Ceiling, Floor Orientation

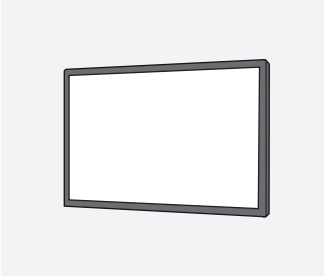

Wall Mount Holder

The warranty will not cover any damage caused by using the product in an excessively dusty environment.

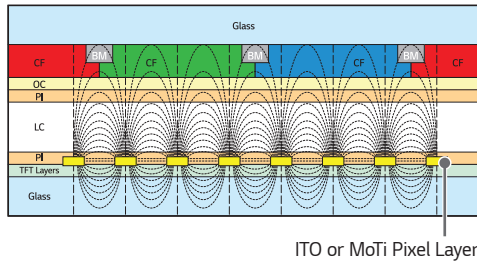
Afterimage

- After-image appears when the product is turned off.
 - Pixels may be damaged rapidly if a still image is displayed on the screen for a long period of time. Use the screen-saver function.
 - Switching from a screen with high differences in luminance (black and white or grey) to a darker screen may cause an afterimage. This is normal due to the display characteristics of this product.
- When the LCD screen is in a still pattern for extended periods of use, a slight voltage difference may occur between the electrodes that operate the liquid crystal (LC). The voltage difference between the electrodes increases over time and tends to keep the liquid crystal aligned in one direction. At this time, the previous image remains, which is called an afterimage.
- Afterimages do not occur when continuously changing images are used but take place when a certain screen is fixed for a long time. The following are operational recommendations for reducing the occurrence of afterimages when using a fixed screen. The maximum recommended time for switching the screen is 12 hours. Shorter cycles are better for preventing afterimages.

- Recommended Usage Condition

- 1 Change the background color and text color at equal intervals.

- Afterimages occur less when the colors to be changed are complementary to one another.



- 2 Switch the screen at equal time intervals.

- Take caution, and ensure that text or images from before the screen change are not left in the same location after the screen change.

Precautions for the AC Adapter and Power

WARNING

- Use only the power cord or AC adapter provided or approved by LG Electronics, Inc. If you use another power cord, make sure that it is certified by the national standards. If the power cable is faulty in any way, please contact the manufacturer or the nearest authorized service center for a replacement.
- Operate the display only from a power source (i.e. voltage) indicated in the product specification.
 - Otherwise the product can be damaged, fire can occur or you may be electrocuted. If you are not sure what type of power supply you have, consult a certified installation company.
- Make sure the power cord connect to a properly grounded outlet.
 - If you do not you may be electrocuted or injured or the product can be damaged.
- Insert the power plug or AC adapter firmly so it cannot come loose.
 - Poor connection may cause a fire or electric shock.
- In the presence of thunder and lightning, never touch the power cord and signal cable because it can be very dangerous.
 - It can cause electric shock.
- Be careful not to step or place heavy objects (electronic appliances, clothing, etc.) on the power cord or AC adapter. Additionally, do not bend or pull out the power cord or AC adapter with excessive force.
 - Damaged power cords may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not connect power cord or AC adapter damaged with sharp objects to power outlet.
 - You may be electrocuted.
- Do not insert a conductor (like a metal chopstick) into one end of the power cord while the other end is connected to the input terminal on the wall. Additionally, do not touch the power cord right after it is unplugged.

- If water or any foreign substance goes inside the product, disconnect the power cord immediately and contact the service center.

- Keep the power cord or AC adapter away from any heating devices.
 - The cord coating may melt and cause fire or electric shock.
- Never disassemble, repair or modify the power cord or AC adapter.

- The main cutoff device is the power cord. Please make sure the product is installed near the wall outlet and that it is easily accessible.
- As long as this unit is connected to the AC wall outlet, it is not disconnected from the AC power source even if the unit is turned off.
- Power consumption will be '0' only when the power plug is unplugged.
- Use the appliance coupler as the disconnect device.

**CAUTION**

- If the outlet pins of the power plug or AC adapter is covered with dust, be sure to wipe them and keep them clean.
 - Overheating due to layers of dust may cause a fire or electric shock.
- If the outlet pins of the power plug or AC adapter is covered with water be sure to wipe them and keep them clean. Additionally, Do not touch the power plug or AC adapter with wet hands.
 - This may cause an electric shock.
- Do not turn the product on or off by plugging in or unplugging the power plug from the power outlet. Do not use the power socket as a switch.
 - This may cause an electric shock or product malfunction.
- Do not unplug the power cord while the product is in use.
 - Electrical shock can damage the product.

