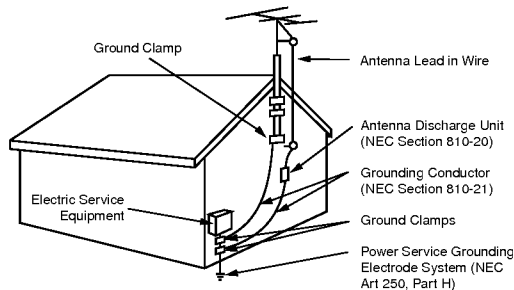
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14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

15. Lightning

For added protection for this product (receiver) during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

16. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

17. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

18. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the product.

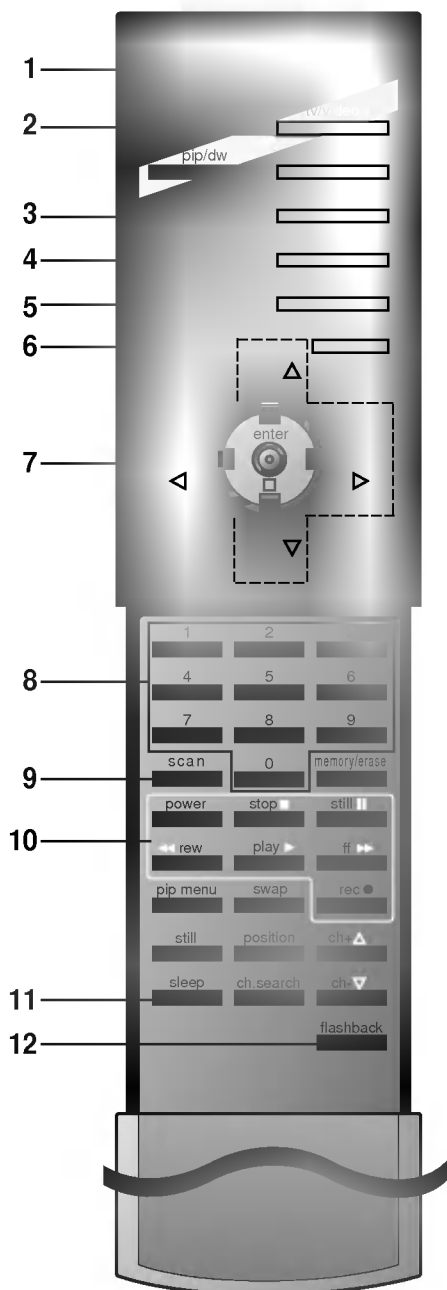

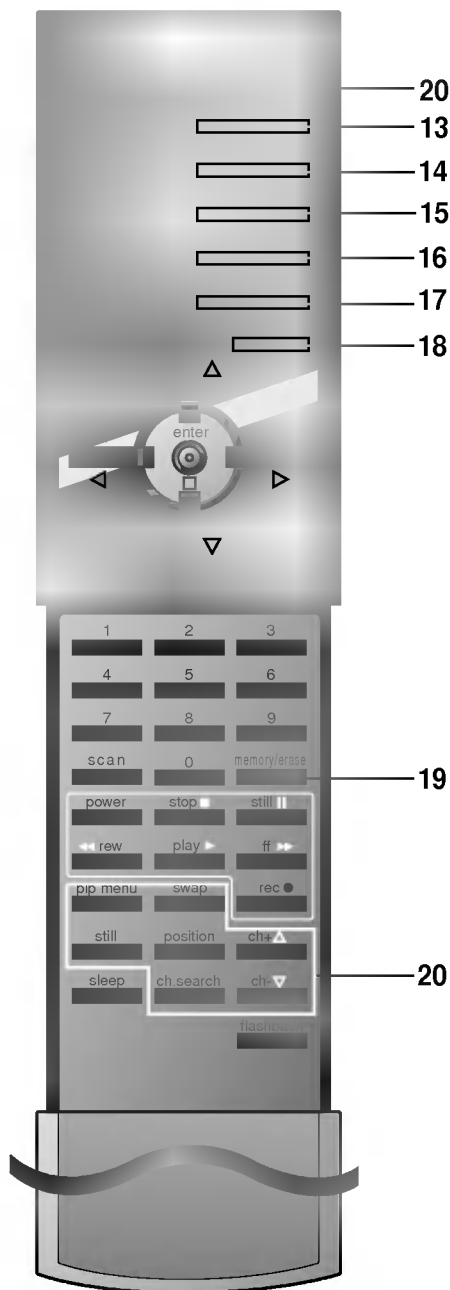

1. **POWER (or ON/OFF)**
Refer to "Turning the TV on/off".
2. **CAPTION**
Selects CAPTIONS: **On**, **EZ Mute**, or **Off**.
3. **MULTIMEDIA**
Selects COMPONENT mode.
4. **VIDEO**
Selects factory preset picture settings: **Day Light**, **Clear**, **Optimum**, **Soft**, or **User**.
5. **FCR (Favorite Channel Review)**
Selects favorite channels.
Refer to "Favorite channel memory".
6. **MENU**
Displays on-screen menus.
7. **CHANNEL UP/DOWN**
 - Selects the desired channel.
 - Selects the desired menu option when menu is displayed on the screen.
- VOLUME UP/DOWN**
 - Increase or decrease sound level.
 - Enters or adjusts the selected menu options when menu is displayed on the screen.
- ENTER (■)**
 - To memorize the adjusted menu.
 - To recall the current TV mode (by remote control only).
8. **NUMBER BUTTONS**
Direct channel selection.
9. **SCAN**
To search and memorize channels with EZ Scan.
10. **VCR BUTTONS**
Control some video cassette recorders.
11. **SLEEP**
Sets a TV turn-off time.
12. **FLASHBK**
Returns to the previous channel.



13. TV/VIDEO

Selects TV, VIDEO, or COMPONENT mode.

14. ARC

Selects 4:3, 16:9 or Zoom picture formats.

15. AUDIO (Not available using earphones).

Selects the sound appropriate for the program's character; **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie**, **Sports** or **User**.

16. AVL (Auto Volume Leveler)

Maintains an equal volume level for each channel.

17. MTS

Selects MTS sound: **Mono**, **Stereo**, or **SAP**.

18. MUTE

Press to remove sound. Press again to restore sound.

19. MEMORY/ERASE

To memorize or erase a channel.

20. PIP (Picture-in-Picture)

PIP/DW

Selects the PIP mode or Double window mode.

PIP MENU

To display menus for PIP mode or double window mode.

SWAP

Switches the main and sub pictures.

STILL

Freezes the sub picture in PIP mode or the currently-viewed main picture.

POSITION

Moves the sub picture to another corner of the main picture.

