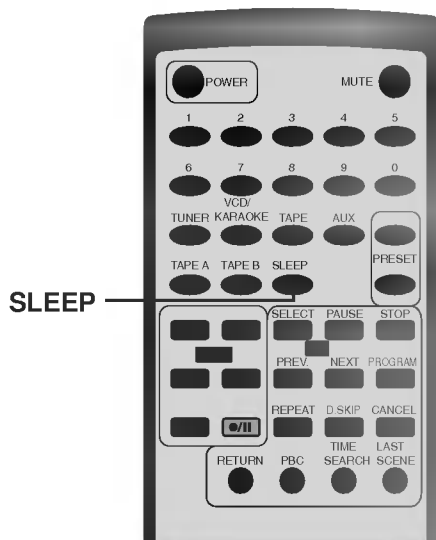
Press the **SET** button.

Use **MULTI JOG DIAL** or **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons to set the correct minutes.

Press the **SET** button and the correct time is shown on the display.

Press **CLOCK** at any time to display the time for about 3 seconds.

When the sleep timer is used, the power is automatically turned off after the specified time has elapsed.



**To specify the time until the power is turned off, press SLEEP.**

In the display you can see **SLEEP 90** for about 5 seconds. This means that the system turns off automatically after 90 minutes.

Each time the button is pressed the time interval before it turns off is reduced by 10 minutes. i.e. 80...70... etc.

Select the desired time to turn off.

**To check the remaining time until the power is turned off.**

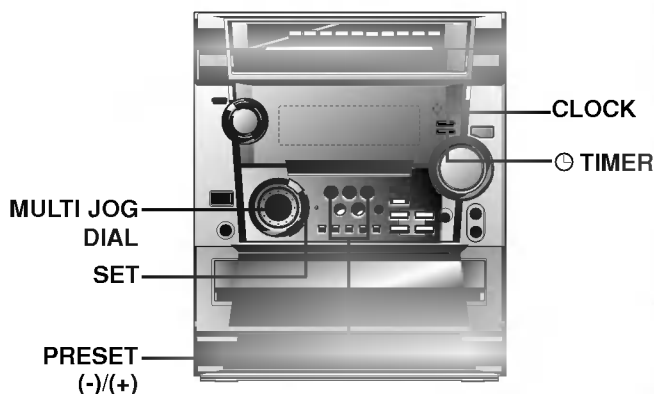
While the sleep function is active press the **SLEEP** briefly. The time remaining until it turns off is displayed for about 5 seconds.

If you press **SLEEP** while the sleep time is displayed, the **SLEEP** time is reset.

**To cancel the sleep timer mode:**

If you wish to stop the function press **SLEEP** repeatedly until 10 appears, and then press **SLEEP** once again while 10 is displayed.

With the **TIMER** function you can have the radio reception and recording, CD or tape playing turned on and off at the time desired.



Press **CLOCK** to check the current time.

Press the “ **TIMER**” button to enter the timer setting mode. (If you want to correct the previous memorized **TIMER**, press and hold the “ **TIMER**” button more than 2 seconds.) The previous memorized timer on time and the “” appears in the display. Each function : **TUNER**-**CD**-**TAPE** flashes in the display in turn.

Press the “**SET**” button when the desired function is flashing.

If you select the **TUNER** :  
**REC** and **PLAY** flash in the display alternately for about 3 seconds. Press the **SET** button to confirm the desired operating mode.  
**REC**: **TUNER** recording and play  
**PLAY**: **TUNER** play only

- If you have selected the **CD** or **TAPE**, ignore step 4.

When you have selected the **TUNER**;  
 Select the previous memorized preset number with **MULTI JOG DIAL** or **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons and press the **SET** button. The hour with **ON** display flashes.

- If you have selected the **CD** ,**TAPE** ignore step 5.

Set the hour to switch on by turning **MULTI JOG DIAL** or pressing **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons.

Press the **SET** button to confirm the hour to switch on. The minute with **ON** display flashes.

Set the minute to switch on by turning **MULTI JOG DIAL** or pressing **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons.

