PREPARATION

FRONT PANEL CONTROLS

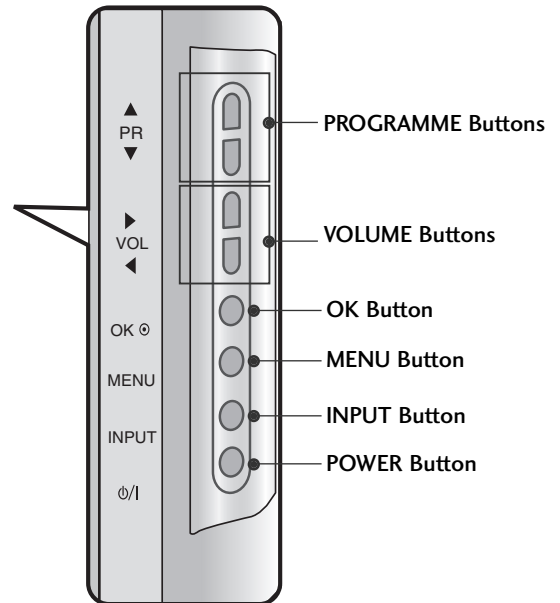
- This is a simplified representation of the front panel. Here shown may be somewhat different from your TV.
- The external appearance of the set has an inherent character (annual ring, wood grain, knar) of wood.
- If your product has a protection film attached, remove the film and then wipe the product with a polishing cloth.



Power/Standby Indicator

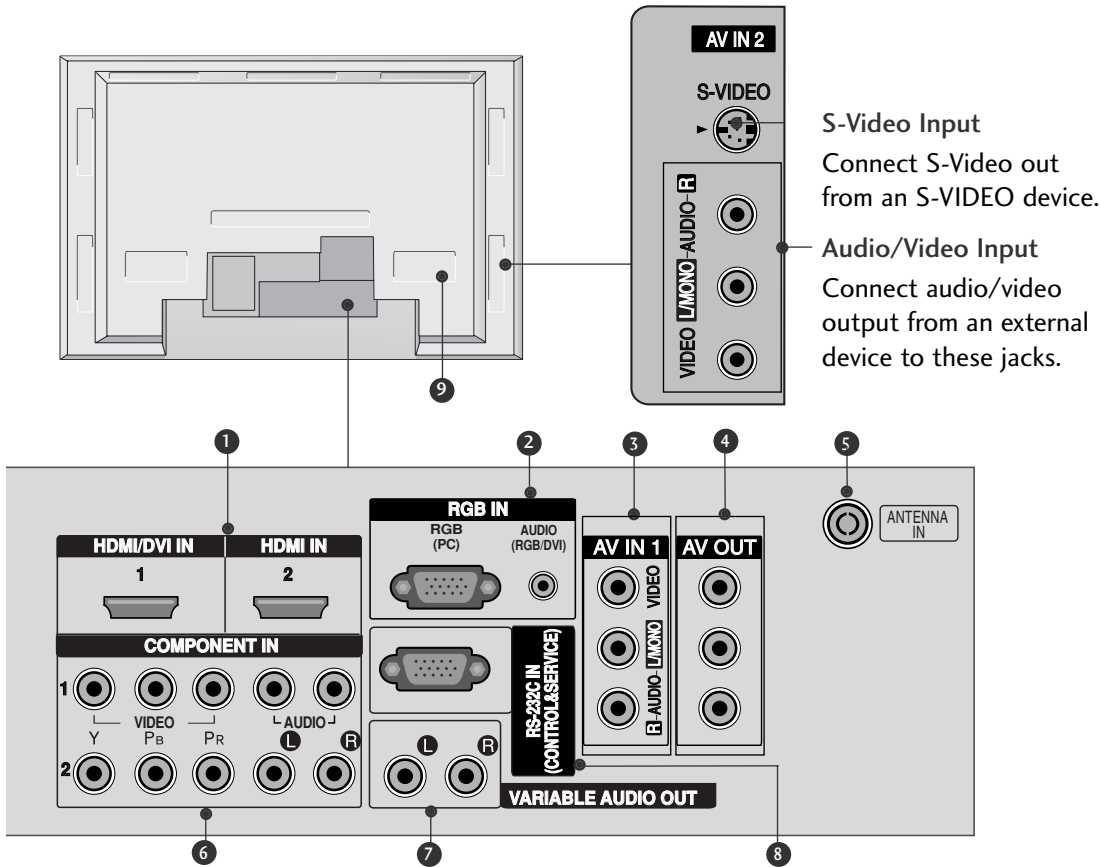
- illuminates red in standby mode.
- illuminates green when the set is switched on.

Remote Control Sensor



BACK PANEL INFORMATION

- This is a simplified representation of the back panel. Here shown may be somewhat different from your TV.



- HDMI/DVI1, HDMI2 Input**
Connect a HDMI signal to HDMI IN.
Or DVI(VIDEO)signal to HDMI/DVI port with DVI to HDMI cable.
- RGB/Audio Input**
Connect the monitor output from a PC to the appropriate input port.
- Audio/Video Input (AV IN 1)**
Connect audio/video output from an external device to these jacks.
- AV Output**
Connect second TV or monitor to the AV OUT socket on the set.
- Antenna Input**
Connect over-the-air signals to this jack.
- Component Input 1/2**
Connect a component video/audio device to these jacks.
- Variable Audio Output**
Connect an external amplifier or add a subwoofer to your surround sound system.
- RS-232C Input(CONTROL&SERVICE)Port**
Connect the serial port of the control devices to the RS-232C jack.
- Power Cord Socket**
This TV operates on an AC power. The voltage is indicated on the Specifications page. Never attempt to operate the TV on DC power.

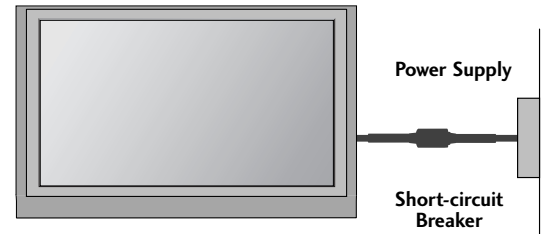
PREPARATION

- The TV can be installed in various ways such as on a wall, or on a desktop etc.
- The TV is designed to be mounted horizontally.

GROUNDING

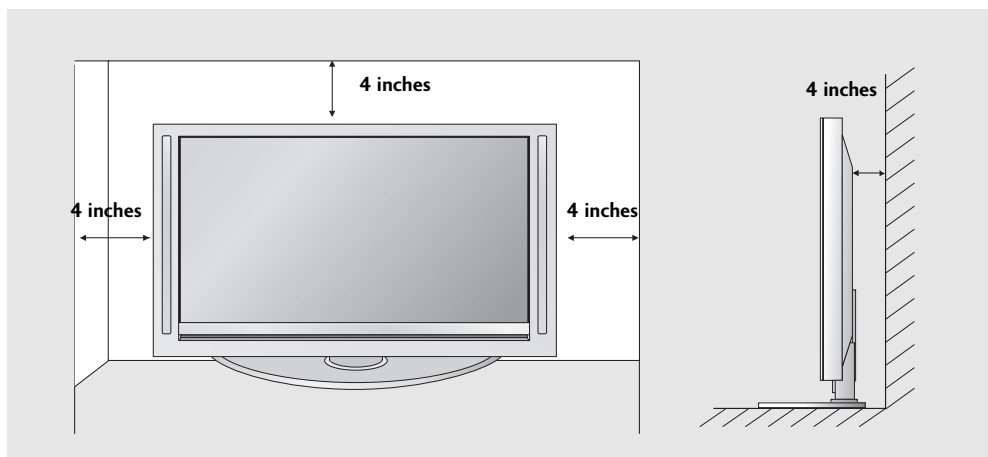
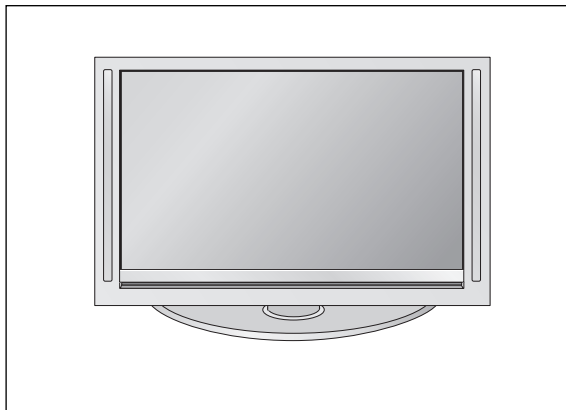
Ensure that you connect the earth ground wire to prevent possible electric shock. If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker.

