How to insert SIM Card

Before Use

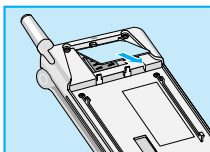
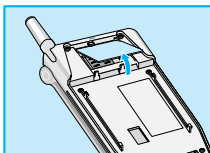


1. Switch off the phone and push up the attached separation button, while pulling the battery to separate it from the phone. (A sudden cutoff may cause malfunction.)



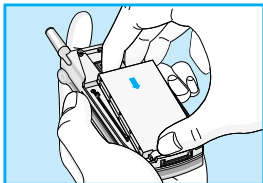
2. Insert the SIM card into the SIM card holder. Make sure that the SIM card is inserted properly and that the golden contact area on the card is facing downwards.

To remove the SIM card, hold down the side of the SIM card toward the top of the phone and slightly lift the opposite side of the SIM card.

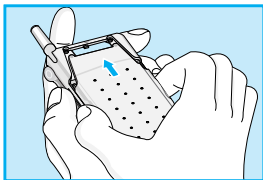


How to install Battery

Before Use



1. Position the bottom of battery to the lower cut of the phone, then push it until you hear a click.

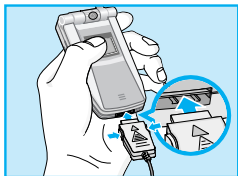


2. Properly adjust the battery cover and push it in.

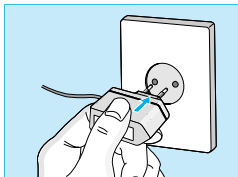
How to charge the Battery

Before Use

To connect the travel adapter to the phone, you must have installed the battery.



1. Insert one end of the travel adapter into the bottom of the phone.



2. Connect the other end of the travel adapter to an AC wall outlet.
Use only the included packing charger.

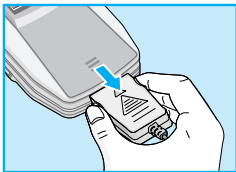


Warning

- Do not force the connector as this may damage the phone and/or the travel adapter.

How to disconnect the charger

Before Use



Disconnect the travel adapter from the phone by pressing its side buttons.

! Notice

- The battery delivered with your phone has to be fully charged before using it.
- Do not remove your battery or the SIM card while charging.
- The moving bars of battery icon will stop after charging completely.
- On charging the phone, you can check the status of battery by the color of the indicator LED.
[Full charge: Blue, In progress of charging: Red]

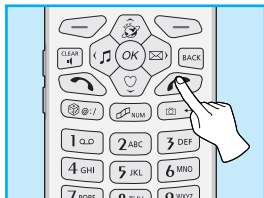
! Note

- In case of not charging the battery properly...
 1. After switching On/Off Power key, please try to recharge it.
 2. In case of the battery is attached, please detach it from the phone. And then place it back, please try to recharge it.

If you experience malfunction while your phone is in use, or your phone would not switch off, remove and reinsert the battery to switch it on.



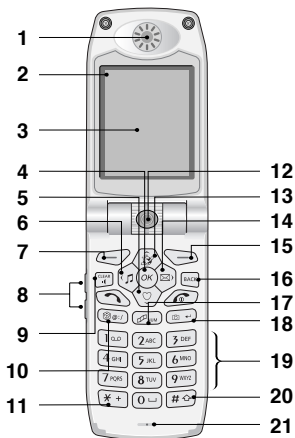

Viewing Menu



1. Open folder and press  [Menu] key.
2. Press  or  key to select the menu desired, and press  [OK] key to execute. You could also directly execute the menu desired by pressing the corresponding number of the menu.
3. Press  to move to the preceding phase, and press  to return to the Standby Display.

Making a Call

Making a voice call





1. Enter telephone numbers with area code at the Standby mode.
2. After entering the numbers, press  key to make the call.
3. Telephone numbers, name, current time, call duration time are presented on the display.
4. After making the call, press  key or close the folder to end the call.