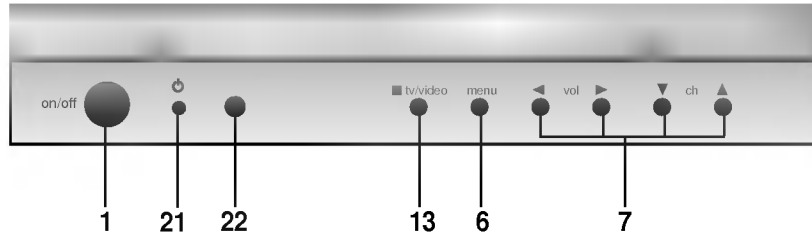
CH.SEARCH

To search one the pictures of all the programmed channels through the sub pictures while the main picture remains as the video input source.

CH +/-

Selects the sub picture channel.

This is a simplified representation of the front panel.



21. STANDBY INDICATOR (Ⓞ)

Illuminates red bright when the TV is in standby mode. Refer to "Turning the TV on/off".

22. REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control

- Open the battery compartment cover on the back side and insert the batteries with correct polarity.
- Install two 1.5V batteries of AAA type. Don't mix used batteries with new batteries.



Before operating your TV, make sure the TV has been connected to an antenna or cable system and the TV is plugged into a power outlet. p 29 ~ 32.

Turning the TV On/Off

The set switches to standby mode and the standby indicator lights red. To switch the TV on from standby mode, press the tv/video, ch ▲/▼ button on the set or tv/video, multimedia, ch ▲/▼, power or any number button on the remote control.

The on-screen will appear on the top-right of the screen and will disappear after a few seconds.

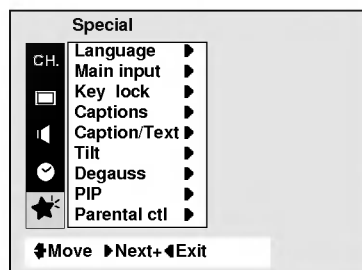
Press the **power** button on the remote control. The TV reverts to standby mode.

Selecting a Language for the Menus

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Language**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select the desired language.

From this point on, the on-screen display will be presented in the language of your choice.

4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



Channel Search

Use the ch ▲/▼ button to easily select the next higher or lower channel. Or, use the **NUMBER** buttons to directly select the desired channel.

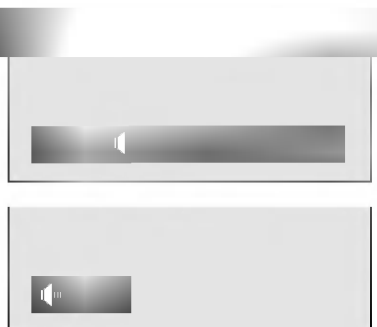
Adjusting the Sound Level (Not available using earphone.)

Use the **vol**◀/► buttons to increase or decrease the volume level. Turn off the sound with the **mute** button.

The word **Mute** is displayed

Using Mute is convenient if you need to answer a telephone call.

To restore the muted sound, press the **mute** button again or **vol**◀/► button.



Channel Search

Channel Search memorizes all the active channels in your area. You must do a channel search before you can use the TV.

There two ways of memorizing channels. You can use either, **EZ Scan** or **Manual Program**.

In **EZ Scan**, the TV memorizes the channels in ascending numerical order.