Do not try to ground the unit by connecting it to telephone wires, lightening rods, or gas pipes.



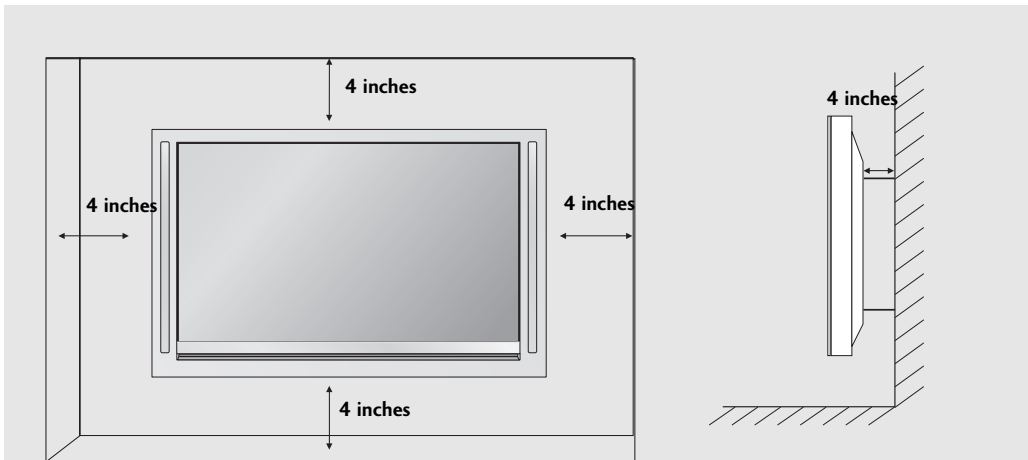
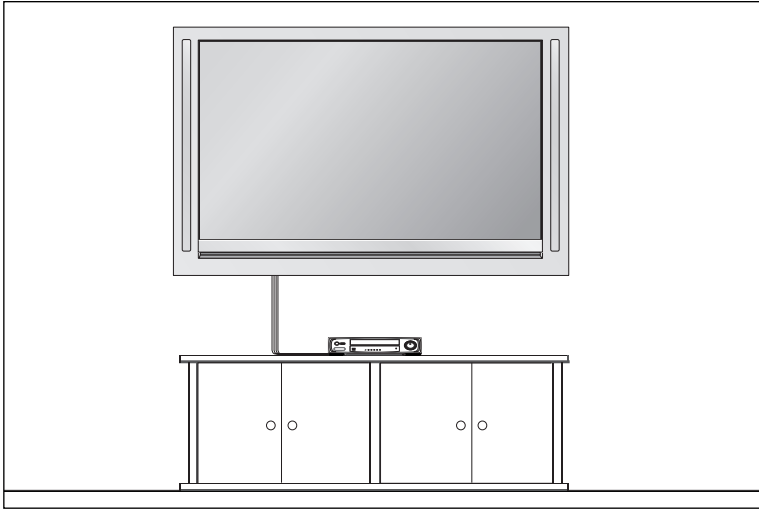
DESKTOP PEDESTAL INSTALLATION

For proper ventilation, allow a clearance of 4" on each side and the top and 4" from the wall. Detailed installation instructions are included in the optional Desktop Stand Installation and Setup Guide available from your dealer.



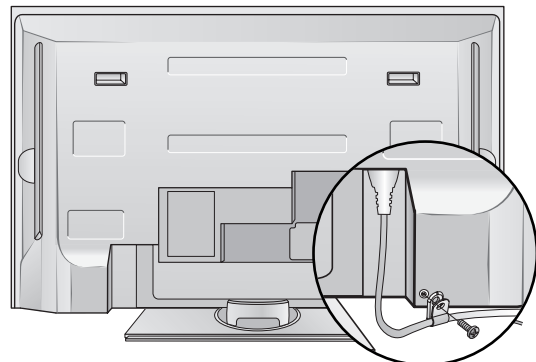
WALL MOUNT: HORIZONTAL INSTALLATION

For proper ventilation, allow a clearance of 4" on each side and from the wall. Detailed installation instructions are available from your dealer, see the optional Tilt Wall Mounting Bracket Installation and Setup Guide.



POWER CORD ARRANGEMENT

After connecting the power cord to the AC input terminal, remove the bolt at the hole on the back cover and fix the power cord at the rear side of the TV by using the bracket for fixing the power cord.

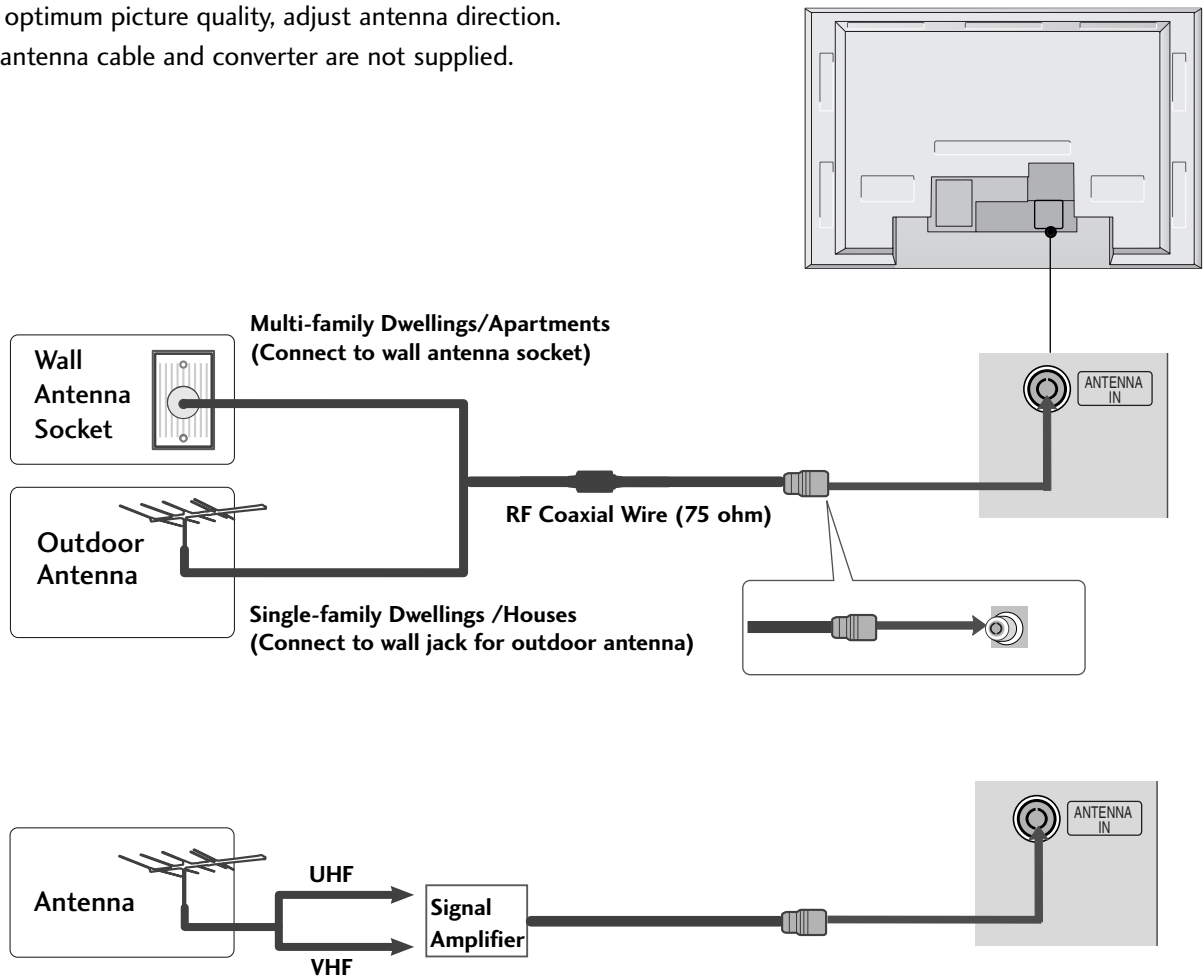


PREPARATION

- To prevent the equipment damage, never plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

ANTENNA CONNECTION

- For optimum picture quality, adjust antenna direction.
- An antenna cable and converter are not supplied.



