### Important Precautions

This unit has been engineered and manufactured to ensure your personal safety, however improper use may result in potential eletrical shock or fire hazards. In order to allow the proper operation of all safeguards incorporated in this display, observe the following basic rules for its installation, use, and servicing.

### On Safety

Use only the power cord supplied with the unit. In case you use another power cord, make sure that it is certified by the applicable national standards if not being provided by the supplier. If the power cable is faulty in any way, please contact the manufacturer or the nearest authorized repair service provider for a replacement.

The power supply cord is used as the main disconnection device. Ensure that the socket-outlet is easily accessible after installation.

Operate the display only from a power source indicated in the specifications of this manual or listed on the display. If you are not sure what type of power supply you have in your home, consult with your dealer.

Overloaded AC outlets and extension cords are dangerous. So are frayed power cords and broken plugs. They may result in a shock or fire hazard. Call your service technician for replacement.

### Do not Open the Display.

- There are no user serviceable components inside.
- There are Dangerous High Voltages inside, even when the power is OFF.
- Contact your dealer if the display is not operating properly.

### To Avoid Personal Injury:

- Do not place the display on a sloping shelf unless properly secured.
- Use only a stand recommended by the manufacturer.

#### To Prevent Fire or Hazards:

- Always turn the display OFF if you leave the room for more than a short period of time. Never leave the display ON when leaving the house.
- Keep children from dropping or pushing objects into the display's cabinet openings. Some internal parts carry hazardous voltages.
- Do not add accessories that have not been designed for this display.
- During a lightning storm or when the display is to be left unattended for an extended period of time, unplug it from the wall outlet.

### On Installation

Do not allow anything to rest upon or roll over the power cord, and do not place the display where the power cord is subject to damage.

Do not use this display near water such as near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool. Displays are provided with ventilation openings in the cabinet to allow the release of heat generated during operation. If these openings are blocked, built-up heat can cause failures which may result in a fire hazard. Therefore, NEVER:

- Block the bottom ventilation slots by placing the display on a bed, sofa, rug, etc.
- Place the display in a built-in enclosure unless proper ventilation is provided.
- Cover the openings with cloth or other material.
- Place the display near or over a radiator or heat source.

Do not rub or strike the Active Matrix LCD with anything hard as this may scratch, mar, or damage the Active Matrix LCD permanently.

Do not press the LCD screen with your finger for a long time as this may cause some afterimages.

Some dot defects may appear as Red, Green or Blue spots on the screen. However, this will have no impact or effect on the display performance.

If possible, use the recommended resolution to obtain the best image quality for your LCD display. If used under any mode except the recommended resolution, some scaled or processed images may appear on the screen. However, this is characteristic of the fixed-resolution LCD panel.

### **On Cleaning**

- Unplug the display before cleaning the face of the display screen.
- Use a slightly damp (not wet) cloth. Do not use an aerosol directly on the display screen because over-spraying may cause electrical shock.

### On Repacking

 Do not throw away the carton and packing materials. They make an ideal container in which to transport the unit. When shipping the unit to another location, repack it in its original material.




 Before setting up the monitor, ensure that the power to the monitor, the computer system, and other attached devices is turned off.

### Connecting the stand

- ${f 1.}$  Place the monitor with its front facing downward on a soft cloth.
- **2.** Assemble the Stand Body into the product in the correct direction as shown in the picture. Make sure you push it until you hear it "click".



- 3. Assemble the Stand Base(Front, Rear) into the Stand Body in the correct direction.
- 4. Once assembled take the monitor up carefully and face the front side


- This illustration depicts the general model of connection. Your monitor may differ from the items shown in the picture.

### ■■■ When Connecting to your PC

- Connect the power cord into a proper power outlet that is easily accessible and close to the display.

- Recommend resolution are 1680 x 1050, 1280 x 1024, 1024 x 768, 800 x 600.
- The setting method can differ by O/S or video card. In this case, Please ask to the computer or the video card manufacturer.


### **Screen Adjustment**

"Controls locked" should appear.

Language

To choose the language in which the control names are displayed.

Power Indicator Use this function to set the power indicator on the front side of the product to

On or Off.

Transparency

To adjust the transparency of the OSD menu screen.

Reset

Use this function to reset the product to the factory default. However, language

selection will not be initialized.

DDC-CI

DDC/CI(Display Data Channel Command Interface) is communication protocol for

communications between PC and monitor.

DDC/CI makes it possible to adjust and setup detailed functions on PC instead of the

monitor OSD.