You can also add or delete channels manually.

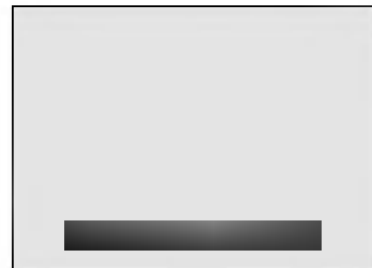
Memorizing Available Channels with EZ Scan

EZ Scan searches and memorizes all the active channels in your area. Select a channel with the ▲/▼ buttons.

Using the scan button

You can conveniently perform EZ Scan using the **scan** button on the remote control.

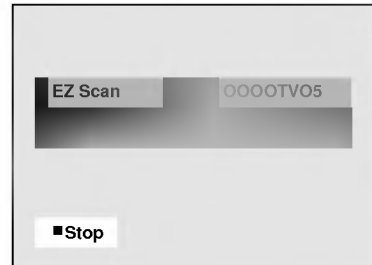
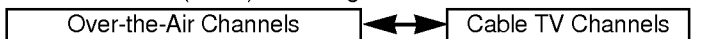
1. Press the **scan** button.
2. Press the ▲/▼ button to select **Turbo** or **Normal**.
3. Press the ► or **scan** button.
The EZ Scan starts.



If you want to stop auto programming, press the **enter** (■) button. Only the channels searched up to that time are memorized.

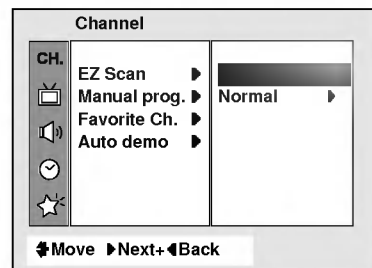
Notes

- **Turbo EZ Scan** works faster than **Normal EZ Scan**.
- If broadcast signals are of poor quality, try scanning channels again using **Normal EZ Scan**.
- EZ scan stores all available channels regardless of signal (RF, Cable).
- If over-the-air and Cable TV channels are duplicated, use the number buttons (0 ~ 9) to change channels as shown:



Using the menu

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **EZ Scan**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Turbo** or **Normal**.
4. Press the ► button. EZ Scan starts.

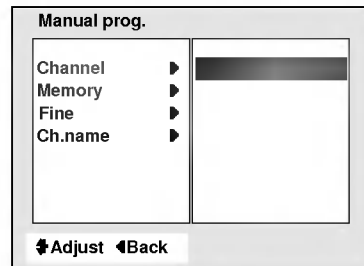
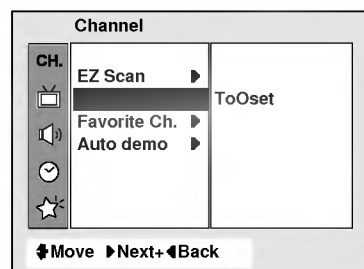
Using the memory/erase button

You can conveniently perform Manual Programming using the **memory / erase** button on the remote control.

1. Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons or Number Keypad buttons to select the channel number you want to memorize or erase.
2. Press the **memory / erase** button.
The on screen display appears as shown right.
3. Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the channel number you want to memorize or erase, then use the **memory / erase** button to select **Memory** or **Erase**.
4. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

Using the Menu

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Manual prog.**
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Channel**.
4. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the channel number you want to memorize or erase.
5. Press the ◀ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Memory**.
6. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
7. Press the ◀ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Ch.name**.
You can make a channel name.
8. Press the ► button and then use ◀ / ► button to select a word position and then ▲ / ▼ button to enter alphabet **A** to **Z**, number **0** to **9**, or blank.
9. Repeat steps 3 to 8 to memorize or erase other channels.
10. Press the ◀ button to exit.



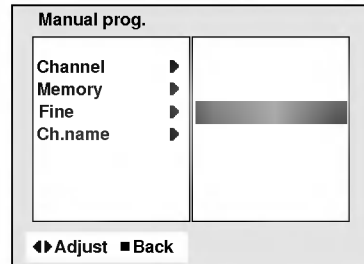
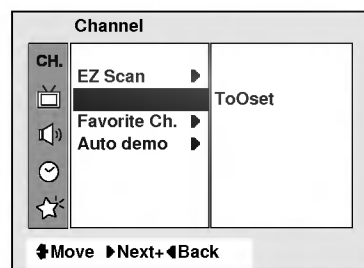
Fine Tuning Adjustment

Fine Tuning adjusts the picture to a stable condition if it is poor, for example, a horizontal stripe, twisted picture or no color in program.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Manual prog.**
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Fine**.
4. Press the ► button and then use ◀ / ► button to adjust the picture appearance to your preference.
5. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

Notes

- To remove the memorized fine tuning setting, reprogram the fine-tuned channel with EZ Scan or Manual Program.
- If a finely tuned channel is memorized, the color of the channel number changes to yellow.

