GD880 User Guide

Congratulations on your purchase of the advanced and compact GD880 phone by LG, designed to operate with the latest digital mobile communication technology.

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Guidelines for safe and efficient use

Please read these simple guidelines. Not following these guidelines may be dangerous or illegal.

Exposure to radio frequency energy

Radio wave exposure and Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) information. This mobile phone model GD880 has been designed to comply with applicable safety requirements for exposure to radio waves. These requirements are based on scientific guidelines that include safety margins designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

- The radio wave exposure guidelines employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. Tests for SAR are conducted using standardised methods with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all used frequency bands.
- While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various LG phone models, they are all designed to meet the relevant guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

- The SAR limit recommended by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) is 2W/kg averaged over 10g of tissue.
- The highest SAR value for this model phone tested by DASY4 for use at the ear is 1.23 W/kg (10 g) and when worn on the body is 1.10 W/kg(10 g).
- SAR data information for residents in countries/regions that have adopted the SAR limit recommended by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), which is 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1g of tissue.

Product care and maintenance

WARNING

Only use batteries, chargers and accessories approved for use with this particular phone model. The use of any other types may invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.

- Do not disassemble this unit. Take it to a qualified service technician when repair work is required.

Guidelines for safe and efficient use

- Repairs under warranty, at LG's option, may include replacement parts or boards that are either new or reconditioned, provided that they have functionality equal to that of the parts being replaced.
- Keep away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, and personal computers.
- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators or cookers.
- Do not drop.
- Do not subject this unit to mechanical vibration or shock.
- Switch off the phone in any area where you are required by special regulations. For example, do not use your phone in hospitals as it may affect sensitive medical equipment.
- Do not handle the phone with wet hands while it is being charged. It may cause an electric shock and can seriously damage your phone.
- Do not charge a handset near flammable material as the handset can become hot and create a fire hazard.
- Use a dry cloth to clean the exterior of the unit (do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner or alcohol).
- Do not charge the phone when it is on soft furnishings.
- The phone should be charged in a well ventilated area.
- Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke or dust.
- Do not keep the phone next to credit cards or transport tickets; it can affect the information on the magnetic strips.
- Do not tap the screen with a sharp object as it may damage the phone.
- Do not expose the phone to liquid or moisture.
- Use the accessories like earphones cautiously. Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily.

Efficient phone operation

Electronics devices

All mobile phones may get interference, which could affect performance.

- Do not use your mobile phone near medical equipment without requesting permission. Avoid placing the phone over pacemakers, for example, in your breast pocket.

- Some hearing aids might be disturbed by mobile phones.
- Minor interference may affect TVs, radios, PCs, etc.

Road safety

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile phones in the area when you drive.

- Do not use a hand-held phone while driving.
- Give full attention to driving.
- Use a hands-free kit, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.
- RF energy may affect some electronic systems in your vehicle such as car stereos and safety equipment.
- When your vehicle is equipped with an air bag, do not obstruct with installed or portable wireless equipment. It can cause the air bag to fail or cause serious injury due to improper performance.

- If you are listening to music whilst out and about, please ensure that the volume is at a reasonable level so that you are aware of your surroundings. This is particularly imperative when near roads.

Avoid damage to your hearing

Damage to your hearing can occur if you are exposed to loud sound for long periods of time. We therefore recommend that you do not turn on or off the handset close to your ear. We also recommend that music and call volumes are set to a reasonable level.

Glass Parts

Some parts of your mobile device are made of glass. This glass could break if your mobile device is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If the glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by an authorized service provider.

Guidelines for safe and efficient use

Blasting area

Do not use the phone where blasting is in progress. Observe restrictions, and follow any regulations or rules.

Potentially explosive atmospheres

- Do not use the phone at a refueling point.
- Do not use near fuel or chemicals.
- Do not transport or store flammable gas, liquid, or explosives in the same compartment of your vehicle as your mobile phone and accessories.

In aircraft

Wireless devices can cause interference in aircraft.

- Turn your mobile phone off before boarding any aircraft.
- Do not use it on the ground without permission from the crew.

Children

Keep the phone in a safe place out of the reach of small children. It includes small parts which may cause a choking hazard if detached.

Emergency calls

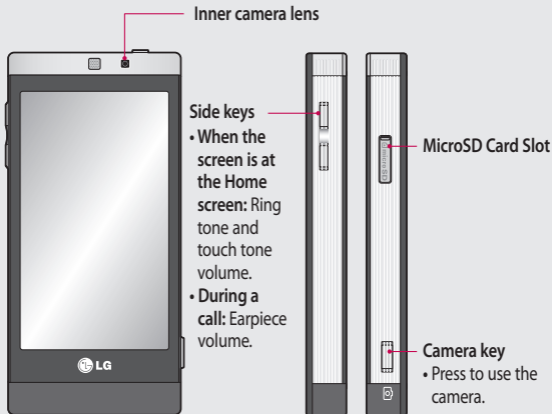
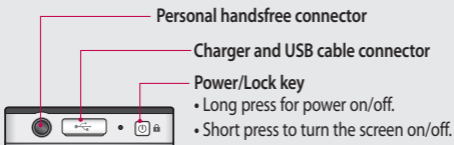
Emergency calls may not be available under all mobile networks. Therefore, you should never depend solely on the phone for emergency calls. Check with your local service provider.