Monitor can be adjusted with PC by connecting communication between PC and monitor when DDC/CI is ON, and monitor cannot be adjusted with PC because communication

between PC and monitor is disconnected when DDC/CI is OFF.



### **Screen Adjustment**



#### **ARC**

To select the image size of the screen.

\* Menu varies depending on the type of input signal. ARC is activated in Video signal but deactivated in 1080i.

#### Auto-Configure

This function is suitable for analogue signal input only. This button is for the automatic adjustment of the screen **Position**, **Clock** and **Phase**.

#### Clock

This function is suitable for analogue signal input only. To minimize any vertical bars or stripes visible on the screen background. The horizontal screen size will also change.

#### **Phase**

This function is suitable for analogue signal input only. To adjust the focus of the display. This item allows you to remove any horizontal noise and clear or sharpen the image of characters.



When the Interlace Signal is inputted at the RGB source input level, the Auto-Configure, Clock, Phase menu can't be used.

#### **Position**



This function is suitable for analogue signal input only. To adjust position of the screen. Press the **AUTO/SET** button to display the sub-menu for position.

H-Position: Moving the screen position horizontally.

V-Position: Moving the screen position vertically.

#### **HDMI**

Video: Used when it is connected with DVD or SET-TOP BOX through HDMI.

\* If you want to connect VCR, select VIDEO in this menu. Otherwise, you may see noise in the margin of the screen due to the difference in the screen size.

PC: Used when it is connected with PC through HDMI.

\* If you want to connect PC, select PC in this menu. Otherwise, the screen may be too large to support PC sub screen



When the Interlace Signal is inputted at the RGB source input level, the Position menu can't be used.

### **Troubleshooting**

Check the following before calling for service.

### No image appears

- Is the power cord of the display connected?
- Check and see if the power cord is connected properly to the power outlet.
- Is the power indicator light on?
- · Press the Power button.
- Is the power on and the power indicator blue or green?
- · Adjust the brightness and the contrast.
- Is the power indicator amber?
- If the display is in power saving mode, try moving the mouse or pressing any key on the keyboard to bring up the screen.
- Try to turn on the PC.
- O Do you see an "OUT OF RANGE" message on the screen?
- This message appears when the signal from the PC (video card) is out of horizontal or vertical frequency range of the display. See the 'Specifications' section of this manual and configure your display again.
- Do you see a "CHECK SIGNAL CABLE" message on the screen?
- This message appears when the signal cable between your PC and your display is not connected. Check the signal cable and try again.

### Do you see a "Controls locked" message on the screen?

- Do you see "Controls locked" when you push MENU button?
- You can secure the current control settings, so that they cannot be inadvertently changed. You can unlock the OSD controls at any time by pushing the MENU and (+) button for several seconds: the message "Controls unlocked" will appear.

### Display image is incorrect

- Display Position is incorrect.
- Press the AUTO/SET button to automatically adjust your display image to the ideal setting.
   If the results are unsatisfactory, adjust the image position using the H position and V position icon in the on screen display.
- Check Control Panel --> Display --> Settings and see if the frequency or the resolution were changed. If yes, readjust the video card to the recommend resolution.
- On the screen background, vertical bars or stripes are visible.
- Press the AUTO/SET button to automatically adjust your display image to the ideal setting.
   If the results are unsatisfactory, decrease the vertical bars or stripes using the CLOCK icon in the on screen display.
- Any horizontal noise appearing in any image or characters are not clearly portrayed.
- Press the AUTO/SET button to automatically adjust your display image to the ideal setting.
   If the results are unsatisfactory, decrease the horizontal bars using the PHASE icon in the on screen display.
- Check Control Panel --> Display --> Settings and adjust the display to the recommended resolution or adjust the display image to the ideal setting. Set the color setting higher than 24 bits (true color).
- The screen color is mono or abnormal.
- Check if the signal cable is properly connected and use a screwdriver to fasten if necessary.
- Make sure the video card is properly inserted in the slot.
- Set the color setting higher than 24 bits (true color) at **Control Panel Settings**.
- The screen blinks.
- Check if the screen is set to interlace mode and if yes, change it to the recommend resolution.

### Have you installed the display driver?

- Have you installed the display driver?
- Be sure to install the display driver from the display driver CD (or diskette) that comes with your display. Or, you can also download the driver from our web site: http://www.lge.com.
- Do you see an "Unrecognized monitor, Plug&Play (VESA DDC) monitor found" message?
- Make sure to check if the video card supports Plug&Play function.