Making an international call




1. Press  key two times in sequence or hold this key for a long time until display “+”.
2. Enter the phone number.
3. Press  [Send] key.

! REFERENCE




• Entering and Saving Numbers

- Shortly pressing  key while entering numbers will delete numbers sequentially from the last, and long pressing will delete all numbers.
- Pressing  or  key while entering numbers will move to the Standby Display.
- Press  [Save] to save the numbers you entered at the Contacts Registration Display.

• Use Recent calls to Make a Call





- Shortly press  key from the Standby Display and select a number from the Recent Call List, then press  key to make a call.
- Long press  key from the Standby Display to dial the latest call you made or received.

• Conveniently Make a Call

- Use speed dials saved in speed dial from the Standby Display to make a call or write a message to send.
- Press  [Search] key from the Standby Display to search for a telephone number, then press  key to make a call.
- Pressing  [Search] key while the phone is in use will enable search for other contacts; however, a call cannot be made from the searched number.


Receiving a Call

Receiving a Voice Call

1. In case Folder open is set in answer mode, you can get a call by opening a folder, or you can do it by pressing any keys except  and  when the folder is already opened.
2. If you set Send key in answer mode, you can get a call only by pressing .
3. After the call, press  key to end the call, unless the other party disconnects the call before you to end the call.

Checking missed call




You can check the number list of missed calls.

1. Missed Call and the number of missed calls are expressed in the external LCD.
2. Opening the folder will prompt contents of the missed calls and will move to the Recent Calls.
3. Select missed calls from the Last Call List and press  [Detail] key to view the caller, telephone numbers and time call received. (Refer to 10. Last Call List)


How to use Hotkeys

Use speed dials from the Standby mode to move all menus fast.
(Refer to Key description.)


View Menu

Press  [Menu] key from the standby mode to move to Menu, then press  or  key to execute various menus.



Searching Contacts

Press  [Search] key from the standby mode to search for telephone numbers from Contacts and address for sending message. If you long press the key, Voice dial functions. When you long press the key, "Say the name after hearing 'Beep' sound" is displayed. Say the name you want to make a call after hearing 'beep' sound.


Accessing Internet

Press  key from the standby mode to move to the Internet Menu, where access to Internet is available. If you long press the key, the phone attempts to access Home.


Message Menu

Shortly press  key from the standby mode will directly move to the Menu. Long press  key will directly move to the Write Message display, allowing you to write a message immediately. If you long press the key, the phone moves to SMS write.

My Menu

Press  key from the standby mode to directly move to My Menu, where you can add, delete, or edit the menu you desire.


Ring Tone Setting

Press  key from the standby mode to move directly to the Ring tone Setting, where you can change Ring tone. If you long press the key, Quiet profile is activated.


Games

Press <game> key to directly move to Games menu.


Multimedia

Press  key from the standby mode to directly move to the VOD Menu, where you can access VOD service and play video.

Camera

Press  key from the standby mode to directly move to the Camera Mode, where you can take pictures, record videos, and recognize the color code.

Voice Recording

Press  key at the upper portion of the phone from the standby mode to immediately record voice.

How to read received Messages

Icon and letters alerting the message arrival will be expressed in the external LCD. Reading incoming messages will depend upon how you preset, and you can change alerting mechanism under Settings [Menu 1-5].

How to change Display Theme

You can change Clock mode, Image and animation of Display Theme.



1. To change 'Time' or 'Date format', select 'Phone' from the Settings menu.
2. To change Clock mode(Analog,Digital,Dual,Normal) or 'Display Theme', select 'Display' from the Settings menu and select 'Screen theme'.
3. If you select 'Image gallery' from Multimedia, you can change Display Theme into Image or Animation.

REFERENCE

- In 'Screen theme' menu, you can also change the themes of Incoming/Outgoing call, Power On/Off.



How to adjust Keypad tone

Use side keys from the standby mode to adjust volume.

1. Press  key on the side of the phone from the standby mode to increase the volume.
2. Press  key on the side of the phone from the standby mode to reduce the volume.