Battery information and care

- You do not need to completely discharge the battery before recharging. Unlike other battery systems, there is no memory effect that could compromise the battery's performance.
- Use only LG batteries and chargers. LG chargers are designed to maximize the battery life.
- Do not disassemble or short-circuit the battery pack.
- Keep the metal contacts of the battery pack clean.
- Replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. The battery pack maybe recharged hundreds of times until it needs replacing.
- Recharge the battery if it has not been used for a long time to maximize usability.

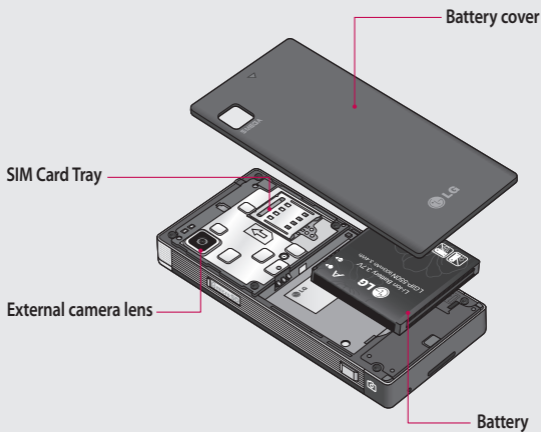
- Do not expose the battery charger to direct sunlight or use it in high humidity, such as in the bathroom.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, this may deteriorate the battery performance.
- There is risk of explosion if the battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
- Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions. Please recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- If you need to replace the battery, take it to the nearest authorized LG Electronics service point or dealer for assistance.
- Always unplug the charger from the wall socket after the phone is fully charged to save unnecessary power consumption of the charger.
- Actual battery life will depend on network configuration, product settings, usage patterns, battery and environmental conditions.

Getting to know your phone

Installing the SIM and battery

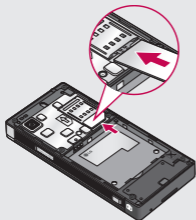
1 Remove the battery cover

Slide the battery cover towards the bottom of the phone and pull it away.



2 Install the SIM card

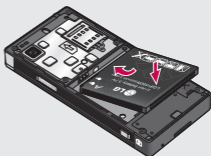
Slide the SIM card into the SIM card holder, making sure that the gold contact area on the card is facing down. Please make sure the battery is removed from the phone before installing the SIM card. To remove the SIM card, pull it out gently.



⚠ WARNING: Do not remove the battery when the phone is switched on, as this may damage the phone.

3 Install the battery

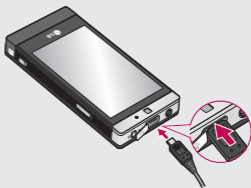
Insert the right side of the battery into the top edge of the battery compartment first. Ensure that the battery contacts align with the phone's terminals. Press the left side of the battery down until it clicks into place.



Charging your phone

Connect the Travel Adapter (Charger) and the included USB cable. Connect the USB cable to the phone and plug it into a power socket. Your GD880 must be charged until the "Battery full" message appears on the screen.

NOTE: The battery must be fully charged initially to improve battery life. Disregard the first "Battery full" message and keep the phone on charge overnight.



Memory card

Installing a memory card

You can expand your phone's memory by using a MicroSD memory card.


NOTE: A memory card is an optional accessory.

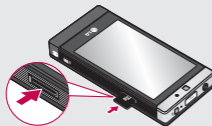
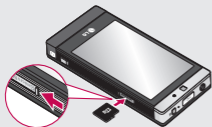
- 1 Slide the slot cover down.
- 2 Put the microSD card into the slot. Make sure the gold contact area is facing down
- 3 Slide the slot cover up.

The GD880 will support up to an 32GB memory card.

Formatting the memory card

Your memory card may already be formatted. If it isn't, you will need to format it before you can use it.

- 1 From the Home screen select , then **Device settings**.
- 2 Touch **Memory info** and scroll down to choose **External memory**.
- 3 Touch **Format** and then confirm your choice.
- 4 Enter the password, if one is set. Your card will then be formatted and ready to use.



Using your touch screen

Touch screen tips

- To select an item, touch the centre of the icon.
- Do not press too hard. The touchscreen is sensitive enough to pick up a light, firm touch.
- Use the tip of your finger to touch the option you require. Be careful not to touch any other keys.
- Whenever your GD880 is not in use, it will return to the lock screen.