- In poor signal areas, to get better picture quality, install a signal amplifier to the antenna as shown to the right.
- If signal needs to be split for two TVs, use an antenna signal splitter for connection.

■ To prevent the equipment damage, never plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

HD RECEIVER SETUP

When connecting with a component cable

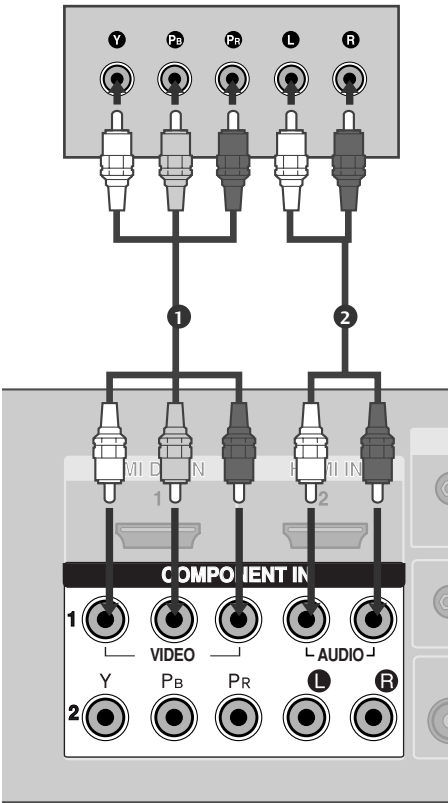

Connect the video outputs (Y, PB, PR) of the digital set top box to the **COMPONENT IN VIDEO** jacks on the set.
- 2

Connect the audio output of the digital set-top box to the **COMPONENT IN AUDIO** jacks on the set.
- 3

Turn on the digital set-top box.
(Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)
- 4

Select **Component1** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
If connected to **COMPONENT IN2**, select **Component2** input source.

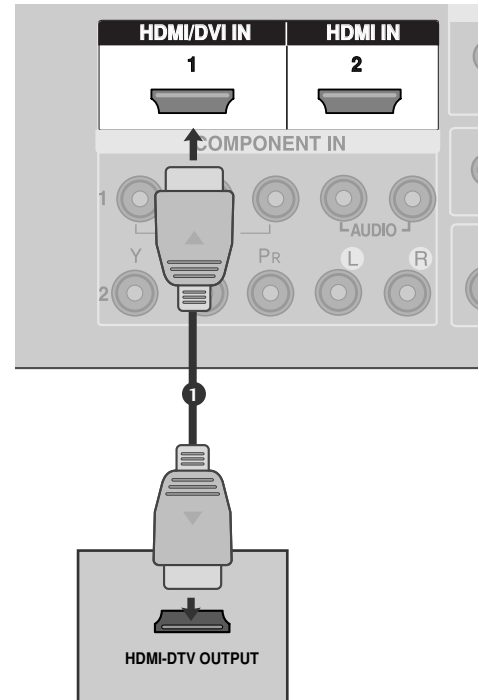

EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

When connecting with a HDMI cable

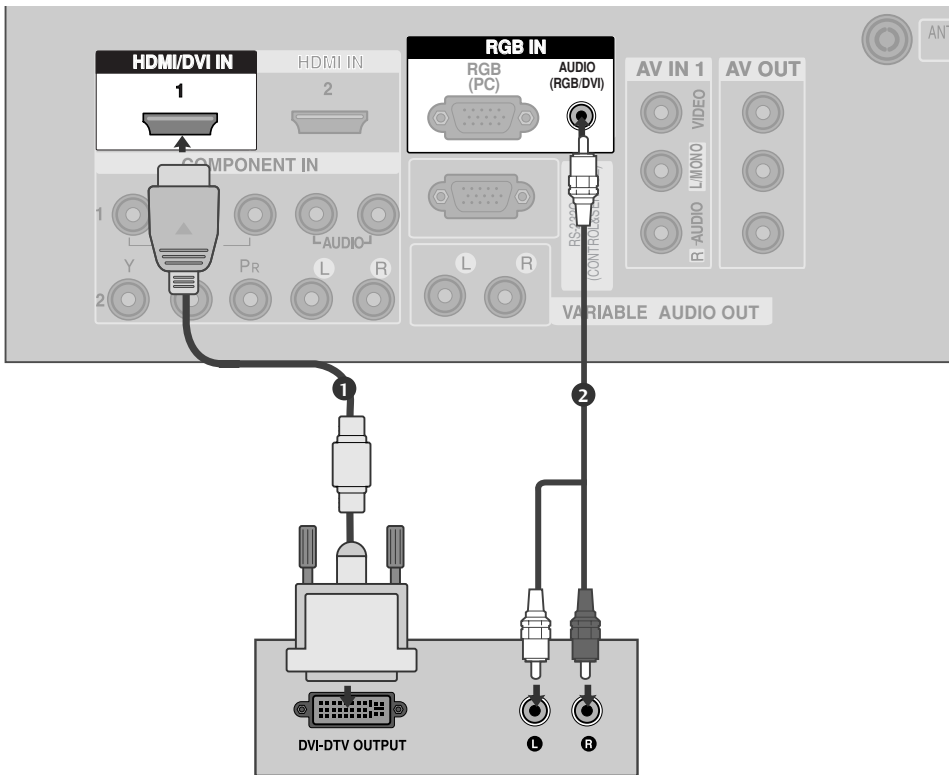
- 1 Connect the HDMI output of the digital set-top box to the **HDMI/DVI IN 1** or **HDMI IN 2** jack on the set.
- 2 Select **HDMI1/DVI** or **HDMI2** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
- 3 Turn on the digital set-top box.
(Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)



! NOTE

- ▶ If the digital set-top box supports Auto HDMI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically set to 1280x720p.
 - ▶ If the digital set-top box player does not support Auto HDMI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the source device to 1920x1080i/1080p.

When connecting with a HDMI to DVI cable



- 1 Connect the DVI output of the digital set-top box to the **HDMI/DVI IN 1** jack on the set.
- 2 Connect the audio output of the digital set-top box to the **AUDIO(RGB/DVI)** jack on the set.
- 3 Turn on the digital set-top box. (Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)
- 4 Select **HDMI1/DVI** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

DVD SETUP

When connecting with a component cable

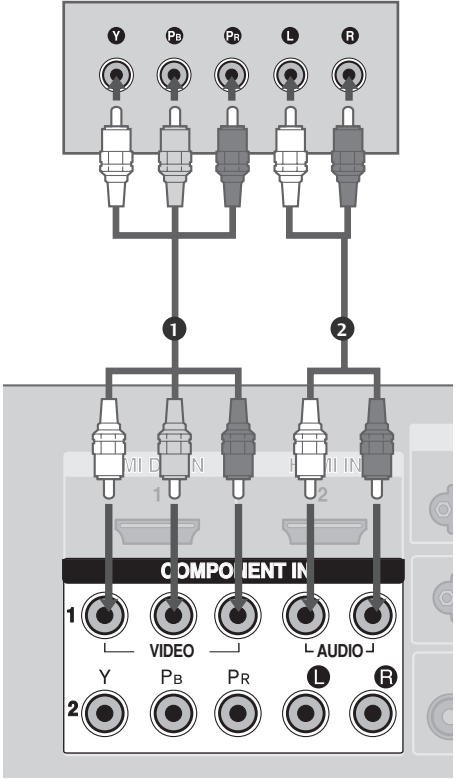
Connect the video outputs (Y, PB, PR) of the DVD to the **COMPONENT IN VIDEO** jacks on the set.
- 2

Connect the audio outputs of the DVD to the **COMPONENT IN AUDIO** jacks on the set.
- 3

Turn on the DVD player, insert a DVD.
- 4

Select **Component1** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
If connected to **COMPONENT IN2**, select **Component2** input source.
- 5

Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.



