




Component and Button Description



Moving and Lifting the Monitor

When moving or lifting the monitor, follow these instructions to prevent the monitor from being scratched or damaged and to ensure safe transportation regardless of its shape or size.

- It is advisable to place the monitor in the original box or packing material before attempting to move it.
- Before moving or lifting the monitor, disconnect the power cord and all cables.
- Hold the top and bottom of the monitor frame firmly. Do not hold the panel itself.



 When holding the monitor, the screen should face away from you to prevent it being scratched.




- When moving the monitor, avoid any strong shock or vibrations to the product.
- When moving the monitor, keep it upright, never turn the monitor on its side or tilt it sideways.



CAUTION

 As far as possible, avoid touching the monitor screen. This may result in damage to the screen or some of the pixels used to create images.



Installing the Monitor

Assembling the stand base


1 Place the Monitor set with the screen side down on a flat and cushioned surface.




CAUTION-

• To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.


2 Use a tool to attach the **stand body** as shown in the figure.



3 Check the **position** (at the front and rear) of the stand body, then mount the **stand base** on the **stand body** as shown in the figure.




4 Using a coin, turn the screw clockwise to secure the **stand base**.



Detaching the stand base

- Place the monitor's screen face down.
 To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Using a coin, turn the screw in the stand base counterclockwise. Detach the stand base from the stand body.




CAUTION

- The components appearing in the illustrations may look different from the actual product.
- Do not carry the monitor upside-down as this may cause it to fall off its stand, resulting in damage or injury.
- To avoid damaging the screen when lifting or moving the monitor, only hold the stand or the plastic cover. This avoids putting unnecessary pressure on the screen.
- Only remove the tape and the locking pin when the monitor is mounted on the stand base and is in an upright position. Otherwise, the stand body may protrude, which may lead to injury.

Installing onto a table


1 Lift the monitor and place it on the table in an upright position.

Place at least **10 cm** away from the wall to ensure sufficient ventilation.



2 Connect the adapter to the monitor, then plug the power cord into the power outlet.

3 Press the \circ (Power) button on the bottom of the monitor to turn it on.




CAUTION

 Unplug the power cord prior to moving or installing the monitor. There is risk of electric shock.


Adjusting the stand height

- 1 Place the monitor mounted on the stand base in an upright position.
- 2 Remove the tape attached at the bottom rear of the stand body, then pull out the locking pin.

3 The height can be adjusted up to 120 mm.





• Once the pin is removed, it is not necessary to re-insert it to adjust the height.








 Do not put your fingers or hand between the screen and the base (chassis) when adjusting the screen's height.

Adjusting the angle

- 1 Place the monitor in an upright position, mounted on the stand base.
- 2 Adjust the angle of the screen. The angle of the screen can be adjusted forwards or backwards from -5° to 20° for a comfortable viewing experience.








 To avoid injury to the fingers when adjusting the screen, do not hold the lower part of the monitor's frame as illustrated below.




 Be careful not to touch or press the screen area when adjusting the angle of the monitor.




Swivel stand

Using the cable holder

- Fix the Knob (Cable holder) to the Hole(Hingebody).
- Use one screw to fix the Cable Holder and monitor set.
- Close the Cable holder.




Using the Kensington lock

The connector for the Kensington lock is located at the rear of the monitor.



Installing the wall mount plate

This monitor supports the specification of the standard wall mount plate or compatible device.

- 1 Place the screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Place the wall mount plate onto the monitor and align it with the screw holes.
- 3 Using a screwdriver, tighten the four screws to fix the plate onto the monitor.






NOTE

- · The wall mount plate is sold separately.
- For more information on installation, refer to the wall mount plate's installation guide.
- Be careful not to use excessive force when mounting the wall mount plate, as this can damage the monitor's screen.

Installing to a wall

Install the monitor at least 10 cm away from the wall and leave about 10 cm of space at each side of the monitor to ensure sufficient ventilation. Detailed installation instructions can be obtained from your local retail store. Please refer to the manual to install and set up a tilting wall mounting bracket.