Press the **SET** button to confirm the minute to switch on. The hour with **OFF** now flashes in the display.

Program the time to switch off in the same way as the time to turn on.

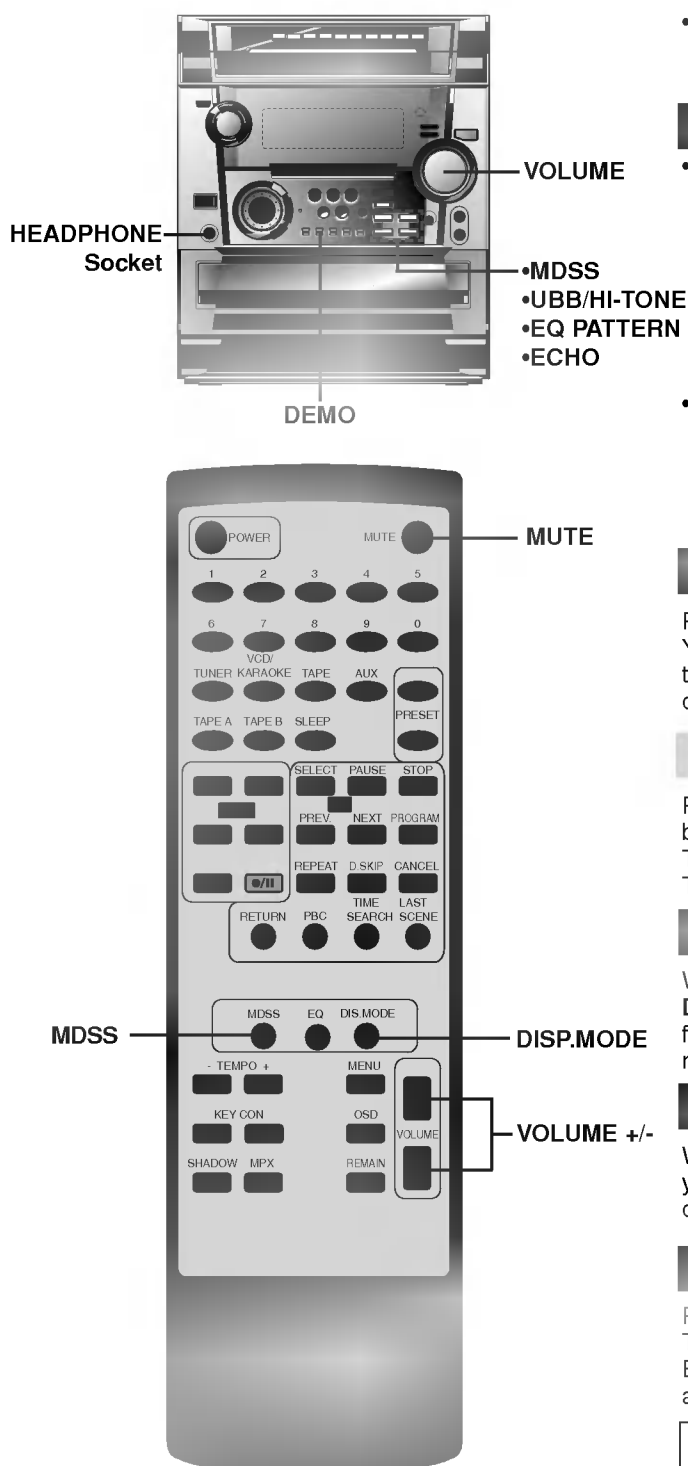
Press the **SET** button.

Adjust the volume level by turning **MULTI JOG DIAL** or pressing **PRESET (-)/(+)** buttons.

Press the **SET** button.  appears and the timer setting has been completed.

Switch the system off.  
 The selected function is automatically switched on and off at the time set.

To cancel or check the timer.  
 Each time the **TIMER** button is pressed you can select the timer set or cancel. You can also check the timer setting status.  
 To activate or check the timer, press the **TIMER** button so that  lights up in the display.  
 To cancel the **TIMER**, press the **TIMER** button so that  in the display window disappears.