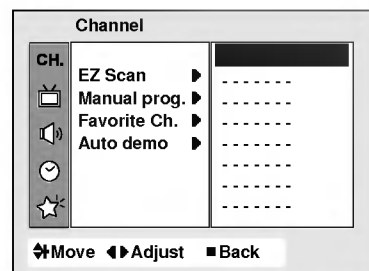


Favorite Channel Memory

Favorite channel memory is a convenient feature that lets you quickly scan up to eight channels of your choice without having to wait for the TV to scan through all the in-between channels.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Favorite Ch..**
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select a favorite channel position.
4. Use the ◀ / ▶ button to select the desired channel number.
5. Repeat steps 3 to 4.
6. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

To select a favorite channel, repeatedly press the **fcr** (Favorite Channel Review) button. Eight channels programmed appear on the screen one-by-one.

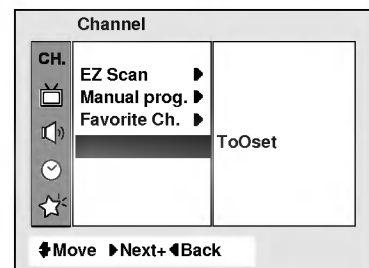


Auto Demonstration

Auto demo allows you to review all the menus available on the TV set.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto demo.**
3. Press the ► button, and the demonstration starts.

When the demonstration reaches the last display, it starts again from the beginning.
To stop auto demonstration, press any button.



EZ Video

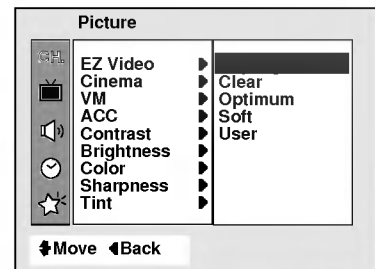
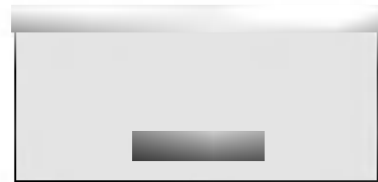
You can select preset picture modes.

Choosing a picture mode with the video button

1. Repeatedly press the **video** button to select: **Day Light**, **Clear**, **Optimum**, **Soft**, or **User**.
2. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

Choosing a picture mode with the Picture menu

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **EZ Video**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Day Light**, **Clear**, **Optimum**, **Soft**, or **User**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



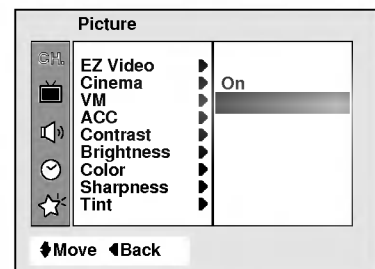
Cinema Mode Setup

Sets up the TV for the best picture appearance for viewing movies.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Cinema**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.

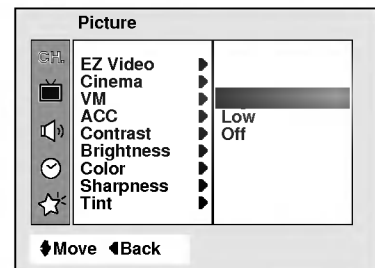
- **Cinema On** only works when selecting 4:3 picture format in Component 480i input.



VM (Velocity Modulation)

If you select **VM High**, the TV will automatically enhance the sharpness of the image's edges.

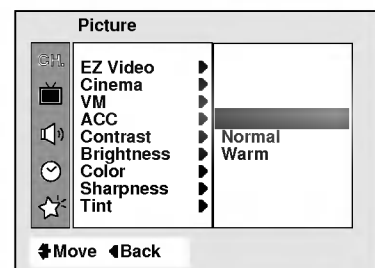
1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **VM**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **High**, **Low**, or **Off**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



ACC (Auto Color Control)

Specify the picture color appearance.

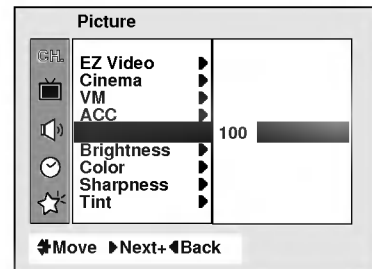
1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **ACC**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Cool**, **Normal**, or **Warm**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



User Picture Appearance Adjustments

You can manually adjust the picture levels: **Contrast**, **Brightness**, **Color**, **Sharpness**, and **Tint** to your preference. If the picture settings you adjust are not satisfactory, you can also select a factory preset picture setup.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the **▶** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the desired picture option (**Contrast**, **Brightness**, **Color**, **Sharpness**, and **Tint**).
3. Press the **▶** button and then use **◀ / ▶** button to adjust the level. Use the **▲ / ▼** button to select other options.
4. Press the **enter (■)** button to exit.



Picture Formats

You can select 4:3, 16:9 or Zoom picture proportions.

1. Use the **arc** button to select your desired picture format. Each time you press **arc** button, the picture aspect ratio changes in series: **4:3**, **16:9** or **Zoom**.
2. Press the **enter (■)** button to exit.

