
Notes on Tapes

Preventing record

Removing the tab(s) of the cassette (with a small screwdriver) will prevent accidental erasure.




To record again, cover the hole of the tab with adhesive tape.




Notes on Discs

Handling discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc. Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints do not get on the surface. Never stick paper or tape on the disc.






Storing discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.


Cleaning discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out.




Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.





Remote Control battery installation



Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert two R03 (size AAA) batteries with

and aligned acorrectly.

Caution: Do not mix old and new batteries. Never mix different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).

Remote Control Operation Range

Point the remote control at the remote sensor and press the buttons.


Distance: About 23 ft (7 m) from the front of the remote sensor.

Angle: About 30° in each direction of the front of the remote sensor.

2.Installation

Speaker System Connection

Connect the speaker cords to the speaker terminal.




№ otes

- Be sure to match the speaker cord to the appropriate terminal on the components: + to + and - to -. If the cords are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack base.
- Do not disassemble the front cover of supplied speaker.

Antenna (Aerial) Connections

Connect the supplied FM/AM antennas for listening to the radio.



√ otes


- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM loop antenna away from the unit and other components.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
- After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it as horizontal as possible.

Auxiliary Devices

Connect an auxiliary device such as a TV or VCR via the rear mounted AUX sockets and press AUX.

√ ote

You can also record from the auxiliary input source, (see the recording section).



3.Operation

Setting the voltage (OPTIONAL)

If your set is equipped with a voltage selector at the back side, be sure to set it to your local power supplied before connecting the AC power cord.


Audio Adjustment

Volume Adjustment

- Press VOLUME (▲) on the front panel to increase the sound level, or VOLUME (▼) on the front panel to decrease it.
- Using the remote control, press VOLUME
 CONTROL (♠) to increase the sound level, or
 (❤) to decrease it.

Using earphone

Connect a stereo earphone jack (\$\psi 3.5\text{mm}\$) into the earphone jack to listen to the sound through headphones. The speakers are automatically disconnected when you plug in the earphone (not supplied).



MUTE

Press **MUTE** to temporarily stop the sound such as when you answer the telephone. The MUTE indicator flashes in the display window. To cancel it, press MUTE again.

Sound Quality Adjustment

You can select a desired sound mode by using **EQ PATTERN** button on the front panel or **EQ PATT.** button on the remote control. When a sound mode passes by with the left side from the right, press EQ PATTERN or EQ PATT.. FLAT → ROCK → POP → CLASSIC → FLAT ...

SURROUND

Press **SURROUND** on the front panel or **SURR**. on the remote control to reinforce surround effect. "SURROUND ON" or "SURROUND OFF" indicator lights on the display window.

When "SURROUND ON" or "SURROUND OFF" indicator passes by with the left side from the right, press SURROUND or SURR..

XDSS (Extreme Dynamic Sound System)

Press **XDSS** to reinforce treble, bass and the surround effect. The "XDSS ON" or "XDSS OFF" indicator lights. To cancel, press XDSS again.

DEMO

Press **DEMO/DISPLAY MODE** in power off state to demonstrate the function in the display window. To cancel it, press **POWER** or **DEMO/DISPLAY MODE** again.

DISPLAY MODE


Whenever you press **DEMO/DISPLAY MODE**, you can enjoy the spectrum change with 9 types in the display window.

Auto Function Selection

- If you press PLAY/PAUSE (►/II) on the remote control during radio receiving or CASSETTE play, CD will be operated automatically.
- If you press BAND on the front panel or TUNER/BAND on the remote control during CD or CASSETTE play, radio function will be operated.

Setting the Clock

- Press CLOCK.
 (If the clock requires setting, press and hold CLOCK for more than 2 seconds.)
- 2. Select a 24 hour cycle or 12 hour cycle by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP).



- Press SET to confirm the selected hour cycle.
- 4. Use TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP) to set the correct hours.
- 5. Press SET.
- 6. Use TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP) to set the correct minutes.
- 7. Press SET and the correct time is shown on the display.
- 8. Press CLOCK at any time to display the time for about 5 seconds.