- Turn the **VOLUME** clockwise to increase the sound level, or counterclockwise to decrease it.
- Press the **VOLUME +** button to increase the sound level, or press the **VOLUME -** button to decrease it on the remote control.

#### • To activate stereo sound

You can choose between 6 fixed sound impressions: Select a desired sound mode by using the **EQ PATTERN** button.



#### • Headphone Socket

Connect a stereo headphone plug (6.3mm) into the headphone socket.

The speakers are automatically disconnected when you plug in the headphones (not supplied).

Press this button to mute your unit.

You can mute your unit in order, for example, to answer the telephone, the **MUTE** indicator flashes on the display window.

### MDSS (Multi Dynamic Sound System)

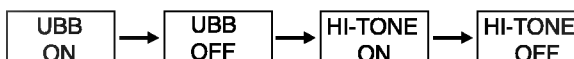
Press the **MDSS** button to reinforce treble(Hi-Tone), bass(UBB: Ultra Bass Booster) and surround effect. The "MDSS ON" or "MDSS OFF" indicator lights up. To cancel it press the **MDSS** button again.

With the unit plugged in but turned off, press the **PLAY DEMO** button for a continuous visual display of units features. Press it again to return to a display of the current time.

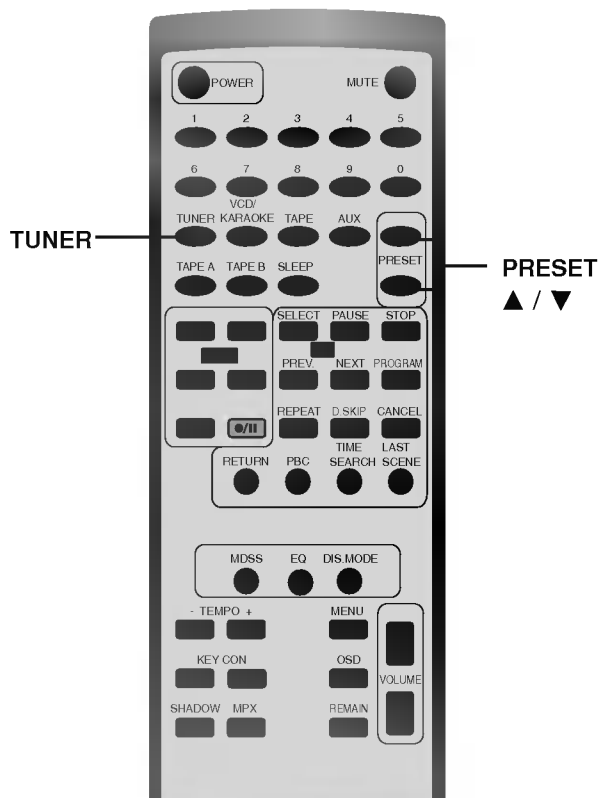
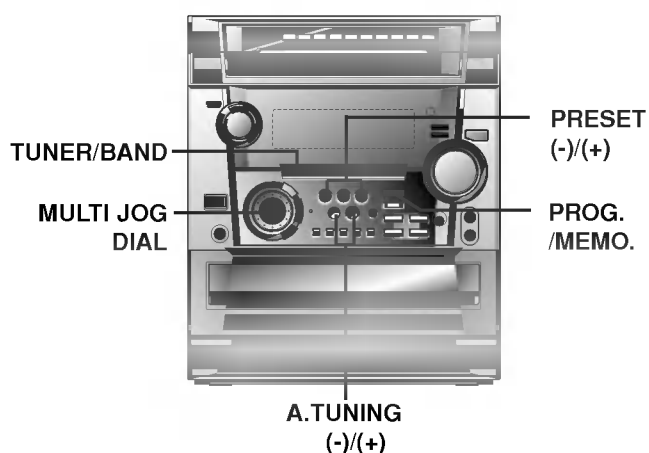
Whenever you press **DIS.MODE** on the remote control, you can enjoy the spectrum change with 4 types in the display.

Press the **UBB/HI-TONE** button to set the UBB/HI-TONE mode.