To install the monitor to a wall, attach a wall mounting bracket (optional) to the back of the monitor. Make sure that the wall mounting bracket is securely fixed to the monitor and to the wall.

- 1 Use the screws and wall mounting bracket that comply with the VESA standard.
- 2 Screws which are longer than the standard length may damage the inside of the monitor.
- 3 A non-VESA standard screw may damage the product and cause the monitor to fall. LG Electronics is not liable for any accidents relating to the use of non-standard screws.
- 4 The monitor is VESA standard compliant.
- 5 Use it according to the VESA standard as specified below.
 - 784.8 mm or less
 - * Thickness of the wall mount plate: 2.6 mm
 - * Fastening screw: Diameter 4.0 mm x Pitch 0.7 mm x Length 10 mm
 - 787.4 mm or greater
 - * Use the wall mount plate and screws that conform to the VESA standard.

CAUTION

- Unplug the power cord before moving or installing the monitor to avoid electric shocks.
- Installing the monitor on the ceiling or on a slanted wall may result in the monitor falling off, which could lead to injury. Please use the genuine LG wall mounting bracket. For more information, contact your local retail store or a qualified installer.
- Applying excessive force when fastening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be covered by the product warranty.
- Use the wall mounting bracket and screws that conform to the VESA standard. Damage caused by the use or misuse of inappropriate components will not be covered by the product warranty.



- Use the screws specified by the VESA standard.
- The wall mount kit includes the installation guide and all necessary parts.
- The wall mounting bracket is optional. The accessories can be purchased at your local retail store.
- The length of the screw may differ for each wall mounting bracket. Ensure the correct length screw is used.
- For more information, please refer to the user manual for the wall mounting bracket.

USING THE MONITOR

Connecting to a PC

 This monitor supports the *Plug and Play feature.


*Plug and Play: A feature that allows you to add a device to your computer without having to reconfigure anything or install any manual drivers.

DVI connection

Transmits digital video signals to the monitor. Connect the monitor using the DVI cable as illustrated below.

Press the menu () button and then select the input option from the input menu.

To hear the sound in DVI input mode, connect the PC's AUDIO OUT port to the monitor's AUDIO IN (PC) port using the audio cable that came with the product.



CAUTION

 Connect the input signal cable and turn in the direction of the arrow.
 To prevent disconnection secure the cable tightly.



- Do not press on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image distortion.
- Do not display a still image on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image retention. If possible, use the screen saver.




- When connecting the power cord to the outlet, use a grounded (3-hole) multi-socket or a grounded power outlet.
- The monitor may flicker when turned on in an area of low temperature. This is normal.
- Sometimes red, green, or blue spots may appear on the screen. This is normal.
- Using a DVI to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.

DisplayPort connection

Transmits the digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect your PC to the monitor using the display port cable as illustrated below


Press the menu () button and then select the input option from the input menu.



HDMI connection

Transmits the digital video and audio signals from your PC and A/V devices to the monitor. Connect your PC and AV device to the monitor with the HDMI cable as illustrated below.

Press the menu (**!!**) button and then select the input option from the input menu.





NOTE

- There may be no video or audio output depending on the DP version of the PC.
- The DisplayPort cable may not be available in some areas.




- HDMI PC may cause device compatibility issues.
- Using a DVI to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.

Connecting to AV Devices

HDMI connection

Transmits the digital video and audio signals from your PC and A/V devices to the monitor. Connect your PC and AV device to the monitor with the HDMI cable as illustrated below.

Press the menu () button and then select the input option from the input menu.




NOTE

Using a DVI to HDMI cable may cause compatibility issues.

Connecting to External Devices

Smartphone (MHL) connection

Mobile High-definition Link (MHL) is an interface that allows you to play video and audio from your smartphone on the monitor by connecting the monitor to your smartphone. Connect the smartphone to the **HDMI2/MHL** port of the monitor using the supplied **MHL signal cable** and switch the input by pressing the input button on the monitor.