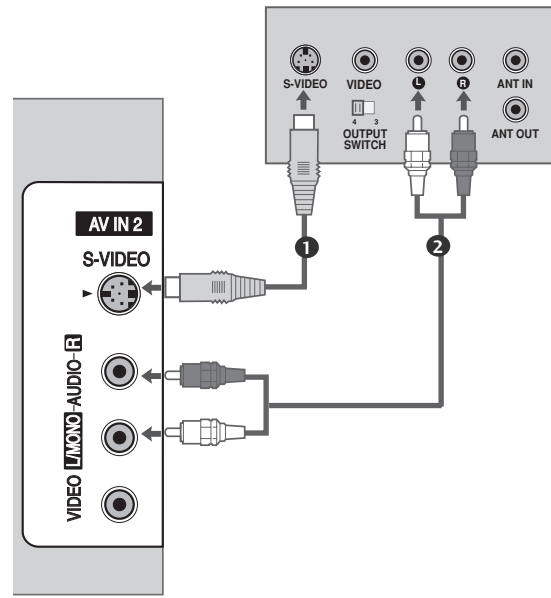

When connecting with an S-Video cable

- 1 Connect the S-VIDEO output of the DVD to the **S-VIDEO** input on the set.
- 2 Connect the audio outputs of the DVD to the **AUDIO** input jacks on the set.
- 3 Turn on the DVD player, insert a DVD.
- 4 Select **AV2** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
- 5 Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.



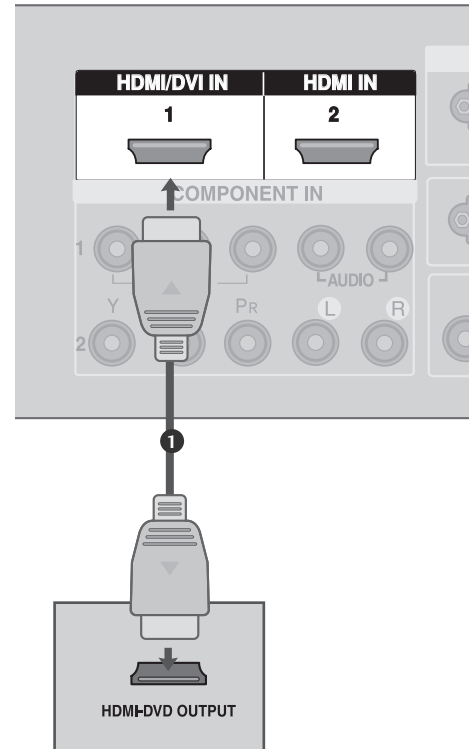
EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

When connecting HDMI cable

- 1 Connect the HDMI output of the DVD to the **HDMI/DVI IN 1** or **HDMI IN 2** jack on the set.
- 2 Select **HDMI1/DVI** or **HDMI2** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
- 3 Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

! NOTE

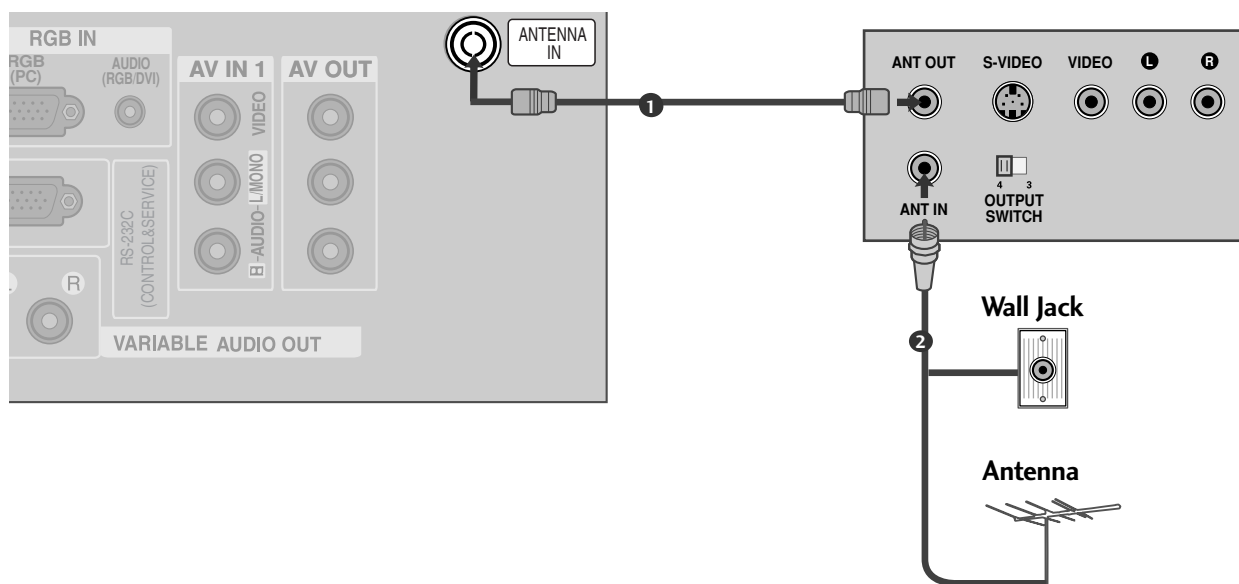
- ▶ If the DVD supports Auto HDMI function, the DVD output resolution will be automatically set to 1280x720p.
 - ▶ If the DVD player does not support Auto HDMI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the DVD to 1920x1080i/1080p.



VCR SETUP

- To avoid picture noise (interference), leave an adequate distance between the VCR and TV.
- Typically a frozen still picture from a VCR. If the 4:3 picture format is used; the fixed images on the sides of the screen may remain visible on the screen.

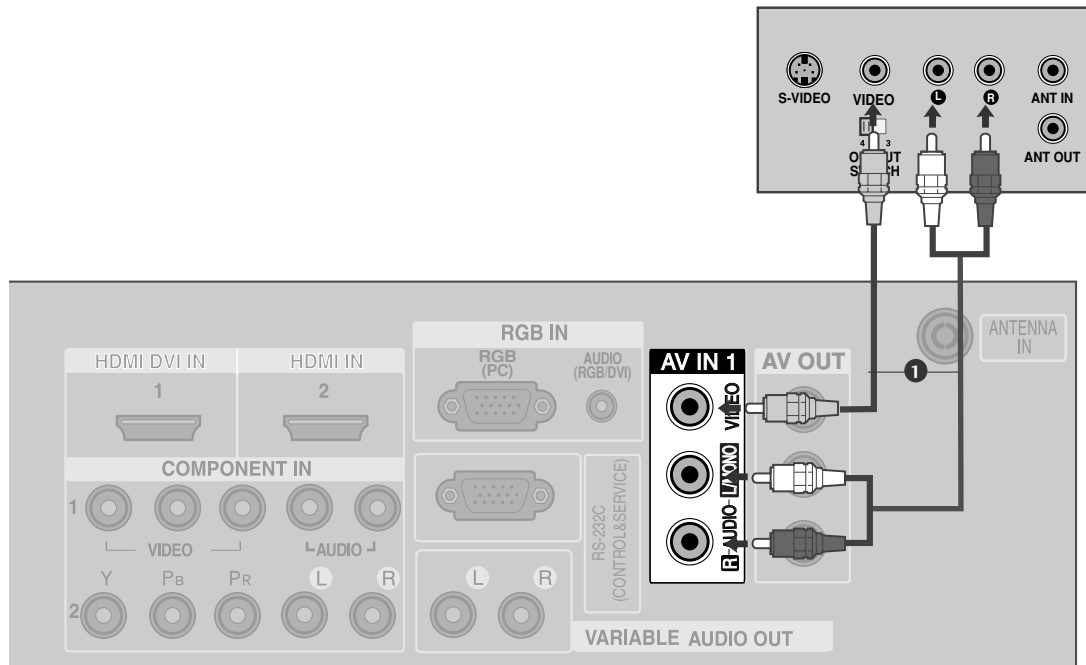
When connecting with an antenna



- 1 Connect the **ANT OUT** socket of the VCR to the **ANTENNA IN** socket on the set.
- 2 Connect the antenna cable to the **ANT IN** socket of the VCR.
- 3 Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR and match the appropriate programme between the TV and VCR for viewing.

EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

When connecting with a RCA cable



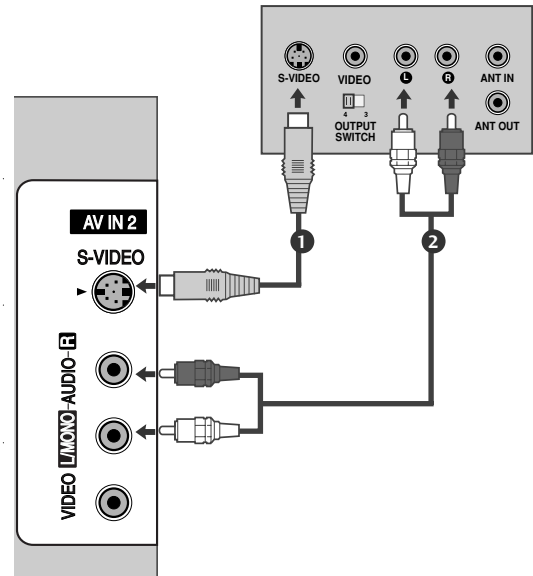
- 1 Connect the **AUDIO/VIDEO** jacks between TV and VCR. Match the jack colours (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)
- 2 Insert a video tape into the VCR and press **PLAY** on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)
- 3 Select **AV1** input source using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.
If connected to **AV IN2**, select **AV2** input source.

! NOTE

- If you have a mono VCR, connect the audio cable from the VCR to the **AUDIO L/MONO** jack of the set.

When connecting with an S-Video cable

- 1 Connect the S-VIDEO output of the VCR to the **S-VIDEO** input on the set. The picture quality is improved; compared to normal composite (RCA cable) input.
- 2 Connect the audio outputs of the VCR to the **AUDIO** input jacks on the set.
- 3 Insert a video tape into the VCR and press PLAY on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)
- 4 Select **AV2** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

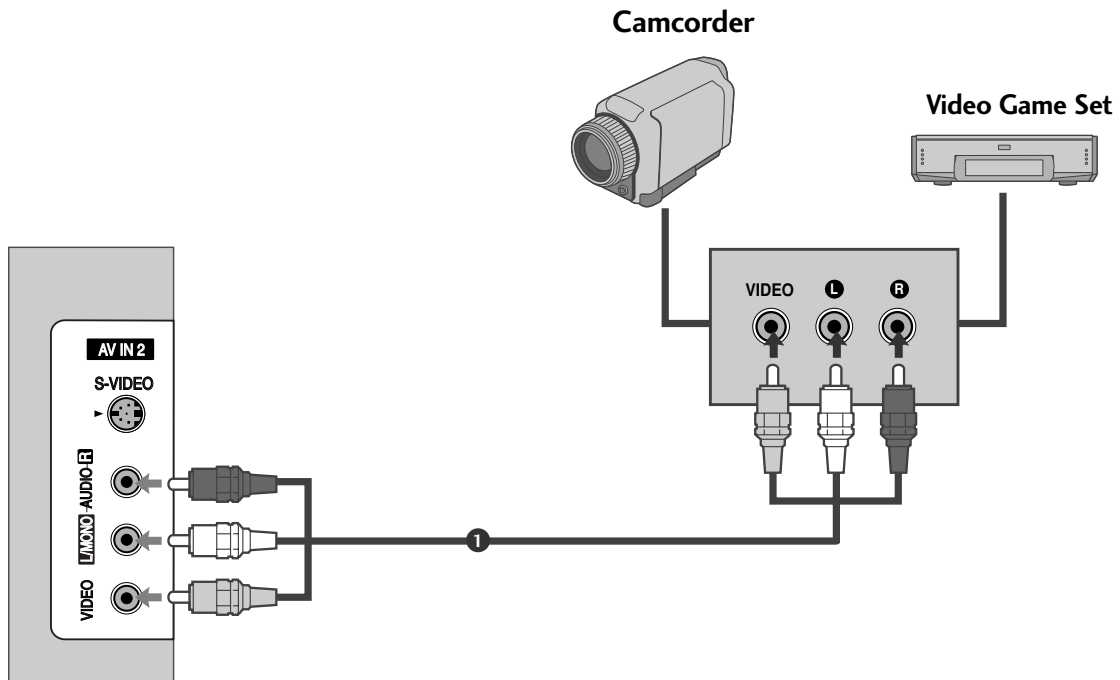


! NOTE

- ▶ If both S-VIDEO and VIDEO sockets have been connected to the S-VHS VCR simultaneously, only the S-VIDEO can be received.

EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

OTHER A/V SOURCE SETUP

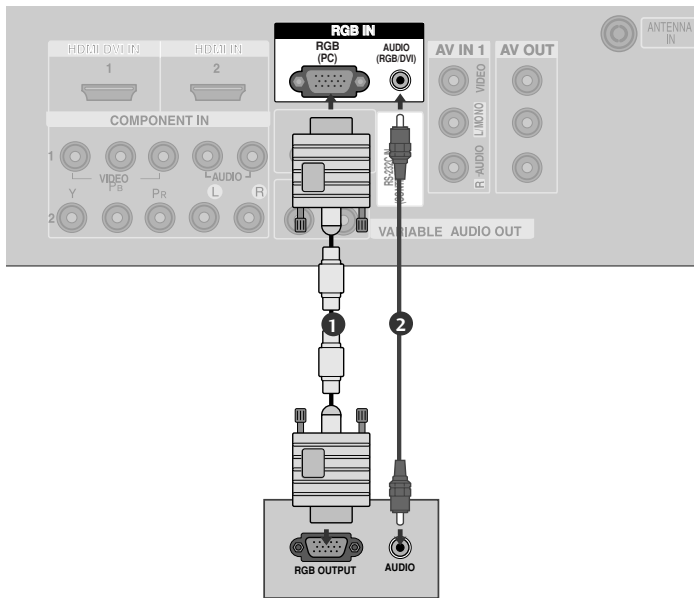


- 1 Connect the **AUDIO/VIDEO** jacks between TV and external equipment. Match the jack colours. (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)
- 2 Select **AV2** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control. If connected to **AV IN1**, select **AV1** input source.
- 3 Operate the corresponding external equipment. Refer to external equipment operating guide.

PC SETUP

This TV provides Plug and Play capability, meaning that the PC adjusts automatically to the TV's settings.

When connecting with a D-sub 15 pin cable



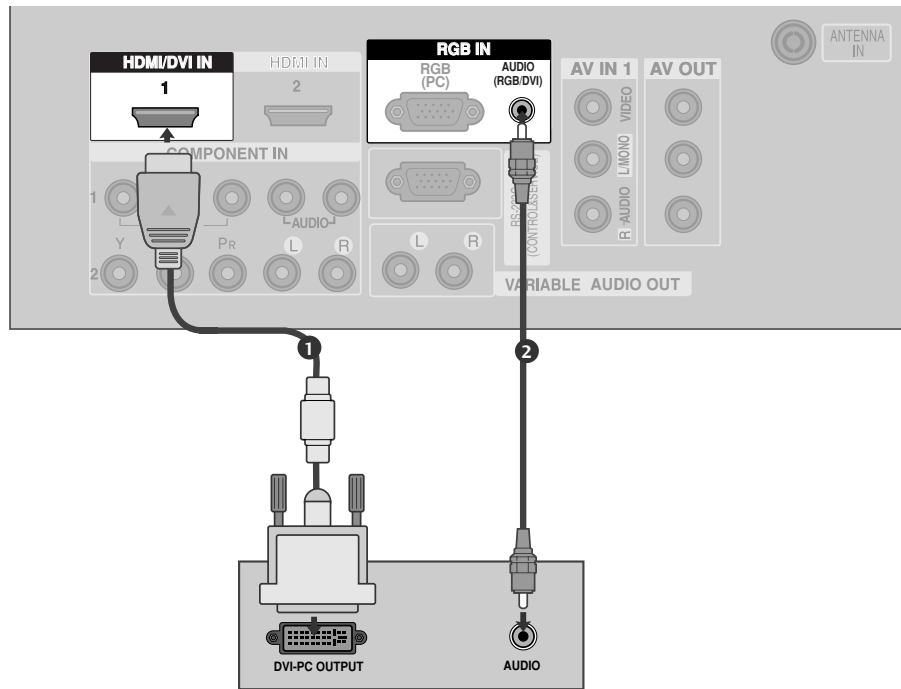
- 1 Connect the RGB output of the PC to the **RGB (PC)** jack on the set.
- 2 Connect the PC audio output to the **AUDIO (RGB/DVI)** jack on the set.
- 3 Turn on the PC and the set.
- 4 Select **RGB PC** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

