



MP3/WMA music file requirement

MP3/WMA file compatibility with this unit is limited as follows.

- Sampling frequency: within 32 to 48 kHz (MP3), within 32 to 48 kHz (WMA)
- Bit rate: within 32 to 320 kbps (MP3), 40 to 192 kbps (WMA)
- Maximum files: Under 999
- Maximum folders: Under 99
- File extensions: ".mp3"/".wma"
- CD-ROM file format: ISO 9660/ JOLIET
- We recommend that you use Easy-CD Creator, which creates an ISO 9660 file system.
- You have to set the disc format option to [Mastered] in order to make the discs compatible with the LG players when formatting rewritable discs. When setting the option to Live File System, you cannot use it on LG players. (Mastered/Live File System: Disc format system for Windows Vista)

Compatible USB Devices

- MP3 Player: Flash type MP3 player.



- If you use a USB extension cable or USB hub, the USB device is not recognized.
- Using NTFS file system is not supported. (Only FAT(16/32) file system is supported.)
- This unit is not supported when the total number of files is 1 000 or more
- External HDD, Card readers, Locked devices, or hard type USB devices are not supported.
- USB port of the unit cannot be connected to PC. The unit cannot be used as a storage device.
- Some USB may not work with this unit.

- Connect the power cord to wall outlet directly if possible. Or when you use an extension cable, it is highly recommended to use an extension cable of 110 V / 15 $\,\mathrm{A}$ or 230 V / 15 A, otherwise the unit may not operate properly because of the lack of power supply.
- Do not overload the extension cord with excessive electrical load.




Connecting to speakers

Connect the black stripe of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).



Attaching the high channel speakers to the unit

- 1. Loosen the knob by turning it counterclockwise.
- 2. Insert the bare part of the wire into the hole in side of each terminal.
- 3. Tighten the knob by turning it clockwise to secure the wire.

Attaching the low channel speakers to the unit

Caution


- Do not try to lift the speaker alone. It needs two persons to lift the speaker. Otherwise it may result in the speaker malfunction and cause personal injury and/or property damage.
- When you connect the speakers to the unit, make sure to connect the speaker's cable and plug to the corresponding speaker terminal.
- The speakers must be placed at a distance of about 20 cm from the unit for preventing the vibration caused by the speakers.



- Check the volume level before playing music to prevent infirm, child, and pregnant women from being shocked by the sudden and loud sound from the unit.
- Do not use the unit in a limited space. It may damage a person's hearing. It is recommended to use it in a wide space.
- Be careful to make sure children not to put their hands or any objects into the *speaker
 - *Speaker duct: A hole for plentiful bass sound on speaker cabinet (enclosure).
- The speakers contain magnet parts, so color irregularity may occur on the TV screen or PC monitor screen. Please use the speakers far away from either TV screen or PC
- Make sure to install the speaker with other people in order to prevent it from falling and causing injuries to the installer.

Attaching the speaker light cables to the unit

To connect the speaker light cable to the unit. insert the cable to **SPEAKER LIGHT** connectors on the unit.





- Make sure arrows on the ends of cables should be toward the to upper side.
- Make sure to connect the cables to connectors tightly on the unit.




Optional Equipment Connection

AUX IN Connection


Connect an output of auxiliary device(Camcoder, TV, Player, etc) to the **AUX IN** (L/R) connector.

If your device has only one output for audio(mono), connect it to the left (white) audio jack on the unit.



PORT. IN Connection

Connect an output (earphone or line out) of portable device (MP3 or PMP etc) to the **PORT. IN** connector.



Listening to music from your portable player or external device

The unit can be used to play the music from many types of portable player or external device.

1. Connect the portable player to the PORT. IN connector of the unit.





Antenna Connection

Connect the supplied FM antenna for listening to the radio.

Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna. After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it horizontal.

Basic Operations

CD/USB Operations

- 1. Insert the disc by pressing $\triangle(\triangle)$ or connect the USB device to the USB port.
- 2. Select the CD or USB function by pressing CD or **USB** on the unit or **FUNCTION** on the remote control.