Control the touch screen

The controls on the GD880 touch screen change dynamically depending on the task.

Opening Applications

To open any application, simply touch its icon.



Scrolling

Drag from side to side to scroll. On some screens, such as the call history list, you can also scroll up or down.

Your home screen

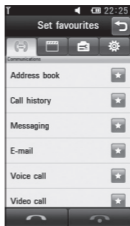
From here you can access all the menu options, make a quick call, view the status of your phone and much more.

You can add favourite menus to the main menu

- 1 Touch  from the home screen.
- 2 If you want to remove a favourite menu, touch  on the upper right of the icon. If you want to add favourite menus to the main menu, touch **Add** on the bottom right of the screen.



- 3 Once you touch **Add**, you can choose between **Widget**, **Bookmarks** or **Shortcut** (If you do not want to add, touch **Cancel**).
- 4 Select a menu you want to add by touching the Star mark on the right side of the menu. The menu will appear on the screen when you return to the previous screen.
- 5 When you are finished, touch **OK**.



Your home screen

Quick keys

The quick keys on your home screen provide easy, one-touch access to the functions you use the most.



Touch to bring up the touch dialling pad to make a call.



Touch to open your **Contacts**. To search for the number you want to call, enter the name of the contact into the Search field at the top of the screen using the touchpad. You can also create new contacts, edit existing ones, etc.




Touch to access the **Messaging** menu. From here you can create a new SMS or MMS or view your message folder.






Touch to open the full **Top menu**.


Multi-tasking function

While you are running an application, touch  to open the Multitasking menu. From here you can view some applications that are running and access them with one touch.

Calls


Making a call

- 1 Touch  from the home screen to open the keypad.
- 2 Key in the number using the keypad.
- 3 Touch  to initiate the call, but if you want to initiate a Video call, touch  then select **Make video call**.
- 4 To end the call, press End call on the bottom of the screen.

TIP! To enter + for making an international call, press and hold .

TIP! Press the power key to lock the touchscreen to prevent making calls by mistake.

Making a call from your contacts

- 1 From the home screen touch  to open your **Contacts**.
- 2 Tap the Search field box on the top of the screen and use the keypad to enter the first few letters of the contact you want to call.
- 3 From the filtered list, touch the Call icon next to the contact you want to call. The call will use the default number if there is more than one for that contact.
- 4 Or you can touch the contact name and select the number to use if there is more than one for that contact.

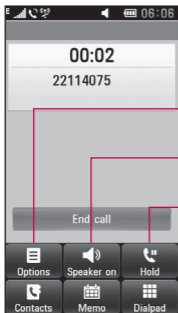
Answering and rejecting a call

When your phone rings, touch **Answer** to answer the call.

To mute the ringing, touch **Silent**.

This is useful if you have forgotten to change your profile to **Silent** for a meeting. Touch **Reject** to reject an incoming call.


In-call options





Options - Touch  to bring up a list of further in-call options.

Speaker - Touch  to turn the speaker phone on.

Hold - Touch  to put a call on hold.

Touch  to open a numerical keypad for making a second call. This function also allows you to navigate menus with numbered options when you dial automated telephone services, such as call centres.

Touch  to add memo during a call.



Touch  to search your contacts during a call.

TIP! To scroll through a list of options or your list of contacts, touch the last item visible and slide your finger up the screen. The list will move up so more items become visible.

Calls



Speed dialling

You can assign a frequently-called contact to a speed dial number.

- 1 Select **Phonebook** and touch  and select **Speed dials**.
- 2 Your voicemail is already set to speed dial 1. You cannot change this. Touch any other number to assign it to a speed dial contact.
- 3 Your **Contact** will open. Select the contact you want to assign to that number by touching the contact's phone number once. To find a contact, tap the **Search** field box and enter the first letter of the contact's name.
- 4 To call a speed dial number, touch  on the home screen then press and hold the assigned number until the contact appears on the screen. The call will initiate automatically, without touching Voice call.


Making a second call

- 1 During your initial call, touch **Dialpad** and type the number you want to call.
- 2 Touch **Voice call** to connect the call.

- 3 Both calls will be displayed on the call screen. Your initial call will be locked and the caller put on hold.
- 4 To change between the calls, touch  or press the number of the held call.
- 5 To end one or both calls, press  and select **End**.

NOTE: You will be charged for each call you make.

Viewing your call logs

Touch **Logs** in the **Main menu** or touch  from your home screen and select any of the options like All logs, missed calls only, calls only, messages only, video calls only, **Favourites**

TIP! Touch any single call log entry to view the date, time and duration of the call.

Using call divert

- 1 Touch **Call settings** in the **Main menu**.
- 2 Touch **Call divert**.
- 3 Choose between **Voice calls** and **Video calls**. You can choose to divert all calls, calls when the line

is busy, when there is no answer or when you cannot be reached.