Precautions for Moving the Product

WARNING

- Contact the service center before moving the product.
 - It may cause electric shock and damage the product.
- Make sure the product is turned off, unplugged, and all cables have been removed before the product is moved.
 - You may be electrocuted or the product can be damaged.
- When moving the product, do not shock or cause an impact on the front panel.
 - You may be electrocuted or the product can be damaged.
- Use the correct number of people according to the weight of the product. (Under 25 Kg (55.1 lbs) per person use lifting equipment when exceeding 100 Kg (220.4 lbs))
 - If use the damaged product again, contact the service center because it can cause electric shock or fire.
- Do not hold it upside down while holding only the stand. (It is for stand supported models only.)
 - This may cause stand warping, panel damage and other types of product damage.

CAUTION

- Do not dispose of the product-packing box. Use it when moving by putting the product in the box to carry it.

Precautions for Installing the Product

WARNING

- Contact the service center before installing the product.
 - It can cause electric shock and damage the product.
- Do not drop an object on or impact on the product. Keep out of reach of children and do not place toys or objects near the product to prevent throwing things on the product screen.
 - It can cause injury to human, problem to product and damage the display.
- Do not put heavy objects on, or hang from, the product.
 - If the product collapses or is dropped, you may be injured.
- Do not touch the surface of the product if it overheats.
 - It can cause injury to human.
- Install the product firmly fixed on a floor, wall, etc. to prepare against external impact such as wind and earthquake.
 - You must refer to the manual provided.
- Prevent Children from climbing or hanging on the product.
 - If the product collapses or is dropped, you may be injured.
- Do not install it where there are heating devices such as electrical heaters or lighting equipment.
 - Fire, electrical shock, malfunction may occur.
- Do not install this product by yourself as you may injure yourself or cause damage to the product. Please contact service engineer authorized by service center.
- Do not install this product on a wall if it could be exposed to oil or oil mist.
 - This may damage the product and cause it to fall.
- Do not leave the power or signal cable, etc. on the pathway.
 - This could cause a trip or fall, which could cause an electrical shock, fire, product breakdown, or injury.
- Do not let the product drop when connecting it to an external device connected with a short cable.
 - This may cause injury and damage to the product.
- If you drop the product or the case is broken, turn off the product and unplug the power cord and contact the service center.
 - If you continue to use without taking proper measures, electrical shock or fire can occur.
- Install the product in a dry place where it is not near dust and water. Avoid high temperatures and humidity.
 - This may cause electrical shock, fire or product damage.
- Safely install the product in a place that can hold the weight of the product.
 - A lack of strength may cause the product to fall.
- Take a comfortable and natural position to relax the muscles when working with a product.
- Do not install this product on a location that is wobbly, sloped, unstable, exposed to vibrations, or that does not safely and securely support the product to remain in place. Do not place a cloth or any other item between the product and the furniture supporting the product.
 - The product may fall down or overturn, causing an injury or malfunction.

 **CAUTION**

- Install the product where no Electromagnetic Interference occurs.
- If you install the product in a place that does not meet the recommended conditions, this may cause serious damage to the product's picture quality, life cycle, and appearance. Please check with service engineer before installing. Please do not install the product in places such as where there is an abundance of fine dust or oil mist, chemical substances are used, exposed to direct sunlight, the temperature is very high or low, the humidity is very high.
- Make sure the product is well ventilated by installing at a distance (100 mm (3.9 inches) or more) from the wall.
 - If you install the product too close to the wall, it may be deformed or fire can break out due to internal heat buildup.
- Do not cover the product with a tablecloth or a curtain or other materials (e.g. plastic) while plugged in. Do not block the ventilation hole of the product.
 - The product can be deformed or fire can break out due to overheating inside the product.
- Do not install the product in an area with poor ventilation (e.g. on a bookshelf, in a closet) or outside and avoid placing on cushions or carpets.
 - The product could catch fire due to overheating inside the product.
- Install the product on a flat and stable place that is large enough to support the product.
 - If the product is dropped, you may be injured or the product may be broken.

Precautions for Cleaning the Product

[Lock Screen Password]

(Start)(Set ID)(Type)(Command)(Data)(Cr)

- * (Start): This is a command to start the RS-232C control and starts with 0 x 3A.
- * (Set ID): This is to select the set to be controlled, and the Set ID is fixed to 01 (30 31).
- * (Type): The command is to set the function or check the status of it. (Settings: 0 x 53/Check: 0 x 47)
- * (Command): This command is to control the set.
- * (Data): Transmits command data.