Note

- This function is not available in Channel search mode.

Stereo/SAP Broadcasts Setup

This TV can receive MTS stereo programs and any SAP (Second Audio Program) accompanying the stereo program. The broadcaster may transmit one additional sound signal as well as the original one. MTS is not available for the video mode.

1. Use the **mts** button to select your desired MTS mode.
Each time you press **mts** button, the sound mode changes in series: **Mono**, **Stereo**, or **SAP**.
2. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

Notes

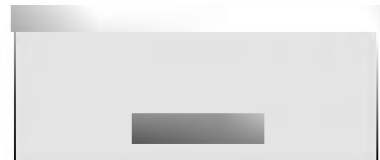
- Stereo or SAP can only be received if the TV station transmits those signals, even though you have selected **Stereo** or **SAP**.
- Mono sound is automatically received if the broadcast is only in Mono; even though **Stereo** or **SAP** has been selected.
- Select **Mono** if you want to listen to mono sound in remote fringe areas during stereo/SAP broadcasting.

EZ Audio

You can enjoy the best sound without any special adjustment because the TV automatically adjusts the sound appropriate to the program's character.

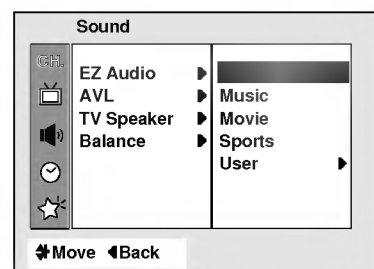
Choosing a sound mode with the audio button

1. Repeatedly press the **audio** button to select **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie**, **Sports**, or **User**.
2. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.



Choosing a sound mode with the Sound menu

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **EZ Audio**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie**, **Sports**, or **User**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



AVL (Auto Volume Leveler)

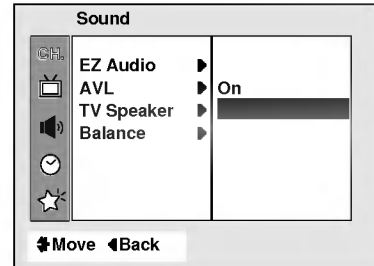
AVL automatically maintains an equal volume level; even if you change channels.

Using the avl button

1. Press the **avl** button.
2. Press the **avl** button to select **On** or **Off**.
3. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

Using the sound menu button

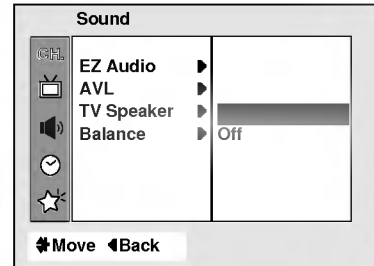
1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **AVL**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **On** or **OFF**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



TV Speakers On/Off

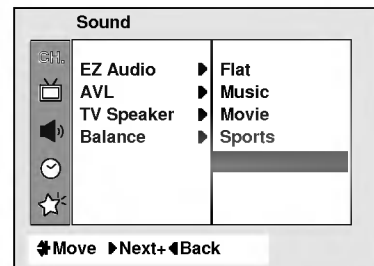
If you want to use your external hi-fi stereo system, select **TV Speaker - Off** to turn the TV internal speakers off.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **TV Speaker**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.



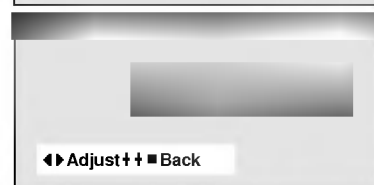
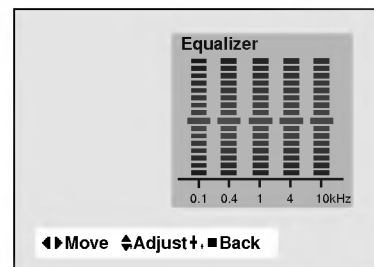
Adjusting the Equalizer (User mode in EZ Audio)

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **EZ Audio**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **User**.
4. Press the ► button and then use ◀/► button to select the sound band and then use ▲/▼ button to adjust the band.
5. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.



Adjusting Balance

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Sound menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Balance**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ◀/► button to adjust the balance level.
4. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.



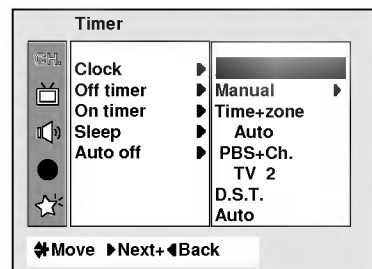
Setting the Clock

Before using the On/Off Timer features, set the current time on the clock.