! NOTE

- ▶ Check the image on your TV. There may be noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrast or brightness in PC mode. If noise is present, change the PC output to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the VIDEO menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.

EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

When connecting with a HDMI to DVI cable



- ➊ Connect the DVI output of the PC to the **HDMI/DVI IN 1** jack on the set.
- ➋ Connect the PC audio output to the **AUDIO (RGB/DVI)** jack on the set.
- ➌ Turn on the PC and the set.
- ➍ Select **HDMI1/DVI** input source with using the **INPUT** button on the remote control.

! NOTE

- ▶ HDMI2 source does not support DVI source.
- ▶ If the PC has a DVI output and no HDMI output, a separated audio connection is necessary.
- ▶ If the PC does not support Auto DVI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.

! NOTE

- ▶ To get the best picture quality, adjust the PC graphics card to 1920x1080, 60Hz.
- ▶ Depending on the graphics card, DOS mode may not work if a HDMI to DVI Cable is in use.
- ▶ When Source Devices connected with HDMI Input, output TV SET Resolution (480p, 720p, 1080i) and TV SET Display fit EIA/CEA-861 -B Specification to Screen. If not, refer to the Manual of HDMI Source Devices or contact your service center.
- ▶ If the HDMI Source Device is not connected to the Cable or if there is a poor cable connection, "No signal" is displayed in the HDMI Input. In this case, that Video Resolution is not supported.
- ▶ Avoid keeping a fixed image on the screen for a long period of time. The fixed image may become permanently imprinted on the screen.
- ▶ The synchronization input form for Horizontal and Vertical frequencies is separate.
- ▶ When you use too long RGB-PC cable, there might be a noise on the screen. We recommend using under 5m of the cable. It provides the best picture quality.

EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT SETUP

Screen Setup for PC mode

Auto Configure (RGB [PC] mode only)

Automatically adjusts picture position and minimizes image shaking. After adjustment, if the image is still not correct, your set is functioning properly but needs further adjustment.

Auto configure

This function is for the automatic adjustment of the screen position, clock, and phase. The displayed image will unstable for a few seconds while the auto configuration is in progress.

1 Press the **MENU** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **PICTURE** menu.

2 Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Screen**.

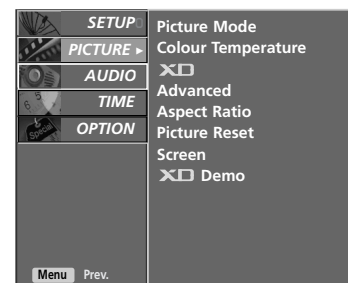
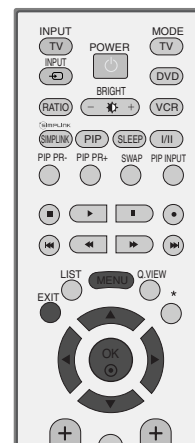
3 Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto Config..**

4 Press the ► button to start **Auto Config..**

- When **Auto config.** has finished, OK will be shown on screen.
- If the position of the image is still not correct, try Auto adjustment again.

- If picture needs to be adjusted more after Auto adjustment in RGB (PC), you can adjust the **Manual Config..**

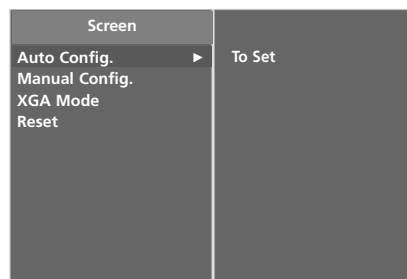

Adjustment for screen Phase, Clock, Position

If the picture isn't clear after auto adjustment and especially if characters are still trembling, adjust the picture phase manually.

It's not available to use this function in 1:1 Pixel mode.

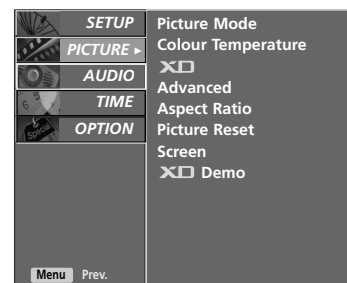
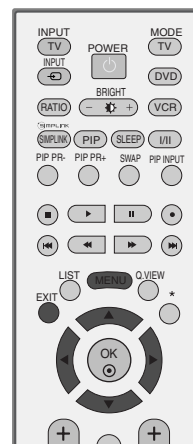
To correct the screen size, adjust **Clock**.

This function works in the following mode : RGB[PC], COMPONENT (480i/480p/576i/576p/720p/1080i/1080p), HDMI (480p/576p/720p/1080i/1080p).

It's not available to use Phase, Clock function in COMPONENT (480i/480p/576i/576p/720p/1080i/1080p), HDMI (480p/576p/720p/1080i/1080p).

Clock This function is to minimize any vertical bars or stripes visible on the screen background. And the horizontal screen size will also change.

Phase This function allows you to remove any horizontal noise and clear or sharpen the image of characters.

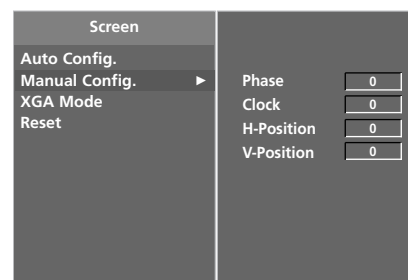

AV OUTPUT SETUP

The TV has a special signal output capability which allows you to hook up the second TV or monitor.

- 1 Connect the second TV or monitor to the TV's **AV OUT** jacks.
- 2 See the Operating Manual of the second TV or monitor for further details regarding that device's input settings.



! NOTE

- ▶ Component, RGB, HDMI input sources cannot be used for AV out.
- ▶ We recommend to use the AV OUT jacks for VCR recording.

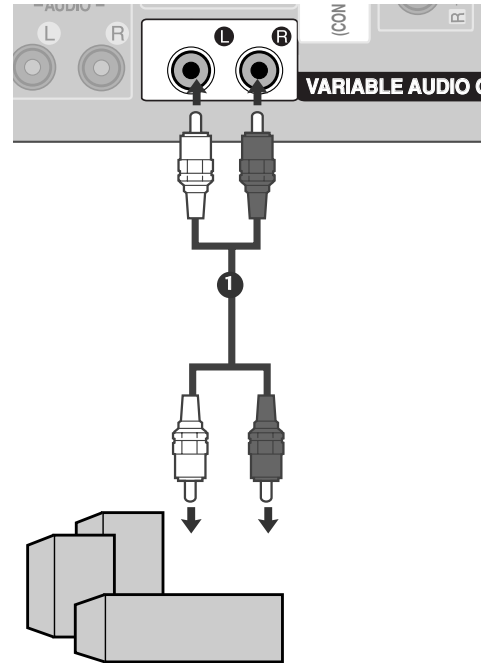
EXTERNAL STEREO SETUP

Use to connected either an external amplifier, or add a sub-woofer to your surround sound system.