Issues Related to Use

- The power won't turn on.
 - Check if the power cord is correctly plugged into the power outlet.
 - When operating in below zero temperature, the enclosure may not work for up to one hour to raise the internal temperature of the enclosure.
 - For models with a circuit breaker, check whether the circuit breaker has been connected properly. The switch of the circuit breaker must be set to on (red).
 - Try turning the power on after disconnecting the AC adapter and cleaning the contacting port.
 - Ensure whether LAN cable is damaged or not when using POE.
 - Do not connect AC adapter when using POE power.
- The 'Unknown Product' message appears when the product is connected.
 - Check if the driver of PC(graphics card) has been installed.
 - Check if the plug and play function is supported by the PC(graphics card) user manual.

Issues Related to Screen (Video)

- A message saying 'No signal' or 'Invalid Format' appears.
 - The signal cable is not connected between the PC and the product, or the cable connection status is unstable. Check the signal cable.
 - Access the input menu to check the input signal.
 - The signal from the PC (Graphics card) is out of the vertical or horizontal frequency range of the product. Adjust the frequency range by referring to the specifications in this manual.
- The position of the screen is incorrect.
 - Check if the graphics card resolution and frequency are supported by the product. If the frequency exceeds the supported range, use PC settings to set the resolution to the recommended value.
 - D-Sub analog signal - Press the **AUTO** button in the remote control to automatically select the optimal screen status that fits into the current mode. If the adjustment is not satisfactory, adjust the display settings manually in the OSD menu. (Depending on model)

- The screen is displayed abnormally.
 - Connect the signal cable that matches with the source input signal.
 - Condensation may appear on the screen. It will disappear in a certain period of time after the product is powered on.
 - The condensation formed inside the product is a natural phenomenon and is not covered under warranty. (IPX6 is a standard to protect the product from 100L of water per minute and not from infiltration of moisture in the air into the set.)
 - When connecting the panel and the Signage box, check their serial numbers and make sure they match. If the serial numbers match, unplug the power cord and plug it in again to run the Clear Panel Noise feature. (The system will reboot automatically after running the feature.)
You can also run the feature in **⚙️ (Settings)** → [Display] → [Advanced Settings] → [OLED Panel Settings] → [Clear Panel Noise] menu.
- The PC BIOS configuration screen is not displayed correctly.
 - On some PCs, the BIOS configuration screen may not display correctly because the atypical aspect ratio is not supported before the graphics card driver is configured. This is not a problem of the product; it is due to the design of the graphics card's BIOS configuration screen aspect ratio. To access the PC BIOS configuration screen, please connect a standard aspect ratio (4:3 or 16:9) monitor, then perform the BIOS configuration.
- Images are flickering or fluttering on the screen.
 - If you turn the monitor on when it is cold, the screen may flicker. This is normal.
 - Make sure that the current resolution and frequency settings of the graphics card are supported by the monitor.
- Stripes appear in the background.
 - D-Sub analog signal - Press the **AUTO** button in the remote control to automatically select the optimal screen status that fits into the current mode. If the adjustment is not satisfactory, adjust the display settings manually in the OSD menu. (Depending on model)
- Horizontal noise appears or the characters look blurred.
 - D-Sub analog signal - Press the **AUTO** button in the remote control to automatically select the optimal screen status that fits into the current mode. If the adjustment is not satisfactory, adjust the display settings manually in the OSD menu. (Depending on model)
- The image is not displayed.
 - Check that the cable is properly connected between the panel and the Signage box.


Issues Related to Screen (Color)

- Screen has poor color resolution (16 colors).
 - Use PC settings to set the color to 24 bits (True Color) or above.
- Screen color is unstable or mono-colored.
 - Check the connection status of the signal cable. Or, re-insert the PC graphics card.
- Black spots or bright spots appear on the screen.
 - Some pixels (red, green, blue, black) are visible on the screen due to the unique characteristics of the display panel. This is not a malfunction of the product.
- The screen's brightness seems dark.
 - Adjust brightness and contrast again.
 - Backlight may need repair.
 - If the internal temperature of the enclosure rises, the screen's brightness may darken. Clean the heat exchanger or filter in the enclosure periodically.

Issues Related to Sound

- There is no sound output.
 - See if the audio cable is connected properly.
 - Adjust the volume of the product or external device.
 - See if the sound is set properly.
- Sound is too dull.
 - Select the appropriate equalizer sound.
- Sound is too low.
 - Adjust the volume of the product or external device.
- For some models, you will need to purchase external speakers separately since they do not have speakers built-in.

Other Issues

- The power suddenly turned off.
 - Check if the auto-off function is activated on the settings related time.
 - Power source has not being supplied properly. See if the product power cord is connected properly.
 - Check the power control settings.
 - If the internal temperature of the enclosure rises, the power may shut down. Clean the heat exchanger or filter in the enclosure periodically.
 - Check if the fan is working properly.
View the fan status in  (SETTINGS) → [General] → [System Information] → [Fan Status].