Auto Clock Setup

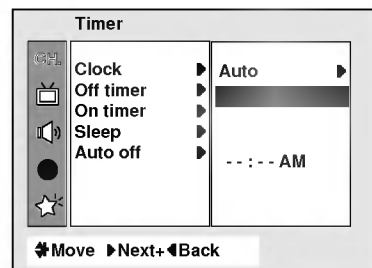
The time is set automatically through from a PBS broadcast signal. The PBS channel signal includes information for the correct time and daylight saving time.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the **▶** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Clock**.
3. Press the **▶** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Auto**.
4. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select the time zone for your viewing area. Your choices are: **Auto**, **E.S.T.** (Eastern Standard Time), **C.S.T.** (Central Standard Time), **M.S.T.** (Mountain Standard Time), **P.S.T.** (Pacific Standard Time), **Alaska**, or **Hawaii**.
5. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set a PBS channel.
6. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set **D.S.T.** (Daylight Saving Time) **Auto**, **On**, or **Off**, depending on whether or not your viewing area observes Daylight Savings Time.
7. Press the **enter (■)** button to exit.



Manual Clock Setup

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the **▶** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Clock**.
3. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select **Manual**.
4. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set the hours.
5. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set the minutes.
6. Press the **enter (■)** button to exit.



Off Timer/On Timer Setup

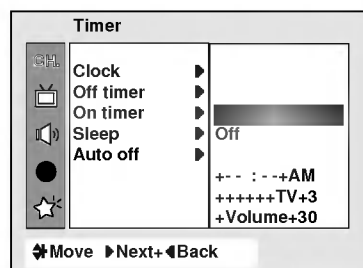
Off Timer automatically switches the TV to standby mode at the preset time.

On Timer automatically turns the TV on at the preset time and tunes to the specified channel.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select either **Off timer** or **On timer**.

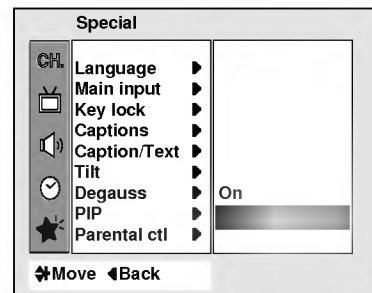
Degaussing Screen

In this TV, the magnetic field of the earth may influence the color purity of the picture. The picture can also be disturbed by other nearby magnetic influences or perhaps because of the location of the TV itself. Stripes may appear on the screen or the color may not be equal in the corners. Use Degauss to reset the color purity.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Degauss**.
3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
After the degaussing function works, **ON** mode switches to **OFF** mode automatically.

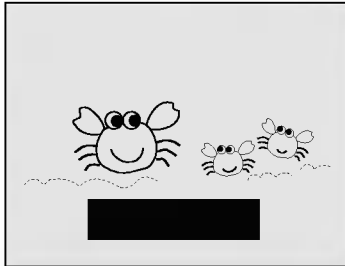

- Do not use Degauss too often or the life of the CRT may be shortened.
- If you are unable to correct the problem by degaussing, try again after about 4 minutes.



Closed captioning is a process which converts the audio portion of a television program into written words, which then appear on the television screen in a form similar to subtitles. Closed captions allow viewers to read the dialogue and narration of television programs.

Closed Captions Overview



Captions are the subtitles of the dialogue and narration of television programs. For prerecorded programs, program dialogue can be arranged into captions in advance. It's possible to caption a live program by using a process called "real-time captioning", which creates captions instantly. Real-time captioning is normally done by professional reporters using a machine shorthand system and computer for translation into English.

Captioning is an effective system for the hearing-impaired, and it can also aid in teaching language skills.

- The picture at left shows a typical caption.

Caption Tips

- Not all TV broadcasts include closed caption signals.
- Sometimes TV stations broadcast two different caption signals on the same channel. By selecting CC 1 or CC 4, you can choose which signal you view. CC 1 is usually the signal with the captions, while another mode might show demonstrations or programming information.
- Your TV might not receive caption signals normally in the following situations.

1 Poor reception conditions are encountered:



■ IGNITION:

Picture may flutter, drift, suffer from black spots or horizontal streaking. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills and other electrical appliances.



■ GHOSTS:

Ghosts are caused when the TV signal splits and follows two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected off tall buildings, hills or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve reception.



■ SNOW:

If your receiver is located at the weak, fringe area of a TV signal, your picture may be marred by small dots. It may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the picture.

- 2 An old, bad or illegally recorded tape is played.
- 3 Strong, random signals from a car or airplane interfere with the TV signal.
- 4 The signal from the antenna is weak.
- 5 The program wasn't captioned when it was produced, transmitted or taped.

Text Overview

Text services give a wide variety of information on all kind of subjects (ex. captioned program lists, weather forecasts, stock exchange topics, news for hearing-impaired---) through the full TV screen. But not all stations offer text services, even though they might offer captioning.

Note

- In the event you receive a poor signal, an empty black box may appear and disappear, even when the text mode is selected. This is normal function in such an event.

