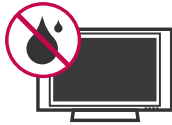

- 1** Do not use this apparatus near water.



- 2** Clean only with dry cloth.



- 3** Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.



- 4** Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



- 5** Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A

grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.



- 6** Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.



- 7** Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.

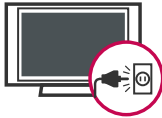


- 8** Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.

- 9** Unplug this apparatus during lighting storms or when unused for long periods of time.



- 10** Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.



- 11** Never touch this apparatus or antenna during a thunder or lighting storm.

- 12** When mounting a TV on the wall, make sure not to install the TV by the hanging power and signal cables on the back of the TV.

- 13** Do not allow an impact shock or any objects to fall into the product, and do not drop onto the screen with something.

- 14** CAUTION concerning the Power Cord:
It is recommend that appliances be placed upon a dedicated circuit; that is, a single outlet circuit which powers only that appliance and has no additional outlets or branch circuits. Check the specification page of this owner's manual to be certain.
Do not connect too many appliances to the

same AC power outlet as this could result in fire or electric shock.

Do not overload wall outlets. Overloaded wall outlets, loose or damaged wall outlets, extension cords, frayed power cords, or damaged or cracked wire insulation are dangerous. Any of these conditions could result in electric shock or fire. Periodically examine the cord of your appliance, and if its appearance indicates damage or deterioration, unplug it, discontinue use of the appliance, and have the cord replaced with an exact replacement part by an authorized servicer. Protect the power cord from physical or mechanical abuse, such as being twisted, kinked, pinched, closed in a door, or walked upon. 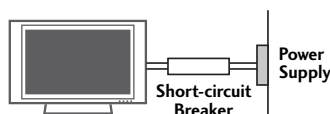
- 16** Do not expose to dripping or splashing and do not place objects filled with liquids, such as vases, cups, etc. on or over the apparatus (e.g. on shelves above the unit).



17 GROUNDING

Ensure that you connect the earth ground wire to prevent possible electric shock (i.e. a TV with a three-prong grounded AC plug must be connected to a three-prong grounded AC outlet). If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker.

Do not try to ground the unit by connecting it to telephone wires, lightning rods, or gas pipes.



18 DISCONNECTING DEVICE FROM MAINS

Mains plug is the disconnecting device. The plug must remain readily operable.

- 19** As long as this unit is connected to the AC wall outlet, it is not disconnected from the AC power source even if you turn off this unit by SWITCH.

20 Cleaning

When cleaning, unplug the power cord and scrub gently with a soft cloth to prevent scratching. Do not spray water or other liquids directly on the TV as electric shock may occur. Do not clean with chemicals such as alcohol, thinners or benzene.

21 Moving

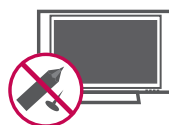
Make sure the product is turned off, unplugged and all cables have been removed. It may take 2 or more people to carry larger TVs. Do not press against or put stress on the front panel of the TV.

22 Ventilation

Install your TV where there is proper ventilation. Do not install in a confined space such as a bookcase. Do not cover the product with cloth or other materials (e.g.) plastic while plugged in. Do not install in excessively dusty places.

- 23** If you smell smoke or other odors coming from the TV or hear strange sounds, unplug the power cord contact an authorized service center.

- 24** Do not press strongly upon the panel with hand or sharp object such as nail, pencil or pen, or make a scratch on it.



- 25** Keep the product away from direct sunlight.

26 For LCD TV

If the TV feels cold to the touch, there may be a small “flicker” when it is turned on. This is normal, there is nothing wrong with TV.

Some minute dot defects may be visible on the screen, appearing as tiny red, green, or blue spots. However, they have no adverse effect on the monitor’s performance.

Avoid touching the LCD screen or holding your finger(s) against it for long periods of time. Doing so may produce some temporary distortion effects on the screen.