- 1 Connect the input jack of the stereo amplifier to the **VARIABLE AUDIO OUT** jacks on the set.
- 2 Set up your speakers through your analog stereo amplifier, according to the instructions provided with the amplifier.

! NOTE

- ▶ When connecting with external audio equipments, such as amplifiers or speakers, please turn the TV speakers off. (▶ p.63)



WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

REMOTE CONTROL KEY FUNCTIONS

When using the remote control, aim it at the remote control sensor on the TV.



POWER Switches the set on from standby or off to standby.

TV INPUT Returns to the TV viewing from any mode.
Switches the set on from standby.

2 INPUT If you press the button once, the input source OSD will appear on screen as shown. Press the ▲ / ▼ button and then OK button to select the desired input source (AV1, AV2, Component1, Component2, RGB, HDMI1/DVI or HDMI2).

RATIO Selects your desired picture format.

Brightness adjustment Adjusts screen brightness.
It returns to the default settings brightness by changing mode source.

1 PIP Switches the sub picture PIP, DW mode.

PIP PR - / + Selects a programme for the sub picture.

SWAP Alternates between main and sub picture in PIP/Twin picture mode.

PIP INPUT Selects the input source for the sub picture in PIP/Twin picture mode.

SIZE Adjusts the sub picture size.

POSITION Moves the sub picture.

VCR/DVD control buttons Controls some video cassette recorders or DVD players when you have already selected DVD or VCR mode button. Control connected AV devices by pressing the ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶, OK buttons and buttons for play, stop, pause, fast reverse, fast forward, chapter skip.
(The ● button does not provide such functions.)

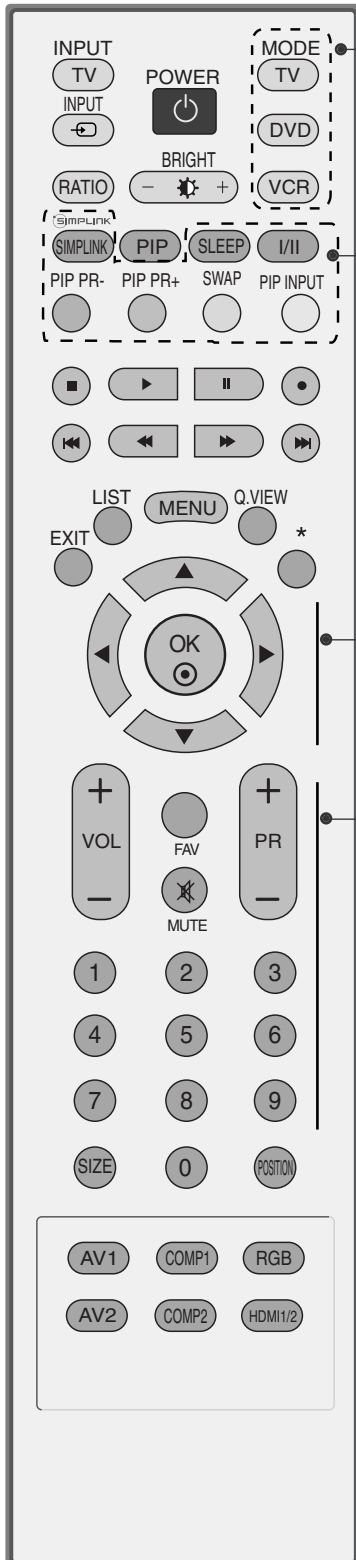
EXIT Clears all on-screen displays and returns to TV viewing from any menu.

LIST Displays the programme table.

MENU Selects a menu.

Q.VIEW Returns to the previously viewed programme.

* No function



MODE Selects the remote operating modes.

SIMPLINK See a list of AV devices connected to TV.
When you toggle this button, the Simplink menu appears at the screen. (► p.41)

SLEEP Sets the sleep timer.

I/II Selects the sound output.

Coloured buttons These buttons are used for **Programme edit**.

THUMBSTICK (Up/Down/Left Right) Allows you to navigate the on-screen menus and adjust the system settings to your preference.

OK Accepts your selection or displays the current mode.

VOLUME UP/DOWN Adjusts the volume.

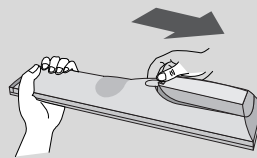
FAV Displays the selected favourite programme.

MUTE Switches the sound on or off.

Programme UP/DOWN Selects a programme.

0~9 number button Selects a programme.
Selects numbered items in a menu.

Installing Batteries



- Open the battery compartment cover on the back side and install the batteries matching correct polarity (+with +,-with -).
- Install two 1.5V AA batteries. Don't mix old or used batteries with new ones.
- Close cover.

WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

TURNING ON THE TV

If your TV will be turned on, you will be able to use its features.

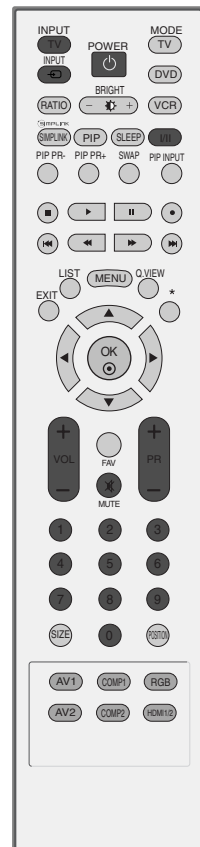
- 1 First, connect power cord correctly.
At this moment, the TV switches to standby mode.
 - In standby mode to turn TV on, press the $\phi/1$, **INPUT**, **PR ▲ / ▼** button on the TV or press the **POWER**, **TV**, **INPUT**, **PR + / -**, **Number(0~9)** button on the remote control and then the TV will switch on.

PROGRAMME SELECTION

- 1 Press the **PR + / -** or **NUMBER** buttons to select a programme number.

VOLUME ADJUSTMENT

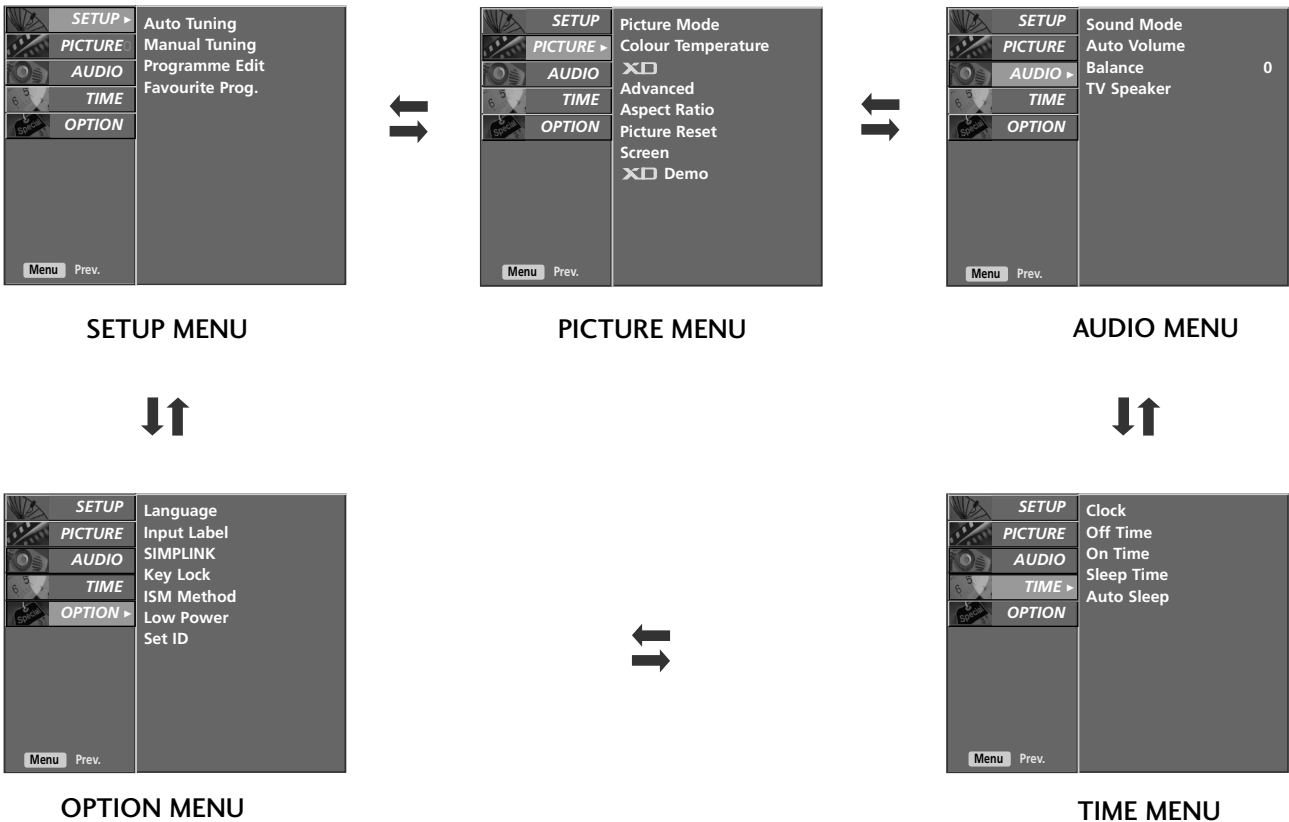
- 1 Press the **VOL + / -** button to adjust the volume.
- 2 If you want to switch the sound off, press the **MUTE** button.
- 3 You can cancel the Mute function by pressing the **MUTE**, **VOL + / -** or **I/II** button.