- When you play JUKE BOX list, only REPEAT TRACK and REPEAT ALL are available.
- Even after restarting the unit or switching one function to another, you can listen to music from the point where it's last been played.
- The next file name is displayed every 30 seconds. (Except RANDOM play, AUTO DJ RANDOM play, the last file of playlist, etc.)
- If you leave the disc tray open for 5 minutes, it will close automatically.

Selecting a folder and an MP3/WMA file

On the unit

- 1. Press FOLDER and rotate FILE SEARCH until a desired folder appears.
- 2. Press ENTER and rotate FILE SEARCH until a desired file appears. Press > 11 to play it.

On the remote control

- 1. Press **PRESET·FOLDER** Λ/V repeatedly until a desired folder appears.
- 2. Press ►/II to play it. The first file of folder will play.



• CD / USB Folders/Files are recognized as below



- If there is no file in a folder, the folder will not appear.
- Folders will be presented as the following order: $ROOT \rightarrow FOLDER 1 \rightarrow FOLDER 3 \rightarrow FOLDER$ 7 → FOLDER 8 → FOLDER 5 → FOLDER 6
- File will be played from lambda file No.1 to lambda file No.14 one by one.
- Files and folders will be presented in order recorded and may be presented differently according to the record circumstances.
- *ROOT: The first screen you can see when a computer recognize the USB is "ROOT".

Deleting an MP3/WMA file

You can delete file, folder or format by pressing **DELETE**. This function is supported only in stop status. (USB only)

- 1. -Select the file you want to delete and press DELETE.
 - -Select the folder you want to delete by pressing **FOLDER** and rotating **FILE SEARCH** and press **DELETE**.
 - -Press and hold **DELETE** to format the USB device

Press **DELETE** repeatedly during selecting the MP3/WMA file.

The display changes in the following order.

- DEL EILE? : Deletes file
- DEL FOLDER: Deletes folder
- FORMAT?: Formats USB
- 2. To delete file/folder or format, press ▶/**II** on the remote control or press **>II** on the unit.
- 3. If you want to exit the current mode, press ■ ENTER on the remote control or press □ on the unit.

Caution

- Do not extract the USB device during operation. (play, delete, etc.)
- Regular back up is recommended to prevent data loss.
- The delete function may not be supported according to the USB status. (lock, etc.)

Playback effect

The unit supports various sound and playback effects: SMART DJ, AUTO DJ, DJ EFFECT, and JUKE BOX playback.

SMART DJ playback

SMART DJ plays music with various sound and playback effects: auto effect, cross fade, back spin, loop, beat box, and voice sampling.

It plays repeatedly all the music in the USB device and gives various effects randomly.

You can enjoy it with 2 types of genre: ELECTRO and HOUSE. Press SMART DJ repeatedly. The display window changes each time you press **SMART DJ** as followings: SMART DJ OFF -> SMART DJ ELECTRO -> SMART DJ HOUSE.

To cancel it, press **SMART DJ** repeatedly until "SMART DJ OFF" appears on the display window. You can listen to music as usual.

Adjusting the effect level

You can adjust SMART DJ effect sound level between LOW, MIDDLE, and HIGH. As the effect level moves from LOW to HIGH, SMART DJ effect appears more frequently and makes the sound feel more powerful.

On SMART DJ mode, press **DJ LEVEL** repeatedly on the unit or **EFFECT LEVEL +/-** on the remote control. The display window changes as followings: MIDDLE -> HIGH -> LOW.

- SMART DJ is supported only on USB function.
- You can identify the effect by hearing the sound, not by display window.
- It is recommended to play only electronic and house music on SMART DJ mode. SMART DJ is optimized to enjoy electronic and house music.
- If the function changes to the others or turn off and on the unit on SMART DJ mode, SMART DJ will be turned off.
- If you record your music you are listening to on SMART DJ mode, SMART DJ will be turned off and the music will be recorded without any sound effect.
- If SMART DJ is turned off, you should turn it on again to enjoy the effect.
- It is impossible to operate SMART DJ and AUTO DJ at the same time. If you select one, another will be turned off automatically.