Using the Sleep Function

When the sleep timer is used, the power is automatically turned off after the specified time has elapsed.

 To specify the time delay before the power is turned off, press SLEEP.
 In the display window you see "90" for about 5 seconds. This means that the system turns off automatically after 90 minutes.

Press SLEEP until the desired time is displayed.

Note: Each time the button is pressed the

Note: Each time the button is pressed the time interval is reduced by 10 minutes. i.e. 80...70... etc.

2. To check the remaining time until the power is turned off, press SLEEP while the sleep function is active. The time remaining is displayed for about 5 seconds.

√ ote

If you press SLEEP while the sleep time is displayed, the SLEEP time is reset.

3. To cancel the sleep timer mode, press the SLEEP button repeatedly until "10" appears, and then press SLEEP once again while "10" indicator is displayed.

Timer

With the TIMER function you can have the radio reception and recording, CD play, tape play or auxiliary source and recording turned on and off at the time desired.

- Press CLOCK to check the current time.
 (If you don't set clock, timer function doesn't work.)
- 2. Press OTIMER to enter the timer setting mode.

(If you want to correct the previous memorized TIMER setting, press and hold the TIMER button more than 2 seconds.

- The previous memorized timer on time and "O" indicator appears in the display window.)
- 3. Each function (TUNER → CD → TAPE → AUX) flashes in the display window in turn. Press SET when the desired function is flashing.
- 4. 1. a. When you select the TUNER or AUX function,

"PLAY" and "REC" indicator flash in the display window alternately for about 3 seconds.

"PLAY" indicator: TUNER play only "REC" indicator: TUNER play and recording

- b. Press SET when the desired function is flashing.
- c. Select the previous memorized preset number with TUNING/TIME (DOWN/ UP) button and press SET.
 - "ON" indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.
- 2. When you select the CD or TAPE function,
- "ON" indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.
- 5. Set the hour to switch on by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP).
- 6. Press SET to confirm the hour to switch on.

- 7. Set the minute to switch on by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP).
- 8. Press SET to confirm the minute to switch on.
 - "OFF" indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.
- 9. Set the hour to switch off by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP).
- 10. Press SET to confirm the hour to switch off.
- 11. Set the minute to switch off by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP).
- 12. Press SET.
- 13. Adjust the volume level by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP).
- 14. Press SET.
 - "O" appears in the display window and the timer setting has been completed.
- 15. Switch the system off.

 The selected function is automatically switched on and off at the time set.

To cancel or check the timer

Each time the ØTIMER button is pressed you can select the timer set or cancel. You can also check the timer setting status.

To activate or check the timer, press the @TIMER button so that "@" appears in the display window. To cancel the TIMER, press the @TIMER button so that "@" disappears in the display window.

Presetting the Radio Stations

You can preset 50 stations for FM and AM. Before tuning, make sure that you have turned down the volume to the minimum.

- Press BAND on the front panel or TUNER/ BAND on the remote control to select the frequency (AM or FM) you want.
- 2. Select a station you want by pressing TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP) buttons.

Tuning in automatically

- Press TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP) for more than 0.5 second. Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a stations.

Tuning in manually

- Press TUNING/TIME (DOWN/UP) briefly and repeatedly.
- 3. Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel.

 A preset number will flash in the display window.
- Press PRESET (◄/►) (or PRESET (➤/ ▲)
 on the remote control) to select the preset
 number you want.
- Press MEMORY/PROG. again.The station is stored.
- 6. Repeat steps 1 (or 2) to 5 to store other stations.

To delete all the memorized stations

Press and hold MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel for about two seconds, "CLEAR" appears in the display window and then MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel again, the stations are deleted.

For your reference

If all stations have already been entered, FULL message will appear in the display window for a moment and then a preset number will flash. To change the preset number, follow the steps 4-5.

To recall presets

Press and hold PRESET (◄/►) (or PRESET (★/►) on the remote control) until the desired preset number appears or press it repeatedly.