ON SCREEN MENUS SELECTION AND ADJUSTMENT

Your TV's OSD (On Screen Display) may differ slightly from what is shown in this manual.
The OSD mainly use pictures for the Plasma TV models.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then ▲ / ▼ button to display each menu.
- 2 Press the ► button and then ▲ / ▼ button to select a menu item.
- 3 Change the setting of an item in the sub or pull-down menu with ◀ / ▶ button.
You can move to the higher level menu by pressing the **OK** or **MENU** button.



! NOTE

- a. The OSD (On Screen Display) function enables you to adjust the screen status conveniently since it provides graphical presentation.
- b. In this manual, the OSD (On Screen Display) may be different from your TV's because it is just example to help the TV operation.
- c. In the teletext mode, menus are not displayed

WATCHING TV / PROGRAMME CONTROL

AUTO PROGRAMME TUNING

Up to 200, TV stations can be stored by programme numbers (0 to 199). Once you have preset the stations, you will be able to use the PR + / - or NUMBER buttons to scan the stations you have programmed.

Stations can be tuned using automatic or manual modes.

All stations that can be received are stored by this method. It is recommended that you use auto programme during installation of this set.



1 Press the **MENU** button and then **▲ / ▼** button to select the **SETUP** menu.

TELETEXT

This feature is not available in all countries.

Teletext is a free service broadcast by most TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics.

The teletext decoder of this TV can support the SIMPLE, TOP and FASTEXT systems. SIMPLE (standard teletext) consists of a number of pages which are selected by directly entering the corresponding page number. TOP and FASTEXT are more modern methods allowing quick and easy selection of teletext information.

SWITCH ON/OFF

Press the **TEXT** button to switch to teletext. The initial page or last page appears on the screen.

Two page numbers, TV station name, date and time are displayed on the screen headline. The first page number indicates your selection, while the second shows the current page displayed.

Press the **TEXT** or **EXIT** button to switch off teletext. The previous mode reappears.

SIMPLE TEXT

■ Page selection

- ① Enter the desired page number as a three digit number with the **NUMBER** buttons. If during selection you press a wrong number, you must complete the three digit number and then re-enter the correct page number.
- ② The **PR +/-** button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

TOP TEXT

The user guide displays four fields-red, green, yellow and blue at the bottom of the screen. The yellow field denotes the next group and the blue field indicates the next block.

■ Block / group / page selection

- ① With the blue button you can progress from block to block.
- ② Use the yellow button to proceed to the next group with automatic overflow to the next block.
- ③ With the green button you can proceed to the next existing page with automatic overflow to the next group.
Alternatively the **PR +** button can be used.
- ④ The red button permits to return to previous selection. Alternatively the **PR -** button can be used.


■ Direct page selection

Corresponding to the SIMPLE teletext mode, you can select a page by entering it as a three digit number using the NUMBER buttons in TOP mode.

FASTEXT

The teletext pages are colour coded along the bottom of the screen and are selected by pressing the corresponding coloured button.

■ REVEAL

Press this button to display concealed information, such as solutions of riddles or puzzles.

Press this button again to remove the information from the display.



■ SIZE

Selects double height text.

Press this button to enlarge the top half of the page.

Press this button again to enlarge the bottom half of the page.

Press this button again to return to the normal display.



■ UPDATE

Displays the TV picture on the screen while waiting for the new teletext page. The display will appear at the top left hand corner of the screen. When the updated page is available then display will change to the page number.

Press this button to view the updated teletext page.



■ TIME

When viewing a TV programme, press this button to display the time at the top right hand corner of the screen.

Press this button again to remove the display. In the teletext mode, press this button to select a sub page number. The sub page number is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To hold or change the sub page, press the RED/GREEN, **PR** +/- or NUMBER buttons.

Press again to exit this function.



■ HOLD

Stops the automatic page change which will occur if a teletext page consists of 2 or more sub pages. The number of sub pages and the sub page displayed is, usually, shown on the screen below the time. When this button is pressed the stop symbol is displayed at the top left-hand corner of the screen and the automatic page change is inhibited. To continue press this button again.

APPENDIX

TROUBLESHOOTING

The operation does not work normally.

The remote control doesn't work

- Check to see if there is any object between the product and the remote control causing obstruction.
- Are batteries installed with correct polarity (+ to +, - to -)?
- Correct remote operating mode set: TV, VCR etc.?
- Install new batteries.

Power is suddenly turned off

- Is the sleep timer set?
- Check the power control settings. Power interrupted
- No broadcast on station tuned with Auto off activated.

The video function does not work.

No picture & No sound

- Check whether the product is turned on.
- Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast.
- Is the power cord inserted into wall power outlet?
- Check your antenna direction and/or location.
- Test the wall power outlet, plug another product's power cord into the outlet where the product's power cord was plugged in.

Picture appears slowly after switching on

- This is normal, the image is muted during the product startup process. Please contact your service center, if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.

No or poor colour or poor picture

- Adjust Colour in menu option.
- Keep a sufficient distance between the product and the VCR.
- Try another channel. The problem may be with the broadcast.
- Are the video cables installed properly?
- Activate any function to restore the brightness of the picture.

Horizontal/vertical bars or picture shaking

- Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.

Poor reception on some channels

- Station or cable product experiencing problems, tune to another station.
- Station signal is weak, reorient antenna to receive weaker station.
- Check for sources of possible interference.

Lines or streaks in pictures

- Check antenna (Change the direction of the antenna).

The audio function does not work.

APPENDIX

MAINTENANCE

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the Screen

- 1 Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2 Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the Cabinet

- To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth.
- Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence

CAUTION

- ▶ If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.

PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL

The remote is a multi-brand or a universal remote. It can be programmed to operate most remote-controllable devices of other manufacturers.

Note that the remote may not control all models of other brands.

Programming a code into a remote mode

- 1 Test your remote control.
To find out whether your remote control can operate the component without programming, turn on the component such as a VCR and press the corresponding mode button (such as a **DVD** or **VCR**) on the remote control, while pointing at the component. Test the **POWER** and **PR + / -** buttons to see if the component responds properly. If not, the remote requires programming to operate the device.
- 2 Turn on the component to be programmed, then press the corresponding mode button (such as a **DVD** or **VCR**) on the remote control. The remote control button of desired device is lighted.
- 3 Press the **MENU** and **MUTE** buttons simultaneously, the remote control is ready to be programmed for the code.
- 4 Enter a code number using the number buttons on the remote control. Programming code numbers for the corresponding component can be found on the following pages. Again, if the code is correct, the device will turn off.
- 5 Press the **MENU** button to store the code.
- 6 Test the remote control functions to see if the component responds properly. If not, repeat from step 2.