Each time **UBB/HI-TONE** button is pressed, it change as follows.



You can preset 30 stations for FM and AM. Before tuning, make sure that you have turned down the volume to the minimum.



**Press the TUNER/BAND on the front panel repeatedly or TUNER on the Remote control until the FM or AM appears in the display window.**

**Every time you press the TUNER/BAND (TUNER : on the remote control), FM and AM changes alternately.**

**Press the AUTO TUNING button (A.TUNING (-)/(+)) on the front panel until the frequency indication starts to change, then release.**  
Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

**Press the PROG./MEMO.**  
A preset number will flash in the display window.

**Press the PRESET (-)/(+) or turn MULTI JOG DIAL on the front panel to select the preset number you want.**

**Press the PROG./MEMO. again.**  
The station is stored.

**Repeat steps 3 to 6 to store other stations.**

#### To clear all the memorized stations

Press and hold the **PROG./MEMO.** for about two seconds, "RESET" appears in the display window and then press **PROG./MEMO.** again, the stations are cleared.

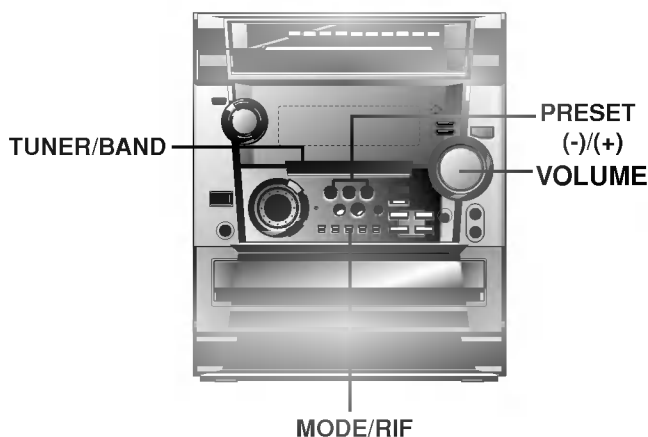
#### For your reference

If all stations have already been entered, FULL message will appear in the display window for a moment and then a preset number will flash. To change the preset number, follow the steps 5-6 as above.

#### To recall presets.

Press and hold the **PRESET (-)/(+)** or **PRESET ▲ / ▼** (on the remote control) until the desired preset number appears.

Preset radio stations in the units memory first (see "Presetting radio stations" on the previous page).



#### For your reference

- **If an FM program is noisy**  
Press the **MODE/RIF** on the front panel so that **ST** disappears in the display window. There will be no stereo effect, but the reception will improve. Press the **MODE/RIF** again to restore the stereo effect.
- **To improve reception**  
Reposition the supplied antennas.

- Use **MODE/RIF** (Radio Interference Filter) to switch the mono reception if stereo reception is distorted by noise.
- When recording the MW(AM) or LW broadcast, beat noises occur. If it does, press the **MODE/RIF** once.

**Press the TUNER/BAND until AM or FM appears in the display window.**

The last received station is tuned in.

**Press the PRESET (-)/(+) or PRESET ▲ / ▼ repeatedly to select the preset station you want.**

Each time you press the button, the unit tunes in one preset station at a time.

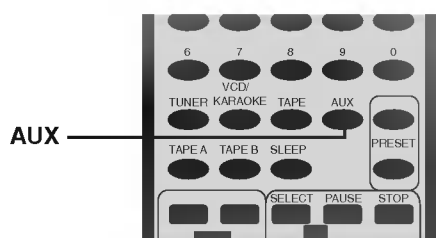
**Adjust the volume by rotating VOLUME on the front panel or pressing VOLUME (+/-) repeatedly on the Remote control.**

#### To turn off the radio

Press **POWER (STANDBY/ON)** to turn the unit off or select another function mode (KARAOKE/VCD, TAPE or AUX).

#### To listen to non-preset radio stations

For manual automatic tuning, press **A.TUNING (-)/(+)** on the front panel.