Listening to the Radio

- Press BAND on the front panel or TUNER/ BAND on the remote control to select the frequency (AM or FM) you want. The last received station is tuned in.
- Press PRESET (◄/►) (or PRESET (➤/►) on the remote control) repeatedly to select the preset station you want.
 - Each time you press the button, the unit tunes in one preset station at a time.
- Adjust the volume by pressing VOLUME
 (▼/▲) on the remote control repeatedly.

To listen to non-preset radio stations

- For manual tuning, see "Tuning in manually" in step 2 on left.
- For automatic tuning, see "Tuning in automatically" in step 2 on left.

To turn off the radio

Press POWER (STANDBY/ON) to turn the unit off or select another function mode (CD/MP3, AUX, TAPE).

For your reference

- If an FM program is noisy
 Press MODE/RIF so that "STEREO" disappears in the display window. There will be no stereo effect, but the reception will improve.
 Press MODE/RIF again to restore the stereo effect.
- To improve reception Reposition the supplied antennas.

√ otes

- Use MODE/RIF (Radio Interference Filter) function to switch to mono reception if stereo reception is distorted by noise.
- When recording the MW(AM) broadcast, beat noises may occur. If it does, press MODE/RIF once.

Tape Playback

Use only normal tapes.

Basic Playback

- Press FUNCTION on the front panel to select tape function. ("TAPE" appears in the display window.)
- 3. Insert a cassette with the tape side to the downside and then close deck.
- 4. Press PLAY (▶ or ◀: OPTIONAL).

To Stop Play

Press STOP(■) during playback.

Tape Counter Reset

Press COUNTER RESET (CNT RESET) during playback. Playing time appears "0000" in display window.

To Play Rewind or Fast Forward

After pressing I◄◀ ◀◀/▶▶ ▶▶I on the front panel or ◀◀/▶▶ on the remote control during playback or stop, press PLAY(▶) at the point you want.

AUTO STOP DECK

- After auto stop deck plays only front side, the unit stops automatically.

AUTO REVERSE DECK:OPTIONAL

You can select direction of the cassette you want by pressing PLAY MODE.

Tape Recording

Wind the tape to the point recording starts. Use only normal tapes.

Basic Setting

- Select a function you want to record except tape function.
- Open the cassette deck and insert a blank cassette into the cassette compartment.

To set the recording direction :OPTIONAL Press PLAY MODE repeatedly to set the recording direction.

General Recording

- 1. Press •/II on the remote control.
 - "

 REC" flashes and holds the cassette in pause mode.
- Press ●/II or PLAY(►) on the front panel or the remote control.
 The recording begins.

To pause recording

Press •/II during recording.

- "PREC" flashes in display window.

To stop recording

Press TAPE STOP(■).

CD- Synchro recording

This feature is a convenient to record tracks from CD to cassette.

- Select the CD function and load a CD to be recorded.
 - You may wish to program a selection of tracks for recording.
- 2. Open the cassette deck and insert a blank cassette into the tape tray.

To set the recording direction

Press PLAY MODE repeatedly to set the recording direction.

- 3. Press CD SYNC. in stop mode.
 - "

 REC" flashes and "SYNC" indicator lights.
- 4. The synchronized recording is started automatically after about 7 seconds.

№ otes

- If you wish to record from the desired track,
 select the desired track with I◄◀ ◄◄/▶▶ ▶▶I
 before commencing CD synchro recording.
- The function change is not possible during recording.

CD Playback

Basic Playback

- 1. Press FUNCTION on the front panel to select CD/MP3 function.
 - If no disc is loaded then "NO CD" is displayed.

√ ote

To load an 8cm (3 inch) disc, put it onto the inner circle of the tray.

- - Audio CD: "READ" appears in the display window, and then the total number of tracks and the playing time are displayed.
 - MP3 CD: "READ" appears in the display window, and then the total number of files is displayed.
- Press PLAY (►) on the front panel or PLAY/
 PAUSE (►/II) on the remote control.
 In addition, you can also play an Audio CD or
 MP3 CD using the NUMBER buttons.

Pause Playback

Press CD PAUSE or PLAY/ PAUSE (►/II) on the remote control during playback.

Press this button again it to resume play.