- 4 Touch **Activate**.
- 5 Choose **To voicemail centre** or **To other number** to enter the new divert number.
- 6 Touch **OK** when you have finished entering the number.

NOTE: Charges are incurred for diverting calls. Please contact your network provider for details.

TIP! To turn off all call diverts, select **Deactivate all** from the **Call divert** menu.

Using call barring

- 1 Touch **Call settings** in the **Main menu**.
- 2 Touch **Call barring**.
- 3 Choose **Voice calls** or **Video calls**. You can turn off all call barring by touching **Deactivate all** from the **Call barring** menu.
- 4 Choose any of the five options:
All outgoing calls
Outgoing international
Outgoing international calls

except home country

All incoming

Incoming when abroad.

Touch **Activate**.

- 5 Enter the call barring password. Please check with your network operator about this service.

TIP! Select **Fixed dial numbers Main menu** to turn on and compile a list of numbers that can be called from your phone.


Using Excuse message

Before you reject an incoming call, you can use “**Excuse messages**” to send a message to explain why you do not receive an incoming call.

Changing the common call setting

- 1 Touch **Call settings** in the **Main menu**.
- 2 Touch **Common settings**. From here you can adjust the settings for:
Call reject - Slide the switch to the left to highlight the **Reject list**. You

can touch the text box to choose all calls, calls from specific contacts or groups, calls from unregistered numbers (those not in your contacts) or calls with no caller ID. Touch  to change the setting.

Send my number - Choose whether your number will be displayed when you call someone.

Show SNS events - Choose whether SNS events will be displayed or not.

Auto redial - Slide the switch left for **ON** or right for **OFF**.

Minute minder - Slide the switch left to **ON** to hear a tone every minute during a call.

BT answer mode - Select **Hands-free** to be able to answer a call using a Bluetooth headset or select **Handset** to answer a call by pressing a key on the handset.

Save new number - Choose whether the **Save new number** function is **ON** or not. Slide the switch left for **ON** or right for **OFF**.

Voice clarity - Choose whether the **Voice clarity** function is **ON** or not. Slide the switch left for **ON** or right for **OFF**.

Changing the Video call settings

1 Touch **Call settings**.

2 Touch **Video call settings**.

From here you can adjust the settings for:

Use private image - Choose whether to use a private image for video calls.

Private image - Choose an image for video calls.

Mirror - Choose whether to use Mirror.

Call costs

View the charges applied to your dialled numbers (this service is network-dependent and some operators cannot support it).

Call durations

View the duration of all your dialled or received calls or both.



Data volume

View the amount in kilobytes of all received or sent data or both.

Contacts

Searching for a contact


There are two ways to search for a contact:

- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **Phonebook** or touch  from the home screen.
- 2 You see a list of contacts. Typing the first letter of a contact's name in the Name field will jump the menu to that alphabetical area of the list.



TIP! The alphabetical keypad is displayed once you tap the Name field.

Adding a new contact

- 1 Touch **Phonebook** and touch **New**.
- 2 Choose whether to save the contact to your **Handset** or **SIM**.
- 3 Enter your first and last name.
- 4 You can enter up to 5 different numbers per contact. Each entry is preset for **Mobile**, **Home**, **Office**, **Pager**, and **Fax**.
- 5 Add an email address.

- 6 Assign the contact to one or more groups. You can assign up to three groups per contact. Choose between **No group**, **Family**, **Colleagues**, **School** and **VIP**.
- 7 You can also add a **Ringtone**, **Vibration**, **Homepage**, **Home address**, **Company name**, **Job title**, **Company address**, **Birthday**, **Anniversary** and **Memo**.
- 8 Touch  to save the contact.
favorite - You can set this contact as favourite by touching the Star mark on the right side of the option.

Creating a group


- 1 Touch **Phonebook**. Touch the down arrow beside **Contacts** and then select **Groups**.
- 2 Touch **New group** or touch  and select **New group**.
- 3 Enter a name for your new group in Group name field. You can also assign a ringtone, vibration and a group image to the group.
- 4 Touch  to save the group.

Contacts

NOTE: If you delete a group, the contacts assigned to that group will not be lost. They will remain in your **Phonebook**.

Changing your contact settings

You can adapt your contact settings to suit your own preferences.

- 1 Touch **Phonebook**, touch , scroll down and select **Contact settings**.
- 2 From here, you can adjust the following settings:
 - Show keypad** - Choose whether the Keypad is displayed.
 - Display name** - Choose the display order of the name.
 - Synchronise contact** - Connect to your server to synchronise your contacts.
 - Copy all** - Copy your contacts from your handset to your SIM or from your SIM to your handset. You can choose one at a time or all at once.

Move all - This works the same way as Copy, but the contacts will only be saved to the location you've moved them to.