- This function only works for smartphones that support MHL.
 - There may be compatibility issues with other mobile phones.

USB cable-PC connection

The USB 3.0 function acts as a USB hub on the product.

To use USB 3.0, connect the A-B type USB 3.0 cable for the product to the PC.

Peripheral devices connected to the USB IN port can be controlled from the PC.





NOTE

- Please install the latest Windows service pack before use.
- Peripheral devices are sold separately.
- The USB ports can be used to connect the keyboard, mouse, and other USB devices.





<Cautions When Using a USB Device>

- A USB device with an automatic recognition program installed, or using its own driver, may not be recognized.
- Some USB devices may not be supported or may not work properly.
- It is recommended to use a USB hub or hard disk drive with power supplied. (If the power supply is not adequate, the USB device may not be recognized properly.)

Headphone port connection

Use the headphone port to connect a peripheral device to the monitor. Connect as illustrated.





NOTE -

 For an angle plug earphone, it is difficult connect it with a peripheral device, so use a straight type.

 Depending on the audio settings of the PC and external device, headphone and speaker functions may be limited.

INSTALLING LG MONITOR SOFTWARE

Insert the the owner's manual CD included in the product package into your PC's CD driver and install the LG Monitor Software.

1 Set the default Web browser to Internet Explorer.



2 Click the "LG Monitor Software" on the CD's main screen. When the file download window appears, click the Run button. (The file download window may vary depending on the operating system and the Internet Explorer version, but the installation procedures are same.)





- Service Pack 1 or higher is required for Window 7.
- 3 Follow the instructions to proceed with the installation.



4 Check "I accept the terms of the agreement" on the License Agreement screen and then click the [Next] button.




5 Select the program that you want to install.



•

- Screen Split: This program automatically splits the program window as desired.
- True Color Finder: This program calibrates the precise color output of the monitor to suit your needs.
- Auto Resolution: This is a program that automatically changes the resolution to the optimal settings when connecting the monitor to the PC in PBP mode.
 - * This program is not supported in Clone Mode.
 - * Extended Mode is not supported when using a single display.

6 The LG Monitor Software installation starts as shown below.




7 If the TUSB3410 driver has not been installed, it will install automatically. Select "Install this driver software anyway (I)" if the Windows security message is displayed as below.





8 The program you selected on the Select Features page will install automatically.



9 When the installation is complete, restart your system.





NOTE

When you run the True Color Finder software, the True Color Finder icon

[3] appears in the system tray at the right bottom of the PC screen.



Right-click the True Color Finder icon and select "Start Program" to start the program.



CAUTION

- Once you have completed the monitor calibration with the True Color Finder software, remove the calibrator from the monitor and store it at room temperature away from direct sunlight or put it in the box.
 - If the calibrator's measuring part is exposed to direct sunlight for a long time, this may cause damage to the calibrator.
 - Do not store it in an environment with too low/high temperature and high humidity.
- If any third-party calibration application is already installed on your PC, the image quality may be affected by a conflict between the two applications. For the best performance, it is recommended to uninstall the other calibration application.



NOTE

- To use the True Color Finder function, you must purchase the supported calibrator.
- For details on supported calibrators and graphic cards, see the True Color Finder user guide.
- If you have changed the input port, it is recommend that you calibrate the monitor's picture quality again.



NOTE

If you run Screen Split, the Screen Split icon [] appears in the system tray at the right bottom of the PC screen.





- **Vertical Frequency:** In order to display an image, the screen must be refreshed dozens of times per second like a fluorescent lamp.
 - The number of times the screen is refreshed per second is called vertical frequency or refresh rate and is represented by Hz.
- Horizontal Frequency: The time it takes to display one horizontal line is called the horizontal cycle. The number of horizontal lines displayed in one second can be calculated by dividing one by the horizontal cycle. This is called horizontal frequency and is represented by kHz.