Stop Playback

Press STOP(■) on the front panel or CD STOP(■) on the remote control during playback.

Skipping a Track

- Press the ►► ►►I button to go to the next track.
- When the I◄◀ ◀◀ button is pressed once midway through a track, the player returns to the start of that track. When it is pressed again, a track is skipped each time the button is pressed.

Searching a Track

After pressing and holding I◀◀ ◀◀/▶▶ ▶▶I button on the remote control during playback, then release at the point you want.

√ ote

This function is not available to play a MP3 file.

Program Play

You can arrange the order of the tracks on the discs and create your own program. The program can contain up to 20 tracks.

- 1. Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel on the stop mode.
- 2. Press ◄◄ ◄◄/▶▶ ▶►I to select the track.
 EX) "04 P-01" will be shown in the display.
 Program number
 Track number
- 3. Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel.
- 4. Repeat 1~3.
- Press PLAY (►) on the front panel or PLAY/
 PAUSE (►/II) on the remote control. "PROGRAM" appears in the display window.

To check program contents

Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel on the stop mode.

- A Track and program number will be displayed.

To clear program contents

Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel on the stop mode. And then press CD STOP(■) on the remote control.

To add program contents

- Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel repeatedly on the program stop mode until Track Number blinks.
- 2. Repeat 2~4 on above.

To modify program contents

- 1. Press MEMORY/PROG. on the front panel to display program number you want to modify.
- 2. Repeat 2~4 on above.

Repeat

To play one track repeatedly

Press REPEAT once during playback.

- "REPEAT 1" appears in the display window.

To play all tracks repeatedly

Press REPEAT again during playback.

- "REPEAT ALL" appears in the display window.

To cancel repeat play

Press REPEAT once more during playback.

- Repeat indicator disappears.

Program repeat play

- Press REPEAT once during program play.
 - "REPEAT 1" appears on the display window. (One track repeat)
- Press REPEAT again during program play.
 - "REPEAT ALL" appears on the display window.

(All program repeat)

To check MP3 file information

Press the MP3 Info button during MP3 file playback.

- The information (Title, Artist or Album) of the MP3 file will be shown in the display window.
- If there is no the information of the MP3 file, "NO ID3 TAG" indicator will be shown in the display window.

√ ote

This unit can play a CD-R or CD-RW that contains audio titles or MP3 files.

About MP3

MP3

- An MP3 file is audio data compressed by using the MPEG1 audio layer-3 file-coding scheme. We call files that have the ".mp3" file extension "MP3 files".
- The unit can not read an MP3 file that has not ".mp3" file extension.

MP3 Disc compatibility with this unit is limited as follows:

- 1. Sampling Frequency / 8 48kHz
- 2. Bit rate / 8 320kbps
- 3. CD-R physical format should be "ISO 9660"
- 4. If you record MP3 files using the software which cannot create a FILE SYSTEM, for example
 - "Direct-CD" etc., it is impossible to playback MP3 files. We recommend that you use "Easy-CD Creator", which creates an ISO9660 file system.
- 5. File names should be named using 30 letters or less and must incorporate ".mp3" extension
 - e.g. "******.MP3".
- 6. Even if the total number of files on the disc have more than 1000, it will only be shown up to 999.

About MULTI SESSION

- This function recognizes the multi session disc according to a disc of CD-ROM type.
- ex) If there are MP3 files in the first session, the MP3 file in the first session is only played. If there are only MP3 files in the whole session, all of the MP3 files in the session are played.
 - If there is Audio CD in the first session, only the Audio CD in the first session is played.

Maintenance and Service

4. Maintenance and Service

Shipping the Unit

The original shipping carton and packing materials can come in handy. For maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory if you need to ship it.

Cleaning the Unit

Use a soft, dry cloth when cleaning the player. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution.

Never use strong solvents, such as alcohol, benzine, or paint thinner. These might damage the surface of the unit.

Do not use volatile liquids, such as insecticide spray, near the unit. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time. They will leave marks on the surface.

This button is used to solve the problem as following symptom;


- When the power can not on, even if power cord is connected to the outlet.