Restore contacts - Restores your contacts from the external memory. This option requires external memory.


Clear contacts - Delete all your contacts. Choose between **Handset** and **SIM** and touch **Yes** if you are sure you want to erase your contacts.

Memory info - View information about available memory regarding **Handset**, **USIM** and **USIM e-mail**.


Send all contacts via Bluetooth - Send all of your contacts to another device using Bluetooth. You will be prompted to turn on Bluetooth if you select this option.

Backup contacts - Backup your contacts to the external memory. This option requires external memory.

Viewing information

- 1 Touch **Phonebook**, touch , scroll down and select **Information**.

From here you can view your **Service dial numbers**, your **Own numbers**, your **Memory info** (showing your memory usage) and **My profile**.




TIP! To add your own business card, select **My profile** and enter your details as you would for any contact. Touch  to finish.


Messaging

Messaging

Your GD880 combines SMS and MMS into one intuitive and easy-to-use menu.


Sending a message


- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **Messaging** or touch  from the home screen.
- 2 Touch **Write message**,  and select **Insert** to add an image, video, sound, emoticon, etc.
- 3 Touch **To** to enter the recipient's number or open your contacts or favourites. You can add multiple contacts. When you are finished, touch the message box below to start composing the message text.
- 4 After entering the text, you can send the message by touching **Send SMS/Send MMS** at the top of the message.

 **WARNING:** If an image, video or sound is added to an SMS, it will be automatically converted to an MMS and you will be charged accordingly.

Entering text

Touch  to turn on T9 mode.

Touch  to choose the writing language.

Touch  to change between numbers, symbols and text input.

Function keys enable you to change between capital and lowercase input or write a message in a full screen on the keypad, etc.

T9 mode

The T9 mode uses a built-in dictionary to recognise the words you're writing based on the sequence of keys you've touched. It predicts the word you are inputting and suggests alternatives.

Using templates

Create templates for the SMS and MMS messages you send most often. There are already some templates on the phone, which you can edit.


Using emoticons

Liven up your messages using emoticons. There are some commonly used emoticons already on your phone. You can add a new emoticon by touching **New emoticon**.

Using signatures

Create signatures for the SMS and MMS messages you send most often. When writing a new message, you can enter Signature from Insert->More in option menu.

Changing your text message settings

Touch **Messaging**, touch  and select **Settings**. Select **Text message**. You can make changes to:

Text message centre - Enter the details of your message centre.

Delivery report - Slide the switch left to receive confirmation that your messages were delivered.


Validity period - Choose how long your messages are stored at the message centre.

Message types - Convert your text into **Text, Voice, Fax, X.400** or **E-mail**.

Character encoding - Choose how your characters are encoded. This impacts the size of your messages and therefore the data charges.

Send long text as - Choose to send long messages as **Multiple SMS** or **MMS**.

Changing your multimedia message settings

Touch **Messaging**. Touch  and select **Settings**, then select **Multimedia message**. You can make changes to:

Retrieval mode - Choose between **Home network** or **Roaming network**. If you then choose **Manual**, you will receive only notifications of MMS and you can decide whether to download them in full.

Delivery report - Choose to request and/or allow a delivery report.

Read reply - Choose to request and/or allow a reply.

Priority - Choose the priority level of your MMS (**Low priority, Normal priority, High priority**).

Validity period - Choose how long your message is stored at the message centre.

Slide duration - Choose how long your slides appear on the screen.


Creation mode - Choose your message mode (**Restricted, Warning, Free**).

Messaging

Delivery time - Choose how long to wait before a message is delivered.

Multimedia message centre - Choose one from the list or add a new message centre.

Changing your other settings

Touch **Messaging**. Touch  and select **Settings**.

Videomail/Voicemail - Touch **New profile** to add a new Videomail/Voicemail service. Contact your network operator for more information about the service they provide.


Service message - Choose to receive or block service messages. You can also set your message security by creating lists of trusted and non-trusted senders in the **Service security** option.

Save sent message - Choose whether to save sent messages.


Info. service - Choose whether to turn Cell broadcast on/off and select your channels and languages.

Signatures - Create, edit or delete **Signatures**.

Setting up your e-mail

Touch  from the home screen, scroll to the right and then touch **E-mail**.

If the email account is not set up, touch **Microsoft Exchange, etc.**

If the email account is set up in your phone and you want to add a new email account, touch  and select **New e-mail account**.

E-mail address - Enter the email address.

Password - Enter the account password

Reply email address - Enter the 'reply to' email address.

Outgoing mail server - Enter the outgoing email server address

Incoming mail server - Enter the incoming email server address

Mailbox type - Enter mailbox type POP3 or IMAP4.

Save to server - Choose whether to save your emails on the server.

Copies are always saved for IMAP4 accounts.