How to record a voice



In a standby mode, you can record a voice by pressing .

1. If you press  shortly, the menu is moved to **Voice recorder**.
2. If you press  for a long time, you can record a voice directly.

Recent Calls




You can read and save the latest missed, and received calls.

Read Call List


1. Shortly press  key from the Standby Display.
2. Select the item to read from the Last Call List, then press  [Detail] key.
3. Read the caller, telephone numbers, and the time call received.

Saving Phone Numbers




You can save unregistered telephone numbers from the Last Call List.

1. Select the unregistered telephone numbers from the Last Call List, then press  [Save] key.
2. Select **New name** by pressing  [Option], to register a new name, then select icon to move to the Contact Registration display.
3. Select **Existing Name** by pressing  [Option] and register in Contacts through the Name Search Display to register under an existing name.
4. After registration, return to the Last Call List.

Deleting Call List

1. Select the item you desire to delete from the Call List, then press  [Option] key.
2. Select **Delete** to delete the item you selected.
3. Select **Delete All** to delete the entire items.

You can use your phone to send short messages, multimedia messages, and E-mail. You can also manage the received messages.

Write [Menu 1-1]

You can write a multimedia message, email, or short message to send or save as draft.

SMS

1. Select a **SMS** from Write message and press [OK].
2. Select **SMS** from among the types of messages to send, then press [OK].
3. Select [Option] and select **Template, Emoticon** to use the stored sentences or emoticon while writing a message.
4. You can select picture, animation or sound by pressing [Option] and [Attach].
5. After entering all items, press [Ok] to move to **To Field**.
6. You can input phone numbers under **To Field** and recall the phone numbers from **Phonebook** by pressing [Search].
7. Select [Done] after inputting phone numbers.
8. Select **Send message** and press [OK].
9. Select **Save to draft** and press [OK] to save in **Draft box**.
10. If message sending is completed, your phone asks whether you will store the edited message.
11. Press Yes if you want to store it.



MMS

1. Select **MMS** from the list of messages to send, then press [OK].
2. Select a format from the list to send, then press [OK].
3. Input phone numbers to To and press [Down] key. You can enter more than 1 recipient, and either directly enter or press [Search].
4. Select **Title** to enter title.
5. Select **Message**, then write a message.
6. To attach an image, select Image and select the image from the list of images to send, then press [OK] key.
7. To attach a music file, select **Audio**, and select the music file from the list of music files to send, then press [OK] key.
8. To attach a movie file, select Video and select the video file from the list of video files to send, then press [OK] key.
9. After entering all items, press [Done] key to send the multimedia message or save temporarily. To view before sending your message, select **Preview**.

What is a Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS)?

- Multimedia Message is defined as a messaging service to send or receive messages by multimedia after coordinating character, photograph, audio and video. If you compose the message, select the template and insert multimedia objects to it. Its composition differs by the format of the message desired to be sent in terms of time and space.



E-mail

1. Select **E-mail** from the list of **Write**, then press [OK] key.
2. Enter email address or telephone numbers under **To**, then press [OK] key. You can use e-mail addresses and telephone numbers saved in Phone book.
3. Select **Title** to enter title.
4. Select **Message** to write a message.
5. Select **Attachment** to attach files. Press [search] and select **Video**, **Audio**, **Image**, or **Voice** files.
6. After entering all items, press [Done] key to send the email or save temporarily.









How to Use T9

T9 allows you to input text quickly.




Unlike in T9, you only need to press the key with the corresponding letter once. This is based on a built-in dictionary to which you can also add new words.

• Writing words by using T9.





1. Start writing a word by using the keys  to . Press each key only once for one letter.

To write for instance 'girl', press , , , . The characters that you enter appear blocked.

The word changes after each keystroke. Therefore you shouldn't pay too much attention to how the word appears on the display until you have pressed all the appropriate keys.

To delete a character to the left, press . To change the character case, press . To insert several numbers, press and hold  and key in the numbers.