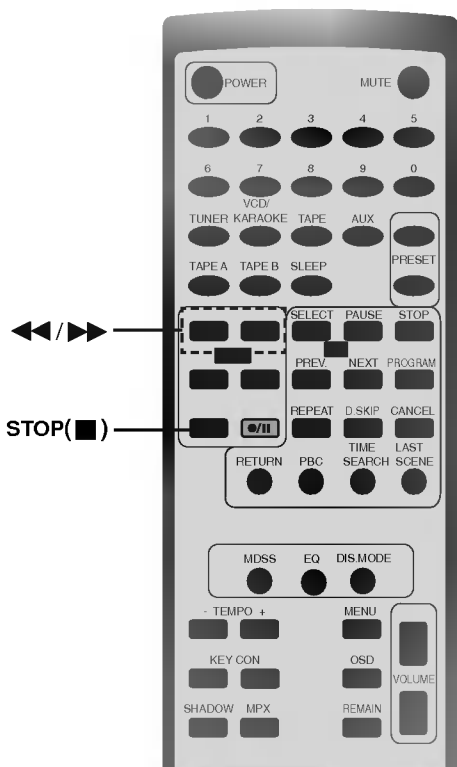
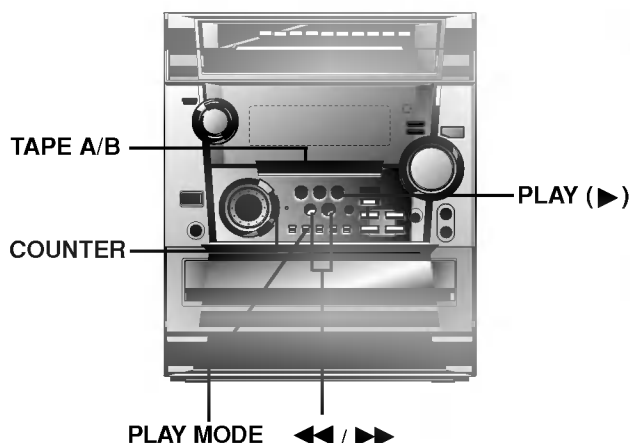


Connect an auxiliary device i.e. TV or VCR, via the rear mounted **AUX** phono sockets.

Press the "**AUX**" function button.

You can also record from the auxiliary input source, see Cassette Deck Operation Section.

You can use only normal tapes.



**To set the cassette function:**

Switch the unit on and press the **TAPE A/B** button. (If necessary, press the button again to select the other deck.)

**To insert cassettes :**

Open cassette deck A (or B) or both by pushing the deck **▲** PUSH EJECT position. Insert one or two cassettes with the tape side to the bottom and the cassette side that you wish to hear facing the front in cassette deck A or B.

NOTE:

DECK A - Auto stop only (Non-auto reverse)

DECK B - Auto reverse

**Auto reverse :**

Select which side of the cassette is to be played and how often with the **PLAY MODE** button.

**1) 1st Option**

In case of non-autoreverse (auto stop) deck A and auto reverse deck B.

In this case, the continuous play between deck A and B cannot be performed.

**(a) DECK A**

Front side play only.

**(b) DECK B (Auto Reverse)**

One side **↔** : Unit plays the front or reverse side in deck B and stops automatically at the end of the tape.

All side **↔↔** : Unit plays the front and reverse side in deck B and stops automatically at the end of the tape.

Endless loop **↔↔↔** : Like **↔↔** but six times in succession in deck B.

**2) 2nd Option**

In case of non-autoreverse (auto stop) deck A and B. (Front side play only)

**Playback:**

Start playback with **PLAY (▶)** button (front side) or (reverse side). The (reverse side) **PLAY** button is not operated in the non-auto reverse deck.

**Fast forward or rewind :**

Press **◀◀/▶▶** for fast rewind or fast forward.