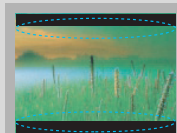
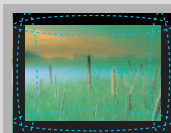
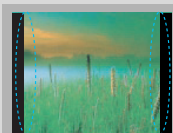

- Image burn can also occur on the letterboxed areas of your TV if you use the 4:3 aspect ratio setting for an extended period.

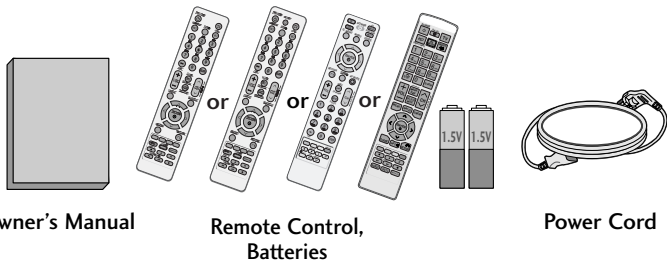

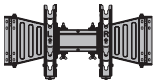
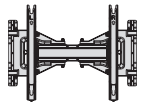
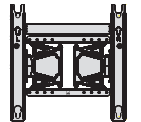
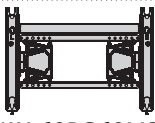
Install your wall mount on a solid wall perpendicular to the floor. When attaching to other building materials, please contact your nearest installer.

If installed on a ceiling or slanted wall, it may fall and result in severe personal injury.

We recommend that you use an LG brand wall mount when mounting the TV to a wall.

LG recommends that wall mounting be performed by a qualified professional installer.

ATTACHING THE TV TO A DESK (Except 42/47LH70**, 47/55LH50**, 47/55LH90**, 32/42/47/55SL80**, 42/47SL90**, PLASMA TV models)

The TV must be attached to a desk so it cannot be pulled in a forward/backward direction, potentially causing injury or damaging the product.

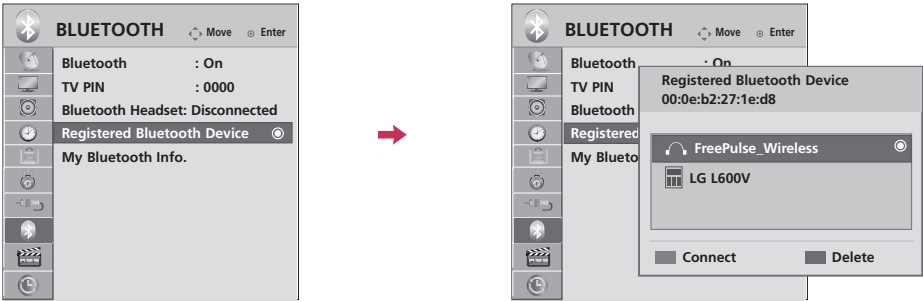
There might be an audio delay, depending on the buffer memory size of the headset.

- ▶ The stereo/mono headsets officially certified to be Bluetooth compatible can be searched and connected.

- ▶ If the surrounding environment of the TV is as follows, the device may not be searched or connected properly.
 - If there is strong electromagnetic interference.
 - If there are many Bluetooth devices in the area.

PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL

Programming a code into a remote mode

- 1 Testing your remote control.
To find out whether your remote control can operate other components without programming, turn on a component such as a STB and press the corresponding mode button (such as a **STB**) on the remote control, while pointing at the component. Test the **POWER** and **CH** $\wedge$ $\vee$ buttons to see if the component responds correctly. If the component does not operate correctly, the remote control requires programming to operate the device.
- 2 Turn on the component to be programmed, then press the corresponding mode button (such as **STB**) on the remote control. The remote control button of the desired device is illuminated.
- 3 Press the **MENU** and **MUTE** buttons simultaneously, and the remote control is ready to be programmed with the code.
- 4 Enter a code number using the number buttons on the remote control. Programming code numbers for the corresponding component can be found on the following pages. If the code is correct, the device will turn off.
- 5 Press the **MENU** button to store the code.
- 6 Test the remote control functions to see if the component responds correctly. If not, repeat from step 2.