Save sent mail into - Select where to save sent emails for IMAP4 mailboxes. For POP3 mailboxes sent mails are always saved to the handset.

Download option - Choose the way to download emails. Choose between Header only or All for POP3, and header only, header + body, or all for IMAP4.

Access point - Choose your Internet access point.

Auto retrieve - Choose whether to retrieve your new emails automatically.

Retrieve only new - Choose whether to discard emails already downloaded previously.

SMTP TLS/SSL - Choose whether to use TLS/SSL for outgoing server.

Incoming TLS/SSL - Choose whether to use TLS/SSL for incoming server.

Retrieve amount - Choose retrieve amount

Advanced settings - Choose whether to use the advanced settings.

SMTP port number - Normally, this will be 25.

Incoming server port - Normally, this is 110 for POP3 accounts and 143 for IMAP4 accounts.

APOP secure login - Choose to activate APOP secure login for a POP3 account. IMAP4 accounts are always set to off.

SMTP authentication - Choose the security settings for the outgoing mail server

SMTP Username - Enter the SMTP username.

SMTP Password - Enter the SMTP password.

Microsoft Exchange e-mail account

E-mail address - Enter the account email address.

Server address - Enter the email server address.

Domain - Enter the account domain.

User name - Enter the account user name.

Password - Enter the account password.

Sync items - Choose whether to use Sync items (**Contacts, Schedules, Tasks**).

Messaging

Retrieving your e-mails


You can automatically or manually check your account for new emails. To check manually:

- 1 Touch **E-mail**.
- 2 Touch the account you want to use.
- 3 Choose **Retrieve new**.

Sending an e-mail using your new account

- 1 Touch **Write e-mail** and a new email will open.
- 2 Enter the recipient's address and write your message. You can also attach images, videos, audio files and other file types.
- 3 Touch **Send email** to send your email.

Changing your e-mail settings

- 1 Touch **E-mail** from the main menu.
- 2 Touch  and select **E-mail settings**, then you can change the following settings:

E-mail account - Select an email account

Allow reply e-mail - Choose to allow the sending of read confirmation messages.

Request reply e-mail - Choose whether to request read confirmation messages.

Include message in fwd & reply - Select whether to include the original message in your reply.

Include attachment - Choose to include the original attachment in any reply.

Auto retrieval while... - Choose whether to retrieve your messages automatically when abroad (roaming).

New e-mail notification - Choose whether to be alerted to new emails.

Signature - Create an email signature.

Priority - Choose the priority level of your email messages.

Maximum receive size - Select the maximum receive size: **100KB, 200KB, 300KB, 500KB, 1MB, 2MB, 2.2MB**.

Getting to know the viewfinder

Zoom - zoom in or zoom out. You can also zoom in or out by pressing the Side keys of the phone.

Exposure - A low contrast image will appear foggy, whereas a high contrast image will appear much sharper.

Taking a quick photo

- 1 Press the  key on the right side of the phone.

After taking a photo


Your captured photo will appear on the screen. The image name is shown on the bottom of the screen with four icons on the right side.

 Touch to use the image as Home screen, Lock screen, Contact, Start-up, Shut down, Outgoing call or Incoming call screens.

 Touch to edit the image using various tools.

 Touch to return to the viewfinder.


 Touch to delete the image.

 Touch to take another photo immediately. Your current photo will be saved.

 Touch to view a gallery of your saved photos.



Using the advanced settings

From the viewfinder, touch  to open all the advanced settings options.

Size - Change the size of the photo to save memory space or take a picture preset to the correct size for a contact. Select a pixel value from the seven numerical options: **5M(2560x1920)**, **3M(2048x1536)**, **2M(1600x1200)**, **1M(1280x960)**, **home screen**, **VGA(640x480)**, **QVGA(320x240)**.

Scene mode - Set the camera to adjust to the environment. Choose from **Auto**, **Night**, **Landscape**, **Portrait** or **Sport**.

ISO - The ISO rating determines the sensitivity of the camera's light sensor. The higher the ISO, the more sensitive the camera will be. This is useful in darker conditions when you can't use the flash. Select the ISO value from **Auto**, **ISO 800**, **ISO 400**, **ISO 200** or **ISO 100**.

White balance - Choose from **Auto**, **Incandescent**, **Fluorescent**, **Sunny** or **Cloudy**.

Colour Effect - Choose a colour tone to apply to the photo you're taking.

There are six colour tone options: **Off**, **Sepia**, **Monochrome**, **Negative**, **Solarize** and **Blue**.

Focus - Select the way the camera will focus. Choose from **Auto focus**, **Manual focus** or **Face tracking**.

Self-timer - The self-timer allows you to set a delay before the camera takes the picture, after the capture button is pressed. Choose from **Off**, **3 seconds**, **5 seconds** or **10 seconds**.

Shot mode - Choose the shot mode from 9 options.