Captions On, Off, EZ Mute Setup

Captions setup with the caption button

1. Use the **caption** button to select **On**, **EZ Mute**, or **Off**.
2. Press the **enter** (■) button to exit.

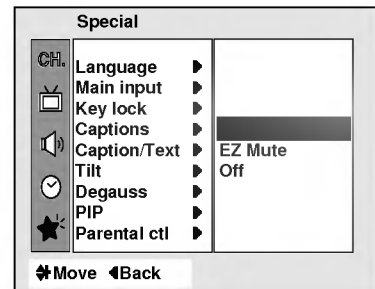

Parental Control Overview

The Parental Control Function (V-Chip) can be used to block program viewing based on the ratings sent by the broadcast station. The default setting is to allow all programs to be viewed. Viewing can be blocked by the type of program and by the categories chosen to be blocked. It is also possible to block all program viewing for a time period. To use the Parental Control Function, the following must be set:

1. Ratings and categories to be blocked.
2. A password.
3. Enabling the lock.

V-Chip Ratings and Categories

Rating guidelines are provided by broadcast stations. Most television programs and television movies can be blocked by TV Rating and/or Individual Categories. Movies that have been shown at the theaters or direct-to-video movies use the Movie Rating System (MPAA) only.

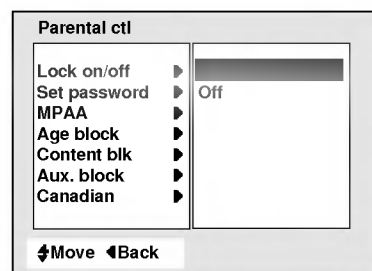
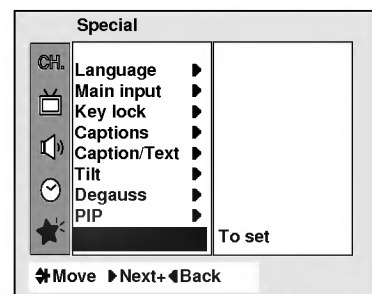

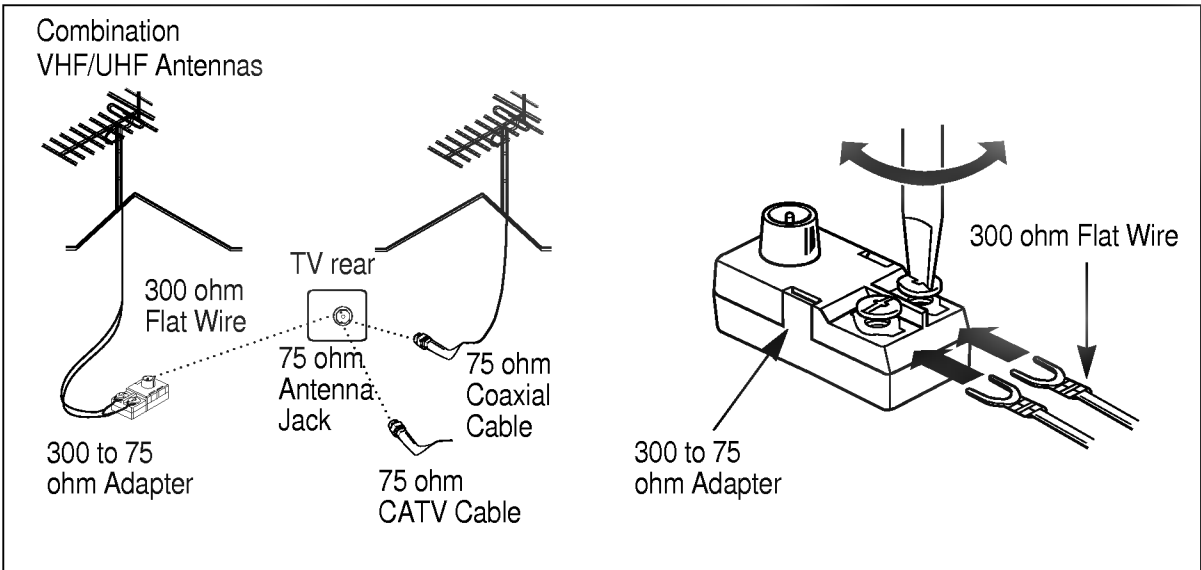

Blocking Setup

Connecting an Outdoor Antenna

For the best reception, we recommend you use an outdoor antenna. Severely weathered antennas and antenna cables can reduce the signal quality. Check antenna and antenna cables condition before making connections. Any service center can explain the various outdoor antennas available to you.

300 Ohm Flat Wire

1. Connect the 300 ohm flat wire to screws on the 300 ohm to 75 ohm adapter.
2. Push the end of 300 ohm to 75 ohm adapter into 75 ohm antenna jack.