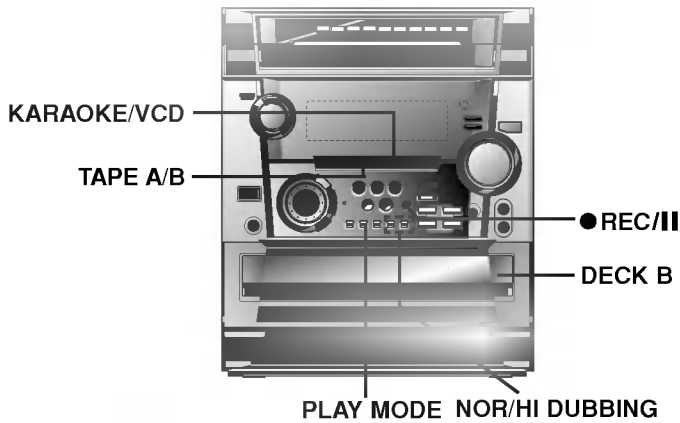
**To end playback :**

Press the **STOP/CLEAR (■)** button.

The unit stops automatically at the end of the tape.

Press the **COUNTER** button while tape is playing or stopped.

During play or fast forward, the tape counter increases and during rewind, the tape counter decreases.



### Recording from Radio, CD or auxiliary source.

#### PREPARATION :

Wind up the tape to the point recording starts.

Use only normal tapes.

You can record from cassette deck B only.

#### To select the function :

Select the KARAOKE/VCD function.

#### To insert the cassette :

Open the cassette deck B.

Insert a blank cassette into the cassette compartment.

#### PLAY MODE

Select the play mode with **PLAY MODE** button, if you wish to record one cassette side only and or for both cassette sides.

#### Recording mode :

Press the **●REC/II** button.

The "●REC" indicator flashes and holds the cassette in pause mode.

#### To start recording :

Press the **●REC/II** button or **PLAY** () button again if you want to record the front side or **PLAY** () for the reverse side (OPTIONAL). The recording begins.

#### NOTE :

If both cassette sides are to be recorded (**PLAY** MODE , ) always start with the front side **PLAY** ( ). (Use only auto reverse deck)

#### To interrupt recording :

To interrupt the recording for a short period, press the **●REC/II** button again.

#### To end the recording :

Press the **STOP** () button. The unit stops automatically at the end of the tape.

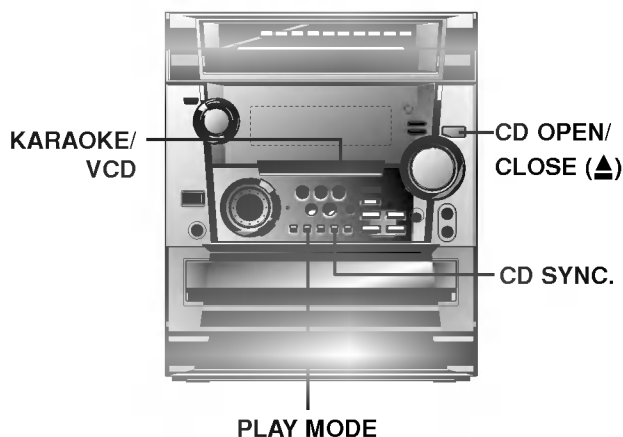
#### Press TAPE A/B (or TAPE on the remote control).

- DECK A- Insert a playback tape to dub.
- DECK B- Insert a blank tape.

#### Press NOR/Hi DUBBING as follow.

| Pressing    | Display         | Function             |
|-------------|-----------------|----------------------|
| NOR DUBBING | <i>NOR DUBB</i> | Normal speed dubbing |
| HI DUBBING  | <i>HI DUBB</i>  | Double speed dubbing |

Before recording, select a function you want and then press the **PLAY** ().



### CD to tape synchronized recording.

The CD synchro recording function dubs a complete CD and programmed titles automatically into a cassette.

**Select CD or VCD function by pressing KARAOKE/VCD repeatedly.**

Open the CD compartment with the **CD OPEN / CLOSE(▲)**, insert CD discs and close the CD compartment again.

**To insert cassette :**  
 Open the cassette deck B.  
 Insert a blank cassette into the cassette compartment.  
 Rewind the cassette to the beginning of the tape.

**Auto reverse**  
 Select the **PLAY MODE**,  if you only wish to record the front side and  or  for both cassette sides.