Quality - Choose between **Super fine**, **Fine** and **Normal**. The finer the quality, the sharper a photo will be, but the file size will increase.

Show captured image - Choose to view the picture with options after taking a photo.

Shutter sound - Select one of the three shutter sounds.

Grid screen - Choose from **Off**, **Simple cross** or **Trisection**.

Geo-Tagging - Choose whether to switch on the EXIF information for the photo to write GPS information.

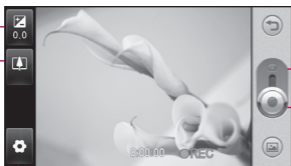

- 4 **REC** will appear at the bottom of the viewfinder with a timer at the bottom showing the length of the video.
- 5 To pause the video, touch  and resume by selecting .
- 6 Touch  on screen or press the camera key on the phone again to stop recording.

After making a video

A still image representing your captured video will appear on the screen. The name of the video will be shown on the bottom of the screen



Touch to send the video as a Message or E-mail or by Bluetooth, Youtube.



Touch to use the video as a voice or video ringtone




Touch to play the video.



Touch to return to the viewfinder.



Touch to delete the video you have just made and confirm by touching **Yes**. The viewfinder will reappear.


Touch  to shoot another video right away.



Touch to view a gallery of saved videos and images.



Using the advanced settings

From the viewfinder, touch  to open all the advanced settings options.

Refer to the advanced settings for the Camera.

Video size - Select Video size: **VGA(640x480)**, **QVGA(320x240)**, **QCIF(176X144)**.


Recording mode - Set a duration limit for your video: **Normal**, **MMS**.

Audio - Choose whether to mute (record a video without sound) or to unmute to include the sound.

Show recorded video - Choose to view the video with options after taking a video.

Viewing your photos and videos


- 1 Scroll and touch **Gallery** in the **Main menu** or touch  on your camera preview screen.
- 2 Your gallery will appear on the screen.
- 3 Touch the video or photo to open it fully.

TIP! Flick left or right to view other photos or videos.

Capturing an image from a video



- 1 Select the video you would like to capture an image from.
- 2 Touch the centre of the screen to bring up the play options, then touch  to pause the video on the frame you'd like to convert to an image and touch the upper left of the screen to open the  menu.

- 2 The slideshow will begin.
- 3 You can open menus such as Duration, Transition, etc. by tapping  during the slide show.

Setting a photo as wallpaper

Editing your photos

 Adding texts to a picture. You can choose the text box and the colours of the box and text.

 Erase the drawings you made on the picture. You can choose the size of eraser to use.

 Touch to open further effect options including **Rotate**.

 Touch to apply the effect options to a photo.

Adjustment This helps to adjust a picture taken using Brightness or Contrast.

 Touch to return to the gallery.

Save Save the changes you made to your phone. You can save the edited photo with another name.

Undo Erase the editing you did on the photo.

Send via Select to send the edited pictures as **Message**, **E-mail** or **Bluetooth**.





Multimedia

You can store any multimedia files on your phone's memory to have easy access to all your pictures, sounds, videos and games. You can also save your files to a memory card. Using a memory card allows you to free up space in your phone's memory. select My Stuff from the main menu. You can open a list of the folders that store all your multimedia files.

Pictures


Images contains a list of pictures including default images preloaded onto your phone, images downloaded by you and images taken on your phone's camera.

Sending a photo


- 1 Touch  from the home screen, touch **My stuff** and select **Images**. Select the picture you want and touch .
- 2 Touch **Send Via** and choose **Message, E-mail, Bluetooth**.

Using an image

You can choose images to use as wallpaper, for the lock screen and to identify callers.

- 1 Touch **My stuff** in the **Main menu** and select **Images**. Select the picture you want and touch .
- 2 Touch **Set as** and choose from: **Homescreen image, Lockscreen image, Contact image, Start up image, Shutdown image, Outgoing call image, Incoming call image**


Printing an image

- 1 Touch **My stuff** and select **Image**. Select the picture you want and touch .
- 2 Touch **Print** then choose between **PictBridge** and **Bluetooth**.

TIP! You can print via Bluetooth or by connecting to a PictBridge compatible printer.

Moving or copying an image

You can move or copy an image between the phone memory and the memory card. You might want to do this to free some space in one of the memory banks or to preserve your images.

- 1 Touch **My stuff** from the main menu. select **Images** and touch .
- 2 Select **Move** or **Copy**.
- 3 You can mark/unmark an image by tapping it sequentially. Mark the image that you want to move or copy and touch **Copy/Move**.


Sounds

Sounds contains a list of sounds including downloaded sounds, default sounds and voice recordings. From here you can manage or send sounds or set them as ringtones.

Videos shows a list of downloaded videos and videos you have recorded on your phone.

Watching a video

- 1 Touch **My stuff** in the **Main menu** and select **Videos**.
- 2 Select a video to play.