CAUTION

- Since afterimage can occur when a specific fixed screen is used for a long time, To reduce after-images, it is recommended not to exceed the recommended daily operation time set for the screen size and to display the video content with a small number of fixed characters or logos.
Recommended daily operation time (55 inches: 18 hours, 65 inches: 12 hours)
- A few horizontal lines may appear on the screens while running the [Clear Panel Noise] feature. This is normal, so there is no need for concern. If the power is turned on or a power failure occurs while the [Clear Panel Noise] feature is running, the feature may not work properly.
- Turn the power on five minutes after running the [Clear Panel Noise] feature.
- The external speakers connected to the product may make a sound while you are running the [Clear Panel Noise] feature.
- [Clear Panel Noise]: Correct issues that may arise on the screen when it is turned on for a long period of time.
- Use the [Screen Protection Mode Setting] feature in [OLED Panel Settings] to effectively prevent the formation of an afterimage.

Issues Related to Touch

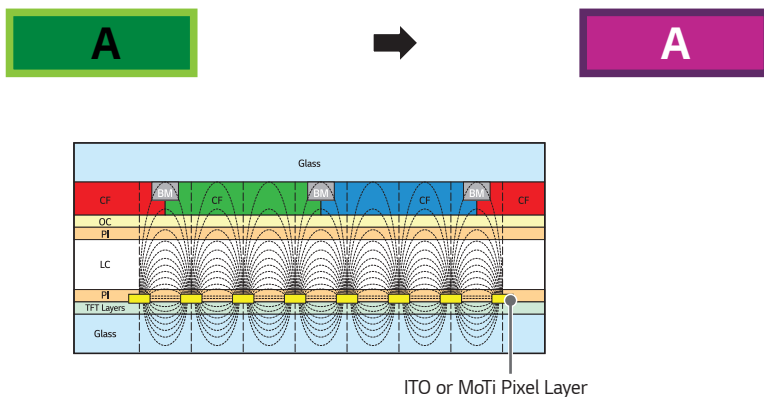
- Touch does not respond.
 - This may occur when the USB cable between PC and product is not connected. Remove the USB cable and connect it again in 10 seconds.
 - Make sure that your PC's power cord is firmly plugged into a power outlet and restart your PC.
 - Touch may not respond when the system is down due to the unstable network. Reconnect the LAN cable or restart your PC.
 - If your PC and product are not connected using a signal cable, touch does not respond. Check the signal cable connection.
 - Touch may not respond when the product is powered off. Check the product power.
 - If you do not use a grounded outlet, it may cause a break or touch error. Always connect the power cord to a grounded outlet.
 - Check if the screen is currently on.
 - A break or touch error may occur as below case.
 - If touching the screen only with nail or fingertip
 - If holding the tip of the touch pen or near the tip of the touch pen
 - If using the touch pen while pressing it with strong force on the screen
- The location of a touch does not correspond to the touch coordinates.
 - This may occur when the touch screen is not calibrated properly. Change your tablet PC settings.
- A touch is applied to a monitor other than the one I intended.
 - This may occur if the monitor is not set as the default monitor when you are using multiple monitors. Set the monitor as the default monitor.
 - This may occur when the touch screen is not calibrated properly. Change your tablet PC settings.
- Multi-touch does not respond.
 - The content played (e.g. Paint, etc.) may not support Multi-touch points. Make sure that you use a content that supports Multi-touch point.
 - Remove the USB cable and connect it again in 10 seconds.
 - Run the content (e.g. Paint, etc.) again.
 - Restart your PC.
 - On the edge of the touch screen, multi-touch may work unstably.
 - If the interval between two touches is too short, a touch error may occur.

Image sticking

- After-image appears when the product is turned off.
 - If you use a fixed image for a long time, the pixels may be damaged. Use the screen-saver function.
 - When a dark image is displayed on the screen after an image with high contrast (black and white or gray), this may cause image sticking. This is normal for display products.
- When the LCD panel displays a static image for an extended period of time, it can cause a voltage difference between the electrodes that operate the liquid crystals. When the voltage difference between the electrodes builds up over time, liquid crystals have a tendency to remain aligned in one direction. During this process, a previously displayed image remains visible. This phenomenon is referred to as image sticking.
- Image sticking does not occur when using constantly changing images but may occur when using a fixed image for an extended period of time. Therefore, it is recommended that you use the instructions below to decrease the likelihood of image sticking occurring when using a fixed image. It is recommended that you change the screen at least once every 12 hours at the very minimum; if done more frequently, the prevention of image sticking is more effective.
- Recommended operating conditions
 - 1 Change the background and the character colors using the same time interval.
 - When changing colors, using complementary colors helps to prevent image sticking.



- 2 Change the image using the same time interval.
 - Make sure that the characters or images before changing the image remain in the same location after changing the image.