DJ effect

It allows you to enjoy DJ effect such as scratch sound and several kinds of voices yourself.

 Press DJ EFFECT on the unit. The display window changes each time you press DJ EFFECT as followings: OFF -> SCRATCH -> VOICE 1 -> VOICE 2 -> VOICE 3.

| Display Window | Description |
|-------------------|--|
| SCRATCH | You can hear two kinds of scratch sound depending on the direction in which you turn DJ EFFECT CONTROL . |
| VOICE 1/2/3 | You can hear only one kind of the sound regardless of the direction in which you turn DJ EFFECT CONTROL . |

2. Turn **DJ EFFECT CONTROL** clockwise or counterclockwise during playback.

To cancel it, press **DJ EFFECT** until "DJ EFFECT OFF" appears on the display window.

AUTO DJ playback

Auto DJ blends the end of one song into the beginning of another for seamless playback. It equalizes volume across tracks/files for uninterrupted playback.

Press **AUTO DJ** on the remote control or unit repeatedly, the display changes as followings. RANDOM (AUTO DJ RANDOM) -> REPEAT ALL (AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL) -> (AUTO DJ OFF)

Operating



JUKE BOX Playback (Program play)

Bluetooth Profiles

In order to use Bluetooth wireless technology, devices must be able to interpret certain profiles. This unit is compatible with following profile. A2DP (Advanced Audio Distribution Profile)

Listening to music stored on the Bluetooth devices

Before you start the pairing procedure, make sure the Bluetooth feature is turned on in to your Bluetooth device. Refer to your Bluetooth device's user guide. Once a pairing operation is performed, it does not need to be performed again.

- 1. Select the Bluetooth function by using the FUNCTION or BLUETHOOTH/AUX/PORT.IN. "BT READY" appears on the display window.
- 2. Operate the Bluetooth device and perform the pairing operation. When searching for this unit with the Bluetooth device, a list of the devices found may appear in the Bluetooth device display depending on the type of Bluetooth device. Your unit appears as "LG AUDIO CM9730".
- 3. Enter the PIN code. PIN code: 0000
- 4. When this unit is successfully connected with your Bluetooth device, "PAIRED" will appear on the display window and bluetooth indicator will be lit up.



Depending on the Bluetooth device type, some device have a different pairing way.

5. Listen to music.

To play a music stored on your Bluetooth device, refer to your Bluetooth device's user guide.



Note

- · Sound from the main set can be distorted if you raise the volume of Bluetooth device up to two-thirds or more.
- When you use the bluetooth function, adjust the volume of a bluetooth device to a proper level to listen to.







Note

- The sound may be interrupted when the connection interfered by the other electronic wave.
- You cannot control the Bluetooth device with this unit.
- Pairing is limited one Bluetooth device per one unit and multi-pairing is not supported.
- Although the distance between your Bluetooth and the set is less than 10 m, there are obstacles between both, your Bluetooth device cannot be connected.
- Depending on the type of the device, you may not be able to use the Bluetooth function.
- When not connected the Bluetooth. "BLUETOOTH" and "BT READY" appears on the control panel.
- The electrical malfunction due to devices using same frequency such as Medical equipment, Microwaves or wireless LAN devices, the connection will be disconnected.
- When someone stands and interrupts communication between Bluetooth device and the player, the connection will be disconnected.

Radio Operations

Be sure that FM aerial is connected. (Refer to the page 16)

Listening to the radio

- 1. Press TUNER on the unit or FUNCTION on the remote control until FM appears in the display window.
 - The last received station is tuned in.
- 2. Auto tunina: Press and hold TUNING-/+ on the remote control or $|\langle\langle \rangle\rangle$ on the unit for about two seconds until the frequency indication starts to change, then release. Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

Manual tuning:

Press TUNING-/+ on the remote control or I≪/≫I on the unit repeatedly.