**NOTE:**  
 If the last track has stopped because the tape is full, the track will be recorded again completely on the reverse side of the cassette tape.

**To start recording :**

Press the **CD SYNC.**

The recording begins and stops automatically at the end of the CD.

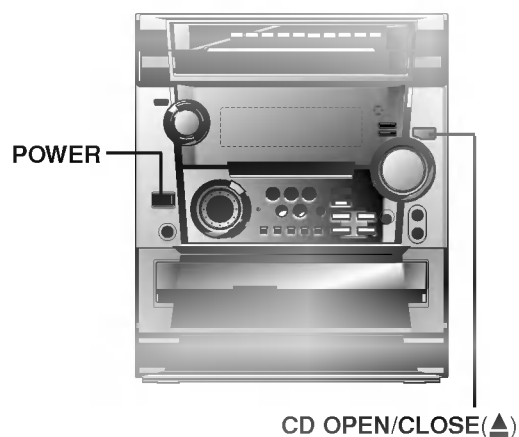
**NOTE:**

In case of Auto Stop deck

If you want to record onto another tape after one has ended. Change the tape, then push the **PLAY**.

The tape enters into the recording mute mode for 7 seconds then CD player starts playing and recording.

- If you only want to record certain titles, program these before the CD synchro recording.
- If you wish to record from the desired track, select the desired track with the (◀◀ / ▶▶) before commencing CD synchro recording.
- The function change is not possible during recording.



- For further information, also refer to the jacket or case of the disc you are playing.

**After operation**

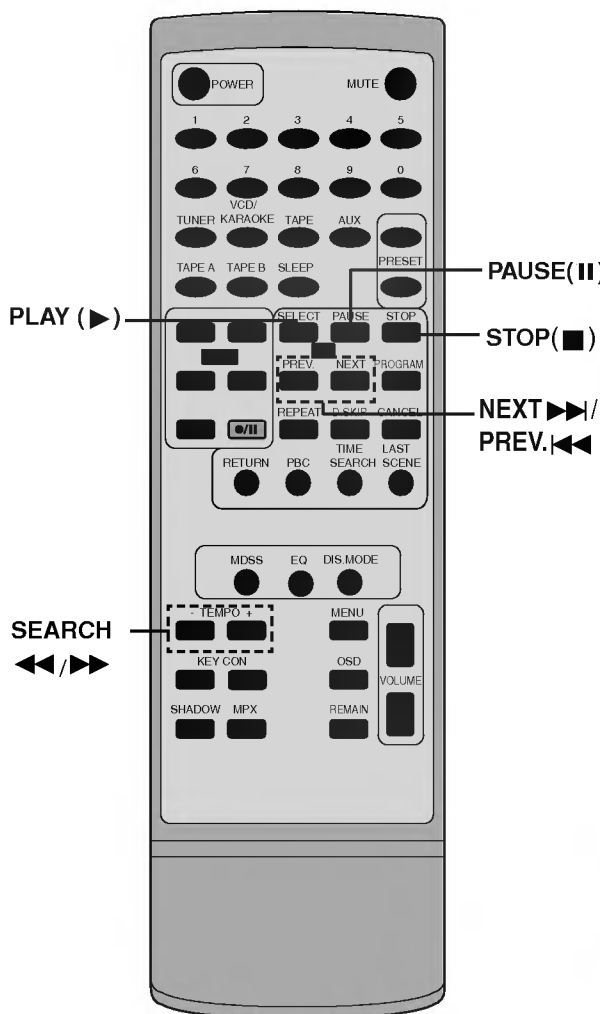
When the unit is not in use, remove the disc and press the **POWER** to turn off the power.

Press the CD OPEN/CLOSE(▲) to open the disc compartment.

Remove the discs and replace with other discs. The disc placed on the left side tray will be played next.

Press the CD OPEN/CLOSE(▲) to close the disc compartment.

- When "🚫" appears on the TV screen while a button is pressed, it means that this function is not available on the disc you are playing.



Press the STOP(■) during playback.

Press PAUSE(||) during playback.