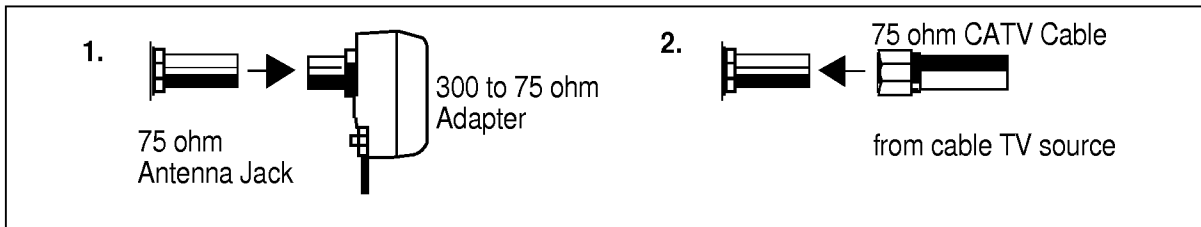
75 Ohm Coaxial Cable

1. Connect the 75 ohm coaxial cable directly to the 75 ohm antenna jack.

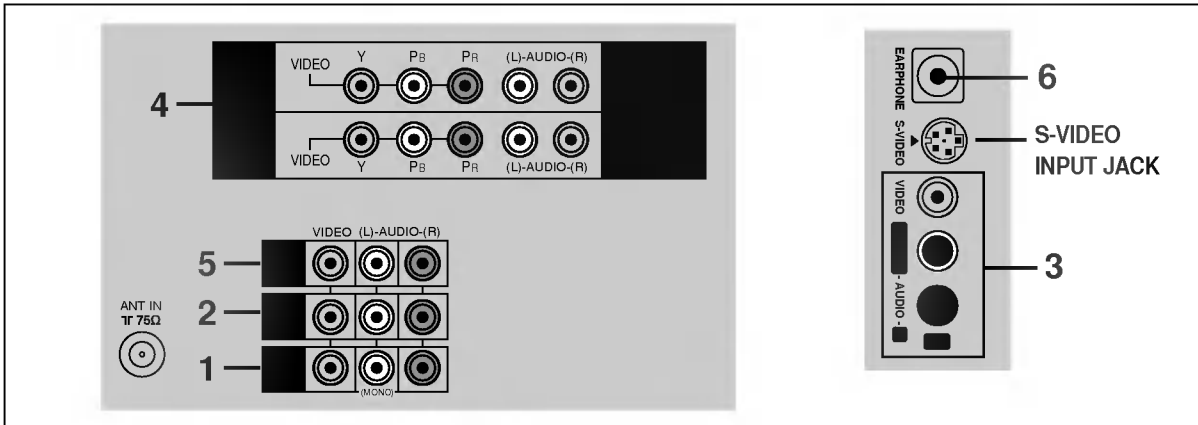
Connecting a CATV Cable

If you subscribe to a CATV system (cable service), change the antenna connection as described below.



1. Remove the 300 to 75 ohm adapter or the cable from the set if attached.

Also, with earphones the Mute button does not work. You should turn off the speakers, if you don't want to listen to the speaker's sound. See page 16 "TV Speaker". If the earphones are connected, the audio from PIP or Double window is heard, if active.

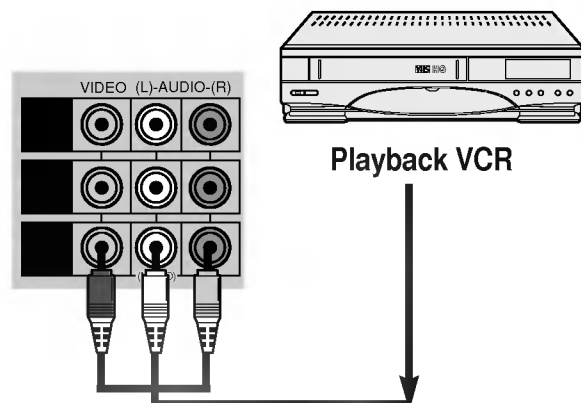

Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have with your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and pull out the plug before you begin any cleaning.

Screen Cleaning

1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cabinet Cleaning

1. Use a soft cloth with a mild soap solution to wipe the cabinet.
2. Rinse the cloth and wipe the cabinet again.
3. Let the cabinet air-dry before turning the TV on.

Extended Absence



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges. If you use an off-air antenna, you may also want to disconnect it from the back of your TV before leaving.

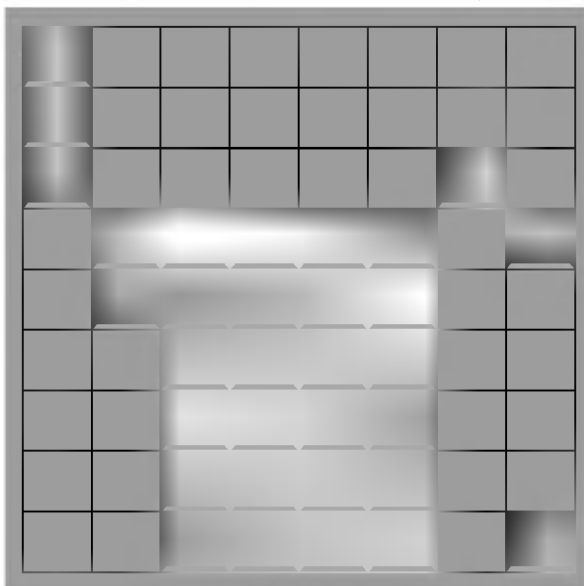