3. Adjust the volume by rotating volume knob on the unit or by pressing **VOL +/-** on the remote control repeatedly.

Improving poor FM reception

Press >|| on the unit or ▶/|| on the remote control. This will change the tuner from stereo to mono and usually improve the reception.







Presetting the Radio Stations

You can preset 50 stations for FM.

Before tuning, make sure to turn down the volume.

- 1. Press TUNER on the unit or FUNCTION on the remote control until FM appears in the display window.
- 2. Press **TUNING-/+** on the remote control or **I**≪/≫I on the unit to select a desired frequency.
- 3. Press TUNER MEMORY. A preset number will blink in the display window.
- 4. Press **PRESET·FOLDER** Λ/V to select the preset number vou want.
- 5. Press **TUNER MEMORY**. The station is stored.
- 6. Repeat steps 2 to 5 to store other stations.
- 7. To listen a preset station, press PRESET-FOLDER ∧/V or 0 to 9 numerical buttons.

Deleting all the saved stations

- Press and hold TUNER MEMORY for two seconds. "ERASE ALL" will flash up on the unit display.
- 2. Press TUNER MEMORY to erase all the saved radio stations.

Seeing information about a Radio station

The FM tuner is supplied with the RDS (Radio Data System) facility. This shows information about the radio station being listened to. Press RDS/SET repeatedly to cycle through the various data types:

PS (Programme Service Name)

The name of the channel will appear in

the display.

PTY (Programme Type Recognition)

The programme type (e.g. Jazz or News)

will appear in the display.

RT (Radio Text)

> A text message contains special information from the broadcast station. This text may scroll across the display.

CT (Time controlled by the channel) This shows the time and date as broadcast by the station.

You can search the radio stations by programme type by pressing **RDS/SET**. The display will show the last PTY in use. Press PTY one or more times to select your preferred programme type. Press and hold **◄◄/▶►!**. The tuner will search automatically. When a station is found the search will stop.







Other Operations

Turn off the sound temporarily

Press **MUTE** to mute your unit.

You can mute your unit, for example, to answer the telephone, the mute icon "XIII" is blinked in the display window.

Displaying file information (ID3 TAG)

While playing an MP3 file containing file information, you can display the information by pressing **INFO**.

DEMO

In the power off state, it demonstrates the function on display window with a demo sound and a display by pressing **SPEAKER LIGHT/DEMO**. To cancel the DEMO, press it again.



Note

- While DEMO, this unit will keep DEMO status even if you unplug the power cord connection.
- You can enjoy other functions during the DEMO. Then the DEMO will pause to temporary.
 - Without input key in 10 sec, the DEMO will play back automatically.

Using Microphone

- 1. Connect your microphone to the MIC jack.
- 2. Play the music you want.
- Sing along with the accompaniment. Adjust the microphone volume by rotating MIC VOL. clockwise or unclockwise on the unit.



Note

- When not using the microphone, set the MIC VOL. to minimum or turn off the MIC and remove the microphone from the MIC jack.
- If the microphone is set too near the speaker, a howling sound may be produced. In this case, move the microphone away from the speaker or decrease the sound level by using the MIC VOL.
- If sound through the microphone is extremely loud, it may be distorted. In this case, rotate MIC VOL. to minimum.

Switching on and off the speaker light

You can select various types of the speaker light by pressing **SPK LIGHT/DEMO** on the unit.

To turn off the light, press **SPK LIGHT/DEMO** repeatedly until the light will be turned off.

Auto power down

This unit will be off itself to save electric consumption in the case main unit is not connected to external device and is not used for 25 minutes

So does this unit after six hours since Main unit has been connected to other device using analog input.







Sound adjustment

Setting the surround mode

This system has a number of pre-set surround sound fields. You can select a sound mode you want by using **SOUND EFFECT** on the remote control.

The displayed items for the Equalizer may be different depending on sound sources and effects.

Notes on Discs

Handling Discs

Never stick paper or tape on the disc.

Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight.

Cleaning Discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center to out.

Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for old vinyl records.

Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit. Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time

Cleaning the unit