Alternatively : Press  [Symbol] and select insert symbol. Select the desired character and press .

2. When you have finished writing the word, check that the word is correct.
If the word is correct : Press  and write the next word.
If the word is not correct : Search by scrolling with , .
3. To insert a punctuation mark, press  repeatedly until the desired mark appears.







• Adding a new word in the dictionary

When no word is blocked, you can add a new word in the dictionary in the following key:

1. Press  [option] and select Insert word.
2. Key in the word by using the T9 and press  [OK].

• Changing the language or turning T9 off

1. In the **Write** menu, press  [Option].
2. Select **Dictionary** and press  [OK].
3. If you want to change the language used in T9, select the desired language and press  [OK].
If you want to set T9 off, select **Dictionary off** Dictionary off and press  [OK].



Inbox [Menu 1-2]

Allows you to get Message alert which inform you that you have received a message or allows to receive and save or delete the message. In the case of SMS, it shows you the notification messages or receiving message lists that let you know successful delivery. View, Delete, Reply, Sending are available.

SMS

• Read message

1. Select the desired message from Inbox, and press [OK].
2. You can view a long message by scrolling with , . If you press , , you can view the contained contents. The phone can play sound if you select Sound icon. Press [Option] to save the desired contents and you can use the contents when making a message later.





• Read message option menu

1. **Reply** : Replies immediately after viewing the message.
2. **Forward** : Forwards a selected message to the other party.
You can modify the message.
3. **Get number**: If the selected message has the phone numbers (more than 3 figures), you can extract and save it in Phonebook. Also, you can call by this number.
4. **Delete** : Deletes the message.

• Option menu

Press  [Option] from Inbox.

1. **Multiple delete** : Press  key to select one or multiple messages, then press  [Delete] key to delete the selected messages.
2. **Delete All** : After entering Security code, the phone deletes all the messages in the inbox.
3. **Delete** : Deletes the message.



MMS

• Read message

1. Select **Message alert** from Inbox, and press . Then, the phone will show the lists of **Delivery report**.
2. Press [Retrieve] to receive the desired message and show it. Press [Stop] to pause, and press [Play] to resume.
3. Press [Delete] to erase the desired message .

• Read message option menu

1. **Reply** : Replies immediately after viewing the message.
2. **Forward** : Forwards a selected message to the other party.
You can modify the message.
3. **Get number** : If the selected message has the phone numbers (more than 3 figures), you can extract and save it in Phonebook. Also, you can call by this number.
4. **Save address** : Saves the phone number or e-mail address of a sender in Phonebook.
5. **Delete** : Deletes the selected message.



• Option menu

Press [Option] key from the **Inbox**.


1. **Multiple delete** : Press key to select one or multiple messages, then press key to delete the selected messages.
2. **Delete All** : After entering Security code, deletes all the messages in the inbox.
3. **Information** : Shows the size of the attachment file and the time when a message was received.
4. **Delete** : Deletes the message.

E-mail

1. Select **Option** and select **Get e-mail list**.
2. When you have several registered Email accounts, you can select an account.
3. Only mail headers will be received.
4. Press to view the details of the mail headers. Or press [Receive] to receive the mail contents.
5. Press [Option] and select [Delete] to erase e-mail in e-mail server and the Phone simultaneously.
6. Press [Reply] to reply to the sender.
7. If there is an attached file, put cursor on it and press to open it. (jpg, gif, mp4 is available)



• Option menu

Press  [Option] key from the Inbox.

1. **Delete** : Deletes the selected message.
2. **Delete all** : Deletes only e-mails in Inbox. E-mails in your phone are all deleted.
3. **Get email list** : Only mail headers will be received.





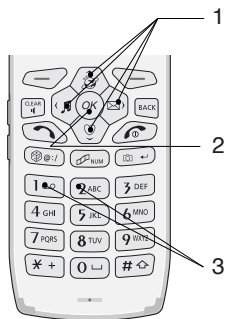