- 1 Select a video.
- 2 Touch  and then touch **Send via**. Choose from **Message**, **E-mail** or **Bluetooth**.

Flash contents

The **Flash contents** folder contains all downloaded SWF and SVG files.

- 1 Touch **My stuff** in the **Main menu** and select **Flash contents**.
- 2 Select the file you want to view.

Documents

From the **Documents** folder in **My stuff**, you can view all your document files. From here, you can view your Excel, PowerPoint, Word, Text and pdf files.

Other content

Other content contains a list of files that are not pictures, sounds, videos, documents, games or applications.

Games

You can install new games on your phone to enjoy when you have spare time.

You can also access this using the **Games & Apps** menu in the **Main** menu.

Playing a game

- 1 Touch **Games & Apps** from the main menu.
- 2 Select Games, then choose a game to launch.

Transferring a file to your phone

Bluetooth is probably the easiest way of transferring a file from your computer to your phone. You can also use the LG PC Suite via your sync cable.

To transfer using Bluetooth:

- 1 Make sure your phone and computer have Bluetooth switched on and are visible to one

another.

- 2 Use your computer to send the file via Bluetooth.
- 3 When the file is sent you will have to accept it on your phone by touching **Yes**.
- 4 The file should appear in your Image folder if it is an image file and in the Sound folder if it is a music file.

Music

Your LG GD880 has a built-in music player so you can play all your favourite tracks. To access the music player, touch **Music**. From here, you can access a number of folders located at the top of the screen:

Playlist - Contains all the playlists you have created.

Transferring music to your phone

The easiest way to transfer music to your phone is via Bluetooth or your sync cable.

You can also use LG PC Suite. To transfer using Bluetooth:

- 1 Make sure both devices have Bluetooth switched on and can see each other.
- 2 Select the music file on the other device and choose to send it via Bluetooth.
- 3 When the file is ready to be sent, you should accept it on your phone by touching **Yes**.

- 4 The file should appear in **Music > All tracks**.

Playing a song

Multimedia

Searching for stations

You can tune your phone to radio stations by searching for them either manually or automatically. They will then be saved to specific channel numbers, so you don't have to keep re-tuning. You must first attach the headset to the phone as this acts as the antenna.

To tune automatically:

Touch  and touch **Auto-scan**.

A confirmation message appears.

Select **Yes**, then the stations will be automatically found and allocated to a channel in your phone.


NOTE: You can also manually tune to a station by using the wheel displayed next to the radio frequency.

A social network service focuses on building and reflecting a social network or social relationship among people who share interests and/or activities.


Facebook

Facebook is a social networking website.


- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **Facebook**.

Twitter

Twitter is a free social networking and micro-blogging service.

- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **Twitter**.

Settings



- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **SNS settings**.
- 2 Turn on Social networking. If you have an account related to social networking, the account is displayed. Touch the account, then touch **Import friends** to add your friend contact to your phone.

- 3 If you have no account, touch **New account**, then create your account.




NOTE: You will incur an extra cost by connecting to this service. Check the data charges with your network provider.

Organiser



Adding an event to your calendar

- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch Organiser.
- 2 Select the date you would like to add an event to.
- 3 Touch  and touch New schedule or simply touch New schedule at the bottom of the screen.
- 4 Touch Category then choose from Appointment, Anniversary or Birthday.
- 5 Enter Subject.
- 6 Check and enter the date and the time you would like your event to begin. For Appointment and Anniversary enter the time and date your event finishes in the lower two time and date boxes. Enter the location if it is an Appointment.
- 7 Set Alarm and Repeat.
- 8 Select Save and your event will be saved in the calendar. A square cursor will mark the day that any events have been saved to and a bell will ring at the start time of your event, so that you can stay organised.


Adding an item to your to do list

- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **Tasks** in the **Main menu**.
- 2 Touch  and touch **New task** or simply touch **New task** at the top of the screen.
- 3 Set the date for the task, add notes and select a priority level: **High**, **Normal** or **Low**.
- 4 Save your task by touching .


Adding a memo

- 1 Touch  from the home screen and then touch **Memo** in the **Main menu**.
- 2 Touch  and then **New memo**. Or simply touch **New memo** at the top of the screen.

DivX Converter

Install the DivX converter, which is supplied on the same CD as the PC Sync software DivX will convert media files on your PC to a format that lets you upload them and view them on your phone.

Once installed, select **DivX** from the Program Files on your PC, then **DivX converter** followed by Converter.

Use the arrows in the application to change the conversion format

to Mobile. If you right click on the application box and select **Preferences**, you can change the location where the converted files are saved.

Drag and drop the files into the application for initial analysis. Then select **Convert** for the process to begin. When the process is complete a Conversion complete pop up will be displayed.

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OSP (On Screen Phone)

Connecting your phone and PC

Controlling your phone
